TIME OF THE INCIDENT. HE WAS INTERVIEWED BY MILØBS AND HE SPOKE HIS MIND ON THE INCIDENT. HE SAID HE BELIEVES THE ATTACK WAS A FOLLOW-UP FROM COMMENTS MADE ON RADIO RWANDA BY THE GITARAMA REPORTER WHO CRITICIZED HIM BY NAME AS AN INTERAHAMWE WHO HAD TO BE KILLED. THE BROADCASTING ALSO INCLUDED DEROGATORY COMMENTS AGAINST ALL SPANISH PRIESTS AS PRO-HUTU RACISTS. SEVEN FRANCISCAN SISTERS WERE BEATEN. THREE OF THEM WERE INTERVIEWED AND WERE STILL SHAKEN AND HAVE MOVED OUT OF THEIR HOUSES. ONE LOCAL WAS SHOT IN THE ARM AS HE ATTEMPTED TO YELL FOR HELP. THE RPA AUTHORITIES ARE AWARE OF THE SITUATION AND HAVE INTERVIEWED THE FATHER IN THE PRESENCE OF THE A/BOURGEMESTRE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - ON THE NIGHT OF 13/14 NOV 95, SOME FRGF PERSONNEL CROSSED OVER TO IJWI ISLAND (GR 9350) FROM GIKUYU (GR 9841) USING LOCAL BOATS. THESE MEN ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM BUTUMBARA (GR 9837). WHEN INTERCEPTED BY RPA AT GIKUYU AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE ENSUED. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED ON EITHER SIDE.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE FC HELD SEPARATE MEETINGS WITH THE BELGIUM AMBASSADOR AND MR IAN MARTIN (UNHRFOR). HE LATER MET THE SRSG TO DISCUSS THE FUTURE OF THE MANDATE.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 24 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE TODAY. 17 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI VILLAGE. 136 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

B. GHANCOY 1 PROVIDED 2 TRUCKS TO RPA TO CONVEY FOOD FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO.

C. MALICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO SERVICE PONTS ET CHAUSSEES AND ONE TRUCK TO PAM FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO KADUHA. THEY ALSO PROVIDED 2 TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO KIVU AND NSHILI.

D. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO CONCERN AT NYARUSHISHI TRANSIT CAMP FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF GRAVEL.

E. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO ARDEC TO TRANSPORT WOOD FROM RUGALIKA TO NYAMAHURU AND RUNDA.

F. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED 2 DUMPERS FOR TRANSPORTING EARTH FOR NAKAMERA TRANSIT CAMP IN GESENYI.

H. IN ADDITION TO THEIR NORMAL SUPPLY DUTIES, 95 CMSG TRANSPORTED 720 CHICKENS FOR A LOCAL CHURCH IN KIGALI.

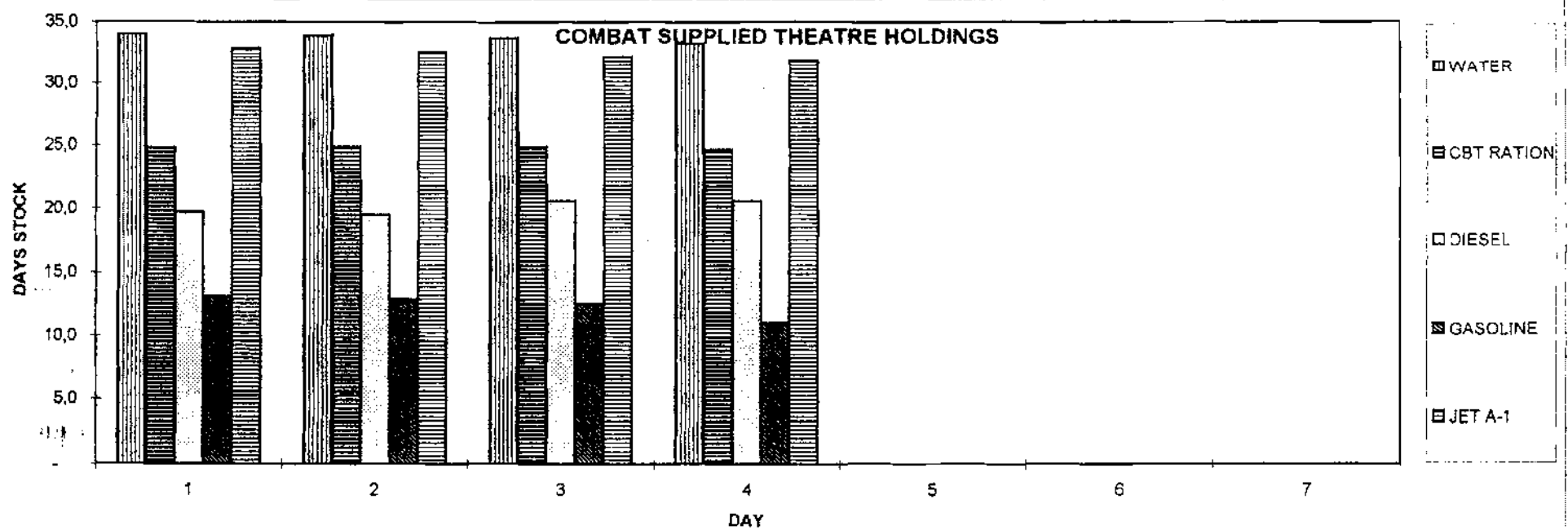

DAILY SITREP FOR 14 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 107. THEY ALL CAME FROM ZAIRE, AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 25,208 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG MET THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA MR PIERRE CELESTIN RWIGEMA TO DISCUSS THE FORTHCOMING CONSULTATION SCHEDULED FOR 21-22 NOVEMBER AND LATER HELD A MEETING WITH OTHER OFFICIALS OF THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT TO DISCUSS ISSUES RELATED TO UNAMIR'S MANDATE. THE SRSG FINALLY GAVE A BRIEFING ON UNAMIR'S MANDATE TO MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS AND HEADS OF VARIOUS AGENCIES AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS.

B. AT THE END OF HER VISIT TO RWANDA, MRS ELIZABETH LINDEMAYER, PRINCIPAL DESK OFFICER FOR RWANDA IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PEACE-KEEPING OPERATIONS, CALLED ON THE SRSG FOR A GENERAL SUMMING-UP.

C. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, DR ANASTASE GASANA, STRONGLY CONDEMNED ALL THOSE WHO USE THE PROBLEM OF RWANDAN REFUGEES TO STRAIN RELATIONS WITH COUNTRIES OF THE SUB-REGION. HE SAID THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT HAD NO INTEREST IN PREVENTING RWANDAN REFUGEES FROM RETURNING TO THEIR MOTHERLAND.

D. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT FORMER US PRESIDENT JIMMY CARTER WILL VISIT UGANDA, RWANDA, ZAIRE AND BURUNDI FROM 17 TO 21 NOVEMBER IN PREPARATION FOR THE SUMMIT OF THE FOUR COUNTRIES' HEADS OF STATE WHICH IS DUE TO BE HELD IN CAIRO ON 27 NOVEMBER.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) -REFERENCE THE REPORTED CASE OF MASKED SOLDIERS WHO FORCED THEIR WAY INTO THE CATHOLIC COMPOUND IN TABA COMMUNE ON 12 NOV 95, MILOBS CONFIRMED THAT THE SOLDIERS WERE LOOKING FOR A SPANISH FATHER WHO WAS OUT ATTENDING A FUNCTION AT THE

TIME OF THE INCIDENT. HE WAS INTERVIEWED BY MILOBS AND HE SPOKE HIS MIND ON THE INCIDENT. HE SAID HE BELIEVES THE ATTACK WAS A FOLLOW-UP FROM COMMENTS MADE ON RADIO RWANDA BY THE GITARAMA REPORTER WHO CRITICIZED HIM BY NAME AS AN INTERAHAMWE WHO HAD TO BE KILLED. THE BROADCASTING ALSO INCLUDED DEROGATORY COMMENTS AGAINST ALL SPANISH PRIESTS AS PRO-HUTU RACISTS. SEVEN FRANCISCAN SISTERS WERE BEATEN. THREE OF THEM WERE INTERVIEWED AND WERE STILL SHAKEN AND HAVE MOVED OUT OF THEIR HOUSES. ONE LOCAL WAS SHOT IN THE ARM AS HE ATTEMPTED TO YELL FOR HELP. THE RPA AUTHORITIES ARE AWARE OF THE SITUATION AND HAVE INTERVIEWED THE FATHER IN THE PRESENCE OF THE A/BOURGEMESTRE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - ON THE NIGHT OF 13/14 NOV 95, SOME FRGF PERSONNEL CROSSED OVER TO IJWI ISLAND (GR 9350) FROM GIKUYU (GR 9841) USING LOCAL BOATS. THESE MEN ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM BUTUMBARA (GR 9837). WHEN INTERCEPTED BY RPA AT GIKUYU AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE ENSUED. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED ON EITHER SIDE.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE FC HELD SEPARATE MEETINGS WITH THE BELGIUM AMBASSADOR AND MR IAN MARTIN (UNHRFOR). HE LATER MET THE SRSG TO DISCUSS THE FUTURE OF THE MANDATE.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 24 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE TODAY. 17 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI VILLAGE. 136 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

B. GHANCOY 1 PROVIDED 2 TRUCKS TO RPA TO CONVEY FOOD FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO.

C. MALICoy PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO SERVICE PONTS ET CHAUSSEES AND ONE TRUCK TO PAM FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO KADUHA. THEY ALSO PROVIDED 2 TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO KIVU AND NSHILI.

D. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO CONCERN AT NYARUSHISHI TRANSIT CAMP FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF GRAVEL.

E. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO ARDEC TO TRANSPORT WOOD FROM RUGALIKA TO NYAMAHURU AND RUNDA.

F. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED 2 DUMPERS FOR TRANSPORTING EARTH FOR NAKAMERA TRANSIT CAMP IN GESENYI.

