UNREO Humanitarian Situation Report
Friday, 21 October 1994

This sitrep is produced three times every week by UNREO Kigali; Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The information is compiled from inputs by organizations working in Rwanda including UNICEF, UNDP, WFP, FAO, UNHCR, WHO, IOM, UNAMIR, USAID-DART, and NGOs. This document is intended to represent the best available information as of 1200, Friday, 21 October 1994.

GENERAL SUMMARY

There is an estimated 1,853,234 Internally displaced Persons in Rwanda according to the 14 October UNAMIR consolidated refugee/Displaced persons list.

Security situation on the Rwanda/Burundi border in Sector 4C is calm.

The Netherlands Minister for Development Cooperation arrives Kigali Friday, 21 October for a two day visit.

SECURITY

A UNAMIR report has described the Rwanda/Burundi border in sector 4C as calm on the Rwandan side. Firing was heard during the period 18 - 19 October on the Burundian side and unspecified number of Burundian soldiers were seen deployed on the Burundi side of the border according to UNAMIR.

4 people were wounded at Ndaba camp in Sector 4C when RPA troops opened fire on IDPs in the camp in an attempt to keep them in place for an address by the RPA. Subsequently, the population in the camp moved away towards Kivumu also in Sector 4C.

REFUGEES AND INTERNALLY DISPLACED

UNAMIR in collaboration with NGOs has released the third edition of a consolidated refugee/displaced persons list. According to the up-date there is an estimated 1,853,234 Internally Displaced Persons within Rwanda. This figure compares with an estimated 1,967,760 as of 26 September. The 14 October figures by sector compares with the previous list as follows:

DAILY SITREP FOR 28 OCT 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE RPA WILL PUT ON A SHOW OF STRENGTH THIS WEEKEND TO EMPHASISE THE FACT THAT THEY HAVE NOT BEEN PAID. THIS DISPLAY MAY ALSO ACT AS A REMINDER TO THE GOVERNMENT THAT THEY CANNOT CONTROL THE COUNTRY WITHOUT THE RPA. IT IS LIKELY THAT THERE WILL BE A CONSIDERABLE RPA PRESENCE THROUGHOUT KIGALI WITH MORE VEHICLE CHECKPOINTS THAN USUAL.

B. THE 2 JOURNALISTS WHO WERE REPORTED MISSING ON 27 OCT 94 HAVE BEEN LOCATED. THEY ARE UNDER OPEN ARREST AT THE URMULI HOTEL IN RUHENGARI. THEY WERE ARRESTED WHILE MAKING AN UNAUTHORISED DOCUMENTARY ON THE TWAS. THE SECTOR COMD AND HAC TEAM MET WITH THE RPA BDE COMD TO TRY TO SECURE THEIR RELEASE.

C. GHANBATT REPORTED THAT LOCALS FROM NKOMERO (GR 4334) ARE REPORTING A TENSE ATMOSPHERE IN THE AREA. THEY CLAIM THAT THE TENSION IS A RESULT OF UNKNOWN PEOPLE IN THE VICINITY. AN OLD LADY WAS KILLED 24 OCT 94 AND A SUSPECT HAS BEEN ARRESTED BY FRAFATT TROOPS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG MET WITH MR. RHAZAOU, THE ACTING UNDP RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE, TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, THE UPCOMING ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE.

B. THE SRSG CONVENED THREE SEPARATE RWANDA EMERGENCY NORMALIZATION PLAN (RENP) MEETINGS TO DISCUSS:

(1) THE RESTORATION OF ELECTRICITY AND WATER.

(2) THE REHABILITATION OF THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS NETWORK.

(3) THE STATUS OF UNITED NATIONS DE-MINING PLANS FOR RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA THE RPA CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND MOUNT ROAD BLOCKS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY.

(1) LOCALS IN THE AREA OF RUGABANO DP CAMP GR 4266 REPORT THAT THE RPA MIGHT CONDUCT A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN THE CAMP ON 29 OCT 94. THE POPULATION OF THE CAMP APPEALED TO FRAFBATT TO PROVIDE PROTECTION DURING THE OPERATION. THE RPA HAVE PREVIOUSLY STATED THAT THE POPULATION OF THE CAMP SHOULD RETURN TO THEIR HOMES BECAUSE THE RPA INTEND TO CLOSE THE CAMP ON 29 OCT 94.

(2) IN A MEETING WITH THE COMD OF SECTOR 4B THE LOCAL RPA BN COMD HAS PROMISED TO TALK TO THE LOCALS IN KIBUYE, GISOVU (GR2952) AND KARONGI IN AN ATTEMPT TO REDUCE TENSION IN THE AREA.

B. RGF NTR.

C. MILITIA LOCALS IN THE MUGINA AREA HAVE REPORTED THAT THE INTERAHAMWE ARE STEALING CATTLE AND OTHER

AREA. IT IS ASSESSED THAT ANY INCIDENTS OF CATTLE STEALING ARE NOT RELATED TO INTERAHAMWE ACTIVITIES AND THAT THE LOCALS IN THE AREA ARE ONLY BLAMING INTERAHAMWE BECAUSE THEY ARE A CONVENIENT SCAPEGOAT.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED. STAFF BRIEF WAS HELD AT 0800 HRS.

(2) PERSONNEL OF TAC HQ ASSISTED AT THE SCENE OF ACCIDENT NORTH OF BUTARE NEAR KARAMA GR 7320. A CARITAS VEH HAD RUN OFF THE ROAD INTO A GROUP OF CHILDREN. HQ PER TRANSPORTED 6 VICTIMS TO UNIVERSITY HOSP.

(3) OP HOMEWARD WAS POSTPONED DUE TO NON AVAILABILITY OF TRANSPORT.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY).

(1) OWN PTL TEAM WENT TO KIBUNGO AND RECORDED AN INFLOW OF 14 REFUGEES FROM TANZANIA TO RWANDA THROUGH RUSUMU ROAD. PLATOON AT GATUNA GR 028407 RECORDED 20 REFUGEES INTO RWANDA.

(2) CHAIRMAN OF GITI COMMUNE GR 247024 AND MEDICAL REP REPORTED AN EPIDEMIC OF DYSENTERY AND MALARIA FEVER IN THE COMMUNE AND REQUESTED IMMEDIATE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE. UNIT PROVIDED THEM WITH ESSENTIAL AND SUFFICIENT DRUGS TO RESUSCITATE THEIR CLOSED CLINIC.

(3) PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 48 LOCALS BY OWN RMO.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT SECURITY ACTIVITIES WITHIN AREA OF OPERATION.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT).

(1) CONTINUED DAY AND NIGHT, FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS WITHIN AOR. STANDING PATROL AT THE REMERA BORDER POST GR 4192 OBSERVED 15 MEN, 13 WOMEN AND 17 CHILDREN CROSSING INTO BURUNDI TO PURCHASE ESSENTIAL COMMODITIES AND BACK WHILST 5 MEN, 14 WOMEN AND SOME CHILDREN ALSO CROSSED TO THEIR FARMS IN RWANDA.

(2) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE GUARDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE AND AICF WAREHOUSE AT CYANIKA GR 5530 AND MAINTAINED DEPLOYMENT OF 1 X MECH SECTION EACH AT MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES. CO PAID ROUTINE WORKING VISIT TO

NORTHERN PART OF AO.

