DAILY SITREP FOR 29 AUG 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. FORCED REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU SEEMS TO HAVE STOPPED FOR THE TIME BEING.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 186 OUT OF WHICH 136 COMING FROM BURUNDI.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 18,174. OUTFLOW - 21.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, IN A COMMUNIQUE DATED 28 AUG 95, DECLARED THAT THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA HAD RELIEVED THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER OF HIS OFFICIAL DUTIES AT 1500 HRS ON MONDAY 28 AUG 95. IN ANOTHER DEVELOPMENT, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT SUBMITTED A LETTER OF RESIGNATION TO THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA DATED 28 AUG 95.

B. IN A COMMUNIQUE ISSUED BY THE OFFICE OF THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT ON 29 AUG 95, IT WAS ANNOUNCED THAT THE FOLLOWING FOUR MINISTERS HAD LEFT THE GOVERNMENT TO ASSUME OTHER DUTIES: THE MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT, THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION (AND GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN), AND THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS. THE MINISTERS HOLD DIFFERENT POLITICAL AFFILIATIONS, BUT THREE OF THE FOUR ARE OF THE SAME HUTU ETHNIC ORIGIN AS THE FORMER RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) THERE WAS A BRIEF FIRE FIGHT BETWEEN RPA AND AN UNIDENTIFIED GROUP WHO THREW A HAND GRENADE AT AN RPA PATROL WOUNDING TWO SOLDIERS. THE INCIDENT TOOK PLACE AT THE GISENYI MARKET AT ABOUT 2030 HRS. MILOBS ARE YET TO OBTAIN FURTHER DETAILS.

(2) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) THREE RPA SOLDIERS WENT TO

THE NYABIKENKE (GR 7292) CACHOT AT ABOUT MIDNIGHT AND FORCIBLY TOOK THE KEYS FROM THE GUARD AND SUBSEQUENTLY BEAT MANY OF THE PRISONERS SEVERELY. ONE PRISONER DIED ON THE SPOT WHILST A SECOND DIED AT 1215 HRS TODAY. THE INSTIGATOR IS SAID TO HAVE BEEN PUT IN A MILITARY JAIL.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) MRS ROSELYNE MATTEUER, HEAD OF THE FEDERATION OF THE RED CROSS IN ZAIRE INFORMED MILOBS AT RUSIZI I ON 29 AUG 95 THAT A DISINFORMATION CAMPAIGN HAS BEEN LAUNCHED BY FRGF INFORMING REFUGEES THAT THEY HAD BEEN IN CYANGUGU AND HAD OBSERVED RETURNEES BEING KILLED BY RPA SOLDIERS. IT WAS THEREFORE ARRANGED THAT AN INDEPENDENT TEAM FROM ZAIRE BE MADE TO VISIT THE BORDER AREA AT RUSIZI I IN THE NEXT FEW DAYS ON A FACT FINDING MISSION.

(2) MILOBS PATROL TEAM TO KAYOVE (GR 2892) WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT ON 24 AUG 95 THREE LOCALS WERE ABDUCTED INTO THE FOREST BY SIX ARMED MEN. THE HOSTAGES WHO MANAGED TO ESCAPE INFORMED RPA WHO CONDUCTED A SEARCH FOR THE ARMED MEN WITHOUT RESULT. ALSO AT NGAMA (GR 2498) THE TEAM WAS INFORMED THAT ON 24 AUG 95 THERE WAS A FIRE FIGHT BETWEEN RPA AND ONE SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE. THE INSURGENT WAS KILLED AND BURIED IN LOCATION. PATROL TEAM VISITED THE SITE AND FOUND TWO HAND GRENADES.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) A TOTAL OF 99 RETURNEES WERE AT THE NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CAMP (GR 7549) ON 29 AUG 95. THE CAMP IS FACING SHORTAGE OF DRINKING WATER.

B SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) - MILOBS INFORMED BY RWINKAVU HOSPITAL STAFF OF WATER SHORTAGE AT THE HOSPITAL AND REQUESTED FOR ASSISTANCE TO FILL A 45,00 LITRE RESERVOIR AT LEAST ONCE A WEEK. UNHCR FILLS UP THE RESERVOIR ONCE IN TWO WEEKS.

C SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) UNHCR TRANSPORTED A TOTAL OF 662 RETURNEES TO 7 COMMUNES ON 29 AUG 95. A TOTAL OF 2,683 RETURNEES REMAIN AT THE NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP.

D SECTOR 5A (RUHENGIERI) UNHCR TRANSPORTED 42 RETURNEES TO VARIOUS COMMUNES IN THE PREFECTURE.

E SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) UNCHR TRANSPORTED 382 RETURNEES FROM THE NYAMISHABA (GR 2571) TRANSIT CAMP TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOME COMMUNES.

F. PATROL TO NTYAZO GIKONGORO LEARNT THAT A TOTAL OF 80 REFUGEES, 60 FROM ZAIRE AND 20 FROM BURUNDI ARRIVED IN THE

COMMUNE ON 28 AUG 95.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) THE VICE BOURGMESTRE OF KIVUYE COMMUNE, MR EMMANUEL BIZIMANA, WITH TWO OTHER LOCALS WERE YESTERDAY ARRESTED AND DETAINED BY LOCAL RPA SOLDIERS FOR DRUNKENNESS AND DISORDERLY BEHAVIOUR. THE TWO LOCALS WERE LATER RELEASED AFTER PAYING A FINE OF FRW10,000.00 EACH.

B. SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO) A MEETING, ATTENDED BY THE PREFECT AND THE BOURGMESTRE, WAS HELD IN MUBUGA COMMUNE OFFICE TO WORK OUT MODALITIES FOR REHABILITATING RETURNEES.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL AT ABOUT 0730 HRS TODAY IN MUKINGI COMMUNE (GR 7160) GITARAMA SECTOR, A PICK-UP VEHICLE OF MEDECIN DU MONDE BASED IN CYANGUGU HIT AND KILLED A 17 YEAR OLD FEMALE LOCAL PEDESTRIAN. MILOBS ASSISTED THE NGO IN TRANSPORTING THE CORPSE FROM THE KABGAYI HOSPITAL TO MUKINGI COMMUNE FOR BURIAL. THE GITARAMA IPJ HOWEVER ADVISED THE NGO PERSONNEL NOT TO ATTEND THE BURIAL FOR FEAR OF REPRISALS BY LOCALS.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 110600 TO 120600 AUG 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUES TO REMAIN CALM. REFUGEES AND DISPLACED PERSONS CONTINUE TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES. ABOUT 800 PERSONS REPORTED TO UNAMIR HQ AT GIKONIGORO ASKING TO BE ESCORTED TO KIGALI AND OTHER DESTINATIONS. LOCALS IN THE HPZ CONTINUE TO BE APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE IMPENDING WITHDRAWAL OF FRENCH FORCES FROM THE HPZ. THE MOVEMENT OF PEOPLE CONTINUED FROM SECTORS 4A AND 4B TOWARDS CYANGUGU. INFORMATION REVEALED THAT THE MEMBERS OF THE MNRD AND CDR PARTIES ARE CONDUCTING CLANDESTINE MEETINGS IN CYANGUGU AND TELLING THE LOCAL POPULATION TO LEAVE CYANGUGU BECAUSE THERE WOULD BE AN RPF ATTACK WHEN THE FF LEAVE. LT GEN GORDON RAEY AND FC MET MAJ GEN KAGAME (VICE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA) AT 0930 HRS. THEY ALSO MET THE PRIME MINISTER AT 1720 HRS AND THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA AT 1810 HRS. THE DFC HELD A PRESS BRIEFING ON THE SUBJECT OF UNAMIR PLANS OF CONTINUING THE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES ON GOING IN RWANDA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: THE PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF THE INTERIOR VISITED THE GISENYI PREFECTURE TO DISCUSS THE HUMANITARIAN SITUATION, RETURN OF THE REFUGEES AND OTHER MATTERS. THE SRSG ARRIVED FROM NAIROBI AND GAVE A BRIEFING TO THE DELEGATION FROM THE OVERSEAS DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION (ODA) LED BY DR. MUKESH KAPILA. SRSG HELD ANOTHER PRIVATE MEETING WITH MS. CATHERINE BERTINI, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME. THEY DISCUSSED THE TRANSITION AND THE URGENT HUMANITARIAN OPERATION REQUIRED IN SECTOR 4.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. THE RPA HAS CARRIED OUT DAY AND NIGHT PATROLLING IN THE CAPITAL AND OTHER TOWNS IN AN ATTEMPT TO PROVIDE SECURITY AND RESTORE LAW AND ORDER. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WITH UNAMIR AND NGOS. THE PRESIDENT OF THE NEW GOVERNMENT MADE A SPEECH INDICATING POSSIBLE FORGIVENESS TO THOSE WHO TOOK PART IN MASSACRES UNDER COMPULSION. HE ALSO APPEALED TO RWANDESE REFUGEES/DISPLACED PERSONS TO RETURN HOME. THE GOVT SAID EFFORTS WERE BEING TAKEN TO RESTORE WATER AND ELECTRICITY IN ALL PARTS OF THE COUNTRY.

B. RGF. VERY FEW NOW LOCATED IN GOMA.

C. MILITIA. REPORTED TO BE REGROUPING IN CYANGUGU AND BUKAVU ACROSS THE BORDER.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS CONTINUED. DFC HELD BRANCH HEADS STAFF BRIEF AT 0800 HRS. LT GEN GORDON RAEY COMMANDER LAND FORCES COMMAND ALONG WITH THE FC MET THE PRESIDENT, PRIME MINISTER AND THE VICE PRESIDENT SEPARATELY. SRSG ARRIVED FROM NAIROBI AND GAVE A BRIEFING TO THE DELEGATION FROM THE OVERSEAS DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION (ODA) DR. MUSESH KAPILA AND MS. CATHERINE BERTINE, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME. DFC BRIEFED THE PRESS ABOUT THE ON GOING HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. ALL HELICOPTERS ARE OPERATIONAL. BORDER CROSSINGS CONTINUED AS FOLLOWS;

(2) TO RWANDA

B. PASSENGERS - 1081
C. REFUGEES - 1035

C. GHANBATT. CO LED PATROLS TO GEN AREAS RURAMBA GR 4716, RWANILO GR 4913 AND KIBEHO GR 5007. DAY AND NIGHT AND PATROLS WERE ALSO CONDUCTED WITH THE FRENCH FROM ALL PATROL BASES. PATROL REPORTED THE MOVEMENT OF DISPLACED PERSONS CARRYING BELONGINGS AND HEADING TOWARDS ZAIRE. SOME 50 PERSONS WITH BELONGINGS WERE SEEN MOVING FROM KIRAMBI GR 5233 TO CYANBIKA GR 5530. MOVEMENT OF PERSONS WITH BELONGINGS ALSO OBSERVED IN GEN AREA RUKONDO AND SUSPECTED TO BE HEADING TOWARDS CYANGUGU. 50 DISPLACED PERSONS WERE GIVEN MED TREATMENT AT CAMP MURUNDI GR 5128. MERLIN VACCINATED DISPLACED PERSONS AT CAMP IN THE SOUTHERN PART OF AOR IN HPZ. PROVIDED SECURITY AT MERIDIEN HOTEL. FORCE HQ, AND MILITARY ACADEMY IN ALL IN KIGALI.

