DAILY SITREP FOR 18 FEB 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE UNDER CONTROL.

B. IN SECTOR 5, A CONVOY OF 16 WFP TRUCKS TRANSPORTING FOOD TO GOMA WAS ATTACKED BY LOCALS AT THE GISENYI BORDER POST WHILE AWAITING CLEARANCE TO CROSS INTO ZAIRE. RPA TROOPS IN THE AREA SHOT DEAD TWO OF THE LOOTERS. A MECHANIZED PLATOON OF TUNBATT WAS SENT TO EXTRICATE THE CONVOY FROM THE MOB AND ESCORT THE CONVOY TO TUNBATT HQ. EN ROUTE TO THE HQ, FIVE OF THE 16 TRUCKS WERE DETAINED AT AN RPA CHECK POINT AND WERE REQUESTED TO PASS THE NIGHT THERE. TUNBATT AND RPA TROOPS PROVIDED SECURITY. EFFORTS UNDERWAY TO GET THE 5 WFP VEHICLES RELEASED.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE 3-DAY MEETING BETWEEN DELEGATES OF THE UGANDA ELECTRICITY BOARD AND DELEGATES OF THE UGANDA RWANDAN MINISTRY OF ENERGY AND PUBLIC WORKS ENDED WITH AN AGREEMENT WHEREBY UGANDA WILL EXPORT ELECTRICITY TO RWANDA VIA AN INTER-CONNECTING LINE WHICH WILL BE BUILT BETWEEN KABARE, UGANDA AND MULINDI, RWANDA. RWANDA WILL EXPORT POWER FROM RUHENGARI TO GISORO, UGANDA. THE PAYMENT WILL BE CONDUCTED IN US DOLLARS AT THE RATE OF ONE KWATT/HOUR FOR \$8.25.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA.

(1) RPA TROOPS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED A LOCAL AGED 22 IN THE BRUSSERIE MUETZIG IN GISENYI ON 08 FEB 95. HE WAS ACCUSED TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE. HR INFORMED AND INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(2) IN SECTOR 5, UN CIVPOL PTL TEAM REPORTED THAT 2 YOUNG MEN WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED IN CUSTODY OF RPA AT BIGOGWE MILITARY CAMP ON 15 FEB 95. RPA AUTHORITIES IN THE AREA CLAIMED THEY WERE SHOT WHEN THEY ATTEMPTED TO ESCAPE FROM CUSTODY. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) AT RUTONGO COMMUNE IN SECTOR 3, THE BOURGMESTRE INFORMED UN CIVPOL PTL TEAM THAT 12 SUSPECTS WHO WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE MURDERED A 20 YEAR OLD WOMAN ON 04 FEB 95 HAVE BEEN DETAINED BY RPA. HR INFORMED.

(4) UN CIVPOL REPORTED THAT RPA HAVE INTENSIFIED PATROLS WITHIN KIGALI CITY AND HAVE ALSO MOUNTED SNAP CHECK POINTS IN SOME STRATEGIC LOCATIONS IN KIGALI.

(5) ZAMBATT REPORTED THE ARRESTS OF 5 LOCALS BY RPA IN MUSANGE IN SECTOR 4A. NO REASONS WERE GIVEN AND THEIR WHEREABOUTS ARE NOT KNOWN. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT IN THE SAME SECTOR RPA SOLDIERS IN RUNYINI WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE BEATEN A LOCAL FOR NO APPARENT REASON. ONE RPA SOLDIER WAS IDENTIFIED AND INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(7) AN RPA SOLDIER, 4458 PTE NYAMWASA JMN OF ZEBRA FORCE, GIKONGORO WENT TO NYAKIZU GR 5796 AND DEMANDED TWO COWS FROM A LOCAL SAYING THAT THE ANIMALS BELONGED TO HIS LATE FATHER. ZAMBATT OC IN LOC ADVISED THE RPA SOLDIER TO FOLLOW THE RIGHT PROCEDURES. WITNESSES TO BOTH PARTIES WERE INTERVIEWED.

(8) RPA SOLDIERS SEARCHED THE HOUSE OF THE BOURGMESTRE OF RUNYOMBYI FOR WEAPONS. WHEN THEY FOUND NOTHING, THEY ATTEMPTED TO TAKE AWAY HIS MOTOR BIKE CLAIMING IT WAS GOVERNMENT PROPERTY BUT MILOBS TO WHOM WIFE REPORTED THE CASE INTERVENED WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF ZAMBATT OC IN LOC.

(9) RPA IN RUNDU IN SECTOR 2, AGAIN DENIED PASSAGE TO MILOBS BEYOND THEIR CHECK-POINT.

(2) CONDUCTED MEDAL PRESENTATION PARADE. IN ATTENDANCE WERE COAS OF NIGERIA, FC, DFC, RPA COMD, PREFECT AND MEMBERS OF NGO IN OWN AOR. THE COAS NIGERIA ADDRESSED OFFERS/MEN IN BYUMBA CAMP.

(3) AT KAGITUMBA BORDER PTL TEAM REPORTED THAT 130 DPs WERE AWAITING EVACUATION TO THEIR VARIOUS HOMES.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 41 LOCALS IN AOR.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) GHANBATT DENTAL OFFR AND HIS TEAM COMPLETED DENTAL INSPECTION FOR TPS OF C COY LOCS.

(3) THE CO CONDUCTED AN OPERATION TOUR TO RWANTERU GR 7948, MULINDI GR 7667, RUSENYI GR 6862 AND RUKIRA GR 6557.

(4) 53 IDPs ARRIVED AT RILIMA ORC.

(5) 199 IDPs ARRIVED AT NGENDA COMMUNE FROM GIKONGORO. THEY WERE REGISTERED AND EVAC TO THEIR VARIOUS HOMES BY GHANBATT VEHS.

(3) A YOUNG GIRL AGED 15, WAS ATTACKED AT RAMBA GR 5414 IN RUNYINYA COMMUNE IN HER HOME BY UNKNOWN PERSONS ON NIGHT OF 17 FEB 95. SHE SUSTAINED SEVERAL INJURIES. THE ATTACKERS ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE COME FROM DP CAMPS IN GIKONGORO. SHE WAS TAKEN TO BUTARE HOSPITAL BY OWN TROOPS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(4) MALAWICOY MED STAFF TREATED 5 LOCALS IN KIGEMBE AND RUNYINYA CAMPS.

(1) CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PROVIDED UN PRESENCE TO IDPs AND LOCALS IN AOR.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) 142 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP. 359 IDPs WERE EVAC BY UNHCR TO NGENDA, KANZENZE, KIBUNGO AND BUTARE.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 455 LOCALS AT BN HQ.

 - (A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO KARAMBO (GR 1860) WERE INFORMED THAT THERE HAD NOT BEEN ANY FURTHER INCURSIONS IN THE AREA AFTER THE 25 JAN 95 INCIDENT DUE TO THE RPA'S VIGILANCE.

(C) PATROLS TO KIBINGO (GR 2980) REPORTED THAT ROADS IN THE AREA WERE IN A VERY BAD STATE AND MOST AREAS WERE INACCESSIBLE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS, TOGETHER WITH HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM AND A PLATOON FROM TUNBATT WENT TO THE SCENE OF THE LOOTING AT ABOUT 1500 HRS TO CONTROL THE SITUATION.

(C) THE CAOS OF NIGERIAN ARMY VISITED THE SECTOR AND WAS BRIEFED BY MILOBS.

(D) MILOBS ACCOMPANIED A GROUP OF PARLIAMENTARIANS TO NYANYUMBA (GR 3223) AND KANAMA (GR 2722) COMMUNES WHERE MEETINGS WERE HELD WITH THE LOCALS.

(E) MILOBS, HUMAN RIGHTS AND CIVPOL INVESTIGATED THE DETENTION OF A RWANDESE SUSPECTED TO BE INVOLVED IN THE ATTACK ON TUNBATT HQ. THE PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE HAS BEEN INFORMED AND WAS STANDING BY TO TAKE OVER THE SUSPECT FROM TUNBATT.

