MINUTES OF UHAAG MEETING OF MONDAY 26 FEBRUARY 96

HELD AT 0930 HRS IN UNAMIR CONFERENCE ROOM

ITEM I - INTRODUCTION

1. The Chairman welcomed all the participants and the meeting started at 0935 hrs.

ITEM II - MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

2. The Secretary read out the minutes of the last UHAAG meeting.

ITEM III - REQUESTS CONSIDERED BY UHAAG

3. **Request for Transportation of Educational Items.** Adventist University has requested for transportation of University goods from its earlier location at Mudende, Gisenyi to Kigali. The load is approximately three trucks worth. The request was accepted and the transport would be provided on a suitable date.

Action - G3 OPS

4. **Construction of Link Track.** Rwandan Ministry of Agriculture has requested for construction of a link track of approximately 60 metres length, in Kigali. The Group decided that Engineers should carry out a recce and subsequently the task may be undertaken depending on the effort involved and resources available.

Action - FEO

5. **Provision of Vehicles, Generator and Office Equipment.** Adventist University, earlier located at Gisenyi and now planned to be temporarily opened at Kigali, has requested for vehicles, generator, computers, office equipment, office furniture, carpentry and welding tools and equipment. The request was pending for consideration later as UN HQ is yet to give out its policy on disposal of UNAMIR equipment.

6. **Provision of Vehicles, Generator, Tents and Public Address System.** The Restore Ministry of Rwanda has requested for vehicles, a generator, tents and a public address system for use in rural areas during its seminars and congregations. The request was pending for consideration later as UN HQ is yet to give out its policy on disposal of UNAMIR equipment.

7. The meeting concluded at 1010 hrs.



SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA) - HUMANITARIAN FINAL REPORT

HUMANITARIAN SITUATION AFTER THE WAR

1. THE WAR HAD WIDELY DEVASTED THE INFRASTRUCTURE IN THE PREFECTURE. APART FROM THE LARGE NUMBER OF IDPS, WIDOWS AND ORPHANS WHO NEEDED SUPPORT, BASIC INFRASTRUCTURE LIKE ELECTRIC SUPPLY AND WATER SUPPLY HAD TO BE RESTORED. MOST OF THE HOSPITALS/HEALTH CENTRES WERE RANSACKED AND FURNITURE AND MEDICAL EQUIPMENT STOLEN. THEIR RESTORATION WAS A MAJOR TASK. SIMILARLY, A LARGE NUMBER OF HOUSES WERE DAMAGED AND THEIR RECONSTRUCTION WAS A PRIORITY TASK. THE TRACING AND RE-UNIFICATION PROGRAM FOR THE ORPHANS AND THEIR REHABILITATION NEEDED GREATER ATTENTION.

GENERAL MODE OF OPERATION

2. IN ORDER TO COORDINATE AND STREAMLINE THE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO BE RENDERED, THERE WAS A NECESSITY TO OBTAIN BASIC DATA. THE BASIC DATA WHICH WAS COLLECTED BY MILOBS OVER A PERIOD OF TIME DURING THE PATROLS WAS AS FOLLOWS:-

A. NUMBER, LOCATION AND CONDITION OF HOSPITALS/ HEALTH CENTRES IN THE COMMUNES.

B. DETAILED LIST OF IDP'S AND WIDOWS, THEIR LOCATION, CONDITION AND PROBLEMS.

C. DETAILED LIST OF ORPHANS (ACCOMPANIED/ UNACCOMPANIED) THEIR LIVING CONDITIONS AND ASSISTANCE REQUIRED.

D. DATA REGARDING DAMAGED HOUSES, BUILDINGS AND SCHOOLS.

E. STATE OF ROADS AND TRACKS, CONDITION OF BRIDGES AND EVALUATION OF THE ENGINEERING SUPPORT REQUIRED TO IMPROVE THEIR STATE.

F. AGRICULTURAL INFORMATION TO INCLUDE THE CURRENT STATE AND THE EVALUATION OF THE ASSISTANCE IN TERMS OF PROVISION OF SEEDS, AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS, FERTILISERS AND INSECTICIDES.

G. REQUIREMENT AND MODALITIES OF DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD DONATED BY WORLD FOOD PROGRAM TO POOR FAMILIES, WIDOWS AND ORPHANS.

H. CONSTANT MONITORING OF THE PLIGHT OF IDP'S AND RETURNEES IN THE COMMUNES.

(3) ASSISTANCE IN TRANSPORTATION OF STATIONARY ITEMS DONATED BY UNICEF FROM GITARAMA PREFECTURE TO COMMUNE OFFICES.

C. SOCIAL WORK.

(1) CONSTANT MONITORING OF THE PLIGHT OF RETURNEES AND IDP'S IN THE COMMUNES AND ASSISTING THEM TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT POSSIBLE.

(2) OBTAINING BODY BAGS, PLASTIC SHEETINGS, SURGICAL GLOVES AND CHEMICALS FOR REBURIAL PROGRAMS.

(3) EFFORTS TOWARDS RE-UNIFICATION OF FAMILIES BY TAKING LISTS OF ORPHANS TO ALL COMMUNE OFFICES AND TRACING FAMILIES WITH THE HELP OF NGOS.

(4) DONATION OF BLANKETS AND CLOTHING TO THE ORPHANS IN THE ORPHANAGES AT KABGAYI AND NYANZA.

D. MEDICAL ASSISTANCE.

(1) MILOBS PARTICIPATED IN THE PREFECTURE VACCINATION PROGRAM BY CONVEYING MEDICAL PERSONNEL AND POLIO VACCINE TO NYAKABANDA COMMUNE DURING NOV 95.

(2) THIRTY THOUSAND ORS (ORAL REHYDRATION SALTS) PACKETS WERE DISTRIBUTED TO ALL THE HEALTH CENTRES IN THE PREFECTURE.

(3) MEDICINES FOR COMMON AILMENTS WERE DONATED TO VARIOUS HEALTH CENTRES IN THE COMMUNES.

D. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.

(1) ENGINEERING SUPPORT WAS PROVIDED TO DIFFUSE UNEXPLODED GRENADES AND MORTAR BOMBS DISCOVERED FROM TIME TO TIME.

(2) MINE AWARENESS LECTURE FOR NGOS WAS CONDUCTED AT SECTOR HQ TO FAMILIARISE THEM WITH THE THREAT OF MINES IN RWANDA.

E. REHABILITATION EFFORT.

(1) MILOBS DREW ATTENTION OF NGO'S TO THE PLIGHT OF WIDOWS/ ORPHANS IN THE COMMUNES TO SOLICIT SUPPORT FOR THEIR REHABILITATION WHICH WAS VERY SUCCESSFUL.

(2) NGOS ACTIVELY PARTICIPATED IN THE RECONSTRUCTION OF HOUSES IN MOST OF THE COMMUNES OF THE PREFECTURE UNDER THE 'FOOD FOR WORK PROGRAM'.

