1. Disturbing news concerning Lumumba etc. is circulating and we are making attempts to find out the facts. But, in any case, if they have been killed or if they have escaped a serious situation is bound to arise for which it is essential that you take all necessary precautions. Civilian staff should be warned and CHUC troops put in a state of alert.
2. Should the escapees turn up seeking asylum, it would be in order for you to grant it while you are seeking instructions from headquarters.
3. You should keep us fully informed regarding any developments and also the general atmosphere.

Your OPS-98 reference letters from Bruart. First dated 18 January asks our guarantee that we will oppose alpha requisition or seizure of their vessels in the ports of Kabundu and Baraka bravo hailing of their vessels transiting in those ports. Second dated 19 January asks help of UN plane to fly mail, spare parts and relieving technicians from Albertville or Usumbura to Kindu. Both questions should be answered <sup>*verbally*</sup> by ONUC Representative on spot with reference to ONUC mandate and in light of circumstances. We can only use good offices and give protection against violence within limits of available means. If critically and urgently needed parts or technicians cannot be brought to Kindu otherwise than by UN plane we might consider request for exceptional assistance forwarded with your and Ward's comments and recommendations.

1. BCK train has been blocked for several days at Bukama and Swedish train escort endeavouring to relieve it has had to repair many breaks in track and has just been involved in fighting in Bukama with 2 Swedish officers and 1 soldier wounded. Though relief operation was necessary it is clear that railway cannot operate for some time to come in view of Baluba hostility.

2. Closing of railway will be disaster not so much for Katanga which has alternative routes but for Kasai since BCK can scarcely function there without fuel and since desirable and even necessary economic relations are made impossible.

3. Every effort should be made with Balubakat leadership to support reopening of railway for purely peaceful purposes in the future. Also there will have to be a cooling off period before traffic can be resumed, <sup>will be made</sup> ~~an~~ attempt to discuss this at Luena and Bukama negotiations.

4. We shall be glad if you will take appropriate action at Manono.

1. On the posting of Brzak to Albertville, it is necessary to define the functions to be exercised by the Civilian Affairs Officers in Elisabethville and Albertville. The Albertville posting follows the division of the Katanga command which has been necessitated by the assumption by UN of direct responsibility for the maintenance of law and order in North Katanga. Brzak's responsibilities will therefore be confined to the political aspects of this operation and he must keep in the closest touch and work in the fullest cooperation with the military command based at Albertville. He will further maintain contact with the Civilian Affairs Officer at Elisabethville and inform him direct of developments of interest to him with copy to Leo as necessary.

2. The Civilian Affairs Officer at Elisabethville will continue to be responsible for the conduct of relations between UN and the Katanga authorities as heretofore. The posting of Brzak to Albertville will assist him in providing him with fuller information regarding North Katanga insofar as it is related to his general responsibilities. His relations with the South Katanga command will remain as before the command was divided. The North and South Katanga commands will of course maintain the closest liaison.