H. IN ADDITION TO THEIR NORMAL SUPPLY DUTIES, 95 CMSG TRANSPORTED 720 CHICKENS FOR A LOCAL CHURCH IN KIGALI.

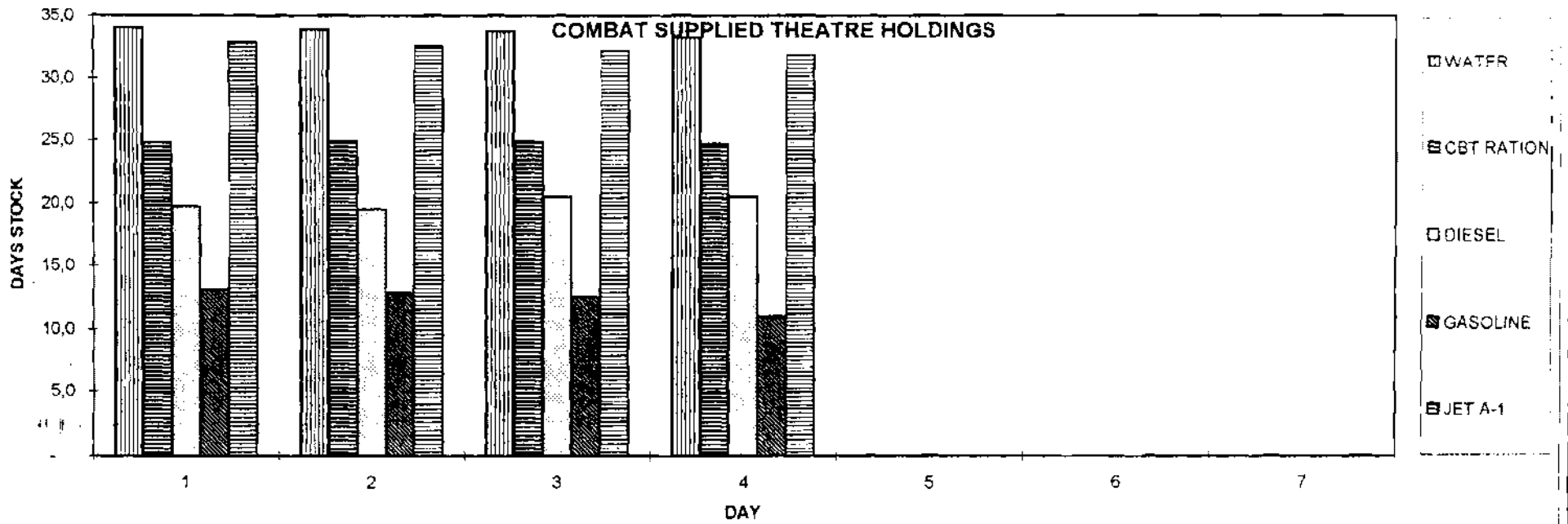

DAILY SITREP FOR 13 NOV 951. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 68. 60 FROM ZAIRE, 04 FROM BURUNDI AND 04 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 25,101 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG MET THE RWANDAN MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS MR ANASTASE GASANA AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR AS WELL AS THE HOLDING OF THE 'GREAT LAKES' REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT.

B. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA A NEW NATIONAL ASSOCIATION NAMELY THE SOCES, HAS BEEN FORMED TO EXAMINE IMPORTANT ECONOMIC PROBLEMS FACING THE COUNTRY.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIESA. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 1A (KIGALI)-TWO MEN WERE ARRESTED ON 13 NOV 95 BY THE RPA IN KIGALI CITY FOR HAVING TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE. IN THE SAME SECTOR, MILOB TEAM INFORMED THAT THE RPA BN AT RILIMA HAS BEEN REPLACED BY ANOTHER BN FROM KIBUYE.

(2) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA)- MILOBS REPORTED THAT MASKED SOLDIERS IN A CAMOUFLAGED VEH WITHOUT NUMBER PLATES, FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A CATHOLIC COMPOUND IN TABA COMMUNE (GR8883) ON 12 NOV 95 AROUND 1900 HRS. THEY WERE LOOKING FOR A SPANISH FATHER WHO HAS THE REPUTATION OF SPEAKING HIS MIND ON THE SITUATION IN RWANDA. WHEN THEY COULD NOT FIND HIM, THE INTRUDERS FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A ADJACENT HOUSE WHERE SOME FRANCISCAN SISTERS LIVE. THE RPA SOLDIERS BEAT UP AND THREATENED 03 OR 04 OF THE SISTERS SO AS TO FIND OUT THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE FATHER WHO WAS ACTUALLY IN ANOTHER PARISH. MILOB TEAM WILL FURTHER INVESTIGATE WITH A HUMAN RIGHTS OFFICER. RPA WAS INFORMED AND THEY MOVED TO THE RELIGIOUS COMPOUND AROUND MIDNIGHT ON THE SAME DAY. THEIR INVESTIGATION IS ALSO IN PROGRESS.

(3) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - AT GICYE COMMUNE (GR 5115), LOCALS REPORTED TO MILOBS THAT RPA HAS IMPOSED RESTRICTIONS ON CONTACT WITH UNAMIR. IN THE SAME SECTOR AT KABAYA COMMUNE (GR 4906), LOCALS REPORTED THAT 50 PERS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA ON CHARGES OF HAVING ALLEGEDLY PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE. OUT OF THE 50 ARRESTED, 10 HAVE BEEN TRANSPORTED TO THE GISENYI PRISON WHILST THE OTHERS ARE STILL IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) - MILOB REPORTED THAT ON 12 NOV 95, A RPA SOLDIER LOST HIS RIGHT LEG WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI-PERS MINE IN MUKAMIRA SECTOR UNDER NKULI COMMUNE. THE MINE WAS PLACED IN A PLAYING GROUND BESIDE LAKE KARAGO (GR4520) VERY CLOSE TO THE MUKAMIRA RPA MILITARY CAMP. ACCORDING TO THE SOLDIER, THE MINE WAS LAID BY SOME CIVILIANS WHO WERE SEEN WALKING ALONG THE LAKE SOME HOURS EARLIER.

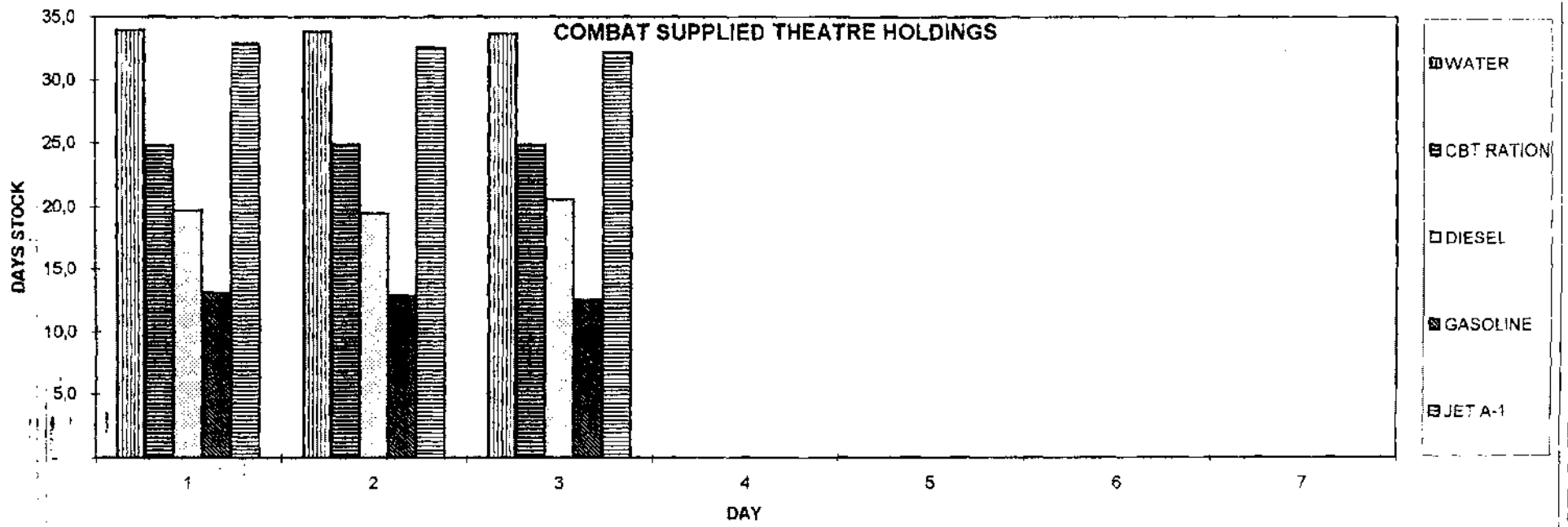

DAILY SITREP FOR 13 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 68. 60 FROM ZAIRE, 04 FROM BURUNDI AND 04 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 25,101 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG MET THE RWANDAN MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS MR ANASTASE GASANA AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR AS WELL AS THE HOLDING OF THE 'GREAT LAKES' REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT.

B. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA A NEW NATIONAL ASSOCIATION NAMELY THE SOCES, HAS BEEN FORMED TO EXAMINE IMPORTANT ECONOMIC PROBLEMS FACING THE COUNTRY.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) - TWO MEN WERE ARRESTED ON 13 NOV 95 BY THE RPA IN KIGALI CITY FOR HAVING TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE. IN THE SAME SECTOR, MILOB TEAM INFORMED THAT THE RPA BN AT RILIMA HAS BEEN REPLACED BY ANOTHER BN FROM KIBUYE.

(2) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT MASKED SOLDIERS IN A CAMOUFLAGED VEH WITHOUT NUMBER PLATES, FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A CATHOLIC COMPOUND IN TABA COMMUNE (GR8883) ON 12 NOV 95 AROUND 1900 HRS. THEY WERE LOOKING FOR A SPANISH FATHER WHO HAS THE REPUTATION OF SPEAKING HIS MIND ON THE SITUATION IN RWANDA. WHEN THEY COULD NOT FIND HIM, THE INTRUDERS FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A ADJACENT HOUSE WHERE SOME FRANCISCAN SISTERS LIVE. THE RPA SOLDIERS BEAT UP AND THREATENED 03 OR 04 OF THE SISTERS SO AS TO FIND OUT THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE FATHER WHO WAS ACTUALLY IN ANOTHER PARISH. MILOB TEAM WILL FURTHER INVESTIGATE WITH A HUMAN RIGHTS OFFICER. RPA WAS INFORMED AND THEY MOVED TO THE RELIGIOUS COMPOUND AROUND MIDNIGHT ON THE SAME DAY. THEIR INVESTIGATION IS ALSO IN PROGRESS.

(3) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - AT GICYE COMMUNE (GR 5115), LOCALS REPORTED TO MILOBS THAT RPA HAS IMPOSED RESTRICTIONS ON CONTACT WITH UNAMIR. IN THE SAME SECTOR AT KABAYA COMMUNE (GR 4906), LOCALS REPORTED THAT 50 PERS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA ON CHARGES OF HAVING ALLEGEDLY PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE. OUT OF THE 50 ARRESTED, 10 HAVE BEEN TRANSPORTED TO THE GISENYI PRISON WHILST THE OTHERS ARE STILL IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY SECTOR 5A (RUHENGIRI) - MILOB REPORTED THAT ON 12 NOV 95, A RPA SOLDIER LOST HIS RIGHT LEG WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI-PERS MINE IN MUKAMIRA SECTOR UNDER NKULI COMMUNE. THE MINE WAS PLACED IN A PLAYING GROUND BESIDE LAKE KARAGO (GR4520) VERY CLOSE TO THE MUKAMIRA RPA MILITARY CAMP. ACCORDING TO THE SOLDIER, THE MINE WAS LAID BY SOME CIVILIANS WHO WERE SEEN WALKING ALONG THE LAKE SOME HOURS EARLIER.

