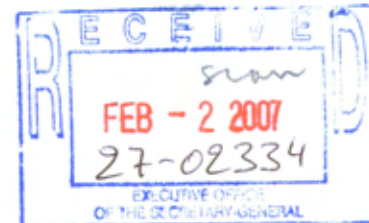

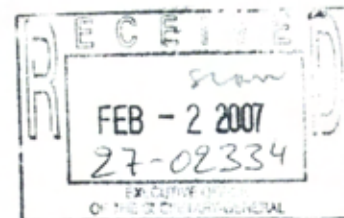

SUBJECT: Proposal to commemorate International Mine Awareness Day
OBJET:

1. The General Assembly has declared April 4 of each year the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action.

2. The United Nations Mine Action Team (comprising 14 UN departments, agencies, programmes and funds) is coordinating publicity events worldwide to mark the Day. Among the events proposed by the Team in New York are demining demonstrations. The Team would like to request your permission to organize these demonstrations.

3. The Humanitarian Demining Training Center (HDTC) in Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, has offered to send three staff and equipment to stage the demonstrations, which we would like to hold from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on April 4, 2007.

a. We propose that the demonstrations take place on the North Lawn, directly adjacent to the plaza. HDTC suggests setting up their demonstrations on about 30 square meters of the lawn. Observers would remain on the plaza, looking down at the deminers, one of whom would describe how metal detectors work and how mines are located and removed. Visitors would not be permitted on the lawn.

b. In the event of rain, the HDTC would prefer not to do demonstrations at all, rather than work under the protection of a tent or canopy, which they believe would make the site seem too unrealistic. HDTC would nevertheless establish the mock minefield for visitors to view, even if demonstrations are not taking place.

c. Creating the mock minefield may entail inserting or burying models of mines and unexploded ordnance. With permission from facilities management, HDTC may want to show how earth is scraped away to reveal the location of a mine.

- d. We understand from the UN Safety Unit and the office of the Capital Master Plan that work on the new temporary UN facilities will not begin until after April 4. Therefore, there is no risk that the demonstrations would interfere or overlap with demolition of the North Lawn area.
4. We would also like to inquire about parking for HDTC's vehicle while they unload their equipment and displays on April 3 and when they reload them on April 4. Would they be allowed to bring their vehicle near the entrance to the visitor's entrance near E. 46th Street at 1st Avenue?
5. In addition, our proposal includes informal mine risk education talks to visitors inside the visitor's lobby of the Secretariat on April 4. These talks would be organized jointly by UNICEF and the International Committee of the Red Cross. This activity might require a table or an easel where speakers may display their materials and about a dozen folding chairs for anyone who wants to sit in on the lessons.
6. We have contacted several top UN officials, such as UNICEF's Executive Director, to participate in or make statements on April 4, either inside the lobby as part of other events described below, or outside, at the site of demining demonstrations.
7. Other activities we propose in New York would begin in mid-March and continue through mid-April. One of these activities would be a photo exhibition in the visitor's lobby of the Secretariat. Ideally, the exhibition would feature the works of three photographers (we have so far received confirmation from one of them) and would be mounted on the white panels immediately to the left of the entrance. We have informally discussed this possibility with Jan Arneson, Renata Morteo and Maria Felisa Wichman.
8. We are approaching the office of the Secretary-General to ask him to officially open the photographic exhibition for us on April 4 (even though the exhibit will have already been installed a week or two earlier) and to make a statement commemorating the Day.
9. Within the walls of the photo exhibition, we would like to set up several display cases with models of landmines and unexploded ordnance and with the actual anti-personnel mine-ban treaty, as we did last year.
10. Near the exhibition, we propose setting up a video monitor to run a continuous loop of an IRIN film about the problem of unexploded cluster munitions in Lebanon, a film by the Mines Advisory Group about explosive ordnance disposal in Sudan, and several public service announcements about UN mine action.
11. Also near the exhibition, we would like to set up at least one computer

through which visitors may use an interactive CD ROM that explains how to remain safe in areas affected by landmines and explosive remnants of war.

12. We propose to update the landmine section of the permanent exhibit on disarmament on the third floor of the Secretariat. The Department of Disarmament Affairs has already informed us that they would endorse this effort. After the exhibit is updated, we would propose to brief the tour guides to ensure they have the latest information on the world's landmine problem and the UN response to it.

13. There may be additional activities aimed at the press (such as a participation in one of the UN spokesperson's noon briefings) and UN staff (a possible panel discussion in the Dag Hammarskjöld Library Auditorium). We will follow up with DPI colleagues about these plans as soon as we have a concrete proposal.

14. In the meantime, please let us know whether you approve of our proposals and if there are any charges associated with these activities or security services. You may contact my colleagues Olga Devyatkin at X32505 or Richard Kollodge at X35677 if you have any questions.

Kaori,

If the Secretary-General agreed to open the exhibit, he would be the only speaker. We would ask him to say a few words about the landmine problem and then link that to the photo exhibit, which is being mounted to commemorate the April 4 International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action. His message would only need to be three or four minutes, and of course we would propose a text for his consideration well in advance of the event.

I think that our ideal time would be 1:10 p.m. The invitations we're sending out say that the opening will take place at 1 p.m., so we're assuming the crowd would be gathered by then. There is no reception, so the crowd would remain only as long as it takes for people to hear the Secretary-General, view the images, and perhaps meet the photographers, who will be present at the event.

If you prefer, we could arrange to have a senior UN official to introduce the Secretary-General. People we would approach for this would be the Under-Secretary-General for Peacekeeping Operations (he serves as chairman of the Inter-Agency Coordination Group on Mine Action) or the Director of UNDP's Bureau for Crisis Prevention and Recovery, which oversees mine action for that organization. We already approached the Executive Director of UNICEF who just informed us that she will be out of the country that day.

I will be away from the office starting later this afternoon until next Thursday morning. But feel free to ring me on my cell phone, which I believe will work overseas, 917-698-6249. I don't know whether I will have access to my e-mail while I'm away. To commemorate the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action in New York, the United Nations, on its North Lawn on April 4, will host a mock minefield and free demining demonstrations by the Humanitarian Demining Training Center, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Inside the UN visitors lobby in the General Assembly Building at 1 p.m. the same day, a top UN official will open *Enduring Fear*, a month-long exhibition of photographs by Charlotte Oestervang and Bobby Neel Adams about landmines, explosive remnants of war and the people affected by them. Landmines, cluster munitions and other devices, along with the actual mine-ban treaty, will also be on display that day through the end of April.

Next to the photography exhibition, UNICEF will host free mine-risk education workshops for the public on April 4 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

AWARENESS DAY

April 4 is International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action.

The Public Service Announcements were produced for the UN Mine Action Service by award-winning director Kevin Thomas and the New York-based Brooklyn Brothers advertising firm. The UN Mine Action Service coordinates mine-clearance and victim assistance work in 30 countries.

Two of the PSAs are about farmers whose livelihoods were taken from them because of landmines. The third PSA tells a tale of a fictional girls' soccer match during which one of the players steps on a landmine.

These spots are intended to keep the public's attention focused on eliminating landmines at a time when interest in the problem appears to be dwindling.

Although progress has been made in removing landmines from the 83 countries affected by them, the number of fatalities and injuries remains alarmingly high—about 15,000 new victims annually worldwide. The problem can be resolved, but success depends on maintaining on public support for getting the job done.

More information is also available in a letter to broadcasters written by USG for Peacekeeping Operations Jean-Marie Guehenno and USG for Communications and Public Information Shashi Tharoor.
