A. RPA. COLONEL NGOGA FORMER BDE CDR IN GITARAMA VISITED TODAY THIS LOCATION AND INVITED SOME MILOBS AND HUMAN RIGHTS MEMBERS TO ASSIST WITH HIM TO A FOOTBALL MATCH, ONE OF THE PARTICIPATING TEAMS WAS RPA 'S SELECTION.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. GITARAMA TEAM

(i) ONE TEAM WENT TO TABA 8883 AND RUTOBWE 7781 COMMUNES ON A DOMINATION PATROL. THE TEAM REPORTED THAT THE SITUATION WAS CALM.

(ii) A MILOB AND HUMAN RIGHTS WENT TO MURAMA COMMUNE 6749 TO ATTEND A REBURIAL THAT WAS TAKING PLACE IN NGWA SECTOR 6941. THE TEAM REPORTED THAT, ABOUT 2000 PEOPLE WERE REBURIED TODAY. THESE PEOPLE WERE EXHUMED FROM 5 MASSES GRAVES WITHIN THE SECTOR. IT IS BELIEVED THAT 5000 PEOPLE WERE MASSACRED IN THE WHOLE COMMUNE. THE REBURIAL WAS ATTENDED BY AMONG OTHER DIGNITARIES, WERE THE GITARAMA PREFET, THE BUTARE DIOCESE PRIEST AND THE MURAMA BOURGEMESTRE. DURING THE SPEECH GIVING, THE PREFET TOLD THE LOCALS TO FORGIVE EACH OTHER AND RECONCILE. HE ALSO TOLD THE LOCALS THAT, THE RWANDA GOVERNMENT DOES NOT HAVE MONEY TO ASSIST LOCALS TO RECONSTRUCTING THEIR DEMOLISHED HOUSES AND ENCOURAGED THEM TO FORM COOPERATIVES AND START THE RECONSTRUCTION OF THEIR HOUSES. GENERAL SITUATION WAS REPORTED TO BE CALM.

i) ONE MILOB TEAM VISITED MASANGO COMMUNE (6254) AND FOUND CHILDREN BEING VACCINATED AGAINST POLIO, TETANUS, DIPHTHERIA AND TUBERCULOSIS. THE MASANGO CLINIC IS RUN BY ONE NGO NAMED MEMISA (HOLLAND). IT SUPPLIES ENOUGH DRUGS AND CURRENT MEDICINES. IT HAS 50 BEDS AND ABOUT 30 PATIENTS ARE TREATED EVERYDAY. IT HAS 12 MEDICAL ASSISTANTS OUT OF WHICH 10 ARE QUALIFIED AND 2 ARE NOT. PAY OF THE STAFFS ARE PROVIDED BY MEMISA AND WHEN THEY FAIL TO PROVIDE ENOUGH AMOUNT THEN PATIENTS SUBSCRIBE SOME AMOUNT EACH TO PAY THEM. THE HOSPITAL DOES NOT HAVE LABORATORY FACILITIES. THE AUTHORITIES REQUESTED FOR LABORATORY FACILITIES WITH EQUIPMENT. THEY ALSO REQUESTED FOR 50 MATRESSES AND ONE AMBULANCE TO CARRY EMERGENCY PATIENTS TO KABGAYE OR KIGALI HOSPITAL.

ii) ONE MILOB TEAM VISITED MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE (8274) AND MET THE NEW BOURGEMESTRE NAMED NSABIMANA MATHIEU WHO JOINED THE COMMUNE TODAY. THE NEW BOURGEMESTRE REQUESTED TO PROVIDE TECHNICIAN TO REPAIR ELECTRIC LINES OF THE COMMUNE OFFICE AND ALSO REQUESTED FOR SOME ELECTRIC GOODS, LOCKS AND BUILDING MATERIALS.

iii) THE SAME MILOB TEAM VISITED MUGINA COMMUNE (9267) AND FOUND THE GENERAL SITUATION CALM. THE BOURGEMESTRE REQUESTED TO TRANSPORT TWO TONS OF FOOD AND BUILDING MATERIALS FROM GITARAMA TO COMMUNE OFFICE. HE ALSO APPROACHED UNAMIR TO PROVIDE TECHNICIANS TO REPAIR WATER PIPE SUPPLIES FOR FOUR SECTORS IN THE COMMUNE. THE HEALTH CENTRE IS RUN BY ICRC. IT HAS 40 BEDS AND CAN TREAT DAILY 70 TO 80 PATIENTS. IT DOES NOT HAVE ANY DOCTOR AND ENOUGH QUALIFIED NURSES. THEY ALSO REQUESTED FOR AN AMBULANCE TO TRANSPORT EMERGENCY PATIENTS TO GITARAMA OR KIGALI HOSPITAL.

i) MALI COY PROVIDED 2 BEDFORD TRUCKS TO "FOOD FOR HUNGRY" TO TRANSPORT 40 TONS OF FOOD FROM GITARAMA TO THE NGO LOCATION AT KABGAYI (7073).

ii) MALI COY PROVIDED TWO BEDFORD TRUCKS TO TAMBWE COMMUNE (7653) TO TRANSPORT 9 TONS OF FOOD FROM GITARAMA TO THE COMMUNE OFFICE.

iii) 15 LOCAL PATIENT WERE TREATED TODAY BY MALI COY IN ITS CLINIC FACILITY.

