INTER OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: HAC TASKS FOR INCLUSION IN OPO 21

Reference : Operation Order No 20 dated 6 Oct 94

1. The HAC has been approached by G3 Plans to confirm that the tasks assigned to the cell under OpO 20 are still valid for inclusion in an OpO 21 which will be produced in the near future. The humanitarian situation in Rwanda continues to improve. UNREO has been co-ordinating humanitarian assistance in the country for the past six months and the requirement for close assistance from the HAC has progressively diminished over time. The same can be said for UN and NGO agencies. As their confidence with the situation improved and their logistic capabilities increased, the requests to the cell have reduced considerably.

2. To produce a modified series of tasks for the new OpO a study will be presented on each of the presently assigned tasks under OpO 20. The tasks are as follows:

- a. Brief the FC on humanitarian assistance operations in RWANDA.
- b. Provide advice to the Plans Cell of UNAMIR concerning UNAMIR operations in support of humanitarian assistance.
- c. Assist UNREO/UNDP in coordinating the activities of UN and NGO agencies operating in RWANDA.
- d. Conduct humanitarian relief assessment recce throughout sectors as required.
- e. Arrange for the security aspects of humanitarian organizations conducting relief operations in RWANDA in close liaison with UNAMIR Ops Branch.
- f. Collate data from sectors pertaining to humanitarian matters.
- g. Maintain current data on displaced persons and refugees.
- h. Disseminate information concerning human rights abuses to UN human rights rapporteurs.
- i. Arrange for the necessary administration for the handover of PWs to the Rwandan authorities to include the presence of ICRC officials.
- j. Effect close liaison with UN and NGO agencies.

8. Collate data from sectors pertaining to humanitarian matters. This remains a valid task and should appear fourth in the OpO. The task should be re-written as follows:

" Collate data from sector humanitarian representatives and produce a weekly humanitarian report "

9. Maintain current data on displaced persons and refugees. This remains a valid task, however UNREO now has the most current information on IDPs and refugees inside and outside Rwanda. This task should be re-written as follows:

" Maintain current data on displaced persons and refugees as reported by UNREO "

10. Disseminate information concerning human rights abuses to UN human rights rapporteurs. It is not felt that this remains a valid task as all UNAMIR sub-elements are doing this via the UNAMIR LO. This task is more relevant to the sectors than the HAC.

11. Arrange for the necessary administration for the handover of PWs to the Rwandan authorities to include the presence of ICRC officials. This task is no longer relevant as their remain no combatants inside the country, just bandits who are turned over to the prosecutor via Human Rights representatives. If retained as a task it should be modified to pertain to criminals and be tasked to all sectors.

12. Effect close liaison with UN and NGO agencies. This remains a valid task. No modifications are required.

13. Effect close liaison as required with humanitarian representatives of the Rwandan Government. This remains a valid task. No modifications are required.

14. Assist where possible in locating missing Rwandans and foreign nationals. This task is no longer valid as the ICRC has assumed this responsibility.

15. In Summary the tasks for the HAC in the new OpO should be written as follows:

- a. Brief the FC on humanitarian assistance operations and problems as reported by UNAMIR troops deployed.
- b. Conduct recce operations on humanitarian concerns in all sectors as directed by the FC or as requested by UNAMIR HQ, Sector HQs and UNREO "
- c. Arrange for the security aspects of humanitarian organizations conducting relief operations in RWANDA in close liaison with UNAMIR Ops Branch.
- d. Collate data from sector humanitarian representatives and produce a weekly humanitarian report.

- e. Provide advice to the Plans Cell of UNAMIR concerning UNAMIR operations in support of humanitarian assistance.
- f. When requested, assist UNREO/UNDP in co-ordinating the activities of UN and NGO agencies operating in Rwanda, particularly with regards to liaison with deployed troops and Milobs.
- g. Maintain current data on displaced persons and refugees as reported by UNREO.
- h. Effect close liaison with UN and NGO agencies.
- i. Effect close liaison as required with humanitarian representatives of the Rwandan Government.

WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT FOR PERIOD 19 FEB TO 24 FEB 95

General Situation

1. The humanitarian situation within Rwanda continues to improve. The IDPs in the northern camps in Sector 4A continue to leave under Op RETOUR however the numbers continue to decline. The Op RETOUR IOC predicts that this is due to rumours circulating within the camps concerning RPA operations in home communes. Further, distribution of food in camps and arrests in home communes continue to have the effect of reducing the number of IDPs opting to leave the camps. The overcrowded situation in the jails and prisons in the country continues. W X

HAC ACTIVITIES

2. The Cell performed tasked in support of Op RETOUR. A representative of the cell attended the UNREO weekly general meeting with NGOs. The HAC representative passed on security issues of concern to the representatives.

3. HAC sent a representative to a meeting in GISENYI concerning the possible eruption of volcanoes in Zaire.

4. One patrol was conducted during this period. The patrol followed an IOM convoy transporting IDPs to the communes of KANZENZE and NGENDA. An HAC patrol report will be forwarded to FHQ, UNREO and Sector 2.