(3) CONTINUED TO MAN PERMANENT CHECK POINTS AT GIKONGORO, RURAMBA, RWAMIKO AND KITABI. 112 DPs WERE GIVEN MED TREATMENT BY OWN MED STAFF AT MURAMBI GR 5128.

(4) PROVIDED SECURITY TO ICRC AND SAVE THE CHILDREN ORGANISATION FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF RELIEF ITEMS AT KAMANA GR 5197 AND NYAMIGINA GR 4525 RESPECTIVELY.

F. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PTLs AND CHECK POINTS WITHIN AO. 895 DPs FROM NKOMERO GR 4339 ARRIVED AT MUKO. MEETING WAS HELD BY PREFECT OF KIBUYE WITH NGO REPRESENTATIVES AND MILOBS.

G. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). BN CO AND 2IC VISITED NYARUSHISHI GR 8522 TO ASSESS THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA.

(1) CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT, MOBILE AND FOOT PATROLS IN FOLLOWING AREAS, NYARUSHISHI GR 8522, KAMEMBE GR 7826, GISUMA GR 8526, GAFUNZO GR 8935, CYANGUGU GR 7724, UVIRA GR 8901, KARANGERA GR 9221, GOMBANIRO GR 9398, GISAKURA GR 9829, SHAGASHA GR 8026, KITABI GR 3520, KIRAMBO GR 0444, NYAMASHEKE GR 9841, KIBINGO GR 9532 AND GATARE BRIDGE GR 1245.

(4) PROVIDED GUARDS FOR UNREO AND CLOSE OBSERVATION FOR HSF, MSF UNHCR OFFICES AND RESIDENCES. ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOY OF 319 DPs PROCEEDING TO BUTARE FROM NYAGATARE GR 8024 TO KITABI GR 3520.

(1) TROOPS CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS, RUHENGIERI, NKUMBA GR 6638, MAYA GR 7043, RUGARAMA GR 7043, KIDAHU GR 7047, BAHUNGA GR 6440, GAZIZA GR 6041, KAGANO GR 5841 AND KIHINGO GR 5440.

(2) COURTESY CALL OF MRS. JOHANNA GOMBACH, HEAD OF SUB DELEGATION OF INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE OF THE RED CROSS AT THE HQ.

(3) RPA HAS DEPLOYED A CHECK POINT JUST IN FRONT OF TUNBATT HQ AT KABALI.

I. MILOB GP. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS AND SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) MILOB GP HQ CARRIED OUT PLANNING, COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOB SECTORS' ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT OVER THE PERIOD.

(3) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA BORDER REMAINED OPENED FOR ALL TRAFFIC. PTLs WERE CARRIED OUT AT MULINDI, KYOMBE, TALANGUE AND MYAGATORE AND FOUND SECURITY SITUATION NORMAL. AUSTRALIA RELIEF PROGRAMME STARTED DISTRIBUTING FOOD AT TALANGUE. THEY ALSO ESTB A CLINIC IN THAT AREA.

(4) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. MILOBS CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PATROLS IN THE AREAS OF KANZENZE, GAKO AND RUSUMO. HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM WAS CONTINUING WITH THE INVESTIGATION IN THE MASSACRE SITE AT NYARUBUYE. MILOB TEAM ESCORTED HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM TO RUSUMO AND NYARUBUYE.

(5) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. MILOBS TEAMS CARRIED OUT PTLs AT NYAMABYE GR 7471, MASKA GR 9679, MUSSAMBIRA GR 82 74, MUGINA GR 93680, NTONGWE GR 89570 AND RUANGO GR 7654. THE BOURGMESTER OF MUSAMBIRA REPORTED ABOUT AN UNEXPLODED MINE IN HIS AREA. ONE RPA SECURITY OFFICER INFORMED THE HUMANITARIAN TEAM THAT AT GISHAMVU GR 6404, TWO PERSONS NAMED KIYANGE JOSHEP AND BONNE WERE KILLED BY A GROUP OF PEOPLE NAMED KUBNIMANA ALPHONSE, SEKIMONYO FAUSTIN, KARISA BOSCO AND KARINANGA INNOCENT ON 26 OCT 94. HE ALSO ADDED THAT ON 27 OCT 94, AT MUBUMBANO GR 6806 FOUR PERSONS WERE KILLED BY MR BUGINGO WHO MANAGED TO ESCAPE AFTER THE INCIDENT. THE RPA OFFICER STATED THAT AT SEKE GR 6303, THREE PERSONS WERE KILLED ON 27 OCT 94. MILOBS TEAMS ARE INVESTIGATING THE MATTERS.

(6) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN AND AROUND THE SECTOR, AND FOUND THE SECURITY SITUATION TO BE NORMAL. MILOBS TEAM ESCORTED BROWN AND ROOTS CONVOY FROM THE SECTOR TO CYANGUGU.

(7) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. MILOBS CARRIED OUT PTLs AT RUGABANO GR 4266, NDABA GR 4173 AND KIVUMU GR 5573 AND SITUATION WAS NORMAL. PRIMARY SCHOOLS WERE OPENED AT KAGUNGA GR 3859 AND RUTONDE GR 5880 BUT ACUTE SHORTAGE OF TEACHERS AND BOOKS WERE OBSERVED.

(8) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM. MILOBS PATROLLED RWANDA BORDERS WITH ZAIRE AND BURUNDI. ROUTINE PTLs WERE ALSO CONDUCTED IN OTHER AREAS OF THE SECTOR. MILOBS TEAM ESCORTED BROWN AND ROOTS CONVOY FROM KITABI TO CYANGUGU AND BACK. AT KARENGERA GR 9321, THE RPA SEARCHED ONE HOUSE AND FOUND A MACHINE GUN. THEY TOOK THE GUN AND RELEASED THE MAN. ON INQUIRY IT WAS LEARNED THAT MR BISMANA RUDHONYORE, THE OWNER OF THE MACHINE GUN HAD BOUGHT THE GUN FROM INTERAHAMWE DURING THE WAR.

(9) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT IN THE AREA OF BORDER POSTS, RUHENGERI, CYANIKA GR 7152, KINIGI GR 5440, GATONDE GR 6117 AND BISOKE GR 449393. SECTOR COMD AND HAC TEAM HAD MEETING WITH RPA BDE COMD ON THE ISSUE OF RELEASING THE TWO JOURNALISTS OF ASSOCIATED PRESS, MR JARROD HARLOW AND MR GRAHAM WALSH. THEY WERE ARRESTED ON 27 OCT 94 BY RPA FROM 10 KM SOUTH OF RUHENGERI. THEY WERE MAKING DOCUMENTARY FILMS WITHOUT AUTHORITY AND ALSO WERE INQUIRING ABOUT RPA DEPLOYMENT. PRESENTLY THEY WERE PUT IN HOTEL URMULI UNDER OPEN ARREST. THE JOURNALIST STATED THAT THEY WERE TREATED NICELY. 17 OUT 20 SUSPECTED PERSONS HELD AT GATONDE COMMUNE FOR VARIOUS OFFENCES WERE RELEASED AFTER PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATIONS WERE CONDUCTED LOCALLY.

(10) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. SITUATION IN KIGALI REMAINED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. ONE MILOB TEAM ESCORTED 418 DPs FROM KIGALI TO NGENDA AND ESCORTED BACK TO KIGALI ANOTHER 100 DPs. 392 DPs WERE ESCORTED FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO BY THE MILOBS WHILE 209 DPs WERE BROUGHT BACK TO KIGALI.

