The security situation in all the sectors and the country continues to be generally calm.

2. RECONCILIATION/REHABILITATION NTR

a: REQUEST BY CIVIL AUTHORITIES:

i: PMT - RUHENGARI PREFECTURE

Visited the Bourgmestre of NKULI Commune who disclosed that about 1,600 returnees have arrived in the Commune from Zaire to be re-settled. However, some of the returnees have got their houses occupied by the 1959-60 group of returnees. Efforts are being made by local authorities to resolve the issue.

In another development the team gathered that 15 detainees in the Commune cell who have been accused of participating in the genocide are being fed by relatives.

ii: PMT - KIBUYE PREFECTURE

CIVPOL Team patrolled BWIKIRA Commune and held discussions with the Headmaster of the EPK (Private) Secondary School. The Headmaster informed the team that there are 61 orphans in the school who are faced with financial problems to settle their fees.

He used the opportunity to appeal to humanitarian agencies to come to their aid.

CIVPOL team conducted patrols to NYABIKENKE Commune prison and reported that 89 inmates of whom most have been accused of taking part in last year's genocide live under poor sanitary conditions as a result of overcrowding in the prison. Human Rights informed.

b: PMT - RUHENGARI PREFECTURE

CIVPOL team visited the Ruhengeri central prison and was informed by the Director of Prisons that there are 1.488 inmates in the prison including 25 females who are detained for various offences including genocide.. The director disclosed further that his office has been able to obtain records on 1.000 inmates out of the total number. On a question about the conditions in the prison, the Director confirmed that the living conditions is pathetic and requires decongestion to avoid increase in death rate. Meanwhile it was reported that 5 of the inmates died during the month of September 1995 as a result of illness. Human Rights informed.

1. GENERAL SECURITY IN THE SECTOR

The security situation in all the sectors and the country continues to be generally calm.

1.1 PMT - KIGALI PREFECTURE

On 7.10.1995 Number P 00077 A/Supt MWENGWE-CHUUMA Andrew left his house for Zambia 'A' house for a visit in KICUKIRO location. At about 1815 hrs on his way to his house within the same locality, he was attacked by a man who called himself as Capt MUSHISHI of Gendarmerie. The attacker wanted to steal a walkie Talkie which was with MWENGWE-CHUUMA. Despite the officer identifying himself by way of a UNID, the attacker hit him on the left eyebrow thereby sustaining a cut and the attacker went away without stealing anything. The matter was reported to both Military Police and Gendarmerie for investigations.

Reported that the authorities of GISHAMVU Commune prison are in need of transport to transfer some of the inmates to NYANZA prison in the same commune in order to de-congest the prison. The Bourgmestre of the Commune when contacted expressed his disappointment of the failure of UN agencies to provide transport to move some of the inmates from the prison.

RWANDAN officials who joined the team were the Director of Cabinet, Ministry of Interior and the Chief of Communal Police. They were met on arrival by the Deputy Commandant of the school who conducted them round the site .
The team expressed satisfaction about progress of work.

Meanwhile, one MUGIRNEZA, a male local has been arrested by RPA and detained at KAGANO cells in connection with the incident.

He used the opportunity to appeal to UNAMIR authorities to assist in mines clearance of the area.

The security situation in all the sectors and the country continues to be generally calm.

2. RECONCILIATION/REHABILITATION

2.1 PMT - KIBUYE PREFECTURE

The Team came across a group of about 500 locals at a meeting which was being addressed by a local security officer. Information had it later that the meeting centered on reconciliation among locals as well as resettlement of returnees in the area.

2.2 PMT - GITARAMA PREFECTURE

Reported that the Prefect of Gitarama has sworn in two Bourgmestres on 3 October 1995 to take charge of Ntongwe and Mugina Communes. The two officers have been introduced to locals in their respective communes and have assumed duty.

ii: CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

a: PMT - KIGALI PREFECTURE

CIVPOL Monitors in Kigali patrolled Gikondo Sector within Kicukiro Commune and visited the Bourgmestre who informed the team that there was a grenade explosion in the area on 2 October 1995 at about 15:00 Hrs which caused the death of 3 children between the ages of 8 and 14.

The incident occurred when one of the children playing on a football field with 8 others unknowingly picked the grenade and threw it hard to the ground. It exploded and injured three of the children causing the death of one on the spot with two others sustaining multiple injuries. They were rushed to the nearest hospital in Kigali but all of them died later. They have since been buried on 3 October 1995.