Sector 1

5. The senior representative of GOAL Ireland approached HAC concerning a report made by Sector 1 in SITREP dated 13 Feb 95. The report stated that GOAL Ireland had ceased operations in MUKONDO. The representative stated that this is erroneous and wants UNAMIR sitrep to correct the report. Sector 1 is to verify this report and correct same. However, GOAL continues to operate in Sector 1 though the Government is introducing a fee of 1300 FRW for each person. The general concern is that the majority of the patients are too poor to pay this amount.

6. Catholic World Organization is reported to be supplying food to the commune of RUTARE.

7. GOAL is operating two clinics in MUKARENGE commune and CARITAS is operating a clinic in MAYENZA.

8. The commune staff of KINIHIRA commune GR 003187 has asked UNAMIR to support them in providing educational teaching aids and furniture for their schools and commune offices. UNREO and UNICEF are requested to action this request.

9. KIYOMBE commune reported that they require seed distribution and food. UNREO to note.

10. CARE are distributing farm tools and seeds in the area. Sector 1 to liaise with CARE to address seed distribution problem reported at para 9 and the seed distribution problems reported last week in GITI, TUMBA and BYOGA communes. UNREO to note.

11. A judiciary working group was held in BYUMBA and attended by the Prefet, the chief of the Gendarmerie, HA reps and UNMOs.

Sector 2

12. LWF delivered seeds, farming equipment and food at RUKIRA GR 6658.

13. Representatives from the European Community and UNHCR visited the ORC and health centre in RILIMA GR 2561. A food distribution was also observed taking place in the commune.

14. Milobs report that 102 returnees arrived in BARE commune from BURUNDI, 126 arrived in KANZANZE from UGANDA, 162 arrived in SAKE from BURUNDI and 34 returnees arrived in NGENDA from TANZANIA. UNHCR to note.

Sector 3

15. Authorities in MURAMA and MASANGO communes reported to Milobs that they expect further IDPs to return to the commune from IDP camps in Sector 4A. There is a concern that food will be required particularly since ICRC will terminate food delivery in the area. UNREO to note.

16. The FC visited GITARAMA prison on 21 Feb where 7 to 10 inmates are dying daily. FC indicated that this constitutes a humanitarian emergency. Thus, adequate action would be taken in conjunction with agencies to improve the situation.

17. Milobs reported seeing many IDPs in the area of KANYARU-HAUTE returning to their communes on foot. Sector requested to forward approximate numbers if possible. IOC to note.

18. MALICOY assisted the Inspector of Schools with the distribution of school supplies which was conducted over a three day period.

19. MALICOY Med staff vaccinated 4,081 children against measles.

20. Feed the Children were observed distributing relief items in MUGUSA commune GR 8325.

21. Milobs report that most of the schools and clinics in NYAKISU commune are functioning.

Sector 4A

22. World Vision was observed distributing seeds in KARABA.

23. Sector Milobs report that about 600 new IDPs arrive at KIBEHO daily and that many of the males arriving have machetes. Milobs also report that IDPs in RWAMIKO refuse to leave due to fear of RPA harassment in home communes. IOC to note.

Sector 4B

24. Milobs report that there are 80 persons under arrest at MABANZA prison GR 3473. Some are charged with participation in genocide.

Sector 4C

25. ETHIOBATT transported 56 IDPs from RUSUZI 1 (GR 7624) to NYAGATARE transit camp and provided escort to UNHCR transporting 253 IDPs in Sector 4C area.

Sector 5

26. A security assessment of warehouses and NGO installations was conducted by Milobs due to the looting incident on 18 Feb. In addition, increased patrolling by Milobs in support of humanitarian operations is being conducted in the GISENYI area.

Sector 6

27. INBATT patrols distributed educational packages and food to orphans at TARE GR 8910, NYAMUGALI GR 8622, NYARUTUVU GR 7517 and KIGALI.

Op Retour

28. Op RETOUR continued under the direction of the IOC. 1,517 IDPs were moved by vehicle during this reporting period. A total of 39,077 IDPs have been moved since the commencement of the operation.


Medical Assistance

29. UNAMIR Contingent medical personnel treated 2,167 Rwandan citizens.

30. AUSMED treated 279 Rwandan citizens at CHK.

HAC PLANNED ACTIVITIES

31. HAC will continue to provide patrols in support of UNREO and the IOC activities as requested.

WEEKLY HUMANITARIAN REPORT FOR PERIOD 12 FEB TO 18 FEB 95

General Situation

1. The humanitarian situation within Rwanda continues to improve. The IDPs in camps in Sector 4A continue to leave from camps targeted by Op RETOUR however it would appear that many IDPs are moving to KIBEHO and NDAGO camps where food distribution continues. UNREO reports that ICRC will reduce food distribution in camps. Increased arrests continue to be reported in the Sector 3 area. Prisons throughout the country continue to receive new arrivals and are becoming severely overcrowded. A delegation of the Rwandan Parliament visited prisons throughout the country to assess needs.

HAC ACTIVITIES

2. The Cell performed tasks^s in support of Op RETOUR. A representative of the cell attended the UNREO weekly general meeting with NGOs. The HAC representative passed on security issues of concern to the representatives.

