DAILY SITREP FOR 15 FEB 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE UNDER CONTROL.

B AT 151240B FEB 95 AN RPA UTILITY VEHICLE BACKED INTO AUSMED SPT FORCE VEHICLE AS IT WAS MOVING OUT OF THEIR BKS. THE ONLY DAMAGE TO EITHER VEHICLE WAS A BROKEN TAIL LIGHT ON THE RPA VEH. THE RPA CLAIMED THAT THE AUSMED VEH CAUSED THE ACCIDENT AND THERE WAS MISUNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE RPA AND AUSMED SOLDIERS. THE GENDARMERIE THEN ARRIVED AT THE SCENE AND DEMANDED THAT THE VEH AND DRIVER SHOULD BE TAKEN TO THE GENDARMERIE HQ FOR THE NECESSARY STATEMENTS TO BE TAKEN. DISCUSSIONS CONTINUED BETWEEN THE GENDARMERIE AND AUSMED SUNRAY, THEIR LEGAL OFFR AND THE UN FORCE MPs. THE RPA AND GENDARMERIE REFUSED TO CHANGE THEIR STANCE AND AT ONE STAGE ONE RPA SOLDIER COCKED HIS WEAPON RESULTING IN ALL AUSMED SOLDIERS AT THE SCENE AND RPA GOING TO ACTION. THE TENSE SITUATION WAS QUICKLY DEFUSED WHEN AUSMED TROOPS WERE ORDERED TO RETURN TO THE LOAD CONDITION AND THE VEHICLE AND DRIVER WERE SENT TO THE GENDARMERIE HQs. THE AUSMED VEH HAS BEEN IMPOUNDED BY THE GENDARMERIE. EFFORTS UNDERWAY AT UNAMIR HQ TO DEFUSE TENSION BETWEEN RPA AND AUSMED TROOPS AS A RESULT OF STAND-OFF BETWEEN AUSMED AND GENDARMERIE AT BUTARE LAST WEEK.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG HELD INTERNAL MEETINGS WITH VARIOUS MEMBERS OF HIS STAFF TO BRIEF THEM ON HIS TRIP TO GENEVA, TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON SEVERAL TOPICS AND TO DISCUSS ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA.

(1) AIR OPS REPORTED THE FOLLOWING RPA AIR UNIT ACTIVITIES:

(A) STRENGTH OF UNIT - 4 PILOTS.

(B) AIRCRAFT PARK - 3 SMALL DOUBLE ENGINE
PLANES, ALL OF WHICH
REQUIRE MAINTENANCE

(C) NO TECHNICAL SERVICE AVAILABLE.

(D) THE UNIT IS HEADED BY A PILOT OF MAJOR RANK WHO WAS FLYING FOR AIR RWANDA BEFORE THE WAR AND WAS TRAINED IN FRANCE TO FLY ABOVE MENTIONED PLANES AND C 160 TYPE AS WELL. HE IS AUTHORISED TO ADVISE THE GOVERNMENT ON WHAT TYPE OF AIRCRAFT IS TO BE PURCHASED OR FREIGHTED.

(2) ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED 2 LOCALS ON 13 AND 14 FEB 95 AT GISEKI 4614 AND GISORORA GR 486174 IN RWAMIKO. REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS UNKNOWN. HR WAS INFORMED.

(3) ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT PEOPLE IN KADUHA HAVE GONE INTO HIDING BECAUSE RPA TROOPS HAD REQUESTED THEM TO EXHUME BODIES OF PEOPLE WHO WERE MASSACRED AT THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH FOR REBURIAL.

(4) AT MBUGA GR 422245 AT ABOUT 2200HRS ON 14 FEB 95 ARMED MEN BELIEVED TO BE RPA TROOPS LOBBED TWO SMOKE CANISTERS INTO MBUGA DP CAMP OF ABOUT 1000 IDPs AND PROCEEDED TO GAHIRA IN WINKINGI SECTOR GR 418366, 3KM FROM THE MENTIONED CAMP AND ABDUCTED A LOCAL BUSINESSMAN, AFTER FIRING SHOTS TO SCARE OTHER LOCALS.

IT IS BELIEVED THAT THEY WENT AWAY WITH VAST SUM OF MONEY WHICH THE ABDUCTED MAN KEPT IN HIS SHOP. THE WHEREABOUTS AND THE CONDITION OF THE ABDUCTED MAN IS NOT KNOWN. THE LOCAL RPA HAVE DENIED INVOLVEMENT AND HAVE PROMISED TO INVESTIGATE. DETAILS FOLLOW.

B. FRGF. MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C REPORTED THAT INFO RECEIVED FROM A RELIABLE SOURCE INDICATED THAT FRGF PERSONNEL ON THE IJWI ISLAND WERE ATTEMPTING TO PREVENT REFUGEES FROM CROSSING TO THE ZAIRE MAINLAND FROM THE ISLAND. THE SOURCE INDICATED THAT THERE WERE RIVAL COMMAND AND CONTROL STRUCTURES WITHIN THE ISLAND AMONG THE FRGF TROOPS. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT FORCE AND COERCION WERE BEING USED TO PREVENT REFUGEES FROM RETURNING.

C. MILITIA. NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) THE FC SPENT THE DAY VISITING SECTOR 2 AND THE GHANA BATTALION. HIS VISIT INCLUDED HQ AND A COY LOCATIONS. HE WAS VERY PLEASED WITH THE EFFORTS OF GHANBATT IN THAT SECTOR. LATER, HE HELD A MEETING WITH MISS DURAND OF THE WORLD BANK TO DISCUSS THE LATEST POLITICAL DEVELOPMENTS IN RWANDA.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY).

(1) CONDUCTED PATROLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) THE BOURGMESTRE OF GITI GR 234021 HAS STATED THAT ALTHOUGH THE INFLUX OF DPs HAS REDUCED IN HIS COMMUNE, THE MAIN PROBLEMS FACING LOCALS IN THE AREA ARE LACK OF SEEDLINGS, FARMING TOOLS AND FOOD. HAC INFORMED.

(3) PTL TO MATIMBA GR 496763 REPORTED SHORTAGE OF GOOD DRINKING WATER IN THE AREA.

(4) PTL TO NGARAMA GR 264921 AND NYAGAHANGA GR 255198 MET BELGIAN RED CROSS ORGANIZATION VACCINATING THE LOCALS AGAINST MEASLES. RPA COMD VISITED OWN LOC TO WELCOME NEWLY DEPLOYED TROOPS IN THE COMMUNE. THERE IS SHORTAGE OF GOOD DRINKING WATER IN NGARAMA TOWN GR 264921.

(5) 28 DPs WERE CONVEYED FROM KAGITUMBA GR 504822 TO THEIR VARIOUS COMMUNES USING NICOY VEHS.

(6) MED STAFF TREATED 83 LOCALS IN AOR.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) THE PL COMD AT KIYANJA PTL BASE GR 5986 HELD A MEETING WITH THE KAYONZA COMMUNE BOURGMESTRE AND THE RPA COMD RESPONSIBLE FOR THE COMMUNE TO DISCUSS THE SY SIT IN THE COMMUNE.