v) THE OTHER MILOB TEAM VISITED THE HEALTH CENTER AT RUTOBWE (7781). IT IS RUN BY THE ICRC. THE BUILDING OF THE HEALTH CENTER IS UNDER REPAIR AND THE ICRC PROMISED TO PROVIDE SIX MILLION FR FOR ITS RECONSTRUCTION. IT HAS 50 BEDS AND AN AVERAGE OF 100 PATIENTS ARE TREATED EVERYDAY. THE TOTAL STAFF STRENGTH IS SEVEN INCLUDING ONE MEDICAL ASSISTANT.

vi) ONE MILOB TEAM VISITED THE HEALTH CENTER AT MURAMA COMMUNE (6749) AND FOUND CHILDREN BEING VACCINATED FOR POLIO, TETANUS AND TUBERCULOSIS. THE TEAM ALSO FOUND ROUGHLY 60 PEOPLE WAITING FOR TREATMENT PLUS 20 ADMITTED PATIENTS. IT IS RUN BY "ADRA". IT SUPPLIES DRUGS AND CURRENT USAGE DRUGS BUT ANTIBIOTICS AND ANTIMALARIAL TABLETS ARE IN SHORT SUPPLY. IT HAS 50 BEDS AND AN AVERAGE OF 110 TO 150 PATIENTS ARE TREATED EVERYDAY. THE CENTER ADMITS 60 SERIOUS PATIENTS PER MONTH. THERE ARE 10 WORKERS, OUT OF WHICH FOUR ARE QUALIFIED. THE CENTER HAS SHORTAGE OF WATER SINCE THE PRESENT TANK IS TOO SMALL. THE AUTHORITIES REQUESTED 50 MATTRESSES, ONE TYPEWRITER, ONE REFRIGERATOR FOR VACCINES AND ONE WEIGHING SCALE FOR CHILDREN AND ADULTS. THEY ALSO REQUESTED 10 WINDOW FRAMES, FIVE DOORS AND ONE BIG WATER TANK.

ii) ALSO, MALI COY PROVIDED TWO BEDFORD TRUCKS TO TRANSPORT 14 TONS OF FOOD FROM GITARAMA TO BULINGA (6679) AND NYAKABANDA (6597).

iii) MALI COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO TRANSPORT FIVE TONS OF FLOUR FROM GITARAMA TO MASANGO COMMUNE OFFICE (6254). THIS MISSION CONTINUES TOMORROW.

A. RPA. AUTHORITIES FROM 301 BDE WERE NOT AWARE OF THE PLANNED MOVEMENT OF PRISONERS FROM GITARAMA PRISON TO NYANZA PRISON. A MEETING IS SCHEDULED FOR TOMORROW AT 1000 HRS AT THE PREFECTURE.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. GITARAMA TEAM.

i) THE NEW SECTOR COMMANDER, LT-COL BLANCHETTE ACCOMPANIED A MILOB/HR TEAM TO THE GIKOMA COMMUNE (7649) FOR A MEETING WITH THE BOURGMESTRE AND A VISIT TO THE COMMUNE CACHOT. THE TEAM THEN VISITED THE GATAGARA SECTOR WHICH INCLUDES A CENTER FOR HANDICAPPED PEOPLE.

ii) THE MEETING WITH THE BOURGMESTRE WENT VERY SMOOTHLY WITH PLEDGES OF COOPERATION BEING OFFERED BY THE LOCAL CIVILIAN AUTHORITY. THE NEARBY CACHOT WAS VISITED EVEN THOUGH THE ACCESS WAS NEGOTIATED WITH DIFFICULTY WITH THE RPA. THE CACHOT CONTAINED 28 PRISONERS, 25 OF WHICH ARE ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE AND THREE FOR COMMON CRIME. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT FIVE OF THE PRISONERS WERE RETURNEES FROM THE KIBEHO CAMP.

iii) IN THE HANDICAPPED CENTER, CALLED THE "HOME DE VIERGE DES PAUVRES", THERE ARE 100 HANDICAPPED PEOPLE, 50 BLIND PEOPLE AND THE STAFF STRENGTH IS 80, INCLUDING DOCTORS, TEACHERS, NURSES, MEDICAL ASSISTANT AND OFFICIAL STAFF. THIS INSTITUTION IS A NATIONAL FACILITY. SINCE THE WAR, IT HAS

LOST MOST OF ITS SELF-SUFFICIENCY WITH THE LACK OF BOTH HUMAN AND MATERIEL RESOURCES. THE TILE FACTORY HOLDS A LARGE SURPLUS AMOUNT OF TILES AND HAS THEREFORE STOPPED PRODUCTION. THESE TILES WOULD BE AVAILABLE TO EVENTUAL BUYERS.

iv) THE HANDICAPPED CENTER HAS A SHORTAGE OF TOOLS AND RAW MATERIAL FOR THE MAKING OF ARTIFICIAL LIMBS. A PRIORITIZED LIST OF ITEMS WILL BE PROVIDED TO MILOBS AT A LATER DATE. NGOS IN A POSITION TO HELP SHOULD BE APPROACHED BY UNAMIR GIVEN THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS INSTITUTION IN THIS COUNTRY.

v) AT THE SAME LOCATION, THE TEAM VISITED THE LABORATORY SCHOOL. IT HAS 12 TEACHERS, 24 STUDENTS IN FIRST AND SECOND GRADE. THEY HAVE A VACANCY PROBLEM OF QUALIFIED TEACHER ON SPECIFIC SUBJECT, MAKING THE OPENING OF THIRD AND FOURTH GRADE IMPOSSIBLE. THE UNDP HAD PROVIDED SUCH HELP IN THE PAST AND OTHER AGENCIES SUCH AS CARITAS GERMANY AND CARITAS ITALY HAVE BEEN SOLICITED IN VAIN. THIS PROBLEM SHOULD RECEIVE TOP PRIORITY GIVEN THE IMPORTANCE OF HAVING QUALIFIED LABORATORY SPECIALIST THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY.

