A. PROBABLE HYJACKING INCIDENT INVOLVING AN NGO.

A. RPF. (1) AT 051810 SEP A CONVOY FROM GITARAMA, BEING ESCORTED BY A MALAWI SECTION, CAME UPON AN NGO VEH WHICH APPEARED TO BE HYJACKED BY RPA SOLDIERS:

THERE WAS AN INITIAL BARRIER OF AN RPA TRUCK, WHICH BLOCKED THE ROAD. AFTER DRIVING AROUND THAT, THE CONVOY CAME UPON AN NGO TRUCK WHICH HAD BEEN PULLED OVER. THE DRIVER WAS BEING TAKEN OUT OF THE TRUCK AND IT SEEMED AS IF THE RPA WERE GOING TO DRIVE AWAY WITH THE TRUCK. THE MALAWI SECTION PROCEEDED PAST THE NGO TRUCK AS THEY WERE UNARMED AND COULD NOT DO ANYTHING.

1. GEN SIT. CALM. PLAN FOXTROT BEING SLOWLY IMPLEMENTED BUT WITHOUT INCIDENT. UNAMIR INSTRUCTIONS FOR INCREASED SECURITY WITHIN SECTOR 4 WERE PASSED LATE AFTERNOON; RESULTS TO FOLLOW. FORCE COMMANDER VISITED ALL BN IN SECTOR 4; RESULTS OF VISIT UNKNOWN.

CORRECTION TO REF A. RGF SOLDIERS WHO SURRENDERED TO GHANBATT WERE NOT EXCHANGED ON 2 SEP. RATHER EXCHANGE DELAYED UNTIL 5 SEP SO THAT ICRC CAN PRESIDE OVER EXCHANGE.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. PRESIDENT FOR RWANDA HELD 3 HOUR RALLY IN BUTARE STADIUM AND VISITED ORPHANAGE AND UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL. RALLY ATTENDED BY 30,000 PLUS PEOPLE AND THE UNAMIR SRSG. GIST OF PRESIDENT SPEECH REPORTED AS:

(1) MAIN TASK IS RECONSTRUCTION OF COUNTRY.

(2) APPEALED FOR PATIENCE AS COUNTRY HAS LITTLE MONEY FOR SALARIES, ETC.

(3) PEOPLE NOT TO TAKE LAW INTO OWN HANDS BUT TO USE LEGAL SYSTEM.

(4) SQUATTERS TO VACATE HOMES WHEN RIGHTFUL OWNERS RETURN.

(5) PLEADED FOR REFUGEES TO RETURN HOME AND AID IN RECONSTRUCTION.

(6) APPEALED TO INTERNATIONAL AGENCIES TO PROVIDE FOOD.

(7) TOLD SOLDIERS TO COOPERATE WITH CIVILIANS.

(NOTE: BBC WORLD SERVICE REPORTED PRESIDENT TO SAY THAT UN AND RPA WOULD SOON BE IN SECTOR 4 TOGETHER. PERHAPS THIS IS WHAT PROMPTED SRSG QUESTION AT PARA 4A BELOW)

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. A. RPA INTENSELY VIGILANT IN BUTARE DUE TO PRESIDENT VISIT. ADDITIONAL PATROLS, CHECKPOINTS AND IDENTIFICATION CHECKS. TROOPS STATIONED ALONG ROUTE GITARAMA TO BUTARE.

B. RPA AT KIZI DETAINED ONE PERSON, MUABONEJO ALOIS, AS BEING SUSPECTED MILITIA. UNHCR BUTARE AWARE AND TOOK PARTICULARS.