(3) THE FC AND HIS ENTOURAGE PAID A WORKING VISIT TO SECTOR 2. HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE CO. HE VISITED A COY HQ AT BARE GR 5448 AND SAKA ORC GR 4454, WHERE HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE OC AND THE PL COMD AT THE RESPECTIVE LOCs.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) MALAWICOY ASSISTED THE RPA AT BUTARE WITH TWO TRUCKS TO COLLECT THEIR UNIFORMS FROM KIGALI.

(2) PTL TO NYAKIZU GR 5796 REPORTED THAT RETURNEES PREFER TO GO STRAIGHT TO THEIR HOMES THAN BE BROUGHT TO THE ORC. SOME OF THE LOCALS IN THE COMMUNE WERE OBSERVED EITHER BUSY ON THEIR FARMS, RECONSTRUCTING THEIR HOMES OR MAINTAINING THE ROADS.

(3) MALAWICOY MED STAFF TREATED 7 LOCALS.

E. SECTOR 4A (ZAMBATT).

(1) CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PROVIDED SECURITY FOR OP RETOUR.

(3) MURAMBI DP CAMP IS NOW EMPTY.

(4) A REP FROM MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION HELD A MEETING WITH NGOS IN GIKONGORO TO ENCOURAGE THEM TO REDUCE THEIR ACTIVITIES IN THE DP CAMPS.

(5) MED STAFF TREATED 78 LOCALS IN AOR.

F. SECTOR 4B (FRAFATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) TRANSPORTED 4 REFUGEES FROM RUSUZI-1 TO NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 4 LOCAL DENTAL PATIENTS.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) A LOCAL WOMAN FROM KANAMA COMMUNE GR 2812 REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT HER HUSBAND WAS KIDNAPPED ON NIGHT OF 13 FEB BY RPA FOR NO APPARENT REASON. SECTOR MILOBS AND HR WERE INFORMED. MATTER UNDER INVESTIGATION.

(3) RPA IN BIGOGWE REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE TOOK PLACE ON NIGHT 14/15 FEB 95 NEAR MUTURA COMMUNE GR 3223 BETWEEN RPA SOLDIERS AND BANDITS WHO HAD INFILTRATED INTO THE COUNTRY FROM ZAIRE. TWO BANDITS WERE KILLED AND ONE RPA SOLDIER WAS INJURED.

(4) ON 15 FEB AT ABOUT 2355 HRS, THERE WAS A 30 SECS FIRING OF MACHINE GUN CLOSE TO TUNBATT LOC AT KABALI GR 3018. THREE RPG ROUNDS WERE ALSO FIRED. INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE SHOOTING WAS BY CATTLE RUSTLERS TO PREVENT INTERVENTION BY UNAMIR TROOPS. NO CAS WAS SUSTAINED BY UNAMIR TROOPS.

(5) MED STAFF TREATED 149 LOCAL IN AOR.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) 445 IDPs ARRIVED NDERA CAMP. 460 IDPs EVAC BY UNHCR TO KIGALI CITY, NGENDA AND KIBUNGO.

(3) 60 IDPs WERE MOVED BY INDBATT VEHS FROM KIBEHO DP CAMP TO BUTARE.

(4) PATROL TO TARE GR 8910, DISTRIBUTED 7 PACKAGES OF EDUCATION MATERIAL TO THE SCHOOLS IN TARE COMMUNE.

(5) MED STAFF TREATED 468 LOCALS AT BN HQ.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY STABLE DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) POLITICAL. NTR.

(2) BORDERS. FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO TRAFFIC.

(A) GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

(B) RUSUMO BORDER POST (RWANDA/TANZANIA).

(C) RUSIZI BORDER POST IN SECT 4C.

(D) GISENYI BORDER POST (EXCEPT FOR UNAMIR

PERS).

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS VISITED NGARAMA TO FINALISE ARRANGEMENTS FOR DEPLOYMENT IN SUB-SECTOR.

(C) AT MUGAMBAZI (GR 0403), MILOBS WITNESSED THE DOCUMENTATION OF 3,000 ORPHANS AND THEIR ADOPTED PARENTS. THE AGES OF CHILDREN VARY BETWEEN 1 AND 16 YEARS. ALSO IN KIVUYE COMMUNE (GR 9535), 622 ORPHANS AND 257 UNATTENDED CHILDREN WERE GIVEN FOR ADOPTION BY FAMILIES IN THE SECTOR.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) 28 MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT VISITED THE KIBUNGO PREFECTURE.

(C) MILOBS ESCORTED RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI TO KIGALI. ESCORTS WERE ALSO PROVIDED FOR 190 REFUGEES LIVING IN RILIMA TO KIGALI.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLLED MASANGO COMMUNE (GR 6254) TO COLLECT DATA TO UPDATE COMMUNE RECORDS AND TO FAMILIARISE NEW MILOBS WITH THE AREA. TEAM TALKED TO ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE WHO CLAIMED SOME RETURNEES WHO ARE CRIMINALS WERE HIDING IN THEIR HOMES FOR FEAR OF BEING IDENTIFIED. TEAM HAS REPORTED THAT UNAMIR'S INITIATIVE TO VACCINATE AND IMMUNISE LOCALS HAD PROMPTED THE LOCAL MEDICAL AUTHORITIES TO PLAN TO UNDERTAKE THE SAME EXERCISE ON 16 FEB 95.

(C) PATROLS WERE ALSO CONDUCTED IN BULINGA (GR 0079) AND NYABIKENKE (GR 7492) TO GATHER INFORMATION ON COMMUNES RECENTLY INCLUDED IN SECTOR 3. TWO BRIDGES AT BULINGA AND 3 AT NYABIKENKE WERE FOUND TO BE IMPASSABLE FOR LARGE VEHICLES.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLLED MBUGA (GR 4224), MURAMBI (GR 5128), AND KARAMBI (GR 5622) AS PART OF OP RETOUR. AT MBUGA PATROL REPORTED IDPs WERE UNWILLING TO BE EVAC DUE TO AN INCIDENT AT 2200 HRS ON 14 FEB 95. SEE PARA 3A. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROL TO RUTSIRO (GR 3285) VISITED BOURGMESTRE OF RUTSIRO WHO WAS VERY UNFRIENDLY AND AGITATED. WHILE TALKING TO BOURGMESTRE, TEAM COULD HEAR BEATINGS AND SCREAMS FROM AN ADJACENT ROOM. ATTEMPTS TO INVESTIGATE WHAT WAS HAPPENING YIELDED NO RESULTS.

(C) THE ROAD FROM MURUNDA TO KEBITOVU IS IN A VERY BAD STATE AND IS TO BE AVOIDED.

(D) THE BOURGMESTRE OF GACUMBI (GR 1050) GAVE MILOB PTL TO THE AREA AN RPA SOLDIER DISGUISED AS A GUIDE TO FOLLOW THE TEAM. THE RPA SOLDIER WAS TOLD NOT TO GIVE ANY INFORMATION TO THE TEAM. A FURTHER VISIT TO THE AREA IS PLANNED.

