





Please be informed that repairs to the Amahoro Hotel will commence on 02 March 1996 to be completed before the end of the month. As the structure continues to be occupied during the repairs we expect all occupants of offices in the building to cooperate with Brown & Root Co. who will be carrying out the repairs.

Attached please find the proposed schedule for the repairs as prepared by Brown & Root. 



SUBJECT : **NEWS SUMMARY FROM 290800 - 300800 JAN 96**

1. **GREAT LAKES REGION**

The UN Security Council has threatened to impose an arms embargo on Burundi to prevent further ethnic violence. In a unanimous resolution the Security Council asked the Secretary-General to develop a contingency plan for possible military intervention by 20 Feb if the situation worsens.

2. **REST OF AFRICA**

a. Unidentified gunmen shot into unemployed workers queuing for jobs in Johannesburg, South Africa, killing 8 and wounding over 20 others.

b. Fighting between Abgal and Murasad clansmen along the 'Green Line' in Mogadishu has led to the death of 31 persons with over 60 others being seriously wounded.

c. Col Ibrahim Baare Mainasara, chairman of the newly proclaimed National Salvation Council in the Republic of Niger, has claimed that the overthrow of the democratically elected civilian government was aimed at preventing the ousted Prime Ministers party from usurping power.

d. People in Swaziland are returning to work after a crippling 7 day stoppage following a call by king Mswati for the nation to return to work. The stoppage has since being suspended by the Swazi Federation of Trade Unions (SFTU).

e. The Security Council has unanimously extended the mandate of UNAMIL (LIBERIA) till 31 May 96. The Security Council condemned recent armed attacks on the West African Peacekeeping Force, ECOMOG.

f. The week-long ceasefire which existed in Sierra Leone after Brig Julius Madah Bio ousted Capt Valentine Strasser was shattered yesterday when suspected RUF rebels launched murderous attacks on 3 villages in South-Eastern Sierra Leone killing and maiming several people.

2. REST OF THE WORLD

a. The French President, Mr Jacques Chirac, has announced that France has completed its nuclear test programme. He defended the six nuclear test explosions carried out and declared that he understood some of the outrage the test caused in the world.

b. The Russian Prime Minister, Mr Victor Chernomyrdin, has stated that Russia will make slight changes to its economic policy in the light of communist/nationalist gains in recent legislative elections and impending presidential elections.

c. The Red Cross is worried about the food and medical situation in the Afghan capital, Kabul. It is planning an airlift, albeit with the agreement of the warring parties, to relieve destitute citizens of the beleaguered city.



Subject: SECURITY CHECKS

1. A recent incident in which a freelance journalist gained access to UNAMIR installations on several occasions although the individual was not in possession of a valid ID Card or authorization to enter UNAMIR property has reinforced the need for the strictest vigilance with respect to physical security. This is all the more important at this time as the Force is downsizing and the Mission is within six weeks of the end of the Mandate. Access to UNAMIR property and security checks of vehicles and personnel leaving UNAMIR compounds is to be escalated to include comprehensive spot checks including random vehicle searches.

2. You are requested to implement the above checks at all locations under your direct purview both during and after normal duty hours. As well, I remind all addressees of the need to ensure the proper authorization for personnel entering UNAMIR premises.

3. Your cooperation is appreciated.



## TRANSIT CENTERS IN RWANDA

### GISENYI

#### 1. NKAMIRA TRANSIT CENTER

Nkamira TC is situated at about 27 kms from Gisenyi town along the Kigali tarmac road. It has a capacity of 2,000 returnees daily. The site is connected both to public water supply as well as public electrical power. COOPI is UNHCR's main implementing agency. MSF/Belgium is in charge of the health sector.

All returnees are served their standard assistance packages at the center before being transported either to their communes of origin or onward to other Prefectures. The average stay in the center is one night, depending on convoy arrival times.

Standard assistance packages are distributed to all returnees and onward transport is provided.

#### 2. COLLEGE TRANSIT CENTER

The College TC situated at 7 kms from Gisenyi Town along the Kigali tarmac road. The center can comfortably accommodate 5,500 returnees. This capacity can be upgraded at short notice to 10,000 if necessary. The site is connected to public water supply and electric power. COOPI is UNHCR's implementing partner.

### CYANGUGU

#### 1. NYAGATARE WEST TRANSIT CENTER:

The center is situated at about 5 Km. from the Rwandese/Zairian border on the Cyangugu/Butare tarmac road. It has a capacity of 2000 returnees daily expandable to 5000, on short notice. IRC is HCR's implementing agency.