3. HAC sent a representative to a meeting in GISENYI concerning the possible eruption of volcanoes in Zaire.

4. One patrol was conducted during this period. The patrol was a joint effort of HAC, UNREO, the IOC Op RETOUR, the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Ministry of Defence. The patrol visited RUNYINYA, MARABA and MBAZI communes. An HAC patrol report will be forwarded to FHQ, UNREO and Sector 3.

Sector 1

5. Milobs report that ADRA has initiated a seed distribution programme at NGARAMA. UNREO to note.

6. GOAL Ireland has ceased assistance to health centre in MUKONDO due to financial constraints.

7. The bourgmestres of GITI GR 234021, TUMBA GR 9614 and BYOGA communes reported to Milobs that the commune requires seed distribution, food and farming equipment. Milobs continuously have such reports from certain communes in Sector 1 area. UNREO requested to liaise with WFP to include communes in present seed distribution operation.

8. HAC spoke with IOM head of mission concerning the requirement for transport assets to assist in the movement of returnees in the Sector 1 area. Head of Mission told HAC that Rwandese Government does not want IOM or UNHCR to conduct this operation at present time. The reason for this would appear to be that the returnees are from 59/60 and are unsure of where to go however this was not confirmed by the Government. IOM head of mission will contact UNHCR to review the matter and re-negotiate with Government to conduct operation in the future.

Sector 2

9. 28 members of the Rwandan Parliament visited the prefecture.

10. Farming tools were distributed to locals in RUKIRA commune GR 6658.

11. GHANBATT transported IDPs and refugees to their homes in the Sector from the ORCs.

Sector 3

12. Milobs in Sector 3 report that the communes of MURE GR 5762 and GAKO GR 9052 require medical assistance and farming tools. The water system in GAKO also requires repairs. UNREO to note.

13. Milobs report that there are 60 abandoned orphans in the area. UNREO requested to liaise with UNICEF.

14. MALAWICOY provided transport to WFP to move food from BUTARE to ROSATINA, NYABISINDU and MUYIRA communes.

Sector 4A

15. MURAMBI IDP camp reported empty of IDPs.

Sector 4B

16. Medical equipment used by FRAFBATT was turned over to the Prefet of KIBUYE.

Sector 4C

17. ETHIOBATT transported 65 IDPs from RUSUZI 1 (GR 7624) to NYAGATARE transit camp and provided escort to UNHCR transporting 336 IDPs in Sector 4C area.

18. Milobs attended a rehabilitation conference with RPA to discuss the return of refugees from ZAIRE.

Sector 5

19. Milobs provided escort for 2 convoys of 208 returnees to their home communes in KABAYE GR 4906 and SATINSYI GR 5900, 2 convoys of 308 returnees to NGORONGERO GR 5995 and one convoy of 560 returnees to their homes in SATINSYI GR 5800.

20. Milobs reported that the Bourgmestre of KARAGO commune GR 4516 reported that 4400 returnees of 59/60 have been resettled in GAKAGARA GR 4921, NANGA GR 4219, RUMBURA GR 4514 and MWIYANIKE GR 4617. UNREO to note.

21. WFP trucks attempting to bring food from GISENYI to GOMA were looted by the local population of GISENYI. UNAMIR and RPA intervened and trucks were evacuated from the scene. RPA shot and killed two of the looters.

22. The IOC was approached to have TUNBATT vehicles involved in Op RETOUR returned to GISENYI to assist WFP in distribution of humanitarian aid. Tac HQ will inform TUNBATT and Milob Sector 5 HQ when trucks are released.

Sector 6

23. INBATT patrol distributed 7 educational packages to TARE GR 8910 and 4 packages to GIKORO commune GR 3786.

24. INBATT repaired the approach road to the NDERA way station, restored the water supply and dug latrines for the IDPs in transit.

Op Retour

25. Op RETOUR continued under the direction of UNREO. 2,154 IDPs were moved by vehicle during this reporting period. A total of 37,560 IDPs have been moved since the commencement of the operation.


Medical Assistance

26. UNAMIR Contingent medical personnel treated 4,790 Rwandan citizens.

27. AUSMED treated 177 Rwandan citizens at CHK.

HAC PLANNED ACTIVITIES

28. Patrols will be sent from KIGALI to the Sector 2 area to assess the Op RETOUR procedures at the home communes. A patrol is also planned to GISENYI. HAC will continue to provide patrols in support of UNREO and the IOC Op RETOUR as requested.

Kigali, February 27, 1995 - President Pasteur Bizimungu of Rwanda on Friday chaired a cabinet meeting in Kigali. On the agenda, the cabinet meeting discussed about the re-opening of the National University of Rwanda, the privatisation of parastatal companies, and the situation of security in the country.

The cabinet decided that the date of the re-opening of the National University of Rwanda would be fixed by the University Council. Because of the many returning students from Anglophone and Francophone countries, the cabinet decided that English and French would be both teaching languages at University.

The cabinet asked the Minister of Justice to publish as soon as possible the list of those responsible for the genocide in Rwanda, and to find ways of freezing the bank accounts of the criminals, and to ban the selling of their property, which should be used to pay compensation to survivors of massacres.

