Dear Mr. President,

I am writing with reference to Security Council resolution 2224 (2015) adopted on 9 June 2015, by which the Council decided to extend until 9 July 2016 the mandate of the Panel of Experts established pursuant to paragraph 29 of resolution 1929 (2010).

Accordingly, I wish to inform you that, after consulting with the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006), I have appointed the following experts:

- Mr. Mowaffaq Al-Refai, conventional arms (Jordan);
- Mr. John Christian Kessler, nuclear issues/technology (United States of America); and
- Mr. Chunjie Li, export control (People's Republic of China).

I have also reappointed the following experts to serve on the Panel for a period up to the date when each expert will reach the maximum period of service under the applicable rules and regulations of the United Nations:

- Mr. Jonathan Brewer, finance (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) until 20 November 2015;
- Mr. Thomas Mazet, customs (Germany) until 24 January 2016;
- Ms. Elena G. Vodoplova, missile issues/technology (Russian Federation) until 10 December 2015; and
- Ms. Salomé Zourabichvili, arms control and non-proliferation policy (France) until 17 November 2015.

One additional expert will be nominated at a later stage.

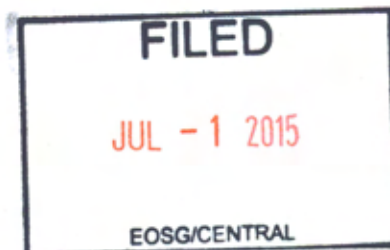
I have designated Ms. Zourabichvili to serve as Coordinator of the Panel of Experts.