The Bourgmestre further disclosed that the grenade might be one of the left overs during last year's genocide.

A: PRISONS:

i: PMT - GITARAMA PREFECTURE

The team reported that the overcrowding situation of Ntongwe Commune detention camp has resulted in unhygienic conditions which if unchecked will cause disease and death among the prisoners.

312 locals have been detained in the camp at the time of the visit. Human Rights to be informed.

ii: PMT - CYANGUGU PREFECTURE

CIVPOL reported that during their visit to Kirambo Commune detention camp some of the inmates hinted to the team that one of them is suffering from Tuberculosis disease and needed to be isolated to help alleviate other inmates from getting the disease. The report further states that prison authorities and RPA guards have ignored the advice given by medical authorities to do so. The inmates have therefore requested for UNAMIR's intervention in this regard.

iii: PMT - BUTARE PREFECTURE

The team conducted patrols to Kigembe Commune and visited the Commune prison. 92 locals were detained in custody. Enquires were made from the Bourgmestre to know their offences revealed that they have all been accused of having participated in last year's genocide. He further informed the team that the prison is overcrowded with poor sanitary condition.

iv: PMT - GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

Visited Rwamiko Commune and reported that 85 locals have been detained in a small prison and under very horrible sanitary condition. Human Rights informed.

v: PMT - GISENYI PREFECTURE

Visited the Gisenyi prison and reported that there were 1,340 locals in the prison. The Director of the Prison complained of lack of water, food and poor sanitary conditions.

B: GENDARMERIE:

PMT - GISENYI PREFECTURE

The Team visited Gisenyi Gendarmerie Commander to avail members of the team with their operational performances. The Commander disclosed that the total strength of the three gendarmerie Brigades in the prefecture is 27 which he described as inadequate to cope with crime situation in the area. He also commented that the gendarmerie in the area is in dire need logistic support.

C: HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES:

PMT - KIBUYE PREFECTURE

CIVPOL Team patrolled Mabanza Commune where a local church elder complained about incessant harassment and arbitrary arrests of Hutu returnees by RPA for unknown reasons. The local appealed to UNAMIR to help solve the problem.

The team reported the launching of Major General Fred RWIGYEMA's FOUNDATION on 29.09.1995 after a two-day Cabinet Meeting, presided over by the president of Rwanda. The foundation the team further reported, will serve as a springboard from which PEACE, UNITY and DEMOCRACY shall thrive in Rwanda. During the launching, the president of Rwanda was quoted as saying that the commitment of Gen. Fred RWIGYEMA to the entire Rwanda Population's well-being was total, as a result the president appeals to all sections of Rwanda Community to reciprocate RWIGYEMA, so that the late General's aspirations for Rwanda is not moribund, for it was for this aspiration he paid the supreme price of death on the 2nd of october 1990. A weeklong mourning in memory of the late Gen will culminate in a State Burial Ceremony on the 1. october 1995.

As part of the fall out of the Cabinet meeting, was the appointment of substantive Bourgmestres for almost all the Communes of Rwanda. The new Bourgmestres according to the team will be sworn in on 3.10.1995 by the prefects of the 11 prefectures in the country.

Theme: Rehabilitation

In another development the team conducted patrols of KANZENZE Subprefecture and reported that a meeting on how best to go about the resettlement of returnees in the prefecture was held under the chairmanship of the subprefect. In attendance were Bourgmestres of MBONGO, MUGAMBAZI, MUSASA AND NGENDA Communes, including representative of ICRC and UNHCR.

b: PMT - GIKONGORO PREFECTURE Theme: Prison

The team after a visit to Gikongoro prison reported that the penitentiary is overcrowded and plagued with sanitation problems. This poor sanitation according to the team, led to an outbreak of Malaria, Tuberculosis and Asthmatic epidemic, following which 60 inmates are reported to have been taken to medical centers around Gikongoro for Asthmatic treatment. The team further disclosed, that the conditions of the inmates, who are mostly of Hutu and Twa ethnics, call for urgent medical attention, otherwise death toll in Gikongoro prison will sky-rocket.

c: PMT - CYANGUGU PREFECTURE Theme: Humanitarian

The team conducted patrols of GISUMA Commune and reported the presence of 1,617 orphans requiring humanitarian assistance, preferably through the establishment of an orphanage in the Commune in view of their present living conditions.

d: PMT - KIBUYE PREFECTURE Theme: Human Rights abuses

The team reported that locals in RWAMATAMU and BWAKIRA Communes have accused RPA of ethnic cleansing following the latter's unabated killings of Hutu returnees and threat of military reprisals against suspected supporters of FRGF inside Rwanda.