#### 2. BUGARAMA TRANSIT CENTER

The site is located in Bugarama town, one Kms. from the Zairian and about six Km. from the Burundese border. The site has been recently connected to the town's water supply system (rehabilitated by UNHCR). The site has a capacity of about 800 per day. The management of the center is carried out by CONCERN. IRC is in charge of the water and sanitation, and MSF is in charge of the health sector. It should be noted that the distance from Bugarama TC to Cyangugu is 40 Km., equaling a two hour drive. Cyangugu arranges transportation only out. This TC could receive returnees from Burundi and Zaire/Uvira.

### **3. NYARUSHISHI TRANSIT CENTER**

The TC is situated at about 7.5 Km. east of Cyangugu. It has a current capacity of 5,000 per day which can be increased to 10,000. Water and sanitation facilities are already available. CONCERN is UNHCR's implementing partner in the center.

## **KIBUYE**

### **1. NYAMISHABA TRANSIT CENTER**

The site is located in Kibuye Town. It has a capacity of 700 returnees per day. This TC is also a newly established one. MSF France will be working on health/ water and sanitation. The management implementing partner has not yet been identified..

## **BYUMBA-NORTH EAST**

### **1. NYAGATARE TRANSIT CENTER -MUTARA**

The TC is situated two Km. from the main tarmac road leading to Nyagatare Town. It is 40 Km. away from the Rwandan northern border with Uganda. The current site has a capacity of 2,200 returnees with the potential to expand up to 8,000. Piped water is available in the transit center. ARC is in charge of health and sanitation, ARP is in charge of water, and ADRA is in charge of management of the transit center. Standard assistance packages are distributed to returnees entering Rwanda from Uganda.

#### **1.1. BYUMBA TRANSIT CENTER**

Byumba TC has been established recently. It is situated about 5 Km. south of Byumba Town along the Kigali/Byumba road. It has a working capacity of 1000 expandable to 2000 if need be. HCR's overall implementing agency is Goal. The average stay in the center is about four days. No standard assistance package is distributed at this TC. It is connected to the public piped water system of Byumba. GOAL is in charge of the transit center.

## **BUTARE**

### **1. BUTARE WAY STATION**

The site is located in Butare Town. The current capacity is around 2,500 returnees per day. The TC is managed by COOPI. However, the sub-Office is in the process of identifying a new site in the area. The average stay over is of one to two nights before onward transportation. The TC distributes standard assistance packages to returnees entering Rwanda through Burundi.

## **KIGALI RURAL**

### **1. DIHIRO TRANSIT CENTER**



The site is located 15 Km. from the Burundian border along the road to Gashora. It has a capacity of 500 daily.

IRC is UNHCR's implementing partner.

This TC distributes standard assistance packages to returnees from Burundi and those which remain in it area. The returnees for Kibungo transit the area and receive their assistance package in Kibungo Tcs.

## **KIBUNGO-SOUTH EAST**

### **1. BIRENGA TRANSIT CENTER**

The center is situated 200 meters away from UNHCR Kibungo field office, in Kibungo city. The TC has a capacity of 2000. The possibility for expansion exists. IRC is in charge of water and sanitation, while LWF is in charge of the overall management.

### **2. NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CENTER**

The site is located at about 28 Km. from the Rwandan/Tanzanian border along the tarmac road. Its current capacity of 1,000 is being expanded to 1,500 with the possibility to increase it up to 2,000. IRC is in charge of water, while AEF is in charge of all remaining responsibilities including management.

## **KIGALI**

### **1. KIGALI TRANSIT CENTER NDERA**

Ndera TC has a capacity of 2000 returnees per day. Concern is HCR's implementing partner. The average overnight stay in the center is of one to two nights. No standard assistance packages are distributed at this site. This site will have to be moved to a new site soon.

1. REF A WAS THE FIRST INFORMATION I RECEIVED CONCERNING THE WITHDRAWAL OF INDSIGS PERS TO BE EFFECTIVE ON 20 NOV 95. THE AIM OF THIS MEMO IS TO REQUEST THAT INDSIGS PERS REMAIN IN GITARAMA BASED ON OPERATIONAL FACTORS.

2. AT REF B, I ASKED WHAT WERE THE OPERATIONAL FACTORS WHICH FORCED THE WITHDRAWAL OF INDSIGS PERS. I WAS TOLD THAT THE ONLY REASON WHY INDSIGS PERS WERE DEPLOYED HERE WAS THAT THEY WERE TAKING CARE OF THE VSAT. I EXPRESSED MY DISMAY AT THIS ANALYSIS OF PERSONNEL RESOURCES. IT IS QUITE CLEAR TO ME, AND TO ANYBODY WHO HAS SEEN HOW THIS SECTOR IS FUNCTIONING, THAT INDSIGS PERS ARE NOT MERE "VSAT HANDLERS". I WISH TO EXPLAIN HOW THESE PERSONNEL MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN SECTOR 1B.