vi) THE HR REPRESENTATIVE INTERVIEWED THE LABORATORY SCHOOL DIRECTOR WHO FELT THAT HIS PERSONAL SAFETY WAS AT RISK BECAUSE OF RUMOURS OF GENOCIDE ACCUSATION. HE PROVIDED IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONCERNING THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COMMUNE. A FULL REPORT WILL BE SUBMITTED IN DUE TIME.

vii) ANOTHER MILOB TEAM VISITED NYABIKENKE COMMUNE (7292) AND VISITED THE HEALTH CENTER, NAMELY THE BIREME CLINIC. THIS CLINIC IS RUN BY MSF WHICH PROVIDES MEDICATION AND FOOD FOR MALNOURISHED PEOPLE. IT HAS 50 BEDS AND AN AVERAGE FROM 60 TO 100 PATIENTS PER DAY. COMMON DISEASES TREATED ARE MALARIA, DIARRHEA, PNEUMONIA AND WORMS INFECTION. THEY ARE EXPERIENCING DIFFICULTIES WITH ELECTRICITY. THEY REQUESTED THE FOLLOWING:

- 1) REPAIR OF THE GENERATOR
- 2) COMPLETION OF TWO BLOCKS OF BUILDING WHICH WERE LEFT INCOMPLETE
- 3) AN AMBULANCE
- 4) STATIONARY, BEDS AND MATTRESSES.

viii) THE TEAM LEARNED THAT THERE WAS A DUTCH ORGANIZATION, WAGENSENI, ASSISTING IN THE HIRING OF LOCALS WHO REBUILD DESTROYED HOUSES.

ix) THE TEAM VISITED KABUYE SECTOR AND FOUND CHILDREN BEING VACCINATED BY THE ICRC AGAINST THE USUAL DISEASES.

x) IN THE SAME SECTOR, CARITAS WAS DISTRIBUTING FOOD FOR THE POOREST FAMILIES.

LAST NIGHT AT 2200 HRS, UNAMIR FOUR RUNNER 1058 PROCEEDING TO KIGALI FROM GIKONGORO WITH TWO MILOBS HAS BROKEN DOWN NEAR TAMBWE COMMUNE (7653). MALI COY RECOVERED THE VEHICLE TO MALI PLATOON LOCATION AT RUHANGO (7653) LAST NIGHT.



The expected number of prisoners to be moved went down from 400 to 200 due to a capacity restriction of the NYANZA prison.

This last prison was also visited today by the Incoming Sector Cdr and the holding conditions awaiting the prisoners to be moved were found to be incommensurably better than those at the GIRARAMA prison. Current statistics for the NYANZA prison is as follows:

- (1) Men — 974
- (2) Women — 81
- (3) Minors — 27
- (4) Infants — 6
- (5) Total — 1088

- The Convoy is scheduled to arrive at the GIRARAMA prison at 0700 hrs tomorrow. It will be composed of 5 trucks each containing 40 prisoners. The RPA will provide two Escort vehicle plus four teams to be mounted in four pick-up that will be driven by mali Cay soldiers. This six vehicles will be positioned alternatively ~~one~~ in between the prisoner trucks. ICRC and HR veh will follow, accompanied with a logistic tail of medical and maintenance. If everything runs smoothly, we are expecting arrival at NYANZA prison at 0900 hrs.

- A change of command ceremony was held today at 1930 hrs between the outgoing Sector Cdr, Lt Col Fox, and the Incoming Sector Cdr, Lt Col BLANCHETTE.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. GITARAMA TEAM

1) THE MOVEMENT OF PRISONERS FROM GITARAMA PRISON TO NYANZA PRISON (IN BUTARE PREFECTURE) STARTED AT 1200 HRS ON 14 JUL 95. THERE WERE SOME SERIOUS DELAYS IN THE LOADING OF THE PRISONERS DUE TO A RUMOUR THAT WAS CIRCULATING IN THE PRISON TO THE EFFECT THAT BOUTROS GHALI WAS GOING TO VISIT THE PRISON TODAY. THEREFORE NOBODY WANTED TO LEAVE IN THE HOPE THAT THE SECRETARY GENERAL COULD FREE THEM. THE SECTOR COMMANDER HAD TO USE A LOUD SPEAKER INSIDE THE JAIL TO QUASH THAT RUMOUR. AFTER ADVISING THE CROWD THAT HE WAS BOUTROS BOUTROS GHALI'S REPRESENTATIVE, HE EXPLAINED TO THEM THAT HE WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR SAFE TRANSPORTATION TO NYANZA PRISON. THIS INTERVENTION PROVED VERY SUCCESSFUL AND THEN IT WAS A MATTER OF REACHING AN AGREEMENT ON VARIOUS LISTS WHICH WERE PREPARED BY THE ICRC AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE PRISON. THE VEHICLE WHICH PROVIDED FOR THIS TASK WERE:

- 1) SIX UN TRUCKS FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF PRISONERS (A SEVENTH WAS KEPT IN RESERVE).
- 2) FOUR ESCORT VEHICLES / UNAMIR (PICK UP) DRIVEN

BY MALICOY SOLDIERS WITH ARMED RPA TROOPS IN THE BACK.

