GENERAL

SAC CMO

1. AS STATED IN ANNEX A, IT IS A UNIT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO OBTAIN AMMUNITION FROM THE HOME COUNTRY.
2. AMMUNITION USED FOR TRAINING PURPOSES IS A UNIT'S RESPONSIBILITY AND WILL NOT BE PAID FOR BY THE UNITED NATIONS.
3. ADDITIONAL AMMUNITION FOR PERSONAL WEAPONS (WHICH IS REIMBURSED THROUGH THE USAGE FACTOR, THE USD 5.00 PER MAN PER MONTH FOR PERSONAL WEAPONS AND AMMUNITION) WILL NOT BE PAID FOR BY THE UNITED NATIONS.

AMMUNITION REIMBURSED BY UNITED NATIONS

4. AMMUNITION USED FOR THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES IS TO BE REIMBURSED BY THE UNITED NATIONS.
 - A. WHEN SO INSTRUCTED BY THE MISSION (OPERATIONS BRANCH WILL IN ALL CASES SUBMIT WRITTEN ORDERS TO THE UNITS CONCERNED IN ADVANCE).
 - B. AMMUNITION USED IN INCIDENTS INCLUDING USE OF WEAPONS, LOSS OF AMMUNITION.
 - C. PYROTECHNICS, FLARES ETC. USED AS SURVEILLANCE MEANS IN ACTION OR WHEN PATROLLING.

6. ATTACHED TO THE CLAIM MUST BE AT LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS:
 - A. A WRITTEN ORDER FROM THE MISSION FOR USE OF THE SAME AMOUNT OF AMMUNITION.
 - B. "QUARTERLY REPORT OF AMMUNITION HOLDINGS" WHICH ARE CERTIFIED BY THE MISSION THAT THE AMOUNT OF AMMUNITION IN THE COLUMN QUANTITY EXPENDED (OPS) HAS BEEN REALLY EXPENDED FOR OPERATIONAL PURPOSES.
7. THE DIFFERENT CONTINGENTS OR UNIT COS ARE RESPONSIBLE THEMSELVES FOR COLLECTING THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS AND SUBMITTING THEM TO THEIR HOME COUNTRIES (SEE ANNEX C AMMUNITION REPORT).

Date: 27th June, 1994

1. Overview/Security:

UNAMIR are now pressing forward with their mandate to implement a ceasefire. There are reports that RPF militia and interahamwe are confused in regard to apparent French policy of disarming their personnel at their roadblocks to affect security for local civilian populations. Sporadic heavy fighting in Kigali is still causing approximately 100 casualties daily.

2. Humanitarian Operations:

(a) critical Needs:

No change from sitrep of June 23rd.

(b) Distributions:

Sisters of Charity:

- 71# Cartons 4kg W/Energy Biscuits (UNICEF)
- 126# Tins 300g Sardines (French Gov)
- 4# Cartons 13.68kg W/Energy Milk Powder (French Gov)

(c) Visits:

The Team visited Ndera, a displaced center 8 kms east of Kigali. RPF report 15,000 persons in the general area whom they advise are having to walk greater distances to find food in the fields. RPF requested that World Food Programme bring food for these people. The Team did not see 15,000 persons during their visit and observed some local people arriving with 50kg sacks of food while departing. Prior to the conflict, Ndera was a mental hospital which also provided some general services. The Team visited one of two orphanages in the center - the total number of orphans in Ndera is advised to be 300 by RPF. Some malnutrition was evident as was diarrhea and scabies. Drugs are in short supply. The Team plans to return tomorrow with unimix, biscuits, ORS and medicines for the orphans and hospital.

(d) EPI:

RPF advises that EPI is concluded at Kabuga and clearance has been requested to visit there tomorrow to confirm the statistics with the doctor. EPI will commence at Ndera either tomorrow or Wednesday beginning with the orphans. The doctor at Ndera advises he has sufficient trained staff for this and also requested that UNICEF consider additional vaccination programmes for meningitis and TB.

(e) RPF Liaison:

This has now improved with the assignment by RPF of a Major Rose for direct liaison on humanitarian interventions, etc. In response to questions from the team as to why people are not moving further east where there are lots of crops awaiting harvest RPF advised that people could only safely occupy main road areas (in that only in some areas) because interahamwe were still about in the countryside.

(f) Medical:

A further 60 patients were transferred from ICRC to the King Payoel today to relieve congestion at the ICRC Hospital. The MSP Team of 8 continue assistance and services at ICRC and King Payoel Hospitals, and the clinic at Amohoro Stadium.

(g) Personnel:

Rafael Loureiro of WFP rejoined the AMT in Kigali today (after 5 days awaiting clearance at the border). The Team's lines of communications on requesting incoming clearance with RPF and UNAMIR are now clear and again we require details including name, passport number and nationality at least 24 hours in advance.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 270600Z JUNE TO 271800Z JUNE 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS RELATIVELY CALM. SPORADIC EXCHANGES OF ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAS FIRE CONTINUED THROUGHOUT THE DAY. RPF CONTINUED TO ISOLATE RGF POSITIONS IN KYCHIRU, VILLAGE URUGWIRO, KIMIKURUKA, NYAMIRAMBO AND THE CITY CENTER. NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE DEPLOYMENT OF BOTH WARRING PARTIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED WITHIN KIGALI. MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES ARE STILL ON THE INCREASE IN RGF AREAS. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THE SITUATION IN THE NORTH AND SOUTH OF THE COUNTRY. THE FRENCH ARE REPORTED TO BE CONTINUING THEIR DEPLOYMENT IN THE WESTERN PART OF THE COUNTRY. 50 PATIENTS WERE EVACUATED DURING THE DAY FROM THE RED CROSS HOSPITAL TO KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. THE GHANAIAN MILITARY DELEGATION ARRIVED THIS AFTERNOON FROM NAIROBI VIA KINSHASA. THE FC PRESENTED UNAMIR MEDALS TO GHANAIAN TROOPS AT A SHORT CEREMONY AT THE KLA, A CEREMONY WHICH WAS ALSO ATTENDED BY THE VISITING GHANAIAN MILITARY DELEGATION.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE CIVILIAN POPULATION IN THE GOVERNMENT CONTROLLED AREAS OF KIGALI CONTINUE TO SHOW THEIR SUPPORT FOR THE FRENCH HUMANITARIAN SUPPORT IN RWANDA BY HOISTING THE FRENCH FLAG AT THE ENTRANCES OF HOUSES AND ON VEHICLES. RPF SYMPATHIZERS DISPLAYED PLACARDS DENOUNCING THE FRENCH INTERVENTION IN THE RWANDESE CRISIS.

3. FACILITATION ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED THEIR PRESSURE ON RGF POCKETS OF RESISTANCE IN KYCHIRU, GIKONDO, URUGWIRO VILLAGE, NYAMIRAMBO AND THE CITY CENTER WITH ARTY/MORTARS, HMG AND SAS FIRE. NO MAJOR CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS HAVE BEEN REPORTED.

B. RGF. RGF CONTINUED TO FIGHT BACK FROM THEIR POSITIONS WITH MORTARS, HMG AND SAS FIRE. CONTINUED TO OPERATE ALONG SIDE WITH THE MILITIA. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THEIR DISPOSITIONS IN THE NORTH AND SOUTH. IN THE WEST THEY CONTINUE TO ASSIST FRENCH TROOPS.

C. MILITIA. MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES ARE STILL ON THE INCREASE. CONTINUED TO CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF AREAS. THEY ARE REPORTED TO BE CHANGING THEIR ATTITUDE TO THE FRENCH IN AREAS IN THE WESTERN PART OF THE COUNTRY.

4. GEN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE STAFF WORK WAS CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. THE NORMAL STAFF BRIEF WAS CONDUCTED BY FC AT 0700 HRS. A SIX MEMBER GHANA MILITARY DELEGATION ARRIVED THIS AFTERNOON FOR A THREE DAY VISIT TO UNAMIR. THE

PC PRESENTED UNAMIR MEDALS TO GHANBATT TROOPS THIS AFTERNOON.

B. UNAMIR. AREA OF OPERATIONS REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE MOVEMENT OF PERSONNEL FROM KIGALI TO KINYINYA. BORDER CROSSING: 32 VEHICLES CROSSED INTO UGANDA FROM RWANDA WITH 147 PASSENGERS AND 17 WERE REFUGEES. 34 VEHICLES CROSSED INTO RWANDA FROM UGANDA WITH 668 PASSENGERS OUT OF WHICH 459 WERE REFUGEES. 11 VEHICLES OF VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES ENTERED RWANDA FROM UGANDA WITH VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ITEMS FOR DISTRIBUTION IN RPF CONTROLLED AREAS.

C. GHANBATT. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE WAS ALSO GIVEN TO DISPLACED PERSONS LOCATED AT THE KIA AND THE STADIUM. TROOPS WERE PRESENTED WITH UNAMIR MEDALS BY PC AT SHORT CEREMONY HELD AT KIA. OWN MEDICAL STAFF PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 49 DISPLACED PEOPLE.

D. KIN. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL AND HOTEL MERIDIEN. ALSO PROVIDED HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE AT HOTEL MERIDIEN AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL.

E. MILIB. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ESCORT AND MONITORING TASKS AS FOLLOWS:

(1) MILIBS ESCORTED MRF PERSONNEL TO REFUGEE CAMPS WITHIN KIGALI AND ALSO ESCORTED ICRC TO EVACUATE CASUALTIES FROM RED CROSS HOSPITAL TO THE KING FAISAL HOSPITAL.

