Dear Mr. Makin:

I am sorry that the Australian representative on the Trusteeship Council was not able to be present at the meeting of the Committee of the Economic and Social Council on the negotiations with Specialized Agencies yesterday. It is, however, as I am sure you will realize, not practicable to give much notice of the exact hour and day of these meetings, that is beyond the general notice that they will take place from time to time during the session of the Council. This committee is one of ten, some or other of which are meeting daily as part of the current session of the Council; and the schedule of plenary meetings and of the various committee meetings has to be settled each evening for the following day. The schedule has, inter alia, to take into account the progress made in plenary meetings and committees each day, the new proposals and papers put in by delegations and of various time factors which govern the treatment of particular agenda items.

As the preliminary discussion of the draft agreements with the United Nations proposed by the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development and the International Monetary Fund reveal^{ed} a number of points of difficulty, the Committee on Negotiations with Specialized Agencies is meeting again today, Thursday, at 2:45. The Secretariat have, I understand, been in touch with your representative by telephone and we hope that he will be able to take part. Whether further meetings will be required before the actual negotiations start with the Bank and Fund depends, of course, on the progress made in the meeting today.

MEMBER COUNTRIES

International Labour Organization

Yugoslavia has given notice of its intention of withdrawing from the ILO in two years.

Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations

Costa Rica has become the 48th nation to join the FAO.

Preparatory Commission for the International Refugee Organization

The United States has subscribed to unconditional membership in the IRO. Her contribution to the first-year operational budget is 45.75 per cent.

Brazil has signed the Constitution of the IRO, subject to ratification.

The Turkish Government has announced that it is unable to join the IRO.

SPECIALIZED AGENCIES CONFERENCES AND MEETINGS

Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations

The Special Cereals Conference of the FAO and IEFC (International Emergency Food Council) opened in Paris, 9 July, to consider the critical world-wide grain situation. Delegations of 38 nations which include 22 Ministers of Food and Agriculture and of Economics, were in attendance. M. Tanguyprigent, French Minister of Agriculture, and M. Moens de Fornig, Belgian Minister of Food, were elected Chairman and Vice-Chairman respectively.

Concurrent with the plenary sessions, delegation experts are meeting in three Commissions:

First Commission is analyzing world cereals outlook; Second Commission is considering farm collections and retentions and livestock feeding allowances; and Third Commission is reviewing problems of general rationing and grain distribution.

Countries which have sent delegations are: Australia, Austria, Belgium, Bolivia, Canada, Chile, China, Cuba, Denmark, Egypt, Ecuador, United States, Finland, France, Greece, India, Ireland, Italy, Lebanon, Luxembourg, Mexico, Norway, New Zealand, Panama, Paraguay, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Dominican Republic, United Kingdom, Turkey, Switzerland, Sweden, Syria, Czechoslovakia, Union of South Africa, and Venezuela.

The FAO Meeting of Nutrition Experts (30 June-2 July, Rome) recommended the organization of "nutrition teams" to assist authorities of each nation toward overcoming current urgent nutrition problems. The experts emphasized the need to increase consumption of milk, butter and other vitamin-rich foodstuffs.

United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization

The UNESCO Commission on Technical Needs in Mass Communications is scheduled for 25 August in Paris. Eric Wyndham White, Executive Secretary of the Preparatory Committee for the United Nations Conference on Trade and Employment, will act as Chairman of the Commission.

International Civil Aviation Organization

The Third Session of the ICAO Meteorological Division, originally scheduled for 8 October 1947 in Montreal, has been postponed.

A special meeting of the Meteorological Division will be held 17 September in Montreal. The United Nations has been invited to send observers to this meeting.

The Council Committee on Negotiations with Specialized Agencies is tentatively scheduled for 4 August to negotiate a relationship agreement with the WHO.

Universal Postal Union

A draft agreement between the United Nations and the UPU has been initialed by Dr. Jan Papanek, Chairman of the Council Committee on Negotiations with Specialized Agencies and M. J. Lescaud, Chairman of the UPU Negotiating Committee. The agreement will enter into force after it has been submitted to the Economic and Social Council and approved by the General Assembly.

International Telecommunications Union

The International Telecommunications Conference has organized Committee D on Relations between UN and ITU for the purpose of studying the drafting of a relationship agreement between the two Organizations. This information will be communicated to the Economic and Social Council Negotiating Committee which is to meet during the 5th session of the Council.

Miss Helen Seymour, of the Division of Coordination and Liaison, and Mr. Louis Delanney, of the Transport and Communications Division, have been added to the list of UN observers to the Plenipotentiary Conference of ITU. Pending the arrival of Mr. B. Lukac, Director of the Transport and Communications Division, Mr. Delanney will act as head of the delegation to the Plenipotentiary Conference.

Preparatory Commission for the International Refugee Organization

The United Nations has granted an additional loan of \$1,000,000 from its working capital fund to the Preparatory Commission for the IRO, which is to be repaid.

Preparatory Committee for the United Nations Conference on Trade and Employment

The Preparatory Committee has unanimously decided to send its Chairman, Mr. Max Suetens, to present to the 5th session of the Economic and Social Council the Report of the Preparatory Committee.

Dr. A.B. Lewis, of the FAO Agriculture Division, will act as technical secretary and rapporteur of the Mission. The United Nations has been asked to provide a general economist, who has yet to be selected.

International Bank for Reconstruction and Development

The Bank for International Settlements (BIS), whose headquarters are in Basle, Switzerland, has declared itself ready to facilitate with all possible means the task of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development in Europe, especially by putting its monetary and economic department at the disposal of the International Bank.

United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration

On June 30, UNRRA ended its four-year program of supplying emergency aid to countries in Europe and Asia.

Preparatory Commission for the International Refugee Organization

The Preparatory Commission of IRO has assumed responsibility from UNRRA and the Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees for the future of refugees and displaced persons.