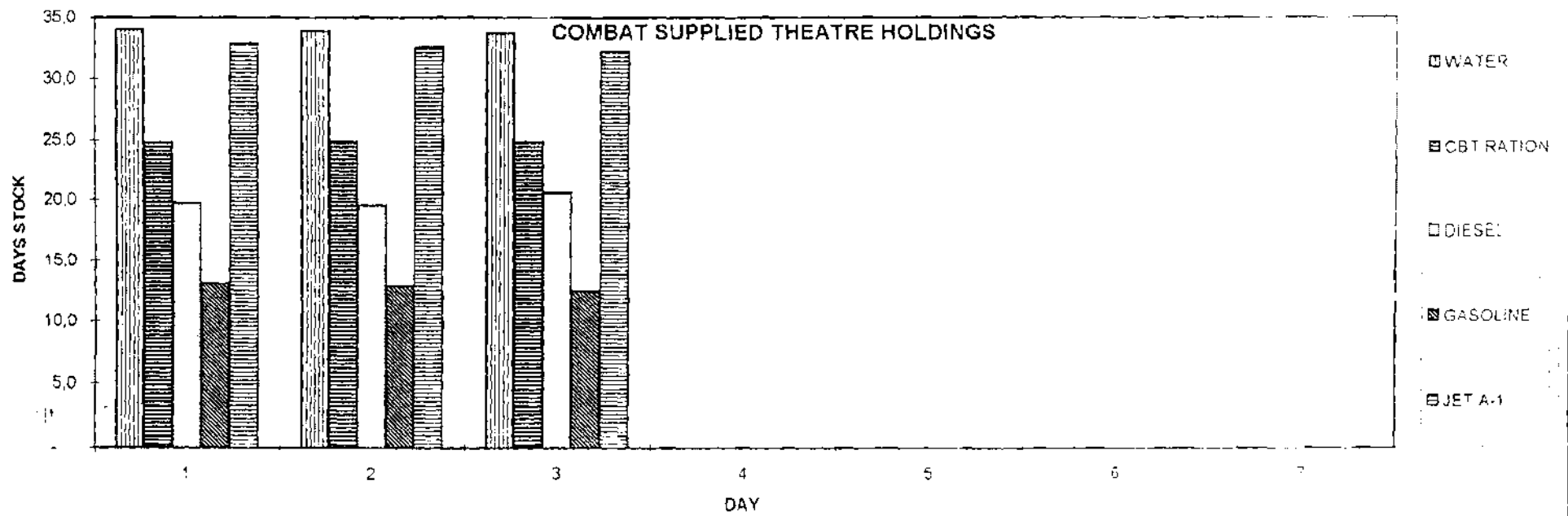

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 06 NOV TO 13 NOV 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINS TENSE. RREPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 1475. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING ON MONDAY, 6 NOVEMBER 1995, TO THE VISITING MEMBERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS ASSOCIATION OF THE U.S.A. ON THE OVER-ALL SITUATION IN RWANDA, WITH PARTICULAR REFERENCE TO RECONCILIATION AND THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES FROM NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. RECONSTRUCTION OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM WAS ALSO DISCUSSED. LATER IN THE DAY, THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AND U.S. AMBASSADORS TO RWANDA TO REVIEW THE DELIBERATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE THAT ENDED ON 5 NOVEMBER 1995.

B. THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING ON 7 NOVEMBER TO HEADS OF MISSIONS AND AGENCIES ON THE CURRENT DEVELOPMENTS AND SITUATION WITH REGARD TO THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE VISITING NORWEGIAN DELEGATION MET WITH THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING THE REFUGEES, REHABILITATION OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM, FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR AS WELL AS INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA.

C. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA REPORT OF TUESDAY, 7 NOVEMBER, THE RWANDESE PRESS CELEBRATED THE AFRICAN INFORMATION DAY AND RECALLED THE ROLE PLAYED BY THE MEDIA IN PREPARING AND IMPLEMENTING THE GENOCIDE. THE PRESS RESOLVED TO SHUN DISSEMINATING ETHNIC HATRED AND TREAT JOURNALISM OBJECTIVELY, TO BUILD A NEW RWANDA.

D. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE U.S. AMBASSADOR ON 8 NOVEMBER 1995 AND DISCUSSED THE OVER-ALL SITUATION IN RWANDA AND MATTERS CONCERNING UNAMIR'S MANDATE. THE SRSG ALSO ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCY MEETING AT THE UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM THE SAME DAY. AMONG OTHER THINGS THAT WERE DISCUSSED, WERE THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE, MORE PARTICULARLY THE RÔLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE

INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY IN ADDRESSING THE POST-GENOCIDE SITUATION.

E. ON THE ARRIVAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY AT KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, ITS CHAIRMAN, AMBASSADOR MAHMOUD KASSEM, ISSUED A PRESS STATEMENT OUTLINING THE MANDATE OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION AS BEING:-TO COLLECT INFORMATION AND INVESTIGATE REPORTS RELATING TO THE SALE AND SUPPLY OF ARMS TO FORMER RWANDAN GOVERNMENT FORCES IN THE GREAT LAKES REGION, TO INVESTIGATE ALLEGATIONS OF MILITARY TRAINING OF SUCH FORCES, TO IDENTIFY THE PARTIES INVOLVED AND TO RECOMMEND MEASURES TO END THE ILLEGAL FLOW OF ARMS INTO THE SUB-REGION IN VIOLATION OF SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS.

F. THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN A MEETING BETWEEN THE VICE-PRESIDENT OF RWANDA AND THE MEMBERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON 9 NOVEMBER 1995 TO DISCUSS MATTERS CONCERNING THE MANDATE OF THE COMMISSION. CLEANING UP OPERATIONS ON IWAWA ISLAND BY THE RPA WERE ALSO DISCUSSED.

G. MS. ELIZABETH LINDENMAYER, PRINCIPAL DESK OFFICER FOR RWANDA IN THE DEPARTMENT FOR PEACE-KEEPING OPERATIONS, NEW YORK, CURRENTLY ON VISIT TO RWANDA, MET WITH THE SRSG ON 10 NOVEMBER 1995 AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SITUATION OF RWANDA AND MORE PARTICULARLY THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR. IN THE AFTERNOON SHE MET WITH THE DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE RWANDAN FOREIGN OFFICE. LATER, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING ON PRISONS WITH UNDP AND REVIEWED OVERALL DEVELOPMENTS IN THIS FIELD.

H. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, REPORT OF 9 NOVEMBER, NORWAY'S ANNUAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA, TOTALLING 3 BILLION RWANDAN FRANCS NEXT YEAR, WILL BE CHANELLED THROUGH UN AGENCIES AND NGOS. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 10 NOVEMBER, THAT THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA PIERRE CÉLESTIN RWIGEMA IN HIS MEETING WITH MR. EUGENE SCANTEI FROM WORLD BANK HEADQUARTERS, WASHINGTON, REITERATED HIS GOVERNMENT'S DETERMINATION TO MOBILIZE THE RESOURCES PROVIDED BY THE WORLD BANK TO PROMOTE THE SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE COUNTRY.

### 3. MILITARY

#### A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 5B, GISENYI, THE RPA LAUNCHED A AMPHIBIOUS OP ON 05 NOV 95 ON IWAWA ISLAND, WHICH WAS BEING USED BY THE EX-FAR AS A TRG CENTRE AND REPORTEDLY HAD ABOUT 500 SOLDIERS WHO WERE UNDERGOING INTENSIVE TRAINING. THE OP WAS SUCCESSFUL AND THE EX-FAR SUFFERED APPROX 171 KILLED AND 15 TAKEN AS PRISONERS. THE NUMBER OF EX-FAR SOLDIERS WHO WERE KILLED DURING THE OP, IS LIKELY TO BE AS HIGH AS 300. THE RPA SUFFERED 05 KILLED AND 13 WOUNDED. A LARGE

QUANTITY OF ARMS, AMMO, EXPLOSIVES AND MINES WERE CAPTURED DURING THE OP.

(2) THE SECTOR COMD OF SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) WAS INFORMED BY AN RPA OFFICER THAT LOCAL RPA TPS WERE NOT HAPPY WITH THE APPOINTMENT OF THE PRESENT 305 BDE COMD. PRESENT COMD WAS MEMBER OF FRGF.

(3) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE) A DRUNKEN RPA SOLDIER CAUSED PANIC ON 5 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 1930 HRS WHEN HE FIRED SOME ROUNDS OF SMALL ARMS IN THE CENTRE OF THE TOWN. THE SOLDIER WAS LATER ARRESTED AND TAKEN INTO MILITARY CUSTODY.

(4) THE RWINKWAVU HOSPITAL AT GR 6883 WHICH WAS RUN BY MEDICOS EN CATASTROPHE, HAS BEEN TAKEN OVER BY RPA TO BE CONVERTED INTO A MILITARY HOSPITAL. ALL FOREIGNERS AND LOCAL WORKERS HAVE ALREADY STOPPED WORK AND WILL LEAVE FOR KIGALI ON 13 NOVEMBER, 1995.

(5) ON 06 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 1000 HRS AT NSHILI COMMUNE IN SECT 3A, AN RPA SOLDIER RAN AMOK AND OPENED FIRE INDISCRIMINATELY KILLING 15 PERSONS AND WOUNDING ANOTHER 20. LATER THE SOLDIER SHOT HIMSELF DEAD. RPA DETACHMENT COMD AND SOME SOLDIERS FROM NSHILI HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND PUT IN DETENTION IN GIKONGORO.

(6) IN SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) RPA ARRESTED 03 SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE IN UNIFORM WITH HAND GRENADES IN RUSASA COMMUNE ON 05 NOV 95. THEY ARE BEING KEPT AT THE COMMUNE PRISON AWAITING FURTHER INTERROGATION.

(7) IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), MILOBS PATROL TO MUSEBEYA COMMUNE (GR 4033) REVEALED THAT RPA HAD CONDUCTED SEARCH OF SOME HOUSES IN GIKUNGO, MURAMBI, NYARWUNGE AND RUSEKERA SECTORS IN THE PAST FEW WEEKS AND RECOVERED SOME WEAPONS AND MILITARY EQUIPMENT.