The Rwandese Vice-President and Minister for Defense, Mr. Paul Kagame told the cabinet that security in the country had improved except for continued infiltrations by Interahamwe elements from Zaire, Tanzania, and Burundi.

The cabinet also declared the 8 March 1995, the International Women's Day, a public holiday in Rwanda.

- The Rwandese Foreign Minister, Mr. Anastase Gasana on Friday received in his office for talks, the French Ambassador to Rwanda, Mr. Jacques Courbin, with an invitation from President François Mitterrand to President Pasteur Bizimungu of Rwanda, to participate in the celebrations of the 50th anniversary of the Peace Armistice, in Paris, on 8 May 1995.

The French ambassador also announced that France would support the draft resolution submitted to the UN Security Council by the United States, asking all the UN member Governments to arrest those accused of being responsible for the genocide in Rwanda living in their countries.

- Several pits with thousands of dead bodies, were discovered in the area surrounding Kigali Central Hospital. 400 skeletons were exhumed for reburial, and many more were expected to be exhumed later.


SUBJECT : NEED TO REMAIN ALERT - DUTY OFFICERS







Subject: FORCE COMMANDER VISITS TO UNAMIR FIELD UNITS

1. The attached calendar describes the Force Commander's intentions for UNAMIR Units during the month of March. Visits to Sector and Unit Headquarters continue to prove their worth. In all cases the FC was very pleased with the organization of the visit and the information provided however, MGen Tousignant is very interested in getting a "hands-on" perspective of what the soldier does daily. These next series of visits should focus on the troops and their activities. The following is a suggested format:

- a. short briefing by the sector/unit commander;
- b. observe company and/or troop positions and patrol routes;
- c. working with and dinning with unit soldiers (to be emphasized);
- d. discussions with and visit (where possible) a local NGO operation;
- e. discussions with local and regional authorities to include both military and civilian; and
- f. visit to nearby IDP camp when possible.

2. The duration of the stay will be four to five hours, including flying time. Security details will be finalized in advance but in most cases, one of the FC's vehicle with his Close Protection party will be dispatched to provide local transport. Space limitations within the vehicle will preclude all local dignitaries. Visit coordination should be done with the ADC/FC at extension 11113.

3. This office would also request that copies of any pictures taken during the FC's tour by the Contingent Photographer or others be forwarded to the ADC to the FC. These photos will be used in the preparation of a memento to the FC at a later date.

4. Your help and cooperation in preparing for the next Commander's visit to your location is appreciated. We are looking forward to our next "rendez-vous".





1. In the recent past, there have been a number of incidents which have come to the notice of this HQ, in which the intervention of formed tps was required to save the situation. However, the tps could not react to these situations in an acceptable time frame, as the procedure of reporting an incident which requires the assistance of armed tps, was not laid down.

2. In future, whenever an incident occurs, and the preliminary findings of the MILOBS present on the spot, merit the requirement of armed tps, the MILOB will immediately inform the Sector Comd on radio, who in turn will apprise the local commander of the formed tps. The local comd will then order his tps to react to the situation. In case the situation is beyond his control, he will immediately inform his unit HQ who in turn shall rush reinforcements to the incident site at the earliest.

3. In emergent situations and when communications fail, the local comd will respond to the request of the MILOBS to meet any unforeseen contingencies. It must be appreciated, that if this procedure is not followed, it may result in the situation escalating to such a level that it results in the loss of property and life, which is not acceptable at any cost.

4. MILOB Gp HQ only. You are requested to issue suitable instructions on the above subject to all sector MILOBS at the earliest.

Looting of World Food Program Vehicles

KIGALI, RWANDA -- At approximately 2 p.m., February 18, a convoy of World Food Program (WFP) trucks carrying humanitarian supplies to refugee camp in Goma, Zaire, were stopped near the border at Gisenyi for inspection by border officials. When stopped, a crowd of about 50 people from the Gisenyi area transit camp surrounded the trucks and began looting them. Government troops on the scene in an attempt to control the situation, opened fire on the crowd, killing two people. At this point, the crowd grew to 400-500 people. Three WFP trucks were looted during this incident.

UNAMIR troops were called to assist and three Armoured Personnel Carriers from the Tunisian Battalion in Mutura were dispatched.

The trucks were stopped at the site until the evening, at which point they were allowed to turn back from the border to drive to the security of the Tunisian Battalion compound at Mutura.

On the way to the compound, seven of the trucks were detained until the morning of February 19. The trucks were then released, but on the way to Mutura, were stopped at the Gisenyi area transit camp where looting of these remaining vehicles took place.

"The looting of humanitarian relief supplies is unacceptable," stated Maj.-Gen. Guy Tousignant, UNAMIR Force Commander. "Steps are being taken to determine who hindered the situation by preventing the WFP from withdrawing to a safe location and by delaying the arrival of UN troops on the scene."

