1. HAVING FOUND THAT NO DIRECT COMMUNICATIONS BY TELEPHONE WITH UNAMIR WERE POSSIBLE, WE MANAGED TO ESTABLISH CONTACT WITH FC THROUGH NY. LATER ON, AT THE END OF THE MORNING, THE COMMUNICATIONS LINK NY-KIGALI V.V. HAD BEEN RESTORED.
2. BY ORDER OF FC WE TRIED TO CONVEY A MESSAGE FROM FC TO COLS ROSADIRA AND DOJERSA IN KIGALI:
  - A. TELEPHONES OF BOTH COLONELS WERE NOT ANSWERED INITIALLY.
  - B. RWANDA EMBASSY/KAMPALA PHONE WAS NOT ANSWERED.
  - C. MR. KEITH R. COLE UNDP KAMPALA WAS REQUESTED TO CONVEY THE MESSAGE PERSONALLY TO THE RWANDESE EMBASSADOR. HE APPROACHED PERSONALLY MR. BUKEYE/SECOND COUNSELLOR RWANDESE EMBASSY IN KAMPALA WHO LATER CONFIRMED, THROUGH

MR. COLE, THAT HE HAD CONVEYED THE MESSAGE TO COL. ROSADIRA.

- D. IN A LATER PHASE WE MANAGED TO CONTACT COL. ROSADIRA'S RESIDENCE (WIFE) AND HIS OFFICE SECRETARY: BOTH CONFIRMED TO PASS THROUGH THE MESSAGE TO COL. ROSADIRA.
  - E. LATER MR. COLE REPORTED, AS TOLD BY MR. BUKEYE, THAT COL. ROSADIRA WAS ON HIS WAY TO SEE FC. MESSAGE CONVEYED TO ADC/DFC.

ONE OF OUR VEHICLES (UNOMUR-35) STUCK UP AT LUBIRIZI AREA ON 070100 APRIL 1994 DUE TO LEAKAGE IN THE FUEL TANK CAUSED BY STONE. IT COULD NOT BE EVACUATED BECAUSE OF NON AVAILABILITY OF APPROPRIATE <sup>W</sup>TOW CHAIN.

**VIII. MISCELLANEOUS**

**A. BORDER CROSSINGS**

(1) FROM UGANDA TO RWANDA - TOTAL FIVE (05) VEHICLES [TRUCK (01), JEEPS/PICK-UPS (03) AND CAR (01)] CROSSED THE BORDER THROUGH KATUNA WITH THIRTEEN (13) PASSENGERS. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT COULD BE FOUND OUT.

B. ON 061100 APRIL 1994 ONE OF OUR PATROL CAME IN CONTACT WITH THE LOCAL RPF CAMP COMMANDER OF KAFUNZO AREA. THE RPF COMMANDER IDENTIFIED HIMSELF AS PATRIC. HE INFORMED THAT MOST OF THE RPF MEMBERS ARE NOT AWARE OF THE PRESENCE OF HELICOPTER IN UNOMUR. SO IT WILL BE BETTER IF THE RPF HQ IS INFORMED ABOUT THIS.

C. THE HELICOPTERS WHICH WE HAVE AT PRESENT DO NOT HAVE ANY UN INSIGNIA AT THE BOTTOM, AS A RESULT IT IS VERY DIFFICULT FOR PEOPLE TO IDENTIFY THE HELICOPTERS OTHER THAN THE COLOUR FROM THE GROUND, SO IT WILL BE SAFE TO HAVE UN MARKED AT THE BOTTOM OF ALL THE HELICOPTERS.