(1) SPT FORCE PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED A TOTAL OF 39 PATIENTS AND 3 DENTAL PATIENTS. CHK IS CURRENTLY HOLDING 8 IN-PATIENTS.

N. AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. 30 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.



A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE UNDER CONTROL.

B. SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT ABOUT 300 ZAIREAN TROOPS HAVE BEEN DEPLOYED IN BUKAVU TO PROVIDE SECURITY FOR THE REFUGEE CAMPS. THE TROOPS WILL BE ASSISTING UNHCR. THEIR TASKS ARE TO PREVENT INCIDENTS OF LOOTING AND ACTS OF BANDITRY WITHIN THE CAMPS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL FOR RWANDA, AMBASSADOR KHAN, LEFT KIGALI FOR BUJUMBURA TODAY TO ATTEND THE FINAL SESSION OF THE OAU/UNHCR REGIONAL SUMMIT WHICH IS SCHEDULED TO TAKE PLACE ON SATURDAY 18 FEB 95. THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT DELEGATION AT THE CONFERENCE IS LED BY MR. JACQUES BIHOZAGARA, THE MINISTER FOR REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL INTEGRATION.

B. MR. ALFRED MUSEMA, THE FORMER DIRECTOR OF THE GISOVU TEA PLANTATION PROJECT IN KIBUYE PREFECTURE, WAS ARRESTED IN SWITZERLAND AS A RESULT OF ACCUSATIONS BY RWANDAN AUTHORITIES OF PARTICIPATION IN THE MASSACRES OF 1994.

C. THE RWANDAN REFUGEES IN CONGO, IN AN OPEN LETTER, HAVE CRITICIZED THE UNHCR FOR FAILING TO REPATRIATE THEM TO RWANDA. THE UNHCR REPORTEDLY RESPONDED THAT IT LACKS THE NECESSARY FUNDS TO CARRY OUT THE TASK.

D. THE DELEGATION OF RWANDAN PARLIAMENT MEMBERS CONTINUED THEIR TOUR OF THE COUNTRY TODAY TO ASSESS, AMONG OTHERS, THE REQUIREMENTS OF RWANDA'S PRISONS AND THE NEEDS OF RETURNEES.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA.

(1) RPA TROOPS AT RUNDU IN SECTOR 2 DENIED A MILOB PATROL ACCESS THROUGH THEIR CHECK POINT INTO THE TOWN.

(2) RPA TROOPS IN MABUGA (GR 2463) IN SECTOR 4B WERE REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED THE MEDICAL ASSISTANT AND THE BROTHER OF THE NURSE AT THE LOCAL CLINIC. THE TWO ARE REPORTED TO BE DETAINED IN KIBUYE PRISON. HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS HAVE BEEN INFORMED.

(3) SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS IN CYANGUGU DETAINED A HUMAN RIGHTS VEHICLE WHICH WAS CONVEYING A LOCAL EMPLOYEE TO HIS HOUSE NEAR THE KAMEMBE AIRPORT. THE RPA INSISTED ON DETAINING THE LOCAL EMPLOYEE. IT WAS FINALLY AGREED AFTER SEVERAL HOURS OF NEGOTIATIONS WITH SECTOR MILOBS TO RELEASE BOTH THE HR VEHICLE AND THE LOCAL EMPLOYEE. THE REASON FOR THE RPA'S INTEREST IN THE LOCAL IS UNKNOWN.

(4) ONE LOCAL WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN SHOT DEAD BY THE RPA IN KAGANO IN MUKINZA (GR 023412) COMMUNE IN SECTOR 4C AROUND 1500 HRS. ACCORDING TO LOCALS THE DEAD MAN WAS RELEASED BY THE RPA AFTER 10 DAYS IN CUSTODY. RPA LOCAL COMMANDERS CLAIM HE WAS SHOT WHILE TRYING TO ESCAPE FROM CUSTODY. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(5) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT RPA EXCHANGED FIRE WITH MILITIA WHO HAD INFILTRATED THROUGH THE NATIONAL PARK ON 16 FEB 95 AT BISAT GR 4841. THE

MILITIA ESCAPED TOWARDS THE ZAIRIAN BORDER. -- NO CASUALTIES ON BOTH SIDES WERE REPORTED. RPA HAVE REINFORCED TROOPS IN THE SECTOR BETWEEN GISENYI AND RWERERE GR 2722.



1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE UNDER CONTROL.

B. IN KIGALI AUSMED REPORTED THAT RPA PURSUED AN AUSMED AMBULANCE TO THE PRESIDENTIAL HANGAR AT AIRPORT AFTER IT ACCIDENTALLY KNOCKED OVER A WITCH'S HAT AT AN RPA ROAD BLOCK. THE RPA HAD MOVED ONE WITCH'S HAT LEAVING ENOUGH ROOM TO ALLOW THE VEH THROUGH THE ROAD BLOCK BUT THE VEH INADVERTENTLY TOPPLED A SECOND AS IT MOVED THROUGH. THE DRIVER WAS UNAWARE OF THIS AND PROCEEDED TO THE AIRPORT. THE RPA BECAME ABUSIVE AT THE AIRPORT AND THREATEN TO SHOOT THE AMBULANCE CREW IF THEY DID THE SAME THING AGAIN. THE INCIDENT WAS QUICKLY RESOLVED AND THE RPA DEPARTED.

C. MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C REPORTED THAT THE LOCAL POPULATION REMAINED TENSE DUE TO THE INCREASED ARRESTS AND CURFEW IMPOSED BY RPA. THE CURFEW APPLIES TO ALL PERSONNEL WITHIN THE COMMUNES.

D. REFERENCE DAILY SITREP OF 15 FEB 95, PARA 4 (I) A PATROL WAS DESPATCHED BY TUNBATT ON 16 FEB 95 TO SEARCH THE VICINITY OF THE TARGETED UN INSTALLATION FOR POSSIBLE CLUES OF THE PERPETRATORS OF THE PREVIOUS NIGHT'S ATTACK. IN THE PROCESS, ELEMENTS OF THE TUNBATT PATROL STEPPED ON A MINE, POSSIBLY OF FRAGMENTATION TYPE, WHICH RESULTED IN INJURIES TO EIGHT OF THE SOLDIERS. OF THESE, FOUR RECEIVED SERIOUS INJURIES, THE OTHERS WERE MODERATE AND MINOR. SEVEN OF THE CASUALTIES WERE EVACUATED TO KIGALI. THE RPA CLAIMED THE CATTLE RUSTLERS CAME FROM ZAIRE. THE PATROL ALSO REPORTED THE KILLING OF TWO PERSONS BY RPA FOR ALLEGEDLY KNOCKING DOWN AN RPA SOLDIER WITH THEIR MOTOR BIKE. THEIR MUTILATED BODIES WERE HANDED OVER TO THEIR FAMILIES ON 15 FEB 95. A JOINT MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM WILL INVESTIGATE THE REPORT ON 17 FEB 95.

(B) MILOBS PROVIDED ESCORTS FOR A CONVOY OF 560 RETURNEES FROM GISENYI TO SATINSYI (GR 5800).

(C) MILOBS ALSO INVESTIGATED THE SMALL ARMS ATTACK ON TUNBATT HQ ON THE NIGHT OF 15/16 FEB 95 AS WELL AS THE MINE INCIDENT IN WHICH 8 TUNBATT SOLDIERS WERE INJURED. INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE FIRING ON THE NIGHT OF 15/16 FEB WAS AN ACT OF BANDITRY BY UNKNOWN ARMED ELEMENTS AIMED AT DESTROYING THE SIGNAL INSTALLATION WITHIN THE CAMP SO AS TO CREATE FRICTION BETWEEN UNAMIR AND THE RPA.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI CONDUCTED PTLs IN RUSHESHE COMMUNE OF KANOMBE COMMUNE DURING THE PERIOD. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(2) UN MP COY INVESTIGATED A SHOOTING AND MINE EXPLOSION INCIDENT AT TUNBATT LOCATION IN SECTOR 5, ON 16 FEB 95.