D. MILOB GP. CARRIED OUT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS. THE SITUATION IN SECTORS 1, 4, 5 AND BYUMBA AREA WAS REPORTED TO BE CALM DURING THE PERIOD. THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA REQUESTS EVACUATION OF ABOUT 3000 REFUGEES FROM KISARO CAMP TO VARIOUS DESTINATIONS IN NORTHERN RWANDA. THE CMO

AND THE SOO VISITED TO SECTOR 3. HE ALSO DISCUSSED THE RESTORATION OF WATER AND ELECTRICITY TO THE TOWNSHIP WITH THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA

E. BRITCON. DEPLOYMENT OF BRITCON CONTINUES. ENGR TROOPS ARRIVED IN BYUMBA DURING PERIOD. HQ BRITCON IS NOW FULLY INTEGRATED WITH THE UNAMIR SYSTEM. WORKSHOP CONTINUES TO REPAIR DAMAGED VEHICLES SO FAR, THEY HAVE REPAIRED 5 VEHICLES WHILE 10 MORE ARE AWAITING REPAIRS. BRITCON ENGR CONTINUE ONGOING TASKS TO IMPROVE THE SITE AT RUHENUERY. ENGR TROOPS ARE CONTINUING TO ASSIST MED PERS WITH HUMANITARIAN PRIORITIES. BRITCON SIGS CONTINUE TO MAINTAIN COMMS.

F. CAN SIGS. HAVE DEPLOYED HF VOICE AND INMARSAT COMMUNICATIONS AND ESTABLISHED COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN UNAMIR HQ AND SECTOR 4A, 4B, 4C AND 5. ALSO DEPLOYED A RADIO DET AT MILOB HQ IN KIGALI. COMPATIBILITY TEST WERE CONDUCTED WITH BRITCON.

G. AUSMED. DEPLOYMENT OF MIL WING OF CHK CONTINUES. MOST OF THE MED STAFFS WERE EMPLOYED IN DEALING WITH 14 CASUALTIES THAT REQUIRED SURGERY. AT LEAST TWO OF THE CASUALTIES WERE RPA. ALL WORK HAS DONE IN THE CIVILIAN PART OF CHK WITH LITTLE NGO ASSISTANCE. JOINED FORCE COMD NET USING OWN EQPT AS A TEMPORARY MEASURE.

5. FRENCH COALITION FORCES. THE FRENCH FORCES CONTINUED TO ASSIST REFUGEES IN GOMA AND THE HPZ. CONTINUE TO ASSIST HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES TO PROVIDE FOOD AND WATER TO REFUGEES.

6. US FORCES. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE FLIGHTS AT KIA WITH UNAMIR.

7. UNCIVPOL. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE PREPARATIONS FOR THE TRAINING OF THE NEW GENDARMES.

8. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. IOM IS SCHEDULED TO CARRY OUT CONVOY MOVE FROM RUTARE WITH 16 VEHICLES TO BRING DISPLACED PERSONS TO KIGALI. THE PLANNED TRANSFER OF ORPHANS FROM BUKAVU TO KIGALI USING CC-130 WAS POSTPONED ON REQUEST OF ICRC. THEY STATE THAT THE OPERATION COULD NOT BE CONDUCTED BEFORE 15 AUG 94. UNAMIR LOG CELL DELIVERED FUEL AND FOOD TO MARC VAITER ORPHANAGE, SOS VILLAGE AND SISTERS OF CHARITY. WFP OFF LOADED 150 TONS OF FOOD IN GIKONGORO AND 150 TONS IN GISENYI.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUES TO REMAIN CALM. REFUGEES AND DISPLACED PERSONS CONTINUE TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES. LOCALS CONTINUE TO BE APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE WITHDRAWAL OF FRENCH FORCES FROM THE HPZ. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT HALF THE POPULATION IN SECTOR 4B MAY LEAVE BEFORE THE 15TH AUGUST. AN ESTIMATED 5000 TO 10,000 PEOPLE ARE REPORTED TO HAVE CROSSED THE BORDER INTO ZAIRE DURING THE PERIOD. THE DFC RECEIVED 200 NEW GHANAIAI TROOPS AT ENTEBBE. THE TROOPS ALONG WITH DFC WERE LATER AIRLIFTED ON UN AIRCRAFT FROM ENTEBBE TO KIGALI. LT GEN GORDON RAEY, COMMANDER LAND FORCES COMMAND, AND LT COL RALPH COLEMAN, CHIEF PLANS, LAND FORCES COMMAND CANADA ARRIVED KIGALI.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: LOCAL RADIO DECLARED THAT THE MILITIA ARE REORGANISING IN ZAIREAN TERRITORY. THE RADIO FURTHER ADDED THAT THE ZAIREAN AUTHORITIES ARE ALLOWING THEM TO MAKE PREPARATIONS FOR AN INVASION OF RWANDA. ACCORDING TO THE RADIO, THE GOVT WILL NOT TOLERATE THIS AND WARNED THAT THE ARMY WOULD PURSUE THEM IF THEY DARE INVADE TO RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES:

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS CONTINUED. FC HELD BRANCH HEADS STAFF BRIEF AT 0800 HRS. LT GEN GORDON RAEY COMMANDER LAND FORCES COMMAND AND LT COL RALPH COLEMAN, CHIEF OF PLANS, LAND FORCES COMMAND, CANADA ARRIVED UNAMIR FORCE HQ ON A WORKING VISIT TO UNAMIR. HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE FC AND THE STAFF ON UNAMIR ACTIVITIES. THE DFC RECEIVED THE INCOMING GHANAIAI TROOPS AT ENTEBBE. HE RETURNED TO KIGALI ON THE UN FLIGHT THAT BROUGHT THE TROOPS TO KIGALI. MR PADDY BLAGDEN, UN DEMINING EXPERT, ARRIVED IN KIGALI DURING THE PERIOD. HE HELD A MEETING

WITH UNAMIR EOD TEAM AND RPA TO FORMULATE A DEMINING PLAN FOR RWANDA.

C. GHANBATT. DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED WITH THE FRENCH FROM ALL PATROL BASES. ESCORTED ICRC CONVOY TO DISTRIBUTE RELIEF ITEMS AT GAMANA (GR 5196) AND MUNINI (GR 4800). WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 01 TO 07 AUG 94.

1. **HIGHLIGHTS.** THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED CALM THROUGHOUT THE WEEK. REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO RWANDA FROM GOMA. THE SITUATION IN GOMA HAS IMPROVED GRADUALLY THROUGHOUT THE WEEK. 110 TROOPS FROM THE NETHERLANDS ARRIVED IN GOMA TO SET UP A FIELD HOSPITAL. ALTHOUGH ABOUT 650,000 PERSONS REMAINED DISPLACED IN THE HPZ, MOST OF THE NGOS AND AID AGENCIES FOCUSED AND CONCENTRATED THEIR EFFORTS ON GOMA. THE LOCAL POPULATION IN THE HPZ CONTINUED TO SHOW SIGNS OF APPREHENSION ABOUT THE WITHDRAWAL OF FRENCH LED COALITION FORCES (FCF) LEADING TO THE EXODUS OF SOME OF THEM. THEY REQUEST THE GOVERNMENT TO ASSURE THEM OF THEIR SECURITY BEFORE THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE FCF. ACTS OF BANDITRY WERE REPORTED IN THE CYANGUGU AREA. ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES WERE REPORTED TO HAVE CONFISCATED RGF VEHICLES IN GOMA. DELEGATIONS WERE RECEIVED FROM BELGIUM, CANADA, FRANCE, GREAT BRITAIN, ITALY AND THE USA. OF SPECIAL SIGNIFICANCE WERE THE VISITS OF GENERAL SHALIKASHVILI, CHAIRMAN JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF AND THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR TO UGANDA, MR DESCOUYETE. THE SRSG MET WITH PRESIDENT MUSEVENI OF UGANDA. A DELEGATION FROM MALAWI AND AN ETHIOPIAN RECCE TEAM VISITED KIGALI AND OTHER SECTORS OF RWANDA. THEY WERE BRIEFED ABOUT THE CURRENT SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY AND UNAMIR'S FUTURE DEPLOYMENT AND OPERATIONS. A FRENCH HIRED BOAT WAS FIRED UPON BY UNKNOWN GUNMEN ON LAKE KIVU WHILE IT WAS ON A RESUPPLY MISSION TO KIBUYE. ONE 5.56 CALIBRE ASSAULT RIFLE WAS FOUND WITHIN THE PREMISES OF THE MILITARY ACADEMY IN KIGALI. THE FLOW OF MEN AND MATERIEL THROUGH KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (KIA) HAS INCREASED TREMENDOUSLY WITH AN AVERAGE OF 25 TO 30 AIRCRAFT LANDING DAILY.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.** AMERICAN AMBASSADOR RAWSON AND ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE FOR AFRICAN AFFAIRS GEORGE MOOSE MET THE PM MR TWAGIRAMUNGU. MR MOOSE EXPLAINED THAT THE AMERICAN DEPLOYMENT AND INVOLVEMENT IN RWANDA WILL BE CONDUCTED IN PHASES. MR MOOSE STATED THAT THE UNITED STATES WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE DEPLOYMENT OF 48 HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS. THE SRSG AGREED THAT THE DEPLOYMENT WAS IMPORTANT, BUT EMPHASIZED THE IMPORTANCE OF NAMING AND DEPLOYING THE COMMISSION OF EXPERTS FIRST. IT IS IMPORTANT TO SHOW SENSITIVITY TO THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT AND PEOPLE WHOSE FIRST PRIORITY IS TO BRING TO JUSTICE THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE RECENT MASSACRES. GENERAL SHALIKASHVILI RECEIVED A FULL BRIEFING FROM THE SRSG AND THE FORCE COMMANDER ON THE POLITICAL, HUMANITARIAN AND MILITARY SITUATIONS IN RWANDA. SPECIAL EMPHASIS WAS GIVEN TO THE TRANSITION IN SECTOR 4 AND THE URGENCY OF BRINGING HUMANITARIAN AID TO THAT AREA. GENERAL SHALIKASHVILI OFFERED TO ASSIST UNAMIR WITH THE AIRLIFT OF TROOPS, EQUIPMENT AND HUMANITARIAN AID. AMBASSADOR DESCOUYETE STATED THAT FRANCE HAS NO OBJECTION TO RPF OFFICIALS ENTERING THE HPZ TO REASSURE THE POPULATION OR TO RE-ESTABLISH THE CIVIL ADMINISTRATION. HE DENIED REPORTS THAT FRANCE HAD OBJECTED TO THIS. HE EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT WHAT HE CALLED "MIXED MESSAGES" BY THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT, REASSURANCES OF PEACE ON ONE HAND, AND STATEMENTS REGARDING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF TRIBUNALS TO TRY 30,000 DETAINEES

ON THE OTHER. (PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU, IN A LATER CONVERSATION WITH UNAMIR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, CATEGORICALLY DENIED MAKING THIS STATEMENT WHICH HAS BEEN ATTRIBUTED TO HIM IN SEVERAL NEWSPAPERS). PRESIDENT MUSEVENI STRESSED THE IMPORTANCE OF SEPARATING REFUGEES IN THE CAMPS IN ZAIRE AND TANZANIA INTO:

1. RGF SOLDIERS 2. THOSE SUSPECTED OF COMMITTING MASSACRES AND 3. ORDINARY CITIZENS. HE SAID THAT THOSE SUSPECTED OF CRIMES SHOULD BE DETAINED. HOWEVER, IF THAT IS IMPOSSIBLE, THEY SHOULD AT LEAST BE SEPARATED FROM THE REST OF THE POPULATION. HE AGREED THAT THE SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEMS IN RWANDA LIES IN THE RETURN OF ALL REFUGEES. HE WAS CRITICAL OF ZAIRIAN PRESIDENT MOBUTU, STATING THAT HE DOES NOT EXPECT PRESIDENT MOBUTU TO MATCH HIS WORDS WITH ACTIONS. HE OFFERED HIS FULL ASSISTANCE TO THE SRSG AND UNAMIR. HE ASKED HIS STAFF TO CUT THE CARGO HANDLING FEES AT ENTEBBE AIRPORT TO HALF IN SUPPORT OF UNAMIR'S HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS. UNAMIR IS INVESTIGATING BBC NEWS REPORTS OF KILLINGS AND SUMMARY EXECUTIONS. AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL HAS SENT A DELEGATION TO KIGALI TO INVESTIGATE HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES. THE DELEGATION PLANS TO SPEND A WEEK IN RWANDA AND SUBMIT A REPORT OF THEIR FINDINGS.