The report further revealed that a number of locals have emigrated while others went into hiding due to incessant harassment, torture and arrests of locals accused by Tutsi returnees of complicity in last year's genocide.

The victim who is currently on admission at SHK-Hospital in Kigali, is reported to be in critical condition. Expatiating further, the brigade Commander said his station has received similar reports of mines explosions and therefore appealed to UNAMIR authorities to assist in mines clearance of the area.

Theme: Death of UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer

The remains of the late Capt FADIALA SEKOU TOURE, of CIVPOL will be flown to BAMAKO-MALI today at 1000 hrs, via Nairobi/Kenya.

b: PMT - CYANGUGU PREFECTURE Theme: Human Rights abuses

The team reported the ongoing feud between the RPA and some Bourgmestres in the prefecture, notably those of GATARE, KIRAMBO, KAGANO, GAPENZO, GISUMA, BUGARAMA and KARENTERA Communes, following the formers usurpation of the judicial responsibilities of the aforementioned Bourgmestres, to wit arrests and detention of persons suspected of genocide.

The report further revealed that the affected Bourgmestres and IPJs have lodged their protest with the prefect of Cyangugu, stressing that they will no longer condone detention of persons arrested without dossiers and reference to their offices.

In a related development the team reported the discovery of a covert detention centre in KARENTERA Commune, where unspecified number of persons are detained by RPA without the knowledge of local judicial authorities having original jurisdiction.

The report further stated that the local villagers living near the detention centre, disclosed hearing gunshots, wailing and yearnings of inmates under going torture and other inhumane treatment. In the early hours of 18.09.1995, RPA summoned the family of one of the inmates who passed away to remove his remains for burial without delay. The bereaved family who complied later reported the incident to the IPJ in the commune. The RPA personnel in charge of the covert detention centre, are said to have come from BUSHENGE military camp, near Cyangugu. Human Rights informed.

c: PMT - GITARAMA PREFECTURE Theme: Prison

The team conducted patrols of RUNDA Commune and reported the detention of 202 persons suspected of genocide including a woman with eight months old pregnancy. The detention centre is reported to be lacking in basic subsistence including medical.

In another development the team reported the official handing over of a refurbished electric generator by UNAMIR to the bourgmestre of TABA Commune, who expressed his great appreciation and thanks to UNAMIR for its wonderful contributions in the normalisation of Rwanda.

Capt FADIALA SEKOU TOURE from Mali

CIVPOL Regrets to confirm the untimely Death of one of its Observers Captain FADIALA SEKOU TOURE from Mali which sad event took place on 27.09.1995 at about 2300 Hrs. Until Captain SEKO Toure's Death, he was one of the CIVPOL Observers conducting the training of Gendarmes at the national Gendarmerie Training School in Ruhengeri.

b: PMT - KIGALI PREFECTURE Theme: Rehabilitation

The team conducted patrols of RUBUNGO Commune and reported that the bourgmestre has appealed to UNAMIR to assist a number of 1959 returnees who are now displaced following the return of 1994 refugees. It will be recalled that the 1959 refugees who came earlier moved into abandoned houses belonging to 1994 refugees in the Commune. Construction of temporary housing structures according to the Bourgmestre, will go a long way in helping the 1959 returnees.

c: PMT - GITARAMA PREFECTURE Theme: Arrests / Detention

The team conducted patrols of MUSANGO and MURAMA Communes. In MUSANGO Commune the team reported the incarceration of 205 genocide suspects in a makeshift prison, while noting that not less than 12 returnees have so far been arrested this september.

Sanitation is said to be awful while inmates have little or nothing to feed on, on a daily basis. Human Rights and ICRC informed.

In a similar development, the team conducted patrols of NTANGIWE, TAMBWE and KIGOMA Communes and reported that 310, 138 persons, all genocide suspects are detained in NYANGWE and TAMBWE Communes prisons, while 6,408 inmates are in Gitarama prison.