(2) MILIBS CARRIED OUT ESCORT DUTIES TO AND FROM KAGITUMBA DURING THE PERIOD. THE LOGISTICS CONVOY THAT WAS TO BE ESCORTED FROM KAGITUMBA TO KIGALI DID NOT REACH THE RWANDA BORDER DURING THE PERIOD. THIS TASK IS RESCHEDULED FOR 28 JUN 94.

RESTRICTIONS THAT WERE IMPOSED ON UNMOM IN MULINDI SECTOR HAVE NOW BEEN LIFTED BY THE RPF. PATROLLING WILL THEREFORE COMMENCE WITHIN THEIR SECTOR WITH EFFECT FROM TOMORROW.

5. UNICEF. ALL ARE NOW IN NAIROBI AT THE MOMENT.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS REMAINED SUSPENDED DUE TO INSECURITY. THE FOLLOWING HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WERE UNDERTAKEN TODAY:

A. 73 CARTONS OF MEAL, 126 TINS OF SARDINES AND 4 CARTONS OF MILK POWDER WERE DELIVERED TO THE SISTERS OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE (STB FAMILLE).

B. AN TEAM VISITED NDERA CAMP AND IDENTIFIED REQUIREMENTS FOR FOOD. ANOTHER VISIT WILL BE CARRIED OUT TOMORROW TO

IDENTIFY MEDICAL NEEDS AND TO BRING IN SOME FOOD. THERE ARE ABOUT 200 ORPHANS IN THAT LOCATION.

C. THE VACCINATION CAMPAIGN BEING CONDUCTED AT KABUGA BY LOCAL MEDICAL STAFF IS NOW COMPLETED. THE SOME ACTIVITY WILL BE CONDUCTED AT NDURA CAMP IN A DAY OR TWO.

D. THE ICRC TRANSFERRED UNDER UNAMIR ESCORT, 45 PATIENTS FROM ICRC TO KING FAISAL HOSPITAL.

E. THE ICRC DELIVERED 44.5 MT OF FOOD TO 4,028 PEOPLE AT BUKARAGATA IN THE BYUMBA PREFECTURE.

F. THE ICRC HOSPITAL IN KIGALI ADMITTED 43 PATIENTS AND TREATED 73.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE GENERAL SITUATION HAS BEEN RELATIVELY QUIET BUT REMAINS UNPREDICTABLE. HOWEVER INTERMITTENT SHELLING AND EXCHANGES OF SAs FIRE CONTINUED IN THE WESTERN AND SOUTH WESTERN PARTS OF THE CITY. THE MAIN AREAS OF FIGHTING WERE AROUND CAMP KACHIYRU, KIMIHURURA, GIKONDO, CITY CENTER AND AROUND HOTEL MERIDIEN. THE HOTEL TOOK SOME DIRECT HITS OF SMALL ARMS FIRE. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THE SITUATION IN THE NORTH AND IN THE SOUTH. A MEDAL PRESENTATION PARADE FOR THE GHANAIAN CONTINGENT WILL BE HELD AT 1600 HRS TODAY. THE EXERCISE ON THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS REMAIN SUSPENDED FOR SECURITY REASONS. A SIX MEMBER GHANAIAN DELEGATION HEADED BY COL MC COLEMAN WILL ARRIVE KIGALI TODAY FOR A THREE DAY OFFICIAL VISIT. TWO MILOB ESCORT TEAMS LEFT FOR KAGITUMBA THIS MORNING WITH UNAMIR PERSONNEL PROCEEDING TO NAIROBI. SAME TEAM WILL ESCORT PERSONNEL ARRIVING FROM NAIROBI TO KIGALI. THE FRENCH TROOPS ARE REPORTED TO BE DISARMING THE INTERHAMWE/MILITIA GROUPS AND DISMANTLING THEIR CHECK POINTS IN THE KIBUYE AND CYANGUGU AREAS. THE RPF HAS SEIZED SOME CASSETTES FROM JOURNALISTS LEAVING RWANDA THROUGH MERAMA HILLS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE INTERIM PM OF BURUNDI HAS BEEN REPORTED AS SAYING THAT THE CRISIS IN HIS COUNTRY HAS REACHED THE CEILING NOW AND CAN EXPLODE AT ANYTIME. THE INTERIM PM OF RWANDA HAS SAID THAT THE INTERIM ADMINISTRATION IS NOT READY TO TALK PEACE WITH THE RPF. HE FURTHER STATED THAT WITH RESUPPLIES COMING IN THE RGF COULD OVERTURN THE TABLE VERY SOON.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED THEIR PRESSURE ON RGF POSITIONS IN KIMIHURURA, GIKONDO AND NYAMIRAMBO WITH ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE OVER NIGHT AND THIS MORNING. NO CHANGES IN THEIR DISPOSITION IN THE NORTH AND SOUTH ARE KNOWN.

B. RGF. CONTINUING TO ABSORB RPF PRESSURE FROM THE POCKETS OF RESISTANCE LEFT IN THE CITY AND CONTINUING TO FIGHT BACK FROM THEIR POSITIONS IN KIMIHURURA AND GIKONDO AND SOME HIGH GROUND DOMINATING THE CITY. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THEIR DISPOSITIONS IN THE NORTH AND IN THE SOUTH. THEIR MORALE REMAINS HIGH.

C. MILITIA. CONTINUE TO CONTROL AND MAN ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF HELD AREAS WHERE THEY STILL POSE A THREAT TO THE CIVILIAN POPULATION. REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN DISARMED BY THE FRENCH IN THE WESTERN PART OF THE COUNTRY.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. FC HELD HIS STAFF BRIEF AT 1900 HRS. A SIX MEMBER GHANAIAI GOVT DELEGATION IS EXPECTED TO ARRIVE IN KIGALI TODAY. A SMALL RECEPTION WAS HELD TO MARK THE MEDALS PRESENTATION CEREMONY YESTERDAY.

B. UNOMUG. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINS CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

C. GHANBATT. AREA AROUND KIA REMAINS GENERALLY CALM. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROVIDED PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE AT KIA AND AMAHORO STADIUM. CONDUCTED PATROLS AROUND KIA FROM 2200 HRS TO 2315 HRS AND 0400 HRS TO 0520 HRS. A MEDALS PRESENTATION PARADE FOR THE GHANAIAI CONTINGENT WILL BE HELD AT 1600 HRS TODAY.

D. THE PLATOON (+). AREAS OF OPERATION WAS TENSE DURING THE PERIOD. SOME SHELLS LANDED IN AND AROUND HOTEL MERIDIEN COMPOUND. SOME ROUNDS OF SMALL ARMS FIRE HIT SOME ROOMS IN THE MERIDIEN HOTEL. PROVIDED SECURITY TO THE DISPLACED PERSONS AT MERIDIEN HOTEL AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL.

E. MILCH. TWO ESCORT TEAMS LEFT FOR KAGITUMBA WITH PERSONNEL PROCEEDING TO NAIROBI.

5. UNCIYPOL. THERE ARE NONE IN RWANDA AT THE MOMENT.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS REMAINED SUSPENDED DUE TO THE SECURITY SITUATION. AN ATTEMPT WILL BE MADE TODAY TO TRANSFER SOME WOUNDED PERSONS FROM THE ICRC HOSPITAL TO KING FAISAL HOSPITAL.

7. CIVIL AFFAIRS. NTR.

8. LOGISTICS. NO CHANGE FROM LAST SITREP.

9. MISC. REFERENCE OUR SITREP COVERING 260600 TO 261800 PLEASE ADD THE FOLLOWING:

THE DFC MET WITH THE COS RGF IN THE AFTERNOON. HE EXPLAINED THE RATIONALE BEHIND THE EVACUATION OF THE FRANCOPHONE UNMOs TO NAIROBI. ON THE RESUMPTION OF THE CEASE FIRE TALKS THE COS SAID THAT AN AGREEMENT HAD BEEN SIGNED IN TUNIS AND ALL THAT MATTERED NOW IS TO FINALIZE THE CEASE FIRE SOPs AT THIS END. SITUATION REPORT # 33

A meeting between the UN Humanitarian Coordinator for Rwanda, UN heads of agencies and donors took place today. The contingency planning exercise that the UN agencies are currently undertaking was discussed. The UN agencies estimate that increased access to 500,000 persons would require US\$ 22 million over a 6 week period. This amount will be included in the Consolidated Appeal which will go out in July. The French Ambassador was questioned about the humanitarian component of the new operation. He explained that military field hospitals will be set up in the border areas where safe havens are planned.

In north west Rwanda MSF reported their plan to work with a target population of 150,000 displaced and war affected in the communes of Kidaho, Butaro and Cyeru. About one third of the patients from Kidaho suffer from bloody diarrhoea, which is suspected to be shigella dysentery. A project proposal has been made to control this epidemic.

In southern Rwanda MSF is planning a cross border operation to Ruhago (border with Kirundo/Burundi) to assist 3-7,000 people with serious medical problems (dysentery). In anticipation of future access to southern Rwanda, MSF Bujumbura is preparing stocks for a possible intervention into the area.

An MSF exploratory mission to Ruhango reported that there are approximately 30,000 displaced persons. Malnutrition is widespread amongst all age groups.

MSF has requested UNICEF support for vaccinations (cold chain, vaccines, immunization supplies and Vitamin A), domestic items (mattresses, soap, drinking cups, towels, bowls etc) and health kits for Ruhango and Nyanza.

In Kigali MSF is working at Amahoro Stadium, King Faisal Hospital, ICRC hospital and isolated pockets of displaced people in RGF and RPF areas.

In Nyanza, north of Butare where ICRC has a presence, the it is registering 15,000 people for future food distributions. This is in addition to the 11,245 people already being assisted.