COOPERATION WITH NGOS

5. MONTHLY MEETINGS WITH NGOS WORKING IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE WERE ORGANISED ON A REGULAR BASIS TO DRAW THEIR ATTENTION AND SOLICIT THEIR PARTICIPATION IN RESOLVING OUTSTANDING PROBLEMS. THE NGOS PROMISED SUPPORT AND ARE WORKING OUT MODALITIES OF ASSISTANCE TO BE RENDERED. NOTABLY, THE ACHIEVEMENTS IN THIS REGARD ARE PROGRAM OF FEEDING PRISONERS IN THE COMMUNE CACHOTS, WHICH IS BEING LAUNCHED SHORTLY AND SUPPORT TO ORPHANAGES WHICH ARE IN A BAD STATE (NYANZA ORPHANAGE IN KIGOMA).

PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED

6. ALTHOUGH HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE WAS RENDERED WITH RELATIVE EASE, NEVERTHELESS, SOME PROBLEMS WHICH WERE ENCOUNTERED ARE:-

A. LACK OF RESOURCES IN GENERAL WITH UNAMIR AND THE NECESSITY TO RELY ON NGOS FOR RESOURCES.

B. LACK OF BRIDGING MATERIAL AS MOST OF THE ENGINEERING TASKS IDENTIFIED IN THE PREFECTURE COULD NOT BE EXECUTED FOR LACK OF RESOURCES.

CONCLUSION

7. MILOBS HAVE BEEN ABLE TO ESTABLISH A GOOD RAPPORT WITH THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND LOCAL POPULATION AND A GOOD WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH THE OTHER UN AGENCIES AND NGOS. THE MAGNITUDE OF HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE REQUIRED WAS COLLASAL AND THE ASSISTANCE RENDERED SO FAR HAS GONE A LONG WAY IN ALLEVIATING THE PROBLEMS OF THE LOCAL POPULATION TO A LARGE EXTENT.

REUNION DU COMITE DE CRISE A GITARAMA DU 12 Janvier 1996.

Introduction.

Le Préfet a délégué Madame Sous-Préfet chargée des affaires Sociales et Culturelles pour diriger cette réunion du comité de crise en Préfecture de GITARAMA.

Ordre du jour

- L'accueil des réfugiés rwandais venant des pays limitrophes
(au cas où ils viendraient en grand nombre et en même temps)
- Recommandations.

La présidente de la réunion a introduit en faisant un bref rappel sur la façon dont les réfugiés rwandais à l'extérieur retournent à Gitarama. Entre le 25 Août 1995 et le 4 Janvier 1996, 1.380 rapatriés **originaires** de Gitarama ont regagné le **pays** et ont été réinstallés dans leurs biens.

Selon les statistiques du H C R, 45.000 rwandais originaires de Gitarama étaient en exil en Mai 1995 dont la majorité était à Goma, 5.000 seulement étaient à UVIRA et très peu au Burundi et en Tanzanie. Il a été demandé aux Communes de donner le nombre de ses habitants encore en exil mais seules les Communes de Tambwe et Rutobwe ont déjà répondu avec 851 pour Tambwe et 1.117 pour Rutobwe.

Après cette brève présentation, les différents intervenants ont échangé les idées sur la façon dont le comité de crise peut gérer une situation difficile au cas où il y a le retour massif de réfugiés dans notre Préfecture. L'une des solutions est que dans quelques jours, le H C R va disponibiliser un centre de transit en Commune RUNDA. Sa capacité d'accueil est de 3.000 personnes à 5.000 personnes. CONCERN et SC/UK vont intervenir dans ce centre de transit pour la distribution des vivres, semences et matériel de base. Au cas où le centre de transit de RUNDA sera débordé; le H C R prévoit un petit centre à Kabgayi avec capacité d'accueil de 500 personnes. Si les conditions logistiques le permettent, aucune personne ne va dépasser plus d'une semaine au centre de transit.

D'après l'intervention de Jacqueline W. Parlevliet, représentante du H C R à GITARAMA, certains problèmes se posent :

- Comment céder les maisons de ces nouveaux rapatriés occupées par les autres?
- Elle a voulu savoir s'il y a les directives données au conseil Communal concernant le remboursement des biens pillés pendant la guerre (vaches...)
- Elle se demande si la Préfecture prévoit comment aider le groupe vulnérable de rapatriés qui sont prêts à venir.
- Elle a voulu aussi savoir s'il y a une procédure d'arrestation de rapatriés au moment où ils sont encore au centre de transit.
- Si les rescapés et les anciens réfugiés pourraient trouver leurs propres maisons, il n'y aurait plus ce problème d'occupation des maisons des autres. C'est dans ce cadre que le Sous-Préfet chargé des affaires sociales a présenté un rapport par Commune du nombre de familles qui n'ont pas d'abris. Selon les rapports des Bourgoumestres, on compte en Préfecture de Gitarama plus de 17.373 familles qui n'ont pas de maisons.
- Le groupe vulnérable retourné va bénéficier avec les autres une aide des vivres provenant de P.A.I.I. une fois par mois.
- Concernant l'arrestation, en principe, elle se fait sur la colline pour ne pas déranger les rapatriés dès qu'ils sont encore au centre de transit : a répondu Capitaine NYAKARUNDI P.C. 305 Brigade.

Les recommandations.

- La plupart des participants ont suggéré que les **conseils communaux** pourraient organiser un recensement sérieux des besoins dans chaque Commune et le nombre de maisons occupées par les autres.
- Pour la reconstruction, il a été demandé au MINIREISO avec les autorités Préfectorales de Présenter dans les meilleurs délais, un document de précision : (identification précise des maisons à construire, matériel nécessaire, coût ...)


- Il est regrettable, mais aussi à vérifier l'information donnée par le H C R que à NTONGWE, le rapatrié doit donner 80.000F pour récupérer sa propre maison.
- Les autorités préfectorales sont priées de donner des directives au conseil communal concernant la procédure de remboursement des biens pillés pendant la guerre et de récupération des biens (maisons, champs) par leurs propriétaires.

Pour clore cette réunion, Madame Sous-Préfet a décidé que dans la prochaine réunion on va inviter toutes les O.N.G. avant de choisir une qui représentera les autres dans d'autres réunions qui vont suivre.

La réunion qui avait commencé à 10h25' a été clôturée à 12h45'.





The school has recently reopened as it was earlier being used as a transit centre. The Group decided that Engineers may undertake the task as and when the dozer is available on completion of the priority tasks.

5. **Repair of Generators at Nsinda Prison**. Rwandan Ministry of Justice has requested for repair of two generators at Nsinda prison. These generators were earlier installed by UNAMIR. The request was accepted and the task would be undertaken by the UNAMIR Generator Unit, as and when possible.