3) TWO ESCORT VEHICLES / R.P.A

4) ONE AMBULANCE FOLLOWED BY NUMEROUS VEHICLES OF THE ICRC, HR, MINISTER OF JUSTICE REPRESENTATIVE, ETC

ONE MILOB TEAM, INCLUDING THE COMMANDER SECTOR 1B MONITORED AND ACCOMPANIED THE CONVOY. THE CONVOY ARRIVED AT NYANZA PRISON AT 1300 HRS AND THE 50 PRISONERS IN THE WORSE MEDICAL CONDITION WERE SEGREGATED AND IMMEDIATELY TAKEN TO THE PRISON CLINIC. THE MORALE OF THE PRISONERS WAS QUITE HEIGHTENED DESPITE THEIR TERRIBLE STATE. ONE MUST UNDERSCORE, HOWEVER THE ABSOLUTE PRIORITY THAT SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THIS KIND OF OPERATION. THE SECTOR COMMANDER'S ESTIMATION IS THAT AT LEAST 3000 MORE PRISONERS WOULD HAVE TO BE SENT TO OTHER PRISONS IN THE COUNTRY TO BRING THE CONDITIONS IN THE GITARAMA PRISON AT A HUMANLY ACCEPTABLE LEVEL. IN A DISCUSSION WITH THE GITARAMA PRISON DIRECTOR, IT WAS LEARNT THAT THE GISENY PENITENTIARY FACILITIES COULD BE THE NEXT DESTINATION. THE DIRECTOR OF PENITENTIARY SERVICES IN RWANDA, MR NZAGONIMANA CASSIEN, EXPLAINED THAT BUTARE WAS ALSO CONSIDERED AS THE NEXT POTENTIAL DESTINATION OF THE GITARAMA PRISON OVERFLOW. IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT UNAMIR HQ ACTIVELY PURSUE THIS FILE WHILE THERE IS SOME MOMENTUM.

ii) ONE MILOB TEAM VISITED MUKINGI COMMUNE (7160) AND FOUND THE GENERAL SITUATION TO BE CALM. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED BYIMANANA HEALTH CENTER. IT IS THE ONLY CLINIC IN MUKINGI COMMUNE AND SERIOUS PATIENTS ARE REPORTED TO KABGAYI HOSPITAL. IT IS RUN BY MSF WHICH SUPPLIES DRUGS. THE CAPACITY IS 18 BEDS, OUT OF WHICH FIVE ARE FOR MATERNITY CASES AND THE REMAINDER FOR GENERAL CASES. AN AVERAGE OF 100 PATIENTS ARE TREATED EVERYDAY. THE MOST COMMON AILMENTS ARE MALARIA, RESPIRATORY PROBLEMS, DIARRHEA AND PNEUMONIA. THE TOTAL STAFF STRENGTH IS 12, OUT OF WHICH SEVEN ARE QUALIFIED MEDICAL ASSISTANTS AND FIVE ARE GENERAL HELPERS. AT PRESENT, NO ELECTRICITY NOR PIPED WATER IS AVAILABLE.

iii) THE CLINIC AUTHORITIES REQUESTED THE FOLLOWING:

- 1) ANTIBIOTICS DRUGS AND ANTIMALARIAL TABLETS.
- 2) WATER PUMP AND GENERATOR.
- 3) ONE AMBULANCE.
- 4) LABORATORY EQUIPMENT.
- 5) MATTRESSES, BLANKETS AND BEDS (THIS SHORTAGE CURRENTLY PREVENTS THEM FROM ADMITTING MORE PATIENTS).

iv) ONE MILOB TEAM VISITED MUGINA COMMUNE (9267) AND FOUND THE GENERAL SITUATION CALM. IT WAS REPORTED THAT CARITAS DISTRIBUTED AGRICULTURAL MATERIAL FOR LOCALS. THE HEALTH CENTRE WAS ALSO VISITED AND IT CONTAINS 60 BEDS AND AN AVERAGE OF 70 TO 100 PATIENTS ARE TREATED EVERYDAY. IT IS RUN BY MEDICUS MUNDI WHICH SUPPLIES DRUGS AND MEDICATION. CHILDREN WERE VACCINATED TODAY AGAINST COMMON DISEASES IN THE REGION. THE AUTHORITIES REQUESTED THE FOLLOWING:

- 1) INFANT FOOD
- 2) POTABLE WATER
- 3) A GENERATOR
- 4) ONE AMBULANCE
- 5) STATIONARY FOR THE CLINIC

v) THE TEAM VISITED NTEKO SECTOR AND REPORTED THAT A MAN CALLED BADJOURI BIRA JEAM WAS KILLED ON 9 JULY 95 BY FOUR RPA SOLDIERS AS HE WAS EXITING THE CHURCH AT 1300 HRS. NO INVESTIGATION WAS CONDUCTED. THE BURIAL TOOK PLACE ON 10 JULY 95. CIVPOL AND HUMAN RIGHTS HAVE BEEN SEIZED OF THE MATTER AND A JOINT PATROL WITH MILOBS WILL BE LAUNCHED.

vi) ON 12 JUL 95 NINE LOCALS WERE ARRESTED IN THE SAME SECTOR BY THE BOURGMESTRE AND TWO RPA SOLDIERS. NO MOTIVE FOR THE ARRESTATION WAS GIVEN, THEIR WHEREABOUTS ARE NOT KNOWN AND THEY HAVE NOT BEEN SEEN SINCE THEN. AGAIN, A JOINT MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS AND CIVPOL WILL BE LAUNCHED.

vii) LOCALS IN THE AREA COMPLAINED ABOUT SHORTAGE OF SEEDS AND SECURITY PROBLEMS TO THE EXTENT THEY ARE AFRAID TO CULTIVATE THEIR FIELDS.

i) RPA TRANSPORT OFFICER CONTACTED US ABOUT THE NEED TO RECOVER THEIR BROKEN DOWN VEHICLE AT RUNDA COMMUNE (9882). HE WAS ADVISED TO VISIT 95 FLSG WITH ALL RELEVANT DETAILS.