(4) RIFLE COY CONDUCTED SECURITY OPS AT THE MIL BKS, BELGIAN VILLAGE AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. ALSO PROVIDED FORCE RRF.

(5) SURGICAL TEAM DELIVERED TO KITABI IN ORDER TO CONDUCT SURGERY IN KIBEHO WITH 23 PFA TOMORROW.

1. **GEN SITUATION.** THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA WERE STILL PURSUING THEIR AIM OF GETTING DPS OUT OF NDABA CAMPS IN SECTOR 4B.

B. IN SECTOR 4B, FRAFBATT REPORTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN KILLINGS AT GR 2656. ACCORDING TO THE RPA 11 ELMS OF INTERAHAMWE AMBUSHED AN RPA PATROL OF 4 SOLDIERS IN THAT LOC. INVESTIGATIONS ARE GOING ON FOR MORE DETAILS. 4 PEOPLE WERE KILLED AT THE SAME LOCATION ON TUESDAY 18 OCT 94.

C. IN SECTOR 4A, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT FIVE LOCALS WERE KILLED AND ABOUT 30 OTHERS ABDUCTED AT CYAFURWE GR 5317. REPORTS FROM LOCALS INDICATED THAT RPA WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE KILLINGS.

D. MILOBS IN SECTOR 5 REPORTED AN RPA HOUSE LOCATED AT KINGORO GR 2726 GOT BURNED DOWN ON 23 OCT 94 DUE FIRE STARTED THROUGH CARELESSNESS OF ONE OF THEIR SOLDIERS. CONSIDERABLE AMMO STORED IN THE HOUSE MADE A RATHER SPECTACULAR FIRE. THE FIRE WAS REPORTED OBSERVED BY MANY PEOPLE IN KUIMBA CAMP, ZAIRE. FALSE RUMOURS CIRCULATING IN THE AREA INDICATE THAT RPA WAS BURNING HOMES AND KILLING CIVILIANS.

E. IN SECTOR 4B, RPA INTENSIFIED THEIR SEARCHES IN ROAD BLOCKS IN THE AREA. GENERAL POPULATION IN KIBUYE WERE STILL APPREHENSIVE BECAUSE OF RPA ACTIVITIES. TENSION BETWEEN RPA AND LOCALS WERE REPORTED AT GISOVU GR 2952 WITH THE WITHDRAWAL OF FRAFBATT PL FROM THE AREA. SITUATION BEING MONITORED BY MILOBS.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY CALM, THE LEVEL OF FEAR AMONG THE LOCAL POPULATION HAS INCREASED AS A RESULT OF INCREASED BANDITRY AND SUSPECTED INTERAHAMWE ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS 4A, 4B AND 4C.

A. IN SECTOR 4B, THE SOUS PREFECT OF BIRAMBO ADDRESSED A MEETING OF DPs AND RE-EMPHASIZED RPA ULTIMATUM THAT THEY MUST VACATE THE CAMP BEFORE 29 OCT 94.

B. ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAS RELEASED ONE OF THEIR INTERPRETERS WHOM THEY ARRESTED IN BUGARAMA GR 8907 ON 20 OCT 94.

C. IN SECTOR 4A, BETWEEN 250300B - 250500B OCT 94 FOUR ARMED ELMS DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORM ATTACKED KANYINYA GR 5621. 4 LOCALS REPORTED KILLED AND 2 OTHERS SERIOUSLY WOUNDED. GHANBATT PTL TEAM DETAILED TO MENTIONED LOCATION FOUND 22 X 5.56MM EMPTY CASES. REPORTS FROM LOCALS INDICATE THAT RPA SUSPECTED TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ACT.

D. IN SECTOR 4B, FRAFBATT REPORTED THAT INFORMATION RECEIVED FROM LOCALS INDICATE THAT A NUMBER OF PEOPLE HAD BEEN KILLED IN THE AREA OF GR 2756. INVESTIGATIONS UNDERWAY.

E. IN SECTOR 4C, AT ABOUT MIDNIGHT 24/25 OCT, BANDITS SHOT AND KILLED ONE MR MONTAKASI AND HIS WIFE AT RUVUNGURA GR 8713. THE MAN, A SHOP OWNER AT BUGARAMA WAS ORDERED TO SURRENDER CASH BUT HE REFUSED. THE SAME GROUP OF BANDITS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE ROBBED ANOTHER PERSONS OF CASH AND PROPERTY IN THE SAME TOWN.

(3) IN SECTOR 3, RPA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED ONE MR KANEZA JEAN BAPTISTE ON 23 OCT 94 AT KIBUYE AND TAKEN TO GITARAMA ON 24 OCT 94.

(4) IN SECTOR 4B, RPA TROOPS WERE SEEN DEPLOYING

ALONG THE LAKE BETWEEN GISHYITA GR 2162 AND NYABINAGA GR 1350.

(5) IN SECTOR 4C, IT WAS REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS KILLED A CIVILIAN NAMED DONATGATABORIA ANDRA AROUND MWITO AT GR 8634 IN THE MORNING. THE RPA SOLDIERS CONFIRMED OF KILLING THE MAN BUT ALLEGED THAT THE MAN WAS A CRIMINAL, AND HAD PREVIOUSLY KILLED AN RPA SOLDIER.

(6) IN SECTOR 5, IOM REPORTED THAT ONE OF ITS EMPLOYEES WAS DELIBERATELY HIT BY AN RPA VEH WHILE DRIVING A MOTORCYCLE IN CYANGUGU.

(7) AN RPA COY MINUS WERE OBSERVED FROM RUHENGERRI HEADING TOWARDS GISENYI IN A SINGLE FILE ON 251600B OCT 94 WITH ARMS AND EQUIPMENT.

C. MILITIA LOCALS OF NYABUYONE GR 517512 REPORTED THAT BANDITS SUSPECTED TO BE INTERAHAMWE ATTACKED A HOME AT THE VILLAGE WITH A GREN. THE GREN HIT A WALL AND EXPLODED AND THE BANDITS FLED LEAVING BEHIND ONE GREN WHICH WAS TAKEN BY RPA SOLDIERS.

a. Displaced Persons.

- (1) Routine IOM/UNHCR transport of DPs which included transport from KIGALI to BYUMBA, KIBUNGO and NYAMATA. Convoys were escorted by MILOBs.
- (2) Op HOMEWARD. NTR. CO BRITCON wishes to conduct a movement of DPs in the KIBEHO area on Sun 30 OCT. HAC will advise UNHCR KIGALI and it is requested that Tac HQ advise UNHCR BUTARE.

b. Humanitarian Assistance.

- (1) BRITCON assisted with the delivery of seeds to KIBUYE for Swiss Disaster Relief.
- (2) UNAMIR assisted COMPASSION INTERNATIONAL in transporting goods for orphans from St Paul orphanage in KIGALI to MASACA orphanage some 20 kms from KIGALI.
- (3) AFRICARE asked for UNAMIR assistance in providing a bulldozer to clear a dump. Request was already discussed with BRITCON engineers. Representative was directed to BRITCON Engineers to discuss details.
- (4) IOM requested UNAMIR assistance in grading about 4 km of dirt road to include provision of culverts where required. The road leads to the new DP way station for KIGALI.

c. Miscellaneous.

- (1) IOM reported that one of its employees was hit deliberately by an RPA vehicle while driving a motorcycle. The incident took place in CYANGUGU. Sector 4C requested to investigate.
- (2) UNREO requests a full report on the state of the bridge over River AKANYARU at GR RT 2947. Information is required to determine its use for transport vehicles carrying IDPs East. Tac HQ requested to investigate and report.

