

I have received a copy of your administrative circular No. 302 which outlines amendments to facilities for Dollar cheque payments in the Congo. I am perturbed that this document should be issued without consultation with me. You must realise that as Force Commander I am responsible for maintaining the morale of all troops under my command in the Congo and being charged with such a responsibility I must resist any measure taken which in any way leads to an adverse effect. To date Military Personnel have been afforded the facilities outlined in para a) and b) and the removal of these facilities is I consider a retrograde step.

... I have already received a complaint from the Pakistan Contingent Commander, copy of which I attach for your information.

I would like to have your comments on the subject matter which it contains and would be glad to have it discussed in my office as soon as possible with a view to reaching an acceptable solution.

Subject: HQ SECTOR 'L'.

Ref our letter of 3 May and yours 15 May.

1. In view of your request and my own awareness of the pressing need to reduce our strength, where possible, by amongst other things, staff amalgamation or abolition, I have given this problem my deepest consideration. In general, your arguments are potent ones and indicate that a reduction in the staff of Sector 'L' should be acceptable. With that I agree, but I believe that the main function of Sector 'L' which is an operational one is not being given sufficient weight and consideration.

2. In Leopoldville we have the Nigerian Battalion, an Irish Armoured Car Squadron, a Canadian Signals Unit, two Pakistan Coys, an Indian Coy, together with other detachments including ONUC HQ. The present strength in Leopoldville is over 2,000 and even after 1 July the strength is likely to remain at 1,736. As long as this variety of units remains in Leopoldville, an overall coordinator, who is responsible to the Force Commander, and by appointment and rank is in a position to command, must remain a necessity.

3. Notwithstanding the last 12 months of comparative peace here in Leopoldville we must, as long as troops remain, plan for an operational commitment whereby the full potential of the military forces in Leopoldville can be mustered and utilised. With diverse units and contingents now and in the future stationed here, I can see no solution to this problem of coordination and command other than retaining the appointment of a Commander for Sector 'L' at the rank of Colonel. Should a situation arise whereby the whole garrison at Leopoldville is mobilised and committed to an emergency task, conflicting requirements will arise within the Sector. Units which, amongst other things, are responsible for the security of large quantities of stores and installations may, under certain conditions, feel justified in considering this task as their primary requirements, and at the same time their commanders will not be in a position to evaluate the entire problem confronting the overall commander. To assume that a Lieutenant-Colonel



commanding a Battalion has both the rank and authority to dispose troops in a way which runs contrary to that decided by officers of a higher rank is not realistic. Such a situation would be further aggravated by the fact that the Officer commanding the Nigerian Battalion is a Major.

4. Planning, coordinating and commanding such a mixed force of infantry, cavalry and administrative units in an operational role is a delicate business requiring the Commander and staff to have full knowledge of the problems. I am satisfied that neither a battalion staff nor an ad hoc organisation, set up when the need arises, can meet the command and control requirements. Under the circumstances, the retention of Sector 'L' HQ in some form or another is not I believe a luxury but a necessity, and I most strongly recommend that it remain as part of ONUC military organisation here in the Congo.

5. On examination, many of the suggestions made by you in para 1 of your letter dated 3 May are accepted as feasible. I propose shifting much of the administrative load from HQ Sector 'L' to the Camp Commandant and his staff and to other agencies. In that way I believe that HQ Sector 'L' could be reduced to 5 consisting of:

1 Colonel

1 Major

1 Captain

2 Clerks.

This would show an overall reduction of 9 from our present establishment.

I would earnestly request that this matter be now reconsidered in the light of the points which I have made and I would welcome your further advice.

Subject: Report on Conditions in 38 Irish Bn by Mr. Taff

... Following our conversation on the above, I requested a report from officiating Area Comd, Kat Area and the attached is a copy of his reply. It will be noted that the Bn Comd Lt.Col.Delaney made no complaint whatever to Mr. Taff concerning conditions in the Irish Bn. It will also be noted that no official representations have been made by Col. Delaney for inclusion of Heavy Mortars in the new Irish Bn. Furthermore Col. Worku considers there is not a requirement for Heavy Mortars in 39 Irish Bn.

I understand that the complaints received by Mr. Taff were made to him in private conversation, by two officers of the Battalion who were acting beyond their competence and without either the knowledge or the authority of their Commanding Officer. The views they expressed on Heavy Mortars were not even shared by Col. Delaney.

To avoid future misunderstandings and embarrassment, I suggest that reporting on purely military matters can best be done by military officers working through our normal channels of command.

We return home with happy memories of our association and comradeship whilst under your command. We have made many friends in the other Contingents, and I hope this friendship will be strengthened in the years ahead.

I give up command of the Battalion in June and then take up my new appointment as Principle Staff Officer Grade 1 to General Tunku Osman at the Ministry of Defence in Kuala Lumpur until April, 1964.