The penitentiaries is said to be plagued with food and sanitation problems.

d: PMT - CYANGUGU PREFECTURE Theme: Prison Expansion

The team reported the working visit of a committee comprising representatives of Rwanda Ministry of Justice, Dutch

government, UNREO, UNDP, HRFOR - Prison unit to Cyangugu central prison, where they held discussions centred on the possible expansion of the prison facility with the director of the project.

Also in attendance were representatives of the inmates and IRC coordinator.

The team further reported, that HRFOR donated unspecified number of motorbikes to IPJs in Cyangugu prefecture through the minister of justice to facilitate their easy movements while conducting investigations into cases of persons detained, as absence of dossiers has contributed in no small measure to the problem of overcrowding in Rwanda prisons.

In another development the team conducted patrols of KARENGERA Commune and reported that RPA on 19.09.1995 subjected two locals to summary deprivation of their lives for allegedly breaking the dusk to dawn curfew imposed on the Commune.

The team reported a wave of arbitrary arrests and detention of locals suspected of genocide by RPA in a makeshift prison in Rwamagana, despite the problems of sanitation, food and overcrowding associated with the detention centre.

The team visited Ruhengeri prison and reported that the facility with a capacity for 1000 inmates, now have 1456 genocide suspects detained therein. The prison according to the team is now overcrowded with 456 inmates living in deplorable and inhumane conditions. Feeding is reported to be very irregular and poor in nature when provided.

b: PMT - KIBUYE PREFECTURE Theme: Arrest

The team conducted patrols of RUTSIRO Commune and reported the arrest of 16 locals among the returnees on grounds of having taken part in last year's genocide. The suspects are now detained in a makeshift prison in RUGARAMBIRO Sector of the commune.

The team further reported a wave of arbitrary arrests in the Commune By RPA and Gendarmerie and this development has driven locals particularly the Hutus into hiding.

c: PMT - KIGALI PREFECTURE Theme: Roadblock

The team conducted patrols of Kigali City and reported that the Road blocks erected at vantage points during the week have been dismantled.

Theme: GENDARMERIE

The team conducted patrols of Kigali urban and visited MUHIMA Gendarmerie brigade in charge of the city center and reported that the Brigade Commander disclosed that there is high rate of stealing and robbery cases in Kigali. The Commander blamed the situation on poor manpower state and logistics constraints, which according to him affects the Gendarmerie's ability to respond to distress calls. He however appeals to UNAMIR for logistic support.

d: PMT - CYANGUGU PREFECTURE

The team after a visit to NYAGATARE Transit camp, reported that the condition for use of the newly constructed NYARUSHISHI Transit camp of allowing in refugees only when

NYAGATARE Transit camp is full, is causing untold hardships for Rwanda Refugees in NYAGATARE in Rwanda and KASHUSHA and INERA Camps in Zaire.

The team further reported that those Rwanda bound refugees in Zaire cannot return home due to overcrowding of NYAGATARE Transit Camp. This situation is causing UNHCR a lot of problems in view of the scarce basic facilities in the camp. The problem created by the refusal of local authorities to allow the use of NYARUSHISHI Transit Camp, should be resolved as quickly as possible if the repatriation of refugees is to continue unhindered the team concluded. It will be recalled that CIVPOL had earlier reported that the prefect of Kibuye insist on having documented particulars of refugees from Kibuye Prefecture, well in advance before allowing resettlement and this has contributed to this situation at NYANGATARE Transit Camp; as a result Kibuye bound refugees can not be resettled without Kibuye prefect go ahead order.

The team conducted patrols of the border posts and reported that at UVIRA border post 11 refugees crossed into Rwanda from Zaire without UNHCR assistance. The refugees proceeded on foot to BUGARAMA site where they are awaiting transportation to NYAGATARE Transit camp.

The team also reported that UNHCR is constructing a new transit camp at NYARUSHISHI about 8 km from NYANGATARE transit camp in anticipation of a large influx of refugees after the visit of the UNITED NATIONS High Commissioner for Refugees at BUKAVU Zaire.

OPENING REMARKS.

The meeting was called to order by the chairman, Col. C.O. Diarra CIVPOL Commissioner at 09:40hrs. He welcomed all present and informed the meeting that the security council has reviewed our mandate in RWANDA under resolution number 996 of 9th June, 1995.