(E) PATROL TO KALINDA INVESTIGATED REPORTS OF A MEASLES OUTBREAK IN THE AREA AND CONFIRMED THAT THE NUMBER OF CASES WAS INCREASING.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE LOCAL POPULATION WAS REPORTED TO BE STILL UNEASY ABOUT THE RECENT SPATE OF RPA ARRESTS. RPA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE IMPOSED A CURFEW IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE SECTOR.

(C) MILOBS MONITORED THE EVACUATION OF 41 REFUGEES FROM BUGARAMA TO THE NYAGATARE CAMP. PATROLS IN OTHER PARTS OF THE SECTOR INDICATED AN UNEASY SECURITY SITUATION.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) MILOBS ATTENDED A CONFERENCE TO COORDINATE A CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR THE EVACUATION OF GOMA REFUGEES IN THE EVENT OF A VOLCANIC ERUPTION. THE DEGREES OF PREPAREDNESS WERE ALSO ARRANGED. THE CONFERENCE WAS ATTENDED BY ICRC REP AND HAC REPS.

(B) MILOBS ALSO MONITORED AN ORGANISED RETURN OF REFUGEES FROM KIBUMBA CAMP IN ZAIRE TO GISENYI. REFUGEES WERE BEING REGISTERED AND EVACUATION TO

HOME COMMUNES LIKELY TO TAKE PLACE ON 16 FEB 95.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI CONDUCTED PTLs IN GIKOMERO AND KACYIRU COMMUNES TO FAMILIARISE THE NEW MILOBS TO THE AOR.

L. FORCE ENGR COY

- (1) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.
- (2) STARTED WORK ON THE LAUNCHING OF BRIDGING AT BUSORO.
- (3) PROVIDED THREE DUMPERS FOR CARRIAGE OF EARTH FOR PREPARING POL DUMP IN LOGISTIC BASE.

M. AUSMED.

- (1) SPT FORCE PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.
- (2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED A TOTAL OF 40 PATIENTS.
- (3) MED SCREENING TEAM IN SPT OF OP RETOUR SCREENED 33 PATIENTS AT KIBEHO CAN MBUGA CAMPS.

N. AIR OPS.

- (1) NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. 21 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

O. UN MP COY.

- (1) UN MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDAN CIVILIAN AT UN MP COY IN KIGALI.
- (2) UN MP COY RECEIVED AN OLD REPORT FROM RPA LIAISON OFFICER CONCERNING AN ACCIDENT ON 14 OCT 94 INVOLVING A UN WATER TANKER NUMBER UNKNOWN. REPORT WAS BROUGHT FOR CLARIFICATION AND FINAL SETTLEMENT. MP COY FOLLOWING UP ON REPORT.

P. 95 FLSG.

- (1) ESCORTED SUPPLY CONVOYS TO FRAFBATT, ETHIOBATT, MALICOY, MALAWICOY AND ZAMBATT.
- (2) RECOVERY MISSION TO FRAFBATT INVOLVING TWO RECOVERY VEHS AND TWO CARGO VEHS BEGAN TODAY. THIS MISSION WILL CONTINUE OVER THE NEXT FOUR DAYS AND WILL MOVE ALL VOR VEHS TO KIGALI PRIOR TO THEIR ROTATION.
- (3) INSPECTION WERE CARRIED OUT ON THE INCOMING VEHS. VEHS WILL BE ISSUED TO GHANBATT ASAP.

6. CIVPOL.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. TWO UNAMIR CIVPOL OBSERVER TEAMS HAVE BEEN DEPLOYED TO BYUMBA AND KIBUNGO PREFECTURES RESPECTIVELY WITH EFFECT FROM 15 FEB 95.

C. THE CIVPOL COMMISSIONER FORMALLY MET THE NEW CHIEF OF STAFF OF GENDARMERIE HQ ON 14 FEB 95. THE COS COMMENDED UNAMIR FOR THE ON-GOING TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI AND REQUESTED FOR MORE ASSISTANCE TOWARDS THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE GENDARMERIE IN RWANDA.

D. CIVPOL AT GITARAMA PREFECTURE VISITED THE RPA LIAISON OFFICER WHO DISCLOSED TO THE TEAM THAT THE STRENGTH OF RPA SOLDIERS IN THE PREFECTURE HAS BEEN INCREASED. HE HOWEVER DID NOT GIVE DETAILS.

