By memo No. 520/2/5 dated 21 Jan 64, the Chief, Purchasing and Supply Section advised that the following quantities of rations had been inspected by the original successful bidder and found below commercial standards:

5	cases	25-in-1	rations	Breakfast

7	"	"	"	Dinner
14	"	equal	to 475	rations at \$0.78 each - \$370.50

The Board noted that in view of the deterioration in the rations which had taken place since the sale was advertised and the goods inspected, it had been agreed to offer them to Civilian Operations for donation as animal feed.

The Board agreed with this proposal and recommended that the above quantity be handed over to Civilian Operations for donation as animal feed.

SUBJECT: Disposal of Hampson Generator

1. Further to my letter 1001/094/64 dated 30 January 1964, the generator in question has been inspected by my representatives and has been found to be within economical repair.

2. It is planned to enlist the aid of Dept. of Communications and Transport (Congo Government) in its repair. The equipment will then be used to support facilities within the Congo. It will remain under ICAO control and will be used under project 10:01.

3. Arrangements to pick up the equipment will be made as soon as possible. It is noted that the power panel for this generator is held at RSSD Limité. This power panel is listed in the RSSD stock as a battery charger. Your intervention is requested in obtaining the release of this panel to ICAO to accompany the generator to which it belongs.

Subject: "C" rations in Kamina

Please refer to your recent telephone call informing us of the availability of 1,430 cartons of Indian-type "C" rations at Kamina Base. I confirm that, after discussion with WHO and UNHCR, we are interested in obtaining these rations for the hospitals in and around Lubumbashi and also for the hospitals and boarding school in the area of Kikwit.

I shall be grateful if you will issue the necessary instructions for these rations to be despatched, to the extent possible on a "space available" basis by C-47 aircraft, or by rail, from Kamina to Lubumbashi, addressed to Dr. G. Scalzo, the Chief WHO Representative in Lubumbashi. Rail charges will be debited to the Famine Relief account.

Dr. Scalzo will be responsible for storing and distributing the rations. WHO recommends that 750 cartons should be used for the hospitals in and around Lubumbashi and that the balance should be sent to Kikwit, as and when transport can be made available.
