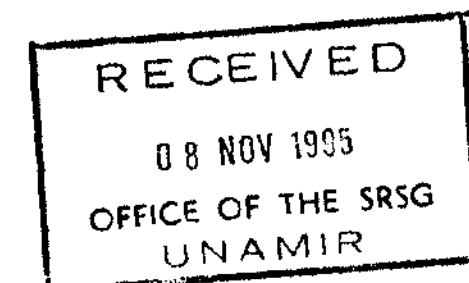

DAILY SITREP FOR 07 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 87. 80 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 07 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW - NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS INFLOW - 24358 AND OUTFLOW - 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS ON THE MANDATE AND DISCUSSED ISSUES OF MUTUAL CONCERN.

B. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE VISITING NORWEGIAN DELEGATION MET WITH THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING THE REFUGEES, REHABILITATION OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM, FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR AS WELL AS INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA.

C. LATER, THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING TO HEADS OF MISSIONS AND AGENCIES ON THE CURRENT DEVELOPMENTS AND SITUATION WITH REGARD TO THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR.

D. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA REPORT OF TUESDAY, 7 NOVEMBER, THE RWANDESE PRESS CELEBRATED THE AFRICAN INFORMATION DAY AND RECALLED THE ROLE PLAYED BY THE MEDIA IN PREPARING AND IMPLEMENTING THE GENOCIDE. THE PRESS RESOLVED TO SHUN DISSEMINATING ETHNIC HATRED AND TREAT JOURNALISM OBJECTIVELY, TO BUILD A NEW RWANDA.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) RPA CHECKPOINT NEAR SAKE GS 4655 HAS BEEN REMOVED AS THE SITUATION IS CONSIDERED CALM.

(2) THE RWINKWAVU HOSPITAL GS 6883 WHICH WAS RUN BY MEDICOS EN CATASTROPHE HAS BEEN TAKEN OVER BY RPA TO BE CONVERTED INTO A MILITARY HOSPITAL. ALL FOREIGNERS AND LOCAL WORKERS HAVE ALREADY STOPPED WORK AND WILL LEAVE FOR KIGALI ON 13 NOVEMBER, 1995.

(3) . IN SECT 5B GISENYI, RPA CONFIRMED HAVING CONDUCTED AN AMPHIBIOUS OP IN IWANA ISLAND ON 05 NOV 95. THE ISLAND WAS USED BY THE EX-FAR AS A TRAINING CENTER AND WAS SUPPOSED TO HAVE OVER 500 SOLDIERS. THE OPS WAS SUCCESSFULL. MILOB SECT COMD VIEWED 07 DEAD AND 15 EX-FAR PRISONNERS AND COUNTED THE FOLLOWING CAPTURED WEAPONS:

- 1 X 75 MM RECOILLESS RIFLE (US);
- 3 x 12.7 HMG COMPLETE WITH TRIPOD AND 2 X 11.5 HMG.
- 3 X LMG,S (FN)
- 15 ASSORTED RIFLES IN WORKABLE COMDITION.
- A NUMBER OF RIFLES OF VARIOUS TYPES IN VARIOUS STATES OF REPAIR AND ASSEMBLY.
- TWO POTATO SACKS OF TNT BLOCKS, APPROX 1/4KG EACH AND IN A STATE OF DETERIORATION.
- 2 X ROLLS OF CORDEX DET CORD.
- NUMEROUS RIFLE PARTS IN THEIR ORIGINAL CONTAINERS/PACKAGING AND
- 6 X ATK MINE CARRIERS WITH INSTRUCTIONS WRITTEN IN ENGLISH.

THE SECT COMDR REPORTED THAT HE WAS TOLD BY AN RPA OFF THAT 141 FRGF WERE KILLED, 05 RPA KILLED AND 13 WOUNDED.

(4) . ON 06 NOV 95, AT ABOUT 1000 HRS, AT NSHILI COMMUNE, IN SECT 3A, AN RPA SOLDIER SHOT RANDOMLY, KILLED 15 PERSONS AND WOUNDED 20. LATER HE SHOT HIMSELF AND DIED. RPA DETACHEMENT COMD AND SOME SOLDIERS FROM NSHILI HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND PUT IN DETENTION IN GIKONGORO.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED IN ALL SECTORS.

B. THE FORCE COMMANDER ATTENDED MALAWI COY MEDAL PARADE AT SHAGASHA.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 42 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE AND NYAKARAMBI. 71 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO BYUMBA, GASHORA AND NGENDA. A TOTAL OF 172 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

B. GHANCOY PROVIDED 1 TRUCK TO CONVEY FOOD ITEMS FROM ADRA OFFICE TO REMERA PARENTS SCHOOL FOR STREET CHILDREN.

C. MALICoy PROVIDED 1 TRUCK EACH TO GROUPE SCHOLAIRE TO TRANSPORT FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO KIGALI AND TO TRANSPORT FOOD FOR WIVES IN GIKONGORO. THEY ALSO PROVIDED 2 TRUCKS TO

BUTARE MILOBS FOR TRANSPORTING PRISONERS.

D. NICOY TRANSPORTED FOOD ITEMS FROM KIGALI TO RAMBURA GIRLS COMMUNITY SCHOOL.

E. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED 1 TRUCK TO ARDEC TO TRANSPORT WOOD FROM RUGALIKA TO BISENYI.

F. NORMED AND UNITS MEDICAL PERSONNEL TREATED 187 LOCAL MEDICAL AND 13 LOCAL DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) THE CHAIRMAN OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF RWANDA ACCOMPANIED BY THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR VISITED KIBUNGO PREFECTURE ON 07 NOV 95.

7. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL

A. AT GICIYI COMMUNE GS 5111, SECT 5B, A LOCAL WOMAN AND MAN STEPPED ON ANTI-PERSONNEL MINE ON 07 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 0600HRS AND WERE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED.

B. ON 07 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 0900HRS, AT KABAYA GR 498958, IN SECT 5B, AN ANTI-TANK MINE WAS DETONATED BY A SWISS EMBASSY LANDCRUISER REGISTRATION NUMBER 8 CD 2R CARRYING FOUR PASSENGERS OUT OF WHOM TWO DIED ON THE SPOT, ONE OF THEM A LOCAL. THE OTHER TWO WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED AND ARE ADMITTED TO MSF HOSPITAL AT KABAYA. THIS INCIDENT TOOK PLACE SOUTH OF THE MAIN ROAD FROM KABAYA TO GASAKE.

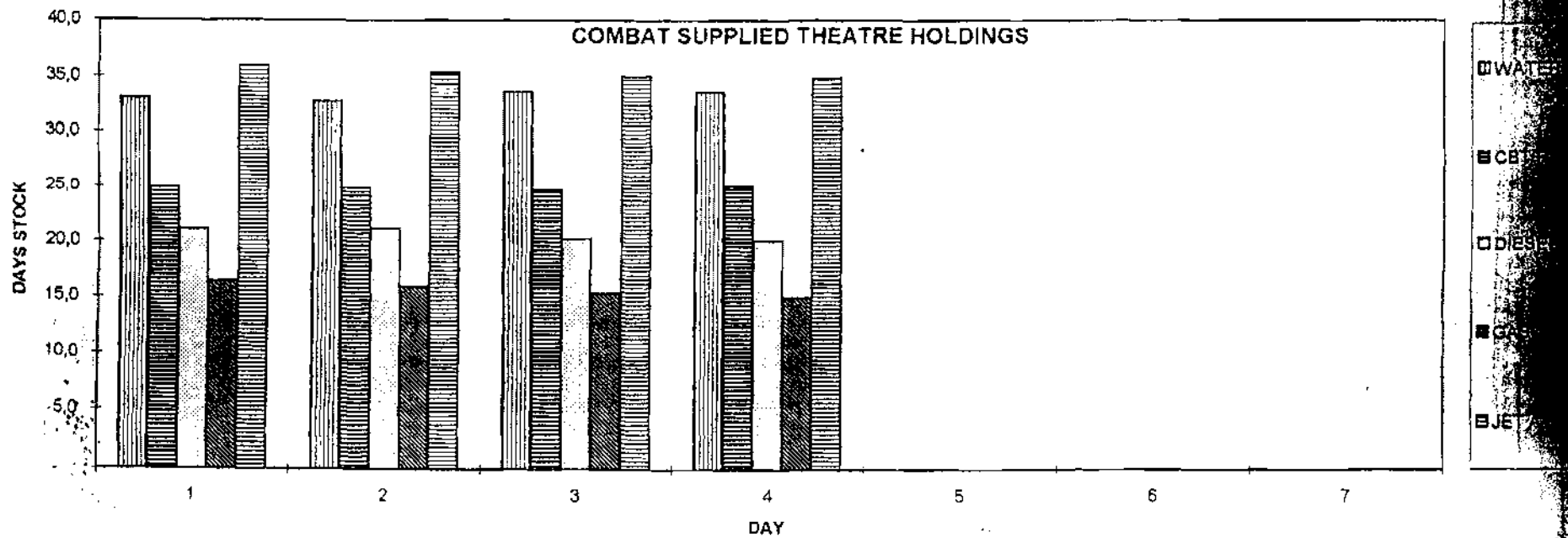

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS ON THE MANDATE AND DISCUSSED ISSUES OF MUTUAL CONCERN.

B. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE VISITING NORWEGIAN DELEGATION MET WITH THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING THE REFUGEES, REHABILITATION OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM, FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR AS WELL AS INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA.

C. LATER, THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING TO HEADS OF MISSIONS AND AGENCIES ON THE CURRENT DEVELOPMENTS AND SITUATION WITH REGARD TO THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR.

D. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA REPORT OF TUESDAY, 7 NOVEMBER, THE RWANDESE PRESS CELEBRATED THE AFRICAN INFORMATION DAY AND RECALLED THE ROLE PLAYED BY THE MEDIA IN PREPARING AND IMPLEMENTING THE GENOCIDE. THE PRESS RESOLVED TO SHUN DISSEMINATING ETHNIC HATRED AND TREAT JOURNALISM OBJECTIVELY, TO BUILD A NEW RWANDA.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) RPA CHECKPOINT NEAR SAKA GS 4655 HAS BEEN REMOVED AS THE SITUATION IS CONSIDERED CALM.

