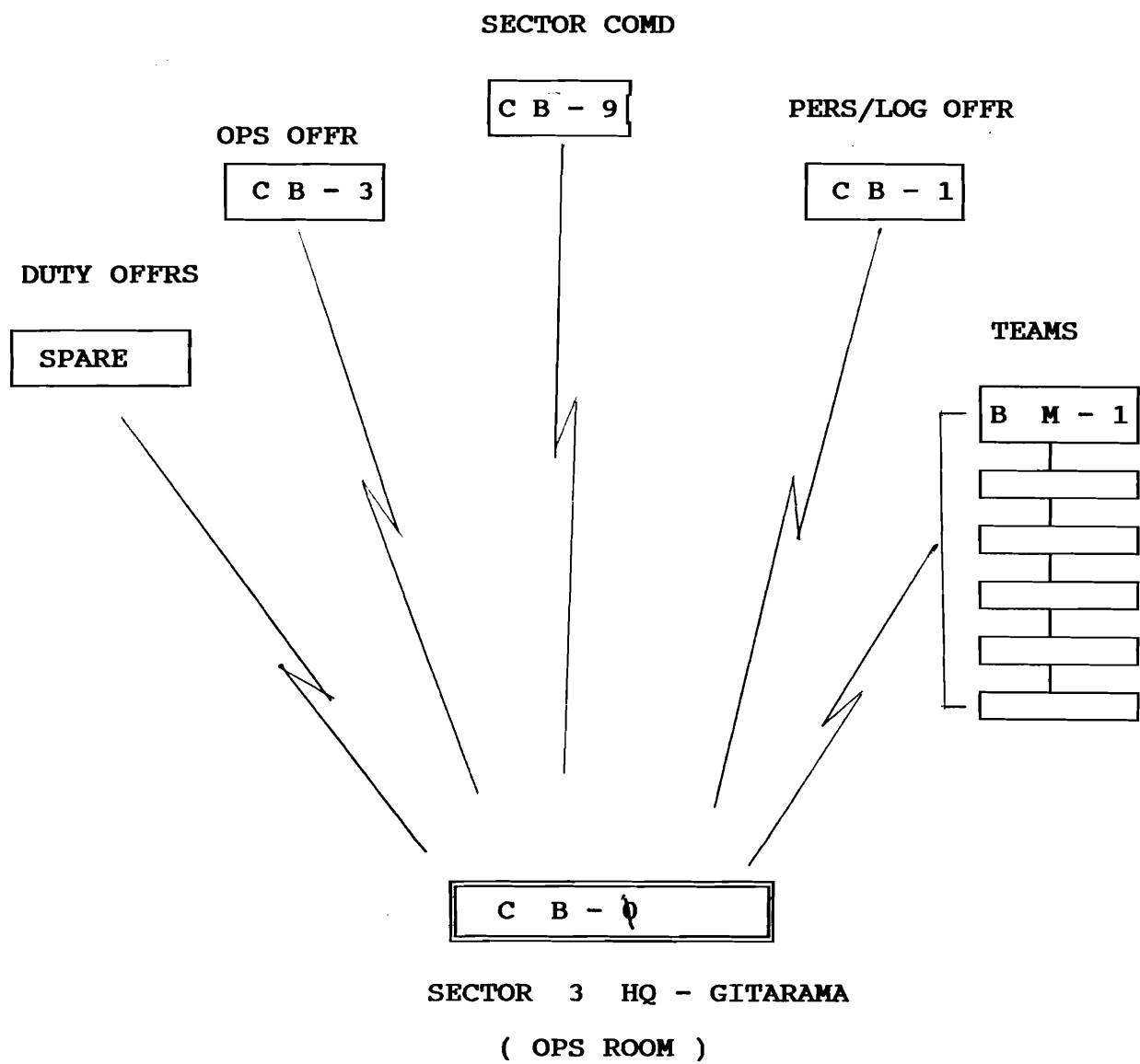
RADIO NET FOR MILOB SECTOR 1
BYUMBA (CHANNEL 14)