1. **GEN SITUATION.** THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. IN SECTOR 4A GIKONGORO, THE PREFECT OF THE AREA HELD A FORUM WITH DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) AT KIBEHO GR 5007 AND ADVISED DPs OF THE NEED TO RETURN HOME AND ABOUT THEIR BEHAVIOUR DURING RELIEF DISTRIBUTION.

B. IN SECTOR 3, 7 RPA SOLDIERS ON PTL AT RURUMBA GR 4726 WERE ATTACKED BY LOCALS ARMED WITH MACHETES, SPEARS AND OTHER LOCAL WPNS. THE SOLDIERS WERE RESCUED BY GHANBATT TPS IN AN APC WHO LATER CONVEYED THEM TO THEIR BASE AT KIVU GR 8310. A SISTER AND A CHILD OF ONE OF THE SOLDIERS WHO WERE ALSO THREATENED BY THE LOCALS WERE ESCORTED TO BUTARE.

C. IN SECTOR 3, REPORTS INDICATED AN INFLOW OF DPs INTO BUTARE FROM SURROUNDING AREA OF RUNYINYA COMMUNE GR 6012, DUE TO INSECURITY IN THE AREA FOLLOWING THE RECENT KILLING OF THE TEN PEOPLE.

D. ONE PRIVATE SOLDIER OF MALAWI COY WHO WAS REPORTED MISSING WAS LATER FOUND TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY THE RPA THE SOLDIER WAS LATER RELEASED AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE RPA LO. THE MATTER IS BEING INVESTIGATED.

E. AT GATUNA AND GAKITUMBA BORDER POSTS RWANDESE IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS INFORMED MILOBS IN THE AREA THAT THEY REQUIRE A LETTER FROM RPA LO IN KIGALI PERMITTING THEM TO CONDUCT BORDER MONITORING DUTIES.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS WITHIN AO. ONE PRIVATE SOLDIER WHO WAS REPORTEDLY UNDER ARREST BY RPA WAS RELEASED AND THE MATTER IS BEING INVESTIGATED.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE BORDER POST BETWEEN RWANDA AND BURUNDI NEAR BUGARAMA CITY WAS CLOSED BY SOLDIERS FROM BURUNDI.

B. ETHIOBATT HAVE REPORTED THAT A REFUGEE FROM BURUNDI, NOW STAYING IN BUGERAMA, HAS CLAIMED THAT SOLDIERS IN BURUNDI ARE FIRING AGAINST OPPOSITION FORCES AND THAT HE SAW 2 BODIES AND 2 HOUSES DESTROYED.

C. BRITCON REPORTED THAT THE LARGER OF THE MASS GRAVES AT CYANIKA (GR 5630) IS AGAIN SUFFERING THE EFFECTS OF HEAVY RAIN. DECOMPOSING BODY MATERIAL AND CONTAMINATED CLOTHING HAVE BEEN BROUGHT TO THE SURFACE CAUSING A HEALTH RISK.

D. A CATHOLIC SISTER IN KARAMA (GR 6011) HAS REPORTED THAT THE BODIES OF 15,000 PEOPLE, KILLED IN APRIL, ARE STILL LYING UNBURIED IN THE AREA. SHE EXPRESSED CONCERN AT THE HEALTH HAZARD POSED BY THESE BODIES. A MILOB TEAM WILL VISIT THE AREA IN ORDER TO VERIFY THIS REPORT.

(1) MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA CONTINUED TO TRAIN NEW RECRUITS IN KIBUYE AND DEPLOYED TROOPS AROUND NDABA DP CAMP AFTER THE EXPULSION OF ALL DPS ON 18 OCT 94. IT IS REPORTED THAT THE RPA REMOVED ALL OF THE BELONGINGS ABANDONED BY THE DPS DURING THE EXPULSION.

PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 25 LOCALS. A TEAM OF CONTRACTORS FROM UNAMIR HQ VISITED NICOY PL LOC IN KIBUNGO TO FIX A WATER TANK.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS..

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY). CONDUCTED PATROL WITHIN AOR.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT DAY AND

DURING PATROLS GEN SECURITY SITUATION WAS FOUND NORMAL. ON 16 OCT 94 MILOB TEAM ALONG WITH HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM WENT TO NYARUBUSE GR 8458 ON A RECCE MISSION. THE TEAM FOUND APP 400 SKELETONS NEAR A CHURCH GR 837588 WHILE ANOTHER GROUP OF 50 SKELETONS WERE SEEN IN A DISPENSARY AT GR 844589. THE SKELETONS WERE LYING IN AND AROUND THE BUILDING. ON INQUIRY, IT WAS LEARNT THAT THE KILLINGS WERE CARRIED OUT BY GENDARMERIE, INTERHAMWE AND LOCAL HUTUS ON 15 APRIL 94. MILOBS COULD OBSERVE THAT SOME OF THE HOUSES WERE STILL MARKED WITH THE WORD HUTU. LOCALS INFORMED THAT THIS MARKING USED TO DIFFERENTIATE BETWEEN HUTU AND TUTSI FAMILIES. THE MILOB TEAM RECOVERED ONE ID CARD OF A TUTSI GIRL FROM THE CHURCH.

(5) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA.

(A) SECTOR COMD WENT TO INVESTIGATE THE MURDER OF CATHOLIC PRIEST CLAUDE SIMARD. 1 X MILOB TEAM ESCORTED ONE UN TANKER WITH 20,000 LTR OF WATER FROM BUTARE TO KITABI FOR DELIVER TO BRITCON. ANOTHER MILOB TEAM WENT TO BURUNDI BORDER FROM BUTARE TO OBSERVE THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THAT LOC. MILOB WENT TO MUYIZE COMMUNE TO MONITOR THE CONDITION OF THE RETURNEES. THE TEAM OBSERVED MOST OF THE RETURNEES WERE HAPPY AND STARTED BUSINESS AND FARMING. RETURNEES HOWEVER COMPLAINED REGARDING INSUFFICIENT FARMING EQUIPMENTS AND SEEDS TO PLANT.

(B) A CATHOLIC SISTER HOLANTA ROSTRZENSKA OF THE PETIE SERVANTE AT KARAMA GR 6011 REPORTED ABOUT 15000 UNBURIED DEAD BODIES KILLED DURING APRIL 94. THESE BODIES ARE STILL LYING OPEN, WHICH HAS BECOME SERIOUS HEALTH HAZZARD IN THAT AREA. 1 X MILOB TEAM WILL VISIT THE LOCATION TO CONFIRM THE PRESENT SITUATION.

(6) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. 343 DPs WERE EVACUATED FROM CYANIKA TO KIGALI. IT WAS MONITORED BY MILOBS. MILOB TEAM ASSISTED THE EVACUATION OF 421 DPs FROM KADUHA TO NGENDA.

(7) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. 195 DPs WERE ESCORTED BY MILOBS FROM RUTSIRO GR 8331 INTO SECTOR 4B. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT IN AND AROUND THE SECTOR.

SITUATION FOUND NORMAL.