(3) UN MP COY RECEIVED A REPORT OF AN ARMED ROBBERY CASE BY 4 ARMED MEN WHO ENTERED THE HOUSE OF CONCERN WORLDWIDE (NGO) ON 16 FEB 95. A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. SECTOR 5 UNAMIR CIVPOL OBSERVER TEAM IN GISENYI CONDUCTED JOINT PATROL WITH HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM WITHIN THE PREFECTURE AND MET 13 LOCALS WHO HAD BEEN DETAINED AT RPA TRAINING CAMP AT BIGOGWE FOR OVER 3 WEEKS. THE DEPUTY COMMANDANT OF THE CAMP DISCLOSED THAT 7 OF THE DETAINEES WERE FORMER RGF SOLDIERS WHO HAVE COME FROM ZAIRE BUT HAVE FAILED TO REPORT FOR SCREENING AND REGISTRATION. HE FURTHER DISCLOSED THAT 6 OTHER DETAINEES WERE LOCALS FOUND TO BE INVOLVED IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE AND WOULD BE TRANSFERRED TO RUHENGERI PRISON SHORTLY. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS. STILL IN THE SAME SECTOR, UNAMIR CIVPOL OBSERVER TEAM IS ASSISTING THE HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM TO INVESTIGATE 2 MURDER CASES WHERE A LOCAL AND HIS WIFE WERE KILLED ON 7 FEB 95 BY SOME ARMED CIVILIANS WHO WERE REPORTED TO HAVE COME FROM ZAIRE AND ANOTHER BY RPA TPS ON 12 FEB 95 AT BAKUKA IN MUTURA COMMUNE.

D. CIVPOL AT GITARAMA PREFECTURE VISITED THE CENTRAL PRISONS AND FOUND THE CELLS OVERCROWDED. FURTHER ENQUIRIES FROM THE PRISON AUTHORITIES REVEALED THAT THE PRISON WHICH WAS BUILT IN 1973 TO HOLD A MAX OF 1,000 INMATES CURRENTLY HAD ABOUT 5,000 INMATES. HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM INFORMED.

E. ON 14 FEB 95, A MEETING WAS HELD WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF CIVPOL, HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS AND RPA IN RUHENGERI, TO DISCUSS THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE PREFECTURE.

F. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGERI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IS IN PROGRESS.



1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE UNDER CONTROL.

B AT 151240B FEB 95 AN RPA UTILITY VEHICLE BACKED INTO AUSMED SPT FORCE VEHICLE AS IT WAS MOVING OUT OF THEIR BKS. THE ONLY DAMAGE TO EITHER VEHICLE WAS A BROKEN TAIL LIGHT ON THE RPA VEH. THE RPA CLAIMED THAT THE AUSMED VEH CAUSED THE ACCIDENT AND THERE WAS MISUNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE RPA AND AUSMED SOLDIERS. THE GENDARMERIE THEN ARRIVED AT THE SCENE AND DEMANDED THAT THE VEH AND DRIVER SHOULD BE TAKEN TO THE GENDARMERIE HQ FOR THE NECESSARY STATEMENTS TO BE TAKEN. DISCUSSIONS CONTINUED BETWEEN THE GENDARMERIE AND AUSMED SUNRAY, THEIR LEGAL OFFR AND THE UN FORCE MPs. THE RPA AND GENDARMERIE REFUSED TO CHANGE THEIR STANCE AND AT ONE STAGE ONE RPA SOLDIER COCKED HIS WEAPON RESULTING IN ALL AUSMED SOLDIERS AT THE SCENE AND RPA GOING TO ACTION. THE TENSE SITUATION WAS QUICKLY DEFUSED WHEN AUSMED TROOPS WERE ORDERED TO RETURN TO THE LOAD CONDITION AND THE VEHICLE AND DRIVER WERE SENT TO THE GENDARMERIE HQs. THE AUSMED VEH HAS BEEN IMPOUNDED BY THE GENDARMERIE. EFFORTS UNDERWAY AT UNAMIR HQ TO DEFUSE TENSION BETWEEN RPA AND AUSMED TROOPS AS A RESULT OF STAND-OFF BETWEEN AUSMED AND GENDARMERIE AT BUTARE LAST WEEK.

A. THE SRSG HELD INTERNAL MEETINGS WITH VARIOUS MEMBERS OF HIS STAFF TO BRIEF THEM ON HIS TRIP TO GENEVA, TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON SEVERAL TOPICS AND TO DISCUSS ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA.

(1) AIR OPS REPORTED THE FOLLOWING RPA AIR UNIT ACTIVITIES:

(A) STRENGTH OF UNIT - 4 PILOTS.

(B) AIRCRAFT PARK - 3 SMALL DOUBLE ENGINE
PLANES, ALL OF WHICH
REQUIRE MAINTENANCE

(C) NO TECHNICAL SERVICE AVAILABLE.

(D) THE UNIT IS HEADED BY A PILOT OF MAJOR RANK WHO WAS FLYING FOR AIR RWANDA BEFORE THE WAR AND WAS TRAINED IN FRANCE TO FLY ABOVE MENTIONED PLANES AND C 160 TYPE AS WELL. HE IS AUTHORISED TO ADVISE THE GOVERNMENT ON WHAT TYPE OF AIRCRAFT IS TO BE PURCHASED OR FREIGHTED.

(2) ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED 2 LOCALS ON 13 AND 14 FEB 95 AT GISEKI 4614 AND GISORORA GR 486174 IN RWAMIKO. REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS UNKNOWN. HR WAS INFORMED.

(3) ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT PEOPLE IN KADUHA HAVE GONE INTO HIDING BECAUSE RPA TROOPS HAD REQUESTED THEM TO EXHUME BODIES OF PEOPLE WHO WERE MASSACRED AT THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH FOR REBURIAL.

(4) AT MBUGA GR 422245 AT ABOUT 2200HRS ON 14 FEB 95 ARMED MEN BELIEVED TO BE RPA TROOPS LOBBED TWO SMOKE CANISTERS INTO MBUGA DP CAMP OF ABOUT 1000 IDPs AND PROCEEDED TO GAHIRA IN WINKINGI SECTOR GR 418366, 3KM FROM THE MENTIONED CAMP AND ABDUCTED A LOCAL BUSINESSMAN, AFTER FIRING SHOTS TO SCARE OTHER LOCALS.

IT IS BELIEVED THAT THEY WENT AWAY WITH VAST SUM OF MONEY WHICH THE ABDUCTED MAN KEPT IN HIS SHOP. THE WHEREABOUTS AND THE CONDITION OF THE ABDUCTED MAN IS NOT KNOWN. THE LOCAL RPA HAVE DENIED INVOLVEMENT AND HAVE PROMISED TO INVESTIGATE. DETAILS FOLLOW.

B. FRGF. MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C REPORTED THAT INFO RECEIVED FROM A RELIABLE SOURCE INDICATED THAT FRGF PERSONNEL ON THE IJWI ISLAND WERE ATTEMPTING TO PREVENT REFUGEES FROM CROSSING TO THE ZAIRE MAINLAND FROM THE ISLAND. THE SOURCE INDICATED THAT THERE WERE RIVAL COMMAND AND CONTROL STRUCTURES WITHIN THE ISLAND AMONG THE FRGF TROOPS. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT FORCE AND COERCION WERE BEING USED TO PREVENT REFUGEES FROM RETURNING.

C. MILITIA. NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) THE FC SPENT THE DAY VISITING SECTOR 2 AND THE GHANA BATTALION. HIS VISIT INCLUDED HQ AND A COY LOCATIONS. HE WAS VERY PLEASED WITH THE EFFORTS OF GHANBATT IN THAT SECTOR. LATER, HE HELD A MEETING WITH MISS DURAND OF THE WORLD BANK TO DISCUSS THE LATEST POLITICAL DEVELOPMENTS IN RWANDA.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY).