(2) THE RWINKWAVU HOSPITAL GS 6883 WHICH WAS RUN BY MEDICOS EN CATASTROPHE HAS BEEN TAKEN OVER BY RPA TO BE CONVERTED INTO A MILITARY HOSPITAL. ALL FOREIGNERS AND LOCAL WORKERS HAVE ALREADY STOPPED WORK AND WILL LEAVE FOR KIGALI ON 13 NOVEMBER, 1995.

(3). IN SECT 5B GISENYI, RPA CONFIRMED HAVING CONDUCTED AN AMPHIBIOUS OP IN IWANA ISLAND ON 05 NOV 95. THE ISLAND WAS USED BY THE EX-FAR AS A TRAINING CENTER AND WAS SUPPOSED TO HAVE OVER 500 SOLDIERS. THE OPS WAS SUCCESSFUL. MILOB SECT COMD VIEWED 07 DEAD AND 15 EX-FAR PRISONERS AND COUNTED THE FOLLOWING CAPTURED WEAPONS:

- 1 X 75 MM RECOILLESS RIFLE (US);
- 3 X 12.7 HMG COMPLETE WITH TRIPOD AND 2 X 11.5 HMG.
- 3 X LMG, S (FN)
- 15 ASSORTED RIFLES IN WORKABLE CONDITION.
- A NUMBER OF RIFLES OF VARIOUS TYPES IN VARIOUS STATES OF REPAIR AND ASSEMBLY.
- TWO POTATO SACKS OF TNT BLOCKS, APPROX 1/4KG EACH AND IN A STATE OF DETERIORATION.
- 2 X ROLLS OF CORDEX DET CORD.
- NUMEROUS RIFLE PARTS IN THEIR ORIGINAL CONTAINERS/PACKAGING AND
- 6 X ATK MINE CARRIERS WITH INSTRUCTIONS WRITTEN IN ENGLISH.

THE SECT COMDR REPORTED THAT HE WAS TOLD BY AN RPA OFF THAT 141 FRGF WERE KILLED, 05 RPA KILLED AND 13 WOUNDED.

(4). ON 06 NOV 95, AT ABOUT 1000 HRS, AT NSHILI COMMUNE, IN SECT 3A, AN RPA SOLDIER SHOT RANDOMLY, KILLED 15 PERSONS AND WOUNDED 20. LATER HE SHOT HIMSELF AND DIED. RPA DETACHEMENT COMD AND SOME SOLDIERS FROM NSHILI HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND PUT IN DETENTION IN GIKONGORO.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED IN ALL SECTORS.

B. THE FORCE COMMANDER ATTENDED MALAWI COY MEDAL PARADE AT SHAGASHA.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 42 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE AND NYAKARAMBI. 71 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO BYUMBA, GASHORA AND NGENDA. A TOTAL OF 172 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

B. GHANCOY PROVIDED 1 TRUCK TO CONVEY FOOD ITEMS FROM ADRA OFFICE TO REMERA PARENTS SCHOOL FOR STREET CHILDREN.

C. MALICOY PROVIDED 1 TRUCK EACH TO GROUPE SCHOLAIRE TO TRANSPORT FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO KIGALI AND TO TRANSPORT FOOD FOR WIVES IN GIKONGORO. THEY ALSO PROVIDED 2 TRUCKS TO

BUTARE MILOBS FOR TRANSPORTING PRISONERS.

D. NICOY TRANSPORTED FOOD ITEMS FROM KIGALI TO RAMBURA GIRLS COMMUNITY SCHOOL.

E. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED 1 TRUCK TO ARDEC TO TRANSPORT WOOD FROM RUGALIKA TO BISENYI.

F. NORMED AND UNITS MEDICAL PERSONNEL TREATED 187 LOCAL MEDICAL AND 13 LOCAL DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) THE CHAIRMAN OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF RWANDA ACCOMPANIED BY THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR VISITED KIBUNGO PREFECTURE ON 07 NOV 95.

7. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL

A. AT GICIYI COMMUNE GS 5111, SECT 5B, A LOCAL WOMAN AND MAN STEPPED ON ANTI-PERSONNEL MINE ON 07 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 0600HRS AND WERE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED.

B. ON 07 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 0900HRS, AT KABAYA GR 498958, IN SECT 5B, AN ANTI-TANK MINE WAS DETONATED BY A SWISS EMBASSY LANDCRUISER REGISTRATION NUMBER 8 CD 2R CARRYING FOUR PASSENGERS OUT OF WHOM TWO DIED ON THE SPOT, ONE OF THEM A LOCAL. THE OTHER TWO WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED AND ARE ADMITTED TO MSF HOSPITAL AT KABAYA. THIS INCIDENT TOOK PLACE SOUTH OF THE MAIN ROAD FROM KABAYA TO GASAKE.

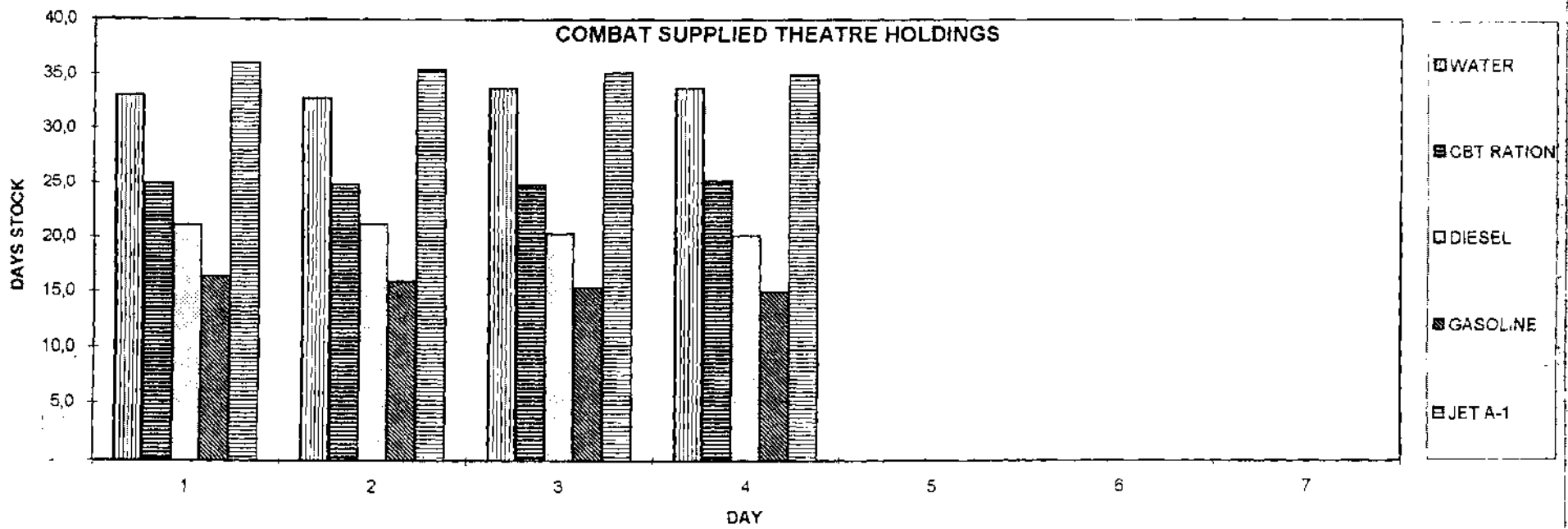

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 426. 425 FROM ZAIRE AND 01 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW - NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS INFLOW - 2348 AND OUTFLOW - 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING ON MONDAY, 6 NOVEMBER 1995, TO THE VISITING MEMBERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS ASSOCIATION OF THE U.S.A ON THE OVER-ALL SITUATION IN RWANDA, WITH PARTICULAR REFERENCE TO RECONCILIATION AND THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES FROM NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. RECONSTRUCTION OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM IN RWANDA WAS ALSO DISCUSSED.

B. LATER IN THE DAY, THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AND U.S. AMBASSADORS TO RWANDA TO REVIEW THE DELIBERATIONS AND CONCLUSION OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE THAT ENDED ON 5 NOVEMBER 1995.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT, IN HIS CLOSING ADDRESS TO THE CONFERENCE, THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA H.E. 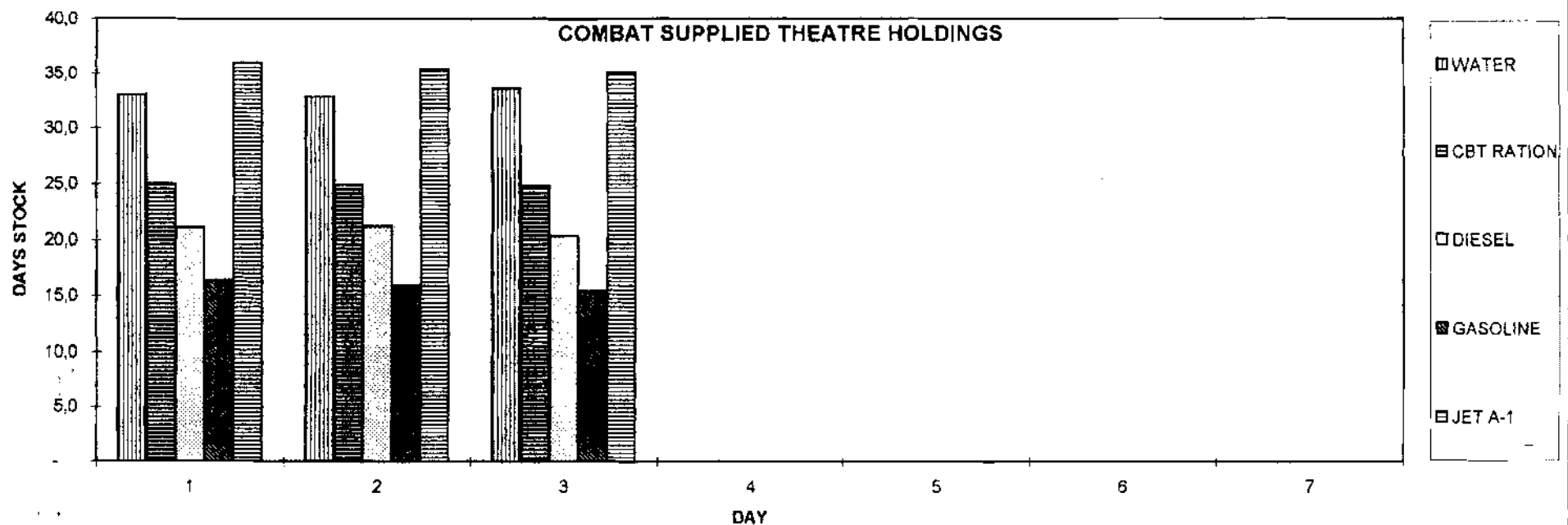