SITREP COVERING PERIOD 250600Z JUNE TO 251800Z JUNE 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE SITUATION REMAINED CALM BUT UNPREDICTABLE. EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE WARRING FACTIONS CONTINUED IN VILLAGE URUGWIRO, KIMIHURURA, NYAMIRAMBO AND THE CITY CENTER. RPF CONTINUED TO TIGHTEN THEIR GRIP ON THE RGF POSITIONS IN AN ATTEMPT TO STRANGLE THE RGF POCKETS OF RESISTANCE WITHIN KIGALI CITY. THERE WAS NO CHANGE IN MILITIA ACTIVITIES. NO REPORTS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED ON ANY CHANGES IN THE BATTLE SITUATION AND DISPOSITIONS OF BOTH FACTIONS IN THE NORTH AND SOUTH APART FROM SOME FIGHTING AROUND RUNDA ON KIGALI - GITARAMA ROAD. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS DID NOT TAKE PLACE TODAY DUE TO CONTINUED FIGHTING IN THE CITY AND THE GENDARMES COMPLAINING THAT THE RGF DROP OFF POINT AT RUNDA WAS NOT SAFE BECAUSE OF FIGHTING BETWEEN RGF AND RPF IN THE AREA. THE DPC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO THE TUNISIAN TROOPS AT HOTEL MERIDIEN.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. MANY AREAS OF THE RGF CONTROLLED AREA OF THE CITY OF KIGALI WERE DECORATED WITH THE FRENCH FLAG, AN INDICATION OF SUPPORT BY SUPPORTERS OF THE INTERIM GOVT FOR THE FRENCH HUMANITARIAN SUPPORT INITIATIVE. RTLM CONTINUED TO INCITE THE POPULATION TO RISE AND VIOLET THE ENEMY. THERE ARE REPORTS OF THE INTERIM GOVT NOT BEING TOO HAPPY WITH THE NUMBER OF ENGLISH SPEAKING COUNTRIES CONTRIBUTING TROOPS TO THE EXPANDED UNAMIR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO EXCHANGE ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE AS THEY CONTINUED TO SQUEEZE THE ISOLATED RGF POSITIONS IN URUGWIRO VILLAGE, KIMIHURURA, NYAMIRAMBO AND THE CITY CENTER. CONTINUED TO MAKE SOME SLOW PROGRESS IN THE CITY. REPORTED TO BE FIGHTING WITH THE RGF AT RUNDA ON KIGALI - GITARAMA ROAD.

B. RGF. CONTINUED TO RESIST FROM THEIR POSITIONS IN URUGWIRO VILLAGE, KIMIHURURA, NYAMIRAMBO AND THE CITY CENTER. THEIR MORALE CONTINUES TO RISE AS THEY AWAIT THE FRENCH.

C. MILITIA. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THEIR ACTIVITIES.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE STAFF WORK WAS CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. A STAFF BRIEF WAS CONDUCTED BY FC AT 0700 HRS. THE DPC PAID A VISIT TO HOTEL MERIDIEN TO INSPECT AND CHECK ON THE CONDITION OF TROOPS AND THE DISPLACED PEOPLE. A SCHEDULED MEETING WITH THE COS RGF COULD NOT COME ON.

B. UNOMUG. AREA OF OPERATIONS REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES CONTINUE TO CROSS INTO RWANDA FROM UGANDA WITH VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN ITEMS FOR DISTRIBUTION IN RPF CONTROLLED AREAS.

C. GHABATI. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KIA, AMANORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE WAS ALSO GIVEN TO DISPLACED PERSONS LOCATED AT THE KIA AND THE STADIUM. OWN MEDICAL STAFF PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 20 DISPLACED PEOPLE.

D. TUN PL. CONTINUED TO BE PROVIDE SECURITY AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL AND HOTEL MERIDIEN. ALSO PROVIDED HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE AT HOTEL MERIDIEN AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL.

E. MILOR. PLANNING AND REORGANIZATION CONTINUE. THE FOLLOWING WERE TASKS PERFORMED DURING THE PERIOD:

(1) ONE TEAM MONITORED THE REFUGEE CAMPS AT ST MITCHELL AND RED CROSS HOSPITAL. THE TEAM ALSO ARRANGED, IN CONJUNCTION WITH RGF LIAISON THE EVACUATION OF DISPLACED PERSONS FROM RGF HELD AREAS.

(2) TWO TEAMS ESCORTED OFFICIALS OF MSF AND RED CROSS TO REFUGEE CAMPS AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL, AIRPORT, RED CROSS, ST FAMILLE AND AMANORO STADIUM.

(3) FOUR TEAMS WERE DETAILED TO ESCORT PERSONNEL AND LOGISTICS CONVOY FROM KIGALI TO KAGITUMBA AND BACK.

5. DECIYPO. THEY ARE ALL IN NAIROBI.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE COULD NOT TAKE PLACE TODAY DUE TO FIGHTING IN TOWN AND DUE TO THE FACT THAT DROP OFF POINT AT RUNDA WAS NOT SECURE. 70 WOUNDED PEOPLE WERE TRANSFERRED FROM ICRC HOSPITAL TO KING FAISAL HOSPITAL UNDER UNAMIR ESCORT. SOME QUANTITY OF FOOD WAS DELIVERED TO ST MITCHELL ORPHANAGE. VACCINES WERE GIVEN TO RPF DOCTORS IN KANUSA FOR THE VACCINATING OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN. THE ICRC RECEIVED A RESUPPLY OF MEDICAL SUPPLIES TODAY FOR KING FAISAL AND ICRC HOSPITALS.

AAA. MR MEDILI HAS ASKED ME TO PASS ON HIS APPRECIATION OF YOUR MAKING TIME TO SEE HIM TODAY AT SUCH SHORT NOTICE.

BBB. DURING LUNCH SEVERAL IMPORTANT MATTERS WERE DISCUSSED ON WHICH WE PROMISED TO LET YOU HAVE WRITTEN CONFIRMATION OF OUR NEEDS. FIRSTLY AND MOST IMPORTANTLY IS THE MATTER OF TRANSIT TAXATION OF THE APCs WHICH ARE CURRENTLY BEING IMPORTED FROM MOGADISHU AND USA FOR THE UNAMIR FORCE IN KIGALI. OUR FREIGHT HANDLERS (CANDY LOGISTICS) ARE BEING CHARGED THE STANDARD UGANDAN IMPORT DUTY ON THESE VEHICLES ON ENTRY. Date: 25th June, 1994

1. Overview:

The arrival of the French in Southern Rwanda has fueled a flood of unfounded rumours in RGF held downtown Kigali. French flags were evident in abundance amidst rumours of a pending French arrival in Kigali. Some displaced persons did not wish to be transferred to Kabuga (in any forthcoming transfers) amidst rumours that it might be attacked by the French.

The general atmosphere with RPF is more relaxed than that of a few days ago but movement outside Kigali still requires advance clearance where allowed. Approval for food deliveries through RPF lines must still be obtained from Mulindi. The absence of a local RPF Humanitarian Officer with autonomy to make basic decisions on local humanitarian operations is causing a lot of downtime. Access to downtown displaced centers awaits approval from RPF and thereafter, appropriate security conditions so deliveries could proceed. Kigali Airport may remain closed for the next month and in the interim, logistics will run via Entebbe/Uganda.

One hundred patients were transferred from ICRC to King Paycel during a negotiated truce while an ICRC convoy successfully delivered badly needed medical supplies to both field hospitals.

2. Humanitarian Operations:**(a) Medical & NFI:**

Vaccinations commenced today at Kabuga where the programme was carried out by local medical staff. Returns are not yet available.

MSF commenced a full surgical service at King Faycel Hospital.

(b) Critical Needs:

No change from sitrep of June 23rd.

(c) Personnel:

Bob Davis (UNICEF) out to Uganda and David Fletcher (WFP) out to Nairobi. The current team strength is 9 persons - 8 MSF and one UNAMT, and the UN and NGO personnel continue to function as a cohesive unit. The Team has an excellent working relationship with a very supportive and efficient UNAMIR Humanitarian Assistance Team. Both teams combine as one for appropriate operations.

(d) Distributions:

25# Cartons of 20kg MSF H/Energy Biscuits to Ste.Michale Orphanage.

(e) General Situation:

The major humanitarian work for the Team in Kigali is currently the treatment of war casualties. Generally speaking and hitherto, food has been available in the downtown markets (and those in displaced centers appear to have been combining their resources to meet very basic requirements). It is being reported that food stuffs may now be running in short supply in the markets. In this event it will become increasingly important to have full and regular access to the displaced centers with the full cooperation of both sides in the conflict.

D. TUM PL. PROVIDED SECURITY AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL AND HOTEL MERIDIEN. ALSO PROVIDED HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE AT HOTEL MERIDIEN AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. PERSONNEL OF THE PLATOON RECEIVED MEDALS FROM THE FORCE COMMANDER AT A SHORT PARADE THIS AFTERNOON.

E. MILOR. ORGANIZATION AND PLANNING FOR DEPLOYMENT CONTINUED. THE FOLLOWING TASKS WERE PERFORMED TODAY:

1. GEN SITUATION. THE PERIOD WAS OBSERVED TO BE RELATIVELY QUIET IN COMPARISON TO THE PREVIOUS NIGHT. HOWEVER, INTERMITTENT SHELLING AND SAS FIRE CONTINUED IN THE WESTERN AND SOUTH WESTERN PARTS OF THE KIGALI CITY. THREE NEW APCs, TYPE M-113 ARRIVED FROM ENTENBE TO KIGALI LAST NIGHT. TWO MILOB TEAMS ESCORTED UNAMIR PERSONNEL AND OTHER ROAD CONVOYS PROCEEDING TO NAIROBI/UGANDA. THE DFC IS SCHEDULED TO MEET COB RGF TODAY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE RPF POLITICAL LEADERSHIP HAS STRESSED THE NEED FOR THE FAST BUILD UP OF THE FORCE IN ORDER TO PREVENT THE FRENCH STAYING LONGER THAN PLANNED. THE INTERIM GOVT HAS EXPRESSED ITS SATISFACTION AT THE DEPLOYMENT OF THE FRENCH SO FAR.

