ON 281820 B MAR 95 LOCALS OF RUNYOMBI AREA REPORTED TO OWN TROOPS THAT RPA SLDRS FM REMERA COY WERE GRABBING FOOD FM IDPS WHICH THEY HAD RECEIVED FM KAMANA DISTRIBUTION CENTRE.OWN OC RESOLVED THE ISSUE AND GAVE BACK FOOD TO QWNERS. RPA IS ALLEGING THAT THE IDPS AND SOME LOCALS ARE SUPPLYING SOME FOOD TO FRGF IN ZAIRE THROUGH BURUNDI. OWN CHECK POINT AT RURAMBA RECORDED 56 IDPS PROCEEDING TO KIBEHO FM BUHORO AND MUSEBEYA. TODAY UNHCR GAVE OUT CLOTHES AT KIGEME REFUGEE CAMP WHILE WORLD VISION SUPPLIED WATER TO RWAMIKO DPC. DCOS SUPPORT TODAY PAID A WORKING VISIT TO OWN LOC - GIKONGORO HE'S CURRENTLY ON TOUR OF SECTOR 4A ZAMBATT.

SUBJ : SPECIAL SIT REPORT-NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECT

1. DURING THE PERIOD 19-28 MARCH 95, THE NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR HAS BECOME INCREASINGLY UNSTABLE WITH BOLD ACTS OF BANDITRY OCCURRING. THE SUBSECTOR HAS NOT EXPERIENCED A GREAT DEAL MORE ACTIVITY THEN ELSEWHERE IN SECTOR 4C, BUT INCIDENTS DURING THE REPORT PERIOD HAVE BEEN CONCENTRATED WITHIN A CERTAIN LIMITED AREA OF THE SUB-SECTOR. DURING THIS TIMEFRAME, AN INEFFECTIVE, AN INCREASE IN THE FREQUENCY OF INTIMIDATING LETTERS SECRETLY ISSUED TO MANY LOCAL HOMES WARNING THE HUTU POPULATION TO LEAVE THE COUNTRY OR RISK GETTING CAUGHT UP WHEN RGF AND INTERAHAMWE COME IN APRIL TO FINISH OFF THE REMAINING AND SYMPATHIZERS.

2. INCIDENTS OF ARMED ROBBERIES AND KILLING BY RGF AND UNIDENTIFIED BANDITS SEEMS TO HAVE GATHERED MOMENTUM RECENTLY, AND THE SIT HAS BEEN COMPOUNDED BY INVOLVING RPA. THE BULK OF THE INCIDENTS ARE OCCURRING IN THE KAVUNE (GR 9740) AND MUKINJA PENINSULA (KNOWN AS ISHARA GR 0042) AREAS. THE FREQUENCY AND SEVERITY OF THE INCIDENTS HAVE LEFT LOCALS VERY NERVOUS AND INSECURE. AS THE POPULATION GETS SQUEEZED IN BETWEEN, THEY HAVE BEEN MORE AND MORE DESERTING THEIR HOMES AT NIGHT AND SLEEPING AT THE COMMUNE OFFICES AND OTHER LOCATIONS NEAR RPA AND UNAMIR LOCS. HOWEVER, MOST OF THE MOST INSECURE OF THE POPULATION HAVE CHOSEN TO JOIN THEIR RELATIVES FURTHER INLAND. SOME OF NOW BEEN, IN A SENSE, THREATENING TO MOVE THE HOSPITAL, ORPHANAGE AND UNAMIR CONTINGENT AND MILOB LOCATIONS FOR PROTECTION. THIS IS CONSIDERED VERY LIKELY TO OCCUR REGARDLESS OF AN INCIDENT OCCURRING NEAR AND AFTER 6 APRIL. BANDITS ARE AWARE OF THIS AND HAVE SUBSEQUENTLY DISPATCHED MESSAGES STATING THEY WOULD COME TO THE ORPHANAGE AND HOSPITAL FIRST TO TAKE BLANKETS AND MATTRESSES FOR USE ON UWI ISLAND. THIS HAS RESULTED IN LOCALS REQUESTING THE SET UP OF PROTECTIVE CAMPS TO BE MANNED BY UNAMIR TROOPS.