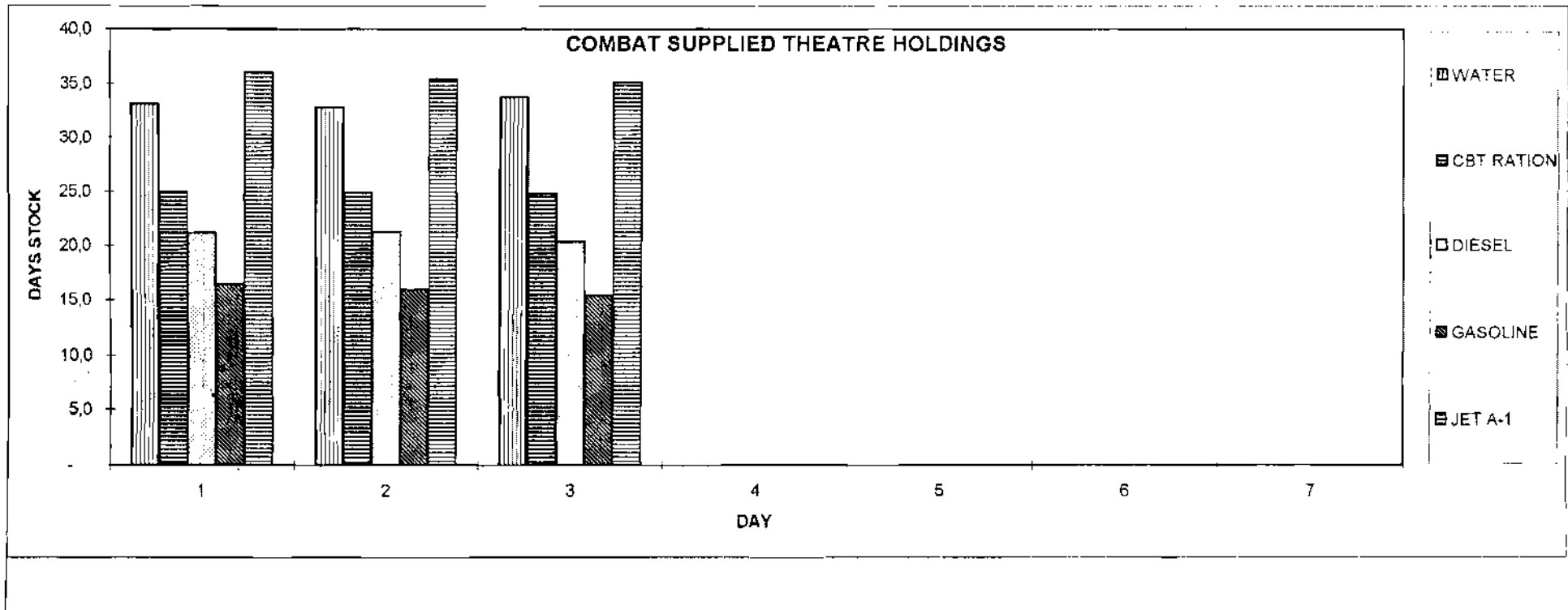

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 30 OCT 95 TO 05 NOV 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES AT A LOW RATE.

B. MANY CASES OF HARASSMENT OF LOCAL AND ILLEGAL ARRESTS HAD BEEN REPORTED.

C. THE WEEK WAS DOMINATED BY THE INCREASE OF MINE INCIDENTS. SEVEN WERE RECORDED, WITH FOUR PERSONS KILLED AND THIRTEEN WOUNDED.

D. AN INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE GENOCIDE WAS HELD IN KIGALI.

D. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 2420 OUT OF WHICH 1586 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 535 FROM TANZANIA, 264 FROM BURUNDI AND 35 FROM UGANDA. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON NOVEMBER 31, THE SRSG BRIEFED MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC COMMUNITY AS WELL AS THOSE FROM UN AGENCIES, ON THE ON-GOING DISCUSSIONS WITH THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT ON THE UNAMIR MANDATE.

B. THE SRSG ACCOMPANIED THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA DURING HIS VISITS TO THE SITES RESERVED FOR THE RESETTLEMENTS OF THE REFUGEES ON THE OUTSKIRTS OF KIGALI ON 1ST NOVEMBER. THE PRIME MINISTER APPRECIATED UNAMIR'S ROLE IN PROVIDING NECESSARY ASSISTANCE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THOSE SITES. THE MINISTER FOR PUBLIC WORKS, UNDP REPRESENTATIVE AND CHIEF OF THE HABITAT ALSO ACCOMPANIED THE PRIME MINISTER.

C. THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE ON 2 NOVEMBER 1995, INAUGURATED BY THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU, IN HIS ADDRESS AT THE CONFERENCE, STATED THAT THE PURPOSE OF THE CONFERENCE WAS TO SHARE IDEAS WITH EXPERTS FROM VARIOUS COUNTRIES, IN PARTICULAR COUNTRIES THAT HAD EXPERIENCED SOME DEGREE OF GENOCIDE OR MASSIVE VIOLATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS, IN A BID TO FORMULATE AN APPROPRIATE POLICY FOR THE NATIONAL HEALING PROCESS.

D. IN A LATER INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA, PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU OPINED THAT THE REGIONAL SUMMIT TO BE CONVENED BY EX-PRESIDENT OF USA, MR. JIMMY CARTER, SHOULD FOCUS ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECISIONS TAKEN AT THE NAIROBI AND BUJUMBURA CONFERENCES ON REFUGEES REPATRIATION.

E. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA NEWS REPORT OF NOVEMBER 4, 1995, THE DUTCH MINISTER OF COOPERATION, MR. IAN PRONK, IN HIS MEETING WITH PRIME MINISTER RWIGEMA, ANNOUNCED THAT HOLLAND WILL GIVE RWANDA US\$ 16 MILLION IN SUPPORT OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM AND OTHER AREAS OF THE COUNTRY'S REHABILITATION.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE), ON 30 OCT 95 NIGHT, A DRUNK RPA OFFICER WHOSE VEH HAD BROKEN DOWN, THREATENED A SOLDIER FROM THE FORCE SIG COY DET AT KIBUYE WITH A KNIFE AND DEMANDED THE KEYS OF A UNAMIR VEH. THE SOLDIER REFUSED. THE RPA OFFICER LEFT ON ARRIVAL OF THE SIG DET COMDR AND LATER RETURNED TO COLLECT HIS VEH. INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

(2) IN SECTOR 5B, GISENYI, 20 PERSONS SUSPECTED TO BE INTERHAMWE WERE ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN THE LAST WEEK AND ARE PRESENTLY BEING DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE PRISON. TWO OF THE DETAINEES HAVE BEEN HANDED OVER TO THE RPA BDE COMDR IN RUHENGARI. THE COUNCILLOR OF BONEZA SECTOR HAS ALSO BEEN ARRESTED ON CHARGES OF HAVING ASSISTED THE INTERHAMWE.

(3) IN SECTOR 4(CYANGUGU) AT ABOUT 0300 HRS ON 01 NOV 95 TWO MEN AND A CHILD RESPECTIVELY WERE SHOT AT GASEBEYA (GR 0233) AND RUGOMERO (GR 0435). THE TWO MEN DIED BUT THE CHILD SURVIVED AND WAS EVACUATED TO KIBOGORA HOSPITAL. IT IS CLAIMED THAT THE SHOOTING WAS DONE BY RPA WHO MISTOOK THE VICTIMS FOR BANDITS.

(4) AT ABOUT 010500B NOV 95, AN RPA SOLDIER CAME TO THE CAMP OF OWN SLDRS AT MT KARONGI AND DEMANDED THAT HE MUST SEARCH THEIR TENTS AND PERS EFFECTS. THE SENTRY AFTER RESISTING, LATER ALLOWED HIM TO ENTER THE CAMP. AS THE RPA SLDR'S WPN WAS COCKED, THE SECTION COMD DISARMED HIM. THE RPA SLDR RAN AWAY AND RETURNED WITH REINFORCEMENTS. MILOBS SECTOR 5C AND NICOY WAS INFORMED AND A TEAM WAS DESPATCHED TO THE SCENE IMMEDIATELY. AFTER THOROUGH INVESTIGATION BY MILOBS, THE RPA COMD CONFIRMED THAT THE RPA SLDR HAD ACTED ILLEGALLY. THE RPA SLDR WAS TAKEN TO THE RPA HQ AT KIBUYE FOR FURTHER ACTION.

(5) IN SECTOR 5A, RUHENGARI, AN ANTI-TANK MINE DESTROYED

AN RPA DAIHATSU TRUCK AT BRIDGE GR 633310 ON 021400 NOV 95. ONE RPA SOLDIER DIED ON THE SPOT WHILE THREE OTHERS SUFFERED MINOR INJURIES AND ARE RECEIVING TREATMENT AT RUHENGARI HOSPITAL. RPA HAS STOPPED ALL OTHERS FROM USING THE ROAD.