Attack On United Nations Position In Mutura

KIGALI, RWANDA -- On February 15, 1995 at approximately 11:55 p.m., the Tunisian Battalion Headquarters at Mutura was fired upon by small arms fire, including 3 rocket propelled grenade (RPG) rounds, for about 30 seconds in a deliberate and unprovoked attack. It is believed that this attack by unknown armed elements was aimed at destroying the signal installation within the camp.

The following morning, February 16, a patrol of Tunisian troops searched the vicinity of the camp to determine the perpetrators of the attack. In the process, a mine suspected of being planted was detonated by the patrol resulting in the injury of 8 Tunisian troops: four seriously, the others moderate and minor. A second mine, also suspected of being planted by the attackers was found and defused.

"This unprovoked attack on a UN position and the injury of the Tunisian soldiers is of great concern to me," stated Maj.-Gen. Guy Tousignant, UNAMIR Force Commander. "We are carefully investigating the incident to determine who is responsible and will take every action to hold them accountable for this incident."

Four of the casualties have been evacuated to Nairobi for treatment. A United Nations Military Police investigation of the attack is in progress.



ACCURACY IN REPORTING

1. Every day one or more units submit reports containing vague details of incidents. These types of reports raise more questions than they answer and necessitates someone chasing down the missing information in an effort to obtain an accurate report of the event.

2. The effort necessary to achieve the required detail can be minimized if duty and/or operations officers at all levels were to answer the following questions when they are preparing and receiving reports:

a. **WHAT** happened: a short accurate description of the incident, usually in the chronological sequence that the incident developed and concluding with what further action will be taken by the various people, unit(s) and agencies involved;

b. **WHERE** did it happen: the location of the incident should be as specific as possible but at a minimum the report must include the name of the closest community and the community's grid reference.

c. **WHEN** did it happen: the time of the incident and any significant action(s) within the incident should be identified preferably with a date/time group (ie 161420 Feb 95)

d. **WHO** was involved: the individual who made the initial report should be identified as well as anyone who was affected by the incident or took an active part in the incident. In identifying people, their full names should be given and any official title, position or rank included. For UN personnel, their UNID number should also be included to aid in identifying these people at a later date if necessary.

e. **WHY**: an explanation of the reason why the incident occurred. In providing this detail the source of the reason should be identified so that its credibility can be assessed. If the reason is unknown then one must be expressed should be stated as such.

3. The UNAMIR Operations Duty Officers will be instructed to critically read all incoming reports against the above questions and to automatically seek clarification where points are unclear or unanswered. This however should be unnecessary if units observe the elements of reporting and remember that brevity should not be at the expense of clarity.

4. If reports continue to be received which do not include the above elements then we will insist on a proforma which provides the necessary details.