1. Overview:

Heavy fighting continued into the early hours but eased off during the morning - 100 casualties were treated/admitted by ICRC. RPF declared UNAMIR is welcome in Rwanda. They also stated that they expect that the French intervention force will stay within their mandate or that they would fight the force.

A shell hit the ICRC emergency room killing five patients; a second shell hit an unoccupied building in the compound with no casualties. Urgently needed medical supplies were delivered to the ICRC and King Faisal hospitals.

2. Displaced Persons:

RPF report 15000 displaced at Endera, 6 kms from Kigali. The UNAMT has requested clearance to visit the center for needs assessment purposes. RPF also report 4000 persons at Kabuga.

The priest at Ste. Famille advises that 11500 displaced persons are now in the compound. UNAMIR will run a check on this as soon as possible.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS TENSE AND VOLATILE. HEAVY EXCHANGES OF ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SA& FIRE CONTINUED THROUGH OUT THE NIGHT BETWEEN THE WARRING FACTIONS. THE MAIN AREAS OF FIGHTING WERE AROUND KACHIVRU, KIMIHURURA, MERIDIEN ROND ABOUT, VILLAGE URUGWIRO AND THE CITY CENTRE. RGF CONTINUED TO FIGHT BACK FROM THEIR POSITIONS. SPORADIC EXCHANGES OF FIRE CONTINUED EARLY THIS MORNING BETWEEN RPF POSITIONS LOCATED NEAR MERIDIEN HOTEL AND RGF POSITIONS IN VILLAGE URUGWIRO. MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES CONTINUE TO BE ON THE INCREASE. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THE SITUATION IN THE NORTH. RPF ADVANCE AROUND BUTARE IN THE SOUTH SEEMS TO BE STALLING. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS FROM KIA TO THE KING FAISAL HOSPITAL WILL BE CONDUCTED TODAY. TWO MILOR TEAMS ESCORTED MR MEDILI, DIR POC UN HQ AND HIS TEAM PROCEEDING TO KAIROBI VIA ENTENNE. THE SC WILL MEET COS RGF LATER TODAY. ELEMENTS OF THE FRENCH TROOPS ARE REPORTED TO BE ACROSS THE BORDER AND DEPLOYING IN THE WESTERN AREA OF RWANDA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE RPF POLITICAL LEADERSHIP OF THE RPF IS QUOTED AS SAYING THAT THE FRENCH INITIATIVE IS AN INVASION AND WILL BE TREATED AS SUCH. RTLM HAS CONDEMNED THE DEMONSTRATION HELD IN BURUNDI AGAINST THE FRENCH INTERVENTION. THE MODERATE RWANDESE POLITICIANS WHO ESCAPED THE MASSACRES AFTER 6 APRIL ARE REPORTED TO HAVE FORMED A FRONT BY THE NAME "THE DEMOCRATIC FRONT FOR CHANGE." THE FRONT HAS CONDEMNED THE FRENCH INITIATIVE WHILE SUPPORTING THE CONTINUED OPERATIONS OF UNAMIR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. THE RPF CONTINUED TO MOUNT PRESSURE ON RGF/PRESIDENTIAL GUARD POSITIONS IN KIMIHURURA AND AROUND VILLAGE URUGWIRO WITH ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SA& FIRE OVER NIGHT AND THIS MORNING. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THEIR DISPOSITION IN THE NORTH. ADVANCE WEST WARD IN THE SOUTH SEEMS TO BE STALLING.

B. RGF. SEEMS TO BE ABSORBING THE INTENSE RPF PRESSURE OVER NIGHT AND THIS MORNING AND CONTINUED TO FIGHT BACK FROM THEIR POSITIONS IN KIMIHURURA AND VILLAGE URUGWIRO AND OTHER PARTS OF THE CITY. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THEIR DISPOSITIONS IN THE NORTH AS WELL AS IN THE SOUTH. PREPARATIONS FOR THE DEFENCE OF GISENYI AND BUTARE CONTINUING.

C. MILITIA. CONTINUE TO CONTROL AND MAN ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF HELD AREAS WHERE THEY CONTINUE TO BE A THREAT TO THE CIVILIAN POPULATION. JUBILATIONS OVER THE ARRIVAL OF THE FRENCH CONTINUE.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. FC HELD HIS STAFF BRIEF AT 1900 HRS. HE BRIEFED ALL ON THE OUTCOME OF THE DISCUSSIONS HELD WITH MR MEDILI AND HIS TEAM. E. MILOR. TWO ESCORT TEAMS LEFT FOR KAGITUMBA WITH PERSONNEL PROCEEDING TO NAIROBI. PREPARATION AND DEPLOYMENT OF MILOBs FOR PHASE 1 IS IN PROGRESS.

5. UNCLYPOL. REORGANIZATION AND THEIR EMPLOYMENT CONTINUES.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS FROM KIA TO KING FAISAL HOSPITAL IS SCHEDULED FOR THIS MORNING.



On 22 June Security Council Resolution 929 was voted in favour, welcoming the 2,500 French troops sent to Rwanda to protect civilians.

In order to support the UN contingency plan and establish an interface with this new force, UNREO is considering opening a liaison office in Zaire.

The UNICEF/WFP/WHO assessment mission in RPF held areas reported that people in the south are in a very poor health condition. They visited Ruhango (about 17 km from Gitarama) which has a population of 6,000. Half of the children are malnourished, 20% severely malnourished. All the population are hungry and lethargic. The vast majority are women and children. There has been no food distribution recently because of transportation problems and the lack of a bridge. People are not harvesting the fields because of the local insecurity and because they are too weak.

An FAO specialist (who was to participate in the assessments in RPF held territory) reported his concern that if the crops (particularly for cereals such as sorgho) are not harvested in the Byumba, Bugesera and Kibungo Prefectures during the next three weeks, people will become totally dependent on food aid. He reported that the countryside in this area is empty of population and livestock, apart from the displaced camps. WFP has reported a similar story for both RPF and RGP areas.

WFP reported that six trucks of food arrived in Kigali. Distribution began immediately at Amohoro Stadium, King Paisei Hospital and the airport.

The RPF areas are becoming significantly more difficult for NGOs to operate in, due to greater control by the authorities. All French personnel have left Rwanda.

An ICRC convoy with food has left Rwamagana with food for Kigali today.

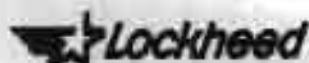
WFP Bujumbura reported that up until recently there were 30,000 Rwandan refugees dispersed in villages along the Rwandan border inside Burundi. They were unwilling to go to the refugee camps due to a fear of the Tutsi dominated Burundi army. However, since the local authorities have

given assurances of protection and assistance, people have been more willing to move into the camps, leaving approximately 18,000 at the border. Camps with Tutsi refugees are reducing in size because people are returning to RPF controlled areas in Rwanda.

In Zaire there is increasing insecurity in the refugee camps near Uvira. Groups of Hutu refugees are allegedly undergoing training and arming themselves. Cases of murder and torture of Tutsis and local Zaireans who resemble Tutsis are being investigated.

The joint WFP, AICF and Solidarite mission to RPF held areas saw very few displaced persons in Cyangugu, Gikongoro, Butare and Kibuye prefectures. In Kibuye a relatively small number is living with family and friends. There are 7,000 people living in a camp south of Butare. Caritas feeds 10,000 at a camp in Cyanika (Gikongoro) but only 500 people were seen by the WFP team.

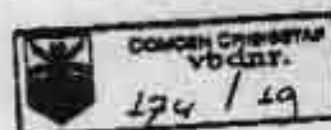

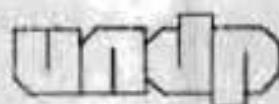

I SECURITY

60 children were killed on 14 June at Ste Famille by government militia. The children were between the ages of 13 - 17 years. The militia claimed that more RPF people were evacuated to 'safe areas' than RPF, and they killed the children to readress the balance. Radio Mille Collines, has broadcast messages that militias should not attack "innocent people" but should fight against the RPF.

On Thursday 16 June the RPF did a raid on St. Paul church to evacuate 200 people. They killed a number of Gendarmes in the process.

On Friday 17 June a Uruguayan Major was killed and a Bangladeshi Major badly injured when the RPF fired a rocket propelled grenade at the UN vehicle they were driving. The RPF claimed that they fired at the vehicle because the RPF drives a number of stolen vehicles with UN markings.

On the same day the militia attacked the Hotel Mille Collines. Fortunately, the Rwandan army sent in two tanks and Gendarmes to protect the people from the militia. Nobody was injured or killed. The following day 300 people were evacuated from Mille Collines (including 69 local UN staff). As of today, only 40 people remained in the Mille Collines.

On Sunday 19 June a local Red Cross worker was killed and at least three other people wounded when a mortar hit the ICRC hospital in Kigali. Another mortar hit the compound later, but nobody was injured.

The UN Humanitarian Coordinator for Rwanda issued a public statement protesting against the flagrant violation of UN/ICRC immunity from attack, following the attack on the UNAMIR vehicle on 17 June and the mortar attack on the ICRC compound on 19 June.

RPF lost ground to the RPF in Kigali and the south west. Fighting occurred on the outskirts of Butare and in and around Ruhengeri.