(6) IN SECTOR 4, CYANGUGU, RPA INFORMED THE BUGARAMA SUB SECTOR THAT ZAIRIAN TROOPS HAVE COMPLAINED THAT UN HELICOPTERS ARE VIOLATING THEIR AIR SPACE AND HAVE THREATENED TO SHOOT DOWN THE UN HELICOPTERS IN FUTURE.

9. COMMENTS

A. THE SECURITY SITUATION IS RELATIVELY STABLE. THERE IS AN INCREASE OF INFILTRATION ACROSS THE LAND/LAKE BORDER IN SECTOR 5B, GISENYI. IT APPEARS TO BE A CONCERTED MOVE BY THE FORMER GOVT LEADERS TO DESTABILIZE THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE SECTOR. THE RPA ARE TAKING ACTION IN MANY PLACES BY INCORPORATING THE LOCALS IN THE SECURITY MEASURES.

B. THERE HAVE BEEN REPORTS OF RPA VISITING PEOPLE AT NIGHT, HARASSING THEM, SUSPECTING THEM OF BEING INTERHAMWE AND ARRESTING THEM ON ALLEGATION OF TAKING PART IN THE LAST YEAR GENOCIDE. AS A RESULT, FEAR IS INSTALLED AMONGST POPULATION IN MANY AREAS. IN SOME CASES MEN WHO ARE AFRAID OF BEING ARRESTED, HIDE DURING DAYTIME AND VISIT THEIR FAMILIES AT NIGHT.

C. THE MINE INCIDENTS ARE BECOMING ALL TO COMMON IN THE MISSION AREA. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THERE ARE BETWEEN 4,000 AND 5,000 UNCLEARED LANDMINES IN RWANDA THAT WERE PLACED DURING THE CIVILIAN WAR. THIS SITUATION IS FURTHER COMPLICATED BY THE EX-FAR, WHO HAVE BEEN LAYING MINES IN THE WESTERN PART OF RWANDA. THE MAIN VICTIMS ARE USUALLY CIVILIANS.

D. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 2420 OUT OF WHICH 1586 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 535 FROM TANZANIA, 264 FROM BURUNDI AND 35 FROM UGANDA. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON NOVEMBER 31, THE SRSG BRIEFED MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC COMMUNITY AS WELL AS THOSE FROM UN AGENCIES, ON THE ON-GOING DISCUSSIONS WITH THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT ON THE UNAMIR MANDATE.

B. THE SRSG ACCOMPANIED THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA DURING HIS VISITS TO THE SITES RESERVED FOR THE RESETTLEMENTS OF THE REFUGEES ON THE OUTSKIRTS OF KIGALI ON 1ST NOVEMBER. (2) ON 31 OCT 95 AT ABOUT 2300 HRS, ICRC REPORTED THAT AN ANTI TANK MINE EXPLODED AT 1900 HRS AT GASHARU GR 2057. THREE PERSONS WERE KILLED AND SIX OTHERS INJURED IN THE EXPLOSION.

(3) SECTOR 1B, GITARAMA, MILOBS INVESTIGATING ALLEGED KILLINGS IN NTONGWE COMMUNE (GR 9057) CONFIRMED THAT THREE MEN WERE KILLED ON SAT 29 OCT 95 BY EIGHT ARMED BANDITS IDENTIFIED BY A LOCAL AS RPA SOLDIERS. THE ARMED MEN LED BY 2 CIVILIANS, FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A HOUSE, KILLED 2 WORKERS AND A COW, AND LATER SHOT AN OLD MAN WHO HAD GONE THERE IN AID OF THE VICTIMS.

(4) IN SECTOR 5C, KIBUYE AT APPROXIMATELY 1900 HRS ON 31 OCT 95, A 40 SEATER LOCAL PASSENGER BUS TRAVELLING FROM CYANGUGU TO KIBUYE HIT AN ANTI-TANK MINE RESULTING IN THE DEATH OF THREE PERS AND WOUNDING SEVERAL OTHERS. ICRC PERS AND LOCAL RPA TPS EVAC THE WOUNDED BY ROAD TO KIBUYE HOSPITAL.

(5) IN SECTOR 5B GISENYI, MILOBS PATROL LEARNED FROM THE LOCALS THAT THERE HAS BEEN AN INCREASE OF INFILTRATIONS ACROSS THE BORDER IN THE COMMUNE OF MUTURA (GR 3233). ON 31 OCT, TWO SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE ENTERED BUTAKA SECTOR (GR 3120) WITH THE AIM OF STEALING FOOD AND CATTLE. ONE WAS APPREHENDED BY THE RPA ON NIGHT OF 2/3 NOV 95.

(6) IN SECTOR 5A, RUHENGARI, MILOBS RECEIVED A LEAFLET WRITTEN IN LOCAL LANGUAGE CALLING ON RWANDA HUTU TO UNITE AND FIGHT THE TUTSI LED GOVERNMENT. THE LEAFLET REFERRED TO THE KIBEHO INCIDENT AND SAID THE PRESENT ADMINISTRATION WAS OUT TO ELIMINATE HUTUS AND TAKE THEIR PROPERTY BY FORCE.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) ON 30 OCT 95, THE FC AND PRINCIPAL STAFF OFFICERS BRIEFED THE VISITING US AUDIT TEAM ON UNAMIR ACTIVITIES.

(3) SECTOR 5B, GISENYI WAS VISITED BY A DELEGATION FROM ASSOCIATION NATIONS UNIES/ETATS-UNIS D'AMERIQUE ON 05 NOV 95. THEY WERE BRIEFED ON THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE PREFECTURE BY THE MILOB SECTOR COMMANDER AND BY REPS FROM

UNHCR AND HUMAN RIGHTS.

- A. ALL UNITS/SECTORS CONTINUED PROVIDING HUMANITARIAN AND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.
- B. A TOTAL OF 201 RETURNEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.
- C. A TOTAL OF 2081 MEDICAL AND 159 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY MED CENTRES IN VARIOUS SECTORS.
- D. INDBATT DONATED TOILETRIES AND GROCERY ITEMS TO MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGES IN KIGALI AND KIBUNGO.
- E. NICOY MUSLIM COMMUNITY DONATED RWF 51,600 TO GISENYI MUSLIM COMMUNITY TO ASSIST IN BUILDING A CENTRAL MOSQUE.
- F. NICOY OFFICERS AND SOLDIERS DONATED GIFT ITEMS TO 19 ORPHANS FROM MEDICINS SANS FRONTIERS (MSF) ORPHANAGE MURARA IN RUBAVU COMMUNE.
- G. 95 CMSG DONATED 28 BUNDLES OF CLOTHING TO NYAMATA ORPHANAGE.
- H. ENGR COY TEAM DELIVERED MINE AWARENESS LECTURES IN KIBUYE AND BUTARE.
- I. A TOTAL OF 39 VEHS WERE PROVIDED BY ALL CONTINGENTS TO TRANSPORT VARIOUS ITEMS AS PART OF HUMANITARIAN TASKS, TO VARIOUS PLACES IN THE AOR.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

- A. IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) AN OUTBREAK OF CATTLE DISEASE IN GITI AND RUTARE COMMUNE WAS REPORTED. THE VET DOCTOR IN RUTARE INFORMED THAT THE SITUATION WAS LIKELY TO WORSEN UNLESS MEDICINES WERE MADE AVAILABLE ON PRIORITY.
- B. IN SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU, AT SHAGASHA, AN ANTI PERS MINE WAS FOUND AT THE ROAD JUNCTION AT GR 835237 BY SOME CHILDREN. IT WAS LATER NEUTRALIZED BY RPA IN THE PRESENCE OF MALAWI COY ENGR REP.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL SEVEN MINE INCIDENTS WERE RECORDED DURING THE WEEK RESULTING IN FOUR DEAD AND THIRTEEN WOUNDED LOCALS.

9. COMMENTS

A. THE SECURITY SITUATION IS RELATIVELY STABLE. THERE IS AN INCREASE OF INFILTRATION ACROSS THE LAND/LAKE BORDER IN SECTOR 5B, GISENYI. IT APPEARS TO BE A CONCERTED MOVE BY THE FORMER GOVT LEADERS TO DESTABILIZE THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE SECTOR. THE RPA ARE TAKING ACTION IN MANY PLACES BY INCORPORATING THE LOCALS IN THE SECURITY MEASURES.

B. THERE HAVE BEEN REPORTS OF RPA VISITING PEOPLE AT NIGHT, HARASSING THEM, SUSPECTING THEM OF BEING INTERHAMWE AND ARRESTING THEM ON ALLEGATION OF TAKING PART IN THE LAST YEAR GENOCIDE. AS A RESULT, FEAR IS INSTALLED AMONGST POPULATION IN MANY AREAS. IN SOME CASES MEN WHO ARE AFRAID OF BEING ARRESTED, HIDE DURING DAYTIME AND VISIT THEIR FAMILIES AT NIGHT.

C. THE MINE INCIDENTS ARE BECOMING ALL TOO COMMON IN THE MISSION AREA. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THERE ARE BETWEEN 4,000 AND 5,000 UNCLEARED LANDMINES IN RWANDA THAT WERE PLACED DURING THE CIVILIAN WAR. THIS SITUATION IS FURTHER COMPLICATED BY THE EX-FAR, WHO HAVE BEEN LAYING MINES IN THE WESTERN PART OF RWANDA. THE MAIN VICTIMS ARE USUALLY CIVILIANS.

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 01, FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS INFLOW - 1,922 AND OUTFLOW - 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE SRSG ATTENDED THE CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE THAT CONCLUDED ITS DELIBERATIONS ON NOVEMBER, 5. NUMEROUS RECOMMENDATIONS WERE ADOPTED THAT RANGED FROM TAKING MEASURES TO RETAIN THE MEMORY OF GENOCIDE TO REBUILDING THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM, ELEVATING THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL PLIGHT OF THE SURVIVORS OF GENOCIDE, DEFINING THE ROLE OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY IN MITIGATING THE EFFECTS OF GENOCIDE AND ENSURING THAT THIS CRIME AGAINST HUMANITY IS NOT REPEATED IN THE FUTURE.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) CIVPOL KIBUNGO WAS DENIED ENTRY TO KIBUNGO PRISON BY RPA GUARDS WHO DETERMINED THAT VISITS TO THE PENITENTIARY BY UNAMIR OBSERVERS MUST BE EXPRESSLY AUTHORISED. THE SUB-PREFECT OF RWAMAGANA WHO HAD EARLIER GRANTED PERMISSION, COULD NOT BE REACHED EVER SINCE THE LAST VISIT, DESPITE THE PROTEST REGISTERED.

