Your 8037 presumably refers our 8269 your 7036 and cable detonating mine clearing anti personnel M1. Info requested as follows:

A flexible linear charge used to clear narrow lanes in anti personnel mine fields consisting of nylon covered cable 170 feet long and about one inch diameter. Cabled coiled around cone in carrying case. Cone removed from case before unit is fired. One end of cable anchored to ground by thirteen inch oak tent stake and has sleeve containing booster charge and well for fifteen second delay detonator. Launcher is aluminum folding stand when set on level ground with propulsion unit on launcher angle of elevation 38 degrees. Cable is projected across mine field where it is exploded by 15 second detonator. Grass, leaves other light vegetation and some soil blown aside in lane about eight feet wide. Camouflaged AP mines and those near surface are normally exposed. If cable less than 6 inches off ground pressure type AP mines with pressure surface directly under cable detonated and destroyed. Pressure type mines withing 5 feet of cable may or may not be fired. Mines not exploded by cable may become extremely sensitive. Detonation of cable across trip mines either cuts wires or detonates mines to which connected.

1. Indonesian contingent departs Djakarta on Blatchford 4 December. Contingent consists at present of one battalion, combat team of paratroopers, one anti-aircraft unit with six 40 mm L/70 bofors guns and twelve 0.50 heavy MG and one detachment each signals, ordnance, medical, quartermasters, military police and information officers. Total 1800 troops. Indonesian mission has been requested to furnish details strength and organisation of each unit.

2. Contingent is taking with them three months supply basic items plus six months supply dry Indonesian ingredients and condensed foods. Indonesian mission has been requested to procure detailed load tables necessary for transport arrangements between Dar Es Salaam and the Congo. Indonesian government not repeat not able to provide tentage for contingent. Please advise regarding your accommodation possibilities.

3. Indonesian government has requested United Nations to provide in the Congo vehicles and communication equipment for contingent. Field Service is processing request and will advise re delivery.

4. Blatchford plans to proceed according to following schedule:

2. I note and endorse view expressed in para 8 of your message. In this regard, would call your attention to my 8244 of 22 November which would seem to me to make this new recommendation superfluous. I note, however, the limitations on your capability to carry out this recommendation set forth in ONUC 7926 and para 2 of ONUC 7953. I must add also that any aerial counteraction to be undertaken by ONUC aircraft is to be on the basis of fulfilling security Council resolutions and in pursuance of your standing instructions and not repeat not in connection with any joint ONUC-ANC operation or at the request of the ANC.-

1. Suggest you issue press release along following lines :

"For the past three weeks, ONUC reports have indicated that Katangese aircraft have engaged in offensive operations against villages and ANC positions in North Katanga.

Mr. Tshombe has been warned that the UN takes a grave view of these provocative acts; that under its mandate it has the duty to put an end to such murderous attacks; and that it is determined to use all means at its disposal for that purpose. He has been asked to call an immediate halt to the depredations of Katangese aircraft and to honour his own pledge to abide by the acting Secretary General's plan of national reconciliation. ONUC has pointed out that all Katangese aircraft are flown by mercenary pilots, notwithstanding Mr. Tshombe's repeated assertions that there are no more mercenaries in Katanga.

ONUC reconnaissance and patrol flights are being carried out in north Katanga in order to assess the precise scope of Katangese offensive operations as a basis of subsequent ONUC action prescribed by its mandate".

2. Please ask Mathu to draft response to Tshombe's protest along similar lines, further reiterating Gardiner's previous warning (G1595 and our 7990 refer), and cable draft for approval.-

Your ONUC 7837. I fully appreciate your difficulty. I suggest the following procedure :

Incorporate in a new draft financial law the provisions in part roman 9 - Public finance - of the federal constitution, and chapter 4 - budget, Public accounts and supervision - of the present draft financial law not in any way alter the text of the constitutional provisions.

Please understand that the above suggestion is to enable Adoula to deposit draft financial law in parliament. As soon as the constitution is adopted by parliament the law will become invalid. When this happens a new law will have to be drafted to deal with procedural matters such as are now contained in chapter 4 of the draft financial law, and the procedure to be followed by the " Cour des comptes " and the commissions provided for in article 187 and 188 of the constitution.

Incidentally, your ONUC 7837, although first transmitted on 21 November was not received here until today. Can you please investigate and let me know what caused the delay in the transmission of the message.

After clearance with Adoula serve notice on both central government and katangese authorities that ONUC plane will be proceeding to Kongolo at a specified time with a doctor to evacuate Red Cross representative seriously wounded. On the assumption that various factors such as Katangese secession, decline of production and disorganization of tax offices have not only affected the total amount of public receipts but have also made their classification difficult, we doubt whether we can properly base 1962 estimates on 1960 figures.
2. Your estimates for public receipts exclusive of Katanga are CF 6,050 millions a year (2,900 plus 3,150). Unable reconcile this figure with actual receipts from January to end of July amounting to CF 2,480 millions on basis of which figure for full year would not exceed CF 4,250 millions.
3. Your estimates for public receipts including Katanga amount to CF 7,700 millions (4,050 plus 3,650), showing a gross increase of CF 1,650 over CF 6,050 millions mentioned



in paragraph 2 above. This can hardly be reconciled with actual taxes and customs duties totalling CF 3,260 millions collected by Katangese authorities in 1961, not to mention portfolio's revenue in the sum of CF 500 millions.