6. **Filling Up of Garbage Pit at Gisenyi Prison**. MILOB Sector 5 has projected the need of filling up of a garbage pit at Gisenyi prison. The pit was originally dug by the Force Engineer Company. The request was accepted and the task would be undertaken by the Force Engineers. However, the task will not be undertaken if the pit was used as a sewage pit.




4. **Request for Transportation of Construction Material.** The Secondary School at Gikonko in Mugusa commune has requested for assistance in transportation of construction material from different places in the commune to the school for construction of new class rooms. The request was for two to three vehicles for three weeks. The Group decided that the request could not be undertaken due to lack of resources and lower priority for transportation of items as construction materials.

5. **Provision of Vehicle, Furniture and Utensils for Orphanage.** An NGO, "International Assistance", has requested for a vehicle, furniture items, utensils, clothes and food items for their centre for widows and street children at Remera, Kigali. As UNAMIR presently does not hold such surplus stores the request was not accepted. However, it can be considered by the UNAMIR administration during the closure of the mission, when such items may become available.

WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 01 - 07 JAN 96

GENERAL SITUATION

1. There is an accelerated improvement in the humanitarian situation all over the country. Most of the requests received are being handled depending on the resources available.

2. Sector 1A

a. UN Agencies and NGOs. Swiss Disaster Relief was giving medical care at Ndera transit camp.

3. Sector 1B

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) MILOBS distributed Oral Rehydration Salts (ORS) packets to various health centres in the prefecture.

(2) MILOBS assisted in shifting of mild offenders from Gitarama to their respective communes. These pers were recently arrested in Kigali for not possessing work permit.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) ARDEC has extended its programme of reconstruction of houses to Taba commune.

(2) ACIST and LWF are undertaking agricultural and rehabilitation programmes in Mugina and Ntongwe communes.

(3) CONCERN is constructing a temporary camp for returnees in Ruyenzi sector of Runda commune. The camp is likely to be operational in two weeks time.

(4) CARITAS is supporting 10,000 poor families in Gitarama prefecture by distributing seeds, hoes and food material.

(5) CONCERN is feeding prisoners in Mugina and Ntongwe commune cachots on a five day basis from Monday to Friday. The food is cooked by the prisoners. Maize,

beans and cooking oil is provided by the NGO.

(6) CARITAS has built 2000 houses for the IDPs in the prefecture.

(7) ICRC continues to monitor hygiene and sanitation in the various commune cachots.

4. Sector 2B

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities. GHANCOY medics treated and discharged 111 local patients at their RAP over the week.

b. General Living Conditions

(1) Water. The pipeline being constructed from Sake to Rukumbeli is now being taken on by COFORWA. The project was earlier being executed by Terres Sans Frontiers which has since been expelled.

(2) Housing

(a) A project for construction of 100 houses is being undertaken in Rwinkwavu area which is earmarked for resettlement of old case returnees by an NGO called ALDELK. PAM is providing food for the labourers for this project on a food for work basis.

(b) IRC is considering a project for providing assistance has taken up a project for assistance in construction of houses in Birenga commune.

(3) Roads and Tracks. Tracks in the Nasho area where the old case load of returnees are being re-settled are in a poor state of maintenance.

5. Sector 5B

a. General Living Conditions

(1) Housing. The joint FHI/WFP housing project continued in five communes.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs. UNHCR continued with the repatriation process. The planned repot of OCL from Masisi from 03 Jan 96 has been suspended. Fresh date is yet to be confirmed. The situation in Goma continues to be tense after two bomb blasts on 05 Jan 96 near a cathedral killed one and seriously injured two others.

6. Sector 5C

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities. The state of infrastructure, for example roads and lack of cooperation by some local authorities had negative effects on the sector's humanitarian effort. Resultantly some localities benefited at the expense of others. Humanitarian activities undertaken include:

(1) Engineering. The Indian engineers team made a detour in Rwamatamu to allow traffic pass after a bus hit a mine in Oct 95. They also helped giving mine awareness lectures. The team carried out a mine clearance exercise at the Kibuye church after an explosion injured a young boy late Dec 95.

(2) Orphanages and Supplementary Feeding Programme. MILOBS supplied information required by HAC for sourcing of material assistance. The sector supplied blankets to local orphanages as well as nutritional foods. At the same time ICRC managed to reunite a lot of dispersed children with their families.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) NGOs operating in Kibuye prefecture are ADRA, CARITAS, SDR, ICRC, Solidarite and COOPI. These, the local authorities and other UN agencies notably UNHCR, Human Rights, WFP and the International Tribunal Commission worked closely with MILOBS. They benefited through the use of MILOBS office facilities eg fax and telephones and were given a weekly security brief.

(2) MILOBS escorted food delivery convoys to Murunda, Rutshiro and Bwiza areas which without MILOBS involvement could not be reached. The sector requested and was allocated a NICOY truck to augment work being done by NGOs. Local authorities were allowed the use of UNAMIR vehicles, occasionally were given fuel, patrolled to Bwiza and communes using UN transport, air and land. Food, medical drugs, blankets and agricultural implements were distributed to commune authorities. Human Rights conducted lectures to prefecture staff on human rights issues.

c. Success and Failures. The following were successes recorded in our endeavour to improve the quality of life:

(1) Distribution of food and blankets to the needy.

(2) Distribution of medicines and transportation of medical staff to isolated areas of Murunda and Bwiza.

(3) Acquisition and dissemination of information to HAC for humanitarian purposes.

(4) In cooperation with other organisations, helped communes and returnees by providing food, medication, shelter, water, seeds and agricultural implements. Some areas are inaccessible by road and heli transport was used.

(5) Creating good working relationship with other agencies through joint programmes and exchange of information.

(6) Support to aid organisations.

CONCLUSION

6. The main responsibility of HAC now is for coordination of support to the returnees from entry to resettlement. Most of the requests received will be for transport assistance, medical, food and shelter. However, the main tasks UNAMIR is likely to be able to undertake is only of transport of returnees.

WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT

FOR THE PERIOD 14 JAN - 21 JAN 96

1. GENERAL SITUATION. The general situation has witnessed a slight change. Acts of banditry were on the decline during the week. MILOBS have reported that people are busy with cultivation. However, people have as usual complained about shortage of seeds, fertilizers and insecticides. The overall situation is reported to be calm.

2. OWN HAC ACTIVITIES. MILOBS distributed Oral Rehydration Salts (ORS) packets to various health centers in the prefectures.

3. GENERAL LIVING CONDITIONS.

a. Food. No change from last report. Food is still reported to inadequate in the communes. CARITAS is distributing food to very poor families in the prefecture on a regular basis.

b. Water. There is a marked improvement in the water supply in Gitarama and surrounding communes.

c. Health Care and Health Problems. There is an outbreak of malaria in Cukiro and Giseke Sectors of Mushubati Commune. CARITAS will stop supply of drugs to Nyarusange Health Centre in the same commune. ICRC continues to monitor hygiene and sanitation in the cachots.

d. Housing. ARDEC has extended its program of reconstruction of houses to TABA Commune (8883).

e. Education. No change.

f. Farming Activities. People have requested for urgent assistance in the provision of insecticides for treatment of Potato crops which has been affected severely. (MILOBS Sect 2 letter dated 05 Dec 95 refers).

g. Roads and bridges. No Change.

h. Electricity. No change.