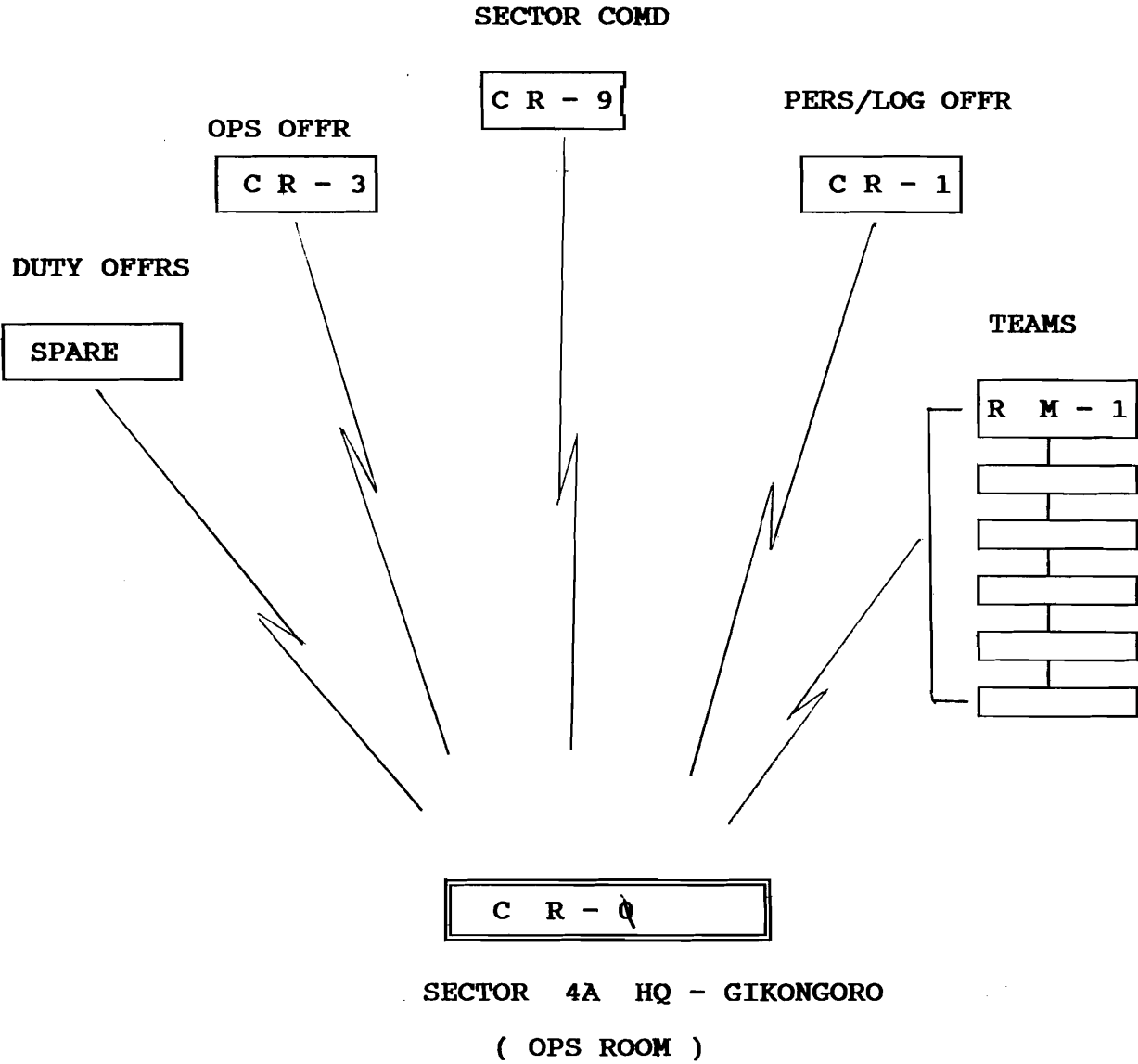
RADIO NET FOR MILOB SECTOR 2
KIGALI (CHANNEL 14)



