1. Referring to your telephone conversation with Mr. Schmid last Saturday, 14 March 1964, I shall be grateful if you will confirm my understanding regarding disposal of aircraft as follows:

- (a) Two C47's are set aside, and ten other C47's have been offered for disposal to the Congolese Government;
- (b) Two Otters are available within the Congo, while two more Otters will be flown in from Gaza;
- (c) Five helicopters are available within the Congo. Neither the Otters nor the helicopters have been offered to the Government.
- (d) No action will be taken to dispose of the two C47's, the Otters, or the helicopters unless you have my confirmation in writing: at present it appears that Civilian Operations may have need of all those aircraft.

Dear Dave,

..... Attached is correspondence concerning the disposal of surpluses to Civilian Operations.

As you can see, their ideas had gotten pretty far from what I believe you intended. Luscombe's proposal that we simply turn over to Civilian Operations all of the scrap automatically, I have vetoed. I have agreed, however, that whenever Civ. Ops can designate a particular lot of scrap as being for use on one of their projects, and will certify that it is remaining under the control of Technical Assistance personnel until the project is completed or abandoned, I will turn the material over at once. I also pointed out to them that there is no use moving a lot of scrap from one junk yard to another, since they are not going to be able to use the tremendous quantities of scrap that we are going to generate between now and August. I have gone one step further and said that if they saw any scrap material that they wanted which had not yet been declared surplus, I would make a special effort to speed up the Survey Board procedure, even to the point of delivering the scrap and obtaining post facto Survey Board approval.

The second question raised by the enclosed memorandum of Mr. George Tafall has now been resolved. It was my position that when you set up two types of sales to the Congolese government in your memo of 24 January you must have had a reason for doing it; the only reason I could see was that you felt that there would be sales of surplus items, particularly vehicles, to the Congolese government for direct use in connection with Civilian Operations projects. I was present when Ahmed made his proposal and it is my distinct recollection that this was what he told you. The Civ. Ops side, however, said that we must take a broader view and that for all practical purposes any programme of the Congolese government is a Civilian Operations programme and therefore all sales of vehicles to the Congolese government should be made at 10% of the depreciated value. As I think you know, our average price per vehicle has been so far in Congolese francs, at the official rate of exchange, the equivalent of something like \$25. Since this is less than a wreck would bring for scrap in the open market, I cannot believe that the Congolese government would ever turn anything down under this interpretation.

While most of the stuff that we are selling now is in bad shape and can be classified in many instances as being pretty close to scrap, comes the end of June and some pretty good equipment will be on the market. I would hate to see some of our vehicles which are only 18 months or 2 years old, going for \$50.00 if worth \$500.00. I also find that this policy would be contradictory to the arrangement which was made for the Dodge trucks. I see no reason for the Congolese government to live up to its agreement to pay the transportation of these trucks, plus half of their purchase price, if they can get them at ten percent of their depreciated value.

The question has been pretty much resolved now, because Bibiano agreed that the interpretation was too broad. There is only the question of prices. A reasonable formula would be the sale of vehicles at a depreciated price, as opposed to either the 10% of depreciated price or the price on the open market.

However, Bibiano asks me to tell you that he feels that we are being a bit tight fisted in disposing of surpluses when we consider the proceeds of these sales in the light of having spent 120 million a year out here in the past. He is in favor of making a lump sum settlement with the Congolese government for everything we have after the Civilian Operations needs have been provided for. Let me know whether you are interested in such a scheme.