(8) IN SECTOR 5A, IN NYAMUTARA COMMUNE, A MAN WAS ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN TUBUNGO (GR5818) FOR HIDING TWO GRENADES AND A KALASHNIKOV BAYONET IN A FARM CLOSE TO HIS HOME. HE SAID HE HAD BEEN GIVEN THE ITEMS BY THE FRGF TWO WEEKS AGO. HE IS BEING HELD BY THE RPA AT MUHOZA CAMP (GR 6134).

(9) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), IT WAS CONFIRMED THAT TWO RPA GUARDS WERE KILLED AS RESULT OF AN ANTI-PERSONNEL MINE EXPLOSION ON 04 NOV 95 AT THE PHARMIKINA PLANTATION NEAR THE RPA CAMP.

(10) SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) - A UNHCR DRIVER REPORTED THAT A COMMUNAL POLICEMAN, COMMITTED SUICIDE AFTER KILLING A

WOMAN USING A GREN ON 12 NOV 95 IN MWENDO (GR 4558). SEVERAL OTHER PERSONS WERE WOUNDED INCLUDING AN RPA SOLDIER. THERE IS NO MOTIVE KNOWN FOR THE SUICIDE.

(11) SECTOR 1A (KIGALI)-TWO MEN WERE ARRESTED ON 13 NOV 95 BY THE RPA IN KIGALI CITY FOR HAVING TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE.

(12) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA)- MILOBS REPORTED THAT MASKED SOLDIERS IN A CAMOUFLAGED VEH WITHOUT NUMBER PLATES, FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A CATHOLIC COMPOUND IN TABA COMMUNE (GR8883) ON 12 NOV 95 AROUND 1900 HRS. THEY WERE LOOKING FOR A SPANISH FATHER WHO HAS THE REPUTATION OF SPEAKING HIS MIND ON THE SITUATION IN RWANDA. WHEN THEY COULD NOT FIND HIM, THE INTRUDERS FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A ADJACENT HOUSE WHERE SOME FRANCISCAN SISTERS LIVE. THE RPA SOLDIERS BEAT UP AND THREATENED 03 OR 04 OF THE SISTERS SO AS TO FIND OUT THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE FATHER WHO WAS ACTUALLY IN ANOTHER PARISH. MILOB TEAM WILL FURTHER INVESTIGATE WITH A HUMAN RIGHTS OFFICER. RPA WAS INFORMED AND THEY MOVED TO THE RELIGIOUS COMPOUND AROUND MIDNIGHT ON THE SAME DAY. THEIR INVESTIGATION IS ALSO IN PROGRESS.

(13) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - AT GICYE COMMUNE (GR 5115), LOCALS REPORTED TO MILOBS THAT RPA HAS IMPOSED RESTRICTIONS ON CONTACT WITH UNAMIR. IN THE SAME SECTOR AT KABAYA COMMUNE (GR 4906), LOCALS REPORTED THAT 50 PERS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA ON CHARGES OF HAVING ALLEGEDLY PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE. OUT OF THE 50 ARRESTED, 10 HAVE BEEN TRANSPORTED TO THE GISENYI PRISON WHILST THE OTHERS ARE STILL IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT.

(B) MILITIA/FRGF

(1) REFERENCE REPORTED EXPLOSION AT MUHARI SECTEUR (GR 7729) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) IN SITREP OF 6 NOV 95. MILOBS INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE INCIDENT WHICH LASTED BETWEEN 1054 HRS AND 1200 HRS, OCCURRED WHEN A VILLAGER CLAIMED THAT HE HAD SEEN FRGF/INTERHAMWE IN THE AREA AND INFORMED RPA WHO CORDONED OFF THE AREA. AT LEAST TWO SECURITY GUARDS AT A PLANTATION CLOSE TO THE AREA WERE KILLED BY RPA WHO POSSIBLY MISTOOK THEM TO BE FRGF/INTERHAMWE. NO OTHER CASUALTIES KNOWN.

(2) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI), MILOBS PATROL TO NYARUTOVU COMMUNE WAS INFORMED BY THE LOCALS THAT FRGF HAD INFILTRATED INTO THE COMMUNE. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(3) IN SECTOR 4, TWO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED AS A

RESULT OF AN ANTI-PERSONNEL MINE EXPLOSION ON 04 NOV 95. A 15 YEAR OLD BOY LOST HIS LEFT LEG AND A 13 YEAR OLD BOY RECEIVED MINOR INJURIES.

(4) IN SECTOR 5A, AT MUKINGO OF GATARAGA SECTOR (GR 515310), AT APPROXIMATELY 0930 HRS ON 09 NOV 95, FRGF ELEMENTS TRIED TO BLOW UP AN ELECTRIC PYLON. THE PYLON WAS PARTIALLY DAMAGED. A REP FROM ELECTROGAZ ESTIMATED THE COST OF REPAIRS TO BE AROUND 3.9 MILLION RWF. THIS WAS THE SIXTH INCIDENT OF THIS NATURE THIS YEAR. IN THE SAME SECTOR, RPA REPORTED THAT A GROUP OF SIX FRGF WERE AMBUSHED IN MUHINGO SECTOR (GR4732) AT ABOUT THE SAME TIME AS THE EXPLOSION. ONE INFILTRATOR WAS KILLED WHILE THE OTHERS ESCAPED.

(5) IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE), IN MURANGA COMMUNE, THERE WAS AN ALLEGED FIRE FIGHT BETWEEN RPA AND INTERHAMWE NEAR THE SITE OF THE MINE EXPLOSION ON THE ROAD BETWEEN KIBUYE AND CYANGUGU (GR 205580). ONE RPA SOLDIER REPORTEDLY SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES AND ONE INTERHAMWE MEMBER WAS ARRESTED.

(6) IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE), IN KIVUMU COMMUNE, LOCALS REPORTED THAT A COUPLE WAS SHOT ON 08 NOV 95 BY AN RPA SOLDIER WHO WAS TRYING TO ROB THEM. THE MAN WAS KILLED AND HIS WIFE WAS INJURED.

(7) ON 10 NOV 95, IN NYAMASHEKE OF SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), AT GR 985416, FIVE FRGF/INTERHAMWE MEMBERS WHO HAD REPORTEDLY COME FROM NYUNGWE FOREST, WERE AMBUSHED BY THE RPA AND KILLED. ONE RPA OFFR WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED IN THE INCIDENT. ONE AK 47 RIFLE, TWO HAND GRENS AND A RADIO WERE CAPTURED BY THE RPA.

(8) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - LOCALS FROM RWERERE GR 2622 REPORTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN FIRING ALONG THE BORDER AT APPROX 0300 HRS ON 12 NOV 95. EXACT LOC OR REASON FOR THE FIRING IS NOT KNOWN.

(9) SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) - MILOB REPORTED THAT ON 12 NOV 95, A RPA SOLDIER LOST HIS RIGHT LEG WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI-PERS MINE IN MUKAMIRA SECTOR UNDER NKULI COMMUNE. THE MINE WAS PLACED IN A PLAYING GROUND BESIDE LAKE KARAGO (GR4520) VERY CLOSE TO THE MUKAMIRA RPA MILITARY CAMP. ACCORDING TO THE SOLDIER, THE MINE WAS LAID BY SOME CIVILIANS WHO WERE SEEN WALKING ALONG THE LAKE SOME HOURS EARLIER.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(A) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(B) ON 09 NOV 95, THE FC MET WITH EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT TO UNHCR SPECIAL ENVOY AND DISCUSSED ISSUES OF MUTUAL INTEREST. HE BRIEFED THE JOURNALISTS OF THE DAILY TELEGRAPH AND CHRISTINE SCIENCE MONITOR ON THE STATE OF THE MISSION. HE ALSO BRIEFED THE AMBASSADORS OF GERMANY, BELGIUM, AND FRANCE ON THE FUTURE OF UN MISSION AND THE PRESENT THREAT TO RWANDA AND UNAMIR.

(C) ON 11 NOV 95, THE FC ATTENDED THE REMEMBRANCE DAY PARADE HELD AT 95 CMSG LOC IN KIGALI.

(D) GEN VAN KAPPEN OF DPKO VISITED UNAMIR ON 11 AND 12 NOV 95. ON ARRIVAL, HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE FC AND SRSG ON THE MILITARY SITUATION AND POLITICAL SITUATION IN RWANDA RESPECTIVELY. LATER, HE VISITED GISENYI SECTOR 5B WHERE HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE SITUATION IN THAT SECTOR. HE ALSO VISITED FORCE ENGR COY, FORCE SIGNAL COY AND 95 CMSG. HE DEPARTED FROM KIGALI AT 0700 HRS ON 13 NOV 95.

(E) THE FC AND MS ELIZABETH LYNDEN MAYER, PRINCIPAL OFFICER FOR RWANDA IN UNHQ NEW YORK, PAID A FAMILIARISATION VISIT TO GITARAMA AND KIBUYE IN SECTORS 1B AND 5C RESPECTIVELY. THEY WERE BRIEFED ON THE CURRENT OPERATIONAL SITUATION IN BOTH AREAS.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 43 TRUCKS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. A TOTAL OF 129 IDPs ARE AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

C. A TOTAL OF 1255 MEDICAL AND 164 DENTAL PATIENTS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE DURING THE WEEK.

D. A TEAM OF FORCE ENGR COY DELIVERED A MINE AWARENESS LECTURE IN BUTARE WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY MILOBS AND NGOS.

E. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED TWO DUMP TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTATION OF LATERITE FROM NYANZA TO FIRING RANGE IN KIGALI.

F. SECTOR 5A(RUHENGERI)- HOUSING PROJECT IN KAWASA SECTOR IS PROGRESSING WELL WITH 28 HOUSES COMPLETED WITH FOUR MORE NEAR COMPLETION . CONCERN ( NGO) IS DISTRIBUTING FOOD TO THE WORKERS ON THE PROJECT .

G. FORCE ENGR COY DESPATCHED 2 DOZERS TO NYUNDO TO WORK IN NAKAMERA TRANSIT CAMP AND ALSO DEPLOYED A DOZER FOR A REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI.

H. IN ADDITION TO THEIR NORMAL SUPPLY DUTIES, 95 CMSG RECOVERED 2 M-A-N DIESEL VEHs FROM SHAGASHA TO KIGALI AND TRANSPORTED 80 MATTRESSES TO BUTARE FOR THE "GROUPE SCOLAIRE".

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. CIVPOL TEAM IN GIKONGORO WAS DENIED ACCESS TO THE PRISON. THEY ARE TRYING TO RESOLVE THE IMPASSE WITH THE PREFECT AND THE GENDARMERIE COMDR.

B. IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), THE OFFICIAL OPENING OF THE EXPANDED GITARAMA PRISONS WAS HELD ON 09 NOV 95. THE PRISON WAS HOWEVER NOT OCCUPIED BY PRISONERS DUE TO MISSING "MIRADORS" AND UNFINISHED LIGHTING. THE PRISONERS ARE LIKELY TO MOVE IN NEXT WEEK.

C. ON 11 NOV 95, TREE PLANTING CEREMONIES WERE HELD IN ALL PREFECTURES TO COMMEMORATE TO WORLD TREE PLANTING DAY. IN KIGALI PREFECTURE, THE CEREMONY WAS ATTENDED BY THE RWANDESE VICE PRESIDENT, PRIME MINISTER AND OTHER MINISTERS, AMBASSADORS AND REPS OF NGOS.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL

A. AT GICIYI COMMUNE GR 5111, A LOCAL WOMAN AND MAN WERE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED WHEN THEY STEPPED ON A ANTI-PERS MINE ON 07 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 0600HRS.

B. ON 07 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 0900HRS, AN ANTI-TANK MINE WAS DETONATED BY A SWISS EMBASSY VEH CARRYING FOUR PASSENGERS AT GR 498958, SOUTH OF THE MAIN ROAD FROM KABAYA TO GASAKE. TWO OF THE OCCUPANTS DIED ON THE SPOT WHILE THE OTHER TWO WHO WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED, WERE ADMITTED TO MSF HOSPITAL AT KABAYA.

9. COMMENTS

A. THE AMPHIBIOUS OPS ON IWANA ISLAND IS THE FIRST OF ITS KIND CONDUCTED BY THE RPA. IF THIS OP IS EFFECTIVE, WE MAY SEE A DECREASE IN BANDITRY ACTIVITIES AND INFILTRATIONS IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

B. ARRESTS BY RPA OF PERSONS ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN THE GENOCIDE CONTINUES. MINE INCIDENTS IS ALSO ON THE INCREASE. THE CONSTANT ARREST OF RETURNEES ACCUSED OF PARTICIPATING IN THE GENOCIDE IS PRESENTING RETURNEES FROM RETURNING TO RWANDA. UNAMIR PERS, ESPECIALLY MILOB AND CIVPOL, UN AGENCIES WORKER IN THE FIELD AND NGOS MUST TAKE NECESSARY PROTECTIVE MEASURES AGAINST MINES AND EXPLOSIVE ORDNANCE DEVICES (EODs). THEFT OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL AND VEH PARTS ALSO ON THE INCREASE. THIS MIGHT BE AS A RESULT OF RUMOURS OF UNAMIR'S MISSION COMING TO A CLOSE.

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 06 NOV TO 13 NOV 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINS TENSE. RREPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 1475. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING ON MONDAY, 6 NOVEMBER 1995, TO THE VISITING MEMBERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS ASSOCIATION OF THE U.S.A. ON THE OVER-ALL SITUATION IN RWANDA, WITH PARTICULAR REFERENCE TO RECONCILIATION AND THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES FROM NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. RECONSTRUCTION OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM WAS ALSO DISCUSSED. LATER IN THE DAY, THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AND U.S. AMBASSADORS TO RWANDA TO REVIEW THE DELIBERATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE THAT ENDED ON 5 NOVEMBER 1995.

B. THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING ON 7 NOVEMBER TO HEADS OF MISSIONS AND AGENCIES ON THE CURRENT DEVELOPMENTS AND SITUATION WITH REGARD TO THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE VISITING NORWEGIAN DELEGATION MET WITH THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING THE REFUGEES, REHABILITATION OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM, FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR AS WELL AS INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA.

C. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA REPORT OF TUESDAY, 7 NOVEMBER, THE RWANDESE PRESS CELEBRATED THE AFRICAN INFORMATION DAY AND RECALLED THE ROLE PLAYED BY THE MEDIA IN PREPARING AND IMPLEMENTING THE GENOCIDE. THE PRESS RESOLVED TO SHUN DISSEMINATING ETHNIC HATRED AND TREAT JOURNALISM OBJECTIVELY, TO BUILD A NEW RWANDA.

D. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE U.S. AMBASSADOR ON 8 NOVEMBER 1995 AND DISCUSSED THE OVER-ALL SITUATION IN RWANDA AND MATTERS CONCERNING UNAMIR'S MANDATE. THE SRSG ALSO ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCY MEETING AT THE UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM THE SAME DAY. AMONG OTHER THINGS THAT WERE DISCUSSED, WERE THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE, MORE PARTICULARLY THE RÔLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE

INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY IN ADDRESSING THE POST-GENOCIDE SITUATION.

E. ON THE ARRIVAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY AT KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, ITS CHAIRMAN, AMBASSADOR MAHMOUD KASSEM, ISSUED A PRESS STATEMENT OUTLINING THE MANDATE OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION AS BEING:-TO COLLECT INFORMATION AND INVESTIGATE REPORTS RELATING TO THE SALE AND SUPPLY OF ARMS TO FORMER RWANDAN GOVERNMENT FORCES IN THE GREAT LAKES REGION, TO INVESTIGATE ALLEGATIONS OF MILITARY TRAINING OF SUCH FORCES, TO IDENTIFY THE PARTIES INVOLVED AND TO RECOMMEND MEASURES TO END THE ILLEGAL FLOW OF ARMS INTO THE SUB-REGION IN VIOLATION OF SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS.

F. THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN A MEETING BETWEEN THE VICE-PRESIDENT OF RWANDA AND THE MEMBERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON 9 NOVEMBER 1995 TO DISCUSS MATTERS CONCERNING THE MANDATE OF THE COMMISSION. CLEANING UP OPERATIONS ON IWAWA ISLAND BY THE RPA WERE ALSO DISCUSSED.

G. MS. ELIZABETH LINDENMAYER, PRINCIPAL DESK OFFICER FOR RWANDA IN THE DEPARTMENT FOR PEACE-KEEPING OPERATIONS, NEW YORK, CURRENTLY ON VISIT TO RWANDA, MET WITH THE SRSG ON 10 NOVEMBER 1995 AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SITUATION OF RWANDA AND MORE PARTICULARLY THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR. IN THE AFTERNOON SHE MET WITH THE DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE RWANDAN FOREIGN OFFICE. LATER, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING ON PRISONS WITH UNDP AND REVIEWED OVERALL DEVELOPMENTS IN THIS FIELD.

H. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, REPORT OF 9 NOVEMBER, NORWAY'S ANNUAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA, TOTALLING 3 BILLION RWANDAN FRANCS NEXT YEAR, WILL BE CHANELLED THROUGH UN AGENCIES AND NGOS. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 10 NOVEMBER, THAT THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA PIERRE CÉLESTIN RWIGEMA IN HIS MEETING WITH MR. EUGENE SCANTEI FROM WORLD BANK HEADQUARTERS, WASHINGTON, REITERATED HIS GOVERNMENT'S DETERMINATION TO MOBILIZE THE RESOURCES PROVIDED BY THE WORLD BANK TO PROMOTE THE SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE COUNTRY.

### 3. MILITARY

#### A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 5B, GISENYI, THE RPA LAUNCHED A AMPHIBIOUS OP ON 05 NOV 95 ON IWAWA ISLAND, WHICH WAS BEING USED BY THE EX-FAR AS A TRG CENTRE AND REPORTEDLY HAD ABOUT 500 SOLDIERS WHO WERE UNDERGOING INTENSIVE TRAINING. THE OP WAS SUCCESSFUL AND THE EX-FAR SUFFERED APPROX 171 KILLED AND 15 TAKEN AS PRISONERS. THE NUMBER OF EX-FAR SOLDIERS WHO WERE KILLED DURING THE OP, IS LIKELY TO BE AS HIGH AS 300. THE RPA SUFFERED 05 KILLED AND 13 WOUNDED. A LARGE

QUANTITY OF ARMS, AMMO, EXPLOSIVES AND MINES WERE CAPTURED DURING THE OP.

(2) THE SECTOR COMD OF SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) WAS INFORMED BY AN RPA OFFICER THAT LOCAL RPA TPS WERE NOT HAPPY WITH THE APPOINTMENT OF THE PRESENT 305 BDE COMD. PRESENT COMD WAS MEMBER OF FRGF.

(3) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE) A DRUNKEN RPA SOLDIER CAUSED PANIC ON 5 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 1930 HRS WHEN HE FIRED SOME ROUNDS OF SMALL ARMS IN THE CENTRE OF THE TOWN. THE SOLDIER WAS LATER ARRESTED AND TAKEN INTO MILITARY CUSTODY.

(4) THE RWINKWAVU HOSPITAL AT GR 6883 WHICH WAS RUN BY MEDICOS EN CATASTROPHE, HAS BEEN TAKEN OVER BY RPA TO BE CONVERTED INTO A MILITARY HOSPITAL. ALL FOREIGNERS AND LOCAL WORKERS HAVE ALREADY STOPPED WORK AND WILL LEAVE FOR KIGALI ON 13 NOVEMBER, 1995.

(5) ON 06 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 1000 HRS AT NSHILI COMMUNE IN SECT 3A, AN RPA SOLDIER RAN AMOK AND OPENED FIRE INDISCRIMINATELY KILLING 15 PERSONS AND WOUNDING ANOTHER 20. LATER THE SOLDIER SHOT HIMSELF DEAD. RPA DETACHMENT COMD AND SOME SOLDIERS FROM NSHILI HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND PUT IN DETENTION IN GIKONGORO.

(6) IN SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) RPA ARRESTED 03 SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE IN UNIFORM WITH HAND GRENADES IN RUSASA COMMUNE ON 05 NOV 95. THEY ARE BEING KEPT AT THE COMMUNE PRISON AWAITING FURTHER INTERROGATION.

(7) IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), MILOBS PATROL TO MUSEBEYA COMMUNE (GR 4033) REVEALED THAT RPA HAD CONDUCTED SEARCH OF SOME HOUSES IN GIKUNGO, MURAMBI, NYARWUNGE AND RUSEKERA SECTORS IN THE PAST FEW WEEKS AND RECOVERED SOME WEAPONS AND MILITARY EQUIPMENT.

(8) IN SECTOR 5A, IN NYAMUTARA COMMUNE, A MAN WAS ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN TUBUNGO (GR5818) FOR HIDING TWO GRENADES AND A KALASHNIKOV BAYONET IN A FARM CLOSE TO HIS HOME. HE SAID HE HAD BEEN GIVEN THE ITEMS BY THE FRGF TWO WEEKS AGO. HE IS BEING HELD BY THE RPA AT MUHOZA CAMP (GR 6134).

(9) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), IT WAS CONFIRMED THAT TWO RPA GUARDS WERE KILLED AS RESULT OF AN ANTI-PERSONNEL MINE EXPLOSION ON 04 NOV 95 AT THE PHARMIKINA PLANTATION NEAR THE RPA CAMP.