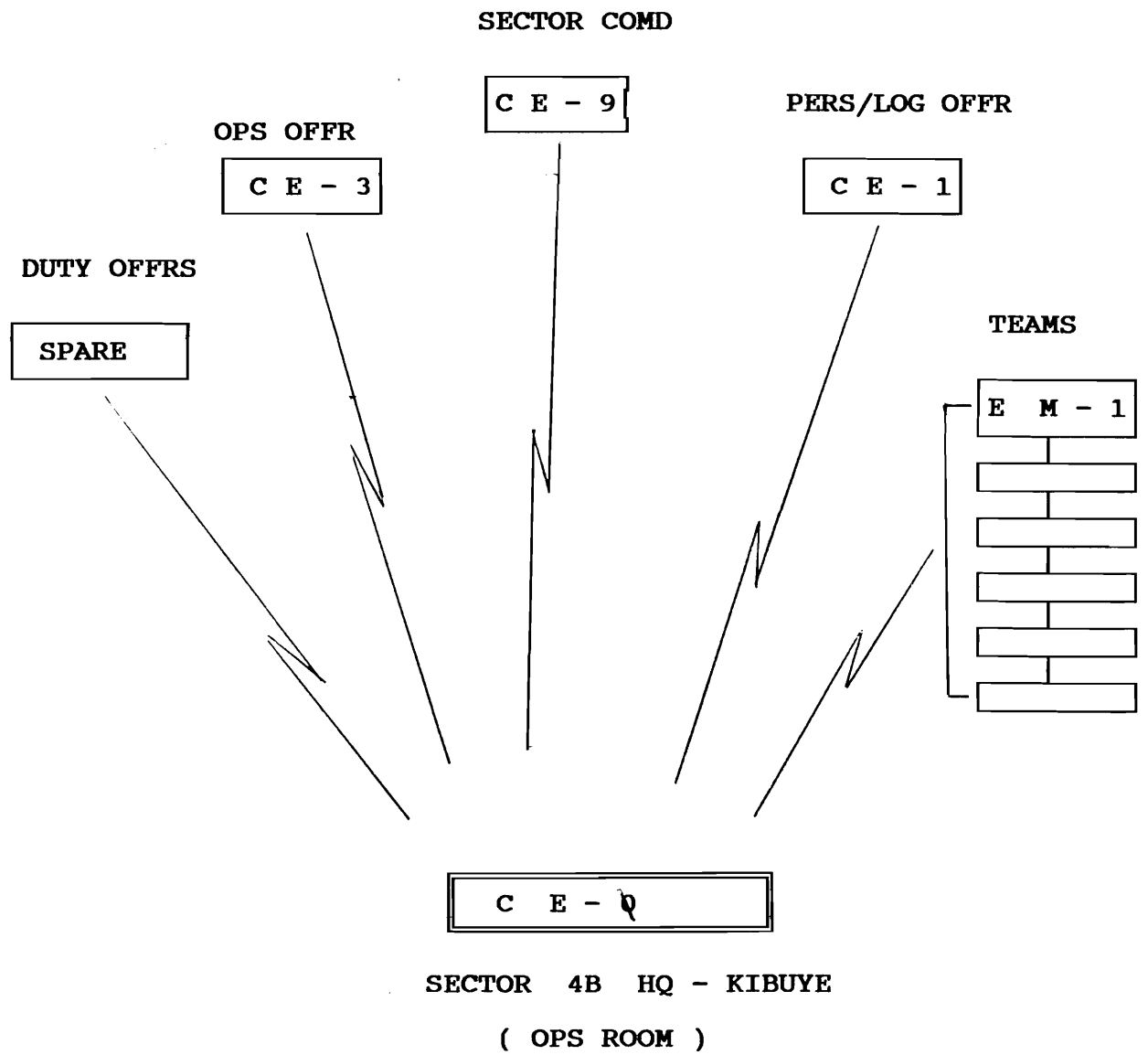
RADIO NET FOR MILOB SECTOR 3

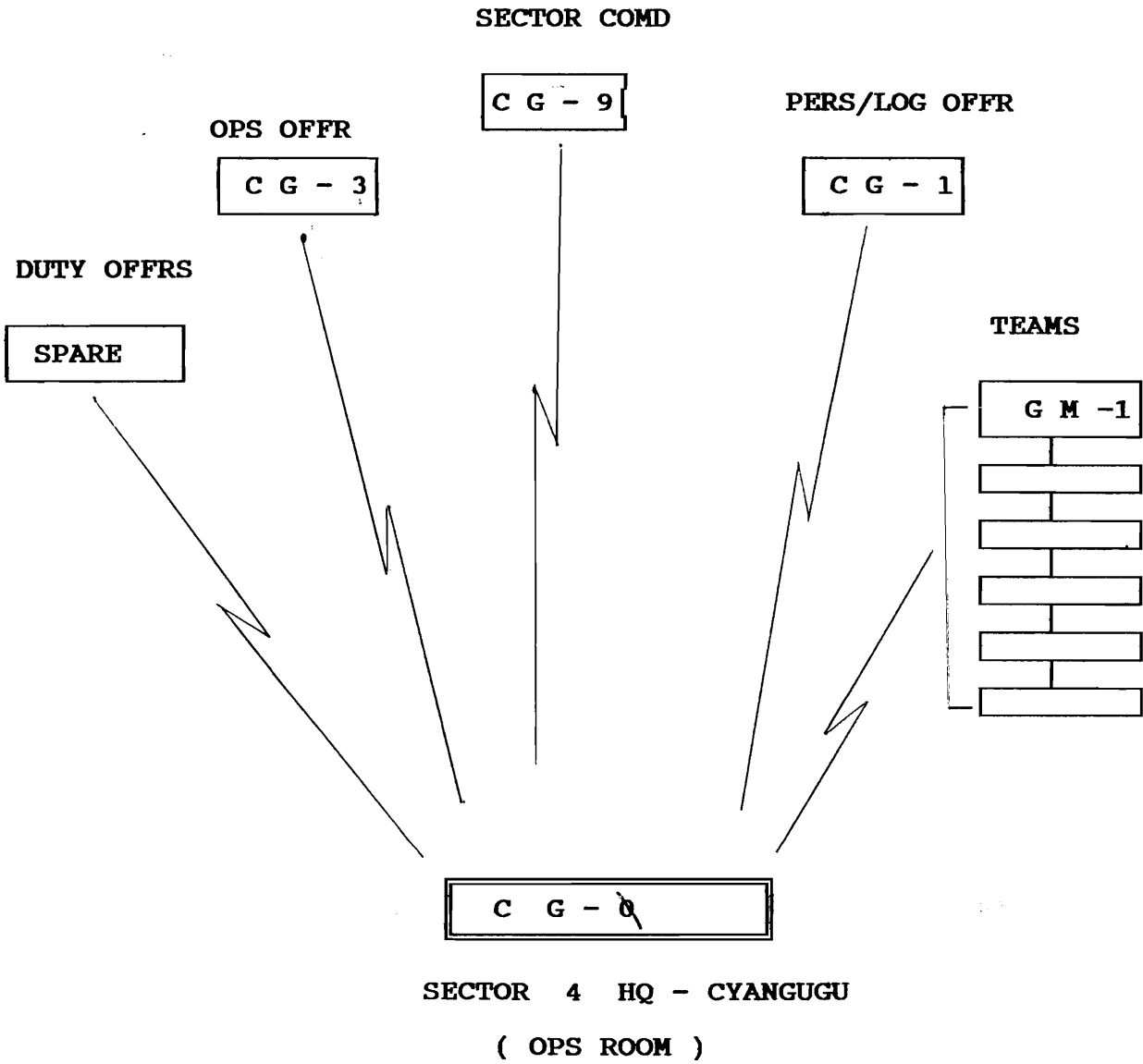

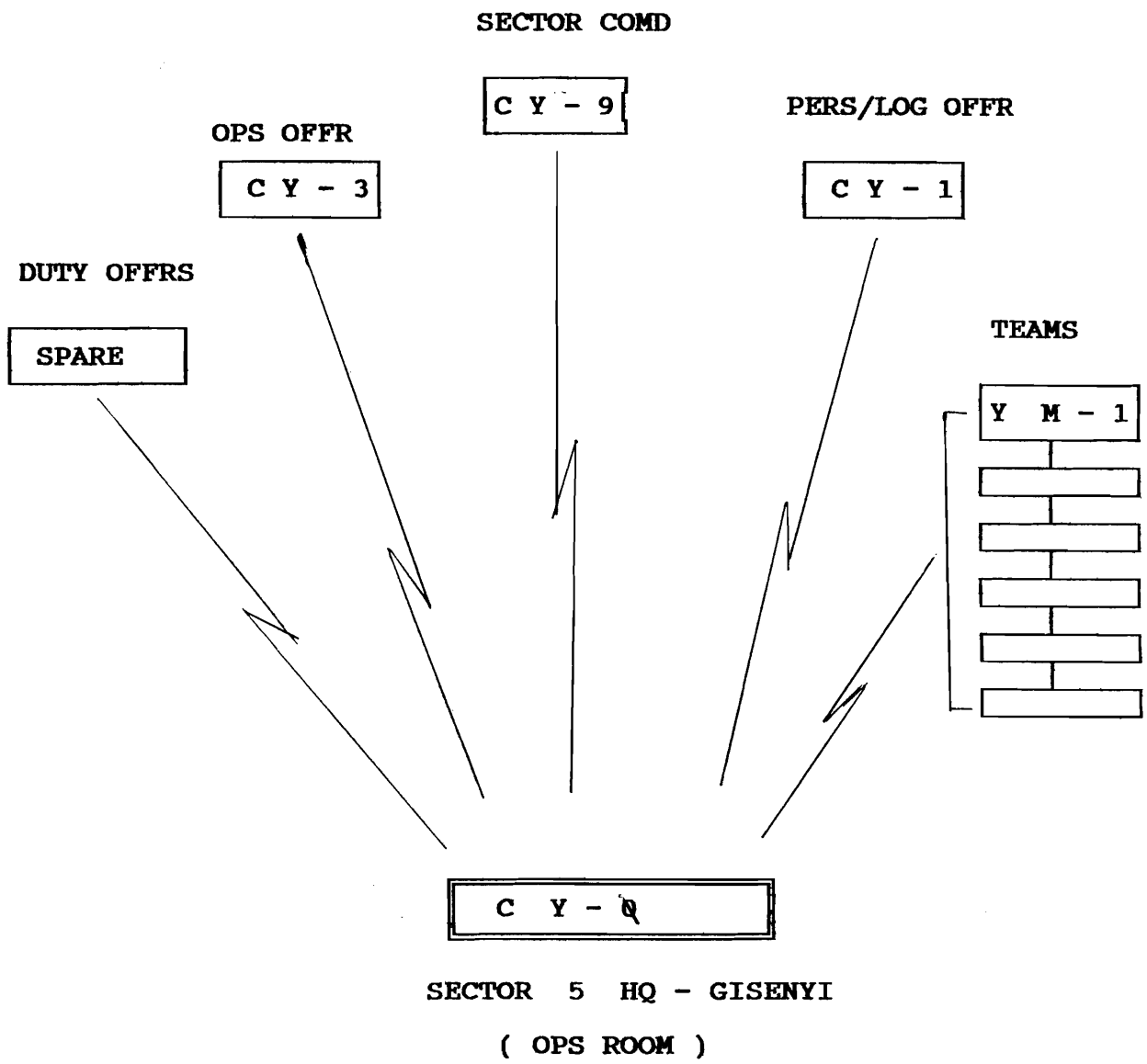

COMMUNICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR
EXPANDED UNAMIR FORCE - UNAMIR II

INTRODUCTION

1. UNAMIR comms are provided by the UN Field Service Comm Staff at present. With the proposals for the expansion of UNAMIR, it would be difficult for the communication cell as it stands now to meet the comm requirements of an expanded force.
2. The security environment in Rwanda has posed a problem for the field service to operate. Additionally, the current strength of the Field Service Comm Staff would not be able to meet comm requirements of the rapidly deploying bns and supporting elements within a reasonable time frame due to even accelerated staffing procedures.