B. FRGE. NTRC. MILITIA. NTR

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. MILOBS.

i) THE FIRST MILOB TEAM, JOINED BY CIV POL MEMBER AND HUMAN RIGHTS WENT TO MUGINA COMMUNE (9267) AND MET THE BOURGMESTRE AND VISITED THE COMMUNE CACHOT. THE BOURGMESTRE CONFIRMED THE PREVIOUSLY REPORTED KILLING OF MR BAGIRUBWIRA AT NTEKO SECTOR (9769). HE SAID IT WAS A CASE OF SELF-DEFENCE BY THE SOLDIER. HE REFUSED TO GET FURTHER INVOLVED IN THIS CASE BECAUSE HE SAW IT AS A STRICTLY MILITARY CASE.

ii) ABOUT THE ARRESTEES, THE BOURGMESTRE STATED THAT ONLY ONE PERSON WAS IN THE COMMUNE PRISON. OTHERS HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO KANZENZE COMMUNE CACHOT (KIGALI PREFECTURE) AS THEY WERE FROM THIS COMMUNE. HUMAN RIGHTS ARE FOLLOWING THIS FILE AND WILL FURTHER DETAILS TO THEIR KIGALI COLLEAGUES.

iii) THE TEAM ALSO VISITED THE COMMUNE CACHOT. IT IS DIVIDED INTO THREE BIG ROOMS FOR MALE

PRISONERS. ONE OF THE FORMER OFFICE ROOMS IS USED TO HOLD 11 WOMEN AND THREE INFANTS. ABOUT 40 PEOPLE WERE HELD IN THE FIRST ROOM. THE SECOND ROOM CONTAINED ABOUT 80 PRISONERS. THE TEAM WAS ALSO SHOWN ANOTHER ROOM WHERE 27 COMMON CRIMINALS WERE HELD. ALL ROOMS WERE RATHER CLEAN AND NOT OVERCROWDED. THE TOTAL FIGURES AS THEY WERE GIVEN ARE: 120 PRISONERS SUSPECTED FOR GENOCIDE, 11 FEMALES, INCLUDING THREE PREGNANT ONES, AND 27 COMMON CRIMINALS.

iv) A SECOND MILOB TEAM VISITED TAMBWE COMMUNE (7653) AND VISITED RUHANGO HEALTH CENTRE. IT HAS 25 BEDS AND AN AVERAGE OF 150 PATIENTS ARE TREATED EVERYDAY. THE CLINIC HAS A STAFF STRENGTH OF FOUR QUALIFIED NURSES, FOUR UNQUALIFIED NURSES, TWO LABORATORY TECHNICIANS AND THREE MEDICAL ASSISTANTS. IT IS RUN BY THE ICRC WHICH SUPPLIES CURRENT MEDICATION ONCE A MONTH. AT THE END OF JULY, CARITAS WILL BEGIN SUPPORTING THE CLINIC. THIS CLINIC IS THE ONLY ONE CAPABLE OF CURING TUBERCULOSIS IN THE PREFECTURE BECAUSE NONE OF ITS EQUIPMENT WAS STOLEN DURING THE WAR.

v) THE MILOB TEAM MET THE RPA PLATOON COMMANDER AT TAMBWE COMMUNE (7653). HE WAS POLITE BUT NOT VERY COOPERATIVE IN PROVIDING INFORMATION. HE REPORTED NO MAJOR PROBLEM IN HIS COMMUNE AND THAT LOCALS WERE SUFFERING FROM BANDITRY.

vi) THE TEAM ALSO VISITED MUNINI SECTOR (7856). DISCUSSIONS WITH LOCALS REVEALED THAT THE LEVEL OF THEFTS AND BANDITRY WAS LOW. THE BRIDGE AT 5640 WAS IN BAD CONDITION AND COULD NOT BE CROSSED. THERE IS AN URGENT NEED TO GET THIS BRIDGE FIXED BECAUSE IT IS AN IMPORTANT LINK BETWEEN MUNINI SECTOR AND TAMBWE COMMUNE OFFICE.

vii) A THIRD MILOB TEAM VISITED KAYENZI COMMUNE (8389). THE COMMUNE HEALTH CENTER IS GOVERNMENT OWNED AND HAS 15 STAFF (TWO QUALIFIED NURSES, FOUR AUXILIARIES HEALTH WORKERS AND NINE GENERAL WORKERS WITHOUT UNIFORM). IT IS RUN BY MEDICUS MUNDI WHICH SUPPLIES CURRENT MEDICATION, SALARIES AND PROMISED TO REHABILITATE THE CLINIC AND THE DAMAGED EQUIPMENT. AN AVERAGE OF SIXTY PEOPLE ARE TREATED EVERY DAY AND THE CLINIC HAS 56 BEDS WITHOUT MATTRESSES OR BLANKETS. THE CLINIC DOES NOT HAVE A LABORATORY EVEN THOUGH IT HAS A MICROSCOPE. THERE IS NO CLEAN WATER BUT THE SALVATION ARMY HAD PROMISED TO SUPPLY WATER (NO ACTION TAKEN SO FAR). THE CLINIC AUTHORITIES WOULD LIKE TO REVERT TO SOLAR ENERGY, LIKE THEY WERE ~~DOING~~ DOING BEFORE THE