Subject: Unserviceable surplus ONUC stores and equipment

You will recall that the interested Agencies recently proposed that all unserviceable surplus ONUC stores and equipment should be handed over to them for storage, sorting and distribution among themselves. For various practical reasons (including the problem of disposing of items which eventually proved unusable by any of the Agencies), the following alternative arrangements were agreed upon with the Chief Administrative Officer:

1. Every first and third Tuesday of the month, starting 17 March at 8.30 a.m., representatives of interested Agencies, together with a representative of the Purchasing and Supply Section and a representative of Civilian Operations, will meet at the Base Ordnance Depot to inspect all unserviceable stores and equipment, whether or not these have already been declared surplus by the Survey Board.
2. The Chief Administrative Officer, by arrangement with the Military Supply and Transport Section, will make available about six trucks and drivers.
3. Agency representatives will decide on the spot which items they can use and in what quantities. These will then be loaded on the trucks for immediate despatch.
4. The Agency representatives will subsequently address notes to the Chief of Civilian Operations indicating the items and quantities taken and giving a brief justification, specifying the projects for which they will be used. A distinction will be made between durable items (which will be transferred to Civilian Operations inventories) and consumable items, for which only receipts will be required from the receiving Agency.

I shall be grateful if you will arrange for a representative of your Agency/Section to attend a meeting at 10 a.m. on 13 March in conference room N° 252 to discuss these arrangements.

Subject: Disposal of Unserviceable Equipment and Stores and Scrap at RSSD, Limete, to Civilian Operations

Discussion 11 March 1964, Lt-Col. Safdar Ali Malik/Mr. Wyatt-John refers.

1. Before disposing of unserviceable equipment and stores and scrap by public sale this Section is committed to offering it as a donation to Civilian Operations.
2. With a view to speeding-up the disposal it was agreed at a meeting held on 10 March 1964 between representatives of the Civil Administration and Civilian Operations, chaired by the Chief Administrative Officer, that the following procedure be instituted.
3. (a) On two days a month, the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays, representatives of Civilian Operations and its Agencies will be invited to meet a representative of this Section and of Ordnance at the RSSD, Limete, at 08:30 hrs. They will be shown the items of unserviceable stores and equipment and the scrap available for disposal and permitted to select such items as they can use in connection with UN projects.
- (b) The representative of this Section will be empowered to release the items required against a statement of the Agency Representative as to the Project for which it is required. Our representative will be empowered, also, to release unserviceable items and scrap even if they have not been declared for disposal by the Property Survey Board. This Section will be responsible for ensuring that the donation is subsequently cleared with the Board.




- (c) Transport, provided under arrangements to be made by the Senior Administrative Officer, will be available at the RSSD so that the selected items can be moved immediately by the Agencies' Representatives.
- (d) Vouchers would be made out by your staff and signed on-the-spot by the Representatives.

4. It is, of course, imperative that all unserviceable stores and scrap are segregated from the serviceable and repairable items as is already the case. So far as it is practical, it will obviously be of mutual advantage if the unserviceable items are located away from the serviceable and repairable.

5. It is hoped that by co-operation between Civilian Operations, the Agencies, ourselves and your good-self that disposals can be much accelerated to the advantage of all parties concerned.



The representatives of the agencies agreed that all unserviceable stores and equipment in whatever state, can be made use of in field operations or, in the worst case, as raw material for technical education and vocational training.


It was agreed ~~that I~~<sup>to</sup> write to you on behalf of all the agencies to request that all such stores and equipment should be taken over by Civilian Operations on our behalf automatically, as soon as they are released. If this can be done we will make joint arrangements for housing, sorting and distribution by agreement between the representatives of the agencies. If you agree, we shall take immediate steps to obtain suitable storage accommodation as well as the necessary guards. This equipment may be so valuable to our vocational training work that we are considering making available the services of one of the international instructors to supervise the sorting, distribution and possible recuperation of this equipment.

Should you wish reference to be made to particular projects, the vocational training project can make use of unlimited quantities of general metal scrap, unlimited quantities of batteries can be used in training Congolese in the reconstruction of old batteries, and all old springs can be remade into machettes and other agricultural tools for the rural development project.

I wish to obtain complete agreement on the mechanics of disposing of ONUC Surplus Property based on the principles set out in Mr. Vaughan's memorandum dated 24 January 1964 addressed to Mr. Seward copied to Mr. Ahmed. May I have, therefore, your confirmation of the following arrangements?