3. Because of the essential role a dedicated and reliable comm net work must play to enable UNAMIR II to undertake its tasks, a Force Communication Squadron (FCS) is required. It will be based on a military Signal Squadron which will have to be integrated into the already existing UNAMIR Comm Cell.

ROLE OF THE FORCE COMMUNICATION SQUADRON (FCS)

4. The FCS will provide for the fol:
 - a. A capability to meet the primary operational command and control requirements of UNAMIR II above unit level and in addition support the administration/logistic comm requirements.
 - b. A planning implementation assistance and technical control of communication capability for the Force and be able to access the needs of other deployed organizations such as UNHCR and ICRC communications including appropriate liaison as required.

UNAMIR SIGNAL CELL

5. The Force Signal Officer will provide the operational and planning guidance on matters of comm for the Force.

6. His responsibilities will include:
 - a. Communication advise to Force commanders and staff and preparations of communications support plans to operational orders/instructions in conjunction with the Headquarters planning and operational staff.
 - b. Co-ordination between the Field Service Comm Staff and the FCS.

TASK OF COMM SQN

7. The communication sqn will undertake the following tasks:
 - a. UNAMIR II communications system planning and operating including preparation of technical documentation.
 - b. Frequency management and production/distribution of signal operating instructions (SOI) to all UNAMIR II and associated organizations.
 - c. Technical control of all UNAMIR communications including operating procedures, equipment compatibility and radio frequency allocation.
 - d. Establish and man the Force HQ communication center.
 - e. Communication advice to the collocated UNAMIR II unit/sector HQ and preparations of communications support plan in conjunction with the sub units signal det.
 - f. Installation and maintenance of the allocated communication systems and if necessary manning of the systems.