C. GHANBATT ARRESTED YVES NBABO IN VICINITY RURAMBA (4716) ON SUSPICION OF CLANDESTINE ACTIVITY. NBABO CLAIMS TO HAVE BEEN SENT WITH 9 OTHERS INTO DMZ BY RPA TO COLLECT NAMES OF MILITIA. DOCUMENTS ON SUSPECT APPEAR TO SUBSTANTIATE HIS STORY.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. TACHQ: (1) RECEIVED SRSG AND STAFF. BRIEFED SRSG ON GENERAL SITUATION BUT UNABLE TO ANSWER HIS QUESTION ON PLANS TO ALLOW RPA INTO SECTOR 4; SUGGEST YOU BRIEF HIM. (2) RECEIVED AND PASSED TO MILOB/HAC A REQUEST TO INVESTIGATE WHEREABOUTS OF 4 PERSONS TAKEN BY RPA (REF B). (3) A WRITTEN COMPLAINT HAS BEEN GIVEN TO LOCAL RPA BRIGADE COMMANDER CONCERNING VISIT AT NIGHT BY ARMED RPA SOLDIERS. ALTHOUGH VISIT BELIEVED TO BE INNOCENT FAMILY REUNION, ITS CONDUCT AT DARK SCARED THE ORPHANS AND STAFF. THE COMPLAINT REQUESTS VISITS BE MADE ONLY IN DAYLIGHT AND AN INTERVIEW BETWEEN G3 THIS HQ AND BRIGADE COMMANDER ON 5 SEP. (4) WERE TO HAVE CONDUCTED OP/MED LIAISON VISIT TO SECTOR 4 UNITS AND 2 FD AMB IN SECTOR 5. VISIT CANCELLED 4 SEP AS NO HELICOPTERS AVAILABLE. (5) DFC TOURED UN UNITS IN BUTARE. LEAVING FOR KIGALI 4 SEP.

B. GHANBATT: CONTINUED WITH TASKS AND GUARDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE, AICF WAREHOUSE AND DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AT CYANIKA. ESTABLISHED SNAP ROADBLOCKS AT RUKONDO (5338), CYANIKA AND TABA (4571). ARRESTED 2 PEOPLE WHO BROKE INTO CLINIC AT RURAMBA (4171) TO STEAL DRUGS AND 1 PERSON AT CYANIKA CAMP SUSPECTED OF POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA.

C. FRAFATT: CONTINUING WITH TASKS. ARRESTED FORMER GENDARME, NDAYAMBAJE JEAN MARIE S/N 17293) FOR MURDER IN KIBUYE AND ATTEMPTED TO TURNOVER TO RPA AT NDABA. RPA WOULD NOT ACCEPT AS HAD NO INSTRUCTIONS TO TAKE SUCH PERSONS.

D. EHTIOBATT: CONTINUED WITH TASKS, PROMOTING PLAN FOXTROT AND COLLECTING WEAPONS VOLUNTARILY (120 WEAPONS, 11 GRENADES, 1 PICKUP TRUCK AND 2500 ROUNDS OF AMMUNITION). SHOWED FORCE COMMANDER RUSIZI 1, ESCORTED 9 ICRC VEHICLES AND ARESTED 9 PERSONS FOR THEFT.

E. MALAWI COY: PROVIDED ARMED ESCORT FOR SRSG WHILE AT PRESIDENTIAL RALLY. TASK TO BRING PRIESTS AND FAMILY HEADS FROM KIBEHO TO BUTARE POSTPONED TO 4 SEP AND FURTHER POSTPONED TO MAYBE 5 SEP AS ANGLICAN CHURCH NOT READY.

F. OTHERS: CONVOY OF 2 ESCORTS AND AND CIVILIAN TANKER MOVING TO CYANGUGU HALTED 40 KM SHORT OF DESTINATION FOR SAFETY REASONS. SLOW SPEED OF TANKER AND POOR ROAD CONDITIONS MADE CONTINUING IN DARK HAZARDOUS. CONVOY CONTINUED AT 040445 SEP.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

A. MILOB 3 REPORT 739 PERSONS RETURNED FROM BURUNDI ON 3 SEP.

B. ETHIOBATT REPORTS 430 REFUGEES RETURN VIA RUSIZI.

C. GHANBATT REPORTS 304 PERSONS EVACUATED FROM GIKONGORO TO KIGALI BY UNHCR.

6. CIVIL AFFAIRS: INCIDENTS OF THEFT INCREASING THROUGHOUT AOR.

7. LOGISTICS:

A. MALAWI COY REQUIRES GENERATOR, REFRIGERATOR/FREEZER, TIMBER AND SHEET STEEL TO ESTABLISH PROPER FIELD KITCHEN. ALSO REQUIRE 6 PATROL VEHICLES AND MOTOROLA RADIOS IN ORDER TO

PERFORM ESCORT DUTIES AND TO COMMUNICATE ON MILOB NET.

