Food Relief Report

I. Vehicles and transport

A. Arrangements already made

a/ Vehicles for South Kasai refugee relief programme

I had to hire from M.A.S. Co. two 10-ton semi-towing tractors, with driver, for the transport, from the Amato flour mills to the Luluabourg aeroport, of 1,000 tons of flour purchased for the refugee relief programme. Daily cost: 5,000 C.Frs. for the two; cost up to present: 125,000 C.Frs.

I hired from Sopoka Co. as well a 6-ton GMC lorry at cost of 1,000 C.Frs. a day for a duration of 7 days. We discontinued hiring this lorry as soon as the lorry from the Canadian Signal Corps was turned over to us. This vehicle was put into service at once. I should be grateful if you could give me instructions regarding the registration of this vehicle and the taking over of it by the ONUC office of civilian affairs.

The hiring of M.A.S. vehicles will be discontinued as soon as we receive in a few days lorries sent from Léo for the South Kasai refugee relief programme.

I had to have M.A.S transport to Lusambo, at cost of 1,324 C.Frs., 40 tons of palm-oil purchased from Nogueira.

B. Projects

a/ Maintenance of vehicles

When contacts were first made with the Ghana Brigade it appeared that the transport section would not be able to take care of the maintenance of the Pakistani lorries.

/...

I propose therefore that we have our own garage. With this in mind I have already done a certain amount of prospecting in Luluabourg. We could obtain the Kapulato garage, which comprises of two grease racks, a workshop, store and necessary installations, on the basis of a rent of 30 to 40,000 C.Frs. per month (for six months). Along with this garage there are living quarters with three bedrooms. We could recruit necessary personnel and mechanics, principally among Lulua refugees recently laid off from the Kamina Base and who will be arriving shortly in Luluabourg.

b/ Necessary vehicles

In accordance with our conversation of last evening, it would be necessary for me to have a vehicle for myself in order to go from one place to another (car or jeep (Land-rover)). Moreover it is also necessary to obtain a station-wagon which with a driver would enable us to transport crews, personnel arriving in Luluabourg, etc. As a consequence, it would perhaps be necessary to obtain some vehicles for the military at Movement Control.

c/ Petrol

Petrol for lorries can be supplied by Amato Co. who have retained quite a considerable stock due to the fact that they were able to accumulate their petrol attributions for the months of September, October, November and December, a period during which time this Luluabourg station was closed.

II. Procurement

Following the conclusion of a contract with Amato Bros. of Luluabourg, this company was to have furnished us daily with 30 tons of maize-flour. Up to this time the agreement has not been carried out even though:

The labourers work all around the clock 7 days a week; I continually urge them on;

Mr. Israël, director of Amato, has engaged 17 extra men and has threatened to discharge his workers if 45 tons of flour (figure asked for to obtain 30) have not been delivered each day.

Reasons for this failure are:

Shortage of European staff;

Lack of specialists. Here as in other parts of Kasai, the departure of Balubas is disrupting labour;

Perhaps the voluntary slackening of work on the part of Lulua workers who are aware that this flour is being sent to South Kasai;

Breakdown of equipment due to lack of maintenance by specialized personnel.

/...

In conclusion, I think that it would be possible, nevertheless, upon further insistence to boost the daily average of 18 tons (last 10 days' average) to 25 or 30 tons.

III. Personnel

A. ONUC Personnel

If the South Kasai food relief programme is to develop along the original plan of anticipated fulfilment it is indispensable that I have a Finance-assistant. The engagement and payment of the numerous teams of Congolese workers on the one hand and the rentals and purchases which will necessitate without a doubt an extensive operation on the other hand will create accounting work which Mr. Messeri, Finance Officer in Luluabourg, would not be able to handle along with his regular duties.

I am also in need of a secretary, bilingual if possible, to whom I could dictate mail, reports or telegrams.

I think if the programme is to develop fully it would be necessary that I devote all my time to it. I should be grateful if you would follow through with the measures you have already undertaken in this direction and I am sure that your influence will override any administrative obstacles which may appear. Moreover, I believe, all personal interest set aside, that a higher grade would be necessary to affirm the post of co-ordinator and to give him independence over against all persons other than yourself.

B. Local Personnel

As the Ghana soldiers will no doubt not be able to handle all the storekeeping work involved in this operation, I suppose we should employ about a hundred Congolese workers. I should appreciate it if you would let me know in time what type of contract we can give them, keeping in mind the fact that we should have teams working day and night. Some teams will be needed at the same time for the loading and unloading of trains and lorries, as well as at the aeroport. In certain cases, it would be well to have rations available allowing the workers to have a meal on the spot without interrupting work.

I have given an authorization of principle, with reserve of the approval of Mr. Rossborough, Chief of Personnel, for the employment of three workers to clean the houses at the disposal of the 66 Pakistani drivers and their officers. With the vehicles arriving shortly, these soldiers will be called to work each day and I think it would be well to have these workers to take care of their cantonments.