(2) IN SECT 3B BUTARE, A SHOOTING INCIDENT TOOK PLACE IN FRONT OF HOTEL IBIS AT 1925 HRS ON 05 NOV 95. 6-7 ROUNDS WERE FIRED. THERE WAS NO INFORMATION ABOUT CASUALTIES. MILOB INVESTIGATING.

(3). IN SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU, ON 05 NOV 95 AT 1330 HRS AT MUHARI SECTOR (GR 7729) HUMAN RIGHTS REPORTED THAT AN EXPLOSION WAS HEARD FOLLOWED BY A BURST OF SMALL ARMS FIRE OF 20-30 ROUNDS. THE EXPLOSION TOOK PLACE 150-200M SOUTH WEST OF THE RPA CAMP. THE AREA WAS CONDONED BY THE RPA. THE EXACT CAUSE OF THE EXPLOSION WAS NOT KNOWN BUT APPEARS TO BE THE DETONATION OF 81MM BOMB PLACED IN THE GROUND. MALAWI ENGINEER OFF WHO WENT ON THE SPOT AND MET

AN RPA SOLDIER WHO TOLD HIM THEY WERE DEMOLISHING A MINE
DISCOVERED BY KIDS IN A PLANTATION.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. SECTOR 5B, GISENYI-THE SECTOR WAS VISITED BY
A DELEGATION FROM ASSOCIATION NATIONS UNIES/ETATS-UNIS
D'AMERIQUE. THEY WERE BRIEFED ON THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE
PREFECTURE BY THE SECTOR COMMANDER. THEY WERE ALSO BRIEFED BY
REPS FROM UNHCR AND HUMAN RIGHTS.

ACCIDENT WHILST THE OTHER HAD A MOTOR CYCLE ACCIDENT.

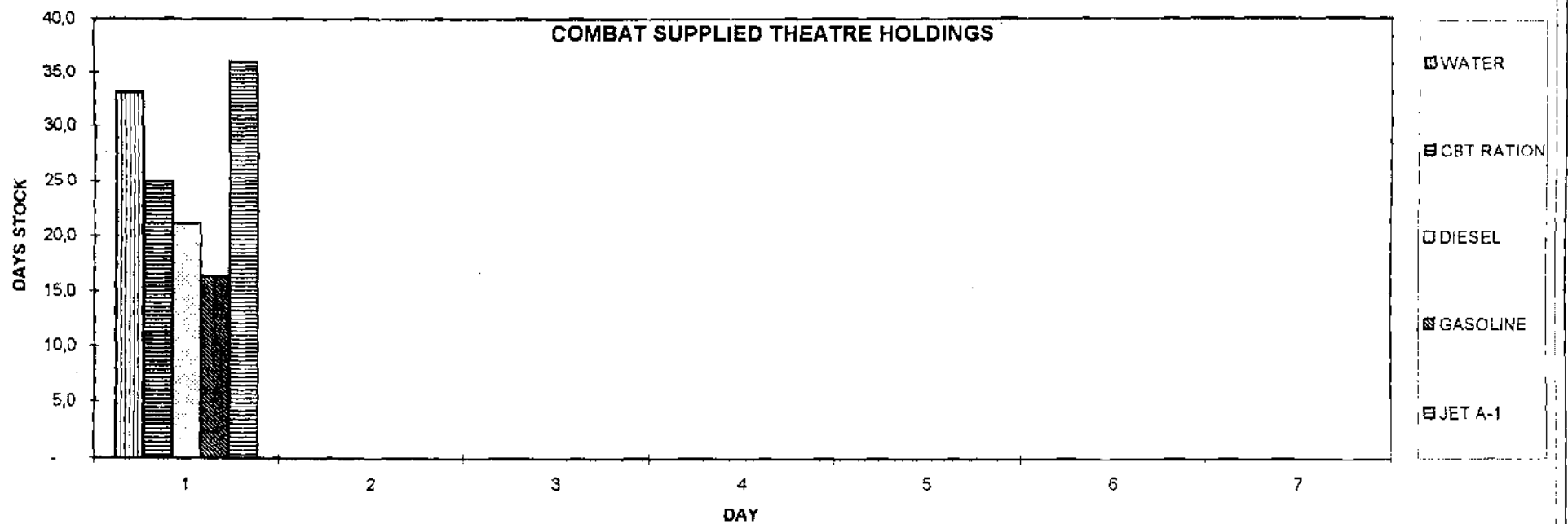

DAILY SITREP FOR 05 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 01, FROM ZAIRE. OUT FLOW NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS INFLOW - 1,922 AND OUTFLOW - 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE SRSG ATTENDED THE CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE THAT CONCLUDED ITS DELIBERATIONS ON NOVEMBER, 5. NUMEROUS RECOMMENDATIONS WERE ADOPTED THAT RANGED FROM TAKING MEASURES TO RETAIN THE MEMORY OF GENOCIDE TO REBUILDING THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM, ELEVATING THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL PLIGHT OF THE SURVIVORS OF GENOCIDE, DEFINING THE ROLE OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY IN MITIGATING THE EFFECTS OF GENOCIDE AND ENSURING THAT THIS CRIME AGAINST HUMANITY IS NOT REPEATED IN THE FUTURE.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) CIVPOL KIBUNGO WAS DENIED ENTRY TO KIBUNGO PRISON BY RPA GUARDS WHO DETERMINED THAT VISITS TO THE PENITENTIARY BY UNAMIR OBSERVERS MUST BE EXPRESSLY AUTHORISED. THE SUB-PREFECT OF RWAMAGANA WHO HAD EARLIER GRANTED PERMISSION, COULD NOT BE REACHED EVER SINCE THE LAST VISIT, DESPITE THE PROTEST REGISTERED.

(2) IN SECT 3B BUTARE, A SHOOTING INCIDENT TOOK PLACE IN FRONT OF HOTEL IBIS AT 1925 HRS ON 05 NOV 95. 6-7 ROUNDS WERE FIRED. THERE WAS NO INFORMATION ABOUT CASUALTIES. MILOB INVESTIGATING.

(3). IN SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU, ON 05 NOV 95 AT 1330 HRS AT MUHARI SECTOR (GR 7729) HUMAN RIGHTS REPORTED THAT AN EXPLOSION WAS HEARD FOLLOWED BY A BURST OF SMALL ARMS FIRE OF 20-30 ROUNDS. THE EXPLOSION TOOK PLACE 150-200M SOUTH WEST OF THE RPA CAMP. THE AREA WAS CONDONED BY THE RPA. THE EXACT CAUSE OF THE EXPLOSION WAS NOT KNOWN BUT APPEARS TO BE THE DETONATION OF 81MM BOMB PLACED IN THE GROUND. MALAWI ENGINEER OFF WHO WENT ON THE SPOT AND MET

PREFECTURE BY THE SECTOR COMMANDER. THEY WERE ALSO BRIEFED BY

FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO.

D. GHANCOY MED STAFF TREATED 214 LOCAL MED PATIENTS.

E. NICOY EVACUATED 2 RPA SOLDIERS FROM THE GENERAL HOSPITAL
IN RUHENGIERI TO KANOMBE HOSPITAL IN KIGALI. ONE HAD A MINE
ACCIDENT WHILST THE OTHER HAD A MOTOR CYCLE ACCIDENT.