4. PEOPLE WITH SPECIAL NEEDS.

a. Orphanages. NTR.

b. Hospital. SALVATION ARMY will cease support to GITEGA Health centre of NYAKABANDA Commune (6597) wef the New year. ICRC has pledged support.

c. Handicap. NTR.

d. Elderlies. NTR.

e. Widows. NTR.

f. IDPs. NTR.

g. Returnees. See Annex A for statistics.

h. Prisoners. See Annex B for statistics.

5. ACTIVITIES OF NGOS.

a. ACIST and LWF are undertaking agricultural and rehabilitation programs in MUGINA Commune (9267) and NTONGWE Commune (9057).

b. CONCERN is constructing a temporary camp for returnees in RUYENZI SECTOR of Runda Commune (9882). The camp is likely to be operational in two weeks time.

c. ARDEC is engaged in the reconstruction of houses in RUNDA Commune (9882). It has now extended its activities to TABA Commune (8883) as well.

d. LWF is engaged in repair of damaged houses in TAMBWE Commune (7653) and NTONGWE Commune (9057).

e. CRS is winding up its activities in MURAMA Commune (6749) by distributing seeds, fertilizers and goats to the locals.

f. CARITAS is supporting 10,000 poor families in GITARAMA Prefecture by distributing seeds, hoes and food material.

g. CONCERN is feeding prisoners in MUGINA and NTONGWE Commune cachots on a five day basis from Monday to Friday. The food is cooked by the prisoners. Maize, Beans and cooking oil is provided by the NGO.

h. CARITAS has built 2000 houses for the IDPs in the prefecture.

6. ACTIVITIES OF UN AGENCIES. Hum Offr maintains constant contact with HRFOR and UNHCR officers. ICRC continues to monitor hygiene and sanitation in the various commune cachots.

7. REQUESTS FOR HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE.

a. Request for septic truck for Nyanza Orphanage and Musambira Commune cachot has still NOT materialized.

b. Favorable action is requested on our request for provision of mattresses, pillows and bed sheets. (MILOBS SECTOR 1B letter dated 22 Nov 95 refers).


c. Favorable action is requested on our request for supply of pesticides. (MILOBS Sect 2 letter dated 05 Dec 95 refers).

8. CONCLUSION. Demand for humanitarian assistance far exceeds our resources. The NGOs are however making efforts at meeting some of the requests. Humanitarian efforts at the sector level will continue to be largely, one of liaison.

9. ASSESSMENT.

a. The activities of the NGOs and agencies involved in looking after the welfare of returnees is slowly, but, surely bearing fruit. It is just a matter of time before things could be expected to return to normal.

b. The outstanding requests as per Para 7 above should be actioned as soon as possible.





ITEM I - INTRODUCTION

1. The Chairman welcomed all present and quickly highlighted the items in the minutes of the last meeting.

ITEM II - REQUESTS CONSIDERED BY UHAAG

2. The request from Byumba Prefecture for a bulldozer to clear the plots for the returnees' families was considered and approved. The Force Engr Coy will carry out an immediate recce of the job area with a view to executing it.

Action - FEO

3. A request from Logistics Officer, WFP Kigali for the provision of fencing storage tents unit was considered. It was decided that WFP be asked for the exact details of area to be covered. Force Engr Coy will then do the costing job and supervision later while WFP will purchase the materials and also provide necessary labour.

4. The request for 27 km road repairs within Nyabisindu commune from MILOBS Sector 3B was considered but not approved, due to the heavy resource commitments required.

5. A request by HACU for assistance in her commune rehabilitation projects by provision of bulldozer and water truck at their disposal, was also considered. It was decided that HACU be informed that our bulldozer cannot be put at their disposal as requested. However, the Force Engineers may carry out specific tasks by themselves. Besides, a water tank truck also cannot be put at their disposal but UNAMIR can consider delivery of water at some specific points on request.

6. The HACU's request for 2,000 litres of diesel to run their generator was also considered but not approved due to non-availability of fuel for donation to other agencies.

7. The request for telephone lines' repairs by Ministry of Rehabilitation and Social Integration/HACU was considered and approved. Force Sig Coy will undertake the task of assisting Rwandatel for the purpose, to the extent possible.

8. On request for transport for animal vaccination programme by the Ministry of Agriculture, it was decided that they be asked to provide us with more details as to the duration of the assignment, areas to be covered etc.

9. The request for transport by the Salvation Army, Kigali to move 41 tons of food from WFP warehouse in Kigali to Gitega Nutrition Centre Nyakabanda commune, Gitarama Prefecture was also considered and approved.



WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 25 - 31 DEC 95

GENERAL SITUATION

1. The general humanitarian situation as reported by all the sectors shows an improvement. The rate of absorption in the communes is quite good.

2. Sector 1A

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities. The main activity of Humanitarian team has been to monitor the arrival and situation of returnees.

3. Sector 1B

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) 95 CMSG moved a generator within the complex of Gatagara centre in Kigoma commune on 27 Dec 95.

(2) Force Engr Coy excavator working at the Gitarama prison has completed its task. It has dug three pits to improve the sanitary conditions in the prison.

(3) INDBATT provided two trucks for transportation of Ballet dancers from Murama commune to Gitarama on 30 Dec 95 to participate in the reconciliation function at the Gitarama stadium.

a. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) ACIST and LWF are undertaking agricultural and rehabilitation programmes in Mugina commune.

(2) CONCERN is constructing a temporary camp for returnees in Ruyenzi sector of Runda commune.

(3) ARDEC is engaged in the reconstruction of houses in Runda commune.

(4) LWF is engaged in repair of damaged houses in Tambwe and Ntongwe commune.

(5) CARITAS is supporting 10,000 poor families in Gitarama prefecture by distributing seeds, hoes and food material. It has built 2000 houses for the IDPs in the prefecture.

4. Sector 2A

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) Provided transport from own resources to convey 7 bags of 50 kgs each of fertilizer, 1 kg of cabbage seeds, 5.5 kgs of carrot seeds and 8 kgs of bean seeds.

(2) The sector provided transport to convey drugs from the Byumba medical stores to Cyungo health centre at the request of the centre's authorities.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) AMREF continued to support the Kivuye and Bungwe health centres by providing medicines. An AMREF doctor visits the health centres once a week. The NGO was also rehabilitating the Buyoga health centre.

(2) UNICEF continued to distribute text books and other school materials to primary schools in the sector.

5. Sector 2B

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) GHANCOY medics treated and discharged 210 local patients at their RAP over the week.