The UN/NGO Advanced Humanitarian Team in Kigali reported that there was heavy shelling in Nyamirambo throughout the week. There was also

shelling around the Hotel Mille Collines and Meridien Hotel. Access remains difficult to downtown areas of Kigali.

The French government announced during the last week that they are considering sending troops to Rwanda. The operation would come under a Chapter VII mandate (which is peace making and therefore allows the force to operate without approval from the belligerents) as opposed to the Chapter VI mandate that UNAMIR is operating under (which is purely peace keeping and only allows self defence). The RPF have denounced the offer. Today, the RPF said that they would request UNAMIR to leave Rwanda if the French army arrives. The French Ambassador in Nairobi said that between 15-20 French troops are already in Goma, Zaire.

NGOs and UN agencies have expressed concern that security is going to deteriorate in RPF held areas. MNM have left Gahini following problems with the RPF due to RPF hostility to French military involvement in Rwanda.

There were security problems in Ngara, Tanzania throughout the last week. Fourteen men suspected of perpetrating and inciting killings in Rwanda, including Bourgmestre Mr Jean Baptiste Gatete, were released from Tanzanian protective custody on the condition that they did not go to the refugee camp at Benaco. They then went to the camp. When UNHCR demanded that these men leave the camp a riot developed. The refugee leaders claimed that these men were there leaders. Death threats were given and all international staff except the German Red Cross and the Tanzanian Red Cross were evacuated to Ngara. Talks were held on 17 June with the refugee leaders. Following these talks in which the leaders gave security assurances to the international community, all UN agencies and NGOs except MSF and AICF agreed to return to the camp. It is proposed that Mr Gatete and his commune should be moved to a site 2-300 km from the Rwandan border. The number of police in Benaco camp will be increased from 50 to 300. Five people have been murdered since the beginning of June in the refugee camp.

In Burundi the security situation continues to deteriorate. On 13 June 96 Hutu refugees were killed in the province of Kirundo. On 14 June, fighting between Tutsi led government troops and Hutu armed bandits took place in the northern province of Kayanza. On 17 June a French resident military adviser was shot dead by Gendarmes in Bujumbura when he tried to enter a public building. Another Frenchman was badly injured.

II DISASTER MANAGEMENT TEAM ACTIVITIES

The UN Humanitarian Coordinator for Rwanda and heads of UN agencies have approached both the RPF and RGF authorities to allow a comprehensive needs assessment to take place in Rwanda. The RPF attitude up until recently was very positive, but changed during the last week into one of procrastination and delay. No explanation was given, and the RPF area assessment which was due to start on 21 June has been postponed. Meanwhile, talks with the RGF have not yet taken place in earnest regarding assessments of government held areas.

The contingency plan has been finalised and sent to donors. It will be discussed at a donors meeting scheduled for Friday 24 June. This planning will help with UN agency preparedness, particularly in the south-west.

The Disaster Management Team continued to prepare the consolidated appeal. The appeal will be divided into the following areas:

- Executive summary
- Introduction
- Response of UN Agencies, ICRC and NGOs during the first 40 days
- Priority areas for future assistance
- Country specific project descriptions for displaced/affected/refugees
- Operation structures and collaboration with other agencies
- Monitoring system
- Resource requirements
- Annexes

III POPULATION MOVEMENTS

WFP and UNHCR estimate that there are no more than 40,000 Burundi refugees in Rwanda.

UNICEF reported that in Ngara district, Tanzania, Mshuru is being kept as a 'contingency' site for the relocation of refugees from Benaco, and Kayonza has been identified as the third site for the movement of refugees.

UNHCR has revised the figures for refugees in Tanzania as follows:

Benaco	330,000
Lumasi	8,500
Other Ngara	5,000
Lukole	8,000
Karagwo	62,400
Burigi	5,000

UNICEF reported that the numbers of refugees arriving in Ngara district has increased substantially. Over the past week there have been an average of 3,000 people arriving per day. This has led UNHCR to review their planning figure for the region to 500,000.

IV LOGISTICS AND ACCESS

Kigali airport remains closed. The RPF have put rocks on the runway and the RGF has not agreed to not fire at incoming planes.

The UN/NGO assessments of the RPF held areas have been postponed after the RPF withdrew their support. This is going to seriously affect the consolidated appeal.

The UNICEF, WHO, and WFP rapid needs assessment for RPF camps in the Prefecture of Byumba will return to Kabale on Saturday. OXFAM, Care and Concern Ireland will carry out a further assessment of RPF held areas next week.

WFP will assist in customs clearance from Entebbe. They will also help organize transportation of goods from Entebbe to Kabale. Warehouse facilities should be available soon.

WFP reported that 90T of food are being transported from Uganda to Kigali today. This comprises 60T INAMIT and 30T Maiso.

30 WFOB trucks are being redeployed from Ethiopia to Bujumbura by WFP.

ICRC delivered 217 tonnes of food to 12,000 persons at Butare and 80 tonnes of food to 17,000 persons at Rwamagana. On 19 June, about 400 citizens of Zaire were evacuated by the RGF to Goma (Zaire) from Kigali.

1412 cartons of WFF biscuits were distributed by the UN/NGO AHT in Kigali.

UNESCO is collaborating with UNICEF in providing education kits to the refugee camps in Tanzania.

V HEALTH

The UN/NGO AHT reported that critical needs in Kigali are medical supplies, especially dressings and blood for the ICRC hospital.

UNICEF reported that 2,563 women and children have been vaccinated between 11-19 June in Kigali. A UNICEF unaccompanied and traumatized child specialist travelled to Rujumbura today. She will begin an assessment of displaced children in Burundi.

UNICEF reported that 69% of deaths in Benaco are people who come from Rusumo district in Rwanda. Many of the new arrivals are coming in a poor health condition.

ICRC reported that they are doing a medical assessment in Kiramuruzi camp (near Muramhi in government held territory in the north west). An evacuation of patients from Muhura parish (with 3,200 displaced) to Gahini hospital will take place. ICRC held talks with the RGF who agreed to not come within 500 m of the ICRC. However, since then the two mortars hit the hospital.

Save the Children Fund has a staff member in Kabale who is looking into the problem of unaccompanied children in Rwanda. The research will have to be long term (3-5 years) with registration, documentation and databases being set up. SCF is currently developing forms to record information.

WHO reported that the presence of bodies in Lake Victoria does not pose an additional public health threat for people eating the fish or drinking the water. An independent microbiological and biochemical study was carried out. The study found that although there are significant levels of pollution in the lake, there is no evidence that the pollution is either new or related to the presence of the corpses. Untreated water from Lake Victoria is not recommended for human consumption.

At an NGO meeting in Kabale ICRC reported that the situation is not "disastrous" yet but the next two months will be crucial for the harvest and the food situation. MSF reported that people are harvesting crops in the south east. Samaritans Purse reported that several thousand people in Rutare have left the camp to go home. SCF reported that 1,000 people in Manyagiro have returned to their homes. The harvest in the northwest area should begin within the next 14 days. There are reports of mines in the Ruhengeri area.

VI WATER AND SANITATION

MSP is working in two areas: Kidaho and Mutare. Water samples taken in Kidaho indicated that the water is in good condition. Dysentery figures are increasing in Kidaho. Mutare camp has around 50,000 persons (displaced and local) with a weekly increase of around 200 persons. Springs are available, but they are in poor condition and in scattered villages.

AMREF-SCF/UX are working in Manyajiro in 4 camps with an estimated population of 20,000. There is an urgent need for water here. They are also working at Yauramba with an estimated population of 8,000 and Kivuye with an estimated population of 8,000. Main concerns are the lack of pit latrines and water.

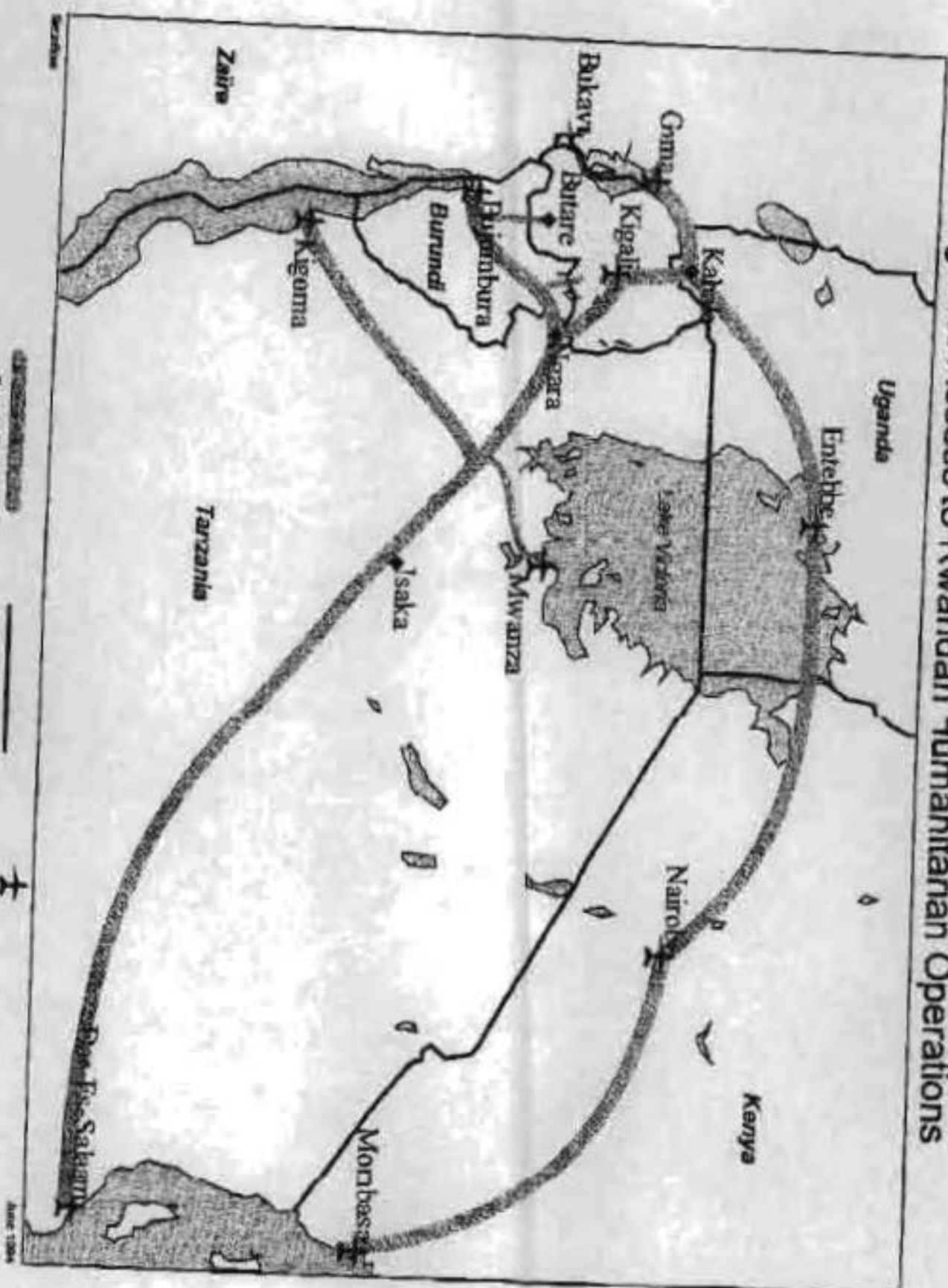
MDM is working in Gahini and Rwamagana. The current water source is a lake 150 m from the camp. A storage tank with a capacity of 15,000 litres has been installed. The main problem is distributing water to the 12 sites.