(10) SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) - A UNHCR DRIVER REPORTED THAT A COMMUNAL POLICEMAN, COMMITTED SUICIDE AFTER KILLING A

WOMAN USING A GREN ON 12 NOV 95 IN MWENDO (GR 4558). SEVERAL OTHER PERSONS WERE WOUNDED INCLUDING AN RPA SOLDIER. THERE IS NO MOTIVE KNOWN FOR THE SUICIDE.

(11) SECTOR 1A (KIGALI)-TWO MEN WERE ARRESTED ON 13 NOV 95 BY THE RPA IN KIGALI CITY FOR HAVING TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE.

(12) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA)- MILOBS REPORTED THAT MASKED SOLDIERS IN A CAMOUFLAGED VEH WITHOUT NUMBER PLATES, FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A CATHOLIC COMPOUND IN TABA COMMUNE (GR8883) ON 12 NOV 95 AROUND 1900 HRS. THEY WERE LOOKING FOR A SPANISH FATHER WHO HAS THE REPUTATION OF SPEAKING HIS MIND ON THE SITUATION IN RWANDA. WHEN THEY COULD NOT FIND HIM, THE INTRUDERS FORCED THEIR WAY INTO A ADJACENT HOUSE WHERE SOME FRANCISCAN SISTERS LIVE. THE RPA SOLDIERS BEAT UP AND THREATENED 03 OR 04 OF THE SISTERS SO AS TO FIND OUT THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE FATHER WHO WAS ACTUALLY IN ANOTHER PARISH. MILOB TEAM WILL FURTHER INVESTIGATE WITH A HUMAN RIGHTS OFFICER. RPA WAS INFORMED AND THEY MOVED TO THE RELIGIOUS COMPOUND AROUND MIDNIGHT ON THE SAME DAY. THEIR INVESTIGATION IS ALSO IN PROGRESS.

(13) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - AT GICYE COMMUNE (GR 5115), LOCALS REPORTED TO MILOBS THAT RPA HAS IMPOSED RESTRICTIONS ON CONTACT WITH UNAMIR. IN THE SAME SECTOR AT KABAYA COMMUNE (GR 4906), LOCALS REPORTED THAT 50 PERS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA ON CHARGES OF HAVING ALLEGEDLY PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE. OUT OF THE 50 ARRESTED, 10 HAVE BEEN TRANSPORTED TO THE GISENYI PRISON WHILST THE OTHERS ARE STILL IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT.

(B) MILITIA/FRGF

(1) REFERENCE REPORTED EXPLOSION AT MUHARI SECTEUR (GR 7729) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) IN SITREP OF 6 NOV 95. MILOBS INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE INCIDENT WHICH LASTED BETWEEN 1054 HRS AND 1200 HRS, OCCURRED WHEN A VILLAGER CLAIMED THAT HE HAD SEEN FRGF/INTERHAMWE IN THE AREA AND INFORMED RPA WHO CORDONED OFF THE AREA. AT LEAST TWO SECURITY GUARDS AT A PLANTATION CLOSE TO THE AREA WERE KILLED BY RPA WHO POSSIBLY MISTOOK THEM TO BE FRGF/INTERHAMWE. NO OTHER CASUALTIES KNOWN.

(2) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGERI), MILOBS PATROL TO NYARUTOVU COMMUNE WAS INFORMED BY THE LOCALS THAT FRFG HAD INFILTRATED INTO THE COMMUNE. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(3) IN SECTOR 4, TWO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED AS A



RESULT OF AN ANTI-PERSONNEL MINE EXPLOSION ON 04 NOV 95. A 15 YEAR OLD BOY LOST HIS LEFT LEG AND A 13 YEAR OLD BOY RECEIVED MINOR INJURIES.

(4) IN SECTOR 5A, AT MUKINGO OF GATARAGA SECTOR (GR 515310), AT APPROXIMATELY 0930 HRS ON 09 NOV 95, FRGF ELEMENTS TRIED TO BLOW UP AN ELECTRIC PYLON. THE PYLON WAS PARTIALLY DAMAGED. A REP FROM ELECTROGAZ ESTIMATED THE COST OF REPAIRS TO BE AROUND 3.9 MILLION RWF. THIS WAS THE SIXTH INCIDENT OF THIS NATURE THIS YEAR. IN THE SAME SECTOR, RPA REPORTED THAT A GROUP OF SIX FRGF WERE AMBUSHED IN MUHINGO SECTOR (GR4732) AT ABOUT THE SAME TIME AS THE EXPLOSION. ONE INFILTRATOR WAS KILLED WHILE THE OTHERS ESCAPED.

(5) IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE), IN MURANGA COMMUNE, THERE WAS AN ALLEGED FIRE FIGHT BETWEEN RPA AND INTERHAMWE NEAR THE SITE OF THE MINE EXPLOSION ON THE ROAD BETWEEN KIBUYE AND CYANGUGU (GR 205580). ONE RPA SOLDIER REPORTEDLY SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES AND ONE INTERHAMWE MEMBER WAS ARRESTED.

(6) IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE), IN KIVUMU COMMUNE, LOCALS REPORTED THAT A COUPLE WAS SHOT ON 08 NOV 95 BY AN RPA SOLDIER WHO WAS TRYING TO ROB THEM. THE MAN WAS KILLED AND HIS WIFE WAS INJURED.

(7) ON 10 NOV 95, IN NYAMASHEKE OF SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), AT GR 985416, FIVE FRGF/INTERHAMWE MEMBERS WHO HAD REPORTEDLY COME FROM NYUNGWE FOREST, WERE AMBUSHED BY THE RPA AND KILLED. ONE RPA OFFR WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED IN THE INCIDENT. ONE AK 47 RIFLE, TWO HAND GRENS AND A RADIO WERE CAPTURED BY THE RPA.

(8) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - LOCALS FROM RWERERE GR 2622 REPORTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN FIRING ALONG THE BORDER AT APPROX 0300 HRS ON 12 NOV 95. EXACT LOC OR REASON FOR THE FIRING IS NOT KNOWN.

(9) SECTOR 5A (RUHENGIRI) - MILOB REPORTED THAT ON 12 NOV 95, A RPA SOLDIER LOST HIS RIGHT LEG WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI-PERS MINE IN MUKAMIRA SECTOR UNDER NKULI COMMUNE. THE MINE WAS PLACED IN A PLAYING GROUND BESIDE LAKE KARAGO (GR4520) VERY CLOSE TO THE MUKAMIRA RPA MILITARY CAMP. ACCORDING TO THE SOLDIER, THE MINE WAS LAID BY SOME CIVILIANS WHO WERE SEEN WALKING ALONG THE LAKE SOME HOURS EARLIER.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(A) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(B) ON 09 NOV 95, THE FC MET WITH EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT TO UNHCR SPECIAL ENVOY AND DISCUSSED ISSUES OF MUTUAL INTEREST. HE BRIEFED THE JOURNALISTS OF THE DAILY TELEGRAPH AND CHRISTINE SCIENCE MONITOR ON THE STATE OF THE MISSION. HE ALSO BRIEFED THE AMBASSADORS OF GERMANY, BELGIUM, AND FRANCE ON THE FUTURE OF UN MISSION AND THE PRESENT THREAT TO RWANDA AND UNAMIR.

(C) ON 11 NOV 95, THE FC ATTENDED THE REMEMBRANCE DAY PARADE HELD AT 95 CMSG LOC IN KIGALI.

(D) GEN VAN KAPPEN OF DPKO VISITED UNAMIR ON 11 AND 12 NOV 95. ON ARRIVAL, HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE FC AND SRSG ON THE MILITARY SITUATION AND POLITICAL SITUATION IN RWANDA RESPECTIVELY. LATER, HE VISITED GISENYI SECTOR 5B WHERE HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE SITUATION IN THAT SECTOR. HE ALSO VISITED FORCE ENGR COY, FORCE SIGNAL COY AND 95 CMSG. HE DEPARTED FROM KIGALI AT 0700 HRS ON 13 NOV 95.

(E) THE FC AND MS ELIZABETH LYNDEN MAYER, PRINCIPAL OFFICER FOR RWANDA IN UNHQ NEW YORK, PAID A FAMILIARISATION VISIT TO GITARAMA AND KIBUYE IN SECTORS 1B AND 5C RESPECTIVELY. THEY WERE BRIEFED ON THE CURRENT OPERATIONAL SITUATION IN BOTH AREAS.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 43 TRUCKS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. A TOTAL OF 129 IDPs ARE AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

C. A TOTAL OF 1255 MEDICAL AND 164 DENTAL PATIENTS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE DURING THE WEEK.

D. A TEAM OF FORCE ENGR COY DELIVERED A MINE AWARENESS LECTURE IN BUTARE WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY MILOBS AND NGOS.

E. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED TWO DUMP TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTATION OF LATERITE FROM NYANZA TO FIRING RANGE IN KIGALI.

F. SECTOR 5A(RUHENGERI)- HOUSING PROJECT IN KAWASA SECTOR IS PROGRESSING WELL WITH 28 HOUSES COMPLETED WITH FOUR MORE NEAR COMPLETION. CONCERN ( NGO) IS DISTRIBUTING FOOD TO THE WORKERS ON THE PROJECT.

G. FORCE ENGR COY DESPATCHED 2 DOZERS TO NYUNDO TO WORK IN NAKAMERA TRANSIT CAMP AND ALSO DEPLOYED A DOZER FOR A REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI.

H. IN ADDITION TO THEIR NORMAL SUPPLY DUTIES, 95 CMSG RECOVERED 2 M-A-N DIESEL VEHS FROM SHAGASHA TO KIGALI AND TRANSPORTED 80 MATTRESSES TO BUTARE FOR THE "GROUPE SCOLAIRE".

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. CIVPOL TEAM IN GIKONGORO WAS DENIED ACCESS TO THE PRISON. THEY ARE TRYING TO RESOLVE THE IMPASSE WITH THE PREFECT AND THE GENDARMERIE COMDR.

B. IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), THE OFFICIAL OPENING OF THE EXPANDED GITARAMA PRISONS WAS HELD ON 09 NOV 95. THE PRISON WAS HOWEVER NOT OCCUPIED BY PRISONERS DUE TO MISSING "MIRADORS" AND UNFINISHED LIGHTING. THE PRISONERS ARE LIKELY TO MOVE IN NEXT WEEK.