/...

IV. Lodgings

I have asked Major Addo, Logistics Officer of the Ghana Brigade, if the Pakistani transport section drivers could use the four houses formerly rented for the use of the Brigade's reconnaissance squad. This Unit of armoured vehicles is now active in interior regions where its presence is more necessary than in Luluabourg. This cantonment having at its disposition a large parking area is suitable for the necessities of a transport company; however, it would be useful to rent for two months an extra villa located nearby. There are 66 Pakistani drivers and 2 officers whereas there were only 30 men in the Ghanaian reconnaissance squad. (Envisaged cost: 10,000 C.Frs. a month for 2 months.)

If the airlift is set up with C-124 planes from Léo to Luluabourg and relayed by DC-4s from Luluabourg to Bakwanga, it will most likely be necessary to anticipate rental of villas for the lodging of crews. Hotel rooms are rarely available in Luluabourg.

V. Working-stock

If, as you had mentioned during our meeting, we had to all at once unload great quantities of food at the BCK Railway and in Luluabourg, 4 fork-lifts would be necessary. The speed at which the trains, lorries or planes are unloaded depends a great deal on the working-stock involved. Usually the loading of 10 6-ton lorries should not take over two hours if we wanted to accomplish the Luluabourg - Bakwanga trip back and forth in 24 hours.

If the airlift using C-124s were to be set up definitively between Léo and Luluabourg, it would be desirable to obtain a petrol pump to supply the planes. The aeroport in Luluabourg only has one and that is used most of the time by Sabena planes.

VI. Depots

Two propositions have been made by some town merchants for the rental of depots in case of possible necessity.

VII. Petty Cash

The Co-ordinator of South Kasai food relief should have at his disposal a small amount of ready cash for emergency cases. For example, Sunday morning none of the workers of Amato Co. whom I had left working Saturday evening and who had promised to work the following day, turned up. It was absolutely indispensable to find workers as there were 4 planes for the airlift at the aeroport to be loaded and a petrol car at the railway station to unload for these same planes. If, at the time, I had had ready cash on hand, it

would have been easy to recruit 20 or 30 Congolese from the "cité" by telling them "I have 30 tons of flour to load. You can earn 50 or 100 Francs a piece". Instead, not having the money on me, I had to look for Mr. Israël, director of Amato, who had to have 15 workers recruited through his Chief Clerk, while I obtained 15 prisoners, loaned to me by the Prison director. We had thus avoided having the planes take off again without fulfilling the mission and being forced to fill up with petrol in Kamina. Nevertheless, we lost two precious hours. I believe that there will be many similar cases in the months to come. Moreover, when we ask the Congolese workers to put forth a special effort, it would be a good thing if we could offer them beer and cigarettes - an expenditure which would be greatly compensated by the increase in output.

The emergency operation to get food to Bakwanga refugees is in danger of being strangled by an inadequate operational capacity in Movement Control Section of the Logistics Branch of Military Headquarters, ONUC.

An international effort is being made with greatest urgency to lay down a supply line from the outside world with a capacity to deliver at least seventy tons of food each day at the Bakwanga outlet. When the bulk shipments begin to arrive by sea in the first days of February, we shall start to fill the surface pipeline inland from Matadi but it will be fifteen to twenty days later before supplies begin to flow out at the Bakwanga end. During that period it will be necessary to rail part of the bulk supplies to Leopoldville and to fly them into Bakwanga from there at the rate of at least seventy tons per day. In addition, there will be a succession of priority shipments, not susceptible to advanced planning, of equipment, medical supplies, etc., as the day-to-day development of the operation will certainly require. At the present time Movement Control at Leopoldville is unable to cope with an emergency lift which should now be moving at a rate of about thirty tons per day at the N'Djili airfield but is far from that average level. Priority shipments of maize flour which should be moving to Bakwanga at the rate of twenty tons per day are piling up at N'Djili airport. There have also been serious delays caused by Movement Control at N'Djili sending back to Leopoldville truck loads of stores required for the Bakwanga Refugee Operation, because they lacked normal documentation. The supplies in question were,

of course, abnormal in kind, and at all other stages of procurement and supply had been given utmost priority with a minimum regard for red tape. The difficulty appears to be that Movement Control, as it is now organized, cannot cope instantaneously with the rapid succession of unexpected priority consignments and switches of plan which are characteristic of all emergency operations.

The heavy cost of the airlift is being in part wasted because aircrafts are allowed to fly with only partial loads.

The rate at which the supplies are pumped through our inland pipeline depends on the operational capacity of Movement Control, and recent performance certainly suggests that their present capacity is not large enough to handle, in addition to their military commitments, a flow of supplies on the scale at which they will very soon be reaching us.