REACTION BY ETHIOBAT AND RPA

3. BOTH GROUPS HAVE ACKNOWLEDGED THE CHANGE IN THE SITUATION, PARTICULARLY IN THE KAVUNE AREA, WHERE ROBBERIES AND MURDERS ARE TAKING PLACE ON A DAILY BASIS. LOCAL RPA BLAME THE SUCCESS OF THE BANDITS ON THE POOR COORDINATION BETWEEN THEMSELVES AND ETHIOBAT. HOWEVER, THE RPA ALSO CLAIM THAT ROBBERIES ARE STAGED BY THE PEOPLE TO CREATE THE OPPORTUNITY FOR GETTING THEIR PROPERTY TO UWI ASAP AND THEN FOLLOW LATER. THIS MAY BE TRUE IN ONE OR TWO CASES, BUT TOO MANY INCIDENTS INVOLVE TORTURE AND KILLING, AND THE RPA LOGIC IN THIS RATIONOALIZATION IS QUESTIONABLE. IT MUST BE NOTED THAT RPA ARE INDEED OFTEN INITIALLY CONSIDERED RESPONSIBLE DUE TO PAST CIRCUMSTANCES; HOWEVER, ALTHOUGH SOME INCIDENTS ARE THOUGHT TO BE RPA RESPONSIBLE, THE BULK OF INCIDENTS ARE STRONGLY BELIEVED TO BE RGF/INTERAHAMWE/BANDITS...PICK ONE...WITH SOME OF THE CULPRITS IDENT BY LOCALS AS BEING FORMER MIL/CIV OFFICIALS FORM THE COMMUNE.

INCIDENTS INVOLVE TORTURE AND KILLING, AND THE RPA LOGIC IN THIS RATIONIALIZATION IS QUESTIONABLE. IT MUST BE NOTED THAT RPA ARE INDEED OFTEN INITIALLY CONSIDERED RESPONSIBLE DUE TO FAST CIRCUMSTANCES; HOWEVER, ALTHOUGH SOME INCIDENTS ARE THOUGHT TO BE RPA RESPONSIBLE, THE BULK OF INCIDENTS ARE STRONGLY BELIEVED TO BE RGF/INTERAHAMWE/BANDITS...PICK ONE...WITH SOME OF THE CULPRITS IDENT BY LOCALS AS BEING FORMER MIL/CIV OFFICIALS FORM THE COMMUNE.

4. ETHIOBAT IN TURN BLAME MUCH OF THE BANDITRY ON THE RPA STATING THAT UWI PEOPLE DO NOT COME TO KILL RPA, BUT RATHER TO GET FOOD AND MONEY. LOC ETHIOBAT COMD APPEAR TO BELIEVE THAT THE BANDITRY DOMINANCE IS DUE TO VIOLATION OF OPERATIONAL ORDERS BY RPA WHO HAVE DELIBERATELY DEPLOYED INTO ETHIOBAT AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY, AND THEREBY ALSO SUBJECTING THEIR PATROLS TO ACCIDENTAL ENCOUNTERS.

5. THE MANDATE AND PRECISE REASONING FOR DEPLOYMENT OF UNAMIR ARMED TROOPS IN A DEFENSIVE AND POTENTIAL CONFRONTATIONAL MANNER IS NOT KNOWN BY MILOBS 4C. REGARDLESS, ON 27 MARCH AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY WERE REDEFINED WITH ETHIOBAT BASICALLY TAKING CHARGE OF THE LAKESHORES FROM GR 979 417 TO AREA GR 003 418, AS WELL AS THE RESIDENCE/OFFICE OF SUB-SECTOR MILOBS AND GERMAN DOCTORS STAFF LOCS IN NYAMASHEKE, THE ORPHANAGE AND THE HOSPITAL. THE DEPLOYMENT ALSO REQUIRES VEH PATROLS OF THE MAIN ROAD. THE REST BELONGS TO THE RPA.