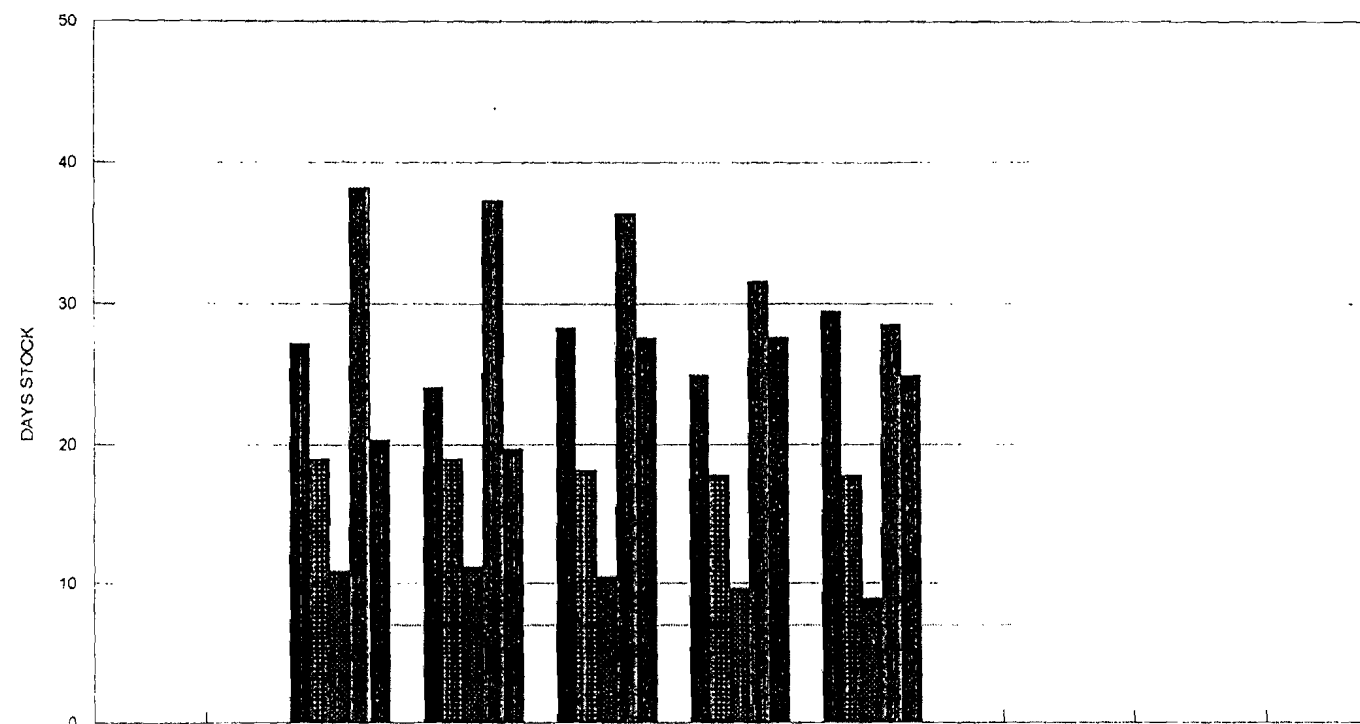

B. TAC HQ BUTARE REPORTED THAT A 20 MEMBER TEAM FROM RWANDA NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF DEPUTIES PAID A VISIT TO KIBEHO CAMP. THEIR AIM WAS TO CONVINCE DPs THAT THERE WAS ENOUGH SECURITY GRANTED IN COMMUNES FOR THEM TO RETURN HOME. DPs HOWEVER EXPRESSED THEIR CONTINUED FEAR OF UNLAWFUL PERSECUTION AND WERE DETERMINED TO STAY IN THE CAMPS FOR AS LONG AS THE SECURITY SITUATION REMAINED UNCERTAIN.

C. A MASS GRAVE WAS DISCOVERED AT RIGANSIA GR 4313 CONTAINING 60 BODIES. IT IS BELIEVED THE DEAD WERE ALL HUTUS AND WERE KILLED BY RPA IN AUGUST 1994.

ONE LOCAL WOMAN AND THREE GIRLS WERE ALSO MATCHETED BUT SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES. NAMES OF SUSPECTS ARE KNOWN. THE MOTIVE FOR THE ATTACK IS NOT KNOWN. MALAWICOY PTLs AND MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(C) MILOBS PATROLS TO MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE GR 8374 WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT THE COMMUNE REQUIRED ASSISTANCE TO REPAIR 2,615 HOUSES DESTROYED DURING THE WAR. HE ALSO COMPLAINED THAT VERY FEW DPs HAD RETURNED TO HIS COMMUNE. SEEDS AND HOES WERE ALSO REPORTED TO BE IN SHORT SUPPLY.

(D) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN RUTOBWE GR 7681 AND KAYENZI GR 8338 COMMUNES TO INTERACT WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND TO INVESTIGATE RUMOURS OF HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES. THE PATROL ALSO LOCATED ONE OF THE SEVERAL CHILDREN REPORTED MISSING IN KAYENZI AND RETURNED HIM TO A RELATIVE IN GITARAMA.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLLED MBUGA GR 4224. NYAMIGINA GR 4523, MURAMBI GR 5128 AND KARAMBI GR 5622 AS PART OF OP RETOUR. ZAMBATT AND AUSMED TROOPS PROVIDED SECURITY AND MEDICAL COVER RESPECTIVELY DURING THE EVACUATION OF IDPs BY UNHCR FROM MBUGA.

(C) AT NDAGO GR 5102, DPs INFORMED MILOBS THAT SOME OF THEIR COLLEAGUES WHO RETURNED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES WERE ARRESTED AND MISTREATED BY THE RPA.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED HELI RECCE FROM KIVUMU GR 5573 TO BWAKIRA GR 4981. THE RECCE ALSO COVERED THE BWIZA GR 3694 - MURUNDA ROAD AND THE FOREST IN THE AREA OF GISHWAT GR 3894. THE KIVUMU-BWAKIRA ROAD AND THE BWIZA-MURUNDA ROAD HAD BOTH BEEN RENDERED IMPASSABLE BY LANDSLIDES, HEAVY RAINS AND NEGLECT. TWO CAMPS WERE LOCATED IN THE GISHWAT FOREST AT GR 3298. THE CAMPS WERE ABOUT 100M APART AND APPEARED TO HAVE OCCUPANTS.

(C) MILOB PATROL TO GISOVU WAS INFORMED OF AN

INCIDENT ON THE NIGHT OF 7/8 FEB 95 IN WHICH 9 BOATS WHICH ATTEMPTED TO LAND IN NGOMA GR 2159. SEVEN OF THE BOATS WERE CAPTURED BY THE RPA AND THE ATTACKERS ESCAPED IN TWO OF THE REMAINING BOATS. RPA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED TWO LOCALS SUSPECTED OF HAVING COLLABORATED WITH THE BANDITS. THE TWO SUSPECTS ARE PRESENTLY IN THE KIBUYE PRISON.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) THE LOCAL POPULATION WAS REPORTED TO BE STILL UNEASY ABOUT THE RECENT SPATE OF RPA ARRESTS.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO KAGANO AND FAMBIRA GR 0144 CONFIRMED THAT THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND OTHER PERSONS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO KIGALI (SITREP OF 13 FEB REFERS). THE EXACT NUMBER OF PERSONS ARRESTED COULD NOT BE CONFIRMED DUE TO THE UNCOOPERATIVE ATTITUDE OF LOCALS DUE TO FEAR OF RPA REPRISALS.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) MILOBS CONDUCTED INVESTIGATIONS INTO TWO SEPARATE REPORTS OF MURDER IN BATUKA GR 3129 AND KABATWE. PRELIMINARY FINDINGS INDICATED THAT THE RPA WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR ONE OF THE KILLINGS IN BATUKA. HOWEVER LOCAL EYE WITNESS ATTRIBUTED THE MURDER OF A COUPLE IN KABATWE TO ARMED CIVILIANS FROM ZAIRE WHO WERE SUSPECTED TO BE INTERAHAMWE.

(B) MILOBS ALSO PATROLLED GISENYI, MUKAMIRA GR 4521, KARAGO GR 4516, GICEYE GR 5111 AND GASEKE GR 4904 TO MONITOR THE WELL-BEING OF RETURNEES SINCE THEIR RETURN. IT WAS REPORTED THAT RETURNEES WERE GENERALLY WELL TAKEN CARE OF BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES. THEY WERE HOWEVER LOW ON FOOD SUPPLY. MILOBS INTEND TO LIAISE WITH UNHCR TO ASSIST.

(C) SECTOR COMD PAID FIRST COURTESY CALL ON COMD OF THE RPA BDE LOCATED IN RUHENGIRI. IT WAS AGREED THAT THERE SHOULD BE CLOSE COOPERATION TO ENSURE A GOOD WORKING RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE RPA TROOPS AND UNAMIR.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(1) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

(2) COMPLETED CONSTRUCTION OF PIER FOR BUSORO BRIDGE.

(3) PROVIDED THREE DUMPERS FOR CARRIAGE OF EARTH PREPARING POL DUMP IN LOGISTIC BASE.

N. AIR OPS.

(1) NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. 21 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

(3) THE SEIZED FORMER AIR RWANDA B-707 AIRCRAFT IS STILL AT KIA. INFORMATION GATHERED INDICATE THAT THE PLANE WAS BOUGHT FOR \$1.2M BY A BELGIUM COMPANY. HOWEVER, AFTER THE SALE THE MONEY WAS DEPOSITED IN AIR RWANDA ACCOUNT AND LATER TRANSFERRED INTO THE PRIVATE ACCOUNT OF ONE FORMER DIRECTOR OF AIR RWANDA. FURTHERMORE, THE MONEY HAS BEEN DISCOVERED IN THIS PRIVATE ACCOUNT AND THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IS MAKING EFFORTS TO RECOVER IT.