3. IN REFLECTING ON REF B, IT APPEARS THAT THE NEW FACTOR (ABOVE AND BEYOND THE RETURN OF THE VSAT) PROMPTING THE WITHDRAWAL OF INDSIGS PERS IS A LACK OF MANPOWER IN KIGALI. TO MAKE A PROPER ASSESSMENT OF THE SITUATION, ONE HAS TO LOOK AT THE ADVANTAGES OF FULFILLING THESE TASKS AND TO WEIGH IT AGAINST THE DISADVANTAGES OF HAVING SECTOR 1B WITHOUT SIGNALMEN.

#### COMMUNICATIONS

4. THE NEW "RURAL SHOOT" SYSTEM (WHICH MAKES ME LOOSE ONE EXTENSION AND WHICH WILL PUT MY SECTOR OUT OF TELEPHONE REACH FOR AT LEAST A MONTH BEFORE OUR NUMBERS ARE KNOWN AGAIN) WILL STILL NEED SOME SORT OF MAINTENANCE WHICH WOULD THEN REQUIRE SOMEONE COMING FROM KIGALI TO RECTIFY THE SITUATION. INDSIGS WERE PROVIDING THESE "EXPERTS IN PLACE" WHICH COULD LITERALLY RECONNECT US TO THOSE IN NEED OF HELP ON A 24 HOUR BASIS OR TO

OUR HQ. WHETHER IT IS LAND LINES, VHF OR SATELLITE COMMUNICATIONS, INDSIGS PERS HAVE POSITIVELY INFLUENCED THE UNFOLDING OF THIS HQ'S REACTION TO INCIDENTS WHICH WERE MATTERS OF LIFE OR DEATH.

5. COMMUNICATIONS HAVE TO BE UNDERSTOOD IN THEIR GENERIC SENSE AND INDSIGS PERS HAVE PROVIDED THESE HEADQUARTERS FUNCTIONS WHICH ARE SO MUCH INTERTWINED WITH COMMUNICATIONS, AS REFLECTED BY THE WORLD WIDE TERMINOLOGY OF "HQ AND SIGNAL" UNITS. IN THAT RESPECT, THESE TROOPS WERE ESSENTIAL IN ACHIEVING CONTINUITY THROUGHOUT THE ROUTINE MOVEMENT OF MILOBS WITHIN OR OUTSIDE OF THE SECTOR. COMMUNICATIONS CANNOT BE SEEN AS A SEPARATE ENTITY OF A HEADQUARTERS AND THEIR EFFICIENCY IN ACTING AS A "CENTRAL REGISTRY" CANNOT BE OVERSTATED.

#### QUALITY OF EMPLOYMENT

6. FROM REF B, I UNDERSTAND THAT A NEW LEAVE PLAN (A REQUIREMENT WHICH IS FULLY UNDERSTOOD) HAS STARTED IN LATE SEPTEMBER AND IS CREATING A TOUGH WORKING SCHEDULE FOR THOSE NOT ON LEAVE. THESE THREE NCOs HERE WOULD THEREFORE BE USED TO SUPPLEMENT A ROTATION SYSTEM WHICH, IN ALL OBJECTIVITY, CANNOT COMPARE TO THE CHALLENGING ENVIRONMENT OF PROVIDING HQ AND SIGS RESPONSIBILITY TO SECTOR 1B.

7. MILOBS CAN WORK INDEPENDENTLY BUT THE CONCEPT HAS TO BE FLEXIBLE AND WHY SHOULD ONE DISORGANIZE A SYSTEM WHICH WORKS? THE "PETIT SEMINAIRE" HAS BECOME THE "UNITED NATIONS BASTION" IN GITARAMA WITH EIGHT HUMAN RIGHT OFFICERS AND NOW THE LOCAL UNHCR OFFICE. INDSIGS PERS HAVE BEEN JUST AS USEFUL TO THESE AGENCIES AS THEY HAVE BEEN TO US AND I HAVE THEIR OVERWHELMING SUPPORT IN ATTEMPTING TO HAVE REF A CANCELLED.