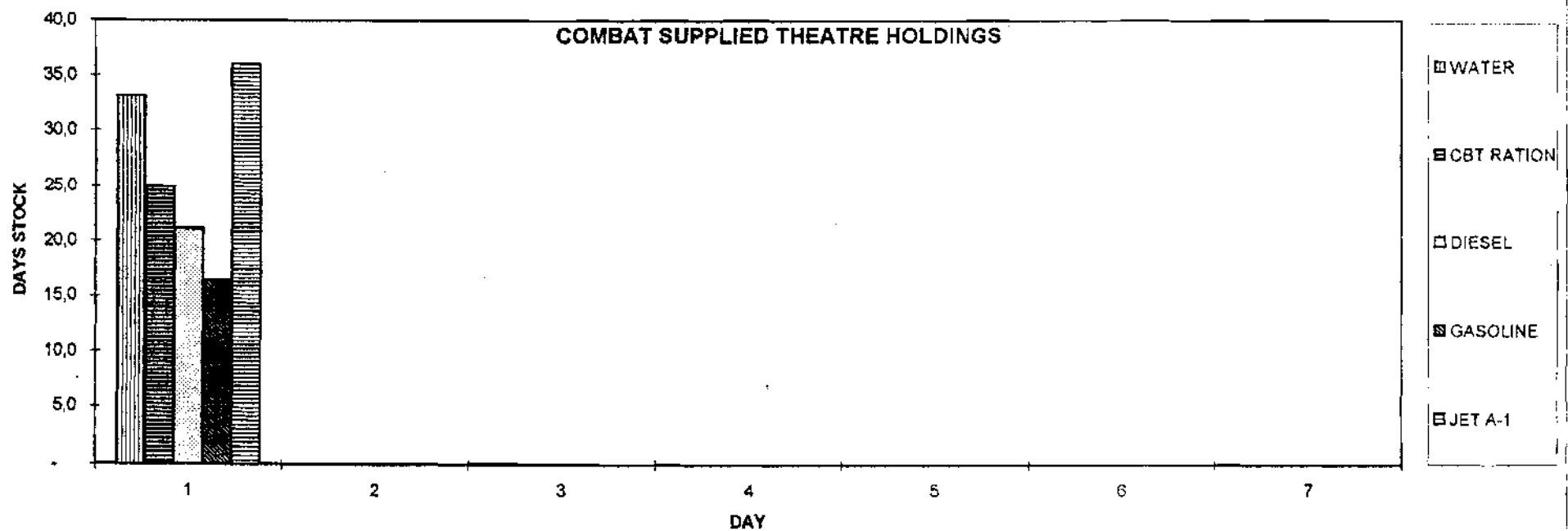
COMBAT SUPPLIES USAGE AND STOCK CHARTS

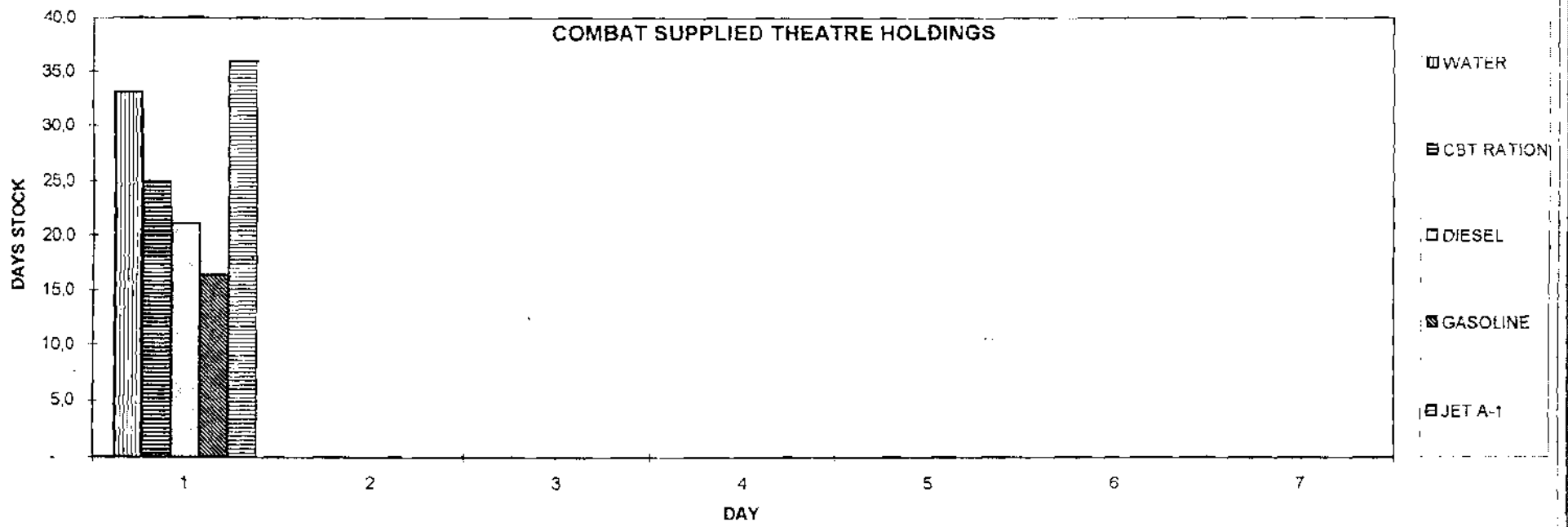
COMBAT SUPPLIES USAGE AND STOCK CHARTS

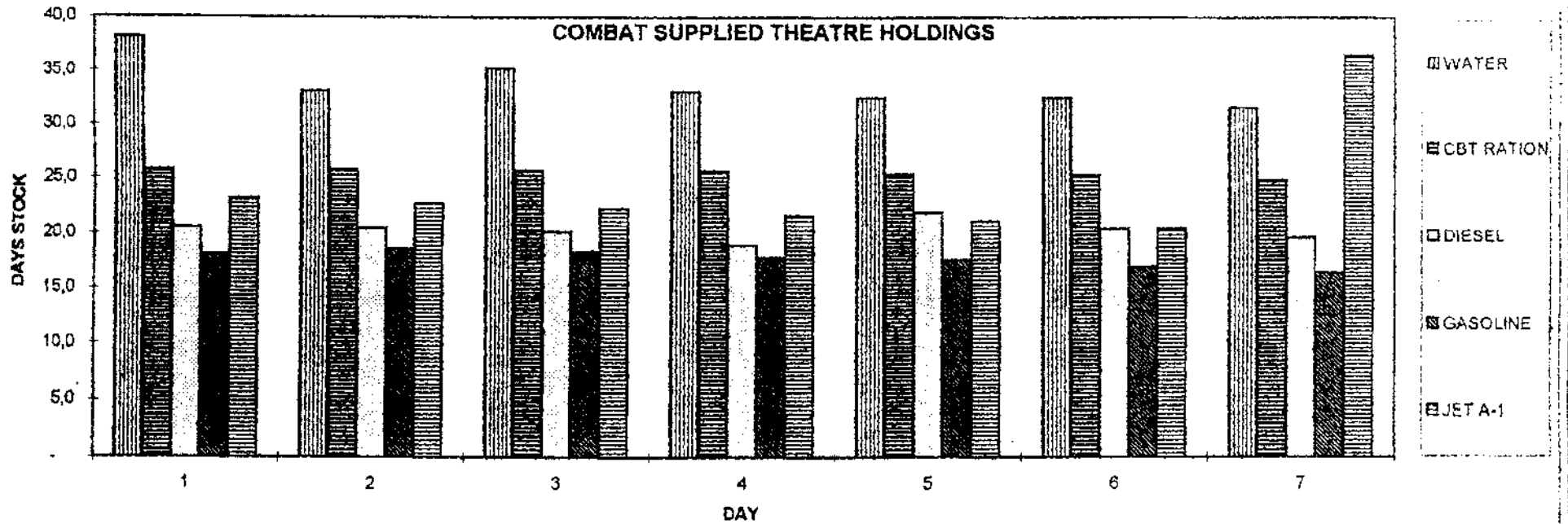

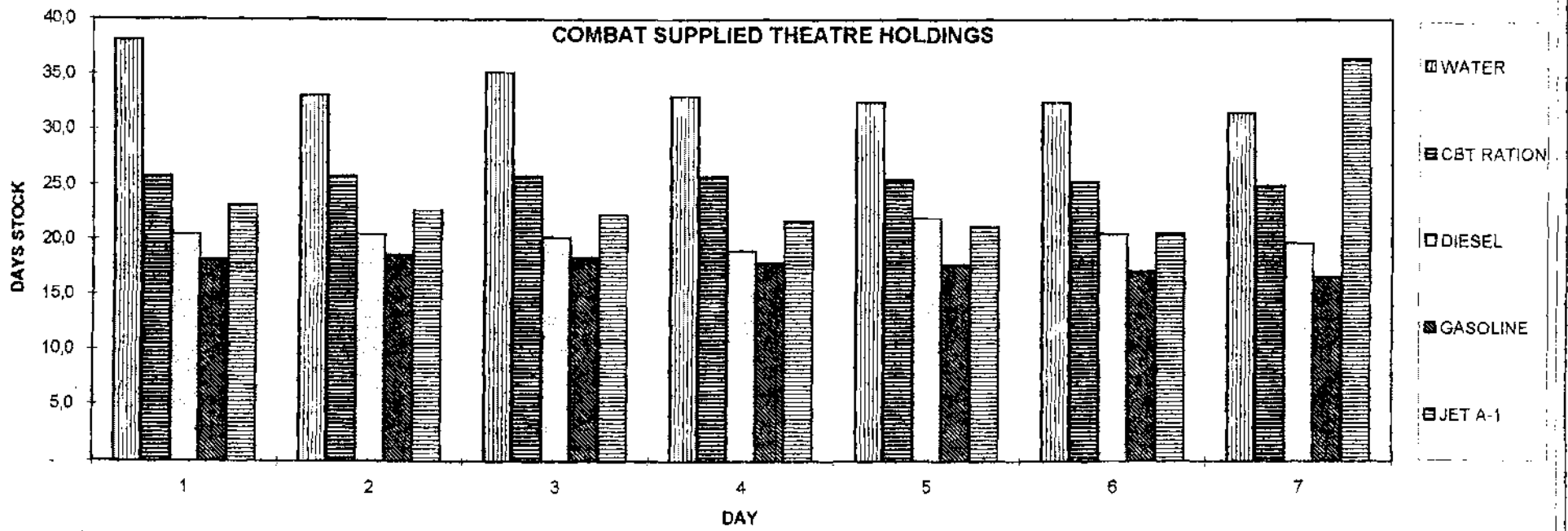

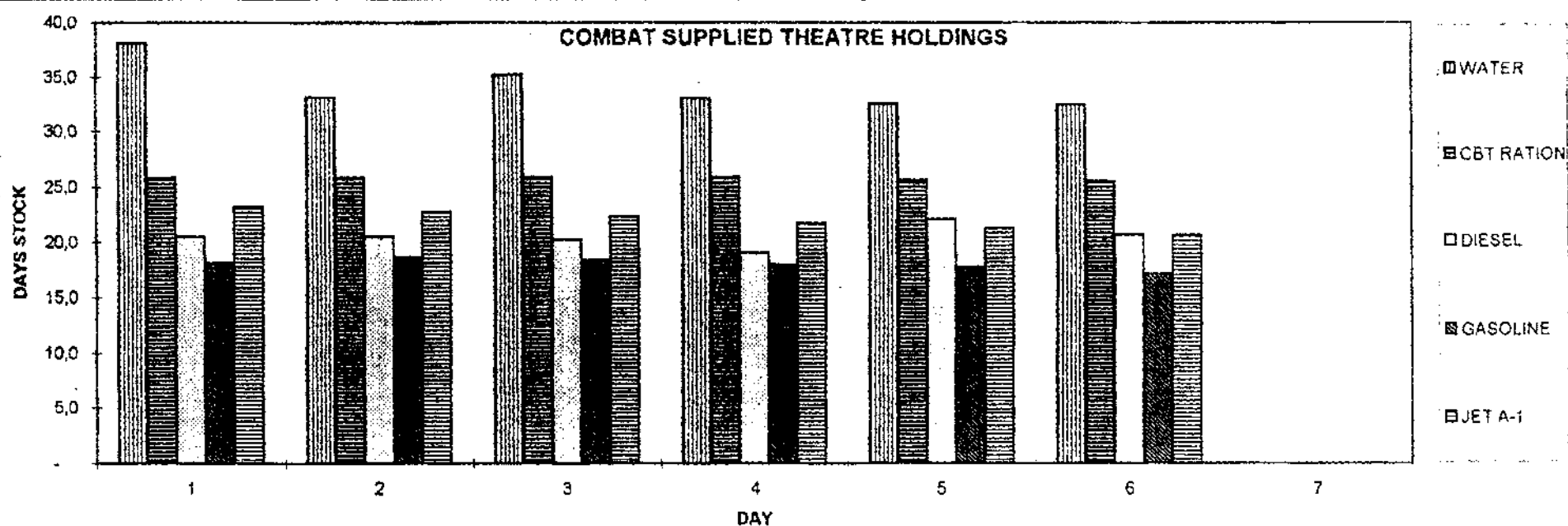

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 1,346. 706 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 504 FROM TANZANIA, 106 FROM BURUNDI AND 30 FROM UGANDA. OUT FLOW - NIL