(1) UN MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDAN CIVILIAN AT UN MP COY IN KIGALI.

(2) ONE LOCAL UN EMPLOYEE WAS DETAINED AT UN MP COY FOR THEFT OF AN ALTERNATOR FROM THE WORKSHOP. HE WAS LATER HANDED OVER TO THE PROSECUTOR.

(3) UN MP COY INVESTIGATED A MINOR TRAFFIC ACCIDENT INVOLVING UNAMIR VEH NO 2504 LAND ROVER AND AN RPA VEH APR 037D AT AUSMED CENTRE ON 14 FEB 95. NO CASUALTIES REPORTED.

AND RECONSTRUCTION WHERE A DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE MINISTRY CALLED ON UNAMIR TO EMBARK ON PUBLIC ENLIGHTENMENT CAMPAIGN OF ITS GOALS AS MAJORITY OF THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA DO NOT KNOW WHY UNAMIR IS IN RWANDA. HE ALSO REQUESTED THAT UNAMIR SHOULD SEEK TO RESOLVE THE SOCIAL PROBLEMS OF THE IDPs/REFUGEES.

C. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGERI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IS IN PROGRESS.

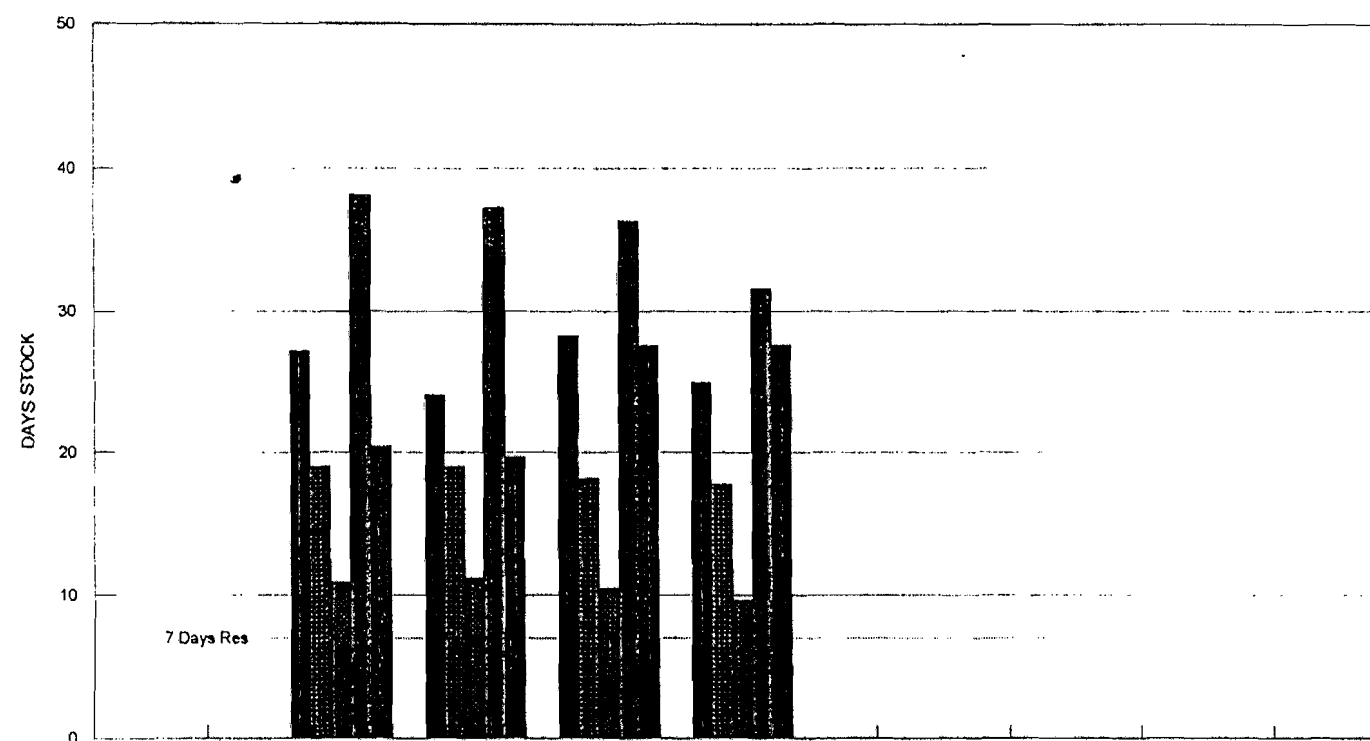

B. HE RECEIVED MADAME OGATA OF UNHCR AT THE AIRPORT AND WENT WITH HER TO MEET PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, THE ISSUES OF THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES AND THE BUJUMBURA CONFERENCE.

C. HE MET WITH THE FORCE COMMANDER TO DISCUSS THE UPCOMING BUJUMBURA CONFERENCE.

D. HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE UNDP RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE TO ADDRESS THE QUESTION OF THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES AND THAT OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR RWANDA'S DEVELOPMENT.

(A) SRSG AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR VISITED THE

SECTOR DURING THE PERIOD. THEY WERE RECEIVED BY MILOBS, UNHCR OFFICIALS AND THE POLITICAL INFORMATION OFFICER. THE DELEGATION WAS ESCORTED TO GOMA.

B. IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT A GRAVE WAS DISCOVERED AT MUHUNGUE FOREST GR 3016. THE GRAVE CONTAINED 4 DEAD BODIES WITH SEVERAL UNBURIED DEAD BODIES AROUND THE GRAVE. THE GRAVE DATES BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR

C. IN SECTOR 6, INDBATT REPORTED THE DISCOVERY OF ANOTHER MASS GRAVE AT NDERA CAMP NEAR THE MENTAL HOSP COMPLEX. NUMBER OF BODIES IN THE GRAVE UNKNOWN. THE GRAVE DATES BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

A. THE FORCE COMMANDER MET THE AMERICAN AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, H.E. MR. DAVID RAWSON, AND A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE U.S. NATIONAL SECURITY COUNCIL, MR. TIMOTHY ATKIN, TO DISCUSS THE PROVISION OF PATROL BOATS BY THE U.S GOVERNMENT FOR USE BY UNAMIR TROOPS ON LAKE KIVU, AND OTHER ASPECTS OF UNAMIR'S CURRENT AND PROJECTED FUTURE OPERATIONS IN RWANDA.

B. HIGH-LEVEL RWANDESE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS HELD SEPARATE TALKS WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF CHINA AND FRANCE IN EFFORTS AIMED AT INCREASING JOINT COOPERATION BETWEEN THEIR RESPECTIVE COUNTRIES.