He further explained that the revised mandate focuses on assisting in the rationalisation and stabilisation of the country. Thus our role will be mainly monitoring and training of Gendarmes and communal police.

In conclusion he mentioned that at the moment the recognised strength of CIVPOL is the present manpower on the ground and not the establishment figure of 120 officers.

REVIEW OF PREVIOUS MEETING

After making several amendments, the chairman observed that there were so many mistakes in the minutes. He therefore, directed that henceforth written reports be reproduced as presented by each head of division/CPMT to minimize errors.


CONTROL OF TASKS

- 1. The Administrative Assistant has been directed to appoint a clerk to be responsible for immediate typing of minutes;*
- 2. The secretary to ensure minutes are compiled promptly;*
- 3. Welfare Committee to hold meeting and submit proposals to the commissioner of police;*
- 4. CPMTs must ensure that daily sitreps are sent on time through their duty officers;*
- 5. All hand and mobile sets to be reprogrammed, starting from today.*

REPORTS FROM CPMTs AND HEADS OF DIVISIONS

CPMT - KIGALI PREFECTURE

The CPMT reported that the general situation in the area remains calm. Though armed robbery and other acts of banditry continued unabated with the international



community having the highest number of victims. Thus, the local security agencies have increased patrols and cordon and search exercises as part of internal security measure aimed at regulating the activities of undesirable elements.

He reported a noticeable increase in commercial activities. As a result of this healthy development, the central bank of Rwanda gave approval for the re-opening of two commercial banks, namely A.C.B. and Rwandese Bank for Development, Commerce and Industries.

Also during the period under review, the team monitored the return and re-settlement of 28,681 refugees/IDPs in the prefecture. Most of the refugees were from UGANDA, KENYA, TANZANIA, BURUNDI and ZAIRE.

A visit was also paid to Kigali Prison and discovered about 10,000 inmates mostly male adults, women and children suspected of participating in genocide, yet the prison has a capacity of accommodating 2000 detainees. Their present situation has been most pathetic and degrading.

In another development the team reported the visit of former Tanzania President Dr. Julius NYERERE and the discussions held with Rwandese authorities in connection with Arusha Peace-Agreement and possible reopening of diplomatic relations between the two countries.

The team also reported the circulation of counterfeit notes of 5000 Fr denomination which was alleged to have originated from Zaire.

In conclusion, the team reported that the general situation has continued to be quiet.

CPMT - GISENYI PREFECTURE

The CPMT revealed that the general situation is calm but tense in view of the constant infiltration of the INTERAHAMWE, incident of shooting and mine explosion in the area. He reported that on 8/06/95 in Rwerere Commune (very close to the Zairian border) a man was shot by RPA on patrol.

Also on 08/06/95 at about 15:30 Hrs there was mine explosion near TUNBATT HQ at Mutura. No injury to humans or damage to property was recorded.

He also reported that on the night of 7th June, 1995 armed bandits suspected to be INTERAHAMWE numbering between fifteen and thirty attacked Buzuta Cellule in Rubavu commune where they killed one local and injured several others after robbing them of their valuables.

Again, on the night of 8th June, 1995 at Kinyanzovu Sector in Rwerere Commune

there was an exchange of fire between suspected INTERAHAMWE and RPA. One RPA soldier was killed and another wounded by grenade splinters. The following morning of 9/6/95 a woman suspected to be an accomplice was arrested and when she attempted to escape, she was shot by the RPA. A local who was in the house was injured by stray bullets in the stomach and back.

Furthermore, on 24/6/95 locals of KINUNU Sector, KAYOVE Commune reported to the RPA platoon in the commune the discovering at the commune shore of the KIVU lake a boat with hand-grenades and mine. On the receipt of the information, the RPA cordoned and searched the area. Ten men suspected to be INTERAHAMWE were found in the forest. Two of the suspects were killed, others escaped, but were later arrested at MUTURA.

In another instance, on 01/7/95 at about 2:30hrs there was an explosion at Gisenyi Electrogaz and two night watch men were met macheted to death by unknown person or persons. By some conjectures, the authors of the barbaric act were alleged to have unsuccessfully attempted to destroy the Power station.

PMT-GITARAMA PREFECTURE

The CPMT reported that the general security situation is calm, compared against the previous month, especially in connection with safety of UNAMIR Property. That between the 1st June and 13th June, 1995, the sector lost 3 UNAMIR vehicles to armed bandits suspected to be RPA. The vehicles were assigned to MILOBS, MALICOY and Human Rights respectively.