(2) GHANCOY provided two Chevrolets for conveyance of invigilators to Sake and Muhazi communes for national exams.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) UNHCR is trying to persuade the returnees in Tanzania to return in larger numbers and has organized the visits of the representatives of refugees from Tanzania in this respect.

(2) CARITAS from Italy is to wind up its assistance programme to Rukara health centre from Mar 96.

(3) WFP is assisting in a housing project to be undertaken jointly with UNDP in Rusumo commune.

5. Sector 3A

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) Oral Rehydration Salts. The Humanitarian agencies distributed Oral Rehydration Salts (ORS) to hospitals and health centres.

(2) Transport Assistance to Gendarmerie. The Humanitarian Cell provided transport assistance to the Gendarmerie to enable them to discharge their duties in outlying communes.

6. Sector 4

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities. Regular visits are being made to border crossing points, transit camps and communes.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) UNHCR has taken up a project for augmentation/provisioning of water supply at Rusizi 1, Rusizi 2 and Uvira crossing points.

(2) Arrangements are underway to establish medical aid posts at all entry points by MDM, MSF and other NGOs.

(3) Transit Facilities. With the anticipated increased influx of returnees the handling capacity of all three transit camps in this sector are being increased. The increased capacity shall be intimated separately on completion of work.

(4) WFP, PAM and PAN are currently providing food to the orphanage at Kibogora. There is however a need to supply more food as presently the supply is not adequate.

8. Sector 5B

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) The sector coordinated provision of UNAMIR transport from NICOY to FHI for the transportation of building material to the communes.

(2) The sector was approached by the Inspector of schools to assist in distribution of test papers to the communes.

(3) The MILOBS provided escort to IOM vehicles going to Kavoya.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs. FHI has distributed 150 tons of food which include maize, beans and cooking oil.

9. Sector 5C

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities


(1) The sector transported two catholic nuns of Ecole Normale Technique (ETN), Kibuye to Kigali on 26 Dec 95.

(2) A truck load of fuel wood was transported from Mubuga in Gishyita commune, for Ecole Normale Technique, Kibuye on 29 Dec 95, using the TCV of the GHANCOY platoon.

(3) Fifty (50) pieces of blankets were donated to the Mwendo commune offices on 29 Dec 95 and another fifty (50) to BWIZA Refugee camp on 30 Dec 95.

CONCLUSION

10. The main responsibility of HAC now is for coordination of support to the returnees from entry to resettlement. Most of the requests received will be for transport assistance, medical, food and shelter. However, the main tasks UNAMIR is likely to be able to undertake is only of transportation of returnees.

ITEM I - INTRODUCTION

1. Minutes of last meeting were highlighted by the Chairman who also informed that a new CHAO Lt Col Nestor Sainz Taranto is on the ground now and hopefully will chair the next meeting.

ITEM II - REQUESTS CONSIDERED BY UHAAG

2. A request from an association "GIRUBUNGU" for the granting of property like utensils, vehicles, water heater, furniture etc was considered. The STO informed that a lot of items are in the process of being written off by the "ASSETS MANAGEMENT GROUP" due to the repatriation of some Contingents. He suggested a HAC rep attending the committee meetings so as to be in a position to know the available items and make subsequent use of them in the humanitarian field.

Action - CHAO

3. A transport request from Rwandese Ministry of Agriculture and Rearing for provision of 10 vehicles (4 runners or pick-ups double cabin) for their vaccination programme was also considered but not approved due to immediate non-availability. However, as per the AFC's instruction on the issue, the Ministry should be asked to make contact with the various Sectors' MILOBS HQ with a view to their assisting them in any way possible transport-wise for the programme.


4. A request from Kigali Prefecture for trucks to transport food (800 tons) from WFP warehouse to the Communes for the period 11 - 17 Jan 96 was also considered. It was not approved because the planned repatriation programme of some Contingents would make UNAMIR transport assistance very minimal. Besides, such requests are to be routed through the Rwandese government Ministry of Planning.

5. Another request from IMC for the digging of some pit latrines in a school in Kibungo was also considered. The digging was approved but the permanent supervision of the masonry aspect of the job was not approved because it will involve keeping some UNAMIR personnel permanently there to supervise the job. UNAMIR does not have the capacity presently to engage in such extra tasks.

WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT

FOR THE PERIOD 01 JAN - 07 JAN 96

1. GENERAL SITUATION. The general situation has witnessed a slight change. Acts of banditry were on the decline during the week. MILOBS have reported that people are busy with cultivation. However, people have as usual complained about shortage of seeds, fertilisers and insecticides. The overall situation is reported to be calm.

2. OWN HAC ACTIVITIES.

a. MILOBS distributed Oral Rehydration Salts (ORS) packets to various health centres in the prefectures.

b. MILOBS assisted in shifting of MILD OFFENDERS from Gitarama to their respective communes. These pers were recently arrested in Kigali for not possessing work permit.

3. GENERAL LIVING CONDITIONS.

a. Food. No change from last report. Food is still reported to inadequate in the communes. CARITAS is distributing food to very poor families in the prefecture on a regular basis.

b. Water. There is a marked improvement in the water supply in Gitarama and surrounding communes.

c. Health Care and Health Problems. There is an outbreak of malaria in Cukiro and Giseke Sectors of Mushubati Commune. CARITAS will stop supply of drugs to Nyarusange Health Centre in the same commune. ICRC continues to monitor hygiene and sanitation in the cachots.

d. Housing. ARDEC has extended its programme of reconstruction of houses to TABA Commune (8883).

e. Education. No change.

f. Farming Activities. People have requested for urgent assistance in the provision of insecticides for treatment of Potato crops which has been affected severely. (MILOBS Sect IB letter dated 05 Dec 95 refers).

g. Roads and bridges. No Change.

h. Electricity. No change.

4. PEOPLE WITH SPECIAL NEEDS.

a. Orphanages. NTR.

b. Hospital. NTR.

c. Handicap. NTR.

d. Elderlies. NTR.

e. Widows. NTR.

f. IDPs. NTR.

g. Prisoners. See Annex A for statistics.

5. ACTIVITIES OF NGOS.

a. ACIST and LWF are undertaking agricultural and rehabilitation programmes in MUGINA Commune (9267) and NTONGWE Commune (9057).

b. CONCERN is constructing a temporary camp for returnees in RUYENZI SECTOR of Runda Commune (9882). The camp is likely to be operational in two weeks time.

c. CARITAS is supporting 10,000 poor families in GITARAMA Prefecture by distributing seeds, hoes and food material.

d. CONCERN is feeding prisoners in MUGINA and NTONGWE Commune cachots on a five day basis from Monday to Friday. The food is cooked by the prisoners. Maize, Beans and cooking oil is provided by the NGO.

e. CARITAS has built 2000 houses for the IDPs in the prefecture.

6. ACTIVITIES OF UN AGENCIES. Hum Offr maintains constant contact with HRFOR and UNHCR officers. ICRC continues to monitor hygiene and sanitation in the various commune cachots.