#### SECURITY

8. AT THE TIME OF THE WITHDRAWAL OF MALI TROOPS, I ATTEMPTED TO CONVINCE AUTHORITIES OF THE NEED TO KEEP ARMED TROOPS IN GITARAMA. LIKE OTHER SECTORS, I HAD TO COPE WITH THE DECISION OF OPERATING WITHOUT FORMED TROOPS WITH THE CONSOLATION, AS EXPRESSED BY THE THEN DCOS(OPS), THAT I WOULD AT LEAST HAVE THE INDSIGS PERS WHO WERE ARMED. AT THE TIME, NO SECURITY PROBLEM HAD ARISEN YET.

9. SINCE THEN, THERE HAS BEEN 17 ATTEMPTS (WITH VARYING DEGREES OF SUCCESS) TO BREAK INTO THIS COMPOUND WHICH HOLDS FUEL, GAS, UNHCR ATTRACTIVE ITEMS (BLANKETS, SOAP, SHEETINGS AND KITCHENWARE), COMPUTERS, TV AND VCRs AND CONFIDENTIAL FILES AND MATERIAL. THREATS OF ARMED ATTACKS HAVE FILTERED TO THIS HEADQUARTERS AND I HAVE ASKED MY CONTINGENT COMMANDER THE AUTHORIZATION OF BEING ARMED AT MY HOUSE WHICH IS ADJACENT TO THE SECTOR HQ AND WHICH HAS HAD MORE THAN ITS SHARE OF UNSOLICITED VISITORS.

10. THREE TIMES, INDSIGS PERS' VIGILANCE ALLOWED THE IDENTIFICATION OF THIEVES. THEY PHYSICALLY INTERVENE TO ALLOW



THE CAPTURE OF CULPRITS AND TO HAVE ELEVEN OF THEM JAILED. I KNOW THIS IS NOT THEIR PRIME RESPONSIBILITY BUT THEIR PRESENCE HERE SINCE THE DEPARTURE OF MALICOY WAS THE RESULT OF A COMPROMISE WHICH WORKED RELATIVELY GOOD. I BELIEVE THIS BARE MINIMAL PRESENCE OF ARMED TROOPS MUST BE RESPECTED.

CONCLUSION

11. I WOULD HAVE APPRECIATED HAVING THE POSSIBILITY OF EXPRESSING THESE VIEWS BEFORE READING REF A BUT I SINCERELY HOPE THAT YOU WILL BE ABLE TO INFLUENCE THE VERY SERIOUS SITUATION THAT THIS HQ WILL FACE AS OF MONDAY, 20 NOV 95. ALL VISITORS TO KABGAYI RECOGNIZE THE SPECIAL SITUATION THAT HAS DEVELOPED HERE AND IT IS DEEMED APPROPRIATE THAT UNAMIR PERSONNEL POLICY BE ADAPTED ACCORDINGLY. I HOPE THE INFORMATION HEREIN PROVIDED, WILL ALLOW AUTHORITIES TO CONSIDER ALL FACTORS RELEVANT TO THIS MATTER.

12. YOUR HELP IN CONVINCING HQ UNAMIR TO CANCEL REF A IS REQUIRED. THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT.

1. As the possible closure of UNAMIR looms in the near term, it is highly probable that the incidents of theft and attempted theft of UNAMIR equipment will increase. While our current security access to UNAMIR HQ and Trafipro is well established it is considered that it would be appropriate to step up the personal identification and vehicle spot checks as a preventive and deterrent measure.

3. Notwithstanding the focus of this direction on the Amahoro and Trafipro locations all addressees are requested to recognize their responsibilities in this regard and to take preventative measures to increase the security awareness of all personnel and to safeguard personal, contingent and UN owned equipment and valuable items.

2. CO INDBATT is requested to implement appropriate measures to increase the level of identity checks within current guidelines and to implement spot checks of vehicles entering and exiting the above locations. It is not intended to create a bottleneck at the entrances, however, personnel should be advised that vehicle inspections at random will be carried out by the gate guards particularly on vehicles exiting these compounds. Accordingly the understanding and cooperation of all addressees is requested.

**UNAMIR Political Activity Highlights For September 1995**

KIGALI, RWANDA -- Did you know that during the month of September 1995, the following UNAMIR political activities were conducted to help assist the people of Rwanda?