3. MILITARY.

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

(1) RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO PATROL KIGALI WITH A VIEW TO MAINTAINING LAW AND ORDER. THE NUMBER OF ROAD BLOCKS HAVE REDUCED IN THE CITY AND THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WITH UNAMIR, AID AGENCIES AND OTHER INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS. ASSURED FREE PASSAGE FOR THE HUMANITARIAN AID CONVOYS TO KIBUYE THROUGH ALL THE RPF CHECK POINTS.

(2) RGF. RGF CONTINUE TO REMAIN IN CAMPS IN GOMA AND IN THE HPZ. REPORTED TO BE INVOLVED IN INCREASED ACTS OF LOOTING AND BANDITRY IN THE HPZ.

(3) MILITIA. REPORTED TO BE DISCOURAGING THE REFUGEES NOT TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME AREAS IN RWANDA FROM THE CAMPS OUTSIDE RWANDA.

B. OWN

(1) UNAMIR. CONDUCTED BRIEFING TO VARIOUS VISITING DELEGATIONS WHICH INCLUDED THE CHAIRMAN OF THE JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF US ARMY, A DELEGATION FROM MALAWI AND A RECCE TEAM FROM ETHIOPIA. THE FC VISITED KABALE (UGANDA) AND GOMA. HE ALSO HELD DISCUSSION WITH THE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION OF RWANDA. DFC VISITED GIKONGORO AREA AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE COMMANDER OF FCF. GHANBATT CONTINUED TO DEPLOY IN THE HPZ. CONTINUED LIAISON WITH THE FRENCH LED COALITION FORCES. TROOPS FROM BRITAIN AND AUSTRALIA STARTED ARRIVING IN KIGALI.

(2) UNOMUR. THE AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONTINUED TO MAN CPs AND OPs AND TO ALSO MONITOR AREA ALONG THE BORDER. PROVIDED HELI SUPPORT TO UNAMIR. ACMO VISITED CPs ALONG THE BORDER. HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES AND NGOS CONTINUED TO ENTER RWANDA WITH RELIEF ITEMS FOR DISTRIBUTION. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING ARE:

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE LIAISON WITH THE FRENCH IN GOMA AND IN THE HPZ. CONDUCTED RECCE IN BUTARE AND GITARAMA PRIOR TO DEPLOYMENT OF UNMOs IN THAT AREA. MILOB TEAMS WERE DEPLOYED IN GIKONGORO, GISENYI, KIBUYE, CYANGUGU AND BYUMBA. ASSISTED IN THE TRANSPORTATION OF SICK PERSONS FROM GISENYI AND RUHENGERI TO MEDICAL POSTS. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ESCORTS FOR VISITING DELEGATES AND MONITORING TEAMS FOR HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ACTIVITIES.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO ASSIST AND COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. SUPPLIED FOOD STUFFS IN GISENYI TO REFUGEES RETURNING HOME. CONVOYS RETURNED WITH DISPLACED PERSONS FROM VARIOUS PLACES TO KIGALI. MANY INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AND AID AGENCIES ARRIVED IN KIGALI. VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDED FOOD AND OTHER AID ITEMS TO ORPHANAGES IN KIGALI. CHOLERA PATIENTS WHO ARRIVED IN KIGALI FROM GISENYI WERE HOSPITALIZED AT KIGALI CENTRAL HOSPITAL AND TAKEN CARE OF BY SAMARITAN'S PURSE. UNICEF BROUGHT IN EQUIPMENT FOR RESTORATION OF WATER IN KIGALI. TWO MEDIUM SIZE WATER TRUCKS DONATED BY FINLAND TO UNICEF ARRIVED AT KIGALI AND WERE SENT TO GISENYI. SIX AMERICAN WATER TRUCKS ARRIVED IN KIGALI AND HAVE SINCE BEEN DEPLOYED TO THE BORDER AREAS.

7. CONCLUSION. AS THE GENERAL SITUATION IN RWANDA RETURNS TO NORMAL, MANY INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AND AID AGENCIES ARRIVED TO HELP IN SOLVING THE HUMANITARIAN PROBLEMS IN THE COUNTRY. THE US ARMY ARRIVED IN KIGALI AND ASSISTED IN PROVIDING FACILITIES

AT KIA TO HANDLE THE INCREASING NUMBER OF FLIGHTS. DELEGATIONS FROM BELGIUM, CANADA, FRANCE, GREAT BRITAIN, ITALY AND THE UNITED STATES WERE RECEIVED BY UNAMIR. THE SRSG AND THE FC MET PRESIDENT MUSEVENI OF UGANDA.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 081801 AUG TO 091800 AUG 94.

1. GEN SITUATION: THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUES TO REMAIN CALM IN RWANDA. DISPLACED PERSONS AND REFUGEES RETURNED TO KIGALI IN SMALL GROUPS DURING THE PERIOD. MANY RETURNEES ALSO CROSSED THE BORDERS WITH HEAD LOADS INTO THE COUNTRY DURING THE PERIOD. LIFE IS GRADUALLY PICKING UP. ROAD REPAIR WORKS HAVE STARTED IN THE CAPITAL. THE SITUATION IN GOMA IS REPORTEDLY IMPROVING. THE LOCALS STILL CONTINUE TO BE APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE WITHDRAWAL OF FRENCH FORCES FROM THE HPZ. THE SRSG AND FC ALONG WITH THE CHIEF FRENCH LO VISITED BUTARE TO INSPECT THE LOCATION OF A PROPOSED TACTICAL HQ. THEY ALSO VISITED GHANA BATTALION DEPLOYED AT GIKONGORO AND MET THE LOCAL FRENCH COMMANDER. THE SRSG AND FC RETURNED TO KIGALI IN THE EVENING. DFC LEFT FOR NAIROBI THIS MORNING TO VISIT GHANAIAI SOLDIERS ON ADMISSION AT THE NAIROBI HOSPITAL. HE WILL MOVE TO KAMPALA TOMORROW TO RECEIVE THE GHANAIAI TROOPS ARRIVING IN ENTEBBE.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: THE SRSG ACCOMPANIED BY THE TRAVELLED TO BUTARE AND GIKONGORO TO ASSESS THE MILITARY AND HUMANITARIAN SITUATION IN THE AREA. ON THEIR RETURN, THE SRSG AND THE FORCE COMMANDER ATTENDED THE UNREO/UN AGENCIES/NGO MEETING TO BRIEF THE AGENCIES ON THE CURRENT SITUATION AND TO OUTLINE THE URGENT HUMANITARIAN NEEDS IN THE HPZ. THE INTERIM GOVT CONTINUES TO CALL ON ALL REFUGEES IN THE NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES TO RETURN TO RWANDA. THE INTERIM PRIME MINISTER HAS CALLED ON THE UN TO ESTABLISH AN INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL TO TRY ALL THOSE ALLEGED TO BE INVOLVED IN THE MASSACRES. A GOVT DELEGATION WENT TO BUTARE FOR A MEETING WITH REPS OF DISPLACED PERSONS/REFUGEES IN THE AREA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

A. RPA. THE RPA HAS INTENSIFIED DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS IN THE CAPITAL AND OTHER TOWNS IN AN ATTEMPT TO PROVIDE SECURITY AND RESTORE LAW AND ORDER. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WITH UNAMIR AND NGOS. RPA TROOPS AND FRENCH FORCES ESCORTED REPS OF THE REFUGEES/DISPLACED PERSONS TO AND FROM A MEETING AT BUTARE. THE DELEGATION ASSURED THE DISPLACED PERSONS/REFUGEES OF THEIR SECURITY AND ASSISTANCE ON THEIR RETURN TO THEIR HOME AREAS.

B. RGF. NO MAJOR ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED.

C. MILITIA. NO MAJOR ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES:

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS CONTINUED. THE SRGS AND FC VISITED GIKONGORO AND BUTARE, TO ASSESS THE MILITARY AND HUMANITARIAN SITUATION ON THE GROUND. THE DFC LEFT FOR NAIROBI EN ROUTE TO KAMPALA TO RECEIVE THE GHANAIA TROOPS ARRIVING AT ENTEBBE TOMORROW.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. ALL HELICOPTERS WERE OPERATIONAL. BORDER CROSSINGS CONTINUED AS FOLLOWS:

C. GHANBATT. CONDUCTED DAY PATROLS FROM ALL PATROL BASES. PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED JOINTLY WITH FRENCH TROOPS IN GEN AREA GILINGORO AND IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE HPZ. A COY CONTINUED TRG ON APCs. ONE PISTOL WAS CONFISCATED FROM A LOCAL AT RURAMBA CHECK POINT GR-4716. ALSO PROVIDED ESCORTS TO ICRC RELIEF SUPPLIES TO DISPLACED PERSONS CAMP AT KIBEHO, MUMINI, HAMANA AND NDASO. REPS OF SAVE THE CHILDREN BENEVOLENT SOCIETY VISITED THE SOUTHERN PART OF A AOR IN HPZ ON AN ASSESSMENT MISSION. THE SRSG AND FC VISITED GHANAIA TROOPS DEPLOYED AT GIKONGORO. PROVIDED SECURITY AT MERIDIEN HOTEL, FORCE HQ AND THE MILITARY ACADEMY ALL IN KIGALI.