1. GEN SIT. SITUATION CALM ALTHOUGH UNITS IN SECTOR 4 ARE AT ALERT STATE YELLOW IN ACCORDANCE WITH OPORD 18. PLAN FOXTROT INITIATED AT 020911 SEP 94 IN SCETOR 4 HOWEVER ONLY 4C HAS FULLY IMPLEMENTED THE PLAN (SEE PARA 3D BELOW). NO SIGNIFICANT REACTION TO SURRENDER OF WEAPONS AND SOME WEAPONS HAVE BEEN SURRENDERED.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. LOCALS ADVISE THAT THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA WILL VISIT BUTARE ON 3 SEP HOWEVER NO NOTICE HAS BEEN RECEIVED THROUGH UNAMIR CHANNELS. THE UNAMIR SRSG WILL BE COMING TO BUTARE ON THE SAME DATE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. (1) THE NUMBER AND FREQUENCY OF RPA ARMED MOVEMENT AND PATROLS IN AND AROUND BUTARE INCREASED DURING THE NIGHT OF 2 SEP 94. IT IS SUSPECTED THAT THIS INCREASE IS IN PREPARATION OF THE PRESIDENT'S VISIT.

(2) ONE RPA VEHICLE CONTAINING 15 PERSONS MOVED WITH AN ESCORT THROUGH THE DMZ IN SECTOR 4B. BN COMD CONFIRMS THAT THE ARRANGEMENT TO ENTER THE DMZ WAS FOR RESUPPLY PURPOSES AND THAT TO DATE, LITTLE TO NO SUPPLIES HAVE BEEN MOVED. BN COMD WILL DISCUSS MATTER WITH RPA SECTOR COMD.

(3) RPA COMD FOR MUSHUBATI (3278) SECTOR REQUESTED CLEARANCE TO TRAVEL THROUGH THE DMZ ON 2 SEP.

B. RGF. (1) ETHIOBATT REPORTS VOLUNTARY SURRENDER OF RGF WEAPONS AND MILITARY EQUIPMENT (A) GUFUNZO 26 WEAPONS (B) CYANGUGU 2X AK47 (C) KAMBA AND RUSIZI 32 WEAPONS AND (D) 3 MOTOR VEHICLES.

(2) GHANBATT REPORTS 19 FORMER RGF SOLDIERS WISHED TO LEAVE SECTOR 4. ARRANGEMENTS WERE MADE TO HAVE MILOB OBSERVE THE HANDOVER TO RPA AT KIZI CROSSING.

D. GENDARMERIE. GHANBATT AND FRAFBATT ADVISE THAT THERE ARE NO GENDARMERIE WITHIN THEIR SECTORS HOWEVER THERE ARE ARMED COMMUNAL POLICE WHO THEY TRUST AND WISH TO RETAIN AT THIS STAGE. RECOMMENDATION TO THIS EFFECT SENT AT REF A.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. TACHQ: HELD COORDINATION CONFERENCE WITH BN COMD LESS ETHIOBATT. DFC ARRIVED THIS LOCATION AT 021700 SEP.

B. GHANBATT: CONTINUING WITH TASKS. WILL PROVIDE 3 TRUCKS TO SUPPORT UNHCR ON 3 SEP 94.

C. FRAFBATT:

D. ETHIOBATT: CONTINUING WITH TASK AND PREPARATION OF FOXHOLES. COLLECTED NUMBER OF WEAPONS FROM FORMER RGF SOLDIERS. MIL ENGINEERS REMOVED 3 HAND GRENADES FROM AROUND THE UNHCR RESIDENCE IN CYANGUGU. ALL STOLEN PROPERTY THAT WAS CONFISCATED FROM SUSPECTED THIEVES WAS TURNED OVER TO THE CIVIL AUTHORITIES.