C. RADIO RWANDA ANNOUNCED THAT A REGIONAL MINISTERIAL MEETING ON REFUGEES WOULD BE HELD IN BUJUMBURA, BURUNDI FROM 15 TO 17 FEBRUARY, UNDER THE AUSPICES OF UNHCR AND THE ORGANISATION OF AFRICAN UNITY. NO INFORMATION WAS PROVIDED REGARDING THE PARTICIPATION OF THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AT THIS CONFERENCE.

IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN ARMED INCURSIONS INTO THE RUBOREZA AREA ABOUT THREE WEEKS EARLIER. THE DEPLOYMENT OF RPA TROOPS HAD HOWEVER STABILISED THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA.

(2) IN SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT TWO PERSONS WERE ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN GISHUMA COMMUNE FOR THEIR ALLEGED PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE DURING THE WAR. THE SUSPECTS ARE BEING HELD IN THE GISHUMA JAIL.

(3) A LOCAL FROM MUTURA COMMUNE GR 3223 REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT RPA TPS ARRESTED HIS BROTHER AND THREE OTHER LOCALS ON 09 FEB 95. REASONS FOR ARREST NOT KNOWN. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT, A LOCAL AT NKULI GR 4724 REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT HE HAD BEEN LIVING IN THE FOREST DUE TO THREATS TO HIS LIFE BY THE RPA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. MILOBS SECTOR 5 AND HUMAN RIGHTS WERE INFORMED.

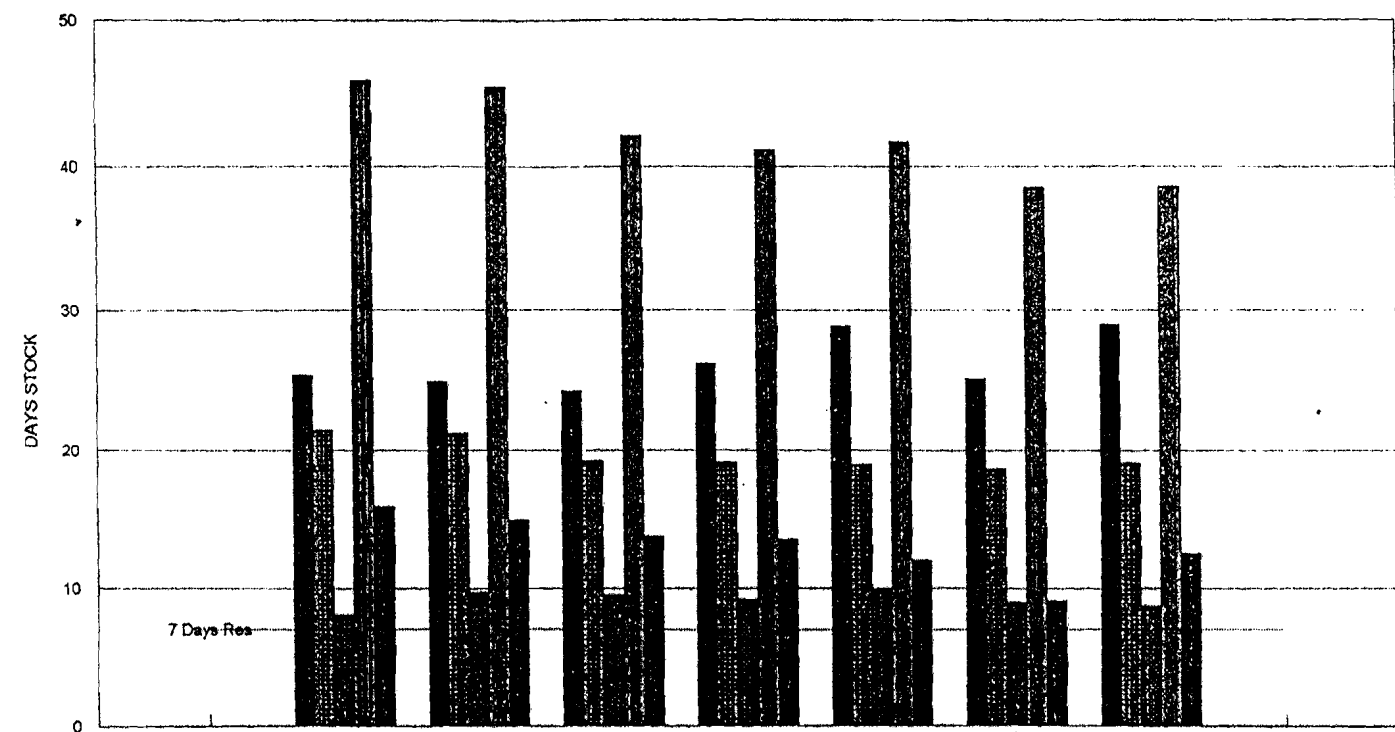

A. THE FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA, MR. PASTEUR BIZIMUNGO, TO DISCUSS THE SECURITY SITUATION IN RWANDA AND THE REFUGEE CAMPS IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES, AND OTHER TOPICS OF MUTUAL INTEREST.

B. THE NEW UNDP RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE FOR RWANDA, MR. S. HASEGAWA, AND HIS DEPUTY MET WITH THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR UNAMIR TO DISCUSS THE CONDITION OF PRISONS IN RWANDA, THE STATUS OF THE U.N. TRUST FUND SET UP FOR RWANDA, THE UPCOMING VISIT OF THE U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL DELEGATION TO KIGALI, AS WELL AS OTHER AREAS OF JOINT COOPERATION.

C. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ALSO MET THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL FOR RWANDATEL TO DISCUSS THE LATEST DEVELOPMENTS REGARDING ALLOCATION OF THE FREQUENCIES NEEDED FOR RADIO UNAMIR'S COMMENCEMENT OF OPERATIONS. THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL ASSURED HIM THAT THE NECESSARY FREQUENCIES HAD BEEN APPROVED AND THAT FORMAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THEIR USE WOULD BE FORTHCOMING SOON.

THEY ASKED THE RELEVANT JUDICIAL ORGANS TO BRING TO JUSTICE THOSE JOURNALISTS WHO BREACH THE LAW GOVERNING THEIR PROFESSION. THEY ALSO ISSUED A COMMUNIQUE READ ON NATIONAL RADIO CONDEMNING THE RECENT ATTACK ON THE RWANDESE POLITICAL JOURNALIST WHO IS STILL HOSPITALISED IN A STATE OF COMA.

(1) TUNBATT REPORTED THAT A 22 YEAR OLD MAN FROM RUBAVO COMMUNE GR 2911, CYANIKA SECTOR 2041 WAS ARRESTED BY THE RPA WHEN HE WAS ON HIS WAY FROM GISENYI TO KIGALI ON 30 JAN 95. HIS FAMILY HAS REQUESTED INFORMATION ABOUT HIM. MILOBS SECTOR 5 AND HUMAN RIGHTS WERE INFORMED.

(2) A LOCAL FROM NKULI COMMUNE REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT ON 07 JAN 95, RPA ARRESTED A MAN WHO OWNED MANY HERDS OF CATTLE IN THE MENTIONED COMMUNE. NO REASONS WERE GIVEN FOR THE ARREST AND THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE PRISONER IS NOT KNOWN. HUMAN RIGHTS WERE INFORMED.