D. MILOB GP. PLANNING, COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBs ACTIVITIES WERE CARRIED OUT DURING THE PERIOD. CARRIED OUT PATROLS IN BYUMBA, RUKOMO AND MUHURA. THE SITUATION IN SECTORS 1, 4, AND 5 AND BYUMBA AREA WERE REPORTED TO BE CALM DURING THE PERIOD. ABOUT 3000 DISPLACED PERSONS AT MUHURA WERE REPORTED TO BE AWAITING TPT TO KIGALI AND OTHER TOWNS. MANY RETURNEES WERE SEEN ARRIVING IN GITARAMA AND BUTARE WITH MANY MORE ALONG THE MAIN ROADS OF BUTARE, AND GITARAMA.

E. BRITCON. DEPLOYMENT OF BRITCON CONTINUES. MEDICAL ELEMENTS CONTINUE TO ESTABLISH AT RUHENGARI HOSPITAL. VEHICLE MAINTENANCE WORKSHOP HAS STARTED OPERATING IN KIGALI.

F. CAN SIG. CANADIAN CONTINGENT PERFORMED EOD TASKS IN SOME PARTS OF THE CITY OF KIGALI. PREPARATONS TO DEPLOY THE TACTICAL HQ TO BUTARI ON 10 AUG 94 CONTINUED.

5. FRENCH COALITION FORCES: THE FRENCH FORCES CONTINUE TO ASSIST REFUGEES IN GOMA AND IN THE HPZ. CONTINUED TO PATROL AND ASSIST DISPLACED PERSONS IN THE HPZ. COMMUNITY POLICE AND GENDARMES ARE ASSISTING THE FRENCH FORCES TO CONTROL THE SITUATION IN THE GIKONGORO AND CYANGUGU AREAS.

6. US FORCES: CONTINUED TO COORDINATE FLIGHTS AT KIA WITH UNAMIR.

7. UNCIVPOL: CONTINUED TO COORDINATE PREPARATIONS FOR THE TRAINING OF THE NEW GENDARMES.

8. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES: COORDINATION OF HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES CONTINUED DURING THE PERIOD. A COORDINATION MEETING WAS HELD WITH UN AGENCIES AND NGOS AT THE UNDP TODAY.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 051801 AUG TO 061800 AUG 94.

1. GEN SITUATION: THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM. THE SITUATION IN GOMA IS REPORTEDLY IMPROVING ALTHOUGH CASES OF DYSENTERY ARE STILL PREVALENT. IN THE HPZ LOCALS ARE STILL SHOWING SIGNS OF APPREHENSION ABOUT WHAT WILL HAPPEN WHEN THE FRENCH FORCES WITHDRAW. THE FORCE MEDICAL OFFICER RETURNED AFTER VISITING TROOPS ON ADMISSION IN NAIROBI TO CHECK ON THEIR CONDITIONS. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH HEADS OF MAJOR UN AGENCIES AND NGOS. THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR TO UGANDA HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE SRSG DURING A WORKING VISIT TO KIGALI.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: THE SRSG RECEIVED A CANADIAN DELEGATION TODAY MADE UP OF MR BERNARD DUSSAULT, SPECIAL ENVOY FROM OTTAWA, MR JIM WALL, FIRST CONSULAR, HIGH COMMISSION, NAIROBI AND MR DENIS PROVOST, HEAD OF OFFICE OF EMBASSY, KIGALI. THE DISCUSSIONS CENTRED ON:

- A. THE TRANSITION IN SECTOR 4
- B. EFFORTS BEING MADE TO ENCOURAGE REFUGEES TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES
- C. ATTEMPTS TO RETURN THE COUNTRY TO NORMALITY (RECONSTRUCTION)
- D. HUMAN RIGHTS

HE THEN MET WITH MR FRANCOIS DESCOUEYTE, THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR TO UGANDA. HE BRIEFED HIM ON THE CURRENT POLITICAL, HUMANITARIAN AND MILITARY SITUATIONS. MR DESCOUEYTE EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT THE FOLLOWING:

- A. RADIO BROADCASTS HAVE NOT REACHED THE HPZ OR GOMA SINCE 19 JUL
- B. REPORTS ABOUT PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU THREATENING TO USE FORCE TO ENTER THE HPZ
- C. REPORTS THAT THE FRENCH HAVE REFUSED TO ALLOW RWANDAN GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TO ENTER THE HPZ (FRANCE CATEGORICALLY DENIES HAVING MADE THIS STATEMENT)
- D. REPORTS QUOTING PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU AS STATING THAT 30,000 RGF/MILITIA TROOPS WILL BE DETAINED AS SUSPECTS IN THE MASSACRES

MR DESCOUEYTE THEN MET WITH PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU AND SEVERAL OTHER GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ALSO HELD A MEETING WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS. THE DELEGATION ASKED ABOUT THE LIST OF POWs THAT UNAMIR HAD COMPILED. UNAMIR INFORMED AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL THAT THIS LIST HAD BEEN GIVEN TO THE ICRC.

AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL STATED THAT THERE WERE POWs CURRENTLY BEING DETAINED AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. UNAMIR WILL ATTEMPT TO CONFIRM THIS REPORT. THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING WITH THE HEADS OF THE FOLLOWING UN AGENCIES AND NGOs TO ESTABLISH A BETTER COORDINATION OF THE OPERATIONS OF THE FOLLOWING HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES: ICRC, IOM, WFP, UNICEF, UNREO, WHO AND UNDP.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO PATROL KIGALI CITY. CONTINUED TO MAN SNAP ROAD BLOCKS AND MOSTLY CHECKED VEHICLE DOCUMENTATION. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WITH UNAMIR AND NGOs.

B. RGF. A FEW ELEMENTS OF UNARMED RGF WERE OBSERVED IN THE GENERAL AREA OF CYANGUGU. MOST OF THEM ARE STILL IN ZAIRE.

C. MILITIA. NO MAJOR ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES:

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED. FC HELD STAFF BRIEF AT 0800 HRS. HE ALSO HELD A PRESS BRIEFING AT 0930 HRS. TROOPS ON ADMISSION IN NAIROBI ARE REPORTED TO BE RECEIVING GOOD CARE.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. ALL HELICOPTERS WERE OPERATIONAL. BORDER CROSSINGS CONTINUED AS FOLLOWS:

C. GHANBATT. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE FRENCH FORCES IN THE HPZ. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KIBEHU AND MUNINI DURING DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD TO DISPLACED PERSONS. SUPPLIED WATER TO ORPHANAGE AT KIGEME. FORUM ORGANIZED AT MUNINI TO EXPLAIN UNAMIR'S MISSION TO THE PEOPLE. UNAMIR CONVOY COMPRISING ONE WATER BOWSER, ONE FUEL TANKER AND ONE BULL DOZER ARRIVED IN THE AREA. IT ALSO BROUGHT 12 X 50 MM GUNS FOR APCs. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL, MERIDIEN HOTEL, BELGIC

VILLAGE AND THE MILITARY ACADEMY ALL IN KIGALI.

D. MILOB GP. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE LIAISON DUTIES WITH THE FRENCH IN GOMA AND IN THE HPZ. ESCORTED ETHIOPIAN RECCE TEAM TO CYANGUGU. ESCORTED UN HUMAN RIGHTS INVESTIGATION TEAM TO GIKONGORO. CONDUCTED PATROLS IN BYUMBA GENERAL AREA WHERE IT IS REPORTED THAT ABOUT 50,000 HAVE SO FAR RETURNED TO THE AREA.

E. BRITCON. CONDUCTED RECCE TO GATUNA BRIDGE. THE BRIDGE CAN STILL TAKE SOME TRAFFIC FOR A WHILE. ADVANCE MEDICAL ELEMENTS ARE NOW ESTABLISHED IN RUHENGERI.

F. CAN COMM COY. RECCE TO RISUMBI MOUNTAIN WAS UNSUCCESSFUL DUE TO BAD WEATHER. INSPECTED THE INTERNATIONAL TELECOM SATELLITE LOCATION. OTHER VISITS WILL BE CONDUCTED AGAIN SOON FOR THOROUGH DETAILS OF DAMAGES TO BE FULLY ASSESSED. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE COMMUNICATIONS TO THE FORCE.

5. FRENCH COALITION FORCES: THE FRENCH FORCES CONTINUED TO ASSIST REFUGEES IN GOMA AND IN THE HPZ. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND ALSO PROVIDED HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE IN THE HPZ. ACTS OF BANDITRY CONTINUE TO BE REPORTED IN THE GENERAL AREA OF CYANGUGU.

6. US FORCES: CONTINUED TO COORDINATE FLIGHTS AT KIA WITH UNAMIR.

7. UNCIVPOL: CONTINUED TO COORDINATE PREPARATIONS FOR THE TRAINING OF THE NEW GENDARMES.

8. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES: WFP DELIVERED 400 KG MAIZE MEAL, 180 KG OIL, 50 KG MAIZE AND 9 BOXES OF HEB TO THE CHK. TWO FREELANCE AID WORKERS, ONE KENYAN AND ONE SWEDEN, WHO WERE ASSISTING THE SISTERS OF CHARITY WERE EVACUATED TO NAIROBI ON A UN FLIGHT. THIS WAS AS A RESULT OF AN INCIDENT WHICH OCCURRED LAST NIGHT INVOLVING MS CHRISTOBEL SIQUERIRA OF THE US, WHO IS WORKING WITH SOME NUNS AT THE STE FAMILLE PARISH. MS CHRISTOBEL HAS DECIDED TO STAY ON AND MEET WITH THE CHEF DU CABINET TO RESOLVE THE PROBLEM. SHE IS UNDER UN CARE FOR THE NIGHT.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 041801 AUG TO 051800 AUG 94.

1. GEN SITUATION: MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM. REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO RWANDA DURING THE PERIOD. 110 TROOPS FROM THE NETHERLANDS ARRIVED IN GOMA TO SET UP A FIELD HOSPITAL. ZAIRIAN SECURITY AUTHORITIES ARE REPORTED TO HAVE CONFISCATED RGF VEHICLES IN GOMA. ETHIOPIAN RECCE TEAM ARRIVED IN KIGALI TODAY AND WERE BRIEFED ABOUT THE CURRENT SITUATION. THE TEAM WILL PROCEED TO CYANGUGU FOR RECCE TOMORROW MORNING. REPORTS FROM UNMOs IN GIKONGORO INDICATE THAT THE LOCALS WANT THE NEW GOVERNMENT TO ASSURE THEM OF THEIR SECURITY BEFORE THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE FRENCH FORCES. ACTS OF BANDITRY WERE REPORTED TO BE CONTINUING IN THE CYANGUGU AREA. THE FORCE MEDICAL OFFICER LEFT FOR NAIROBI TO CHECK ON THE CONDITION OF TROOPS WHO HAVE BEEN HOSPITALIZED THERE FOR SOMETIME NOW. THE FORCE COMMANDER AND THE SRSG RETURNED FROM KAMPALA TODAY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: THE SRSG RETURNED FROM KAMPALA THIS MORNING AND MET WITH THE FOLLOWING NGOS AND AGENCIES INDIVIDUALLY; ICRC, UNHCR, AND WFP. THE SRSG OUTLINED THE PRIORITIES OF THE OVERALL RELIEF EFFORT ESPECIALLY AS IT RELATES TO THE TRANSITION IN SECTOR 4. THEY THEN RECEIVED A DELEGATION LED BY MR SHINOMIYA NOBUTAKA OF THE JAPANESE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS TO DISCUSS JAPAN'S CONTRIBUTION TO THE RELIEF EFFORT.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO MAN A FEW ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN KIGALI. CONTINUED TO ASSIST COORDINATION OF HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

B. RGF. RGF ARE REPORTEDLY MOVING ABOUT IN GOMA BUT WITHOUT ARMS. THEIR VEHICLES ARE BEING CONFISCATED BY ZAIRIAN TROOPS. IN THE HPZ THEY CONTINUED TO MOVE ABOUT IN SMALL GROUPS AND MOST OF THE TIME IN CIVILIAN CLOTHES. CONTINUED TO ENCOURAGE PEOPLE TO CROSS INTO ZAIRE FROM THE HPZ.