It was further mentioned that the communes are witnessing increase in banditry activities especially at Masango and Murama where armed bandits suspected to be elements of FRGF cross the river Mwogo and perpetrate their nefarious activities. However, RPA soldiers have intensified patrols of the area.

Also the team revealed that at KAYENZI Commune dispensary about 500 children are suffering from malnutrition and they need serious care and attention urgently.

Also on 26/6/95 the team in conjunction with human rights assisted in the delivery and distribution of relief materials to orphans at Rugalika Sector in Runda Commune.

Furthermore, on 29/6/95 at about 01:00hrs 4 prisoners who were alleged to have attempted to escape from custody were shot dead by RPA soldiers on guard. Three other inmates sustained injuries and are presently on admission at Kabgayi hospital.

PMT-GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

The Ag CPMT reported that the situation in the prefecture has been very calm, except in some communes where acts of banditry are on the increase. The ugly acts are committed by men in military uniform suspected to be RPA. Thus, the victims of the offence are afraid of reporting the happenings to the gendarmerie brigade.

Again, about two weeks ago, in MATA Sector, some armed bandits suspected to be RPA in both military uniforms and civil dress raided the area and robbed locals of their cows, money and motor bikes. During the horrible exercise, one local called HABIMANA tried to run away and was shot dead and his corpse has not been recovered.

He also mentioned that ZAMBATT is pulling out to be replaced by MALICOY.

Finally, the CPMT requested for a computer to alleviate the cumbersome exercise of sending handwritten correspondences.

PMT- BUTARE PREFECTURE

The CPMT reported that during the period under review, the team in conjunction with MILOBS escorted relief materials to Nyabisindu, Nyakizu, Muganza, Ntyazo Communes.

The team also conducted recce along the communes bordering BURUNDI with a view to monitoring the movement of refugees.

He observed an increase in cases of car snatching and robberies targeted mainly at NGOS.

The team also monitored the visit of former Tanzanian President Dr. Julius Nyerere to the prefecture.

He concluded by saying that the situation remains calm.

CPMT-KIBUYE PREFECTURE

The CPMT reported that the general situation in the area remains calm and banditry activities along the coast have decreased considerably.

However during the period under review, the team monitored the return and resettlement of 344 IDPS from KIBEHO Camp. It also undertook series of joint patrols with MILOBS, and discovered in one of the exercises that at KINANIRA primary school in Rwamatamu commune, a teacher and several pupils were accused in connection with genocide.

He reported that on 17/6/95 at about 23:30hrs, two members of personnel of SWISS Disaster Relief were robbed a few meters from their residence by two armed men in military uniform suspected to be RPA. During the brief encounter a two door Toyota, Red in colour n° IT.6464, the sum of 160,000 Fr and a German International Passport were snatched. Though the vehicle was later found and brought to the relief organisation, the recovery was not unconnected with the fact that the coordinator of the Swiss Disaster met the Prefect and threatened to withdraw all their services if the vehicle was not found.

The team further monitored the distribution of food in the Prefecture by World Food Programme.

Finally the return of 1824 refugees of 1959/60 was monitored in the prefecture.

PMT - CYANGUGU

The CPMT reported that the situation remains relatively calm compared against previous month. And that banditry activities have remarkably decreased.

He also mentioned that during the period under review, a total of two hundred and sixty one refugees were registered by UNHCR crossing to Rwanda from the neighbouring countries bordering Cyangugu Prefecture, 254 refugees came from Zaire while only 07 came from Burundi.

The team also visited the prison and found about 2000 detainees. The ICRC is giving tremendous assistance in the feeding and sanitary well being of the inmates.

Also during the period, the prefecture witnessed the visit of the US Ambassador and President of the Republic of Rwanda. The President after addressing the locals in Kamembe Stadium, answered questions from the audience bordering on indefinite and indiscriminate arrest of persons by RPA.

Lastly, he reported that workers of CIMERWA at Bugarama embarked on an industrial action agitating for salary increase. However after a negotiated settlement, the action was called-off.

PMT - RUHENGARI

The CPMT revealed that during the period under review, the security situation was relatively calm. And that numerous combined patrols with MILOBS and Human Rights were carried out. During the exercises, it was discovered that NDUSU, BUTARO and GATONDE communes were faced with the problem of scarcity of land for returnees' settlement.