WAR, BECAUSE ELECTROGAZ IS NOT ABOUT TO PROVIDE ELECTRICITY IN THE NEAR TERM.

viii) THE NUMBER OF PRISONERS IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT HAS INCREASED TO 64, AN INCREASE OF 22 SINCE THE LAST VISIT IN JUNE. IT HAS NOT BEEN DETERMINED YET IF THESE NEW ARRESTS ARE LINKED TO GENOCIDE ACCUSATIONS.

B. MALICOY.

i) THE MALI CONTINGENT COMMANDER TOOK THE NEW SECTOR COMMANDER ON A TOUR OF ALL MALICOY TROOPS IN THE SECTOR. ACCURATE AND COMPLETE BRIEFINGS WERE PROVIDED AT EACH LOCATION, THAT IS TO SAY MASANGO (6254), RUHANGO (7653) AND NTONGWE (9057) WHERE MALI SECTIONS (PLATOONS) ARE DEPLOYED.

ii) AN EMERGENCY TEAM COMPOSED OF A MECHANIC, A MEDICAL ASSISTANT AND ONE MILOB WENT TO AN ACCIDENT SCENE WHERE A SENBATT VEHICLE HAD HIT A CIVILIAN CAR AT RUHANGO COMMUNE (7653). NO INJURY WERE REPORTED AND AN AGREEMENT WAS ARRANGED ON THE SPOT.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. 36 LOCAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED TODAY BY MALI COY IN ITS CLINIC FACILITY.

8. MISCELLANEOUS.

A. THE VISIT TO ALL MALICOY TROOP LOCATIONS BY THE COMMANDER SECTOR 1B UNDERScoreD THE NEED TO HAVE AT LEAST A SYMBOLIC FORMED TROOPS PRESENCE IN THE PREFECTURE. THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE IS A POLITICALLY VERY SIGNIFICANT ONE AND UNAMIR WOULD SEND A WRONG MESSAGE TO BOTH THE POLITICAL AND RPA AUTHORITIES IN THE AREA. FURTHERMORE, IT WOULD BE VERY DIFFICULT FOR MILOBS TO KEEP THEIR CURRENT FACILITIES (PETIT SEMINAIRE) AND ITS COMPOUND WITHOUT THE PRESENCE OF SOME TROOPS. IT IS FULLY REALIZED THAT RESOURCES ARE SCARCE BUT UNAMIR HQ SHOULD CONSIDER HAVING AT LEAST A PLATOON STATIONED IN THE PREFECTURE. A CENTRAL LOCATION AT GITARAMA WOULD OPTIMIZE THE POSITIVE EFFECT THAT THESE TROOPS WOULD HAVE. THE SECTOR COMMANDER REQUESTS THAT THIS MATTER BE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE G3 STAFF.

B. MILOBS ARE EXPERIMENTING SERIOUS COMMUNICATIONS PROBLEMS WITH HANDHELD RADIOS FOLLOWING THE CHANGE OF FREQUENCIES. FOR SOME REASON, THIS DOES NOT SEEM TO AFFECT VEHICLE RADIOS. SOME MORE TRIALS ARE BEING CONDUCTED BUT YOU ARE INFORMED OF THIS IN CASE OTHER SECTORS ARE REPORTING SIMILAR DIFFICULTIES.

A. RPA. 31 RPA BATTALION COMD REQUESTED FOR A TRUCK TO TRANSPORT PIPES FROM ELECTROGAZ IN GITARAMA TO NTONGWE (9057) AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. AN ASSESSMENT OF RESOURCES WILL BE CONDUCTED TO SEE IF WE CAN ACCOMMODATE THIS REQUEST.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. MILOBS.

i) THE SECTOR COMMANDER ATTENDED A CONFERENCE AT THE GITARAMA CULTURAL CENTER ON THE THEME OF RECONCILIATION. THE GITARAMA PREFET ATTENDED THE CONFERENCE WHICH WAS CHAIRED BY HR. PRESENTATIONS WERE GIVEN BY MR ESSAIED (HR), KABGAYI BISHOP SIBOMANA AND MR GASHEGU, PRESIDENT OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION AT THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY. AT THE END OF THE CONFERENCE A FILM WAS PRESENTED ON THE GENOCIDE. IT WAS A GOOD OPPORTUNITY FOR THE SECTOR COMMANDER TO MEET SOME OF THE LOCAL PLAYERS. A FEW QUESTIONS REVOLVED AROUND THE PREVIOUS UNAMIR MANDATE, THAT IS TO SAY THE ONE DURING THE WAR. THE SECTOR COMMANDER DID NOT GET INVOLVED, LEAVING MR ESSAIED THE LATITUDE TO READ SOME EXTRACTS OF PAST MANDATES AND THE CURRENT ONE. MOST INTERVENTIONS WERE VERY POLITICAL IN NATURE AND THE CROWD, ESTIMATED TO 200, SEEMED CRITICAL OF THE SLOW DEMOCRATIZATION PROCESS. IT IS INTERESTING TO NOTE, HOWEVER THAT DURING THE PROJECTION OF THE FILM, WHICH WAS QUITE CRITICAL OF THE PREVIOUS GOVERNMENT, THERE WAS A FAIR AMOUNT OF "HISSING" WHEN EXILED