7. REQUESTS FOR HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE.

- a. Request for septic truck for Nyanza Orphanage and Musambira Commune cachot has still NOT materialised.
- b. Favourable action is requested on our request for provision of mattresses, pillows and bed sheets. (MILOBS SECTOR 1B letter dated 22 Nov 95 refers).
- c. Favourable action is requested on our request for supply of pesticides. (MILOBS Sect IB letter dated 05 Dec 95 refers).

8. CONCLUSION. Demand for humanitarian assistance far exceeds our resources. The NGOs are however making efforts at meeting some of the requests. Humanitarian efforts at the sector level will continue to be largely, one of liaison.

9. ASSESSMENT.

- a. The activities of the NGOs and agencies involved in looking after the welfare of returnees is slowly, but, surely bearing fruit. It is just a matter of time before things could be expected to return to normal.
- b. The outstanding requests as per Para 7 above should be actioned as soon as possible.



WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 13 - 19 NOV 95

GENERAL SITUATION

1. The humanitarian situation all over the country is not improving as the population really need. Aid from NGOs, WFP and ICRC are still essential for them still now as a substantive self sufficiency was not achieved. Fear, insecurity and the real danger of being imprisoned or even killed for futile reasons are prevalent among the population. They are afraid of legal forces acting legally or illegally, plus bandits (and insurgents in the East bank of Kivu lake). Reconciliation sounds like a dream more than a possibility and justice is almost paralyzed. Prisons' problems are ameliorated, but without the justice working, it is merely a matter of time to have them overcrowded again.

HAC ACTIVITIES

2. UHAAG meeting was conducted.
3. Normal brief for NGOs in HACU was conducted.
4. HAC patrol team went out to visit projects sights in Kigali.
5. Sector 1A
 - a. Sector Humanitarian Activities. Details of major activities carried out are as follows:
 - (1) Gikomero Commune. MILOBS team donated a ball to children of the commune at their own expense.
 - (2) Improvement of Tracks. Force Engr Coy are repairing track from Kinamba to gisozi.
 - (3) Ngenda Commune. A total of 70 returnees arrived from Burundi in the past week and have been re-settled in Ngenda and Gashora communes.
 - b. General Living Conditions
 - (1) Health Care. Rilima health centre requires beds and drugs as it has an average capacity of 60 patients per

day and it takes care of an average of 10,000 locals.

(2) Housing. The availability of houses in most accessible communes is a problem, limited government assisted projects to repair damaged houses in most commune has been observed by MILOBS.

6. Sector 1B

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) The Humanitarian Officer visited the CENA of Hanika centre for unaccompanied children in Kigoma commune on 14 Nov 95 to follow up on the requirement of assistance required by the centre in terms of food and blankets.

(2) INDBATT provided two trucks to transport sand for ARDEC which is engaged in construction of houses in Runda commune.

(3) Force Engr Coy provided two trucks on 16 Nov 95 and three trucks on 17 Nov 95 to transport 17 tons of food from Kigali to Ruhango in Tambwe commune for "Barakabaho Foundation".

b. General Living Conditions

(1) Orphanages. Nyanza orphanage and CENA of HANIKA centre for unaccompanied children in Kigoma commune is in desperate need of blankets and food.

(2) Infants. There is a nutrition centre for 500 infants in Gasovu sector of Kayenzi commune. The centre is not aided by any organisation and is in a precarious condition.

c UN Agencies and NGOs. Humanitarian Officer maintains constant contact with HRFOR and UNHCR officers. ICRC continues to provide medical assistance to prisoners in the various commune cachots.

7. Sector 2A

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities. The following activities were undertaken:

(1) Humanitarian Officer visited the Urumuli orphanage and CASA S. Guiseppe Childrens Home during the week. He also visited the site of a bridge at Muranza in Buyoga commune to assess the repairs required. Additionally, the Humanitarian Officer visited the Muhura health centre and the Mukarange primary school.

(2) A team transported the new Bourgmestre and two officials from the Byumba prefecture to and from Cyumba commune for a handing/taking over ceremony of the Bourgmestres on 14 Nov 95.

(3) MILOBS patrol transported a seriously sick patient from Tumba dispensary to Nebma hospital in Nyamagari commune of Ruhengeri prefecture on 13 Nov 95.

(4) MILOBS patrol picked up a man and wife who had fallen from a bicycle on the road Kigali - Gatuna and sent them to Byumba hospital.

(5) Sector 2A provided transport from own resources to transport fertilizer and seeds to Kiyombe and Gituza communes.

(6) 95 CMSG supplied blankets to the Gakenke health centre in Murambi on 7 Nov 95.

b. General Living Conditions

(1) Agriculture

(a) WFP provided 10 tons of beans and seeds for distribution to returnees and the poor in the Kiyombe commune.


(b) The Ministry of Agriculture distributed 1000 hoes each to Kivuye, Kiyombe and Buyoga communes.

(3) Prisons. Eight prisoners were transferred from Rutare cell to Byumba prison during the week. All are charged with genocide crime. Similarly seven prisoners charged with genocide were transferred from Murambi to Byumba prison. Nine persons alleged to have committed genocide were arrested and put in cell at Murambi. They were from sectors Rwankaba, Rwimitereri, Kiramuruzi and Nyabisindu. The commune office was still conducting preliminary hearing. Their names were not release. In Byumba, 9 inmates of the prison escaped during the week through a hole they had apparently dug during dark hours. Three of them were alleged to have committed genocide, 4 charged with armed robbery and 2 for rape.

(4) Orphanages

(a) Urumuli orphanage. Five children from Nyundo in Kisenyi were admitted on 13 Nov 95 bringing the currently population to 85 children.

(b) Gikoni Orphanage. The water pump at the



centre was still awaiting servicing by 95 CSMG.

(c) CASA S. Guiseppe Children Home. Seven of the children were re-united with their families during the week.

c. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) UNICEF distributed textbooks, exercise books and other school materials to primary schools.

(2) WFP distributed 320 bags of maize to road workers on Rukomo - Ngarama road on 17 Nov 95 and another 361 bags on 18 Nov 95. The road workers complained to MILOBS patrol team that they were always given only maize by their commune leaders and suspected that the leaders have been selling other food items such as beans and cooking oil meant for the workers. The workers requested MILOBS to endeavour to get WFP representatives to always be present to supervise the distribution of the food items.

8. Sector 2B

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) INDBATT provided 12 trucks for transfer of prisoners from Kibungo to Nisinda prisons.

b. General Living Conditions

(1) Water

(a) The Canadian NGO called Terre Sans Frontiers has established its office at Sake and is progressing the work of restoration of water supply in the Sake commune.

(b) Shortage of good drinking water has been reported from Rugarama, Gituku, Mushikili and Ntaruka sectors of Rukira commune.

(c) Adequate availability of water was reported at Nyakarambi transit camp.