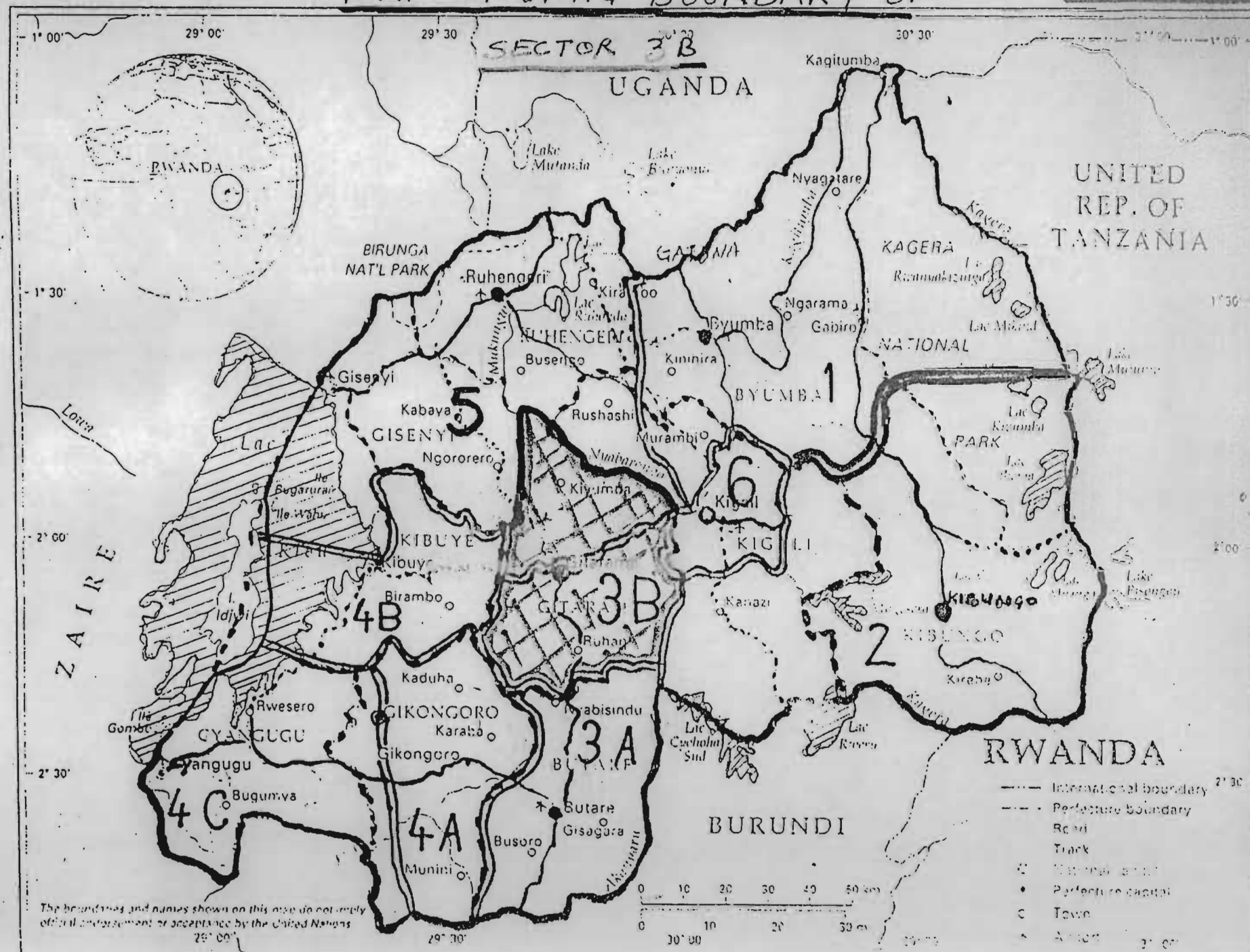

1. The following paid a visit to the Matimba Reception Centre and Kagitumba border outpost on 11 Feb 95, with the aim of giving a follow up report on its present state of affairs.

- a. Lt Col Adjei G K - Sect Cdr
b. Maj Ashish Ghosh - Ops Offr
c. 2 X Milobs - Milob Team

2. **Matimba Reception Centre.** The patrol met Mr Samuel Ndambazhi, who introduced himself as the ADRA monitor for the Matimba Reception Centre. From him and by moving around the camp as well as asking the inmates the following were found out :-

- a. **Dependants.** There were 364 inmates and approx 1000 returnees pass through everyday to collect their food packets provided by WFP.
b. **Food.** The WFP has provided food for the inmates in the form of Beans, Maize Grain, Oil and salt. The problem faced by the inmates was an acute shortage of cooking fuel and also as the food items provided took a long time to cook if faster cooking substitutes could be provided.

c. **Water.** Two bladders have been installed. These were filled once initially a week back. These have not been refilled since then and have been bone dry for the past four days. The inmates have now restarted to use the water from the Akagera river for drinking purposes.

d. **Shelter.** The inmates are housed in four structures around the complex. Two are large tents while others are Shelters erected with other material. Plastic sheeting, cooking utensils are not yet available for the returnees.

e. **Sanitation.** Two trench latrines have been dug within 10 mtrs of the housing Shelters. These need to be redug at a greater distance and hygiene chemicals spread daily.

f. **Medical.** Inoculations were carried out only once and a doctor visited once last week. There have been no further medical aid / activity.

g. **Veterinary** There has been no examination or inoculation of the cattle at the centre so far. Some of the cattle have died recently due to diseases.

3. **Kagitumba Border Outpost.** The patrol met Immigration Officers of both countries.


a. The Ugandan officials have no complaint about the returnee movement. On being asked about pressure being applied by their govt on the Rwandese to return to Rwanda, they said there was no such pressure but only friendly advice given by their President.

b. The Rwandese authorities were extremely cooperative. They requested that as the returnees had to await transportation they needed some sort of night shelter. They informed the patrol that only the cattle accompanied with a certificate of inoculation were being allowed entry into Rwanda. They were providing the daily crossing figures to our teams on a regular basis and no other problems were faced.

4. **Recommendation.** All the recommendations made by the HAC team in the IOM dated 10 Feb 95 are agreed to and must be enforced. However in addition the following are also suggested:-

a. **Transportation.** The arrangement made by the Sector HQ with the Nicoy was for the provisioning of a truck every Monday and Friday for transportation of returnees from the Kagitumba border outpost to Matimba and Nyagatare Reception Centres. This need not be disturbed. The UNHCR and IOM should tackle the movement from the Reception Centres to home communes only.

b. **Veterinary.** A veterinary doctor must visit the camp to examine and carry out inoculations on a regular basis.







OPERATION RETOUR - DAILY SUMMARY 8.2.95

The first foot convoy to be organised under Operation Retour from camp to home commune took place today. The convoy was to originate in Munini camp, pass by Kamana camp collecting more people and end in Nyakizu commune. Total length of trip: about 10 km. Security was provided jointly by the RPA and UNAMIR. Initial reports stated that 250 people had registered to walk home with this convoy: a good number. It is hoped that this convoy will encourage more people to walk home, whether in similar foot convoys or alone.

Rukondo camp was reported to have about 400 people remaining yesterday and was therefore effectively closed; today 100 of these were transported from the camp. Interest in transport from Kibeho, Ndago and Murambi was low. This is not surprising given the recent large movements, both by truck and on foot. No major security incidents have been reported over the recent period.


SUBJECT : REPORTING OF INCIDENTS

1. The importance of timely and accurate passage of information on incidents has been emphasised on several occasions. Despite this the occurrence of lapses seems to be on the increase.