VII GENERAL

The UN Human Rights Commission has completed its preliminary research in and around Rwanda. A Field Officer/ Logistics team remains in Nairobi to continue investigations.



RESOLUTION 928 (1994)

Adopted by the Security Council at its 3391st meeting,
on 20 June 1994

The Security Council,

Reaffirming its resolutions 813 (1993) of 12 March 1993, 846 (1993) of 22 June 1993 and 881 (1993) of 20 December 1993,

Recalling its resolution 873 (1993) of 9 October 1993 establishing the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda (UNAMIR), as well as its resolutions 893 (1994) of 8 January 1994, 909 (1994) of 5 April 1994, 912 (1994) of 21 April 1994, 918 (1994) of 17 May 1994 and 928 (1994) of 8 June 1994,

Having examined the Secretary-General's report (S/1994/715) on the United Nations Observer Mission for Uganda-Rwanda (UNOMUR) dated 18 June 1994,

Welcoming the extension, as of 14 May 1994, of UNOMUR's observation and monitoring activities to the entire Uganda/Rwanda border,

Assessing the need for the observance and strict monitoring of the general and complete embargo of all deliveries of weapons and military equipment to Rwanda, as described in paragraph 13 of its resolution 918 (1994),

Considering that the issue of arms flows is one of the major areas of concern in the cease-fire talks currently being held between the Rwandan parties under the auspices of UNAMIR,

1. Welcomes the Secretary-General's report (S/1994/715);

2. Decides to extend the mandate of UNOMUR for a final period of three months until 21 September 1994 and agree that during this period the number of military observers should be reduced by phases;

3. Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council ^{on} the termination of UNOMUR ~~before~~ the completion of its mandate;

4. Expresses appreciation to the Government of Uganda for the cooperation and support it has extended to UNOMUR;

5. Stresses the importance of continued cooperation between the Ugandan authorities and UNOMUR;

6. Decides to remain actively seized of the matter.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 210600Z JUNE TO 211800Z JUNE 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE GENERAL SITUATION DURING THE DAY REMAINED TENSE AND VOLATILE. HEAVY EXCHANGES OF ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAS FIRE CONTINUED THROUGHOUT THE DAY. RPF CONTINUED TO SQUEEZE RGF POSITIONS IN KYCHIRU, KIMIHURURA, VILLAGE URUGWIRO AND THE CITY CENTER. RGF CONTINUED TO FIGHT BACK FROM THEIR POSITIONS IN THE CITY. MORTAR BOMBS LANDED NEAR THE HOTEL. ALL LIAISON TEAMS HAVE BEEN MOVED TO HOTEL MERIDIEN DUE TO THE DETERIORATING SECURITY SITUATION. EXCHANGES OF FIRE ALSO CONTINUED BETWEEN RPF POSITIONS LOCATED NEAR MERIDIEN HOTEL AND RGF POSITIONS IN VILLAGE URUGWIRO. MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES CONTINUE TO BE ON THE INCREASE. THE SITUATION IN THE NORTH REMAINS UNCHANGED. SPORADIC EXCHANGES OF MORTAR AND HMG CONTINUED IN AND AROUND BUTARE AS RPF ADVANCE SOUTH - WESTWARD CONTINUED. RPF NOW IMPOSING RESTRICTIONS ON UNAMIR PERSONNEL ESPECIALLY THOSE FROM FRENCH SPEAKING AFRICAN COUNTRIES. THE FOOD CONVOY WHICH WAS REFUSED ENTRY TOGETHER WITH THE APCs LEFT KAGITUMBA THIS AFTERNOON FOR KIGALI. HIGH NUMBERS OF DISPLACED PEOPLE CONTINUED TO BE REPORTED IN THE SOUTH WITH MANY MORE CROSSING INTO BURUNDI AND TANZANIA. TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS WAS ONCE AGAIN SUSPENDED TODAY DUE TO INSECURITY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE INTERIM PM IS REPORTED TO HAVE SAID AT NYAKABANDA THAT VICTORY AWAITS THE GOVT FORCES SOON. HE IS ALSO REPORTED TO HAVE VISITED KIGALI TODAY WHERE HE DECLARED THAT THE INTERIM ADMINISTRATION WILL SOON RETURN TO THE CITY. KAIRI IS REPORTED TO HAVE GIVEN THE GO AHEAD FOR THE FRENCH TROOPS TO OPERATE FROM KISANGANI, BUKAVU AND GOMA. THE OAU HAVE EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE FRENCH INITIATIVE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF ISOLATION OF RGF POSITIONS IN KYCHIRU, KIMIHURURA, VILLAGE URUGWIRO, CONTINUED THROUGH THE USE OF ARTY/MORTARS, HMG AND SAS FIRE. THERE IS NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGE IN DISPOSITIONS AND IN THE NORTH. TROOP MOVEMENT TO THE SOUTH FROM THE NORTH HAS BEEN OBSERVED IN THE DAY.

B. RGF. RGF CONTINUE TO FIGHT BACK FROM THEIR POSITIONS IN KYCHIRU, VILLAGE URUGWIRO, KIMIHURURA AND THE CITY CENTER. THEIR MORALE SEEMS TO BE GOING HIGH. CONTINUED TO MAINTAIN A DEFENSIVE POSTURE IN AND AROUND BUTARE AND GISENYI. NO CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS AND THE SITUATION IS REPORTED FROM THE NORTH.

C. MILITIA. MILITIA/INTERHAMWE THREATS OF ABDUCTING AND KILLING OF INNOCENT CIVILIANS AND CHILDREN IS ON THE INCREASE. THEY CONTINUED TO CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS IN RGF AREAS WITHIN THE CITY AS WELL AS BEING EMPLOYED IN COMBAT SIDE BY SIDE WITH THE REGULAR FORCES.