The Special Representative of the Secretary General (SRSG), Ambassador Shaharyar Khan met with:

- a. the United Nations High Commissioner For Refugees, Mrs Sadako Ogata to discuss the refugee repatriation process;
- b. the Dutch Minister for Development Cooperation, Mr Jan Pronk, to discuss the refugee situation in Rwanda, the conditions of the prisons and political developments in the country;
- c. UNDP, UNICEF, UNHRFOR and ICRC representatives to discuss plans of action to alleviate Rwanda's prison conditions and pledged that UNAMIR military and civilian personnel would contribute their expertise and resources to assist;
- d. representatives from the Rwandan Government and various UN agencies to coordinate aid for the wounded and investigation into the Kanama incident;
- e. the Ugandan Ambassador to Rwanda to discuss recent developments in Rwanda;
- f. the Rwandese Vice Prime Minister and Minister of the Interior accompanied by UNAMIR's Commissioner of Civilian Police to discuss UNAMIR's assistance in training of Rwanda's communal police force;

g. the Rwandan President, Mr Pasteur Bizimungu to discuss the Kanama Incident, prison conditions and the refugee repatriation process;

h. a European Union (EU) delegation from France, Italy and Spain to discuss efforts towards reconstruction and reconciliation. The delegation pledged increased EU assistance to Rwanda;

i. the Special Envoy of the UN Secretary General for the Great Lakes Region, Mr Jose Luis Jesus, as well as with the Rwandan President, Vice President and Foreign Affairs Minister, Mr Anastase Gasana to discuss the possibility of holding a conference on security, stability and development in the region;

j. the media to announce that recruitment of judiciary is forthcoming and that 50 foreign experts should arrive in one month's time to review the judicial system in an advisory capacity;

k. the Minister of Justice, accompanied by the UNDP representative to discuss reconstruction of the national justice process;

l. the Deputy Prosecutor, Judge Rukotomanana to discuss modalities related to the establishment of the International Tribunal in Arusha;

m. the ambassadors of Germany, France and the United States to discuss the prison situation and the judicial system; and,

n. the heads of UN agencies to discuss a paper concerning the expected return of refugees to Rwanda.

The SRSG also attended ceremonies in Butare where 650 members of the Former Rwandese Government Forces were sworn into the Rwandese Patriotic Army following a one-year course in political and military training.

UNAMIR Military Activity Highlights For September 1995

KIGALI, RWANDA -- Did you know that during the month of September 1995, the following UNAMIR military activities were conducted under the command of Canadian Forces Major General Guy Tousignant to help assist the people of Rwanda?

Sector 1 (IndBatt)

During the month, military personnel from Indian Battalion:

- a. provided security at Ndera Camp which received hundreds of refugees and IDPs who were then returned safely to their home communes;
- b. provided trucks to Humanitarian Action Coordination Unity for the transportation of tiles;
- c. donated food and miscellaneous stores including toiletries to the "Missionaries of Charity" orphanage in Kigali;
- d. carried out the electrification - security lighting, electrical cables and electric points - and repair of water pipelines at the "Missionaries of Charity" orphanage. Additionally, the medical team conducted a medical check up of the orphans and distributed medicines;
- e. provided trucks to the RPA for the transport of firewood from Gitarama to Birango;
- f. provided trucks for "Food For The Hungry International" to transport food from Kigali to Gitarama;
- g. donated rations and foodstuffs to the Belgian Red Cross orphanage in Kigali;
- h. donated rations and foodstuffs to the Remera Orphanage for Unaccompanied Children;
- i. provided trucks to the RPA for the transport of food from Kigali to Butare;

j. donated 30 packages of medicines provided by the Indian Red Cross as well as rations and foodstuff to the Centre Medico Social;

k. carried out vehicle repair work for the Commanding Officer of the 7th RPA Battalion;

l. provided trucks to Gamini Hospital for the transport of medicines and mattresses;

m. provided trucks to the RPA to move recruits from Kigali to Nsinda;

n. provided trucks to UNDP for the transport of mattresses to Nsinda Prison;

o. medical staff treated local Rwandese throughout the month;

p. participated in fire fighting operations at a Kigali warehouse fire and provided medical assistance to the injured; and,

q. provided one truck to RPA to transport prison guards from Kigali to Nsinda.

#### Sector 2 (GhanCoy)

During the month, military personnel from Ghana Company:

a. provided vehicles to transport food for RPA troops from Kigali to Kibungo;

b. donated assorted food items to the Roman Catholic Church in Bare;

c. provided trucks for the delivery of food to local communes for the World Food Programme and UN High Commission for Refugees;

d. provided trucks to Kibungo Hospital for the delivery of food items to Gahini Hospital;

e. medical staff treated local Rwandese throughout the month;

f. provided trucks to the Byumba Bourgemestre for the transport of food for the RPA; and,

g. provided transport and escorts to Ministers of Justice and Rehabilitation visiting Kibungo Prison.