IF YOUR STAFF WAS INFORMED BEFORE THE TAKING PLACE OF THE CEREMONY ABOUT DATE/TIME/PLACE/CHARACTER OF THE FUNCTION, IT WOULD HAVE BEEN EFFICIENT AND ACCORDING TO THE GENERALLY ACCEPTED RULES FOR DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION, TO FORWARD THIS INFORMATION ACCOMPANIED BY AN ANALYSIS OF THE AVAILABLE INFORMATION TRANSLATED INTO PROBABLE EXPECTATIONS IN ADVANCE TO THIS HQ, TO ENABLE THIS SECTOR HQ TO ANTICIPATE MORE SPECIFICALLY ON EVENTS WHICH COULD BE EXPECTED TO HAPPEN ON THE BORDER.
- B. REGARDING THE QUESTION "DID THEY APPEAR TO BE SOLDIERS IN CIVILIAN ATTIRE?" I WILL MAKE THAT QUESTION ADDED AS AN ITEM OF SPECIFIC ATTENTION TO THE TASK LIST OF UNMOS.
- C. NO COVERED LICENSE PLATES HAVE BEEN OBSERVED/REPORTED BY BORDER OP'S OR BY PATROLS. ALL CROSSING VEHICLES WERE WITH NORMAL UGANDA LICENSE PLATES.

D. REGARDING THE WHAT YOU CALL "INAUGURATION OF A NEW MARKET IN BYUMBA STORY". FIRSTLY I MAY REFER TO MY DAILY SITREP PERIOD 171000 TO 181000 MAR 94, DATED 18 MAR 94, PAGE 2/4, ITEM B.1(C), SAYING: "A GROUP OF 16 YOUNG GIRLS BETWEEN 18 TO 24 YEARS CROSSED THE BORDER IN TWO VEHICLES (REG NO. UAG-048 AND BR-085) THROUGH KATUNA INTO RWANDA ON 180100 MAR 1994. THEY REPORTED THAT THEY CAME FROM KAMPALA AND WERE GOING TO SEE THEIR RELATIVES AT BYUMBA IN RWANDA". SECONDLY I MAY REFER TO YOUR DAILY SITREP 180600B TO 190600B MAR 94 WHICH QUOTES ALMOST LITERALLY (PARA 4.B.) MY REPORT. THEN, FINALLY, ON 20 MAR 94 IN THE EARLIER MENTIONED INFOSUM THE COMBINATION OF THE YOUNG LADIES TRAVELLING TO BYUMBA ON 18 MAR AND THE 212 WELL DRESSED PEOPLE TRAVELLING TO MULINDI (ACCORDING TO THEIR OWN STATEMENT) ON 19 MAR 94 APPEARS. THIS IS A FALSE COMBINATION OF INFORMATION, WHICH I SERIOUSLY REGRET. HOWEVER YOUR STATEMENT "BY ACCEPTING AND REPORTING THIS STORY YOU HAVE RIDICULED YOURSELVES IN THE EYES OF THE RPF SYMPATHIZERS WHO GAVE YOU THIS STORY" IS, STILL UNFORTUNATELY, ONLY HALF TRUE: WE HAVE NOT ACCEPTED THIS BYUMBA STORY FROM THE PEOPLE GOING TO THE GRADUATION CEREMONY IN CYONDO, BECAUSE THEY DIDN'T GIVE US THAT STORY. THE ONLY ONE WHO HAS RIDICULED, IF YOU WANT TO USE THAT WORD, HIMSELF IN YOUR EYES IS ME BY BEING INACCURATE IN CHECKING THE TEXT AFTER BEING FINALIZED. HOWEVER IN PERSPECTIVE OF THE ALL ABOVE MENTIONED, YOUR INFO-OFFICER COULD HAVE MADE ME CORRECT MY INACCURACY, IF

HE HAD PROCESSED THE EARLIER INFORMATION PROPERLY AND IN DIRECT CONTACT ASKED ME FOR CLARIFICATION ON THIS SUBJECT. BUT, I AM AFRAID, I MAY NOT COUNT ON COOPERATION OF THAT KIND AT THIS LEVEL.