(2) Housing

(a) German Agro-Action is undertaking a housing project for widows and orphans in Kigerama commune as part of which they plan to construct 50 houses (25 each in Vumwe and Kansana sectors) in the next two months. The project is already under way and seems to be very successful. The labour is being

paid on a food for work basis.

(b) A land demarcation exercise being undertaken in Mugesera commune has come to a stand still because of lack of adequate and appropriate survey equipment in terms of compasses and theodolites.

(c) In Kigerama commune a large number of inhabitants are re-constructing their houses. However, lack of availability of transport for transportation of poles is hampering a speedy execution of the work.

(d) LWF and UNHCR are assisting in constructing of houses in Rukira commune. 30 Sheets are being made available for each house, while the poles are available from commune plantations.

9. Sector 3A

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) UNHCR/UNHCHR Seminar on Genocide and the Justice System. A two-day seminar was organised in Gikongoro for judicial officials, prison officials, the Gendarmerie, RPA, Bourgmestres and NGOs to appraise all about laws and regulations governing genocide in Rwanda.

(2) Transport Assistance to Kigeme hospital. Sector continued to provide emergency transport assistance to Kigeme hospital.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs. Sector Humanitarian Cell continued to cooperate with all NGOs working in the sector. The NGOs have continued to provide assistance to various commune. The most widespread NGOs are TROCAIRE, World Vision, CARITAS, WFP, ICRC, MSF and GOAL. However, the NGOs have reduced their activities in communes bordering the Nyungwe forest like Kivu, Mudasmwa, Muusebeya and Muko. This is because of a perceived security threat from infiltrators alleged to be hiding in the forest.

10. Sector 3B

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities. The following task was done by MILOBS in coordination with formed troops, local authority and NGOs:

(1) Provided 2 trucks from MALICOY to Ruhashya and Maraba commune which were used for reburial ceremony.

(2) Provided 2 transports to Muyaga and Gishamvu commune

to transfer office materials.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs. CRS is providing farming implements like hoes and seeds to farmers in Shyanda commune. ICRC has stopped providing assistance to prisoners in Shyanda commune cachot. LVIA is assisting at Muganza commune in agricultural development, road repair and rehabilitation of health centre.

11. Sector 4

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) MALAWICOY medical team treated 75 local patients. The process was hampered due to lack of drugs. The Medical Officer of this Coy visited Yove and Bweyeye health centres in order to prepare for the vaccination campaign due to begin next week in which the MALAWICOY's medical team will also participate.

(2) 250 Blankets donated by the Austrian Relief Programme, brought from Kigali were distributed to orphanages as follows, Rusayo 110, Kibogora 50, Kamembe 40 and Nyamasheke 50.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs. The NGO, CONCERN Worldwide, undertakes active efforts to prepare Nyarushishi transit camp to cater for large number of refugees. MDM clinic at Bugarama transit camp continued to operate 24 hrs a day. The NGO Save The Children carries out the programme of reuniting childrens with their families during the period.

12. Sector 5B

a. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) COOPI has received a water tank from UNHCR having a capacity of 70000 litres to be installed at Nkamira transit camp to meet the additional requirement of the large influx take place. They also carried out vaccination in Mutura commune.

13. Sector 5C

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) On 16 Nov 95, MILOBS team delivered quantity 2 bales of 50 blankets each to the Mugenero hospital and Lesperance orphanage in Ngoma.

(2) A Humanitarian team visited the Murunda hospital on 17 Nov 95 and delivered 100 boxes of biscuits, 40 bags of

soya flour and 20 cartons of oil to the hospital. On the same day, a MILOBS team went to the Kilinda hospital and delivered quantity 50 blankets.

(3) On 18 Nov 95, quantity 50 blankets were delivered to the Rubengera health centre in the Mabanza commune.

(4) Upon request, the newly appointed Sous-Prefet for Economic Affairs for Kibuye prefecture was provided with transport to enable him bring down his family and personal belongings from Ruhengeri to Kibuye from 18 - 19 Nov 95.

b. General Living Conditions


(1) Health Care Problems. MSF and UNICEF are working diligently to improve and run hospital facilities throughout the prefecture. In general, the quality of health care provided is poor. Also overcrowding, untrained staff, broken-down equipment, inadequate water and latrine facilities and lack of transportation for the injured exasperate this bad situation.

(2) Water and Sanitation. ICRC is slowly making progress in repairing broken pipes and developing new sources of water. Shortfalls in water still occur daily throughout the prefecture.

c. UN Agencies and NGOs. The main NGOs operating in Kibuye prefecture are ADRA, CARITAS, Enfants du Monde, SDR, ICRC, MSF, Solidarity and various others who played a smaller role here. Two weeks ago, a two-day seminar on the procedures of arrest and detention was organised by the UNHCR and human Rights at the office of the prefecture from 9 - 10 Nov 95. It involved about 60 participants comprising the prefect, Sous-Prefets, Bourgmestres, the military as well as representatives from UN agencies and NGOs within the prefecture.

CONCLUSION

14. In all the sectors the Humanitarian Officers are working round the clock to see that all the request are looked into in a way to finding a solution to them despite the constraint in resources in HAC.

WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 18 - 24 DEC 95

GENERAL SITUATION

1. The general humanitarian situation as reported by all the sectors shows an improvement. The rate of absorption in the communes is quite encouraging.

2. Sector 1A

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities. The main activity of Humanitarian team has been to monitor the arrival and situation of returnees.

b. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) OXFAM QUEBEC provided iron sheet for shelter programme which will start in February in Butamwa commune.

(2) GTZ provided insecticides for the crops in Butamwa commune.

(3) IRC is assisting Kanzenze commune especially in water projects, rehabilitation and provision of loans.

3. Sector 1B

a. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) ACIST and LWF are undertaking agricultural and rehabilitation programmes in Mugina commune.

(2) CONCERN is constructing a temporary camp for returnees in Ruyenzi sector of Runda commune.

(3) ARDEC is still engaged in the reconstruction of houses in Runda commune.

(4) LWF is engaged in repair of damaged houses in Tambwe and Ntongwe commune.

(5) CRS is winding up its activities in Murama commune by distributing seeds, fertilisers and goats to the locals.

(6) Salvation Army distributed Christmas items including blankets, jerricans, cups, bowls, footballs and plates in Kayenzi commune.

(7) CONCERN is feeding prisoners in Mugina and Ntongwe commune cachots on a five day basis from Monday to Friday.

(8) ICRC continues to monitor hygiene and sanitation in the various commune cachots.

4. Sector 2B

a. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) UNHCR is trying to persuade the returnees in Tanzania to return in larger numbers and has organized the visits of the representatives of refugees from Tanzania in this respect.

(2) IRC and LWF are assisting in community development programmes.

(3) WFP is assisting in a housing project to be undertaken jointly with UNDP in Rusumo commune.