SUMMARY OF INCIDENTS- KAVUNE AND ISHARA AREA FROM 19 TO 26 MARCH 95

6. THE FOL IS REPORTED IN CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER:
- A. ON 19 MAR AT NYAMASHEKE FOUR SEPARATE ROBBERIES OCCUR NEAR THE HOME OF THE RPA LOCAL COMMANDER. NO ONE KILLED OR SEVERELY INJURED.
 - B. ON 20 MAR AT MUBUMBANO A ROBBERY OCCURS RESULTING IN MOTHER AND FATHER BEING SEVERELY WOUNDED CHOPPED WITH MACHETES.
 - C. ON 21 MAR AT KAVUNE THREE SERIOUS ARMED ROBBERIES OCCUR WITH HOMES COMPLETELY EMPTIED. PEOPLE ASSAULTED, BUT NO DEATHS.
 - D. ON 22 MAR SEVERAL ARMED ROBBERIES AT ISHARA INCLUDING SKIRMISHES WITH RPA. TWO CIVILIANS SHOT AND SERIOUSLY WOUNDED BY THE BANDITS. IT IS NOW NOTICED THAT RGF ARE ACTING IN GPS OF 30(PLUS) AND LAYING AMBUSHES AGAINST RPS.
 - E. 23 MAR CONTACT AT KAVUNE BETWEEN RPA AND BANDITS. ONE RPA SOLDIER SERIOUSLY WOUNDED.
 - F. 23 MAR AT ISHARA SOME BOATS ARE OBSERVED AND ENGAGED BY RPA. HEAVY AUTOMATIC FIRE IS RETURNED FROM THE BOATS. NO CAS REPORTED.
 - G. 24 MAR THREE ROBBERIES AT KAVUNE OCCUR AND THE BRUTAL HACKING TO DEATH OF A YOUNG TUTSI MAN.
 - H. 25 MAR AT APPROX 1900 HRS RPA SHOT AND KILLED TWO WOMEN AND A BABY AT KAVUNE FOR VIOLATING A CURFEW. TWO MEN WERE ALSO KILLED BY THE RPA AT KIRAMBO FOR ALLEGEDLY RESISTING ARREST.
 - I. ON 25 MAR AT MUBUMBANO(NYAMASHEKE) A LONG SKIRMISH OCCURS BETWEEN RPA AND BANDITS. ROBBERY STILL TOOK PLACE.
 - J. ON 26 MAR TWO BOATS FIRED UPON BY RPA AT ISHARA. NO CAS REPORTED.
 - K. ON 26 MAR AT KAVUNE A LARGE ROBBERY OCCURS AT A HOME RESULTING IN EVERYTHING STOLEN. NO CAS REPORTED.

7. THIS SPECIAL SITREP IS INTENDED TO CAPSULIZE THE INCIDENTS WHICH HAVE OCCURRED IN ONE OF THE 4C SUBSECTORS, AND TO GIVE PERHAPS A FEELING OF WHAT FACTORS LEAD TO THE ONGOING INSECURITY OF THE POPULATION AND INSTABILITY OF THE GEN SITUATION. RUMOURS OF INCIDENTS AND ATTACKS IN APRIL ARE TAKEN SERIOUSLY, DUE IN LARGE PART TO THE PERCEPTION OF THE LOCAL POPULATION AND THE CONTINUED APPARENT EASE AND SUCCESS OF ATTACKS IN A KNOWN AREA OF CONCERN.

3. CIVIL AFFAIRS. MEETING LASTING SEVERAL HOURS BETWEEN UNAMIR, HUMAN RIGHTS, RPA AN UNHCR OCCURED WITH REGARD TO A LOCAL RWANDA JUDGE SEEKING CUSTODY FROM UNAMIR. THIS MAN FIRST PRESENTED HIMSELF TO UNHCR YESTERDAY. IT WAS DECIDED THAT HE WOULD RETURN TO HIS LOCAL RESIDENCE AT CONCLUSION OF THE MEETING. THIS MAN IS OF THE SAME FAMILY THAT WAS REPORTED EARLIER SEEKING CUSTODY FROM UNAMIR LAST WEEK AFTER THREATS WERE RECEIVED AND A NEIGHBOR WAS ALLEGEDLY RAPED BY RPA SOLDIER.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. PATROLS WERE NOT BE CARRIED OUT TODAY SINCE THE DOMO VISIT AND BECAUSE WE HAVE ONLY ONE VEH PER SUB- SECT ONLY FOOT PATROLWERE CARRIED OUT AND NOTHING IS TO BE REPORTED.

INFORMATION CELL - The IOC Information Cell met this morning. An important objective of the information campaign is to encourage the IDPs to choose to go home. The information campaign, once relaunched, should take place both in the camps and in communes. The information team plans to visit communes and camps regularly. It plans to have representation located in communes and camps to continue to disseminate information and report regularly to the IOC. The team also plans to reinstate visits to camps by IDPs who have already reintegrated into communes. Posters and loudhailers will be useful tools, as will contacts with commune leaders and leaders in camps.