MEANS OF COMM TO BE PROVIDED

8. The fol means of comm would be provided by the comm sqn:
 - a. Radio.(secure and non-secure)
 - b. Radio teletypewriter (RTTY).
 - c. Telephone.
 - d. Fax.
 - e. Signal Despatch Services (SDS)

9. The fol radio nets should be established:

- a. Force Command/Secure Net.
- b. Force Admin/Log Net.
- c. Humanitarian Admin Nets
- d. MILOB Operational Net.
- e. MILOB Sector Nets.
- f. CIVPOL Net.
- g. Civilian Admin Nets.
- h. Humanitarian Net.
- i. Political Staff Net.

10. Force Command/Secure Net. This will be the main voice command net for operations. The net will link the Ops Rooms of all the Inf Bns, Supporting Units and MILOB Headquarters. It would be used for operational matters including verbal orders, immediate sitreps and coordination of current ops only. Apart from direct comm with the HQ Ops Room, which will be the Net Control Station (NCS) all other comm would be with the permission of the NCS, and this would be on an alternative channel. The provision of equipment and installations would be by the signal sqn down to all the outstations.

11. The Force Command Net would have a capability of integrating an encryption system for the passage of confidential and secret messages. The encryption system would be on limited issue. This facility would also be provided by the signal sqn.

12. Force admin/Log Net. This net will link all Bns and supporting units. It would solely be used for admin/log matters. The net control station would be at the Force HQ Log Ops Cell co-located with the ops cell. It will have a secure facility like the Force Comd Net. The installation and maintenance of this net would be done by the signal sqn.

13. Humanitarian Net. The net would link the UNAMIR II Humanitarian Cell to the various agencies providing humanitarian services in Rwanda. The NCS would be at Force HQ Humanitarian Cell Office. This would be established by the UN Field Service Comm Staff.

14. MILOB Command Net. The MILOB Command net would link the various MILOB Sector HQs. The MILOB HQ will serve as the NCS. This would be provided by the UN Field Service Comm Staff.

15. MILOB Sector Nets. The various MILOB Sectors would have their own Radio Net. The Sector HQ would serve as the NCS and would link the various teams. This comm facility would be provided by the UN Field Service Comm Staff.

16. Back Up Systems. The under mentioned nets would have separate nets which would act as back ups:

a. Force Command Net - VHF civil pattern to be provided by UN Field Service Staff.

b. Force Admin Net - To be provided by UN field Service Staff.

17. CIVPOL Net. The civil police branch of the UNAMIR II establishment would be provided with comm facilities for it to carry on its task. The NCS would be at the UN CIVPOL HQ. The comm equipment and installations would be undertaken by the UN field service comm staff.

18. Civilian Staff Net. This will link the various key appointment holders within the UNAMIR II civilian staff establishment. The comm facilities would be provided by the UN field service civilian staff.

19. Political Staff Net. The political staffs at the Force HQ would have a radio net. The net control center would be at the Force HQ. It would be provided by UN Field Service Comm Staff.

20. Radio Teletypewriter (RTTY). All the station on the force command net would be linked by RTTY. The radios to be provided by the sig sqn would have a configuration to include TTYS to be used in transmitting long messages and operational orders. The provision, installation and maintenance of this facility would be the responsibility of the signal squadron.

22. Mobile Commcen. The sig sqn would provide for at least three mobile commcen fully equipped with at least Radio and RTTY facilities for use by the Rapid Deployment Force and also for emergency deployments.

TELEPHONE/FACSIMILE (FAX) FACILITIES

23. The provision of telephones and fax would be the sole responsibility of the UN Field Service Communications Staff. A minimum of two telephone lines and a separate line for fax would be provided for each of the Bns, supporting and sub units using VSAT to link the sector HQs (see Annex A) and rural telephones to link the various sub sectors (see Annex B).

24. International Direct Dialing Facilities (IDD) The fol key appointment holders would have IDD facilities:

- a. SRSG
- b. Force Commander.
- c. Executive Director
- d. CAO.
- e. DFC and COO. (Parallel line)
- f. Humanitarian Cell and Media office. (parallel line)
- g. Communication Center.