E. REGARDING YOUR STATEMENT "IF YOU WERE TO STUDY A MAP...": THIS STATEMENT CONTENDS THE DIRECT ACCUSATION OF NOT DOING MY JOB PROPERLY. I MUST DENY THAT. I STUDIED AS THOROUGHLY AS POSSIBLE IN TWENTY DAYS' TIME ALL THE MAPS REGARDING THE OPERATIONAL AREA AS FAR AS THEY ARE AVAILABLE. IN SPITE OF SEVERAL REPEATED REQUESTS FOR MAPS TO YOUR HQ NONE, APART FROM THE ONE COMPLETE COVERAGE OF UNOMUR SECTOR, AS INITIALLY PROVIDED, HAS BEEN RECEIVED. THE DUTCH GOVERNMENT HAS ALREADY SENT ON SPECIAL REQUEST BY MY PREDECESSOR, A NUMBER OF BLACK/WHITE COPIES, WHICH ARE IN USE WITH THE PATROLS. THE RWANDA AREA IS LITERALLY A WHITE SPOT! I THINK IT IS NOT FAIR TO BLAME ONE FOR THE LACK OF KNOWLEDGE OF THE TERRAIN UNDER THESE CIRCUMSTANCES. OF COURSE, I HAVE LEARNED TO IMPROVISE, BUT IMPROVISATION HAS ITS LIMITS AND TAKES TIME.

F. APART FROM THE ABOVE MENTIONED: LANGUAGE PROBLEMS PLAY, FROM TIME TO TIME, A ROLE WITHIN THE MISSION, AS WELL AS THE QUALIFICATION AND CAPACITIES, IN RELATION TO THE PRESENT ASSIGNMENT AS A UNMO, OF SOME OF THE OFFICERS. I AM AFRAID THAT YOU CANNOT EXPECT ME TO TURN A FINANCE, TECHNICAL ETC.

OFFICER INTO A WELL TRAINED RECCE OR INTELLIGENCE OFFICER OVERNIGHT.

G. AS I ALREADY HAVE ASSURED YOU BEFORE: THIS HQ IS WORKING HARD ON THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE OPERATIONAL SKILLS OF THE UNMOS.

4. AD YOUR PARA 4.

THE SQUEEZING PROCESS OF UNMOS HAS ALREADY COMMENCED AND IS BEING CONTINUED, BUT YOU CANNOT EXPECT TO GET A LITER OF JUICE BY SQUEEZING ONE ORANGE.

5. AD YOUR PARA 1.

I AM COMPLETELY AWARE OF YOUR DESPERATE NEED OF THE DESCRIBED INFORMATION. I CONSIDER IT MY TASK TO PROVIDE YOU WITH THE INFORMATION IN ACCORDANCE TO THESE NEEDS.

6. TO CONCLUDE: IN MY OPINION REFERENCE DOES NOT SAY ANYTHING ABOUT THE LACK OF QUALITY OF THE SITREPS FROM THIS HQ, ALTHOUGH I FRANKLY ADMIT THAT IT IS STILL NECESSARY TO IMPROVE A LOT OF ASPECTS CONCERNING THE GATHERING AND PROCESSING OF INFORMATION. BE CONVINCED, SIR, THAT THIS HQ IS WORKING HARD ON THIS, BUT PLEASE ALSO TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION THAT THE POSSIBILITIES ARE, UNFORTUNATELY, LIMITED.

WHAT WERE THEY TAKING WITH THEM? WHAT SEX AND HOW OLD WERE THEY? DID THEY APPEAR TO BE SOLDIERS IN CIVILIAN ATTIRE? THESE ARE THE QUESTIONS WE NEED TO HAVE INFORMATION ABOUT.
3. WE KNOW THAT THESE PEOPLE WERE ATTENDING A GRADUATION CEREMONY IN CYONDO AT THE RPF SCHOOL FOR THE DISABLED. I WAS AT THIS CEREMONY AND SAW THE LARGE NUMBER OF VERY WELL DRESSED CIVILIANS WITH COVERED LICENSE PLATES. THEY OBVIOUSLY DESPITE WHAT YOU REPORTED COULD NOT HAVE ATTENDED THE OPENING OF A MARKET IN BYUMBA. IF YOU WERE TO STUDY A MAP YOU WOULD FIND THAT BYUMBA IS IN THE RGF ZONE AND THESE PERSONS WOULD NOT HAVE BEEN ADMITTED TO THAT AREA. THEREFORE THEY OBVIOUSLY WERE ATTENDING SOME SORT OF FUNCTION IN THE RPF ZONE.