TASK FORCE - The Integrated Task Force held its weekly meeting this afternoon. The Commune Rehabilitation Committee presented the emergency element of its plan, to assist the priority communes due to receive most IDPs. Particular points of focus were agriculture, food, shelter (including a plan for those who may be evicted from illegally occupied houses) and water/sanitation. A working group will continue work on the revised plan for Operation Retour.

The next Task Force meeting is to be held in the field on 3 April.

SUMMARY

Low numbers. Operation Retour continued to see very low numbers of people boarding vehicles to leave the IDP camps.

Movement into camps. Camp leaders reported that people continue to arrive in camps from communes, giving security fears as the main reason.

Future of the camps. The Integrated Task Force continued work on the plan to empty the IDP camps while respecting the principle of voluntary and safe return.

IOC staff. The IOC now has 21 full-time and 38 part-time personnel, a mixture of government officials and international staff.

SECURITY

General security situation

Progress is being made to establish a judicial system, with nominations for the High Court of Rwanda recently being announced by the government. However, there is high and growing frustration among many Rwandese people at the current absence of a functioning judicial system, and the consequent lack of action against the murderers of last year. The proportion of guilty people in IDP camps is now higher than at the start of Operation Retour.

Reaction to security incidents

IOC follow-up on reported security incidents is being improved. The Ministry of Defence has indicated that it will provide information swiftly on security incidents through its Liaison Officer at the IOC, to allow balanced reporting. Links with UNAMIR operations staff are being strengthened for the same purpose.

Gitarama prefecture

The RPA battalion commander for Gitarama prefecture informed UNAMIR that many militia are operating at night in the 3 Gitarama communes closest to Kigali (Musambira, Runda, Mugina). As a result there have been numerous arrests in these communes reported over the past few weeks. It has also been reported that some people have recently left these communes because of the arrests. The motive for some to leave appears to be that they are guilty and fear rightful arrest. Others, though innocent, appear to fear wrongful arrest or mistreatment.

The weekly total of people transported home under Operation Retour was 521. Most of these left Kibeho camp for Butare communes. Some others are thought to have walked from camps to their homes. There was no transport provided on 13 Mar because of an RPA security operation in Butare. The daily figures were as follows:

The total number of people transported by vehicle from camps to home communes since the operation began on 29 Dec 94 now stands at 40,560.

CAMPS

Movement into camps

According to camp leaders, people have recently arrived in Gikongoro IDP camps. They are thought to number about 1,000; the exact period over which they have arrived is not known. Most claim to come from Butare communes, others from Kibuye, Kigali and Gikongoro communes.

Movement to Burundi

The chief of Munini camp estimates that 5 families leave the camp each week for Burundi. According to UNAMIR the outflow to Burundi from the south-west of Rwanda was at least 510 people during the reporting period.

Relocation of IDPs to Gikongoro

"Operation Topaz" began on 16 Mar. Arranged and coordinated locally in the Butare and Gikongoro prefectures, the operation aims to enable around 4,500 IDPs currently in the Groupe Scolaire (educational establishment) in Butare to transfer to the abandoned camp site at Murambi, 4 km north of Gikongoro. The reason for the transfer is to allow the educational facilities to reopen. The IDPs involved originate from the Gikongoro prefecture and should return to their homes in due course. A further 1,500 of these IDPs will be transferred to a newly created camp in Runyinya commune, until they are able to return to their homes.

Environment

Environmental impact studies have been carried out in Cyanika, Rukondo and Kiraro camps, by NGOs. In general, lower slopes have been badly affected by erosion. Agriculture and reforestation programmes are being prepared to address the problems found. The recently emptied Karambi camp, however, has already been almost completely cultivated with beans and bananas.

COMMUNES

Integrated commune rehabilitation

The IOC Commune Rehabilitation Committee has produced a plan which focuses on communes instead of camps. Some international organisations have agreed to this approach, including UNICEF, World Bank, WFP, UNDP and CIDA. It is essential that this plan is integrated with other national rehabilitation and reintegration plans. In order to allow the camps to empty soon, rehabilitation of priority receiving communes must be pursued urgently.