### Sector 3 (MaliCoy)

During the month, military personnel from Mali Company:

- a. on request from the Rusatira Bourgemestre, provided transport for plastic sheets from UNICEF to the commune office;
- b. provided trucks for the transport of CARITAS products to Butare; and,
- c. provided trucks for the transport of students from Cyangugu to Gikongoro.

### Sector 4 (MalawiCoy)

During the month, military personnel from Malawi Company:

- a. monitored the inflow/outflow of refugees at transit camps and entry points of Rusizi I and II and at Uvira;
- b. medical staff treated local Rwandese throughout the month at the Gihundwe Hospital as well as treating local staff at the Company First Aid Post;
- c. provided trucks to assist in the transportation of civilians from Gikongoro to Nyungwe Forest where there was a fire;
- d. provided trucks to the RPA to assist in the transportation of food to RPA sub-units. Trucks were also provided to the RPA to help them with local administration duties; and,
- e. provided trucks to the IRC to transport construction materials for the Nyarushishi Refugee Camp.

### Sector 5 (NiCoy)

During the month, military personnel from Nigeria Company:

- a. provided ambulance transport for a local patient with a spinal cord injury to Kigali from the Ruhengeri General Hospital;
- b. transported local counsellors to the Kabaya Sou-Prefet for a meeting;
- c. supplied water to the Imbabazi Orphanage;
- d. medical personnel treated 110 refugees for various diseases at the Kayove Refugee Camp, as well as making a reconnaissance for an alternate

drinking water source for the Camp as the present one is unhygienic;

- e. medical personnel investigated a reported measles outbreak in Kibuye;
- f. medical personnel treated 72 orphans at the Imbabazi Orphanage in Mutura;
- g. medical personnel treated 34 locals at Kayove Humanitarian Clinic; and,
- h. recovered an RPA vehicle with road recovery equipment.

#### Military Observers

During the month, Military Observers throughout Rwanda:

- a. discovered live explosives and identified mines - locals were made aware and Force Engineers defused the explosives safely;
- b. transported a representative of the Ministry of Rehabilitation to various communes to identify lands for the resettlement of returnees;
- c. visited communes throughout Rwanda to monitor the safe return of refugees;
- d. monitored hospital and prison conditions, schools and consulted with Prefects and Bourgemestres to assist in local communes;
- e. assisted in the investigation into the Kanama Incident along with UN Human Rights monitors, UN Civilian Police and the Rwandese Government;
- f. advised human rights monitors of any possible human rights violations and investigated infiltrations, thefts, assaults, illegal arrests; and,
- g. assisted in coordinating reburial ceremonies and carrying out clean water reconnaissance.

#### Force Signals Company

During the month, military personnel from the Force Signals Company:

- a. helped to activate the local Kigali telephone lines of Rwandatel;
- b. provided trucks to the local (Rwandan) organization "ARDEC" throughout the month for the transportation of wood; and,

- c. provided vehicle assistance to Rwandatel.

#### Force Engineer Company

During the month, military personnel from the Force Engineer Company:

- a. continued work on building sanitary facilities and water supplies, as well as donating food at a rehabilitation school in Butare;
- b. provided concrete mixers with operators to BMS for the concreting work at transit camps;
- c. conducted bulldozer and levelling work at the Nkamera Transit Camp in Gisenyi, deployed an excavator to construct drainage facilities and provided dump trucks for transporting of gravel to the Camp;
- d. constructed the security lighting system and sentry posts at the Ontracom Detention Centre in Kigali;
- e. deployed a bulldozer and an excavator for levelling and digging at the new Detention Centre in Gikondo;

- g. Explosives Ordinance Disposal team recovered and destroyed large numbers of grenades and other explosives near Mount Zali in Kigali;
- h. provided vehicles for the transportation of children in Kigali;

- j. provided dump trucks to the Kabuga Development Centre to assist in the repair of bridge on the Muyenzi-Cyogo-Kabuga Road;
- k. deployed a bulldozer for the repair of road south of the bridge on the Muyenzi-Cyogo-Kabuga Road;
- l. deployed a bulldozer to the RPA for levelling work in Kigali; and,
- m. donated food to the Mbanza orphanage.