(1) CONDUCTED PATROLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) THE BOURGMESTRE OF GITI GR 234021 HAS STATED THAT ALTHOUGH THE INFLUX OF DPs HAS REDUCED IN HIS COMMUNE, THE MAIN PROBLEMS FACING LOCALS IN THE AREA ARE LACK OF SEEDLINGS, FARMING TOOLS AND FOOD. HAC INFORMED.

(3) PTL TO MATIMBA GR 496763 REPORTED SHORTAGE OF GOOD DRINKING WATER IN THE AREA.

(4) PTL TO NGARAMA GR 264921 AND NYAGAHANGA GR 255198 MET BELGIAN RED CROSS ORGANIZATION VACCINATING THE LOCALS AGAINST MEASLES. RPA COMD VISITED OWN LOC TO WELCOME NEWLY DEPLOYED TROOPS IN THE COMMUNE. THERE IS SHORTAGE OF GOOD DRINKING WATER IN NGARAMA TOWN GR 264921.

(5) 28 DPs WERE CONVEYED FROM KAGITUMBA GR 504822 TO THEIR VARIOUS COMMUNES USING NICOY VEHS.

(6) MED STAFF TREATED 83 LOCALS IN AOR.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) THE PL COMD AT KIYANJA PTL BASE GR 5986 HELD A MEETING WITH THE KAYONZA COMMUNE BOURGMESTRE AND THE RPA COMD RESPONSIBLE FOR THE COMMUNE TO DISCUSS THE SY SIT IN THE COMMUNE.

(3) THE FC AND HIS ENTOURAGE PAID A WORKING VISIT TO SECTOR 2. HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE CO. HE VISITED A COY HQ AT BARE GR 5448 AND SAKA ORC GR 4454, WHERE HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE OC AND THE PL COMD AT THE RESPECTIVE LOCs.



1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE STABLE.

B. TAC HQ BUTARE REPORTED THAT A 20 MEMBER TEAM FROM RWANDA NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF DEPUTIES PAID A VISIT TO KIBEHO CAMP. THEIR AIM WAS TO CONVINCE DPS THAT THERE WAS ENOUGH SECURITY GRANTED IN COMMUNES FOR THEM TO RETURN HOME. DPS HOWEVER EXPRESSED THEIR CONTINUED FEAR OF UNLAWFUL PERSECUTION AND WERE DETERMINED TO STAY IN THE CAMPS FOR AS LONG AS THE SECURITY SITUATION REMAINED UNCERTAIN.

C. A MASS GRAVE WAS DISCOVERED AT RIGANSIA GR 4313 CONTAINING 60 BODIES. IT IS BELIEVED THE DEAD WERE ALL HUTUS AND WERE KILLED BY RPA IN AUGUST 1994.

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED A BREAKFAST MEETING WITH H.E. AMBASSADOR KOUYATE, THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY GENERAL FOR POLITICAL AFFAIRS, AND HIS POLITICAL AFFAIRS OFFICER.

B. HE THEN HELD CONSULTATIONS WITH GENERAL BARIL DURING WHICH THEY EXCHANGED VIEWS AND DISCUSSED THE ROLE AND REQUIREMENTS OF THE VARIOUS CONTINGENTS.

C. HE HELD A MEETING WITH MR. CLARENCE, THE CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION, DURING WHICH THE PROGRESS OF THE OPERATION, AMONG OTHER MATTERS, WAS DISCUSSED.

D. THE SRSG CONCLUDED WITH THE VISIT OF MR. GAMBA OF THE WORLD BANK TO DISCUSS THE MODALITIES FOR CHANNELING INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA.

(1) MILOBS' HELI AND VEH PATROLS IN SECTOR 4B LOCATED 2 RPA TRAINING CAMPS AT GR 275732 AND IN GISHIVU GR 2852.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 TUNBATT REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS EXCHANGED FIRE WITH ABOUT 20 BANDITS NEAR CHINGIRO GR 4933 ON THE NIGHT 13/14 FEB 95. THE BANDITS HAD INFILTRATED THROUGH THE NATIONAL PARK TO STEAL COWS BUT LOCALS ALERTED RPA SOLDIERS WHO INTERCEPTED THEM 03 BANDITS WERE KILLED AND ONE CAPTURED, ONE LOCAL WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED. DETAILS FOLLOW.

(3) IN SECTOR 4C ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAVE ARRESTED 25 LOCALS IN THE AREA OF NYAMASHEKE (9841). REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS NOT KNOWN. INVESTIGATION BY ETHIOBATT IN PROGRESS.

B. FRGF. NTR.

C. MILITIA. MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT BANDITS BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM KIREMBA REFUGEES CAMP IN BURUNDI MATCHETED TO DEATH AN OLD MAN ON NIGHT OF 13 FEB 95 IN KIGEMBE GR 9704. ONE LOCAL WOMAN AND THREE GIRLS WERE ALSO MATCHETED BUT SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES. NAMES OF SUSPECTS ARE KNOWN. THE MOTIVE FOR THE ATTACK IS NOT KNOWN. MALAWICOY PTLs AND MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) THE FC MET THE NEW FORCE MEDICAL OFFICER COL WARFE FROM THE AUSTRALIAN CONTINGENT. HE ALSO HELD TALKS WITH MR GANNS, GERMAN AFRICAN AFFAIRS REPRESENTATIVE. AT THE END OF THE DAY HE MET THE SRSG, DFC AND COS TO DISCUSS COORDINATION DIFFICULTIES AMONGST UNAMIR STAFF. IN THE EVENING HE ATTENDED A RECEPTION FOR THE CANADIAN SECRETARY OF STATE AFRICAN AFFAIRS, THE HONOURABLE CHRISTINE STEWART.

 - (A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.
 - (B) MILOB CONDUCTED PATROLS IN RILIMA GR 2561, GASHORA GR 2655, RUTETE GR 2742 AND SAKE GR 4354. THE EXISTENCE OF A PRISON WITHIN THE COMMUNE OFFICE BUILDING IN SAKE IS CONFIRMED. REPORTS FROM LOCALS INDICATED THAT THERE WERE ABOUT 10 PRISONERS IN THE BUILDING FOR NO APPARENT REASON. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.
 - (C) MILOBS MONITORED THE HANDING OVER OF AN FRGF SOLDIER TO THE PROSECUTOR OF BARRE. THE SOLDIER HAD ESCAPED FROM RPA CUSTODY AND SOUGHT PROTECTION WITH GHANBATT TROOPS. IT WAS LATER REPORTED THAT THE FRGF SOLDIER WAS SENT TO KIBUNGO PRISON AFTER HE WAS HANDED OVER.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) SECTOR COMD HELD A MEETING WITH RPA BDE COMD (GITARAMA) TO DISCUSS MARKING AND SAFETY OF ROAD BLOCKS AT NIGHT, COOPERATION BETWEEN RPA AND UNAMIR, ILLEGAL ARRESTS OF LOCALS BY RPA AND JOINT PATROLS. RPA BDE COMD APPEARED COOPERATIVE AND ENTHUSIASTIC ABOUT ALL POINTS DISCUSSED.

(C) MILOBS PATROLS TO MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE GR 8374 WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT THE COMMUNE REQUIRED ASSISTANCE TO REPAIR 2,615 HOUSES DESTROYED DURING THE WAR. HE ALSO COMPLAINED THAT VERY FEW DPs HAD RETURNED TO HIS COMMUNE. SEEDS AND HOES WERE ALSO REPORTED TO BE IN SHORT SUPPLY.

(D) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN RUTOBWE GR 7681 AND KAYENZI GR 8338 COMMUNES TO INTERACT WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND TO INVESTIGATE RUMOURS OF HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES. THE PATROL ALSO LOCATED ONE OF THE SEVERAL CHILDREN REPORTED MISSING IN KAYENZI AND RETURNED HIM TO A RELATIVE IN GITARAMA.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLLED MBUGA GR 4224. NYAMIGINA GR 4523, MURAMBI GR 5128 AND KARAMBI GR 5622 AS PART OF OP RETOUR. ZAMBATT AND AUSMED TROOPS PROVIDED SECURITY AND MEDICAL COVER RESPECTIVELY DURING THE EVACUATION OF IDPs BY UNHCR FROM MBUGA.