(3) ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA PRESENCE IN MUNINI SCARED AWAY IDPs WHO WERE WILLING TO BE ESCORTED ON FOOT BY ZAMBATT TROOPS FROM MUNINI DP CAMP TO THEIR HOMES IN NYAKIZU COMMUNE IN SECTOR 3.

(4) RPA TROOPS IN NYABINAGA (GR 1450) IN SECTOR 4B WERE REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED ONE LOCAL IN THE VILLAGE FOR STEALING LIVESTOCK DURING THE WAR. THE REPORT STATED THAT THE ACCUSED REFUSED TO PAY FOR THE COST OF THE LIVESTOCK AND WAS SUBSEQUENTLY ARRESTED AND PLACED IN CUSTODY IN THE RWAMATAMU PRISON.

(5) MILOB REPORTED THAT IN TWO SEPARATE INCIDENTS ON

06 AND 09 FEB 95, TWO LOCALS WERE ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN GITAMBI (GR 8815) IN SECTOR 4C, FOR ASSOCIATING WITH KNOWN BANDITS.

B. FRGF. GHANBATT REPORTED THAT A FORMER RGF SOLDIER FROM KAGASHA GR 3968 WHO WAS HUNTED BY RPA, SOUGHT REFUGE AT KABILIZI PTL BASE. HE HAS BEEN TRANSFERRED TO BARE PTL BASE. MILOBS AND HR HAVE BEEN INFORMED.

C. MILITIA. NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) THE FC BRIEFED HIS POLITICAL ADVISOR ON THE INFORMATION TO PASS ON TO THE SRSG WHO IS ARRIVING IN NAIROBI BEFORE LEAVING FOR TANZANIA WITH THE UNHCR COMMISSIONER. HE ALSO ACCUSED UNAMIR OF BEING CORRUPT AND OF BEING PARTY TO THE GENOCIDE DURING THE RECENT WAR AND SAID UNAMIR SHOULD FACE A TRIBUNAL. THE PATROL ALSO INVESTIGATED AN INCIDENT IN WHICH ONE LOCAL, WHO IS PART OF A VIGILANTE GROUP WAS SHOT IN THE CHEST BY AN RPA PATROL ON THE 7 FEB 95. INFO GATHERED SO FAR INDICATES THAT THE VICTIM DECIDED TO GO ON PATROL DESPITE INSTRUCTIONS BY RPA LOCAL COMMANDERS TO THE CONTRARY. THE VICTIM IS ON ADMISSION AT THE KIBUYE HOSPITAL.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. REPORTS FROM SOUTHWESTERN RWANDA (SECTOR 4) INDICATE THAT THE RPA HAS IMPOSED A BAN ON ALL PUBLIC POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS IN THE REGION CLAIM THAT SUCH ACTIVITIES WOULD BE PREMATURE, COUNTER-PRODUCTIVE, DIVISIVE WITHIN THE LOCAL POPULATION AND DESTABILISING TO THE AREA.

B. THE U.N. HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION FOR RWANDA HAS COMPLETED AN INVESTIGATION INTO THE RECENT ATTACK ON THE WELL-KNOWN RWANDESE POLITICAL JOURNALIST. THE RESULTS OF THIS INQUIRY WILL BE PRESENTED TO HIGH-LEVEL OFFICIALS OF THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT WITH AN AIM TO CLARIFYING THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE ATTACK, BRINGING TO JUSTICE THOSE INVOLVED, AND PREVENTING THE RECURRENCE OF SIMILAR INCIDENTS.



THE BOURGEMESTRE OF MURAMA ALSO CLAIMED THAT THERE WERE 979 RETURNEES IN HIS COMMUNE AND THAT ANOTHER 6,000 WERE EXPECTED FROM THE RUKONDO DPC. THE MASANGO BOURGEMESTRE ALSO INDICATED HIS INTENTION TO MONITOR ALL RETURNEES AND ARREST CRIMINAL ELEMENTS.

(B) COORD CONFERENCE FOR OP RETOUR WAS HELD IN GITARAMA DURING THE PERIOD. IT WAS DECIDED THAT ALL PRESENT SHOULD SPEAK TO PRISON AUTHORITIES ABOUT OVERCROWDING IN THE PRISONS AND ALL NGOS AND AGENCIES WERE TO FOLLOW UP RETURNEES IN THE VARIOUS COMMUNES TO MONITOR THEIR RESETTLEMENT IN THEIR HOME COMMUNES. MILOBS AGREED TO LOCATE AS MANY REGISTERED RETURNEES AS POSSIBLE.

(C) PATROLS TO MARABA COMMUNE WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT MANY DPs WHO WERE NOT ORIGINAL INHABITANTS HAD BEEN RETURNED TO HIS COMMUNE AS A RESULT OF OP RETOUR. HE SAID HE INTENDED TO SPEAK TO THE PREFECT ABOUT RETURNING THEM TO THEIR OWN COMMUNES.

(D) MILOBS PATROL TO NYIKI (GR 7232) WAS INFORMED OF THE MURDER OF 3 LOCALS DURING AN ATTACK AT NYIKI IN RUSATIRA COMMUNE ON THE NIGHT OF 30/31 JAN 95. ONE OTHER PERSON WAS WOUNDED IN THE ATTACK. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE ATTACK WAS STAGED BY BANDITS FROM CAMPS IN THE GIKONGORO AREA.

(E) MILOBS PATROLS IN NYAMABUYE COMMUNE MONITORED THE PROGRESS OF RETURNEES TO THE COMMUNE AND ALSO DISCUSSED SANITATION IN THE COMMUNE AND ISSUES CONCERNED WITH HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE WITH THE BOUGEMESTRE. THEY ALSO VISITED SHYOGWE AND RULLI SECTORS WHERE LOCALS COMPLAINED ABOUT THE INCREASE IN RPA ARRESTS OF LOCALS.

(7) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN RUKONDO, (GR 5538), KIRARO (GR 5131), KIBEHO AND NDADO AS PART OF OP RETOUR. DPs WERE EVACUATED BY TPT PROVIDED BY ZAMBATT, NIBATT, TUNBATT AND IOM. UNREO HAS INFORMED THE DPs THAT THERE WILL BE NO ISSUE OF FOOD AFTER FRI 03 FEB 95 AND HAS URGED THE IDPs TO VACATE THE CAMP.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) SECTOR HUMANITARIAN TEAM HELD A MEETING WITH LOCAL REPRESENTATIVE OF MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION TO DISCUSS THE STATE OF MEDICAL SERVICES AND ORPHANAGES IN THE KIBUYE COMMUNE.