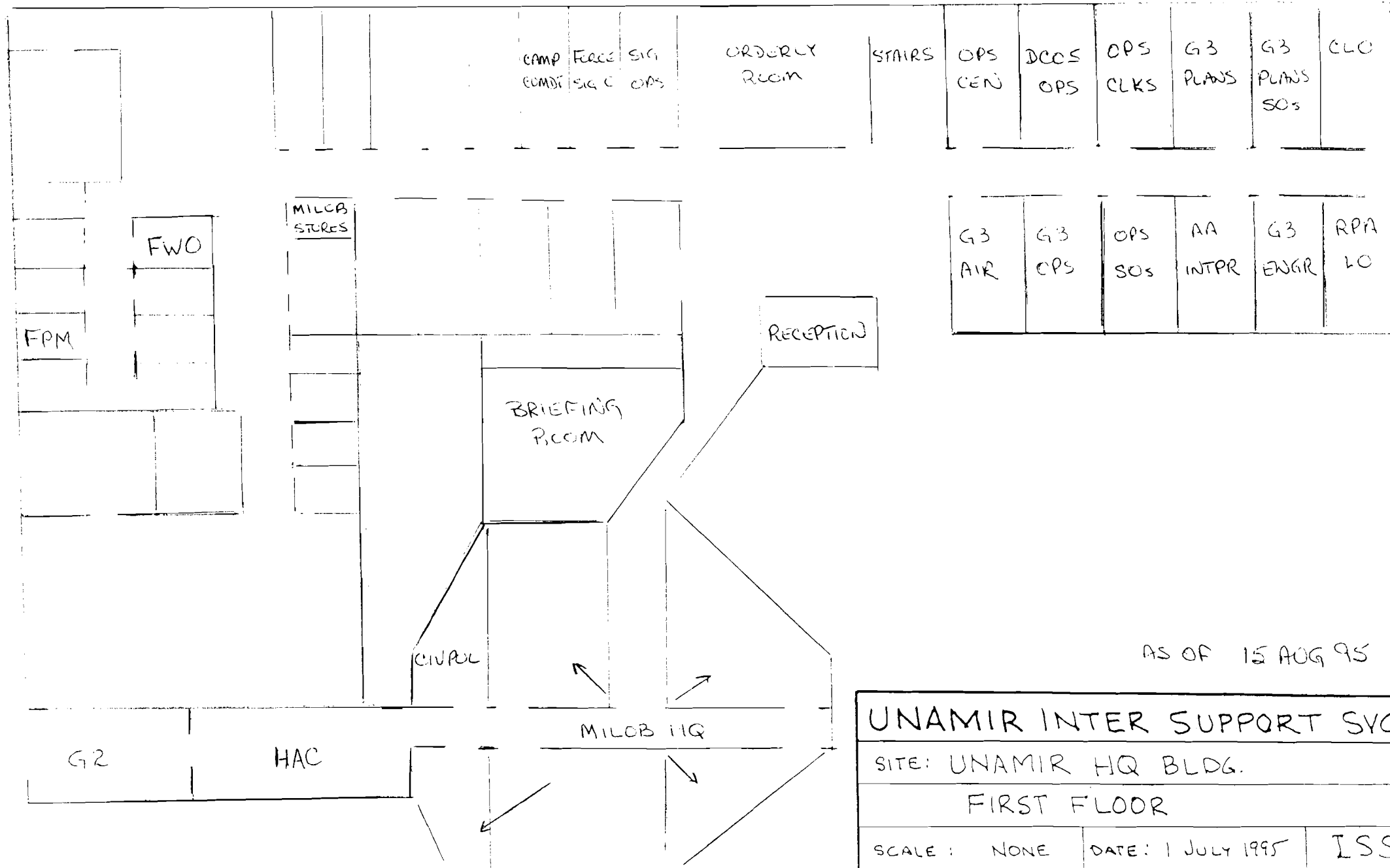

**REPORT OF MEETING HELD IN KAMEMBE REGARDING INCIDENTS  
CONCERNING MALAWI COMPANY AND THE RPA**

**REFERENCE: SPECIAL SITREP NO 1 OF 04 AUG 95**

**GENERAL**

1. A Meeting was organised in the office of Maj Wilson, the Local RPA Battalion Commander, to discuss the various issues regarding the subject incident. The meeting was held from 0930 to 1230 hours on 06 Aug 95 and was attended by :-

- (a) MILOBS Sector Commander.
- (b) Incoming Company Commander of the MALAWI Company and the outgoing Officiating Company Commander, who was officiating during the events of 04 Aug 95;
- (c) The Préfet of Cyangugu;
- (d) RPA Battalion Commander;
- (e) The Local Chief of the Gendarmerie;
- (f) RPA representative from RPA HQ Kigali; and
- (g) RPA Liaison Officer.

2. Points put forward by the RPA Battalion Commander. The RPA Battalion Commander felt that the shooting incident of 04 August 95 was not isolated but the result of a built up of a

series of other incidents. These are given below, as described by the RPA Battalion Commander:-

(a) 23 July 95. In Kagano Commune, a MALAWI Company vehicle apparently had an accident with the driver and other soldiers drunk.