(C) AT NDAGO GR 5102, DPs INFORMED MILOBS THAT SOME OF THEIR COLLEAGUES WHO RETURNED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES WERE ARRESTED AND MISTREATED BY THE RPA.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED HELI RECCE FROM KIVUMU GR 5573 TO BWAKIRA GR 4981. THE RECCE ALSO COVERED THE BWIZA GR 3694 - MURUNDA ROAD AND THE FOREST IN THE AREA OF GISHWAT GR 3894. THE KIVUMU-BWAKIRA ROAD AND THE BWIZA-MURUNDA ROAD HAD BOTH BEEN RENDERED IMPASSABLE BY LANDSLIDES, HEAVY RAINS AND NEGLECT. TWO CAMPS WERE LOCATED IN THE GISHWAT FOREST AT GR 3298. THE CAMPS WERE ABOUT 100M APART AND APPEARED TO HAVE OCCUPANTS.

(C) MILOB PATROL TO GISOVU WAS INFORMED OF AN

INCIDENT ON THE NIGHT OF 7/8 FEB 95 IN WHICH 9 BOATS WHICH ATTEMPTED TO LAND IN NGOMA GR 2159. SEVEN OF THE BOATS WERE CAPTURED BY THE RPA AND THE ATTACKERS ESCAPED IN TWO OF THE REMAINING BOATS. RPA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED TWO LOCALS SUSPECTED OF HAVING COLLABORATED WITH THE BANDITS. THE TWO SUSPECTS ARE PRESENTLY IN THE KIBUYE PRISON.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) THE LOCAL POPULATION WAS REPORTED TO BE STILL UNEASY ABOUT THE RECENT SPATE OF RPA ARRESTS.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO KAGANO AND FAMBIRA GR 0144 CONFIRMED THAT THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND OTHER PERSONS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO KIGALI (SITREP OF 13 FEB REFERS). THE EXACT NUMBER OF PERSONS ARRESTED COULD NOT BE CONFIRMED DUE TO THE UNCOOPERATIVE ATTITUDE OF LOCALS DUE TO FEAR OF RPA REPRISALS.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) MILOBS CONDUCTED INVESTIGATIONS INTO TWO SEPARATE REPORTS OF MURDER IN BATUKA GR 3129 AND KABATWE. PRELIMINARY FINDINGS INDICATED THAT THE RPA WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR ONE OF THE KILLINGS IN BATUKA. HOWEVER LOCAL EYE WITNESS ATTRIBUTED THE MURDER OF A COUPLE IN KABATWE TO ARMED CIVILIANS FROM ZAIRE WHO WERE SUSPECTED TO BE INTERAHAMWE.

(B) MILOBS ALSO PATROLLED GISENYI, MUKAMIRA GR 4521, KARAGO GR 4516, GICEYE GR 5111 AND GASEKE GR 4904 TO MONITOR THE WELL-BEING OF RETURNEES SINCE THEIR RETURN. IT WAS REPORTED THAT RETURNEES WERE GENERALLY WELL TAKEN CARE OF BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES. THEY WERE HOWEVER LOW ON FOOD SUPPLY. MILOBS INTEND TO LIAISE WITH UNHCR TO ASSIST.

(C) SECTOR COMD PAID FIRST COURTESY CALL ON COMD OF THE RPA BDE LOCATED IN RUHENGIRI. IT WAS AGREED THAT THERE SHOULD BE CLOSE COOPERATION TO ENSURE A GOOD WORKING RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE RPA TROOPS AND UNAMIR.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

L. FORCE ENGR COY

- (1) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.
- (2) COMPLETED CONSTRUCTION OF PIER FOR BUSORO BRIDGE.

(3) PROVIDED THREE DUMPERS FOR CARRIAGE OF EARTH PREPARING POL DUMP IN LOGISTIC BASE.

M. AUSMED. NTR.

N. AIR OPS.

(1) NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. 21 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

(2) THE AIR UNIT OF THE RPA IS BEING RE-ESTABLISHED AT KIA.

(3) THE SEIZED FORMER AIR RWANDA B-707 AIRCRAFT IS STILL AT KIA. INFORMATION GATHERED INDICATE THAT THE PLANE WAS BOUGHT FOR \$1.2M BY A BELGIUM COMPANY. HOWEVER, AFTER THE SALE THE MONEY WAS DEPOSITED IN AIR RWANDA ACCOUNT AND LATER TRANSFERRED INTO THE PRIVATE ACCOUNT OF ONE FORMER DIRECTOR OF AIR RWANDA. FURTHERMORE, THE MONEY HAS BEEN DISCOVERED IN THIS PRIVATE ACCOUNT AND THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IS MAKING EFFORTS TO RECOVER IT.

O. UN MP COY.

(1) UN MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDAN CIVILIAN AT UN MP COY IN KIGALI.

(2) ONE LOCAL UN EMPLOYEE WAS DETAINED AT UN MP COY FOR THEFT OF AN ALTERNATOR FROM THE WORKSHOP. HE WAS LATER HANDED OVER TO THE PROSECUTOR.

(3) UN MP COY INVESTIGATED A MINOR TRAFFIC ACCIDENT INVOLVING UNAMIR VEH NO 2504 LAND ROVER AND AN RPA VEH APR 037D AT AUSMED CENTRE ON 14 FEB 95. NO CASUALTIES REPORTED.

(1) ESCORTED CONVOYS TO TUNBATT, NICOY, FRAFBATT AND GHANBATT.

(2) TWO RECOVERY MISSIONS WERE UNDERTAKEN TO SECTOR 4A.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN KIGALI VISITED THE NATIONAL OFFICE FOR INFORMATION. THE DIRECTOR GENERAL DISCLOSED THAT RADIO UNAMIR SHOULD HAVE COME INTO BEING BEFORE AND DURING THE WAR WHEN THERE WAS PERPETUATION OF GENOCIDE IN THE COUNTRY. THEY ALSO VISITED THE MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION

AND RECONSTRUCTION WHERE A DIRECTOR GENERAL OF THE MINISTRY CALLED ON UNAMIR TO EMBARK ON PUBLIC ENLIGHTENMENT CAMPAIGN OF ITS GOALS AS MAJORITY OF THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA DO NOT KNOW WHY UNAMIR IS IN RWANDA. HE ALSO REQUESTED THAT UNAMIR SHOULD SEEK TO RESOLVE THE SOCIAL PROBLEMS OF THE IDPs/REFUGEES.

C. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IS IN PROGRESS.



Subject: SITREP FOR PERIOD 30 JAN - 11 FEB 95.

Introduction.

1. Since the last SITREP covering the period up until COB 29 Jan 95 the FSA for Sector 2 and 3 has left on leave. The ADMIN responsibilities of Sector 3 have been taken over by the FSA for Sector 4. Consequently this SITREP will cover both Sector 3 and 4.

Aim.

2. To present the administrative situation as of COB 11 Jan 95 (3, 4).

KIBUYE.

General.

3. The situation remains as for previous SITREP. The plan to replace FRAFBATT with MALAWI COY is still in vogue but now is reported to happen some time before the end of March 1995.

MILOBS.

4. Office accommodation for the MILOBS is being negotiated by BMS ACCOM OFFR on 11 FEB 95 at the Eden Roce Hotel, KIBUYE. At this juncture this will go ahead and

office movement can commence when the contract is finalized. Ongoing.

200 Man Camp.

5. The 200 Man Camp is being offered as an alternate site to house the Military Contingent to KIBUYE and is an old Government Public Works site. Work has commenced to clean up the site in preparation for tentage erection. BMS has this in control. Ongoing.

Work Requests.

6. Currently two Technical Schools are occupied by the Military Contingent to KIBUYE. Soon these will be handed back to the appropriate authorities. It is felt that these premises should be handed back in a clean and tidy condition so as not to bring UNAMIR in to disrepute. To this end Work Requests for a "one of cleanup" have been initiated. Ongoing.

Local Staff.