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS INFLOW - 1,346 AND OUTFLOW - 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

1. THE SRSG ACCOMPANIED THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA DURING HIS VISIT TO THE SITES RESERVED FOR THE RESETTLEMENT OF THE REFUGEES ON THE OUTSKIRTS OF KIGALI. THE PRIME MINISTER APPRECIATED UNAMIR'S ROLE IN PROVIDING NECESSARY ASSISTANCE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THOSE SITES. THE MINISTER FOR PUBLIC WORKS, A UNDP REPRESENTATIVE AND A REPRESENTATIVE OF HABITAT ALSO ACCOMPANIED THE PRIME MINISTER.

2. THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE THAT WAS INAUGURATED BY THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA. THIS CONFERENCE WOULD CONCLUDE ON 5 NOVEMBER 1995.

3. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE MEETING BETWEEN UNAMIR AND THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES ON THE MANDATE AND DISCUSSED MATTERS OF BILATERAL CONCERN.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGURI) - MILOBS RECEIVED A LEAFLET WRITTEN IN LOCAL LANGUAGE CALLING ON RWANDA HUTU TO UNITE AND FIGHT THE TUTSI LED GOVERNMENT. THE LEAFLET REFERRED TO THE KIBEHO INCIDENT AND SAID THE PRESENT ADMINISTRATION WAS OUT TO ELIMINATE HUTUS AND TAKE THEIR PROPERTY BY FORCE.

(2) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) AT ABOUT 0300 HRS ON 01 NOV 95 TWO MEN AND A CHILD RESPECTIVELY WERE SHOT AT GASEBEYA (GR 0233) AND RUGOMERO (GR 0435). THE TWO MEN DIED BUT THE CHILD SURVIVED AND WAS EVACUATED TO KIBOGORA HOSPITAL. IT IS CLAIMED THAT THE SHOOTING WAS DONE BY RPA WHO MISTAKENLY TOOK THE VICTIMS FOR BANDITS.

(3) AT ABOUT 010500B NOV 95, AN RPA SOLDIER CAME TO THE CAMP OF OWN SLDERS AT MT KARONGI AND DEMANDED THAT HE MUST SEARCH THEIR TENTS AND PERS EFFECTS. THE SLDER ON SENTRY AFTER RESISTING, LATER ALLOWED HIM. THE RPA SLDER'S WPN WAS CORKED, SO ON NOTICING THAT, THE SECTION COMD SWIFTLY MOVE AND DISARMED HIM. THE RPA SLDER TOOK TO HIS HEELS AND BROUGHT REENFORCEMENT. MILOBS SECTOR 5C AND NICOY WAS INFORMED, A TEAM LED BY OWN OPS OFFR WAS DESPATCHED TO THE SCENE IMMEDIATELY. AFTER THOROUGH INVESTIGATION BY MILOBS AND OWN OPS OFFR. THE RPA COMD CONFIRMED THAT THE RPA SLDER WAS ON ILLEGAL DUTY. HE PUNISHED HIS SLDER AND LATER TOOK HIM TO THEIR HQ AT KIBUYE FOR FURTHER PUNITIVE MEASURES.

B FRGE/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) SECTOR 1B - GITARAMA. MILOBS INVESTIGATING ALLEGED KILLINGS IN NTONGWE COMMUNE (GR 9057) CONFIRMED THREE MEN KILLED ON SAT 29 OCT 95 BY EIGHT ARMED BANDITS IDENTIFIED BY A LOCAL AS RPA SOLDIERS. THE ARMED MEN LED BY 2 CIVILIANS FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A HOUSE, KILLED 2 WORKERS AND A COW, AND LATER SHOT AN OLD MAN WHO HAD GONE THERE IN AID OF THE VICTIMS.

(2) IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) AT APPROXIMATELY 1900 HRS ON 31 OCT 95, A 40 SEATER LOCAL PASSENGER BUS TRAVELLING FROM CYANGUGU TO KIBUYE HIT AN ANTI-TANK MINE AT UWINGABU BRIDGE IN GISOVU COMMUNE RESULTING IN THE DEATH OF THREE PERS AND WOUNDING SEVERAL OTHERS. ICRC PERS AND LOCAL RPA TPS EVAC THE WOUNDED BY ROAD TO KIBUYE HOSPITAL.

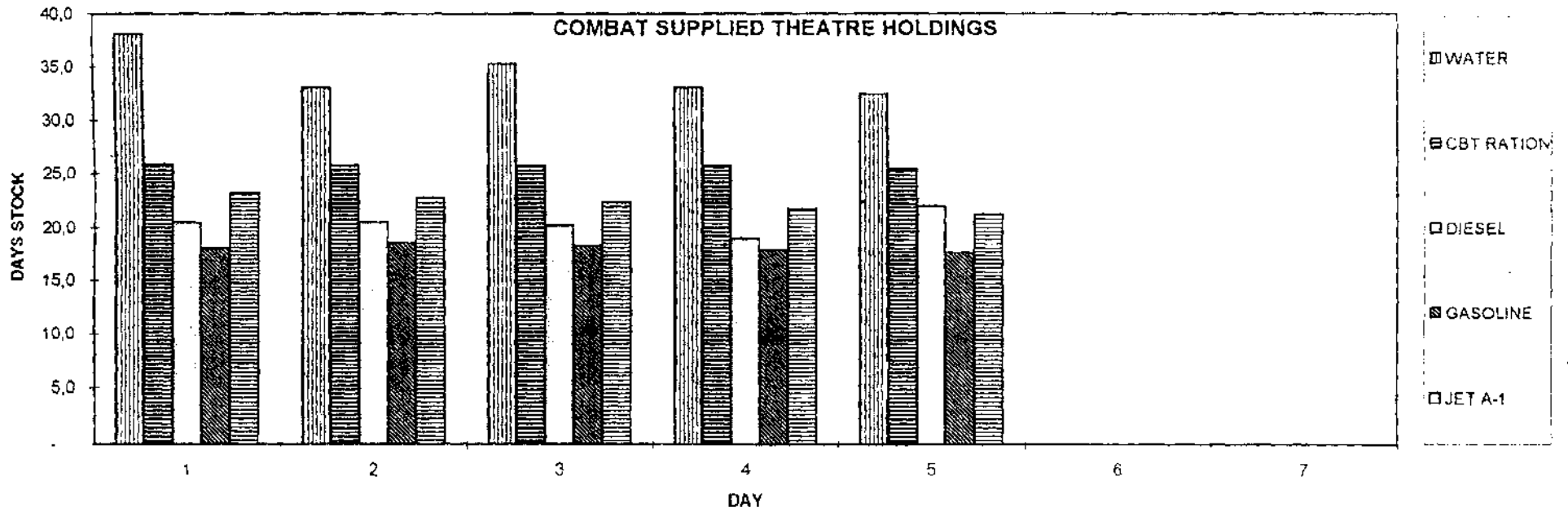

DAILY SITREP FOR 01 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 1,346. 706 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 504 FROM TANZANIA, 106 FROM BURUNDI AND 30 FROM UGANDA. OUT FLOW - NIL

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS INFLOW - 1,346 AND OUTFLOW - 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

1. THE SRSG ACCOMPANIED THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA DURING HIS VISIT TO THE SITES RESERVED FOR THE RESETTLEMENT OF THE REFUGEES ON THE OUTSKIRTS OF KIGALI. THE PRIME MINISTER APPRECIATED UNAMIR'S ROLE IN PROVIDING NECESSARY ASSISTANCE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THOSE SITES. THE MINISTER FOR PUBLIC WORKS, A UNDP REPRESENTATIVE AND A REPRESENTATIVE OF HABITAT ALSO ACCOMPANIED THE PRIME MINISTER.

2. THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE THAT WAS INAUGURATED BY THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA. THIS CONFERENCE WOULD CONCLUDE ON 5 NOVEMBER 1995.

3. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE MEETING BETWEEN UNAMIR AND THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES ON THE MANDATE AND DISCUSSED MATTERS OF BILATERAL CONCERN.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) - MILOBS RECEIVED A LEAFLET WRITTEN IN LOCAL LANGUAGE CALLING ON RWANDA HUTU TO UNITE AND FIGHT THE TUTSI LED GOVERNMENT. THE LEAFLET REFERRED TO THE KIBEHO INCIDENT AND SAID THE PRESENT ADMINISTRATION WAS OUT TO ELIMINATE HUTUS AND TAKE THEIR PROPERTY BY FORCE.

(2) IN SECTOR 4(CYANGUGU) AT ABOUT 0300 HRS ON 01 NOV 95 TWO MEN AND A CHILD RESPECTIVELY WERE SHOT AT GASEBEYA (GR 0233) AND RUGOMERO (GR 0435). THE TWO MEN DIED BUT THE CHILD SURVIVED AND WAS EVACUATED TO KIBOGORA HOSPITAL. IT IS CLAIMED THAT THE SHOOTING WAS DONE BY RPA WHO MISTAKENLY TOOK THE VICTIMS FOR BANDITS.