C. MILITIA. NO MAJOR ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES:

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED. DFC HELD STAFF BRIEF AT 0800 HRS. SRSG AND FC RETURNED FROM UGANDA. THE ETHIOPIAN RECCE TEAM WAS BRIEFED BY THE STAFF ON ARRIVAL AT THE HQ.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. ALL HELICOPTERS WERE OPERATIONAL WITH ONE ON MEDIVAC STANDBY AT KIA. HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES CONTINUED TO CROSS INTO RWANDA WITH HUMANITARIAN RELIEF AID FOR DISTRIBUTION.

- C. GHANBATT. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN SECTOR 4A TOGETHER WITH THE FRENCH FORCES. C COY HQ AND A PLATOON DEPLOYED DATE AT KARAMA (GRID 5631) SIDE BY SIDE WITH FRENCH TROOPS. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL, MERIDIEN HOTEL AND BELGIC VILLAGE IN KIGALI. FORUM HELD AT RUZONDO GRID 5538 WITH LOCALS TO EXPLAIN UNAMIR PRESENCE AND REASSURE THEM OF THEIR SECURITY.
- D. MILOB GP. ESCORTED OFFICIALS OF MEDICINES MONDIAL TO GIKONGORO. AT KABGAYI CATHOLIC HOSPITAL NEAR GITARAMA, 3 MSF OFFICIALS CAME ON RECCE TO ASSESS THE HOSPITAL FOR POSSIBLE MAINTENANCE AND REOPENING BY 08 AUG 94.
- E. BRITCON. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT MEDICAL AND ENGINEER RECCE IN RUHENGIERI AND BYUMBA RESPECTIVELY. PREPARATION FOR BRITCON HQ IS STILL IN PROGRESS.
- F. CAN COMM COY. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE COMMUNICATION FACILITIES TO THE FORCE. RECCE TO MT KARISIMBE IN THE NORTH WILL BE CONDUCTED TOMORROW BY USE OF HELICOPTER.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 021801 AUG TO 031800 AUG 94.

1. GEN SITUATION: MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM. REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO KIGALI, HOWEVER THEIR NUMBERS STILL REMAINED LOW. TWO CIVILIANS WHO WERE INJURED BY LANDMINES DURING THE DAY ARE CURRENTLY UNDER MEDICAL CARE AT KIGALI CENTRAL HOSPITAL. FC AND SRSG LEFT FOR UGANDA THIS MORNING. DFC RETURNED FROM GIKONGORO WHERE HE MET THE FRENCH COALITION FORCE COMMANDER. IT IS REPORTED THAT RADIO RWANDA TRANSMISSIONS DO NOT REACH REMOTE AREAS OF THE COUNTRY SO GOVERNMENT APPEALS AND ANNONUCEMENTS ARE NOT REACHING THE POPULATION IN THESE AREAS. ACTS OF BANDITRY CONTINUE TO BE CONDUCTED IN CYANGUGU. THE ETHIOPIAN BATTALION RECCE PARTY IS EXPECTED TO ARRIVE TOMORROW.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: THE SRSG AND FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH PRESIDENT MUSEVENI IN KAMPALA AND DISCUSSED THE HUMANITARIAN AND RECONCILIATION EFFORTS IN RWANDA. THE HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR THE UNITED KINGDOM IN UGANDA VISITED UNAMIR AND RECEIVED A SITUATION REPORT ON RELIEF OPERATIONS. A SIX MAN DELEGATION FROM JAPAN HEADED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE AFRICAN DEPARTMENT IN THE FOREIGN MINISTRY ARRIVED IN KIGALI AFTER VISITING GOMA. THE DELEGATION WILL HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT AND UNAMIR OFFICIALS TO ACCESS THE COUNTRY'S IMMEDIATE NEEDS.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN KIGALI. ONE CIVILIAN WAS SHOT DEAD WITH ONE RPF SOLDIER WOUNDED IN A SHOOTING INCIDENT LAST NIGHT, NEAR KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. REPORTS FROM GIKONGORO INDICATE THAT RPF ALONG THE HPZ BOUNDARY CONTINUED TO BE FRIENDLY TO UNAMIR TROOPS. CONTINUING TO CONDUCT INFILTRATIONS INTO THE HPZ AT NIGHT.

B. RGF. CONTINUED TO REMAIN IN CAMPS IN GOMA. REPORTS INDICATE THAT THEY ARE RETURNING TO THE HPZ IN CIVILIAN DRESS AND INCITING THE POPULATION TO LEAVE THE AREA AS THEIR SECURITY CANNOT BE GUARANTEED AFTER THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE FRENCH TROOPS.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES:

A. FORCE HQ. CONDUCTED NORMAL ROUTINE DUTIES. FC AND SRSG LEFT FOR UGANDA THIS MORNING. DFC RETURNED FROM GIKONGORO LATER THIS AFTERNOON.

WEEKLY SITREP 24-31 JULY 1994

1. HIGHLIGHTS. UNAMIR received the visit of Mr. Peter Hansen, ASG for DHA, and his team. The SRSG accompanied Mr. Hansen and his team to Goma and Bukavu where they met with local leaders and assessed the grave humanitarian situation. Madame Ogata, the High Commissioner for Refugees, and her team came to Rwanda to discuss UNHCR's role in the overall humanitarian operation. She and her team met with the SRSG, the Force Commander and also with Prime Minister Twagiramungu and President Bizimungu. The meetings focused on three principal points: (a) UNHCR's operations in Rwanda; (b) the apprehension of those responsible for the massacres; and (c) security in Rwanda. On 31 July, U.S. Secretary of Defense William Perry and his team arrived in Kigali to discuss the U.S. role in the Rwandan relief efforts and to receive a UNAMIR briefing on political, humanitarian and military matters. The Secretary of Defense asked how the American government could be of assistance. An American contingent is on the ground in Kigali operating the airport.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY

UNAMIR received a number of important visitors this week. The following are important trends that came out of this weeks' meetings and activities:

-All parties agreed that Kigali should be the focal point of humanitarian relief (including the U.S. government and Mme. Ogata).

-Some refugees are returning. It is a trickle at this point, but UNAMIR is optimistic that the flow will increase.

-President Bizimungu visited all four neighbouring countries to discuss humanitarian, political and military issues. His meetings were very productive, and his meeting with Zairean President Mobutu was unexpectedly successful. The two leaders produced a joint communique stating: (a) Zairean territory will not be used by destabilizing forces against Rwanda; (b) President Mobutu will facilitate the return of refugees from Goma to Rwanda; and (c) a joint commission was formed to facilitate the return of refugees.

-An OAU delegation visited UNAMIR as part of its mission. The delegation stressed the importance of Rwanda's attendance at the Conflict Resolution Mechanism meeting in Tunis to be held 3-4 August.

-The Belgian Ambassador on Special Mission is in Kigali and has asked SRSG Khan how Belgium can assist.

-The Special Rapporteur submitted his report to the SRSG on 31 July. At the present time, it is important to note that the government's assurances of national reconciliation and security are not being implemented on the ground.

-Kigali is slowly returning to normalcy. Markets are opening, and people are returning to daily life.

1. GEN SITUATION: GENERAL MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM. REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO RWANDA, BUT THEIR FIGURES ARE REPORTEDLY LOW. DFC VISITED GIKONGORO AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH FC OF THE FRENCH COALITION FORCES. THEY DISCUSSED THE MODALITIES FOR THE RELIEF EXERCISE. A DELEGATION FROM MALAWI WAS BRIEFED BY FC ABOUT THE CURRENT SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY AND UNAMIR'S FUTURE HUMANITARIAN OPERATIONS. ONE ASSAULT RIFLE 5.56 CALIBRE WITH 45 ROUNDS WAS FOUND WITHIN THE PREMISES OF THE MILITARY ACADEMY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: SIR DAVID STEEL, FORMER LEADER OF THE BRITISH LIBERAL PARTY, AND BROWN MPINGANJIRA, MALAWI MINISTER OF INFORMATION, ARRIVED IN KIGALI TO DELIVER A CARGO OF DRIED FISH WHICH PRESIDENT MULUZI SENT FOR DISTRIBUTION TO RWANDAN REFUGEES. THE TEAM MET WITH THE SRSG TO RECEIVE A BRIEFING ON THE CURRENT POLITICAL, MILITARY AND HUMANITARIAN SITUATIONS AND THEN TOOK A TOUR OF KIGALI TO ASSESS THE PREVAILING CONDITIONS IN THE CITY. THE DELEGATION PLANNED TO MEET WITH BRITISH NGO'S DURING THEIR MISSION, AS WELL. AN ITALIAN DELEGATION LED BY THE ITALIAN AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, MR. MARCELLO RICOVERI, ARRIVED IN KIGALI FOR A SHORT BRIEFING BY THE SRSG. THE ITALIAN EMBASSY IS CURRENTLY BASED IN KAMPALA, BUT AMBASSADOR RICOVERI SAID THAT THE DELEGATION HOPES TO MOVE BACK TO KIGALI IN THE NEAR FUTURE. THE DELEGATION PRESENTED THE SRSG WITH A SUMMARY OF ITALIAN RELIEF AID AMOUNTING TO \$46.7 MILLION.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA VISITED MAURITIUS, TANZANIA AND BURUNDI DURING THE WEEK. RIGHT HONORABLE BARONESS CHALKER VISITED RWANDA AND TOURED BYUMBA AND OTHER AREAS NORTH OF THE COUNTRY. US ARMY TROOPS BEGAN TO ARRIVE IN KIGALI TO ASSIST IN REOPENING KIA. THE US SECRETARY OF DEFENCE VISITED KIGALI AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE PRESIDENT. UN HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES MRS SADAKO OGATA PAID A VISIT TO KIGALI AND LEFT FOR GOMA. OAU DELEGATION ARRIVED AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE PRESIDENT. HUMANITARIAN AID CONTINUED TO BE PROVIDED TO DISPLACED PERSONS IN SECTOR 4.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE LIAISON WITH THE FRENCH. TEAMS DEPLOYED IN GIKONGORO GISENYI, KIBUYE, CYANGUGU AND MULINDI SECTOR UNMOs MOVED TO BYUMBA. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ESCORT FOR VISITING DELEGATES AND MONITORING TEAMS FOR HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO ASSIST AND COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES AND SUPPLIED FOOD STUFFS IN GISENYI TO REFUGEES RETURNING HOME. 1. GEN SITUATION: MILITARY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY REMAINED CALM. REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO RWANDA FROM GOMA. THE SITUATION IN REFUGEE CAMPS IN GOMA IS REPORTED TO BE CALMING DOWN, HOWEVER FEARS EXIST FOR AN OUTBREAK OF MENINGITIS. THE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION VISITED FHQ TODAY. A FRENCH HIRED BOAT WAS FIRED UPON BY UNKNOWN GUNMEN ON LAKE KIVU ON ITS WAY TO KIBUYE ON A RESUPPLY MISSION. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED. ILLEGAL OCCUPATION OF HOUSES CONTINUES IN KIGALI.