C. ON 11 NOV 95, TREE PLANTING CEREMONIES WERE HELD IN ALL PREFECTURES TO COMMEMORATE TO WORLD TREE PLANTING DAY. IN KIGALI PREFECTURE, THE CEREMONY WAS ATTENDED BY THE RWANDESE VICE PRESIDENT, PRIME MINISTER AND OTHER MINISTERS, AMBASSADORS AND REPS OF NGOS.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL

A. AT GICIYI COMMUNE GR 5111, A LOCAL WOMAN AND MAN WERE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED WHEN THEY STEPPED ON A ANTI-PERS MINE ON 07 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 0600HRS.

B. ON 07 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 0900HRS, AN ANTI-TANK MINE WAS DETONATED BY A SWISS EMBASSY VEH CARRYING FOUR PASSENGERS AT GR 498958, SOUTH OF THE MAIN ROAD FROM KABAYA TO GASAKE. TWO OF THE OCCUPANTS DIED ON THE SPOT WHILE THE OTHER TWO WHO WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED, WERE ADMITTED TO MSF HOSPITAL AT KABAYA.

9. COMMENTS

A. THE AMPHIBIOUS OPS ON IWANA ISLAND IS THE FIRST OF ITS KIND CONDUCTED BY THE RPA. IF THIS OP IS EFFECTIVE, WE MAY SEE A DECREASE IN BANDITRY ACTIVITIES AND INFILTRATIONS IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

B. ARRESTS BY RPA OF PERSONS ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN THE GENOCIDE CONTINUES. MINE INCIDENTS IS ALSO ON THE INCREASE. THE CONSTANT ARREST OF RETURNEES ACCUSED OF PARTICIPATING IN THE GENOCIDE IS PRESENTING RETURNEES FROM RETURNING TO RWANDA. UNAMIR PERS, ESPECIALLY MILOB AND CIVPOL, UN AGENCIES WORKER IN THE FIELD AND NGOS MUST TAKE NECESSARY PROTECTIVE MEASURES AGAINST MINES AND EXPLOSIVE ORDNANCE DEVICES (EODs). THEFT OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL AND VEH PARTS ALSO ON THE INCREASE. THIS MIGHT BE AS A RESULT OF RUMOURS OF UNAMIR'S MISSION COMING TO A CLOSE.

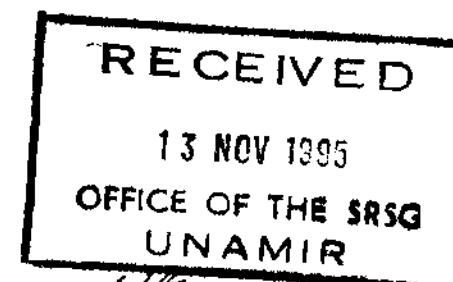

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 01 FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 25,033 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 131 FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 25,032 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. MS. ELISABETH LINDENMAYER, PRINCIPAL DESK OFFICER FOR RWANDA IN THE DEPARTMENT FOR PEACE-KEEPING OPERATIONS, NEW YORK, CURRENTLY ON VISIT TO RWANDA, MET WITH THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SITUATION OF RWANDA AND MORE PARTICULARLY THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR. IN THE AFTERNOON MS LINDENMAYER MET WITH THE DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE RWANDAN FOREIGN OFFICE.

B. LATER, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING ON PRISONS WITH UNDP AND REVIEWED OVERALL DEVELOPMENTS IN THIS FIELD.

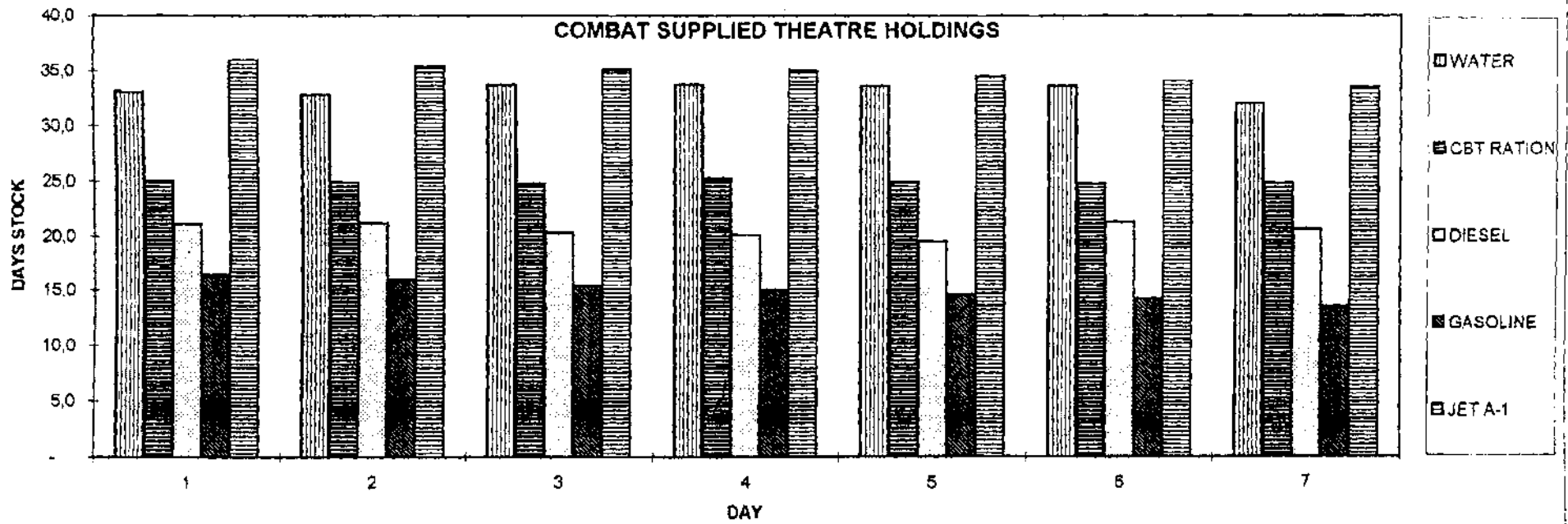

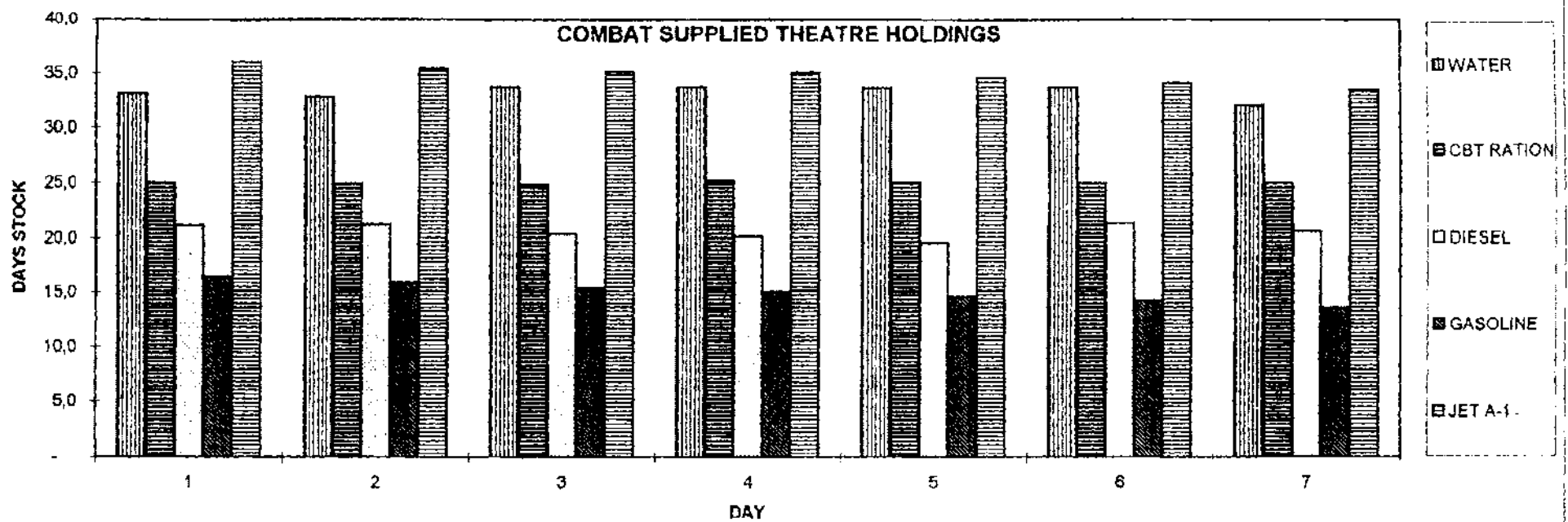

IN THE SAME SECTOR RPA REPORTED THAT A GROUP OF SIX FRGF WERE AMBUSHED IN MUHINGO SECTOR (GR4732) AT ABOUT THE SAME TIME AS THE EXPLOSION. ONE WAS KILLED AND FIVE ESCAPED.

(3) IN SECTOR 5C KIBUYE IN MURANGA COMMUNE THERE WAS AN ALLEGED FIRE FIGHT BETWEEN RPA AND INTERHAMWE NEAR THE SITE OF THE MINE EXPLOSION ON THE ROAD BETWEEN KIBUYE AND CYANGUGU (GR205580). IT WAS ALLEGED ONE RPA SOLDIER HAD MINOR INJURIES AND ONE INTERHAMWE ARRESTED.

(4) IN THE SAME SECTOR IN KIVUMU COMMUNE THE LOCALS CLAIM THAT A COUPLE WAS SHOT ON 08 NOV 95 BY AN RPA SOLDIER WHO WAS TRYING TO ROB THEM. THE MAN DIED IN HOSPITAL. HIS WIFE IS HOWEVER STILL ON ADMISSION.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED IN ALL SECTORS.

B. THE FC MET WITH EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT TO UNHCR SPECIAL ENVOY AND DISCUSSED ISSUES OF MUTUAL INTEREST.

C. HE BRIEFED THE JOURNALISTS OF THE DAILY TELEGRAPH AND CHRISTIAN SCIENCE MONITOR ON THE STATE OF THE MISSION.

D. HE ALSO BRIEFED THE AMBASSADORS OF GERMANY, BELGIUM, AND FRANCE ON THE FUTURE OF UN MISSION AND THE PRESENT THREAT TO RWANDA AND UNAMIR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 50 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE. 44 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO BYUMBA. A TOTAL OF 131 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

B. MALICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO RPA FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO BUTARE.

C. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO IRC AT BUYEYE TO ASSIST IN TRANSPORTING CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS.

D. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM RUGALIKA TO RUNDA.

E. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED A DOZER EACH FOR THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS:

(1) IMPROVING ROAD ZINDIRO - KRAMA.

(2) IMPROVING APPROACH ROAD TO COMMUNE POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL NEAR RAMAGANA.

(3) FOR LEVELLING THE GROUND FOR A REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI.

F. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED ALSO TWO DUMP TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTATION OF LATERITE FROM NYANZA TO FIRING RANGE IN KIGALI.