INFORMATION CAMPAIGN

Current activity

The information campaign in the camps is currently suspended while judicial procedures and the security situation in home communes are being addressed. Field officers and IOC staff are building comprehensive information on home communes to allow a more accurate grasp of realities, commune by commune, and to enable better targeting of rehabilitation assistance to communes that will receive many IDPs.

Future plans

What is needed is a powerful information campaign to be relaunched in the camps and in the communes, encouraging discipline and tolerance and giving detailed factual information about individual communes, judicial procedures and government policies. This must however be accompanied by real improvements in the home communes if it is to have any credibility with the many in the camps who wish to go home. It is on these improvements that the Task Force and the IOC are currently focusing in order to be able to relaunch the information campaign.

DATABASE

Database partnerships

UNAMIR and WHO Kigali have both provided database information to assist the creation of the IOC integrated humanitarian database. The State University of Michigan (USA) plans also to send database information on Rwanda, compiled before April 1994, covering health, agriculture, education and population.

VISITS

CIDA Visit

A delegation from the Canadian Government Development Agency (CIDA) visited the IOC on 15 Mar and 17 Mar. On 16 Mar the IOC assisted the delegation to visit communes in southern Kigali prefecture with a view to funding rehabilitation programmes at commune level. The delegation made clear their desire that the government take the lead role in all rehabilitation programming and documentation, with NGOs fitting their programmes into the government-led agenda. The IOC for its part should include all concerned Ministries in rehabilitation planning.

COORDINATION

Development of future plan for camps

The government continues to make clear its consistent policy that the camps must close. At the same time, it has publicly committed itself to the principle of voluntary and safe return for those innocent of crimes. Those accused of crimes must face due legal process. The difficult task facing the government and international community in partnership is that of combining these factors into a single, workable plan.

Integrated Task Force

The main focus of the Task Force's work was again the formulation of this plan. The latest draft, developed by a working group set up by the Task Force, will be presented to the Task Force on 20 Mar. Current strategy

While further plans are being produced the strategy is to continue providing transport to those who wish to return home while tackling the problems that are hindering innocent people from deciding to return.

Integrated Operations Centre

Work continued on integrating Ministry staff with international staff, and on training new arrivals. The total number of full-time staff is now 7 Ministry officials and 14 international personnel (supplied by UNHCR, WFP, FAO, UNDP, IOM, UNAMIR and UNREO). There are 18 Ministry personnel and at least 20 international personnel working part-time. The IOC Human Rights Cell held its first full meeting on 17 Mar. The main initial focus of its work is quick practical assistance to judicial authorities in the 13 communes due to receive most IDPs.

Integrated Humanitarian Response

The office of the Humanitarian Coordinator for Rwanda has issued a comprehensive Humanitarian Situation Report (15 March 1995) which addresses a wide spectrum of issues that impact on the Integrated Humanitarian Response in Rwanda.

GIKONGORO PREFET'S MEETING - IOC Coordination staff participated in a meeting chaired by the Prefet of Gikongoro today. The agenda concerned how to enable the IDPs to go home as soon as possible. The Prefet outlined his proposed strategy, which was similar to the provisional plan currently under discussion in the Task Force. He concluded that the Task Force should include his proposals in the plan. Planning could continue even while action was simultaneously being taken, in the Prefet's opinion. He wished to see the camps closed as soon as possible, and for the revised plan to begin to be operational within two weeks.

CURFEW IN THE CAMPS - The Gikongoro Prefet announced that there will be a curfew in the camps and their surrounding areas from 1900 hours in the evening. Start date was not announced. The markets in the camps will also be suppressed - again, start date not known.

ECHO representatives visited the IOC today and announced their intention to participate in IOC meetings, with a full-time presence in the IOC.

BYUMBA SHOOTING - Investigations into the Byumba shooting incident are continuing with new evidence providing a different perspective from what initial reports indicated.

Gisunzu Camp. Since 13 Mar 48 people have arrived, principally from Huye, Maraba, and Runyina. 260 people left Gisunzu for southern camps during the same period.

Kibeho Camp. An IOC team accompanied BBC and Norwegian journalists to Kibeho camp today. The main preoccupation of the IDPs spoken to was the fact that the judicial system has yet to function. Political and ethnic problems were due to politicians who set one ethnic group against another. Ordinary people were not the root cause of the problem. The IDPs expressed a desire for frequent visits to the camp by senior government officials.