THE SITUATION IN GOMA REMAINS CRITICAL DUE TO CHOLERA AND OUTBREAK OF DYSENTERY. THERE IS AN ENORMOUS POPULATION OF DISPLACED IN THE HPZ. ESTIMATES SHOW ABOUT 650,000 IN THE AREA BUT MOST OF THE AID AGENCIES ARE FOCUSING THEIR EFFORTS ON ZAIRE.

THE SITUATION IN THE HPZ CONTINUED TO REMAIN VOLATILE AND UNPREDICTABLE. DISPLACED PEOPLE ARE REPORTED TO BE DYING OF HANGER IN THE HPZ. ACTS OF BANDITRY ARE ALSO REPORTED TO BE COMMITTED BY FORMER RGF SOLDIERS. THE US SECRETARY OF DEFENCE ARRIVED IN KIGALI TODAY. HE WAS BRIEFED BY SRSG AND FC ON UNAMIR ACTIVITIES AND FUTURE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. OAU DELIGATION ARRIVED IN KIGALI TODAY. UN HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES MRS SADAOKO OGATA LEFT THIS MORNING FOR GOMA. GHANBATT TROOPS COMMENCED DEPLOYMENT IN SECTOR 4.

REPORTS FROM GIKONGORO INDICATE CONTINUED INTIMIDATION AND BRUTAL KILLING OF SUSPECTS BY RPF. THESE ACTS ARE PREVENTING PEOPLE FROM LEAVING THE HPZ TO GO AND SETTLE IN THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS. THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA VISITED BURUNDI TODAY AND RETURNED IN THE EVENING. AMERICAN DELEGATION VISITED FORCE HQ AND WERE BRIEFED BY FC. UN HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES ARRIVED IN KIGALI. SHE WAS BRIEFED ON MILITARY ACTIVITIES, HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES AND FUTURE PLANS BY SRSG AND FC. RAPPORTEUR ON HUMAN RIGHTS VISITED GITARAMA THIS AFTERNOON. EUROPEAN PARLIAMENTARY DELEGATION VISITED GIKONGORO TODAY AND LEFT FOR NAIROBI LATER IN THE AFTERNOON. 150 MEMBERS OF THE CANADIAN COMM SQUADRON ARRIVED IN KIGALI THIS MORNING.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU TRAVELLED TO BUJUMBURA TO MEET THE PRESIDENT OF BURUNDI. SRSG RECEIVED MADAME OGATA, THE HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES, AND HER TEAM. MADAME OGATA RECEIVED BRIEFINGS FROM THE SRSG, THE FORCE COMMANDER AND THE UN HUMANITARIAN COORDINATOR. MADAME OGATA'S TEAM, ALONG WITH THE SRSG AND HIS POLITICAL AFFAIRS OFFICER, MET FIRST GENERAL PAUL KAGAME AND THEN THE PRIME MINISTER FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU AND MINISTER OF HEALTH, DR JOSEPH KALEMERA. SITREP COVERING PERIOD 291801B JULY TO 301800B JULY 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM IN RWANDA. MANY DISPLACED PEOPLE CONTINUED TO RETURN TO RWANDA FROM GOMA, ZAIRE. REPORTS FROM GIKONGORO INDICATE CONTINUED INTIMIDATION AND BRUTAL KILLING OF SUSPECTS BY RPF. THESE ACTS ARE PREVENTING PEOPLE FROM LEAVING THE HPZ TO GO AND SETTLE IN THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS. THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA VISITED BURUNDI TODAY AND RETURNED IN THE EVENING. AMERICAN DELEGATION VISITED FORCE HQ AND WERE BRIEFED BY FC. UN HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES ARRIVED IN KIGALI. SHE WAS BRIEFED ON MILITARY ACTIVITIES, HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES AND FUTURE PLANS BY SRSG AND FC. RAPPORTEUR ON HUMAN RIGHTS VISITED GITARAMA THIS AFTERNOON. EUROPEAN PARLIAMENTARY DELEGATION VISITED GIKONGORO TODAY AND LEFT FOR NAIROBI LATER IN THE AFTERNOON. 150 MEMBERS OF THE CANADIAN COMM SQUADRON ARRIVED IN KIGALI THIS MORNING.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU TRAVELLED TO BUJUMBURA TO MEET THE PRESIDENT OF BURUNDI. SRSG RECEIVED MADAME OGATA, THE HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES, AND HER TEAM. MADAME OGATA RECEIVED BRIEFINGS FROM THE SRSG, THE FORCE COMMANDER AND THE UN HUMANITARIAN COORDINATOR. MADAME OGATA'S TEAM, ALONG WITH THE SRSG AND HIS POLITICAL AFFAIRS OFFICER, MET FIRST GENERAL PAUL KAGAME AND THEN THE PRIME MINISTER FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU AND MINISTER OF HEALTH, DR JOSEPH KALEMERA. THE DISCUSSIONS FOCUSED ON THREE BASIC ISSUES: (1) UNHCR'S OPERATIONS IN RWANDA, (2) APPREHENDING THE PERPETRATORS OF THE MASSACRES AND BRINGING THEM TO JUSTICE AND (3) SECURITY IN RWANDA. THE TEAM THEN TOOK A TOUR OF KIGALI TO ASSESS THE PREVAILING CONDITIONS IN THE CITY.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF IN THE SOUTH-WEST OF THE COUNTRY CLOSE TO THE HPZ ARE REPORTEDLY INTIMIDATING AND CONDUCTING BRUTAL KILLINGS OF SUSPECTS. RPF IS STILL ENTERING HPZ WITH AND WITHOUT WEAPONS, DAYS AND NIGHT. THEY CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROL IN KIGALI AND CONTROLLING FEW ROAD BLOCKS. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE WITH AID AGENCIES AND NGOS IN HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

B. RGF. NO MILITARY ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED. CONTINUED TO ASSIST THE FRENCH FORCES TO CLEAR AND BURY DEAD BODIES. THEY ARE REPORTED TO HAVE REGROUPED 4 KMS SOUTH OF BUKAVU.

C. MILITIA. NO ACTIVITIES WERE REPORTED. MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE LEAVING THE HPZ ARE REPORTED TO BE INTIMIDATED OR BRUTALLY KILLED BY RPF.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED. FC HELD A MEETING WITH THE STAFFS AT 0800 HRS. HE BRIEFED US ARMY

DELEGATION. SRSG AND FC BRIEFED MRS SADAOKO OGATA, THE UN COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES ON CURRENT REFUGEE STATUS AND FUTURE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. ALL HELICOPTERS WERE OPERATIONAL. VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES CONTINUED TO ENTER RWANDA WITH HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ITEMS.

C. GHANBATT. CONTINUED TO TRAIN ON APCs. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KIA, FORCE HQ, MERIDIEN HOTEL, KING FAISAL HOSPITAL, UNDP COMPLEX AND AT THE BELGIC VILLAGE. CONDUCTED PATROLS WITHIN THE GENERAL AREA OF KIA FROM 2100 HRS TO 2200 HRS AND 0400 HRS TO 0500 HRS. PREPARATION FOR DEPLOYMENT INTO SECTOR 4 CONTINUED. TROOPS FROM ENTEBBE ARE SPENDING THE NIGHT AT MERAMA HILLS.

D. MILOB. CONTINUED LIAISON DUTIES WITH RPF AND THE FRENCH FORCES. ESCORTED THE BRITISH PARLIAMENTARY DELEGATION TO GIKONGORO. CARRIED OUT PATROLS IN MUTARA, BYUMBA, NGARAMA AND TABAGWE AREAS. LARGE NUMBER OF RETURNEES ARE AWAITING TO BE TRANSPORTED TO KIGALI WERE OBSERVED AT RUTARE. ESCORTED FRENCH LOS TO GATUNA.

5. FRENCH COALITION FORCES ACTIVITIES. THE FRENCH COALITION FORCES CONTINUED TO PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN AID TO REFUGEES IN GOMA. THEY ALSO CONTINUED TO CLEAR AND BURY THE DEAD BODIES. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY IN HPZ AND HUMANITARIAN AID WITHIN THE HPZ.

6. US ARMY ACTIVITIES. THE US ARMY STARTED TO DEPLOY AT KIA TODAY. THEY WILL COMMENCE INSTALLATION OF EQUIPMENT AT KIA TO HAVE IT FULLY OPERATIONAL. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO REFUGEES IN GOMA.

7. UNCIVPOL. CONTINUED TO WORK IN COORDINATION WITH MILOBS.

8. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. WFP CONVOY LEFT KIGALI TO DELIVER FOOD AT GISENYI. CONVOY CONSISTED OF 9 TRUCKS CARRYING 150 TONS OF MAIZE AND 130 TONS OF MAIZE MEAL.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. MINE THREAT EXISTS IN SOME AREAS WITHIN THE CITY AND CAUSING INJURIES TO CIVILIANS. MANY MORE ARE EXPECTED IN OTHER PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. THOUSANDS OF DISPLACED PEOPLE CONTINUED TO LEAVE GOMA FOR RWANDA. MOVEMENT OF PEOPLE INTO THE RPF CONTROLLED AREAS FROM THE HPZ IS REPORTEDLY SMALL. HUMANITARIAN AID TEAM FROM NY VISITED GIKONGORO IN HPZ AND RETURNED TO KIGALI LATER IN THE AFTERNOON. FC RETURNED FROM ENTEBBE. HE HELD DISCUSSION WITH SABENA ABOUT THE ADMINISTRATION FOR KIA. HE HELD A MEETING WITH HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES. US ARMY ADVANCE PARTY AND A RECCE TEAM FROM THE BRITISH ARMY ARRIVES IN KIGALI TOMORROW. A CONVOY OF APCs ARRIVED KIGALI FROM ENTEBBE THIS AFTERNOON.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA AND HIS MINISTER OF INTERIOR RETURNED TO KIGALI FOLLOWING DISCUSSIONS WITH THE PRESIDENT MOBUTU IN MAURITIUS AND PRESIDENT MWINYI IN TANZANIA. THE OUTCOME OF BOTH MEETINGS WAS REPORTED TO BE POSITIVE. THE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TEAM VISITING RWANDA MET WITH MINISTERS OF FINANCE, SOCIAL AFFAIRS AND EDUCATION TO FIND OUT THE PRIORITIES OF VARIOUS MINISTRIES. IT WAS AGREED AT THE END OF THE MEETING THAT FOLLOW-UP DISCUSSIONS WILL BE HELD WITH OFFICIALS OF THE RELEVANT MINISTRIES. MR PETER HANSEN AND MS SIRLEAF JOHNSON LEFT FOR NAIROBI FOLLOWING A PRESS CONFERENCE HELD AT KIGALI AIRPORT.