(8) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. SECTOR COMD MET THE DEPUTY COMD OF RPA AT CYANGUGU AND DISCUSSED ON VARIOUS PROBLEMS OF THE SECTOR. PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT AT BUGARAMA TOWN AND DIFFERENT BORDER POSTS. SITUATION OBSERVED NORMAL. MILOB TEAM ESCORTED REP OF BROWN AND ROOT FOR INSPECTION OF ROADS AT BUGARAMA TOWN. TEAM LEADER OF BUGARAMA SUB SECTOR MET THE BUGERMASTER OF GISHOMA AND DISCUSSED ON VARIOUS HUM MATTERS.

(9) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. ROUTINE PATROLS AND BORDER MONITORING ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED WITHIN AOR.

(10) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. PTLs WERE CONDUCTED IN SECTOR. 1 X MILOB TEAM CARRIED OUT PATROLS TO KAGUGU GR 095887 AND RUBUNGO GR 193853. ON DISCUSSION THE COMMUNE LEADER OF RUBUNGO MR MOUSONERA INFORMED THE TEAM THAT THERE WERE 15,000 PEOPLE LIVING IN THAT AREA. THERE WAS NO REFUGEE CAMP IN THE COMMUNE. HOWEVER THERE IS ONE ORPHANAGE WITH 250 CHILDREN ARE RUNED BY LOCAL STAFF. THE TEAM OBSERVED THAT MOST OF THE SCHOOLS REOPENED AND DIFFERENT MARKETS FUNCTIONING NORMAL. ELECTRICITY AND WATER SUPPLY YET TO BE RESUMED. THE SECURITY SITUATION IS NOT SATISFACTORY AS SOME BANDITRY TOOK PLACE IN THAT COMMUNE. ONE OF THE NGO STAFF COMPLAINED THAT THERE ARE POOR COORDINATION AMONG THE NGOS WORKING IN THAT AREA. THE MILOB TEAM FAILED TO MEET THE COMMUNE LEADER AND OTHER OFFICIALS AT KAGUGU. LOCALS COMPLAINED THAT MOST OF THE TIME THE COMMUNE OFFICE REMAIN CLOSED. 210 DPs WERE ESCORTED BY MILOBs FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO. ANOTHER TEAM ESCORTED DPs TO NGENDA. 1 X MILOB TEAM ESCORTED 25 DPs FROM KIGALI TO BUGESERA AND ESCORTED BACK 50 DPs TO KIGALI.

Kigali, 4 Nov.94 - UNAMIR on Thursday released the preliminary report on the massacre of 36 civilians on Sunday night in Gisenyi prefecture near the Zaire-Rwanda border. The report says that unidentified armed attackers may have infiltrated from across Zairian border.

- Rwandan Vice-President Paul Kagame, who is also Minister for Defense, on Thursday for the first time condemned the conduct of soldiers who are involved in revenge killings and banditry acts, while visiting the troops in Kibungo prefecture.

-15 NGOs on Thursday issued a statement in Nairobi warning that they may withdraw from the camps for Rwandan refugees in Zaire where it becomes increasingly dangerous to work because of the escalation of violence carried out by armed ex-soldiers and militia. The NGOs ask for the international community to send peace-keeping troops there to insure security.

-The Special Representative of the UN Secretary-General in Rwanda, Shaharyar Khan, on Thursday left Kigali for a 10-day tour in Europe, where he will visit Belgium, France, Great Britain and Germany, to ask for increased assistance to Rwanda.

-The problem of children in Rwandan prisons for suspected involvement in the massacres was on Thursday the subject of talks between Rwandan Minister for family and women's affairs, Aloysie Inyumba, and visiting German Rhineland Minister for sports and interior, Walter Zuber.

Kigali, 29 Oct.94 - Rwandan government Friday published the list of newly-appointed prefects of prefectures. The new prefects are mainly males and civilians, except for the prefect of Kigali city who is a military woman, Major Rose Kabuye.

-The Rwandan Ministry of Transport on Friday decided to reduce by half the price of transport in the country for passengers in collective taxis and public buses. In Kigali city, the price of transport is reduced from 100 rwf to 50 rwf, with effect starting from November 1, 94.

- Radio Rwanda on Friday reported acts of insecurity in Butare prefecture where "banditry-related attacks in Gishamvu commune left 7 people killed Thursday night in one incident and in another incident Wednesday left 1 bandit killed and 1 gendarme injured in a grenade attack."

- Rwandan Minister for Information Friday announced that 6 newspapers including one official newspaper Imvaho are now operational in Rwanda. He also indicated that over 35 journalists, mainly of the private press, were killed during the massacres.

-Rwandan Prime Minister Faustin Twagiramungu Friday closed the international seminar in Kigali on human rights and reconstruction of Rwanda. The seminar made recommendations on the problems of impunity, justice, repatriation of refugees and reconstruction.

Kigali, 2 Oct.94 - " 36 civilians were on Sunday night massacred in the secteur Nyanzovu in Rwerere commune and secteur Byahi in Rubavu commune, in Gisenyi prefecture, on the border area between Rwanda and Zaire. The killers are not known, but are believed to be Interahamwe militia men infiltrated from their refuge in Zaire. The victims belong to 3 families, Radio Rwanda announced Tuesday, citing the army commander of the area, Colonel Charles Kayonga.

- Radio Rwanda also on Tuesday reported that the NGO Care International decided to withdraw its workers from Gisenyi area following insecurity acts.

- Continued insecurity was on Tuesday reported in Kibuye prefecture due to "illegally held weapons by Interahamwe militia men who live in their hideouts at the countryside."

-Radio Rwanda on Tuesday announced" continued talks over the setting up of an international tribunal on the genocide in Rwanda. Rwanda government wants death penalty to be enforced as stipulated under the Rwandan law and the tribunal to be based in Rwanda, while the UN Security Council is opposed to death penalty and wants the tribunal to sit in the Hague in Netherlands. Definitive decision will come on Monday with a vote in the UN Security Council."

Kigali, 3 Nov.94 - President Pasteur Bizimungu of Rwanda Wednesday returned in Kigali from a 3-day state visit to Kuwait. In an interview with Radio Rwanda, he said that Kuwait promised to examine the possibility of financing some development projects in Rwanda.

On the question that some countries require the participation of members of the former government in the current government as a precondition to resume their aid to Rwanda, President Bizimungu castigated the attitude of those countries and rejected any possibility of "working in solidarity with criminals who should rather be brought to court to be judged."

-Rwandan Prime Minister Faustin Twagiramungu Wednesday held a news conference in Kigali to give an assessment of the government action on the 100th day in power. " Our government has inherited empty coffers and cannot therefore finance government expenditures. We suffer shortage of medical personnel and we can get only 60% of needed food stuffs. We have however also known some successes like the setting up of administration structures and resumption of transport inside and outside the country.

Speaking on the question of security, Mr.Twagiramungu said that security is generally good in the country and refugees can return home without fears. He indicated however that the question of property seized by force is "a serious one and unacceptable. Property must be returned to owners. The government must take urgent measures on this question and the question of homeless returnees who have no shelter."

On the question of the international tribunal to judge those accused of the crime of genocide in Rwanda, Twagiramungu said that an envoy of the UN Secretary-General will arrive soon in Rwanda to discuss the issues of death penalty and location of the tribunal. He said that the UN Security Council will pass a resolution on the issue next Tuesday. The Rwandan government position is to avoid impunity repeating again whether death penalty is enforced or not he said.

-Insecurity reported Wednesday in Butare with " murders carried out by Interahamwe militia men infiltrated from Burundi and young men going to Burundi from Butare to undergo military training.