25. Inmarsat 'C' Terminals. Facsimile services will be provided using INMARSAT satellite terminals from HQ UNAMIR II to selected locations. Sectors beyond the economic reach of other communication systems suitable for facsimile will be provided with Inmarsat. Operational spare equipment would be available for short term deployments to locations in emergencies or for key appointment holders. Two of the Inmarsat are already deployed in Kigali and Kabale. Four are on hold in Nairobi. (see Annex C)

26. Inmarsat (with International Access). Single telephone subscriber with international access using Inmarsat will be available for telephone comm during emergency situations.

27. Private Automatic Branch Exchanges (PABX). Each bn/sector HQ would be provided with an automatic exchange and enough telephone boxes for internal comm by the Field Service Comm Unit.

SIGNAL DESPATCH SERVICES (SDS)

28. The FCS will organise a courier system which will provide the hand delivery of registered official mail between UNAMIR HQ and all deployed subordinate units.

29. The SDS will comprise the fol:

- a. Local Courier. Scheduled despatch services within Kigali Sector. It would be organised twice daily using motor cycles or vehicles as appropriate.
- b. Area Courier. Scheduled despatch services between the various sector using aircraft and vehicles. The daily frequency of the Area Courier will depend on the levels of operational activity.



BATTALION/UNIT COMM

30. Bn/Unit will be totally responsible for the provision and maintenance of its own comm needs.

ADMINISTRATIVE RESPONSIBILITIES

31. Force Communication Sqn as a UN formed unit will be responsible for its autonomous administration and logistics. As per doctrine, the Force HQ Defence Company (Tunisian) will be under command for administration to the Force Comm Sqn, as will be the Force HQ personnel. Force HQ Defence Company will assist Force Comm Sqn in performing these administrative tasks. Accommodation of the Defence Company and Force HQ personnel are being handled separately by CAO/FOD. Although it is anticipated the Force HQ and Force Comm Sqn would be billeted in hard standing accommodation, it will require the normal bivouac type capabilities for cooking, feeding, barbering etc. However Force Defence Company would be operationally under command of Force HQ. The strength of Force Comm Sqn up to 200 personnel Tunisian Coy 60 personnel and a Force HQ military component of 56 personnel. Total maximum strength could be as high as 316 personnel.

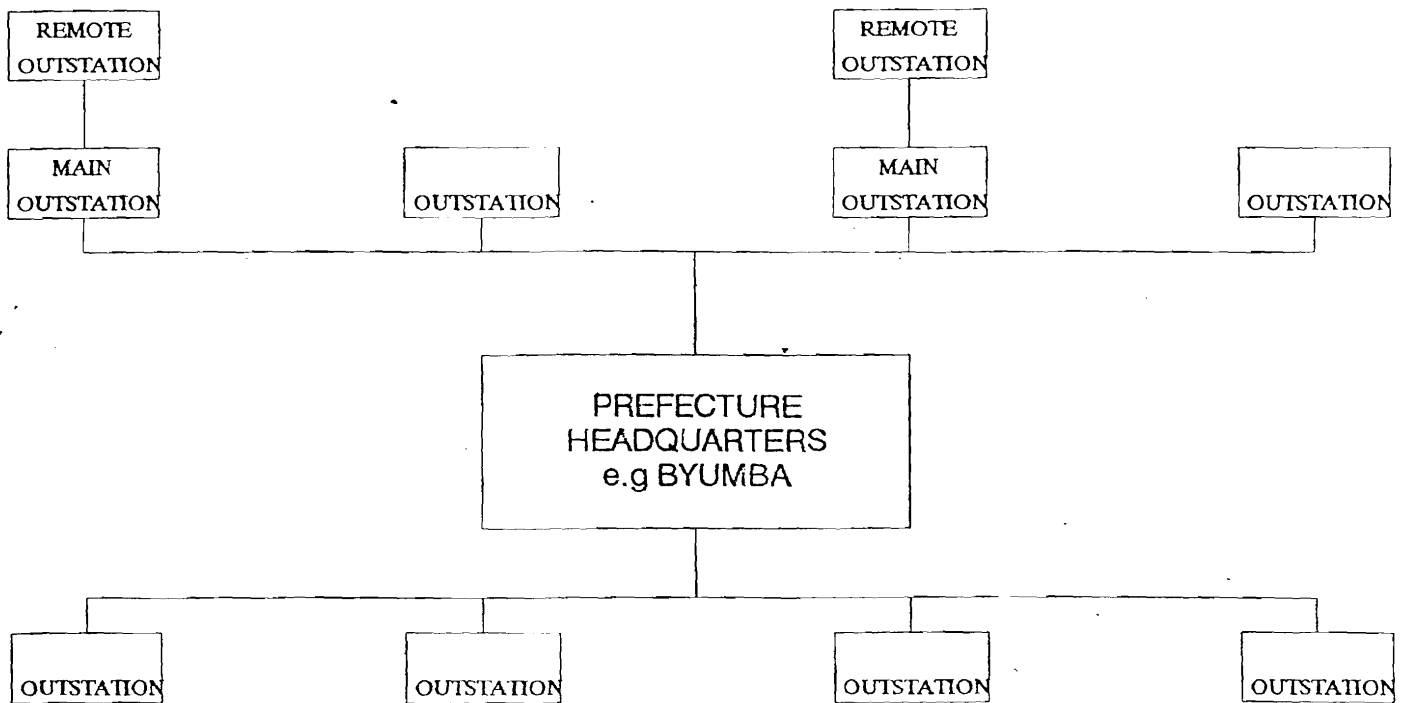
PROPOSED UNITED NATIONS OWNED TELEPHONE COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM