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 18 JUL 94 TO 24 JUL 94.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE FALL OF RUHENGERI AND GISENYI RESULTED IN DRASTIC CHANGES IN THE SITUATION IN RWANDA. THE INSTALLATION OF THE BROAD BASED GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL UNITY WAS HELD ON 19 JULY 94. MR PASTEUR BIZIMINGU WAS MADE THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA AND MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME THE VICE PRESIDENT. MR FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU WAS MADE PRIME MINISTER AND COL ALEXIS KANYAREGWE VICE PRIME MINISTER. THE NEW GOVT CALLED FOR ALL DISPLACED PEOPLE IN THE COUNTRY AND REFUGEES IN GOMA TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES AND COUNTRY RESPECTIVELY. OVER A MILLION PEOPLE WERE REPORTED TO HAVE CROSSED THE BORDER TO GOMA, ZAIRE. FCF HAS DISARMED OVER 8,000 RGF SOLDIERS IN GOMA. RPF ANNOUNCED UNILETERAL CEASE FIRE ON THE NIGHT BETWEEN 18/19 JULY 94. HAC RECCE TEAM WENT TO RUHENGERI AND GISENYI TO ASSESS THE SITUATION IN THE AREA. SITUATION IN REFUGEE CAMPS IN GOMA CONTINUED TO DETERIORATE DUE TO THE OUTBREAK OF CHOLERA, POOR SANITATION AND LACK OF ADEQUATE FOOD. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO ASSIST TO MOVE DISPLACED PEOPLE FROM CAMPS IN BYUMBA AND RUTARE TO KIGALI. DISPLACED PEOPLE AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL LEFT FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE HOMES. THE FCF CONTINUED TO PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE IN THE HPZ AND IN GOMA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. AFTER THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF UNILETERAL CEASE FIRE BY RPF, INSTALLATION OF A BROAD BASED GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL UNITY WAS HELD ON 19 JUL 94. SRSG TRAVELLED TO TANZANIA AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH PRIME MINISTER AND FOREIGN MINISTER. HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE PRESIDENT AND THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA. THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA CALLED FOR ALL DISPLACED PEOPLE IN ZAIRE AND ELSE WHERE TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME COUNTRY.

3. MILITARY.

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPF. RPF ANNOUNCED A CEASE FIRE DURING THE PERIOD. CONTINUED TO CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND PATROLLING IN KIGALI CITY AND THE REST OF THE COUNTRY. THEY REMAINED VIGILANT IN THEIR POSITIONS ALONG THE HUMANITARIAN PROTECTED ZONE BOUNDARIES.

(2) RGF. MANY RGF SOLDIERS FLED AWAY FROM THE COUNTRY ALONG WITH CIVILIANS TO GOMA, AFTER THE FALL OF RUHENGERI AND GISENYI. ABOUT 8,000 ARE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN DISARMED BY THE FCF. SOME SOUGHT SANCTUARY IN THE FRENCH PROTECTED ZONE ALONG WITH MANY INTERHAMWE AND MILITIA.

(1) UNAMIR. CONTINUED TO PERFORM ROUTINE DUTIES. FC MET WITH MAJ GEN PAUL KAGAME. FC VISITED GOMA AND ENTEBBE. CONTINUED LIAISON WITH THE FRENCH LED

COALITION FORCES IN GOMA AND BUKAVU. UNAMIR OCCUPIED SOME INSTALLATIONS IN KIGALI CITY.

(2) UNOMUR. THE AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS AND CONTINUED TO MONITOR THE SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE AND FLY UNAMIR PERSONNEL TO GOMA AND ENTEBBE. VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES AND NGOS CONTINUED TO ENTER RWANDA TO DISTRIBUTE RELIEF ITEMS. THE ACMO VISITED MERAMA HILLS DURING THE PERIOD. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING ARE AS FOLLOWS:

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE LIAISON WITH THE FRENCH IN GOMA AND BUKAVU. PROVIDED UNMO TEAMS TO VISITING OFFICIALS, MOVEMENT OF DISPLACED PEOPLE FROM BYUMBA AND RUTARE TO KIGALI AND ESCORT OF RELIEF CONVOYS. PREPARATION FOR DEPLOYMENT IN SECTORS 4 AND 5 CONTINUED.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO ASSIST TO MOVE PEOPLE FROM BYUMBA AND RUTARE TO KIGALI. TOTAL NUMBER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE MOVED SO FAR IS 5232. DUE TO DETERIORATING CONDITIONS IN REFUGEE CAMPS IN GOMA, MANY REFUGEES ARE REPORTEDLY RETURNING TO RWANDA, AND MANY MORE DIED INSIDE RWANDA AFTER RETURNING. MOVEMENT OF PEOPLE WERE ALSO REPORTED FROM THE HPZ TO GITARMA AND SOME PARTS IN THE SOUTH. MEDICINES DU MONDE DELIVERED FOOD FOR ORPHANS AT SOS VILLAGE AND OTHER ORPHANAGES IN KIGALI. 50 SICK AND WOUNDED SUSPECTS AND 15 ABLE SUSPECTS WERE HANDED OVER TO RPF AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF ICRC AND UNAMIR.

7. CONCLUSION. THE ANNOUNCEMENT BY RPF AND INSTALLATION OF THE BROAD BASED GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL UNITY WERE SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES OF THE WEEK. SRSG VISITED TANZANIA AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF FOREIGN

AFFAIRS. SRSG AND FC HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE PRESIDENT AND THE PRIME MINISTER. FC ALSO HELD A SEPARATE MEETING WITH MAJ GEN PAUL KAGAME. THE CONDITION OF DISPLACED PEOPLE IN GOMA WORSENERD AND CAUSED MANY DEATHS. MANY REFUGEES STARTED TO RETURN TO RWANDA. REPORTS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED THAT PEOPLE FROM HPZ, SOUTH-WEST OF THE COUNTRY WERE ALSO RETURNING TO GITARAMA AND OTHER AREAS UNDER GOVERNMENT CONTROL.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE SITUATION CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. NO ACTIVITIES OF MILITARY SIGNIFICANT WERE REPORTED. NUMBERS OF DISPLACED PEOPLE DYING IN REFUGEE CAMPS IN GOMA CONTINUED TO RISE. A HAC TEAM LEFT FOR GISENYI THIS MORNING AND RETURNED THIS EVENING. FC LEFT FOR GATUNA TO MEET AMERICAN AND FRENCH HUMANITARIAN TEAMS AND RETURNED THIS EVENING. TWO UNEXPLODED BOMBS WERE DESTROYED THIS AFTERNOON NEAR MERIDIEN HOTEL BY OWN EOD TEAM. TWO DEAD BODIES WERE FOUND THIS AFTERNOON IN GHANBATT TRAINING AREA. THE DEAD BODIES HAD MULTIPLE BULLET WOUNDS ALL OVER. THEY APPEARED FRESH PROBABLY KILLED LAST NIGHT.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SRSG RETURNED TO KIGALI TODAY AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH MR FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA. 1. GEN SITUATION. THE SITUATION REMAINED CALM. THE DAY WAS MARKED BY THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE TRANSITIONAL GOVT AND SWEARING IN CEREMONY OF THE PRESIDENT, PRIME MINISTER AND THEIR SENIOR MEMBERS OF THE GOVT. DISPLACED PEOPLE CONTINUED TO CROSS THE BORDER INTO ZAIRE. RGF TROOPS ALSO CONTINUED TO CROSS INTO ZAIRE AND THE HPZ. SRSG RETURNED FROM NAIROBI AND ATTENDED INSTALLATION CEREMONY OF BROAD BASED GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL UNITY. THE CEREMONY WAS ALSO ATTENDED BY FORCE COMMANDER AND MILITARY SENIOR OFFICERS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SRSG, THE FORCE COMMANDER AND OTHER SENIOR MEMBERS OF UNAMIR ATTENDED THE INSTALLATION CEREMONY OF THE BROAD BASED GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL UNITY AT THE CND COMPLEX IN KIGALI. DURING THE CEREMONY, MR PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU WAS SWORN IN AS PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF RWANDA, MAJOR GENERAL KAGAME AS VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MR FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU AND COLONEL ALEXIS KANYARWENGE AS PRIME MINISTER AND DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER RESPECTIVELY. 1. HIGH LIGHTS. THE SITUATION REMAINED TENSE IN RUHENGERI, GISENYI AND GOMA IN ZAIRE. RPF CAPTURED THE TOWN OF RUHENGERI AND ADVANCED TO GISENYI WHERE HEAVY SHELLING WAS REPORTED. RPF EXCHANGED FIRE WITH THE FRENCH IN THE AREA. THEY SHELLED GOMA AIRPORT KILLING 40 PEOPLE. OVER A MILLION REFUGEES CROSSED THE BORDER INTO ZAIRE. THOUSANDS OF RGF TROOPS, MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE ALSO CONTINUED TO FLEE INTO ZAIRE. THE FRENCH AND ZAIRIAN SECURITY FORCES REMAINED VIGILANT. THEY CONTINUED TO DISARM THE RGF, MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE. PRIME MINISTER DESIGNATE, MR TWAGIRAMUNGU PAID SEVERAL VISITS TO FORCE HQ AND EXCHANGED A WIDE RANGE OF POLITICAL ISSUES WITH THE SRSG. FC VISITED GOMA. DISPLACED PERSONS CONTINUED TO RETURN TO KIGALI AND OTHER PARTS OF THE COUNTRY UNDER RPF CONTROL. UNAMIR ASSISTED TO MOVE DISPLACED PEOPLE TO KIGALI FROM RUTARE AND BYUMBA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE RPF ANNOUNCED THAT THEY WOULD SOON FORM AN INTERIM GOVERNMENT COMPRISING ALL RWANDESE POLITICAL PARTIES. THE INTERIM PRIME MINISTER, MR TWAGIRAMUNGU ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 14 JULY 1994. HE MET SRSG AND FC ON SEPARATE MEETINGS AND EXCHANGED WITH THEM A WIDE RANGE OF POLITICAL AND MILITARY ISSUES. THE MAIN SUBJECT WAS A SPEEDY IMPLEMENTATION OF A CEASE FIRE AND FORMATION OF A NATIONAL GOVERNMENT. THEY AGREED TO BE IN CONTINUOUS CONTACT WITH EACH OTHER AND TO ENSURE A SPEEDY RESUMPTION OF THE PEACE PROCESS AND FOR NATIONAL RECONCILIATION. THE INTERIM GOVT WAS REPORTED TO HAVE MOVED FROM GISENYI TO BUKAVU, ZAIRE.

3. MILITARY.

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPF. RUHENGERI AND MUCH OF THE AREA AROUND GISENYI FELL UNDER RPF CONTROL. ALL AREAS UNDER THEIR CONTROL REMAINED CALM. EXCHANGED FIRE WITH FRENCH FORCES AROUND HPZ. THEY ARE REPORTED TO HAVE DEPLOYED SOME ELEMENTS BEYOND THE HPZ.