7. As mentioned in the last SITREP there is a need to recruit Translators to work with the MILOBS and MALAWI COY when this unit deploys. It is uncertain how many translators will be required by the latter as to some confusion about how many locations will be manned, however, 12 locals have been identified and will be tested in due course.

CYANGUGU.

General.

8. Situation remain the same as for last SITREP.

300 Man Camp SHAKASHA (Tea Factory).

9. This site has been identified, with Government approval, for the relocation of the ETHIPBATT BN HQ from KAMEMBE Hospital. Brown and Root under Work Order Request 10.021.0-057 have commenced the cleanup of the area. 40 personnel are to be bused from KIGALI to erect the tentage which has already been delivered to the site. Ongoing.

10. When visited on 10 Feb 95 it was noticed that the RPA guard the area and indeed still occupy housing within the tea plantation. It may be more prudent to have ETHIOPBATT supply a guard considering that UN Equipment has been deployed to the area (if indeed this is not the case).

Electrical Survey.

11. An Electrical Survey was conducted by the Electrical Unit on 1 FEB 95. The team

consisted of the FSA Sector 4, Mr. Wayne Brearly and Mr Michael Selby. The good news appears to be that the underground wiring linking up the some 12 buildings to be used is still in place. Wiring and fittings will need to be provided for each individual building. Time frame for the completion of the task is 7 days (approx).

MILOBS.

12. Due to the overcast weather in the CYANGUGU area the solar panels for recharging batteries supplying power to the Motorola Base Stations are in danger of not supplying sufficient electrical charge. It is requested that COMMS release 4 conventional automatic chargers to supplement these solar panels. This may be the case for other sectors.

BUTARE.

General.

13. There has been quite a good deal of activity in BUTARE with MALAWI COY in need of new accommodation and Ghana SUP COY moving as well. Also with the impending move of FRAFBATT into the location accommodation must be found for this contingent.

Malawi Coy.

14. The BMS Accommodation Officer visited BUTARE on 8 FEB 95 and a favorable decision was reached RE. a contract for property to house Malawi COY (later to house MILOBS, CIVPOL and MP's). The COY is expected to move by 16 FEB 95.

COMMS.

15. As stated in PARA 13 Malawi COY's move is imminent. Request COMMS support to move the COY's Motorola Base Station to the new location.

Ghana SUP COY.

16. It was proposed to move the Ghana SUP COY to the Match Factory, a local facility with some warehousing and open space. This facility was inspected on 8 FEB 95 and deemed unsuitable. It is suspected that the COY will move in with UNHCR to an existing facility. Will keep in contact with Ghana SUP COY as to outcome. Ongoing.

Forklift.

29. It is believed that there are a quantity of Forklifts of varying sizes on consignment from SOMALIA. Due to the large logistic activity in BUTARE it is requested that one large forklift be permanently situated with the SUP COY for use within the immediate area. For consideration.

FRAFBATT's participation in op Turquoise which concentrated in SECTOR 4 has been the main cause of friction between the RPA and FRAFBATT troops in SECTOR 4B this will only continue with the deployment of SENBATT to this sector. Subject: HAC PATROL REPORT BUTARE COMMUNES CONDUCTED 17 FEB 95

1. On 17 Feb 95, HAC Ops conducted a vehicle patrol in conjunction with an Op RETOUR IOC representative, a representative of the Ministry of Rehabilitation and a representative of the Ministry of Defence. The aim of the patrol was to visit three targeted communes of Op Retour to verify humanitarian needs and the security situation. The information gathered was to provide data to the Information Cell of Op RETOUR to confirm or deny rumours circulating in the IDP camps reporting a lack of security. These rumours were having a significant effect on the willingness of IDPs to return to their communes. The HAC representative was specifically tasked with obtaining information on the security situation and this report will concentrate on that aspect.

2. The patrol members were as follows:

- a. Maj MacNeil - HAC
- b. Maj Ryshkovski - IOC Info Cell
- c. Ms S. Opitz - UNREO
- d. Mr Martin - Representative of Ministry of Rehabilitation
- e. Lt Andre - Representative of the Ministry of Defence

3. The communes visited were as follows:

- a. RUNYINYA (GR QT 6013)
- b. MARABA (GR QT 6321)
- c. MBAZI (GR RT 7117)

4. The patrol route followed was KIGALI-GITARAMA- BUTARE-RUNYINYA-MARABA-MBAZI-GITARAMA-KIGALI.

COMMUNE RUNYINYA

5. The patrol spoke with the deputy bourgmestre as the bourgmestre was in Gikongoro. Conversation with the deputy bourgmestre resulted in the following information:

- a. Food. Distribution of food in RUNYINYA is done by Feed the Children using food supplies given by WFP. Feed the Children also provide food to the communes of NDORA and NYARUHENGIERI. Food is distributed to all residents in the communes. The deputy bourgmestre did not voice any complaints about food distribution.
- b. Water. No complaints.
- c. Population. The deputy bourgmestre indicated that about 60 per cent of the commune population consisted of women and children. Returnees to the commune were made up of mostly women and children with the males of the family either remaining in camps or dead due to the genocide. The deputy bourgmestre stated that most of the returnees to date were from BURUNDI and had fled there when the genocide began.
- d. Records. The commune appeared to have very detailed records. Records detailing the number of returnees from camps, BURUNDI and elsewhere were available. The deputy bourgmestre was also able to give the number of widows and orphans which were 1,010 and 200 respectively. He stated that the orphans were taken in by relatives and friends.
- e. Arrests. The deputy bourgmestre stated that there had been some arrests in the commune. Most were for petty theft however some had been charged with participating in the genocide. Once arrested they were transferred to the prison in BUTARE.
- f. Security. The security situation is good within the centre of the commune. The deputy bourgmestre stated that this was due to the presence of UNAMIR and the RPA. He stated that the MALAWI platoon conducted patrols by day only. He stated that security was not good in areas some distance from the commune, particularly at night. He said there had been raids by INTERAHAMWE from camps in the GIKONGORO area who attacked at night and stole livestock and valuables from the population. He confirmed that the bandits were INTERAHAMWE because the people knew the perpetrators from before the war. He further stated that the purpose of the attacks were to eliminate witnesses to the genocide. He stated that this was based upon the fact that several bandits had been caught by the RPA. He stated that the Bourgmestre's visit to GIKONGORO was to accompany witnesses to identify bandits. A local woman interviewed at the commune office also reported the same information. She also stated that some of the men from the camps returned to identify resident Hutus who had remained in the communes with a view to targeting them at a later date.

COMMUNES MARABA AND MBAZI

6. The patrol spoke with the bourgmestres of both communes. Conversation with them resulted in the following information:

- a. Food. Distribution of food is done by CRS and CARITAS. Food is distributed to all residents in the communes. The bourgmestres did not voice any complaints about food distribution.
- b. Water. No complaints except that water pumping machinery required repair and was being pursued by the commune itself.
- c. Population. The bourgmestres both reported a significant portion of the population consisted of women and children. The reason given was the same as that given by the deputy bourgmestre of RUNYINYA. There are 1,194 orphans within these communes. They are being looked after by relatives and friends.
- d. Records. Both communes again appeared to have very detailed records.
- e. Arrests. Both bourgmestres stated that there had been some arrests in the commune. Most were for petty theft however some had been charged with participating in the genocide. Once arrested they were transferred to the prison in BUTARE. The bourgmestre of MBAZI, when pressed for details on the number of arrests, disclosed that if sufficient witnesses did not support a charge of genocide within two weeks, then the person charged was released. He pointed out that some 26 detainees had recently been released due to lack of witnesses.
- f. Security. The security situation is good within both communes. The bourgmestres indicated that there were no attacks from bandits and that security was good even in areas distant from the heart of the commune. Both bourgmestres stated that UNAMIR presence consisted of patrols twice weekly. They did not feel that there was a requirement for a permanent UNAMIR presence in the communes.

7. Tac HQ in BUTARE indicated to the patrol that the deployment of troops at present while not in compliance with the security orders of Op RETOUR was all that could be expected given manpower and logistic restraints.