2. It would appear that most of these lapses are laxities on the part of MILOBs. Most sectors report to reporting incidents only in their daily routine SITREPS. This reduces the reaction time of the HQ to any incident and the use to which the information provided can be put. Generally, if there is any doubt about whether or not an incident should be reported, the best course of action is to report it. The judicious use of radio and facsimile facilities provided in all sectors for the quick passage of information should be encouraged.

3. With immediate effect it is directed that all sectors inform this HQ promptly about any incident as soon as practicable. The use of the daily SITREP as the only means of passing information should be terminated. Sectors should however refer to earlier incident reports in their daily SITREPs and provide any additional information available.

CLOSES ITS FIRST CAMP

KIGALI, RWANDA (Jan. 30, 1995) -- Operation "RETOUR" has closed the first internally displaced person camp in south western Rwanda. Cyanika camp, which initially contained over 30 000 displaced Rwandans, was officially closed on Saturday Jan. 28, 1995 as the last Rwandans boarded UN vehicles to begin their journey home with dignity.

The peaceful and gradual closure of this first is a good indication that the normalisation process is well on its way in Rwanda. This is a direct result of the consolidated effort by the United Nations, Non-Government Organisations (NGO) and the Rwandan Government to bring displaced people back to their homes.

Operation "RETOUR" was officially launched in late December 1994 by the Special Representative to the Secretary General for Rwanda, Mr. Shaharyar Khan, after a long, detailed and careful planning process. This consolidated approach aims at offering to hundreds of thousands of displaced Rwandans an alternative to the life in camps. Those who wish to go back home are provided with the basic tools, support and aid which they require to resume a normal life back in their home villages.

UN TROOPS INTERVENE IN BANDIT RAID
IN SOUTH WESTERN RWANDA

KIGALI, RWANDA (Jan. 30, 1995) -- United Nations troops deployed in south western Rwanda intervened in a bandit raid which occurred on Jan. 28 at approximately 3:00 a.m. on the shores of Lake Kivu. During the incident the offenders opened fire and threw a grenade injuring one Blue Beret. In self defence, the UN troops returned fire resulting in the death of one person from Nyamasheke. Two were subsequently captured and the fourth was injured but managed to escape.

In this latest incident four bandits, some of which were wearing military uniforms and equipped with automatic weapons and grenades, raided the Nyamasheke area, stealing cattle and other materials. Locals notified UN troops who immediately gave chase.

"As a result of our recent redeployment of troops to increase presence in areas such as Nyamasheke, UNAMIR was able to quickly respond to this incident and assist the local population", stated Maj.-Gen. Guy Tousignant, Force Commander of UNAMIR.

In the presence of ICRC and UNHCR representatives, the arrestees were turned over to local authorities on Jan. 29 by Ethiopian UN troops. The attack is presently under investigation.

1. While providing escort for Marie José Torres of UNHCR we discovered a disturbing situation.
2. During our visit ^{with} to Chef de Secteur Mr Bulinawi we met a woman Colette Mukankubana who was arriving to report that her husband Oswald Munyangaju and son Nepomuseme had been taken from their field by persons unknown.
3. It was then discovered that in the past two weeks three other men, Mr Karuranga, Mr Mutaboruka and Mr Mutangana were also taken in the same way and haven't been heard of since then.
4. All five of these men are recently returned DPs from Gikongora, and all were working in their fields when taken.
5. It is suspected that all five were taken by the RPA but there are ^{no} witnesses as yet.

SUBJECT: SECURITY AWARENESS OF CURRENT SITUATION

The object of this memorandum is to appraise all staff members of the day to day events within the Mission with a view of creating a sense of security awareness in the hearts and minds of all concern. Therefore it will be in everybody's interest if all security related incidents are promptly reported in writing or even verbally, to the CSO/ASC - Paul Ischlika on Telephone No.11073 - Room No.4061 on the 3rd. floor. The security awareness bulletin will be issue every Monday of the week, providing information on events which occurred during the preceding week.

1. GENERAL:

The overall security situation in Rwanda although it remains relatively calm, is of serious concern. Incidents of hostility in the Refugee camps were reported where Aid Agencies are threatening to pull out because of lack of security protection. The worst incidents were reported on 11, November (i) Musebeya in Kigongoro, in the sector 4A (N) area, where a clash between the RPA and the Displaced people in the DPs camp led to 7 killings, 13 seriously injured, and an unknown number wounded people. (ii) In Musange in Kigongoro, 7 DPs were reported killed and 4 wounded. The situation is however reported to be returning to normalcy.

3. KIGALI:

Although the security situation in Kigali city and its environs remain calm, threats on personnel and hijacking of UNAMIR vehicles have been reported. The following are tit-bits of incidents worth mentioning for the attention of staff members:

- (a) In recent times the RPA has mounted an increased number of Road Blocks and check points around the city particularly at night time. These road blocks are put up in most cases with empty crates, and not lit to be seen from afar. They have also intensified routine foot and mobile patrols around the city.