(2) RGF. RGF TROOPS ONCE AGAIN SUFFERED A DEFEAT AT RUHENGERI AND LOST MUCH OF THE AREA SURROUNDING GISENYI. MANY RGF TROOPS CROSSED THE BORDER TO GOMA IN ZAIRE. IN THE SOUTH-WEST OF THE COUNTRY RGF CONTINUED TO CROSS INTO THE FRENCH CONTROLLED AREAS. DIVISIONS AMONGST RGF TROOPS CONTINUED. THEIR MORALE HAS DETERIORATED TREMENDOUSLY.

FRENCH CONTINUED. SRSG MET THE DESIGNATE PRIME MINISTER, MR TWAGIRAMUNGU. THEY EXCHANGED VARIOUS ISSUES PERTAINING TO IMMEDIATE CEASE FIRE AND SPEEDY PROCESS TO ESTABLISH A GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL UNITY.

(2) UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTING PATROLS. CONTINUED TO MONITOR THE SITUATION IN NORTH-WEST OF RWANDA ALONG THE BORDER. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE AND FLY UNAMIR PERSONNEL. ALL HELICOPTERS WERE OPERATIONAL. BORDER CROSSING WERE AS UNDER:

DIFFERENT AID AGENCIES BROUGHT IN VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN RELIEF AID THROUGH UGANDA FOR DISTRIBUTION IN RPF CONTROL AREA.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED LIAISON WITH THE FRENCH COALITIONS IN GOMA AND BUKAVU. PROVIDED ESCORTS AND MONITORING TEAM TO CONVOYS FOR TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE AND OTHER HUMANITARIAN CONVOYS.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. DISPLACED PEOPLE CONTINUED TO RETURN TO KIGALI CITY AND IN OTHER RPF CONTROLLED AREAS. HAC DELIVERED RATIONS TO REFUGEE CAMPS AND CONTINUED VACCINATION OF DISPLACED PERSONS. MANY REFUGEE CAMPS IN RPF CONTROLLED AREAS WERE BEING VACATED. SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES AND NGOS. HE DISCUSSED WITH THEM THEIR PRESENT RESPONSIBILITIES AND THEIR FUTURE TASKS. UNAMIR ASSISTED TO MOVE DISPLACED PEOPLE FROM RUTARE AND BYUMBA TO KIGALI. THE LARGEST INFLUX OF DISPLACED PERSONS WAS REPORTED DURING THE WEEK DUE TO HEAVY FIGHTING IN RUHENGERI AND GISENYI.

THE FRENCH COALITION FORCES AND THE ZAIRIAN SECURITY FORCES CONTINUED TO BE VIGILANT AND DISARMED THE FLEEING RGF, MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE. FC AND COO VISITED GOMA. RPF HAVE GIVEN CLEARANCE FOR UNAMIR TO CONDUCT REASONABLE NIGHT MOVEMENTS IN KIGALI AND NORTH-EASTERN AREA FROM TODAY. SRSG LEFT FOR NAIROBI THIS AFTERNOON.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. GENERAL KAGAME WAS REPORTED TO HAVE DECLARED THAT RPF HAD WON THE WAR AND THAT THERE WAS A DE FACTO CEASE FIRE IN RPF HELD AREAS, WHICH IS ABOUT TWO THIRD OF THE COUNTRY. HE ALSO SAID THAT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU WILL BE THE PRESIDENT OF THE BROAD BASED GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL UNITY AND FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU THE PRIME MINISTER. THE INSTALLATION CEREMONY IS SCHEDULED AT 1000 HRS ON 19 JULY 1994. THE SRSG LEFT KIGALI TODAY FOR NAIROBI TO ATTEND A DONORS MEETING AND TO HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE REGIONAL DIRECTOR OF USAID.

DAILY PRESS BRIEFING OF OFFICE OF SPOKESMAN FOR SECRETARY-GENERAL

Joe Sills, Spokesman for the Secretary-General, began today's noon briefing by announcing that Secretary-General Boutros Boutros-Ghali was at his residence today preparing for his trip to Europe. At noon, the Secretary-General would meet with Sung-Joo Han, Foreign Affairs Minister of the Republic of Korea.

Regarding the Secretary-General's trip to Europe, Mr. Sills informed correspondents that the Secretary-General would leave this evening for Moscow. Tomorrow, among other meetings, he would see Andrei V. Kozyrev, Foreign Affairs Minister of the Russian Federation. The Secretary-General's meeting with President Boris Yeltsin would be on Monday of next week, and on Tuesday he would travel to Belarus.

Continuing, Mr. Sills said that there would be no noon briefing tomorrow since it was a holiday. However, an officer of the Department of Public Information (DPI) would be on duty, as usual, during the holiday and over the weekend to provide information to the press.

Mr. Sills then read the following statement:

"The Secretary-General of United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), Kenneth K.S. Dadzie, has informed the Secretary-General of his decision to leave the service of the United Nations at the end of his current term of office on 31 March.

"The Secretary-General has accepted this decision with great regret.

"The Secretary-General wishes to take this opportunity to pay tribute to Dadzie as an outstanding international civil servant who has demonstrated, in the course of a long and very distinguished career, the highest intellectual and diplomatic skills and deepest dedication to the ideals of the United Nations."

Mr. Dadzie would now return to the service of the Government of Ghana, Mr. Sills said. Correspondents were informed that the full text of the statement, which included additional information on his career with the United Nations, would be issued as a press release. (See Press Release SG/SM/5253-TAD/1730.)

Mr. Sills also read the following statement attributable to the Spokesman for the Secretary-General:

"The Secretary-General, following appropriate consultations with members of the Conference on Disarmament, has decided to confirm the appointment of Vladimir Petrovsky, Director-General of the United Nations Office at Geneva, as the Secretary-General of the Conference on Disarmament and as his Personal Representative to the Conference, with immediate effect.

"Mr. Petrovsky has performed these responsibilities on an interim basis since 5 December 1993. He will continue to carry them out concurrently with his responsibility as Director-General of the United Nations Office at Geneva." (See Press Release SG/A/581-SG/SM/5252-DCF/200.)

Mr. Sills went on to say that the Security Council's working group on the United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR) had met during the morning. That meeting would be followed by consultations of the whole on UNPROFOR and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea/International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA). A formal meeting on UNPROFOR was scheduled for 3:30 p.m.

Correspondents were also informed that the DPI would air a World Chronicle television programme featuring Ambassador Herbert Okun, a member of the International Narcotics Control Board, on in-house television at 2:30 p.m. today.

Mr. Sills then noted that the Secretary-General was following with concern developments in Zaire. Lakhdar Brahimi continued to perform his functions as the Secretary-General's Special Envoy for Zaire, concurrently with his functions as Special Representative for South Africa. The Secretary-General will be discussing the situation in Zaire with Mr. Brahimi at their meeting in Geneva next week. Mr. Brahimi intended to make another visit to Zaire in the near future.

Briefing notes from the United Nations Operation in Somalia (UNOSOM II) were also available in the Spokesman's office, Mr. Sills said. The Acting Spokesperson for UNOSOM, Salimatu Khan, announced that the Secretary-General's Acting Special Representative, Lansana Kouyate, had left for New York for consultations at Headquarters. The notes also contained information on a number of water projects that would be funded by the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), on demining activities and the cholera situation.

Referring to a question asked during yesterday's noon briefing on the financing of the International War Crimes Tribunal, Mr. Sills informed correspondents that document A/48/915 contained some relevant information. The document stated that the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (ACABQ) had recommended that the Secretary-General be authorized to enter into further commitments, not exceeding \$11 million, for the Tribunal until 31 December. The ACABQ had also recommended that the Secretary-General submit, by 1 November, a further report on the Tribunal, its financial performance and its requirements on the basis of experience. An amount of \$5,594,000 million had been made available for the Tribunal's start-up phase; this is to be included in the \$11 million.

In response to another question asked yesterday regarding a United Nations convoy that had been "lost" in Angola, Mr. Sills reported that an incident had occurred on 13 March. A convoy of 17 trucks carrying supplies provided by the World Food Programme (WFP) was hijacked. The convoy, contracted by World Vision from a private firm, had left Luanda with a military escort on 8 March, had arrived in Dondo on 9 March and had completed the discharge of cargo on 10 March. The convoy started out for Luanda on 13 March without receiving clearance from the military authorities and without a military escort. It was ambushed. Eight trucks were burned, two staff

drivers or helpers were killed and three were missing. Some of the remaining trucks returned to Dondo and the others proceeded to Luanda. The incident was being investigated.

The Spokesman then announced that Ambassador Satya N. Nandan (Fiji), Chairman of the United Nations Conference on Straddling Fish Stocks and Highly Migratory Fish Stocks, would hold a press conference at 3 p.m. today to brief correspondents on the outcome of the current session of the Conference, which concluded today.

A correspondent asked the Spokesman to comment on the report of the Commission of Inquiry into events in Somalia which, he said, was heavily critical of the United Nations and had demanded that compensation should be paid to Somalis. Mr. Sills said that he would not comment on details of that report, which had been submitted to the Security Council. However, he added that the Council would decide what should be done with the report. If it decided to release the full report, the Secretary-General would have no problem with that decision. Mr. Sills reiterated that he would not respond to individual questions on the content of the report.

In spite of his statement, there was a series of questions on individual points in the report, including the reading of a number of quotations drawn from the report. Mr. Sills again stated that he would not comment on the contents of the report. He said that it was the Secretary-General's decision not to make the report public, since it had been requested by the Security Council. It is true that the Secretary-General had taken some time to review the report, and to consult with the Commissioners, before submitting it to the Council.

Quoting from the report, a correspondent inquired about the Secretary-General's response to some of the recommendations on peace-enforcement operations. Mr. Sills said that all peace-keeping operations, including peace enforcement, were determined by the Security Council. It was obvious that the experience in Somalia had given rise to many questions about peace enforcement operations; as a result, he expected that peace enforcement would be looked at more closely in the future.

A correspondent said that the Secretary-General would receive bad publicity for not making the report public. Mr. Sills said he had no comment on that statement.

The report had been "made available to the press" said another correspondent. Why were members of the Council not given copies? The Spokesman said that "it had been leaked" and he would not comment on documents that had been leaked to the press. The procedure by which the document was made available for examination by members of the Security Council had been decided by the Council's President.

Why was the report being suppressed? asked another correspondent. Mr. Sills said that he did not agree with the use of the term "suppressed". The report was with the Council and the Council would decide what would be done with it. However, without reference to the specifics of the report, the Spokesman said that different points made in the report would be given serious

consideration, for example the question of peace enforcement. The question of indemnities, which had serious ramifications, was also a new area to be considered. The problems created by the lack of control by United Nations Force Commanders over individual peace-keeping units had been discussed in previous briefings; this also had to be addressed.

When would the report on Cyprus be issued? asked a correspondent. The Spokesman said he expected it to be released early next week.

Asked for the full schedule of the Secretary-General's trip to Europe, Mr. Sills stated that for a number of reasons, including security, the full schedule would not be released beforehand. Correspondents would be given the schedule as the visit progressed.

A correspondent asked if the renewed fighting in Afghanistan had caused Mahmoud Mestiri, head of the special mission to that country, to cancel his visit. Mr. Sills said that the outbreak of fighting had caused a delay in his planned visit to Afghanistan. Before the mission could make the visit, assurances of safety would be required.