"GENOCIDAIRES" WERE TRYING TO DENY THEIR PLANNING OF THE GENOCIDE. OVERALL, AN EXPERIENCE POSITIVE BUT WHICH WILL YIELD NO IMMEDIATE RESULTS (THIS IS STILL A STEP TOWARDS RECONCILIATION).

iii) THE FIRST MILOB TEAM VISITED NTONGWE SECTOR (6165) IN MUSHUBATI COMMUNE (6970) AND FOUND THE GENERAL SITUATION TO BE CALM. THE TEAM VISITED THE NYARUSANGE CLINIC IN THIS AREA. IT HAS 54 BEDS, OUT OF WHICH 30 FOR GENERAL CASES, 12 FOR MATERNITY AND 12 FOR INFANTS. AN AVERAGE OF 150 PATIENTS ARE TREATED EVERYDAY. IT IS RUN BY CARITAS WHICH REPLACED MSF. CARITAS SUPPLIES DRUGS AND LABORATORY EQUIPMENT. THE STAFF STRENGTH IS 19, OUT OF WHICH ONLY THREE ARE QUALIFIED. THE AUTHORITIES REQUESTED ONE AMBULANCE.

iv) THE TEAM ALSO VISITED THE GISHWERU CLINIC IN THE SAME AREA. IT HAS 40 BEDS AND AN AVERAGE OF 60 PATIENTS ARE TREATED DAILY. THE STAFF STRENGTH IS SEVEN, ONLY ONE OF WHICH IS QUALIFIED. THE CLINIC IS RUN BY THE "AGENCE DE DEVELOPPEMENT ET DE PROMOTION DU RWANDA" (ADEPR). THE CLINIC AUTHORITY EMPHASIZES THE NEED FOR ASSISTANCE OF WATER SUPPLY, MORE DRUGS AND ELECTRICITY OF ANY SOURCE AS A MATTER OF GREAT PRIORITY.

v) A HUMANITARIAN TEAM VISITED THE GITARAMA OFFICE OF ACIST (AFRICAN COMMUNITIES INITIATIVE SUPPORT TEAMS). AT PRESENT, THIS NGO OPERATES IN THE COMMUNES OF TABA (8883), MUGINA (9267), MUSAMBIRA (8274), NYAMABUYE (7570), TAMBWE (7653) AND NTONGWE (9057), SUPPORTING SOCIAL AND BUSINESS INITIATIVES OF INDIVIDUALS AND GROUPS. PRACTICALLY, THE ACIST OFFERS HUMANITARIAN AID IN AGRICULTURAL SPHERE. COOPERATION BETWEEN MILOBS AND ACIST WAS DISCUSSED TO IMPROVE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITY.

vi) A SECOND MILOB TEAM, CONCENTRATING ON HUMANITARIAN MATTERS, VISITED THE GITARAMA WATER PUMPING STATION IN GIHUMA (7167) AND FOUND IT TO BE IN QUITE SATISFACTORY CONDITION. HOWEVER, THE GENERATOR IS NOT OPERATIONAL AT THE MOMENT, SO NORMAL WORK OF THE STATION DEPENDS COMPLETELY ON EXTERNAL ELECTRICITY SUPPLY. A POWER OUTAGE ON 17 JULY RESULTED IN AN ABSENCE OF WATER SUPPLY IN THE WHOLE OF GITARAMA TODAY. THE MANAGER APPROACHED UNAMIR TO SUPPLY NEW BATTERIES AND A 60 L BARREL OF LUBRICATING OIL FOR THE GENERATOR AS WELL AS 600 L OF FUEL AS A RESERVE. THE CHEMICALS FOR WATER PURIFICATION ARE ABOUT TO BE EXHAUSTED. THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES AT THE STATION IS 27. THEY ARE PAID BY ELECTROGAZ (AVERAGE MONTHLY SALARY IS APPROXIMATELY 11 000 FRW).

vii) A THIRD MILOB TEAM VISITED THE MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE (8274) AND MET A PRIEST (FATHER VERDON) WHO REPORTED THAT THE FOLLOWING:

1) ON 7 JUL 95, AROUND 2100 HRS, ONE RPA SOLDIER, CALLED "VENUS", KILLED ONE PERSON (NIONSINGA VENUS, AGED 34) AND WOUNDED TWO OTHERS (DAYANGA ALEXIS AND KAZIGABA). THE SOLDIER IS CLAIMING A FIRING ACCIDENT. THE SOLDIER, ACCORDING TO THE PRIEST, WAS ARRESTED AND TRANSFERRED TO GITARAMA PRISON, BUT THIS INFORMATION IS NOT YET CONFIRMED;

2) ON 14 JUL 95, FIVE PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS FOLLOWING FALSE ACCUSATIONS. THEY WERE SUBSEQUENTLY FREED ON 15 JUL 95 AFTER THE BOURGMESTRE'S INTERVENTION; AND

3) ON 12 JUL 95, AT 1000 HRS, THE SECONDARY SCHOOL DIRECTOR, MR MUNYANKWAYA PIERRE, WAS ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS IN HIS OFFICE. HE WAS SUSPECTED OF BOTH GENOCIDE AND PROVIDING TRANSPORT TO INTERHAMWE DURING THE WAR. THE PRIEST IS CONVINCED THAT THIS ARRESTATION WAS MOTIVATED BY THE FACT THAT THE DIRECTOR OWNS A HOUSE IN KIGALI CURRENTLY OCCUPIED BY RPA SOLDIERS WHO WOULD FINANCIALLY BENEFIT FROM HIS ARREST.