1. ONUC Property other than Vehicles

(a) Unserviceable Surplus Property

Items which are declared unserviceable will be offered to Civilian Operations. Periodically a day will be set aside by Purchasing and Supply Section to permit inspection by representatives of the various Civilian Operations programmes who have an interest in such property. The Sales Unit of the Purchasing and Supply Section will be authorised to release such property and will be responsible for recording to the Secretary, Property Survey Board the details of the transactions. There must be a restriction that the items donated are of specific interest to a Civilian Operations programme and the actual project for which they are required must be detailed.

(b) Usable or economically repairable surplus property

(i) Such items will be first offered to Civilian Operations and a specific time limit will be stated for acceptance or rejection. Failure to reply by the stipulated date will be regarded as rejection.

..../.

If Civilian Operations have need for such property a request will be submitted in writing containing a brief justification and stating the actual project for which the items are required.

There will be no charge for such property but the items will be vouchered to Civilian Operations to permit adjustment of the records.

There will be a restriction that all such transferred property will be used exclusively in connection with UN programmes and that it will not be sold or transferred to any other organization (outside the UN family) or to the Congolese Government without specific authority from U.N. Headquarters, New York.

(ii) Items of property which are not required by Civilian Operations will be offered to the Congolese Government by letter addressed to the Office of the Prime Minister and signed by the Officer-in-Charge of the mission. The letter of offer will establish a specific time limit for acceptance or rejection and property accepted by the Government will be sold to them at the normal price, i.e. cost less depreciation plus 20% administrative/handling charges.

(iii) Property which is not accepted either by Civilian Operations or the Congolese Government will be offered for public sale in accordance with normal practice.

## 2. Vehicles

### (a) B.E.R. (Unserviceable) Vehicles

These will be dealt with as in para 1(a) above.

### (b) Usable or economically repairable vehicles

(1) Vehicles will be offered to Civilian Operations for use in connection with U.N. programmes. A specific time limit will be established for acceptance or rejection and failure to reply by the stipulated date will be regarded as tantamount to rejection.

..../.



If Civilian Operations have a requirement for such vehicles a request will be submitted in writing containing a brief justification and stating the actual project for which the vehicles are required. The vehicles will be transferred to Civilian Operations free of charge and Civilian Operations will become custodians of the vehicles.

The vehicles will retain their ONUC number plates and the Civil Administration will continue to accept responsibility for maintenance, repairs and the supply of fuel in those areas where it is still operating (i.e. Leopoldville, Elizabethville and Luluabourg) until 30 June 1964.

There will be a restriction that all such transferred vehicles will be used exclusively in connection with U.N. programmes and that they will not be sold or transferred to any other organization (outside the U.N. family) or the Congolese Government without specific authority from UN Headquarters, New York.

(2) Non-standard vehicles will be offered to Civilian Operations with the understanding that Civilian Operations will be responsible for their repairs in Congolese Government workshops or by some other arrangement, but that no assistance will be requested from ONUC for the repair of these vehicles.

(3) Vehicles which are certified by Civilian Operations for sale to the Congolese Government for use on Civilian Operations projects, will be sold to the Congolese Government for 10% of their market value.

(4) Vehicles which are not certified by Civilian Operations as to be sold to the Congolese Government for use on Civilian Operations projects, will be offered to the Congolese Government at the full current market price.

(5) Vehicles accepted by the Government will become their entire responsibility for maintenance, repairs and fuel and the vehicles will not bear ONUC plate numbers.

(6) Vehicles which are not accepted by Civilian Operations or the Congolese Government under any of the conditions set out above will be offered for public sale in accordance with normal practice.



3. You will appreciate that the reduction in the operation in the Congo imposes a very severe time limit on the civil Administration in disposing of ONUC Surplus Property and I am assured that in that connection we shall receive the fullest co-operation of all in Civilian Operations who may be concerned in any way.