Mr Robin Cook, UK Shadow Minister for Foreign Affairs, visited the IOC this afternoon: a thoroughly successful visit.

Operation Topaz. The new camp in Runyinya, established for IDPs moving from Groupe Scolaire in Butare, has no water supply. 400 of them have so far arrived in Runyinya. IOC has this afternoon contacted Unicef, who will take urgent action to provide water for them.

The process is taking time but is making progress. The team working on the plan is working under the supervision of the Integrated Task Force.

1. GENERAL SITUATION. THE GENERAL SIT REMAINS UNCHANGED WITH A SPATE ROBBERIES TAKING PLACE IN THE SEC. THERE HAVE BEEN FOUR ARMED ROBBERIES IN THE AREA IN THE LAST 24HRS. THE MODUS OPERANDI WAS SIMILAR TO THE PREVIOUS INCIDENTS IN WHICH ARMED THE BANDITS COME IN UNIFORM USING BOATS AT NIGHT. GENERALLY HOUSEHOLD GOODS ARE STOLEN ALONG WITH LIVESTOCK. THE FIRING IS RESTORED TO ONLY WHEN ESSENTIAL. IT IS NOW FIRMLY BELIEVED THAT THESE ROBBERIES ARE BEING CARRIED OUT BY THE RANKS OF RGF. RECENTLY THERE HAS BEEN AN INCREASED IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES IN THE AREA OF BUGARAMA THOUGH NO PATTERN HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED AS YET IN THIS AREA. Security Council. The 6 Mar informal consultations focussed on Rwanda. A report of the mission was tabled as a result of the Council representative visit of 12/13 Feb 95. No action was required of the Council. In brief the Council concluded that the Rwandan Govt should intensify efforts (and continue the lead role) regarding security for refugees/returnees. The Rwandan representative also reminded the Council that Rwanda now had a multi-party National Govt, open to all except those guilty of humanitarian crimes. The govt had also integrated, without assistance, some 3,000 former armed forces pers. Further to the Council report, concerns of National Security, return of refugees (not politically based), the judiciary (lack of qualified pers), property rights (new and old case refugee claims) and the arms embargo (restricting security capabilities) were highlighted as major concerns of the Govt. France further developed judiciary discussion, suggesting International assistance to provide French-speaking magistrates and court officers.

Administration

IOC Staffing. The MINIREISO full time representation is now six staff with another Ops member commencing training today.

Information Aquisition - AUSMED (Med Ops) has released data bases for use by IOC and will continue to provide regular updates. WHO are expected to release their complete information base this week.

Transport Cell - The Transport Cell Meeting in Gisenyi has resulted in another meeting to be conducted in Kigali on Tue 14 Mar 95 with MINIREISO staff. Focus will be on Refugee repatriation. Details of both meetings will be forwarded.

SUMMARY

Security

Security issues continued to dominate Operation Retour. A key local government official was shot dead. Numbers of displaced people willing to return home remained low. No major incidents, however, were reported in the camps, whose populations have largely stabilised after the recent large movements.

Action required

Operation Retour has entered a phase which requires determined action to address the major factors discouraging people from returning home. To this end the Integrated Task Force has decided to establish a Justice/Human Rights Cell and a revised Security/Military Liaison Cell within the IOC. In addition more government personnel have been made available to work alongside their international counterparts in the IOC.

SECURITY

Incidents confirmed

Security concerns remain the single biggest reason for people not wishing to return home from camps. False rumour is partly responsible, but a number of confirmed security incidents have added to people's fears.

Prefet murdered

The prefet of Butare, M. Pierre Claver Rwangabo, a key government official, was shot dead in his car at 2100 hours on 4 March about 5 km north of Butare. His son and his driver were also killed, and his RPA guard wounded. There were reportedly 5 assailants in jeans and long coats. Their identity is still not known. The funeral of the prefet was held today, 6 March.

Two bourgmestres arrested

The former acting bourgmestre of Nyamagabe (the commune in which Gikongoro town lies) and the former acting bourgmestre of Rukondo were arrested on suspicion of participation in genocide. Enquiries continue.

UNAMIR post attacked

UNAMIR reported that a UNAMIR guard post in Byumba was attacked with 2 grenades on 5 March. Two soldiers were injured. It is not known who was responsible for the attack.