Au nom de mes confrères dans l'Episcopat, je m'adresse à vos Organismes Humanitaires pour vous soumettre un projet de demande d'aides d'urgence en faveur d'environ trois millions de personnes qui ont dû précipitamment abandonner leurs biens à la suite des combats qui ont repris au Rwanda en avril 1994. Ces milliers de déplacés disséminés ou groupés dans certaines localités sont confrontés à tant de misère : le manque de nourriture, de logement, d'habits, de soins médicaux frappe particulièrement et cruellement des femmes enceintes, des malades, des vieillards et des enfants. Notre personnel sacerdotal et religieux n'est pas épargné de ces épreuves.

Selon un récent recensement, en 1991 le Rwanda comptait 7.149.215 habitants. Avec le début de la guerre en octobre 1990, le mouvement de la population fuyant les zones de combats a occasionné un nombre de plus en plus accru de personnes déplacées dans les Préfectures de BYUMBA, RUHENGERI, KIBUNGO, KIGALI, GITARAMA et BUTARE. Le nombre de déplacés de guerre est actuellement estimé à 3 millions et la population des Préfectures d'accueil (soit 2.500.000 habitants dans Gikongoro, Cyangugu, Kibuye, Gisenyi et Ruhengeri) n'est pas en mesure de leur offrir des conditions de vie souhaitées. Le reste de la population évaluée à 2 millions de personnes se trouve dans une situation difficile à préciser : certains sont décédés, d'autres se sont réfugiés dans les pays limitrophes ou se trouvent dans la zone occupée par le Front Patriotique Rwandais.

La carte du Rwanda ci-jointe vous présente des camps regroupant beaucoup de déplacés de guerre qui attendent votre générosité :

- Préfecture de Gikongoro : Kibeho, Gikongoro, Cyanika, Murambi, Kaduha.

- Préfecture de Cyangugu : Kirambo, Cyangugu, Kamembe, Nyarushishi
- Préfecture de Kibuye : Sanza
- Préfecture de Gisenyi : Gisenyi.