SUB:SIGNAL INSTRUCTION

1. It has been observed with concern that Signal Instruction of UNAMIR dated 04 Jan 93 has not been distributed by Sectors/Units to their under Comds/Units as was instructed to do so. As a result many users did not get the opportunity to go through the Sig Instr and are not complying with Sig Instr which is detrimental to radio discipline. Force Comd has expressed his dissatisfaction on overall radio discipline. However he hopes that all user will comply with Sig Instr. All sectors/units comds are requested to ensure that radio discipline is strictly maintained in their respective comd nets. All radio user are once again requested to read carefully the Sig Instr issued earlier. Fol obsns were noted and needs every user's attn :

a. **Routine Call/Radio Check.** It has been decided that Net Control of UNAMIR will carry out radio check as fol:

(1) **For all user.** Control Net of each comd will carry out all users' radio check on fol time :

- (a) 1st check : 0900 hrs
- (b) 2nd check : 1800 hrs

(2) The **NET CONTROL** will transmit the fol words" **ALL STATION CALLING, ALL STATION CALLING THIS IS RT CHECK. PL REPLY IN ORDER OF CALL SIGN SENIORITY OVER.**"

(3) In case a user does not respond to this test call, the Net Control will try to contact the user through other user of the net or over other means of comm. Duty Offr/Net Controller is to make an occurrence in the log book regarding the subject matter .

(4) **Routine Call.** In routine call only the Ops Rooms/Duty Rooms will respond to Force HQ Ops Room as per alphabetical order. The radio check will be as per the timing of the Sig Instr of 4 Jan 94.

2. **Unauthorised Call Sign.** Some user are using call signs as per their own will which is a breach of radio discipline. All call signs are to be approved by Ops Br of Force HQ. Till such time call sign are not approved, user are requested not to interfere into the nets which creates confusion to the other users. An additional approved call sign list of CH-7 is enclosed as Annx-A to this letter.

3. **Switching Off a Set.** Pl refer to Sig Instr Para 9-e. All are to comply with this instruction.

4. **Changing to a Channel of Another Net.** Pl refer to Sig Inst Para 9-g. You may use your own call sign while transmitting in another net. Other instr of this para will remain unchanged.

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Additional VHF Comm Channel.

5. An additional channel, CH-17 has been incorporated to UNAMIR comm net for limited users. The freq of this channel is also used by UNDP staff. The main purpose of keeping UNDP freq in this net is that UN Chief of Security, Mr Jean Francois Fevre can easily be available on this freq. Moreover he is also responsible for any emergency evacuation from this country. This freq can be identified as emergency freq.

6. VHF sets which are programmed for scan mode will be able to monitor all conversation in different channels staying in their respective channel provided the sets are switched to scan mode.

7. User CH-17. The following personnel are provided with CH-17 facility:


- a. Force Comd and his personal staffs.
- b. UN Chief of Security.
- c. Duty Offr Force HQ.
- d. Kigali Sect Comd.
- e. Kigali Sect HQ Ops Room.

8. Call Sign. The fol call signs are valid in Ch-17 only:

- a. Force Comd and his personal staffs. - ECHO
- b. UN Chief of Security. - MUSTACHE
- c. Duty Offr. - DUTY OFFR
- d. Kigali Sect Comd. - K 9