(C) MILOB PATROLS TO RUTSIRO COMMUNE LIAISED WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO UPDATE THEIR GENERAL KNOWLEDGE OF THE COMMUNE. QUESTIONNAIRES WERE DELIVERED TO THE BOURGEMESTRE FOR THIS PURPOSE. THE MILOB PATROL ALSO DELIVERED SCHOOL TEXTBOOKS TO THE COMMUNE.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE FLOW OF RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE APPEARS TO BE DECREASING. SEVERAL POSSIBLE REASONS APPEAR TO CONTRIBUTE TO THIS PHENOMENON, SUCH AS IMPROVED LIVING CONDITIONS IN ZAIRE REFUGEE CAMPS (CONFLICTING REPORTS), INTERFERENCE WITH RETURN OF REFUGEES BY FORMER GOVERNMENT AND FRGF TROOPS, HARASSMENT BY ZAIREAN TROOPS AT THE BORDER AND INCREASED RPA ACTIVITY IN RWANDA TO ARREST GENOCIDE PERPETRATORS.

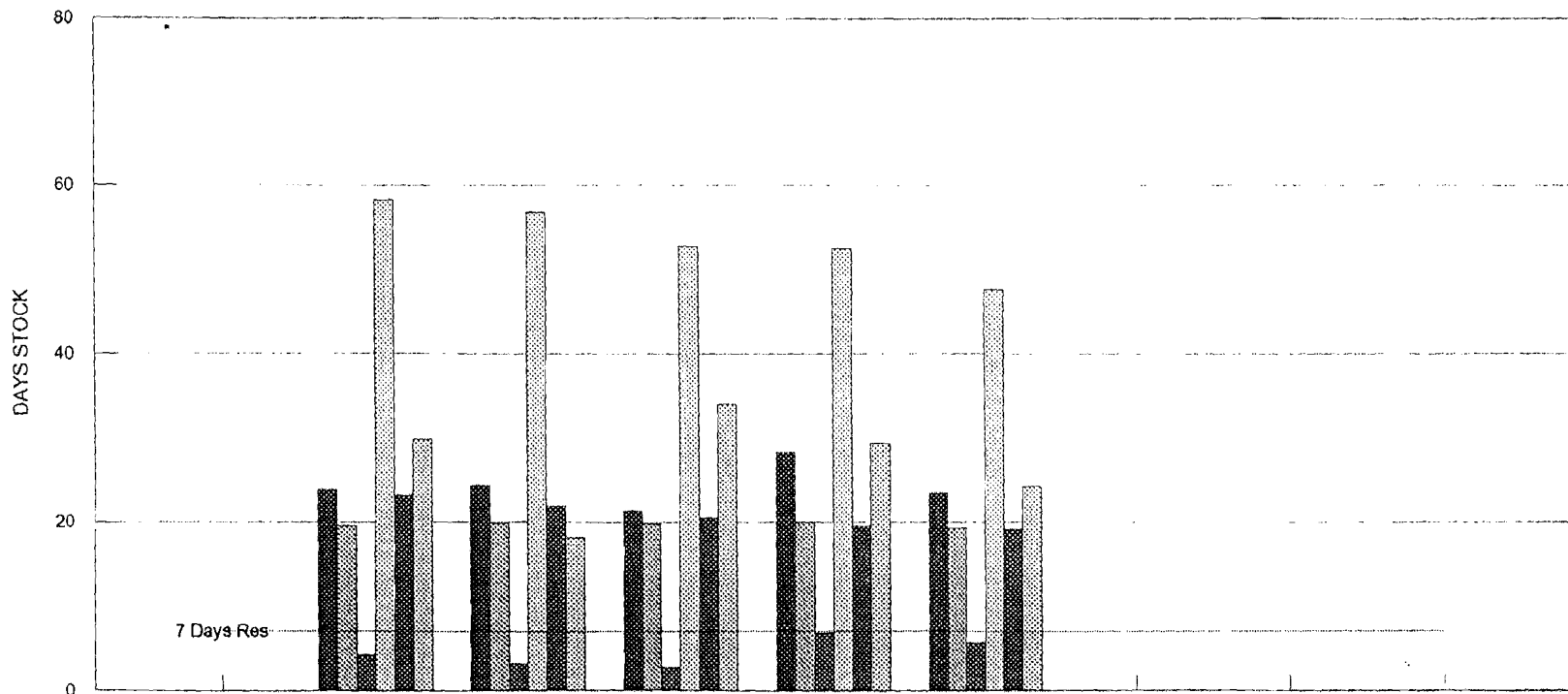

(1) IN SECTOR 2, RPA TROOPS AT NYARUBUYE GR 8460 ATTEMPTED TO PREVENT MILOBS FROM PASSING THROUGH THEIR CHECK POINT. IT TOOK 30 MINS OF NEGOTIATION BEFORE THE MILOB PATROL WAS ALLOWED TO PROCEED. IT APPEARS THAT ORDERS TO ALLOW MILOBS FREEDOM OF MOVEMENT ARE NOT BEING CARRIED OUT, DESPITE ASSURANCES FROM THE LOCAL BATTALION COMMANDER.

(2) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THAT LOCALS IN NYAMABUYE COMMUNE ARE ALARMED AT THE HIGH RATE OF ARRESTS OF LOCALS BY RPA TROOPS. THE REPORT STATED THAT THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES WERE USUALLY UNAWARE OF THE ARRESTS AND MAJORITY OF THE VICTIMS, PREDOMINANTLY HUTUS, HAVE NOT BEEN HEARD OF SINCE THEIR ARRESTS. THE LOCAL POPULATION IS CURRENTLY UNEASY ABOUT THE LARGE RPA GARRISON IN GITARAMA. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) SECTOR 4B MILOBS REPORTED THE ARREST OF THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF MABANZA COMMUNE FOR REASONS UNKNOWN. IN A SEPARATE REPORT FRARBATT REPORTED THAT TRUCKLOADS OF LOCALS ARE BROUGHT TO THE SAME COMMUNE AT NIGHT BY THE RPA FOR INTERROGATIONS AND THE VICTIMS ARE OFTEN BEATEN UP IN THE PROCESS. HUMAN RIGHTS AND SECTOR MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

THEY CITED AN ILLEGAL DETENTION CAMP IN RILIMA AS AN EXAMPLE OF PLACES WHERE HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS ARE CARRIED OUT BY THE RPA. THESE ACTS THEY CLAIM WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GENERAL CLIMATE OF INSECURITY IN THE COUNTRY.

A. MILOBS IN SECTOR 5 INTERROGATED A GROUP OF RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE. THE RETURNEES REPORTED THAT CONDITIONS AND SY SIT IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS WERE VERY BAD. THEY SAID PEOPLE WILLING TO RETURN HAD TO SNEAK OUT BECAUSE MILITIA IN THE CAMPS KILLED ANYONE WHO WAS CAUGHT ATTEMPTING TO RETURN TO RWANDA. THEY ALSO REPORTED THAT ZAIRIAN HUNDE ETHNIC GROUP WAS ATTACKING THE REFUGEES IN THE CAMPS. REASONS FOR THE ATTACKS WERE NOT GIVEN.

C. IN SECTOR 6, MILOBS REPORTED THAT 18 MASS GRAVES CONTAINING ABOUT 60,000 CORPSES WERE DISCOVERED IN KICUKIRO SUBURB OF KIGALI. THE MASS GRAVES DATE BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.