- (b) A military Convoy bringing Returnees to the city from Gitarama end on 25 October was reported to have hit and killed an old man of 50 years of age, and abandoned the body on the road. The angry relatives have demanded an explanation from UNAMIR. A letter of condolence has been written to the bereaved family, and the matter is under investigation.

This hit-and-run attitude on the part of any personnel is totally unacceptable by any International standard, and as such, cannot be tolerated or condoned. It is more honorable to own up and help resolved the matter amicably, than to leave the person to die with no remorse for human feeling. Please refer to all administrative issuances and the Force directives to conduct yourselves in line with UN regulations at all times.

- (c) On 8, November one International staff was followed in the city by some uniformed RPA soldiers driving in a small Jeep. The Staff member suspecting that he was being followed, made some tactical moves to confirm his suspicion. Realizing that he was actually followed, he headed for his residence. Arriving and finding his main entrance gate closed and in an attempt to alert his inmates to open the gate, he was immediately surrounded by his followers who started to hit at his vehicle with their AK47s in desperation. The staff member did not give up, he continued to hoot his horn while making an emergency call on his radio. He finally bashed the gate and drove in while his attackers drove off. One bayonet and a 9mm round was found which, had apparently fallen off from their weapon while bashing on the vehicle. The time of incident was at 8.30pm.
- (d) On 29, October one UNAMIR International staff in the finance section in Kigiri - Nairobi was mobbed by 8 bandits along the Jomo Kenyatta Avenue around 19.30 hrs. and robbed of everything he had; Cash in Dollars and Kenyan Shillings, Calculator, shoes, spectacles and UNAMIR ID card etc. The incident was reported at the Kilimani Police station but no arrest has so far been made.
- (e) One International staff working for Candy House was attacked and assaulted by Uniformed RPA soldiers on Tuesday night 15, November at about 2145 hrs. The incident took place on a bridge on a side road within walking distance from Kigali Night Club. He was questioned and searched for dollars which he didn't have on him. He was saved by an oncoming vehicle which the attackers saw and fled into the bush. He sustained minor bruises on his face.

- (f) On 29, October one International staff was fined 10,000 Rwandee Francs by the RPA Gendarmerie for Careless driving after impounding the Vehicle UNAMIR 43 for about 10 days. The staff member had to pay before the vehicle could be released.

(g) **HIJACKING OF VEHICLES:**

- (i) On 29, October 1994 one Toyota Land cruiser No.1045 was forcefully hijacked at gun point by Armed RPA soldiers from UNAMIR Military Officer, outside his residence in Kigali city.
- (ii) On 14, November 1994 another 4 Runner Land cruiser No.1088 was hijacked from a staff member of UNAMIR. This took place around 2145 hrs. between the junction of Belgian village and the slope coming to Chez Lando on the main airport road. At gun point he was asked to drive to a remote area where he was given some beatings and asked to get off the vehicle.

This brings the number of hijacked vehicles in two months, to four - 413, 455, (double cab pickups) and, 1045 and 1088 (4 Runner LandCruisers), besides 1016 that was hijacked on 15, October and was recovered by the RPA and returned to UNAMIR on 19 October 1994.

5. A UNAMIR Military Police Company has been established and is now operational. The military police office is located 500 meters East of the old UNICEF Building on the main Airport road, opposite the Nobiscum Restaurant.

Major J.G. Plante is the FORCE PROVOST MARSHAL, and the Detachment operates on channel 7, call sign " GOLF HOTEL ZERO. " You can contact the MP Desk Officer on telephone # 86855 and the FPM on Telephone # 86856. All accident cases should be reported to the FPM and a copy sent to the CSO/ASC.

SECURITY GUIDELINES:

- (i) Carry your ID card with you at all times. If you are issued with a Motorola Radio, you are advised to carry it with you as well.

- (ii) Avoid going out on your own and staying out too late at night. It is advisable that you go out in groups of two or more, and where possible, go in convoys of two or more vehicles.
- (iii) Avoid driving at night in remote and isolated areas in the city. Know safe streets and routes.
- (iv) Avoid using local taxis and privately owned cars particularly at night time, except if you know the private car owner. Should you be forced to use a local taxi, you must always be in the company of somebody you know and trust too well. Relying on Registration number plates of taxis is not enough.
- (v) Should you be attacked, you should always try to be calm and firm, and courteous. Never show signs of stress and intimidation, even though you may feel intimidated.
- (vi) Avoid all forms of arguments with your attackers even where you have your right.
- (vii) It is always in your best interest to yield to the demands of your attackers and where possible establish some kind of rapport with them.
- (viii) Stop only at established road blocks/check points, and avoid giving lifts to non UN personnel. Do not stop at hand signals of any kind at night, especially in suspicious circumstances and areas.
- (ix) Should you be trailed at night, avoid heading for your residence especially if it is a distance away from you. You should always try to head for Public houses specially HQ where there is crowd and call for help on your radio describing your exact location.
- (x) Above all, please do not discard "COMMON SENSE" as it will assist you to appreciate the situation on the ground, make sensible deductions and take decisions in your best interest. REMEMBER YOUR LIFE COMES FIRST, AND THEREAFTER, ALL OTHER THINGS SHALL BE ADDED UNTO YOU.