B. MALICOY. MALI COY IS PREPARING TO MOVE FROM PRESENT LOCATION TO NEW POSITION.

HE VISITED RUNDA (9882), MUSAMBIRA (8274) AND TABA (8883) COMMUNES AND MET THE BURGOMASTERS WHO BRIEFED HIM ABOUT THE PRESENT SITUATION IN THEIR COMMUNES. SECTOR COMMANDER ASKED THEM ABOUT PRIORITIES AND URGENT NEEDS IN ORDER TO IMPROVE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE. ACCORDING TO THE BURGOMASTERS THE FIRST PRIORITY NEEDS ARE REHABILITATION AND REBUILDING DAMAGED HOUSES FOLLOWED BY DRINKING WATER, ELECTRICITY AND SEEDS FOR RETURNEES FROM NEIGHBORING COUNTRIES.

ii) THE FIRST MILOB TEAM VISITED BULINGA COMMUNE (6679) AND FOUND THE GENERAL SITUATION TO BE CALM. THE TEAM DISCUSSED SECURITY ISSUES WITH THE RPA PLATOON CDR WHO REPORTED THAT THERE WERE NO CURRENT ARRESTS TAKING PLACE DURING THE LAST PERIOD.

iii) THE TEAM VISITED BULINGA SECTOR (6476) AND REPORTED THE FOLLOWING: FOOD WAS INSUFFICIENT, CARITAS CONTINUE TO FEED THE POOREST FAMILIES ONCE A MONTH. ELECTRICITY IS NOT AVAILABLE IN THIS SECTOR WHICH HAS NOT A CLINIC. LOCALS COMPLAINED ABOUT THEFTS AND BANDITRY ACTS.

iv) THE TEAM ALSO VISITED NYABITARE (6276) AND  
CONTACTED WITH SOME LOCALS WHO REQUESTED FOR BUILDING  
MATERIALS AND SEEDS. SOME WOMEN SPOKE TO AND  
IDENTIFIED THEMSELVES AS HAVING THEIR HUSBANDS IN  
PRISON BECAUSE THEY CAN NOT PAY BACK CATTLE WHICH THEY  
ATE DURING THE WAR.

v) THE SECOND MILOB TEAM VISITED KABGAYI NURSERY  
SCHOOL (7368). IT WAS FOUND IN 1949 AND HAS AT PRESENT  
125 STUDENTS INCLUDING 67 ORPHANS. THE STAFF STRENGTH  
IS 12 OUT OF WHICH FOUR ARE OFFICIAL STAFF AND EIGHT  
PERMANENT TEACHERS. THE SCHOOL HAS ALSO 14 NON-  
PERMANENT TEACHERS FROM KABGAYI HOSPITAL (FOUR DOCTORS  
AND TEN NURSES). THE AUTHORITIES REQUESTED FOR THE  
FOLLOWING:

A. GITARAMA TEAM.

i) ONE MILOB TEAM VISITED RUNDA COMMUNE (9882) AND FOUND THE GENERAL SITUATION TO BE CALM. THE TEAM MENTIONED THAT THE "AGENCE RWANDAISE DE DEVELOPPEMENT ET DE COOPERATION" (ARDEC) IS DISTRIBUTING FOOD FOR THE WORKERS WHICH HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED BY THE AGENCY FOR RECONSTRUCTION OF HOUSES DAMAGED DURING THE WAR.

ii) THE TEAM ALSO VISITED KIGESE (9677) AND KINYANBI (9177) SECTORS. THE SITUATION WAS CALM. LOCALS COMPLAINED ABOUT FOOD SHORTAGE IN BOTH SECTORS, THE CURRENT HARVEST BEING QUITE MEAGRE AND THE LAST FOOD DISTRIBUTION HAVING BEEN CARRIED LAST

FEB 95. THERE WAS NO ELECTRICITY IN EITHER SECTOR AND RIVER WATER IS USED AS DRINKING WATER.

iii) A VISIT TO THE CLINIC AT KIGESE SECTOR (9677) REVEALED THAT THE CAPACITY IS 40 BEDS AND AN AVERAGE OF 40 TO 50 PATIENTS ARE TREATED EVERY DAY. THIS CLINIC IS RUN BY "MEDICUS MUNDI" AND NO ELECTRICITY NOR PIPED WATER IS AVAILABLE. THE TOTAL STAFF STRENGTH IS THREE, INCLUDING ONE MEDICAL ASSISTANT AND TWO TRAINED STAFF.

ELECTRICITY WAS AVAILABLE THROUGH A LOCAL GENERATOR AND PIPED WATER WAS AVAILABLE. THE STAFF DID NOT COMPLAIN REGARDING ANY DEFICIENCY IN THE HEALTH CENTER.

ii) THE SAME MILOB TEAM WENT TO TABA COMMUNE (8883) ON DOMINATION PATROL. THE TEAM REPORTED THE SITUATION CALM.

iii) THE SEC CDR AND THE HUMANITARIAN TEAM VISITED NYANZA PRISON IN KIGOMA COMMUNE (7649) WHERE THEY FOUND ALL PREMISES TO BE READY FOR ACCOMMODATION OF 400 PRISONERS FROM GITARAMA PRISON NEXT WEEK. 