H. NORMED AND UNITS MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 193 MEDICAL AND 14 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

(1) IN SECTOR 1B GITARAMA THE OFFICIAL OPENING OF THE EXPANDED GITARAMA PRISONS WAS HELD ON 09 NOV 95. THE PRISON WAS HOWEVER NOT OCCUPIED BY PRISONERS DUE TO MISSING "MIRADORS" AND UNFINISHED LIGHTING. THE PRISONERS WILL PROBABLY MOVE IN NEXT WEEK.

TWO OF THE FOUR OCCUPANTS ARE LOCAL EMPLOYEES OF THE EMBASSY. PERSONAL DATA ON THE OTHERS IS STILL BEING DEVELOPED.

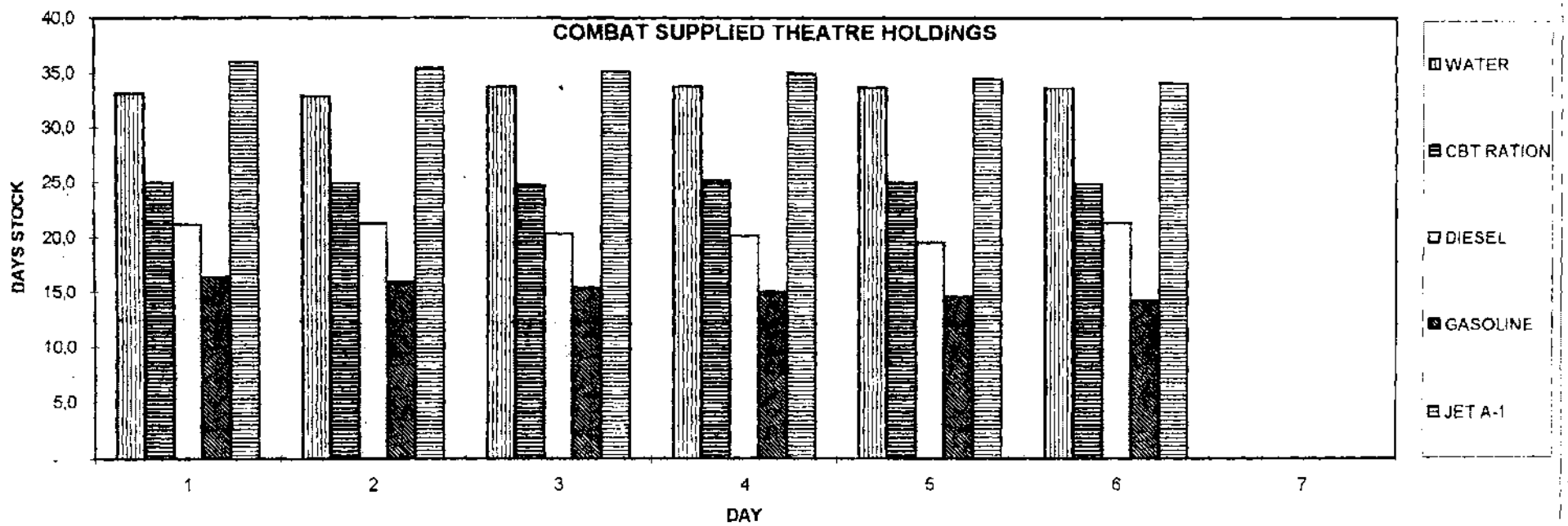

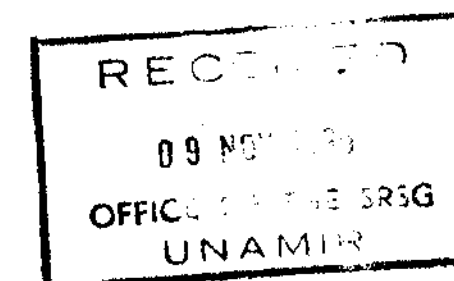

DAILY SITREP FOR 08 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS- 370. ALL CAME FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW - NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS INFLOW - 24,728 AND OUTFLOW - 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCY MEETING AT THE UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM. AMONG OTHER THINGS THAT WERE DISCUSSED WERE THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CONFERENCE ON GENOCIDE, MORE PARTICULARLY THE ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY IN ADDRESSING THE POST-GENOCIDE SITUATION.

B. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE U.S. AMBASSADOR AND DISCUSSED THE OVER-ALL SITUATION IN RWANDA AND MATTERS CONCERNING UNAMIR'S MANDATE.

C. ON THE ARRIVAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY AT KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, ITS CHAIRMAN, AMBASSADOR MAHMOUD KASSEM, ISSUED A PRESS STATEMENT OUTLINING THE MANDATE OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION AS BEING:- TO COLLECT INFORMATION AND INVESTIGATE REPORTS RELATING TO THE SALE AND SUPPLY OF ARMS TO FORMER RWANDAN GOVERNMENT FORCES IN THE GREAT LAKES REGION, TO INVESTIGATE ALLEGATIONS OF MILITARY TRAINING OF SUCH FORCES, TO IDENTIFY THE PARTIES INVOLVED AND TO RECOMMEND MEASURES TO END THE ILLEGAL FLOW OF ARMS INTO THE SUB-REGION IN VIOLATION OF SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) RPA ARRESTED 03 SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE IN UNIFORM WITH HAND GRENADES IN RUSASA COMMUNE ON 05 NOV 95. THEY ARE BEING KEPT AT THE COMMUNE PRISON AWAITING FURTHER INTERROGATION.

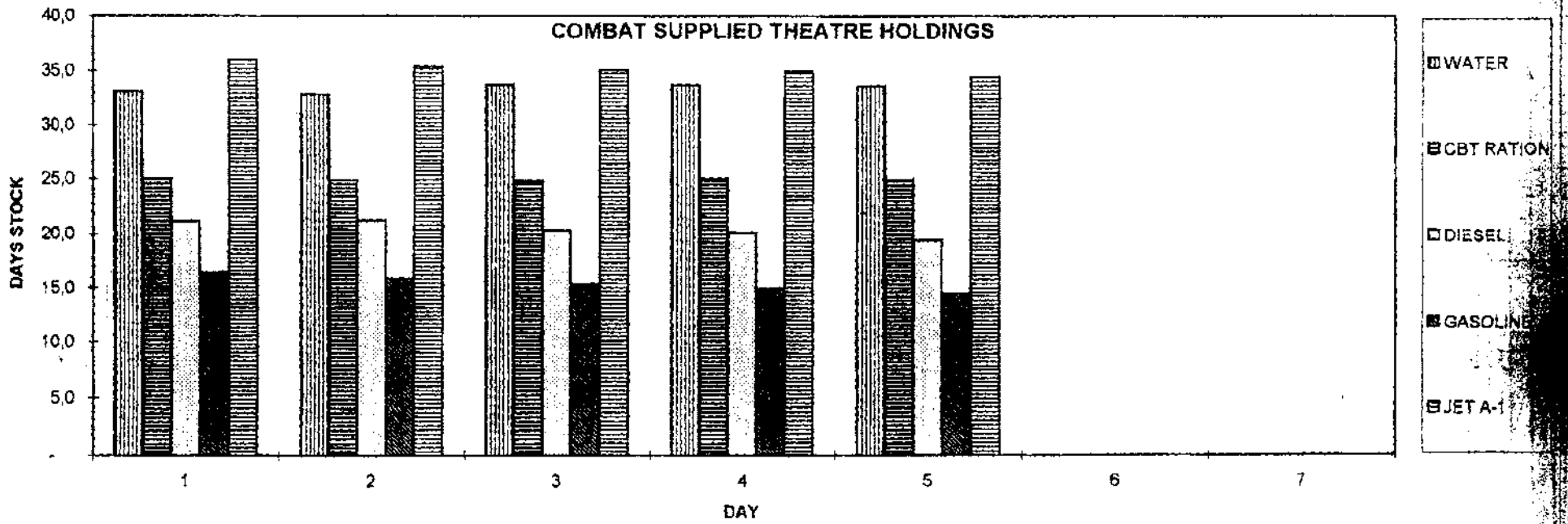

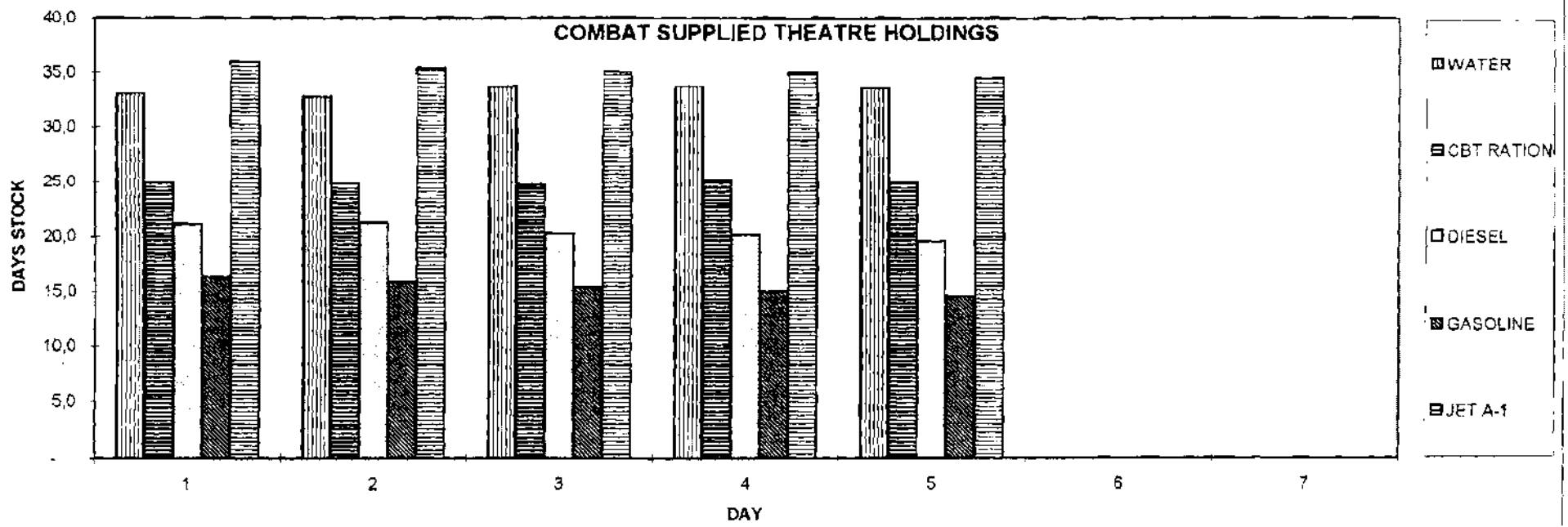