Further to my 8144 of 19 November, I still have not received the comments of the legal counsel, but in order to assist you I would like to make the following observations :

1. Provisions in part IX -Public Finance - of the draft federal constitution of the Republic of the Congo (hereinafter referred to as the constitution) should on no account be reproduced in any other legislation. These provisions are paramount. Also, powers granted by the constitution to the federal republic and the provinces should not be whittled down.

2. Draft finance act contravenes principles stated in paragraph 1 above in the following respects :

(A) Chapter 1 - Legislation concerning public finance - is unnecessary. Reasons are as follows :

Article 1 of draft finance act is covered by article 181 of the constitution ; articles 2 and 3 by 176 ; article 4 is unnecessary ; article 5, first sentence is unnecessary ; second sentence dealing with scale of court fees is Ultra Vires article 158 of the constitution.

3. (A) Chapter 2 - Administration of public finance - articles 6, 7 and 8 are covered by articles 176 and 177 of the constitution ; article 9 is unnecessary ; article 10 is covered by article 176, paragraph 2 of the constitution.



(B) Chapter 3 - Division of public revenues, etc - articles 11 and 12 are covered by article 178 of the constitution ; article 13 is unnecessary ; article 14 is unnecessary. Article 15 : You appear to have overlooked the very important problem concerning the "Congo Portfolios". In fact, this matter appears to have been completely overlooked in the constitution itself. Can you offer any explanation ? Article 16 is Ultra Vires the constitution and should be omitted ; article 17 is covered by article 180 of the constitution ; article 18 is Ultra Vires the constitution, which does not envisage any distribution of revenues between the provincial authorities and the "conscriptions" and "communes" .

4. Bellec, who is studying chapter 4 - budget, public accounts and supervision of the draft finance act - which deals with purely administrative and procedural matters, has informed me that that chapter is incomplete in many respects, and he is preparing comments which will be forwarded to you in due course. Legally chapter 4 can only apply to federal republic.

5. The comments embodied above deal exclusively with legal aspects of the draft law. It appears to me that what is wanted is procedural as opposed to a substantive enactment. The substantive law is embodied in the constitution. You have to consider, for example, whether you should not incorporate in the draft law the procedure to be followed by members of the "cour des comptes", which is provided for in article 186 of the constitution. This same comment applies to the commissions envisaged in articles 187 and 188 of the constitution. Please bear in mind that the federal government cannot, without an amendment of the constitution, be given powers other than those granted to it in the constitution. You should also please remember the significance of the provision in article 176 of

the constitution on the exercise of concurrent powers by the federal republic and the provinces in regard to legislation relating to "the levying of all other taxes, including excise and consumer taxes."

The draft financial law cannot be enacted until after the constitution comes into force.

We have not received comments of legal counsel on draft financial law, but from our study of the draft legislation we can say that it is in many instances Ultra Vires draft Congolese constitution. Draft financial law also unnecessarily repeats provisions in draft constitution. This is unnecessary. In many instances where provisions of draft constitution are repeated in draft financial law, effect of such provisions has been considerably watered down in draft financial law. Furthermore, certain powers conferred on Federal Republic by draft financial law are for constitutional reasons invalid. It is therefore our view that draft financial law in its present form should not be presented to parliament.

We shall pouch within the next few days detailed commentary of draft financial law. This will precede such comments as legal counsel may make.

We note with interest Mathus reference to Tshombe being " Scared stiff " (G 1621) and hope that this is true, since it is only in this state of mind that Mr. Tshombe is likely to prove amenable to reason. Mathu might be advised not to go to any great length to allay Tshombes fear. Mathu has correctly advised Tshombe, as reported in G 1619, that the excitement and tension are of his own making and Mathu could well be advised to add that Struelens in the reports he sends to Eville and in the propaganda he disseminates here is a major contributor to this condition.
2. In connexion with the continuing blockade of our supplies at Sakania and Didolo (G 1623) it would be useful to have Mathus assessment of the feasibility of informing Tshombe that unless the blockade on our supplies is immediately lifted, we will stop all railroad traffic through Eville. You~~x~~ will recall that we discussed this during my recent visit to Leo. Make it clear to Mathu that we are not asking him to take such action at this point but would not hesitate to do so if he and Prem Chand would consider it an effective riposte to the blockade and something that we could readily sustain militarily. If this step should be taken it would in fact be an ultimatum.
3. With regard to G 1625, would like to know basis for thinking in terms of possible necessity for evacuation of ONUC civilian personnel. Our assumption has been, particularly following my talks with the military in Leo, that our military strength~~in~~ in Elisabethville is fully adequate to ensure complete security in that area. Please clarify.

Following is text of a letter dated November 12 from Sir Patrick Dean to the Secretary-General : " Your excellency, Mr. Crowes confidential letter (11653/33/62 of September 5, 1962, told you of her majesty's government intention to contribute two million dollars to help with the short-term difficulties of the congolese government.

I now have the honour to confirm the information already passed orally to the Secretariat to the effect that an announcement on this subject was made in the house of commons on November 2 in the following terms :

" In the light of the acceptance by the central government and Mr Tshombe of the proposal for national reconciliation, her majesty's government have decided to make a grant of two million dollars par( about sevenhundred and fourteen thousand pounds sterling ) to assist the Congo ; it will be channelled through the United Nations and is designed to finance the purchase of British goods and services."

Your excellency will wish to know that her Majesty's representative in Leopoldville informed the prime minister of the congolese central government of this just before the announcement was made. Mr. Adoula expressed himself as being delighted and greatly encouraged by the news.

Members of my delegation are already in discussion with officials of the secretariat to determine under what arrangements this grant can now be made available. I hope to write to you further about this shortly!

Please cable official position of the congolese government regarding the acceptance of this grant.