5. Sector 3A

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities

(1) Oral Rehydration Salts. The Humanitarian agencies distributed Oral Rehydration Salts (ORS) to hospitals and health centres.

(2) Transport Assistance to Gendarmerie. The Humanitarian Cell provided transport assistance to the Gendarmerie to enable them discharge their duties in outlying communes.

6. Sector 3B

a. Sector Humanitarian Activities. Two trucks were provided to transport office materials to Gishamvu and Kigembe communes from Butare Prefecture office.

7. Sector 5A

a. UN Agencies and NGOs. UNHCR continued to transport returnees from Nkamira transit camp to various communes.

8. Sector 5B

a. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) Food for Hungry/British Direct Aid have been given direction to continue operations for three months.

(2) UNHCR continued with the repatriation process and preparations and coordination with other NGOs in readiness for a sudden influx.


9. Sector 5C

a. UN Agencies and NGOs

(1) Returnees. The UNHCR, Human Rights and indirectly UNAMIR continue to assist returnees to return to the prefecture. The problem of housing still exists. The prefecture has one transit camp at Nyamishaba which could house 500 returnees comfortably. Returnee camps (Tentage) could also be constructed with the assistance of UNHCR depending on availability of resources at their disposal.

CONCLUSION

10. The main responsibility of HAC now is for coordination of support to the returnees and hence most of the requests to be received will be for transport assistance, medical, food and shelter. However, the main task UNAMIR will be able to undertake is only of transportation of returnees. Provision of assistance in areas of medical support, food and shelter will not be within the capabilities of UNAMIR and hence will be directed to other UN agencies/NGOs.

ITEM I - INTRODUCTION

1. Minutes of last meeting were highlighted by the Chairman who also informed that a new CHAO Lt Col Nestor Sainz Taranto is on the ground now and hopefully will chair the next meeting.

ITEM II - REQUESTS CONSIDERED BY UHAAG

2. A request from an association "GIRUBUNGU" for the granting of property like utensils, vehicles, water heater, furniture etc was considered. The STO informed that a lot of items are in the process of being written off by the "ASSETS MANAGEMENT GROUP" due to the repatriation of some Contingents. He suggested a HAC rep attending the committee meetings so as to be in a position to know the available items and make subsequent use of them in the humanitarian field.

Action - CHAO

3. A transport request from Rwandese Ministry of Agriculture and Rearing for provision of 10 vehicles (4 runners or pick-ups double cabin) for their vaccination programme was also considered but not approved due to immediate non-availability. However, as per the AFC's instruction on the issue, the Ministry should be asked to make contact with the various Sectors' MILOBS HQ with a view to their assisting them in any way possible transport-wise for the programme.


4. A request from Kigali Prefecture for trucks to transport food (800 tons) from WFP warehouse to the Communes for the period 11 - 17 Jan 96 was also considered. It was not approved because the planned repatriation programme of some Contingents would make UNAMIR transport assistance very minimal. Besides, such requests are to be routed through the Rwandese government Ministry of Planning.

5. Another request from IMC for the digging of some pit latrines in a school in Kibungo was also considered. The digging was approved but the permanent supervision of the masonry aspect of the job was not approved because it will involve keeping some UNAMIR personnel permanently there to supervise the job. UNAMIR does not have the capacity presently to engage in such extra tasks.

WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT

FOR THE PERIOD 07 JAN - JAN 96

1. **GENERAL SITUATION.** The general situation has witnessed a slight change. Acts of banditry were reported in the KIBUYE Prefecture. GITARAMA Prefecture remained calm during the period. The NGO SALVATION ARMY based in KAYENZI (8389) promised to get some insecticides for the farmers. Farmers in the KIBUYE Prefecture are preparing for the sorghum season.

2. **OWN HAC ACTIVITIES.**

a. MILOBS distributed Oral Rehydration Salts (ORS) packets to various health centres in the prefectures.

b. MILOBS assisted in shifting of MILD OFFENDERS from Gitarama to their respective communes. These pers were recently arrested in Kigali for not possessing work permit.

c. The ops offr attended a meeting of NGO's at the GITARAMA Prefecture aimed at making preparations for the resettlement of returnees. The meeting was held under the auspices of the Ministry of Social Affairs and Rehabilitation.

3. **GENERAL LIVING CONDITIONS.**

a. **Food.** No change from last report. Food is still reported to be inadequate in the communes. CARITAS is still distributing food to very poor families in the GITARAMA Prefecture on a regular basis. The Prefect of KIBUYE reported that food is adequate in the Prefecture.

b. **Water.** There is a marked improvement in the water supply in Gitarama and surrounding communes.

c. **Health Care and Health Problems.** There is no change in the health delivery system in the sector. Malaria is still prevalent in the sector.

d. **Housing.** ARDEC has extended its programme of reconstruction of houses to TABA Commune (8883).

- e. Education. No change.

 - g. Roads and bridges. No Change.
 - h. Electricity. No change.
4. PEOPLE WITH SPECIAL NEEDS.
- a. Orphanages. NTR.
 - b. Hospital. NTR.

 - f. IDPs. NTR.
 - g. Returnees. See Annex A for statistics.
 - h. Prisoners. See Annex B for statistics.
5. ACTIVITIES OF NGOS.
- a. ACIST and LWF are undertaking agricultural and rehabilitation programmes in MUGINA Commune (9267) and NTONGWE Commune (9057).
 - b. CONCERN is constructing a temporary camp for returnees in RUYENZI SECTOR of Runda Commune (9882). The camp is likely to be operational by the week end.
 - c. CARITAS is supporting 10,000 poor families in GITARAMA Prefecture by distributing seeds, hoes and food material.
 - d. CONCERN is still feeding prisoners in MUGINA and NTONGWE Commune cachots on a five day basis from Monday to Friday. The food is cooked by the prisoners. Maize, Beans and cooking oil is provided by the NGO.
6. ACTIVITIES OF UN AGENCIES. Hum Offr maintains constant contact with HRFOR and UNHCR officers. ICRC continues to monitor hygiene and sanitation in the various commune cachots.
7. REQUESTS FOR HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE.
- a. Request for septic truck for Nyanza Orphanage and Musambira Commune cachot has still **NOT** materialised.

- b. Favourable action is requested on our request for provision of mattresses, pillows and bed sheets. (MILOBS SECTOR 1B letter dated 22 Nov 95 refers).
- c. The Prefect of KIBUYE requests assistance to retrieve a bulldozer belonging to the Prefecture stuck in MASANGO Commune (6254) on its way to KIBUYE.

8. **CONCLUSION.** Demand for humanitarian assistance far exceeds our resources. The NGOs are however making efforts at meeting some of the requests. Humanitarian efforts at the sector level will continue to be largely, one of liaison.

9. **ASSESSMENT.**

- a. The activities of the NGOs and agencies involved in looking after the welfare of returnees is slowly, but, surely bearing fruit.
- b. The outstanding requests as per Para 7 above should be actioned as soon as possible.