(b) 03 Aug 95.

(1) At about 0900 hours, a Land Rover of the MALAWI Company, commanded by a Lieutenant, created a disturbance in Kamembe Market with a drunken driver refusing to pay for his liquor. The local RPA Battalion Commander himself intervened and escorted the vehicle upto the RPA permanent Check post. The vehicle apparently almost crashed into the road block. On the RPA Battalion Commanders instructions, the driver was physically removed from the wheel by the MALAWIANS and the vehicle despatched to Shagasha Camp.

(2) Subsequently the RPA Liaison Officer came to the MALAWI Company and spoke to one of the officers regarding the behaviour of the soldiers due to the non availability of the Company Commander.

(c) 04 Aug 95. Reference this HQ Special Sitrep mentioned above, in addition the RPA Battalion Commander said that his office and residence had been surrounded by two APCs and troops with weapons deployed. Subsequently the troops left on learning that he was not available. He went on to describe exactly how the troops and weapons were deployed.

(d) 05 Aug 95. After the incidents of 04 Aug 95, a group of MALAWI Company soldiers apparently moved by taxi to Kamembe market in civilian clothes and proceeded to a local bar. At about 2030 hours they allegedly stole 1500 Rwandan Francs from the bar owner. and tried to forcibly smuggle a girl back to Shagasha camp in MALAWI Army uniform. It is also alleged that they were claiming that they would burn Kamembe, beat up the RPA so that the FRGF returns and seriously engages the RPA.

3. The RPA Battalion Commander claimed that he could relieve the MALAWI Company of their weapons any time after 2000 hours as they are all drunk by then. He insisted repeatedly that :-

(a) The Officiating Company Commander responsible for command of the company from 03 to 05 August 95 explain why he ordered his troops to surround his office and residence.

(b) He also explain his intentions and orders to his officers and men.

(c) Explanations or clarifications from any concerned repatriated personnel could be obtained in writing if need be.

Points put forward by the Préfet

4. The Préfet opined that as Cyangugu is an unstable border Prefecture, there could easily be an accident of mistaken identity wherein MALAWI Company soldiers creating a disturbance in the town in civilian clothes could be shot at/ hurt thinking them to be bandits. He requested the new Company Commander to exercise control over the behaviour of his troops.

Points Brought out by Outgoing Company Commander of the MALAWI Company.

5. In response to the insistence of the RPA Battalion Commander for an explanation of events of 04 Aug 95, he explained that :-

(a) He sent one APC with 4-5 soldiers under a Lieutenant to meet the RPA Liaison Officer to try and sort out the situation.

(b) Another APC with 4-5 soldiers under the Medical Officer was sent to look up the soldiers in the hospital.

(c) He did not clarify how these troops and vehicles had arrived at the residence/ office of the RPA Battalion Commander.

(d) He stated that he reacted to the unspecific information that two of his men had been shot in the town by the RPA and was not sure of the exact details of what had happened in the town.

(e) As to events of 23 Jul, 03 Aug and 05 Aug, he did not comment.

Points Brought out by the MILOBS Sector Commander.

6. The Sector Commander highlighted the following aspects:-

(a) The matter had been reported in detail to the DFC and the Force HQ.

(b) The individuals guilty of escalating the situation of 04 Aug had been identified and reported to the Force HQ.

(c) The reaction of the RPA for firing on the Malawi soldiers for a traffic offence was unwarranted. The RPA claims that only one soldier was responsible for the firing and that the wounds were from ricochets off the ground did not match the investigations conducted on 04 Aug 95. He advised the RPA Battalion Commander to carry out a thorough investigation on the matter.

(d) The situation was escalated unnecessarily by both the RPA and the MALAWI Company. The RPA have been responsible for escalating the situation initially by the shooting of the soldier. The MALAWI Company also contributed to the escalation by sending armed troops to the town and the RPA Battalion Commander's office.

(e) The new MALAWI Company Commander should start afresh. He advised the new

Company Commander to take strict measures to ensure no further incidents arose. He recommended that if need be, the town should be placed "Out of Bounds" for the troops.

Conclusion.

7. The RPA Battalion Commander concluded that as there was a command failure in the MALAWI Company, strict action must be taken by UNAMIR against the commanders responsible for taking no action on all events building up to the shooting and the wrong order passed in ordering troops to surround his office/residence. He however appreciated the role of the MILOBS in diffusing the tense situation on the 04 Aug.

8. The MILOB Sector Commander thanked all present in the meeting for reviewing the situation arising after the incidents of 04 Aug and strive to continue to work in cordial manner as hitherto.


