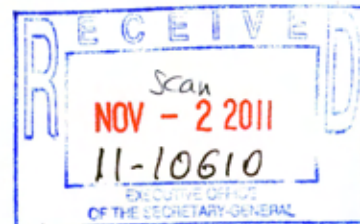

Your Excellency,

I am writing on behalf of the churches of the Crosslink Network of Australia to express my grave concern at the current plight of the more than 3,000 unarmed and vulnerable people currently living in Camp Ashraf, in Iraq.

Even though massive efforts have been made to secure their protection so that a plan can be put in place for their safe withdrawal from Iraq to countries where their immediate needs can be met and a long term decision be made for their future, the Iraqi government continues to harass them, mistreat them and threaten them.


It is our observation that much of the urging for this is coming from Iran and we deplore so much of what the Iranian regime has done to deny people from their own nation basic human rights, let alone those who were living under the protection of the Coalition Occupation Forces since 2003.

We urge the United Nations through the UNAMI to pressure Iraq to extend the deadline for residents of Camp New (formerly Ashraf) and immediately cease their intimidating tactics. We believe there are more than enough reasons to fear that this situation will give way to a third massacre and more innocent people will be killed, wounded and denied the most basic of human rights.

This situation is avoidable. It is clearly within the powers of the US, the UN and the governments of nations around the world to prevent such an atrocity.

We ask you to act before it is too late.