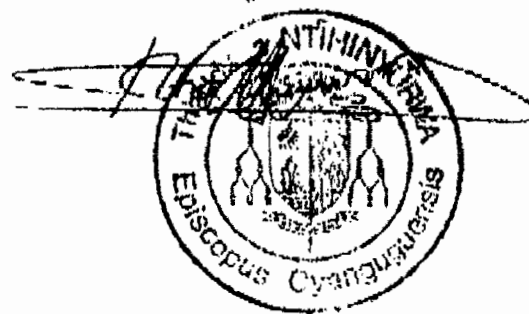

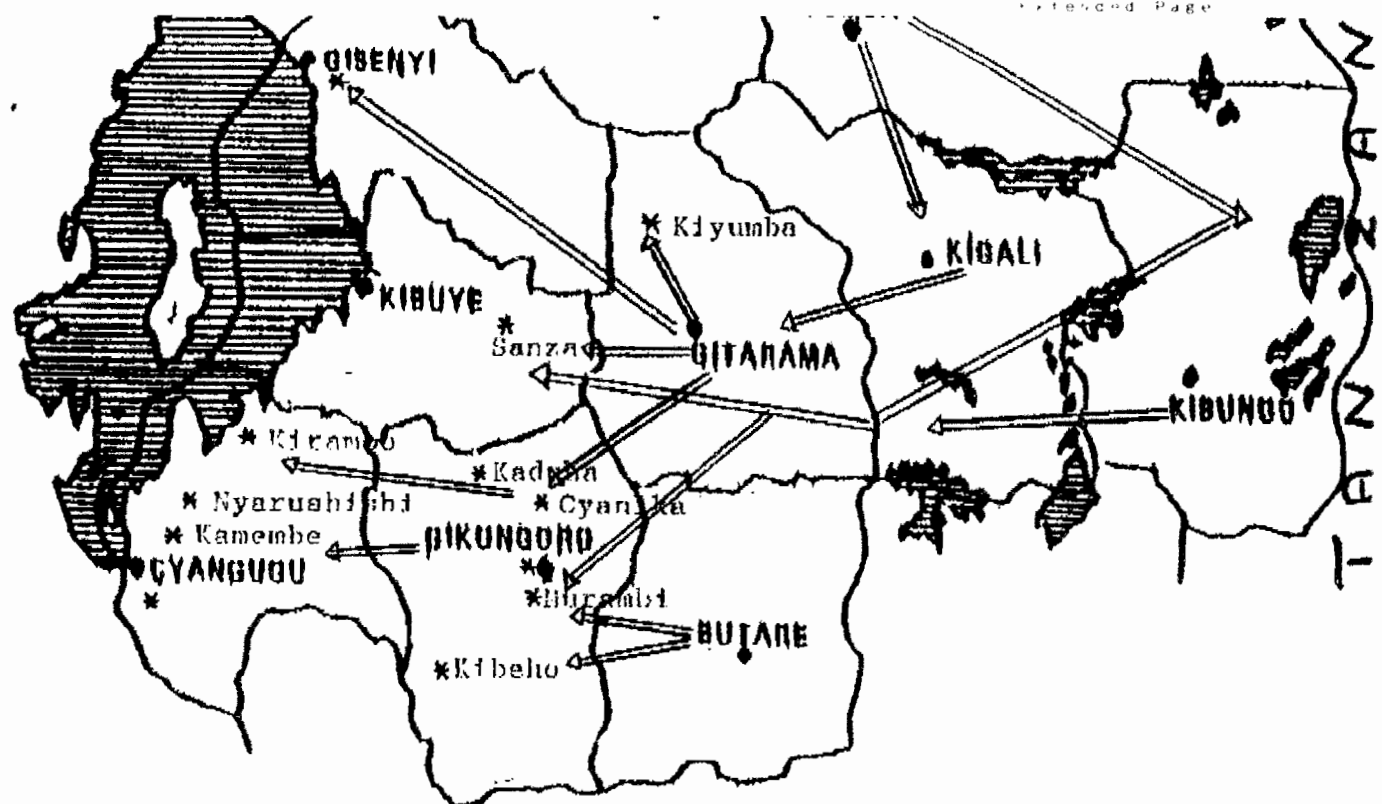

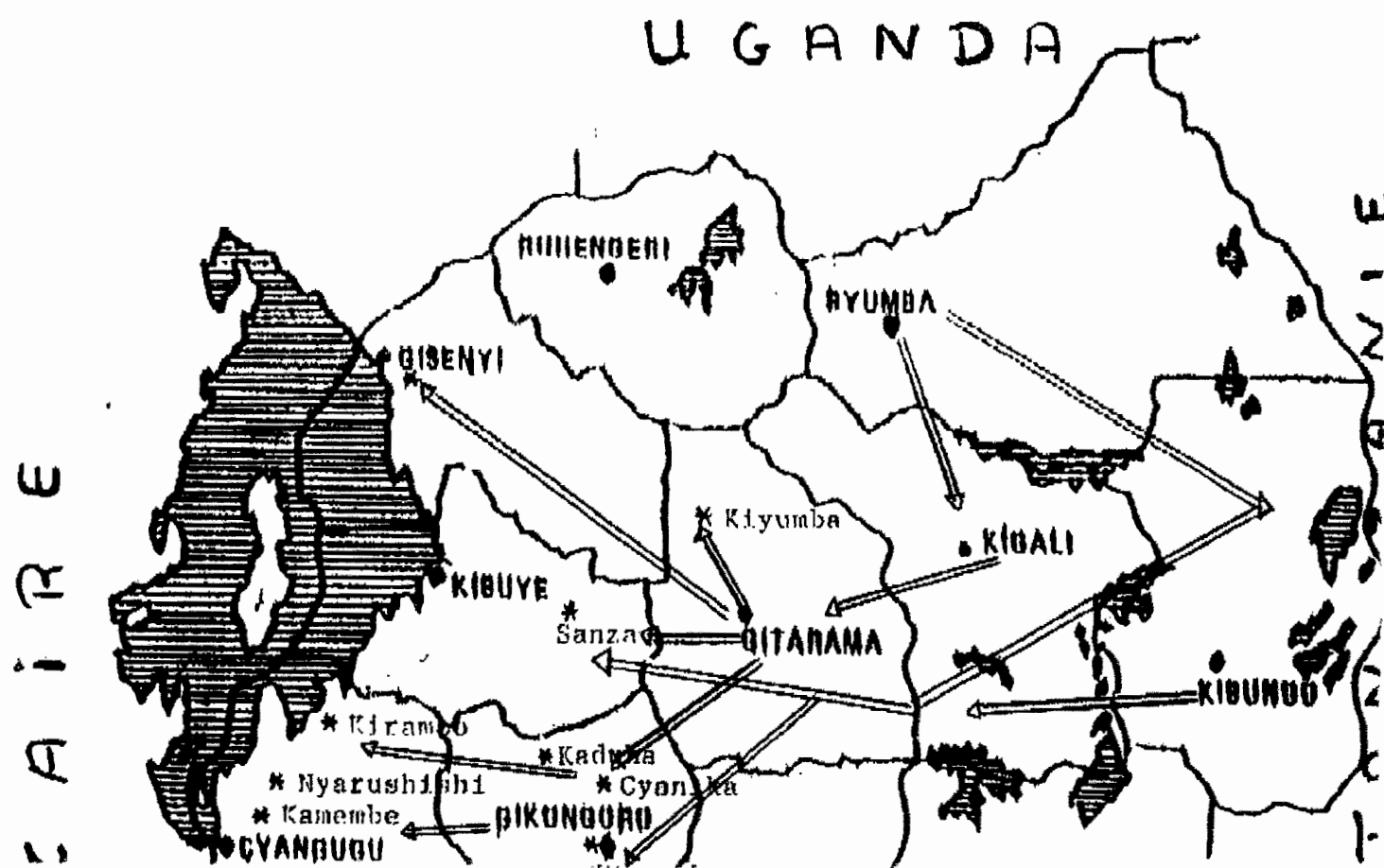

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 240601 TO 250600 AUG 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE SITUATION REMAINED CALM IN KIGALI AND ITS SURROUNDING AREAS. IN THE LAST TWO DAYS THERE HAVE BEEN REPORTS OF INCIDENTS WHERE DRUNK RPA SOLDIERS TRIED TO FORCE THEIR WAY INSIDE UNAMIR OR NGOS INSTALLATIONS. IN SOME INSTANCES WEAPONS HAVE BEEN POINTED AT UN PERS AND VEHICLES. DFC IS TO ADDRESS THIS SITUATION WITH THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES SOONEST. THE SITUATION IN SECTOR 4 IS RELATIVELY CALM. THE ROAD AND BRIDGES CONDITION ARE DETERIORATING RAPIDLY. REFUGEES ARE STILL DEPARTING FOR ZAIRE. ESTIMATED 7,000 CROSSED AND FURTHER 6,000 WAITING. REFUGEES FROM CYANGUGU WERE DEBRIEFED BY UNMOS IN BUTARE AND REFUGEES CLAIM RGF ARE PLANING TO ATTACK ETHIOBATT PERS AS CLAIM THEY ARE RELATED TO TUTSI. UNMOS IN SECTOR 4A AND 4C WILL INVESTIGATE THESE ALLEGATIONS. THERE WAS INFORMATION FROM A UNAMIR OFFICER ON A RECCE OF AIRPORTS IN SECTOR 4 THAT THERE WAS SOME RIOTING AMONGST REFUGEES IN AREA OF AIRPORT OF BUKAVU AND THAT SOME SHOTS WERE FIRED. UNMOS ARE TO INVESTIGATE. IN KIGALI LIFE IS GRADUALLY COMING BACK TO NORMAL, WORK ON THE INSTALLATION OF WATER AND ELECTRICITY CONTINUES.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG AND THE FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH GENERAL GATZINSZI, THE FORMER CHIEF OF STAFF OF THE RGF WHO HAS COME BACK TO LIVE IN KIGALI.

B. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND HIS POLITICAL AFFAIRS OFFICER ATTENDED A MEETING OF TWENTY EUROPEAN AND AFRICAN AMBASSADORS CHAIRED BY RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER NDAGIJIMANA. MR. NDAGIJIMANA'S SPEECH FOCUSED ON THE GOVERNMENT'S OBJECTIVES OF:

- (1) ESTABLISHING LAW AND ORDER;
- (2) ESTABLISHING AN INDEPENDENT AND TRANSPARENT JUDICIAL BRANCH;
- (3) ENCOURAGING MULTI-PARTY DEMOCRACY;
- (4) ENCOURAGING INCLUSIVENESS IN BOTH THE CURRENT GOVERNMENT AND IN THE NATIONAL ARMY;
- (5) ENCOURAGING THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES;
- (6) ENCOURAGING THE DEPLOYMENT OF HUMAN RIGHTS OBSERVERS AND THE RESPECT OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN RWANDA;

(7) RECONSTRUCTING THE COUNTRY (NEED FOR FINANCIAL SUPPORT);

THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, IN HIS SPEECH, EMPHASIZED UNAMIR'S SUCCESSFUL TAKE-OVER OF SECTOR 4 AND UNAMIR'S COORDINATION WITH THE GOVERNMENT IN MATTERS OF HUMAN RIGHTS, SECURITY, THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES AND THE RE-ESTABLISHMENT OF CIVILIAN AUTHORITIES IN SECTOR 4.

C. THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT TRAVELLED TO RUHENGARI, ACCOMPANIED BY THE FORCE COMMANDER AND THE UNAMIR INFORMATION OFFICER. THE DELEGATION ATTENDED A POLITICAL RALLY AT THE RUHENGARI STADIUM. THERE WERE APPROXIMATELY 25,000 PEOPLE IN ATTENDANCE. THE RWANDAN OFFICIALS SPOKE PRINCIPALLY ABOUT MATTERS OF SECURITY, JUSTICE, LAW AND ORDER, THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES, THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CIVILIAN INFRASTRUCTURE IN SECTOR 4 AND HUMAN RIGHTS. THE RECEPTION WAS VERY POSITIVE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. THERE HAS BEEN NUMEROUS INCIDENTS IN THE LAST FEW DAYS WHERE RPA SOLDIERS HAVE POINTED WEAPONS AT UNAMIR/NGOs PERS AND VEHICLES. THEY HAVE ALSO ATTEMPTED TO ENTER SOME OF OUR FACILITIES WITHOUT PRIOR AUTHORITY. DFC IS TO ADDRESS THIS WITH RPA AUTHORITIES SO THESE INTIMIDATING ACTIVITIES CEASE. THEY CONTINUE TO PATROL AND MAN CHECK POINTS IN AND AROUND KIGALI.