OBSERVATIONS

8. It is the view of the HAC representative of the patrol that the following observations should be noted:

- a. The commune leadership is functioning well in all three communes and that detailed records are being kept on the changes in the population.
- b. | There is no humanitarian emergency in the communes.
- c. Building materials would be beneficial in helping all of the communes repair destroyed houses. UNREO is aware of this and emphasis is being placed in this area as materials become available and NGOs to accomplish the task.
- d. The closer communes are to the Sector 4A area, the greater the security problems. Communes near IDP camps are vulnerable, particularly at night, and the leadership in the communes blame INTERAHAMWE who they say are hiding in the Op TOURQUOIS areas of GIKONGORO, KIBEHO, RWAMIKO and MUBUGA. A plan to protect outlying cellules of communes near the Sector 4A area at night should be investigated to improve security.
- e. | The UNAMIR security plan for Op RETOUR in the Sector 3 area requires review by HQ UNAMIR in conjunction with Comd Sector 3, Tac HQ and the Op RETOUR OPI. This will serve to avoid confusion and confirm the deployment of troops pertinent to the actual threat.

B. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN KIGALI PREFECTURE REPORTED THAT MANY LOCALS WERE UNABLE TO SEE THEIR DETAINED RELATIVES IN KIGALI PRISON. THIS HAS RAISED SOME SUSPICION AMONG THE GENERAL PUBLIC IN VIEW OF THE PREVAILING INSECURITY PROBLEMS IN SOME PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. AS A FOLLOW UP, THE TEAM HAD AN INTERVIEW WITH KIGALI DEPUTY PROSECUTOR, WHO EXPLAINED THAT MANY PRISONERS HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO OTHER PRISONS AS A RESULT OF OVER CROWDING. ANOTHER REASON GIVEN WAS THAT SOME OF THE INMATES WERE ON ADMISSION IN HOSPITALS DUE TO ILL HEALTH.

C. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED THE MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION AND RECONSTRUCTION WHERE THE DIRECTOR GENERAL ACCUSED SOME NGOS OPERATING IN RWANDA AS "BUSINESSMEN" PARTICULARLY THOSE FROM THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY COUNTRIES. HE ALSO ADDED THAT OUT OF THE 189 NGOS IN RWANDA, 24 OF THEM HAVE TURNED DOWN THE MINISTRY'S COORDINATION PLAN. HE FURTHER DISCLOSED THAT SOME OF THEM HAVE NO PROGRAMME OF ACTION AND CONCERN FOR THE VICTIMS OF THE CRISIS IN RWANDA.

B. MEDICAL. FORCE MEDICAL STAFF TREATED APPROXIMATELY 162 LOCALS THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY PROVIDING PRIMARY HEALTH CARE.

C. TOTAL OF 208 RETURNEES WERE REPATRIATED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES IN KABAYA (GR 4906) AND SATINSYI (GR 5900) IN SECTOR 5. IN THE SAME SECTOR, AN ORGANISED CONVOY OF 250 RETURNEES WAS RECEIVED FROM THE KIBUMBA CAMP IN ZAIRE. REGISTRATION OF THE LATTER GROUP BY UNHCR OFFICIALS IS STILL IN PROGRESS.





1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE STABLE.

B. IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT A GRAVE WAS DISCOVERED AT MUHUNGUE FOREST GR 3016. THE GRAVE CONTAINED 4 DEAD BODIES WITH SEVERAL UNBURIED DEAD BODIES AROUND THE GRAVE. THE GRAVE DATES BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR

C. IN SECTOR 6, INDBATT REPORTED THE DISCOVERY OF ANOTHER MASS GRAVE AT NDERA CAMP NEAR THE MENTAL HOSP COMPLEX. NUMBER OF BODIES IN THE GRAVE UNKNOWN. THE GRAVE DATES BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE FORCE COMMANDER MET THE AMERICAN AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, H.E. MR. DAVID RAWSON, AND A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE U.S. NATIONAL SECURITY COUNCIL, MR. TIMOTHY ATKIN, TO DISCUSS THE PROVISION OF PATROL BOATS BY THE U.S GOVERNMENT FOR USE BY UNAMIR TROOPS ON LAKE KIVU, AND OTHER ASPECTS OF UNAMIR'S CURRENT AND PROJECTED FUTURE OPERATIONS IN RWANDA.

B. HIGH-LEVEL RWANDESE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS HELD SEPARATE TALKS WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF CHINA AND FRANCE IN EFFORTS AIMED AT INCREASING JOINT COOPERATION BETWEEN THEIR RESPECTIVE COUNTRIES.

C. RADIO RWANDA ANNOUNCED THAT A REGIONAL MINISTERIAL MEETING ON REFUGEES WOULD BE HELD IN BUJUMBURA, BURUNDI FROM 15 TO 17 FEBRUARY, UNDER THE AUSPICES OF UNHCR AND THE ORGANISATION OF AFRICAN UNITY. NO INFORMATION WAS PROVIDED REGARDING THE PARTICIPATION OF THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AT THIS CONFERENCE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA.

(1) LOCALS IN MUHIRA (GR 4185) AND RUBOREZA COMMUNE (GR 1158) REPORTED TO SECTOR 4B MILOBS THAT THE RPA HAD ARRESTED A TOTAL OF 31 PEOPLE IN THE TWO COMMUNES. THE LOCALS WERE NOT SPECIFIC ABOUT THE DATE OF THE ARRESTS. LOCAL POLICE AND RPA COMMANDERS CONTACTED DECLINED TO COMMENT OR TO GIVE REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS. INVESTIGATIONS STILL IN PROGRESS. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN ARMED INCURSIONS INTO THE RUBOREZA AREA ABOUT THREE WEEKS EARLIER. THE DEPLOYMENT OF RPA TROOPS HAD HOWEVER STABILISED THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA.

(2) IN SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT TWO PERSONS WERE ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN GISHUMA COMMUNE FOR THEIR ALLEGED PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE DURING THE WAR. THE SUSPECTS ARE BEING HELD IN THE GISHUMA JAIL.

(3) A LOCAL FROM MUTURA COMMUNE GR 3223 REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT RPA TPS ARRESTED HIS BROTHER AND THREE OTHER LOCALS ON 09 FEB 95. REASONS FOR ARREST NOT KNOWN. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT, A LOCAL AT NKULI GR 4724 REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT HE HAD BEEN LIVING IN THE FOREST DUE TO THREATS TO HIS LIFE BY THE RPA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. MILOBS SECTOR 5 AND HUMAN RIGHTS WERE INFORMED.

B. FRGF. NTR.

C. MILITIA. AUSMED QUOTING AN UNREO REP INDICATED THAT THERE WAS HARD CORE INTERAHAMWE PRESENCE WITHIN NDAGO DP CAMP IN SECTOR 4A.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

- (1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.
- (2) THE FC MET THE US AMBASSADOR MR RAWSON AND MR. TOM ATKIN TO DISCUSS RWANDA'S SITUATION AND A POSSIBLE EQUIPMENT SUPPORT FROM THE USA TO UNAMIR. LATER HE HELD DISCUSSION WITH MR. GOLO, OIC ADMINISTRATION ON THE CURRENT LOGISTIC SITUATION IN THE MISSION. HE CONCLUDED THE DAY WITH A VISIT TO THE AUSTRALIAN CONTINGENT.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA, MR. PASTEUR BIZIMUNGO, TO DISCUSS THE SECURITY SITUATION IN RWANDA AND THE REFUGEE CAMPS IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES, AND OTHER TOPICS OF MUTUAL INTEREST.

B. THE NEW UNDP RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE FOR RWANDA, MR. S. HASEGAWA, AND HIS DEPUTY MET WITH THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR UNAMIR TO DISCUSS THE CONDITION OF PRISONS IN RWANDA, THE STATUS OF THE U.N. TRUST FUND SET UP FOR RWANDA, THE UPCOMING VISIT OF THE U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL DELEGATION TO KIGALI, AS WELL AS OTHER AREAS OF JOINT COOPERATION.

C. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ALSO MET THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL FOR RWANDATEL TO DISCUSS THE LATEST DEVELOPMENTS REGARDING ALLOCATION OF THE FREQUENCIES NEEDED FOR RADIO UNAMIR'S COMMENCEMENT OF OPERATIONS. THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL ASSURED HIM THAT THE NECESSARY FREQUENCIES HAD BEEN APPROVED AND THAT FORMAL AUTHORIZATION FOR THEIR USE WOULD BE FORTHCOMING SOON.

D. AT A MEETING HELD YESTERDAY, MEMBERS OF THE RWANDESE CABINET EXPRESSED THEIR CONCERN OVER ARTICLES PUBLISHED IN THE RWANDESE PRESS CONTAINING DEFAMATORY STATEMENTS WHICH WERE NOT CONDUCTIVE TO THE PROCESS OF NATIONAL RECONCILIATION. THEY ASKED THE RELEVANT JUDICIAL ORGANS TO BRING TO JUSTICE THOSE JOURNALISTS WHO BREACH THE LAW GOVERNING THEIR PROFESSION. THEY ALSO ISSUED A COMMUNIQUE READ ON NATIONAL RADIO CONDEMNING THE RECENT ATTACK ON THE RWANDESE POLITICAL JOURNALIST WHO IS STILL HOSPITALISED IN A STATE OF COMA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA.

(1) TUNBATT REPORTED THAT A 22 YEAR OLD MAN FROM RUBAVO COMMUNE GR 2911, CYANIKA SECTOR 2041 WAS ARRESTED BY THE RPA WHEN HE WAS ON HIS WAY FROM GISENYI TO KIGALI ON 30 JAN 95. HIS FAMILY HAS REQUESTED INFORMATION ABOUT HIM. MILOBS SECTOR 5 AND HUMAN RIGHTS WERE INFORMED.

(2) A LOCAL FROM NKULI COMMUNE REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT ON 07 JAN 95, RPA ARRESTED A MAN WHO OWNED MANY HERDS OF CATTLE IN THE MENTIONED COMMUNE. NO REASONS WERE GIVEN FOR THE ARREST AND THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE PRISONER IS NOT KNOWN. HUMAN RIGHTS WERE INFORMED.

(3) ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA PRESENCE IN MUNINI SCARED AWAY IDPs WHO WERE WILLING TO BE ESCORTED ON FOOT BY ZAMBATT TROOPS FROM MUNINI DP CAMP TO THEIR HOMES IN NYAKIZU COMMUNE IN SECTOR 3.

(4) RPA TROOPS IN NYABINAGA (GR 1450) IN SECTOR 4B WERE REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED ONE LOCAL IN THE VILLAGE FOR STEALING LIVESTOCK DURING THE WAR. THE REPORT STATED THAT THE ACCUSED REFUSED TO PAY FOR THE COST OF THE LIVESTOCK AND WAS SUBSEQUENTLY ARRESTED AND PLACED IN CUSTODY IN THE RWAMATAMU PRISON.

(5) MILOB REPORTED THAT IN TWO SEPARATE INCIDENTS ON

06 AND 09 FEB 95, TWO LOCALS WERE ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN GITAMBI (GR 8815) IN SECTOR 4C, FOR ASSOCIATING WITH KNOWN BANDITS.

B. FRGF. GHANBATT REPORTED THAT A FORMER RGF SOLDIER FROM KAGASHA GR 3968 WHO WAS HUNTED BY RPA, SOUGHT REFUGE AT KABILIZI PTL BASE. HE HAS BEEN TRANSFERRED TO BARE PTL BASE. MILOBS AND HR HAVE BEEN INFORMED.

C. MILITIA. NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) THE FC BRIEFED HIS POLITICAL ADVISOR ON THE INFORMATION TO PASS ON TO THE SRSG WHO IS ARRIVING IN NAIROBI BEFORE LEAVING FOR TANZANIA WITH THE UNHCR COMMISSIONER. LATER HE HELD A MEETING WITH RANDOLPH KENT OF UNREO AND WITH MR HASEGANA OF UNDP ORGANIZATION. IN BOTH MEETINGS IDEAS WERE EXCHANGED ON THE UPCOMING MEETING IN BUJUMBURA. HE LATER ATTENDED A PRIVATE LUNCHEON WITH THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA AND DISCUSSED THE FUTURE OF UNAMIR.

POST AND ALL DPCS AS PART OF OP RUBY AND OP RETOUR. RPA WAS REPORTED TO BE MAINTAINING ITS PRESENCE ALONG THE BORDER AREA AND IN THE CAMPS. THE SITUATION IN THE CAMPS AND ALONG THE BORDER WAS REPORTED NORMAL.

(B) THE DFC/CMO VISITED THE SECTOR. HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE SECTOR HQ STAFF.

(C) PATROLS TO NYABINAGA (GR 1450) REPORTED THAT THE BOURGMESTRE WAS VERY UNCOOPERATIVE. HE DEMANDED THAT MILOBS SEEK HIS AUTHORITY BEFORE CARRYING OUT ANY PATROLS IN THE COMMUNE AND INSISTED THAT NO PATROLS WERE TO BE CONDUCTED IN THE COMMUNE IN HIS ABSENCE. HE ALSO ACCUSED UNAMIR OF BEING CORRUPT AND OF BEING PARTY TO THE GENOCIDE DURING THE RECENT WAR AND SAID UNAMIR SHOULD FACE A TRIBUNAL. THE PATROL ALSO INVESTIGATED AN INCIDENT IN WHICH ONE LOCAL, WHO IS PART OF A VIGILANTE GROUP WAS SHOT IN THE CHEST BY AN RPA PATROL ON THE 7 FEB 95. INFO GATHERED SO FAR INDICATES THAT THE VICTIM DECIDED TO GO ON PATROL DESPITE INSTRUCTIONS BY RPA LOCAL COMMANDERS TO THE CONTRARY. THE VICTIM IS ON ADMISSION AT THE KIBUYE HOSPITAL.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS ESCORTED A CONVOY OF TRUCKS CONVEYING 500 RETURNEES FROM GISENYI TO GICIYE (GR 5012). THE CONVOY WAS ORIGINALLY SCHEDULED TO MOVE ON 08 FEB 95 BUT WAS DELAYED BECAUSE RPA LOCAL COMMANDERS WANTED FULL DETAILS ON NAMES OF RETURNEES AND THEIR ULTIMATE DESTINATIONS.

(C) PRELIMINARY REPORT OF THE ITALIAN SCIENTISTS INVESTIGATING THE NYRIGOMGO VOLCANO INDICATED THAT THERE WAS NO IMMEDIATE DANGER OF THE VOLCANO ERUPTING. THEY SAID THE VOLUME OF LAVA IN THE CRATER IS TOO SMALL AND HAS ENOUGH SPACE TO CIRCULATE. A DETAILED REPORT IS TO BE MADE AVAILABLE TO MILOBS ON COMPLETION OF THE STUDY.

AUSMED INF ELM INTERVENED AND ASSISTED THE ZAMBATT SOLDIER, REINFORCING THAT GENDARMERIE WERE NOT AUTHORISED TO ARREST THE UNAMIR MEMBER. THE GENDARMERIE INSISTED UPON ARRESTING HIM AND WENT TO ACTION WITH THEIR WEAPONS. THE AUSMED ELMS REACTED BY GOING TO ACTION, WHICH FORCED A BRIEF STAND-OFF. THE AUSMEDELM THEN ESCORTED THE ZAMBATT DVR TO TAC HQ FOR HIS SAFETY. B. THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, YESTERDAY CHAIRED A MEETING IN KIGALI OF THE REPRESENTATIVES OF NATIONAL GOVERNMENTS AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS WHICH PLEDGED THEIR ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA DURING THE RECENT GENEVA ROUND-TABLE CONFERENCE. THEY DISCUSSED THE MECHANISMS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION AND COORDINATION OF THE HUMANITARIAN AID PLAN FOR RWANDA WHICH HAS BEEN PRESENTED BY THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AS THE PROGRAMME FOR NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC REHABILITATION.



2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.