(3) AT ABOUT 010500B NOV 95, AN RPA SOLDIER CAME TO THE CAMP OF OWN SLDRS AT MT KARONGI AND DEMANDED THAT HE MUST SEARCH THEIR TENTS AND PERS EFFECTS. THE SLDR ON SENTRY AFTER RESISTING, LATER ALLOWED HIM. THE RPA SLDR'S WPN WAS CORKED, SO ON NOTICING THAT, THE SECTION COMD SWIFTLY MOVE AND DISARMED HIM. THE RPA SLDR TOOK TO HIS HEELS AND BROUGHT REENFORCEMENT. MILOBS SECTOR 5C AND NICOY WAS INFORMED, A TEAM LED BY OWN OPS OFFR WAS DESPATCHED TO THE SCENE IMMEDIATELY. AFTER THOROUGH INVESTIGATION BY MILOBS AND OWN OPS OFFR. THE RPA COMD CONFIRMED THAT THE RPA SLDR WAS ON ILLEGAL DUTY. HE PUNISHED HIS SLDR AND LATER TOOK HIM TO THEIR HQ AT KIBUYE FOR FURTHER PUNITIVE MEASURES.

B FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) SECTOR 1B - GITARAMA. MILOBS INVESTIGATING ALLEGED KILLINGS IN NTONGWE COMMUNE (GR 9057) CONFIRMED THREE MEN KILLED ON SAT 29 OCT 95 BY EIGHT ARMED BANDITS IDENTIFIED BY A LOCAL AS RPA SOLDIERS. THE ARMED MEN LED BY 2 CIVILIANS FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A HOUSE, KILLED 2 WORKERS AND A COW, AND LATER SHOT AN OLD MAN WHO HAD GONE THERE IN AID OF THE VICTIMS.

(2) IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) AT APPROXIMATELY 1900 HRS ON 31 OCT 95, A 40 SEATER LOCAL PASSENGER BUS TRAVELLING FROM CYANGUGU TO KIBUYE HIT AN ANTI-TANK MINE AT UWINGABU BRIDGE IN GISOVU COMMUNE RESULTING IN THE DEATH OF THREE PERS AND WOUNDING SEVERAL OTHERS. ICRC PERS AND LOCAL RPA TPS EVAC THE WOUNDED BY ROAD TO KIBUYE HOSPITAL.

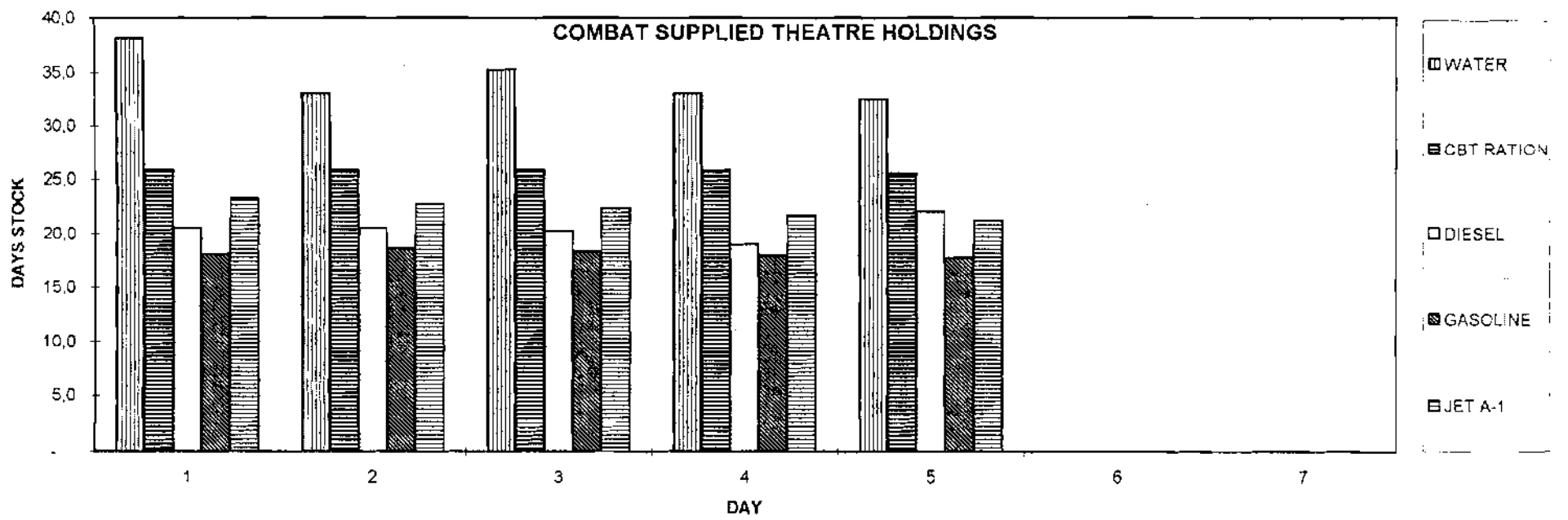

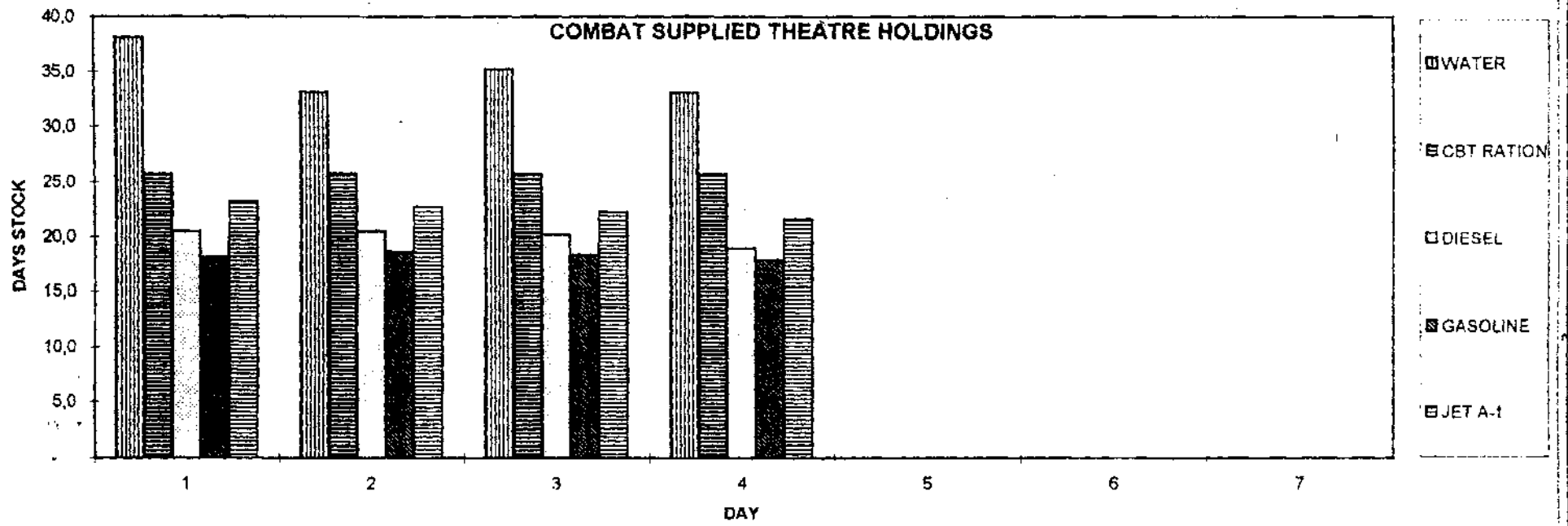

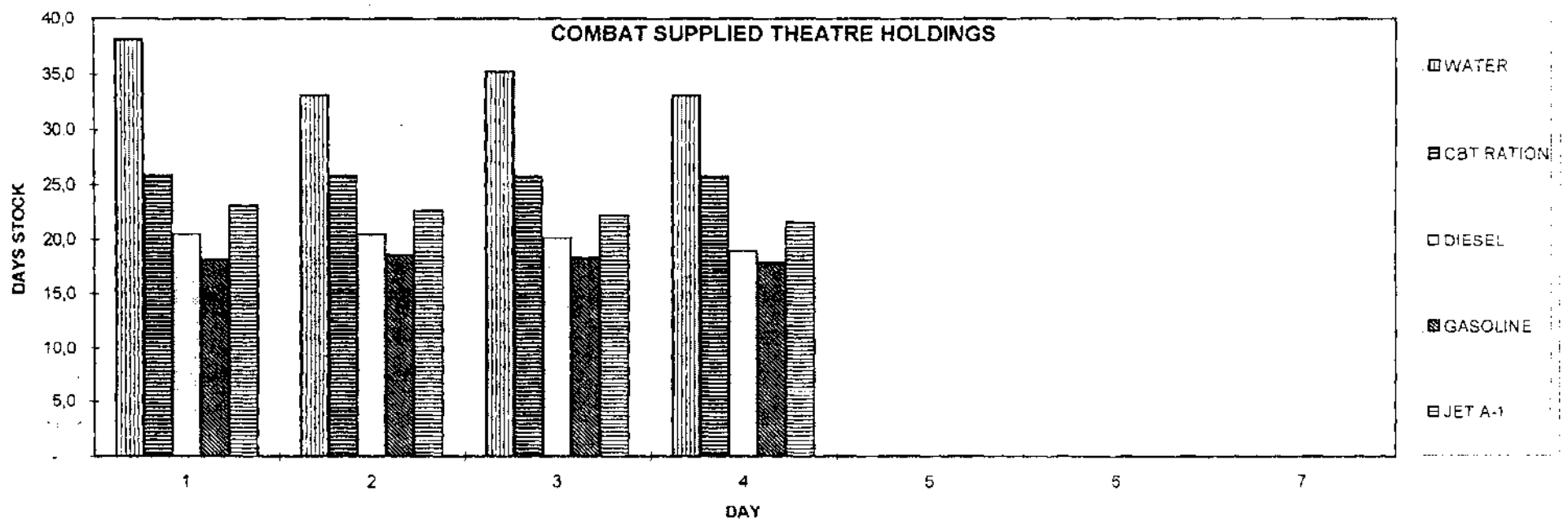