Moreover, having aroused a great and growing concern among the public in many member nations for the plight of the refugees, the Press is watching our performance with the closest interest. Not only are the lives of thousands of refugees at stake, therefore, but also the reputation of the United Nations with respect to this very important sector of its operations in the Congo.

It is recommended that steps be taken urgently to make an appreciation of this problem and to bring about such organizational changes as are necessary to put adequate logistical services under this most important operation.

USE OF THE FORMINIÈRE RESTAURANT

I am sorry to inform the staff that certain cases have been brought to my attention where the conduct of United Nations personnel in the Forminière Restaurant has allegedly provoked resentment on the part of the company's management. I am sure that all members of the staff realize that in the interest of our work in South-Kasaï it is imperative that any unnecessary causes of friction should be carefully avoided. The guiding principle should be to remember at all times that the Forminière Restaurant is not a public institution where every paying client can expect to receive service corresponding to the money he pays. It is in fact a private mess to which we are invited as guests. Therefore, staff members should endeavour to strictly observe attendance hours. Those coming late by reason of their service, should accept without protest or observations what is served to them, even if it should defer from the main menu of the day. Comments and personal opinions concerning the company and its role in South-Kasaï should better not be vented in places where they can reach the attention of company personnel.

It is with great reluctance that I have to communicate these observations to the staff. However, I hope that it will be clearly understood that the interest of our work requires that attention be given to this matter.

Donation of Relief Supplies by Central Government

Mr. Kasavubu, President of the Republic of the Congo, has made a gift of supplies to the refugees in Bakwanga in the value of half million Congolese francs. We were informed the day before yesterday that this gift was ready to be transported to N'Djili airport and ONUC was asked to lift them by air to Bakwanga. The President's office has not specified the weights, varieties or packages involved.

Will you please arrange immediately to have any supplies, repeat any supplies, which are addressed to Bakwanga for the Refugee Relief Operation accepted at N'Djili airport and placed in the American hangar.

I am arranging for Mr. Oertle of this office to be stationed at the hangar for the next several days in order to take note of and arrange the documentation necessary to obtain air movement of these and other supplies for Bakwanga with the greatest possible speed.

I cannot give you more details of the gift of the Central Government, but I hereby pass to you the responsibility for seeing that no political incident is caused by a second refusal to accept these at the airport.

I am sending a copy of this message to Mr. Dayal and Dr. Linner.

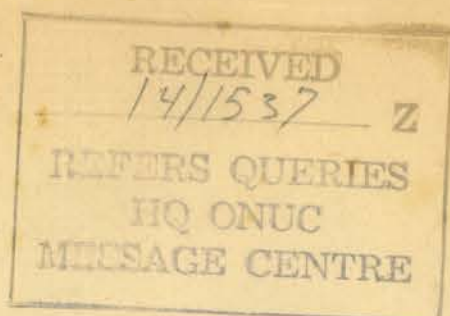

... The concern expressed by Mr. Abbas and Sir Alexander MacFarquhar, in the attached cable to Mr. Dayal and yourself, that there should be unity of command in the field is well founded. However, I think in this instance it is misdirected.

The decision taken in New York to assign to FAO the basic responsibility for procurement of the food required for the Kasai refugees has not entailed a division of functions in the Congo. Our agreement with FAO requires them to obtain the food necessary and to get it to the Congo on time. The Refugee Relief Coordinator, ONUC, has the responsibility of receiving, moving and storing and of distributing the food in the Congo.

But there is real cause for concern about the possibility of loss of effectiveness in the relief supply operation in the Congo, because the operation is dependent in transportation and movement on decisions made in the Logistics Branch of Military Headquarters, ONUC, and, for operational communications, on the military units in the area.

Coordination of supply movements in the relief operation is far from satisfactory at present and it certainly cannot be said that we have that unity of command in the field which Mr. Abbas and Sir Alexander stress as essential.

I do not doubt that Mr. Grün will wish to discuss with you the policy aspects of this quite serious operational problem on his return from Bakwanga.

Vehicles for Food Relief

I refer to Dr. Linner's telegram, ONUC 167, to New York and their reply, 197, authorizing ONUC to take over 13 Canadian vehicles for food relief, settlement to be negotiated between UN, New York, and the Canadian authorities, subject to Mr. Olver's agreement that military operations are not prejudiced.

I would point out that the Logistics Branch of Military HQ has allocated 11 of these vehicles to the Refugee Relief Coordinator, and I have so far received confirmation of delivery of seven of these. Six were obtained in Leopoldville and one in Luluabourg.

I am informed that 4 additional vehicles are on their way to Luluabourg, to be handed over to the Refugee Relief Coordinator.

In settling with the Canadian authorities it should be borne in mind that 11 ^{vehicles}, and not 13 as mentioned in the exchange of cables under reference, have been taken over by the Refugee Relief Coordinator.

I am sending a copy of this memo to the Chief Logistics Officer for his information.