Follow-up to 14 Feb incident

The Operation Retour Weekly Report dated 20 Feb reported the abduction of a businessman from Gatigita village near Mbuga camp on 14 Feb. Investigations have since revealed that after being abducted by the RPA, the man spent 4 days in Muko jail followed by 3 days in Kaduha jail. He was then released without charge and is now at home. Reports that he was robbed and assaulted are still being investigated by the RPA.

NUMBERS

Numbers of people transported from camps to their homes remained low, largely because of security fears. The total for the week was 582, the majority of whom moved from Kibeho camp to Butare communes. The total figure transported by vehicle from camps since Operation Retour began on 29 Dec 94 now stands at 39,199. A substantial unknown number of others have walked home. No transport was provided on 2 March because of the UN holiday. Daily figures were as follows:

CAMPS

Situation stabilising

Kibeho camp was reported relatively calm since the killing of 3 inhabitants on 26 Feb by the RPA. Investigations continue into the details of that incident. No major incidents were reported in other camps. Population movements between camps are now small. The camps appear to have stabilised after the emptying of more northern camps seen over the past few weeks.

Remaining camp sizes

The camps now remaining are Kibeho (approx 120,000); Kamana (approx 34,000); Ndago (approx 55,000); Munini (approx 21,000); Rwamiko (approx 22,000); Ruramba (approx 11,000); Nyamigina (approx 2,000); Bivumu/Gisunzu (approx 2,000); Buhoro (approx 8,500) and Musebeya (approx 2,000). Of these, all but Musebeya are supplied with regular food distribution by the ICRC. Because of recent movements the population figures are far from precise. They do however give a rough indication of IDP distribution, and an approximate total IDP population for the Gikongoro area in excess of 270,000.

STRATEGY

The current transport strategy is to provide transport for those who wish to take advantage of it. There is a steady but small flow of people, particularly from Kibeho camp, willing to be transported home. The Integrated Task Force is examining options for the future of the camps now that movements between camps have reduced. In the meantime it continues to address the security and other issues that are discouraging most IDPs from returning home.

Integrated humanitarian database

With the assistance of DeLorme Mapping USA, and their non-profit arm ResponseNet, an integrated humanitarian database is being created in the IOC using digital mapping. A number of international organisations have indicated their willingness to contribute to the system, which is some weeks away from being fully operational.

COORDINATION

Integrated Task Force Field Visit

The Integrated Task Force visited Kibeho camp, Runyinya commune and Butare on 27 Feb. At Kibeho they interviewed eye-witnesses of the killings of 3 people the previous day by the EPA. A large meeting was held at which questions were put by residents and responded to by the Task Force chairman, the Director-General of the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Social Reintegration. The population was jumpy, evidenced by near panic when a scare was started by ringleaders in the crowd. At Butare the Task Force discussed current operations with Operation Retour field partners and with the prefects of Butare and Gikongoro. The need for clear arrest procedures to be understood and followed was highlighted. The Task Force also received reports of recent attacks on communes apparently committed by people travelling from IDP camps or from Burundi.

New Justice/Human Rights Cell

The Task Force has requested high-level Ministry of Justice assistance to address issues concerning judicial and arrest procedure. A new Justice/Human Rights Cell in the IOC will follow these issues.

New Security/Military Liaison Cell

Similarly, the Ministry of Defence has been requested to assist work on improving security in general and respond to individual security incidents in particular. A new Security/Military Liaison Cell in the IOC will provide a forum for this.

Ministry personnel assigned to IOC

A number of government Ministry personnel have been assigned to the IOC to work alongside their international counterparts. The aim is to ensure integration of operational discussion, decision and action at every level, with the government taking the lead. The Ministry of Rehabilitation and Social Reintegration has provided most government personnel. Other Ministries involved are Defence, Interior, Justice, Planning, Information, Public Works and Health.

SECURITY INCIDENTS - Security incidents recently reported include a figure of 21 people reported killed in Kibungo prefecture in the month of February, according to the Prefet of Kibungo. A number of others are reported missing. Further reports are awaited. In particular it will be important to establish whether the situation is improving or worsening, and what can be done to improve security and confidence.

TRANSPORT CELL - The Transport Cell weekly meeting was today held at Gisenyi. It was organised by IOM at the UNHCR Office in Gisenyi. The main objective of the meeting was to increase the dialogue on transport issues between the Agencies working across the borders on the Rwandan problem.