B. RGF. UNCONFIRMED REPORTS FROM REFUGEES INDICATE THAT RGF ARE INCITING VIOLENCE TOWARDS ETHIOBATT.

C. MILITIA. ACTS OF BANDITRY CONTINUED TO BE REPORTED FROM SECTOR 4.

.. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL WORK WAS CONDUCTED. DFC HELD BRIEF AT 0800 HRS. MUCH DISCUSSION WENT ON IN REGARDS TO THE VEHICLES STATE IN THE MISSION AND WHAT ACTION SHOULD BE TAKEN TO UPGRADE AND MAINTAIN THE VEHICLES WHICH ARE ACTUALLY IN POOR CONDITION. ALSO A DECISION IS TO BE TAKEN SOON IN REGARDS TO THE USE OF LIGHT VEHICLES VICE APC SINCE ROAD CONDITION FAVOUR LT VEHs. THE FC ATTENDED A POLITICAL RALLY IN RUHENGARI WITH THE PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT, PRIME MINISTER AND MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT. THIS MEETING WAS ATTENDED BY APPROX 25,000 PERS. THE DFC CAUTIONED ALL BRANCH HEADS TO BE SECURITY CONSCIOUS AND ADVISE THEIR PERS IN ACCORDINGLY.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION WAS CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN SECTOR OF RESPONSIBILITY.

C. GHANBATT. GEN SITUATION IN AREA IS CALM. AT 240945B AUG 94 RPA PERS SENT 8 X POWS TO KING FAISAL HOSP FOR TREATMENT. POWS LOOKED FRAIL AND THEY HAD WOUNDS ON THEIR ELBOW JOINTS. THEY APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN TIED WITH ROPES. RPA ARE PROVIDING GDS AS LONG AS POW ARE HOSPITALIZED. CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS IN THE AREA. LOCALS COMPLAINED OF ABSENCE OF NGOS TO GIVE ASSISTANCE. CONTINUED PROVISION OF SECURITY AND GDS AT AICF WAREHOUSE AND CENTRE DE SANTE AT CYANIKA. 1 X AK47 MAG WITH 28 RDS WAS CONFISCATED AT CHECK POINT AT RWAMBA. TPS IN KIGALI CONTINUED TRG ON APC M113. A PLATOON DEPLOYED AT MUNINI GR 4800. MORALE OF TPS IS HIGH.

D. MILOB GP. CONTINUED TO MONITOR SITUATION PARTICULARLY IN SECTOR 4. THE FIRST BATCH OF MILOBS HAVE COMPLETED THEIR TRAINING AND OTHER ADMIN FORMALITIES AND ARE AWAITING TO BE POSTED INTO VARIOUS SECTORS. ESCORTED NUMEROUS CONVOYS DURING THE DAY FROM KIGALI TO DIFFERENT LOCATIONS. PEOPLE ARE COMING BACK HOME IN GOOD NUMBERS IN SECTOR 3. THERE WAS A CLASH AT KABGAYI BETWEEN REFUGEES AND LAND OWNER WHO IS A POTATO HARVESTER. MILOB ASSISTED BY RPA RESCUED SIX INJURED PERS WHO WERE EVACUATED TO MSF HOSP AT GITARAMA. AFTER INVESTIGATION IT WAS FOUND THAT THERE WAS NO FOOD AVAILABLE FOR REFUGEES FOR LAST TWO DAYS. THE REFUGEES WENT INSIDE THE VILLAGE IN SEARCH OF FOOD AND THUS THE QUARREL STARTED. MILOB WENT TO MUSHUBIATI GR 6871 TO COLLECT FOOD FOR THE REFUGEES. IN BUSEKUA MILOB TEAM FOUND OUT THAT OF THE 3,000 INHABITANT 2,000 HAVE SO FAR BEEN RETURNED TO THEIR HOME. THEY ALSO FOUND THAT PEOPLE IN THE AREA ARE BUSY CULTIVATING. IT APPEARS THAT SO FAR PEOPLE IN THAT AREA ARE SURVIVING ONLY ON BANANA. IN BUTARE AREA UNHCR STARTED MOVING REFUGEES FROM KIZI TO RPA CONTROLLED AREA. ABOUT 127 PERS CROSSED SECTOR 4 AND ENTERED RPA AREA BY TRUCKS. ABOUT 2,200 DISPLACED PERS WENT FROM CYANGUGU TO ZAIRE. THE CHIEF OF THE COMMUNE OF BUTARE EXPRESSED THAT PEOPLE IN THAT AREA ARE IN NEED OF BLANKETS AND TOOLS TO CULTIVATE IN THE FIELD OTHER THAN FOOD.

E. BRITCON. 23 PFA ARE TO COLLECT THEIR FIRST MED RESUP FROM PSF. MED SECTIONS HAVE BEEN DEPLOYED TO THREE REFUGEES CAMPS AROUND KITABI AND IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THERE ARE 60,000 REFUGEES WITHIN 23 PFA'S IMMEDIATE TAOR. BOTH ABUTMENTS AT THE GATUNA BRIDGE ARE NOW COMPLETE. SPARES FOR NON UK VEHICLES AND EQPT ARE NOW BECOMING A PROBLEM.

F. CAN SIGS.

(1) TO THIS DATE, HF VOICE AND INMARSAT COMMUNICATION HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED BETWEEN UNAMIR HQ AND SECTORS 4A, 4B, 4C, 5 AND 2 (CAN) FD AMBULANCE. HF ONLY WITH MILOB, BRITCON, AUSCON AND CANCON AND SECTOR 1.

(2) RRB DET DEPARTED FOR KIBUYE THIS MORNING. RRB TESTS WERE CONDUCTED AT KARONGI. RAD TP COMD DID ROAD RECCE OF THE KIBUYE - KARONGI ROAD AND CONFIRMED RD IS PASSABLE FOR WHEEL VEH.

(3) MICROWAVE LINK BETWEEN THE NIANZA SATELLITE SITE AND RWANDA TEL HAS BEEN RESTORED WITH THE HELP OF OUR TECHNICIANS.

G. AUSMED. BUILD UP OF PERS VEH AND STORES CONTINUED AT CHK AND BKS. PERS STR IS NOW 276. AUSMED TREATMENT SECTION IS BEING DEPLOYED TO BUTARE WITH 58 PERS AND CYANGUGU WITH 32 PERS. THE SITUATION WITH NON POTABLE WATER IS CRITICAL AND REQ URGENT ACTION TO REMEDY THIS PROBLEM. RPA ARE STILL HARASSING OUR SOLDIERS AT CHECK POINT.

H. ETHIOBATT. SITUATION IN SECTOR IS CALM. 300 REFUGEES RETURNED FROM ZAIRE THROUGH BUGARAMA AND AROUND 300 CROSSED TO ZAIRE IN MIRURU. THE NUMBER OF REFUGEES SEEMS TO BE INCREASING. THE BN COMD GROUP VISITED GISAKURA AND NAMASHAKI AREAS.

5. US FORCES. CONTINUED TO CONTROL FLIGHTS AT KIA IN COORDINATION WITH UNAMIR. A TOTAL NUMBER OF 34 FLIGHTS ARRIVED IN KIA.

6. UNCIVPOL. CONTINUE TO TRAIN NEW GENDARMES.

7. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES

A. HAC CONDUCTED PATROL OF ORPHANAGES IN KIGALI AND IN RAMAGANA. HELPED ONE WOMAN LOCATE HER CHILDREN IN CYANGUGU AND BROUGHT THEM BACK TO KIGALI.
