## **NEW PRIME MINISTER OF JAPAN**

**Following** the "landslide" victory in the general election by the opposition Democratic Party of Japan (DPJ) on 30 August, **Yukio Hatoyama**, 62, was today appointed the 93<sup>rd</sup> Prime Minister of Japan at plenary sessions of both the House of Representatives and the House of Councillors. He received 327 votes from the 480 members of the House of Representatives and 124 votes from the 237 votes cast in the House of Councillors. He will lead a coalition government of the DPJ, the Social Democratic Party and the People's New Party.

Mr. Hatoyama is considered to be politically middle of the road. He has promised to create a "people-oriented society", increase social welfare spending, and to "restore true democracy" by strengthening the functions of the Prime Ministership and limiting the power of the bureaucracy. The new Prime Minister intends to place a stronger emphasis on the United Nations and its activities in the foreign policy of his Cabinet.

Mr. Hatoyama, accompanied by the new Foreign Minister **Katsuya Okada**, the former DPJ Secretary-General, is coming to New York next week to participate in the Climate Change Summit, as well as to address the General Assembly and Security Council. He will also meet with the Secretary-General and other world leaders.

Please find attached, for the consideration and approval by the Secretary-General, a draft customary letter of congratulations to the new Prime Minister of Japan.