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 13 JUN 94 TO 20 JUN 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE PERIOD REMAINED VERY TENSE AND FLUID. IN KIGALI CITY HEAVY EXCHANGES OF ARTY/MORTAR, BMG AND SAB FIRE CONTINUED DURING THE PERIOD BETWEEN THE TWO WARRING FACTIONS AS THE RPF CONTINUED TO ISOLATE AND TIGHTEN THEIR GRIP ON RGF POSITIONS ALL OVER THE CITY. THE RGF REMAINED IN THEIR OFFENSIVE POSTURE AND CONTINUED TO IMPROVE THEIR POSITIONS IN KYCHIRU, NYAMIRAMBO, KIMIHURURA AND THE CITY CENTER. THE MILITIA, GENDARMERIE AND INTERHAMWE CONTINUED TO WORK AND FIGHT ALONG SIDE THE RGF. THEY CONTINUED TO CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN THE RGF CONTROLLED AREAS. INCREASED INTIMIDATION, ABDUCTION AND KILLING OF INNOCENT CIVILIANS AND CHILDREN BY THE MILITIA/INTERHAMWE WAS ALSO OBSERVED DURING THE WEEK. THE RPF CONDUCTED A NIGHT RESCUE OPERATION TO EVACUATE DISPLACED TUTSIS IN ST PAUL/FAMILLE WHO WERE UNDER THREAT FROM MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE. THE OPERATION LEFT 40 CIVILIANS AND SOME GENDARMERIE DEAD. THE MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE RETALIATED BY ATTACKING INHABITANTS OF MILLES COLLINS WHO WERE MOSTLY TUTSIS. THEY FIRED IN THE AIR INDISCRIMINATELY AND DRAGGED OUT DISPLACED TUTSIS UNTIL THE SITUATION WAS BROUGHT UNDER CONTROL BY COS RGF. RPF FORCED THEMSELVES INTO KING FAISAL HOSPITAL AND WENT AWAY WITH 7 STRETCHERS AND 2 BOXES OF DRUGS BELONGING TO THE MSF. THE AMERICAN APCs STARTED ARRIVING IN ENTEBBE. THERE WERE CHANGES IN THE BATTLE SCENARIO AFTER THE TOWN OF GITARAMA AND ITS ENVIRONS FELL UNDER RPF CONTROL. FIGHTING CONTINUED IN THE SOUTH AND EXTENDED TO BUTARE. THE CAPTURE OF GITARAMA AND THE CONTINUED FIGHTING IN THE SOUTH OF THE COUNTRY HAS RESULTED IN A HIGH INFUX OF DISPLACED PERSONS MOVING INTO KIBUYE AND CYANGUGU. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT WAS FORCED TO MOVE TO GISENYI FOLLOWING THE CAPTURE OF GITARAMA BY THE RPF. IN THE NORTH OF THE COUNTRY SPORADIC EXCHANGES WERE REPORTED IN RUHengeri AND ITS OUTSKIRTS. DURING THE WEEK A NUMBER OF DELEGATES VISITED KIGALI. MR BRONIEK SZYNALSKI, DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY DIVISION, WFP, VISITED KIGALI FROM 14-16 JUNE 1994. HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH FORCE HQ STAFF, UNICF, MSF AND PSC REPRESENTATIVES. HE ALSO MET MR PHILIPPE GAILLARD OF THE ICRC, MAJ GEN KAGAME AND WFP OFFICIALS. THE DISCUSSIONS WITH THEM CENTERED AROUND HUMANITARIAN AID ACTIVITIES. MR ARTURO HEIN, DIRECTOR OF UNREO MET RPF CHAIRMAN IN MULINDI, UNREO AND NGO REPRESENTATIVES IN KIGALI ON 16 JUN 94. MR RENE DEGUY SEQUIN, THE UN SPECIAL RAPPORTEUR ON RWANDA AND A TEAM VISITED KIGALI FROM 16-19 JUN 94. THE TEAM INTERVIEWED UNAMIR EYE-WITNESSES ON HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS AND MET WITH GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND RPF REPS IN BYUMBA. FOUR ROUNDS OF CHASE-FIRE TALKS WERE HELD UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF DFC. NO GREAT STRIDES WERE MADE ON THE CHASE-FIRE DOCUMENT BECAUSE OF THE VOLATILE SITUATION. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE RESUMED ON 13 JUN 94 BUT WAS DISCONTINUED DUE TO INSECURITY. DFC HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH MAJOR GENERAL KAGAME AND COS RGF. HE DISCUSSED THE EXERCISE ON THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE, THE CURRENT SECURITY SITUATION AND THE RESUMPTION OF UN FLIGHTS TO KIGALI WITH THEM. THE CMO HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE PREFECT OF KIGALI, REPRESENTATIVES OF RGF, GENDARMERIE AND

MILITIA. HE DISCUSSED THE UNMO FUTURE DEPLOYMENT PLAN AND THE ROLES OF MILITARY OBSERVERS IN ACHIEVING THEIR TASKS UNDER THE NEW UNAMIR MANDATE. THE FC RETURNED FROM NAIROBI THROUGH KABALE WHERE HE ADDRESSED THE UNMOs. MAJ. M J SOSA, UNID 589 OF URUGUAY DIED AS A RESULT OF INJURIES SUSTAINED AFTER HIS VEHICLE WAS HIT BY GRENADE LAUNCHED RIFLE FIRE FROM SUSPECTED RPF POSITION, 21 KM FROM KIGALI ON THE RUHENGERI ROAD. MAJOR R AHSAN, UNID 632 OF BANGLADESH WAS ALSO INJURED IN THE SAME INCIDENT. THEY WERE BOTH EVACUATED TO NAIROBI THE SAME AFTERNOON.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE RWANDESE CRISIS WAS HIGH ON THE AGENDA DURING THE OAU HEADS OF STATE SUMMIT IN TUNIS. MEMBERS CALLED FOR AN IMMEDIATE STOP TO THE MASSACRE OF CIVILIANS AND CHILDREN BY BOTH PARTIES BUT STOPPED SHORT OF APPORTIONING BLAME TO ANY OF THE PARTIES. THE INTERIM GOVT AND THE RPF LEADERSHIP WERE REPORTED TO HAVE SIGNED A CEASE FIRE DOCUMENT IN TUNIS AFTER THE CONFERENCE. RTLM RADIO CONTINUED ITS PROPAGANDA BROADCASTS TO THE PEOPLE NOT TO BELIEVE IN THE CEASE FIRE REPORTEDLY AGREED BY BOTH SIDES IN TUNIS. THE FRENCH ANNOUNCEMENT TO INTERVENE IN RWANDA WAS WELL RECEIVED BY THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT. THE RPF LEADERSHIP ON THE OTHER HAND CALLED THE MOVE AN INSULT TO THE RWANDESE AND SAID IT WAS UNACCEPTABLE TO THE FRONT. IN NEIGHBORING BURUNDI THE INTERIM PRESIDENT EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE DETERIORATING SITUATION IN RWANDA.

1. MILITARY.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED. IN ADDITION FC AND DFC HELD SEPARATE DISCUSSIONS WITH MAJ GEN KAGAME. THE FORCE HQ HOSTED AND CONDUCTED BRIEFINGS FOR VARIOUS DELEGATIONS THAT VISITED KIGALI. THE DFC COORDINATED AND CHAIRED FOUR ROUNDS OF CEASE FIRE TALKS BETWEEN THE RPF AND RGF. THE RETURNED TO KIGALI FROM NAIROBI THROUGH. THE HQ CONTINUED TO PUT PRESSURE ON BOTH PARTIES TO CREATE SAFE CONDITIONS FOR THE RESUMPTION OF THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED CIVILIANS TO SAFE AREAS. THE US APCs STARTED ARRIVING AT ENTEBBE.

B. UNIMUGA. CONDUCTED NORMAL PATROLS WITHIN AREA OF OPERATION. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE AND FLY UNAMIR PERSONNEL AND OTHER VISITORS BETWEEN KAGITUMBA AND ENTEBBE. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSINGS BETWEEN UGANDA AND RWANDA, THROUGH CYANIKA, KATUMA, KASHENYE AND MURAMA HILLS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES CONTINUED TO BRING INTO RWANDA, DRUGS, FOOD AND OTHER HUMANITARIAN ITEMS FROM UGANDA FOR DISTRIBUTION IN RPF CONTROLLED AREAS. A TOTAL OF 113 VEHICLES FROM VARIOUS AGENCIES ENTERED RWANDA FROM UGANDA. TWO HELICOPTERS OPERATED DURING THE PERIOD.

C. GUANDATE. THE KIA AREA WAS CALM DURING THE WEEK. ELEMENTS OF THE BATTALION (-) PROVIDED SECURITY AT THE AMAMORO STADIUM, KIA AND FORCE HQ. HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION WAS ALSO PROVIDED TO DISPLACED PEOPLE IN A CAMP AT KIA, AND THE AMAMORO STADIUM. PROVIDED ARMED SECURITY FOR THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE TO SECURE AREAS AND FOR THE RPF DELEGATES TO THE CEASE FIRE TALKS. THE DFC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO THE BATTALION DURING THE PERIOD. TROOPS MORALE CONTINUE TO BE HIGH.

D. TEN PLATOON (+). CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ARMED ESCORTS FOR VISITORS AND OTHER ACTIVITIES. ALSO PROVIDED SECURITY FOR THE DISPLACED PERSONS AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL, HOTEL MERIDIEN AND HOTEL MILLES COLLINS. MORALE OF TROOPS REMAIN HIGH.

E. MILOR GP HQ. CONTINUED TO REORGANIZE AND PLAN FOR DEPLOYMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH NEW MANDATE. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE LIAISON WITH RPF AND RGF. CMO HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE VRSPECT OF KIGALI AND REPRESENTATIVES OF THE RGF, GENDARMERIE AND MILITIA. HE DISCUSSED WITH THEM THE FUTURE DEPLOYMENT PLAN AND THE ROLE THE MILITARY OBSERVERS WILL PLAY IN THE NEW MANDATE OF UNAMIR.

F. FORCE LOGISTICS, MEDICAL, ENGINEERS AND SECURITY ELEMENTS. THERE IS ONLY ONE CIVILIAN SECURITY MAN LEFT WITH THE FORCE.

G. UNAMIR FORCE STRENGTH. THE FORCE LEVEL AT THE END OF THE WEEK IS AS FOLLOWS:

(1) TROOPS. INF - 360, STAFF 26.

(2) MILORS. RWANDA - 129. UGANDA (UNOMUR) - 78. KENYA - 89.

(3) UNCIVPOL. RWANDA - 6, KENYA 9.

H. MEDICAL AND HEALTH STATE. THE FORCE CONTINUES TO OPERATE WITH ONLY ONE MEDICAL OFFICER. A TOTAL OF 87 PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY THE FORCE MEDICAL OFFICER, 47 OF WHICH WERE MALARIA CASES.

4. UNCIVPOL. ADVANCE PARTY OF SIX ARRIVED FROM NAIROBI AND ARE CURRENTLY BEING EMPLOYED WITH THE MILOBS. THEY CONTINUED TO PLAN AND REORGANIZE FOR DEPLOYMENT IN LINE WITH THE NEW MANDATE.