E. MALAWI COY: AWAITING TASKS.

F. AUS TMT SECT: CONDUCTED CLINIC AT SAVE AND VISIT BRESORO CAMP

G. CAN SIGS: (1) UCRATZZ CAPABILITY PROVIDED TO 4A AND 4C. (2) VEHICLE FROM SIGS HQ KIGALI WAS REPORTED THREE HOURS OVERDUE FROM TRIP INTO SECTOR 3. VEHICLE ARRIVED KIGALI JUST BEFORE SEARCH TEAM DISPATCHED. VEHICLE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN TRAVELLING OFF THE MAIN ROUTE. REQUEST/RECOMMEND THAT IN FUTURE THIS HQ BE ADVISED OF ANY MOVEMENT OFF THE MAIN SUPPLY ROUTES IN OUR AOR.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

A. ARRANGED WITH MALAWI COY TO TRANSPORT/ESCORT APPROXIMATELY 35 PEOPLE FROM KIBEHO CAMP TO BUTARE AND RETURN ON 3/4 SEP. PURPOSE IS TO SHOW/PROVE TO COMMUNAL LEADERS THE CONDITIONS IN THE GOVERNMENT CONTROLLED AREAS. MALAWI COY VEHICLES USED AS TRANSPORT REQUEST FOR UNAMIR KIGALI RESOURCES WAS DECLINED.

B. ETHIOBATT REPORTS 733 PEOPLE RETURNED TO RWANDA VIA BUGARAMA (233) AND RUSIZI 1 AND 2 (500). ALSO 200 PEOPLE RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES FROM NYAARAMSHASHI CAMP.

C. MILOB SECTOR 3 ADVISES THAT 1617 PEOPLE (INCLUDING INFANTS) RETURNED TO SECTOR 3 FROM SECTOR 4C DURING 29 AUG- 1 SEP.

D. NGO, ENFANTES DE MONDE AND ADRA, ESTABLISHED OFFICES IN KIBUYE.

E. FROM HAC OFFICER THIS HQ:

(1) LOCAL BLOOD SPECIALIST HAS RETURNED TO BUTARE UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL. EQUIPMENT IS AVAILABLE BUT THERE IS NO ELECTRICITY. SPECIALIST HAS CONTACTED AUSTRALIAN MILITARY HOSPITAL.

(2) REF REQUEST FROM HAC KIGALI FOR MORE DETAILS ON UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL, THE ONLY PROBLEM WHICH CANNOT BE RESOLVED BY LOCAL NGOS IS SALARIES. THERE ARE 13 DOCTORS (AT 2000 PLUS RF PER DAY) AND 50 NURSES (AT 1000 PLUS RF PER DAY). REQUEST YOUR ASSISTANCE.

(3) SIMILAR FINANCIAL PROBLEM EXISTS WITH BUTARE WATER PLANT. THERE IS NO MONEY FOR SALARIES OF THE 60 WORKERS. THIS PLANT IS ABOUT TO START PUMPING WATER BUT WE ARE RELUCTANT TO DO SO AS THE MACHINERY WILL LIKELY BECOME DAMAGED WITHIN DAYS USING UNSKILLED VOLUNTEER WORKERS. REQUEST ASSISTANCE.

(4) FOR INFO, POPULATION OF BUTARE IS 126,000.

(5) WFP AND ICRC ARE CONDUCTING FOOD AND SEED SURVEY. THEY BELIEVE THE PLANTING SEASON ENDS MID OCTOBER AND PLAN TO START DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD (WFP 1200 TONS) AND BEAN SEEDS (ICRC 350 TONS) COMMENCING 15 SEP. PREFECT AND LOCAL FARMERS ADVISE PLANTING SEASON ENDS ON 1 OCT. REQUEST ICRC AND WFP BE PUSHED TO START FOOD, SEED AND TOOL DISTRIBUTION ASAP.