He mentioned that on 1st July, 1995, the CIVPOL Commissioner and three UNDP officials visited Ruhengeri Training School with a view to assessing the volume of repairs and redecoration required in the area building.

He reported a serious increase in both commercial and social activities in the area, and that according to immigration records the number of returnees crossing Cyanika border have reduced.

FHQ LIAISON OFFICER

He reported that relations with other UNAMIR components have been most cordial. However there were series of complaints that CIVPOL requests are not forwarded well in advance to give room for proper preparations. It is advised that requests be submitted in good time to avoid unnecessary pit falls.

Also UNAMIR has renewed its contract with Kigali Sportif and Sporting facilities are now available for use but bookings have to be done in advance. Also, included in the recreation centre is Saturday night club for all interested UNAMIR staff.

CP PERSONNEL

The CPPO informed the meeting that there has been an improvement in the completion and forwarding of personnel forms and other official UNAMIR documents. But some officers are yet to submit their completed forms. It is imperative that attendance forms are forwarded promptly.

He also informed the meeting that the Medal Parade of the German CIVPOL contingent was coming up tomorrow 4/7/95 at the German Ambassador's residence, Kigali. Thus the Germans will wait to undertake and complete necessary formalities towards their repatriation on 17/7/95 thereafter.

CPLOGO

He informed the gathering that he attended a meeting on relocation of CIVPOL HQ, to TRAFIPRO and thereafter submitted CIVPOL agenda and a brief after the meeting.

He reported that the entire administrative block requested for has been allocated to us and it will conveniently accommodate all the CIVPOL components. He informed the meeting that a CHECK-OUT procedure proforma has been sent to all head of divisions/CPMTs for the guidance of all personnel. He pointed that the procedure became necessary to ensure that nobody leaves the country without properly handing over all UN equipments issued to him/her. He gave a case of Maj. Diakite as an example, who after completing his tour of duty left with hand motorola and its charger.

He also said that a civilian driver has been redeployed here to help minimize our problems of running around.

He mentioned that vehicles for transportation of recruits to Ruhengeri TS have been secured and the exercise was commencing today 3rd July, 1995.

CPOO

He reported that during the period under review, there has been a great improvement in the sending of daily sitreps by all CPMTs, but however reiterated the need to send sitreps on time.


He informed the meeting that it has been directed that all radio sets are to be re-programmed by the communication department and the exercise has commenced today 31/7/95 with Kigali. Therefore all personnel must ensure immediate compliance.

Furthermore, with regards to manning our base station, all duty officers are further reminded to be conscious of their responsibilities. Leaving the duty post will no longer be tolerated. Also voice procedure on the use of VHF radio must be observed.

CPIO

He reported that during the period under review the unit did not have many cases, but however they were still working very hard on pending investigation.

The Commissioner, in his comment observed that there had been a lot of areas requiring police investigation, but it was rather unfortunate that their performance has left much to be desired.



CLOSING REMARKS

At this juncture, the chairman informed the gathering that new redeployment of personnel was in the offing and that closed down PMTs, that is, Byumba and Kibungo will be re-opened in the ongoing dispensation. Therefore, he advised all CPMTs to remain behind for the collection of the new order tomorrow 4/7/95.

Furthermore, he mentioned that the number of personnel in each PMT and divisions will be trimmed down in view of the fact that all french speaking officers will be posted as instructors to National Gendarmerie Training School, Ruhengeri. That the training of about 500 recruits will commence soonest and the cost of the whole project is being borne by the UNDP.

In another instance, he highlighted the need of having an efficient welfare committee. He charged the present committee with a shortcoming in terms of inactivity. And as a result of this, their impact has not been felt. He charged them to hold a meeting and submit proposals without delay.

OTHER MATTERS

The issue of the Training School sending their own independent sitrep or otherwise was discussed intensively and it was resolved that all information be given to PMT Ruhengeri who would in turn include same in his daily sitrep.

Again, CPLOGO pointed out that since there are English Speaking recruits and the use of interpreters in imparting knowledge has not been without serious intricacies, he suggested re-deploying English Speaking Officers as trainers with a view to solving the problem. The suggestion was unanimously applauded. The chairman welcomed the idea and instantly showed good intention to employ the opinion to accomplish best result.

The meeting closed at 1300 hrs.