9 ARE STILL IN NAIROBI.

5. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS. THE FORCE PRESENT RESERVE STOCK AT THE END OF THE WEEK IS AS FOLLOWS:

- A. RATION - 15 DAYS.
- B. WATER - 24 DAYS.
- C. FUEL - NIL.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. A NUMBER OF HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES REPEATEDLY VISITED KIGALI TO ACCESS AND COORDINATE THE HUMANITARIAN NEEDS OF RWANDA. ONE DELEGATION MET WITH UNAMIR EYE-WITNESSES ON HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS TO SAFE AREAS WAS CARRIED OUT ON TWO DAYS OF THE WEEK AND A TOTAL OF 1300 PEOPLE WERE EVACUATED. MANY HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES CONTINUE TO OPERATE IN RWANDA THROUGH UGANDA. SOME HAVE ALSO STARTED OPERATING FROM ZAIRE. THE ADVANCE OF THE RPF IN THE SOUTH HAS LEFT THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE DISPLACED. THIS IS PUTTING PRESSURE ON THE SCARCE RESOURCES OF THE RELIEF AGENCIES ESPECIALLY IN THE SOUTH WESTERN PART OF THE COUNTRY.

7. CIVIL AFFAIRS. NTR.

8. CONCLUSION. THE GENERAL SITUATION REMAINED TENSE AND VOLATILE. BOTH SIDES CONTINUED TO EXCHANGE HEAVY ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAS FIRE. RPF CONTINUED TO ISOLATE AND PUT MORE PRESSURE ON RGF POSITIONS IN KYCHIRU, NYAMIRAMBO, KIMIHURURA AND THE CITY CENTER. THE TOWN OF GITARAMA FELL TO THE RPF AND FIGHTING CONTINUED IN ITS SURROUNDING AREAS AND AROUND BUTARE. IN THE NORTH, EXCHANGE OF FIRE WAS REPORTED AT RUHengeri. THE MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE INTIMIDATION AND KILLINGS WERE ON THE INCREASE THIS WEEK. A SERIES OF CEASE-FIRE TALKS WERE CONDUCTED BUT ENDED WITH LITTLE PROGRESS. THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT WAS REPORTED TO HAVE MOVED TO GISENYI. THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF A FRENCH INTERVENTION IN THE RWANDESE CRISIS WAS WELCOMED BY THE GOVERNMENT. HOWEVER, THE RPF HAS REJECTED THE INITIATIVE. A NUMBER OF DELEGATIONS VISITED THE HQ FOR DIFFERENT REASONS. THE NUMBERS OF DISPLACED PEOPLE CONTINUED TO BE ON THE INCREASE IN AND AROUND KIBUYE AND CYANGUGU.

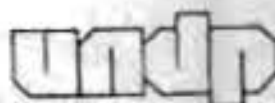

SITUATION REPORT # 30

UN/NGO Advanced Humanitarian Team in Kigali reported that there was heavy shelling in Nyamirambo yesterday. There was also shelling around the Hotel Mille Collines and Meridien Hotel. Access remains difficult to downtown areas of Kigali for humanitarian teams. Critical needs in Kigali are medical supplies, especially dressings and blood for the ICRC hospital.

CORRECTION (Sitrep 29): Yesterday 240 persons were transported from King Faisal Hospital and from Sainte-Famille. About 240 people went to the RGF side and 240 people went to the RPF side.

UNAMIR reported that the RGF has sustained heavy casualties and lost ground to the RPF in Kigali and in the south west. The RPF continued to reinforce its troops and bring military supplies to Kigali. The advance of the RPF towards Butare and Kibuye continued. Fighting occurred on the outskirts of Butare and in and around Ruhengeri.

The UN/NGO assessments of the RPF held areas have been postponed after the RPF withdrew support. This is going to seriously affect the consolidated appeal.

Radio Mille Collines, has been broadcasting messages that militias should not attack "innocent people" but should fight against the RPF.

UNAMIR reported that a French soldier was shot dead by Gendarmes in Bujumbura on 17 June when he tried to enter a public building. He was asking for help after a quarrel between nine French military and a group of young men at Hotel Source du Nil in Bujumbura. Another Frenchman was badly injured. On 19 June tension increased in Burundi.

UNICEF reported that 2,563 women and children have been vaccinated between 11-19 June in Kigali. 1412 cartons of WFP biscuits were distributed by the UN/NGO AHT in Kigali. A UNICEF unaccompanied and traumatized child specialist travelled to Bujumbura today. She will begin an assessment of displaced Burundian children.

Following the problems in Ngara, Tanzania, the Tanzanian government has agreed to increase the number of police in Benaco camp to 300. Logistics problems (housing, vehicles, communication equipment) are an issue. UNHCR met with the leaders of Benaco camp. They apologised for

the problems of the last week and promised that international staff would be safe in the camp. It is proposed that Mr Gatete and his commune should be moved to a site 2-300 km from the Rwandan border. MSF (France, Spain and Holland), IRC, AEF, OXFAM and AICF are still not returning to work in the camp.

ICRC delivered 217 tonnes of food to 12,000 persons at Butare and 80 tonnes of food to 17,000 persons at Rwamagana. On 19 June, about 400 citizens of Zaire were evacuated by the RGP to Goma (Zaire) from Kigali.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE SITUATION REMAINS TENSE AND VOLATILE. EXCHANGES OF ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SA& FIRE CONTINUED DURING THE FIRST HALF OF THE DAY BETWEEN THE WARRING FACTIONS. THE RPF CONTINUED TO TIGHTEN THEIR GRIP ON RGF POSITIONS IN NYAMIRAMBO, GIKONDO, KIMIHURURA, KYCHIRU AND THE CITY CENTER. THE RGF CONTINUED TO FIGHT BACK WITH MORTARS, HMG AND SA& FIRE. THE MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE ARE STILL VERY ACTIVE IN THE AREAS UNDER RGF CONTROL. NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE TROOP DISPOSITIONS OF BOTH SIDES IN KIGALI AND THE NORTH OF THE COUNTRY. IN THE SOUTH FIGHTING IS REPORTED AROUND BUTARE. THE RPF ADVANCE SOUTH - WESTWARD CONTINUES. THE EXERCISE ON THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS WAS CONDUCTED SUCCESSFULLY TODAY. ABOUT 480 DISPLACED PERSONS WERE MOVED.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE DEBATE ON THE PROS AND CONS OF THE FRANCE INITIATIVE CONTINUES WITH THE INTERIM GOVT IN FAVOUR AND THE RPF LEADERSHIP REJECTING IT.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. THE RPF CONTINUED TO HARASS AND TIGHTEN THEIR GRIP ON THE ALMOST ISOLATED RGF POSITIONS IN THE CITY USING ARTY/MORTARS, HMG AND SA& FIRE. THEY SHELLED PARTS OF THE CITY CENTER IN THE MORNING. EXCHANGES OF FIRE WITH THE RGF WERE REPORTED IN BUTARE AS THE ADVANCE SOUTH WESTWARD CONTINUES. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THE SITUATION IN THE NORTH. REINFORCEMENTS CONTINUE TO POUR INTO THE CITY AND TO THE SOUTH.

B. RGF. THE RGF CONTINUED IN THEIR DEFENSIVE POSTURE ON ALL FRONTS. PREPARATIONS FOR THE DEFENCE OF GISENYI AND BUTARE CONTINUES. NO MAJOR CHANGES WERE REPORTED IN THEIR DISPOSITION IN THE NORTH.

C. MILITIA. CONTINUE TO CONTROL AND MAN ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF CONTROL AREAS. THEY HAVE BEEN OBSERVED TO BE DRESSED LIKE THE REGULAR FORCES. THE INTERHAMWE CONTINUE TO THREATEN DISPLACED PERSONS IN STE FAMILLE.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

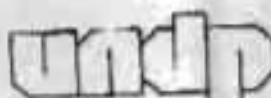

CORRECTION: It was reported in sitrep 28 that one Uruguayan was killed and one Bangladeshi injured when they hit a land mine north of Kigali. In fact, the RPF fired a rocket propelled grenade at the marked UN vehicle these men were travelling in.

On Saturday 18 June approximately 800 people were evacuated to and from Hotel Mille Collines by UNAMIR. All 69 UN staff members and families were evacuated. Approximately 300 people decided to stay at Mille Collines. Today evacuations are taking place from Ste Famille church to King Faisal Hospital. 100 wounded children and civilians are being evacuated from the ICRC hospital to King Faisal Hospital.

On Sunday 19 June a Red Cross worker was killed and at least three other people were wounded when a mortar hit the ICRC hospital in Kigali. Another mortar hit the compound later, but nobody was injured.

The airport at Kigali remains closed. The RPF have placed rocks on the airstrip in order to stop the French army landing. The RPF has not given security guarantees that they will not fire at the airport.

UNAMIR reported that fighting in the Nyamirambo, Gikondo and Kychura areas of Kigali is heavy. There is fighting in the general area of Butare as the RPF continues to move south west.

UNREO Kabale reported that MDM is planning to withdraw from Northern Rwanda. The RPF have been negative about the presence of French personnel in the areas they operate in.

A French convoy with 30T of food is stuck in Uganda awaiting RPF clearance to drive to Kigali.

NFP and UNHCR estimates that there are no more than 40,000 Burundi refugees in Rwanda.

The US is sending 50 APCs to Entebbe for UNAMIR.

1. GEN. SITUATION. THE SITUATION REMAINED TENSE AND VOLATILE. HEAVY EXCHANGES OF ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SA FIRE CONTINUED OVER NIGHT BETWEEN THE WARRING FACTIONS. RPF CONTINUED TO TIGHTEN THEIR GRIP ON RGF POSITIONS IN NYAMIRAMBO, GIKONDO, KYCHIRU. THE CITY CENTRE WAS HOWEVER CALM OVERNIGHT. RGF CONTINUED TO FIGHT BACK WITH MORTARS, HMG AND SA FIRE. THE MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE CONTINUE TO BE VERY ACTIVE IN THE AREAS UNDER RGF CONTROL. NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS AND THE GENERAL SITUATION HAS BEEN REPORTED IN THE NORTH OF THE COUNTRY.
