FURTHER TO SKOLD'S FAX 077 TO YOU DATED 6 OCTOBER, PLEASE FIND ATTACHED COPY OF AN INTERNAL MEMO FROM THE UNOMUR MEDICAL DOCTOR TO THE CMO ALERTING HIM TO THE PROBABLE CONSEQUENCES OF INADEQUATE MEDICAL FACILITIES IN KABALE. FOR EASY REFERENCE I AM ALSO ATTACHING A COPY OF THE FAX REFERRED TO ABOVE.
2. IN THE CMO'S DISCUSSIONS WITH ME, HE HAS STRESSED HIS CONCERN AT THE MISSIONS CURRENT INABILITY TO PROVIDE BASIC MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO ANY OF THE MILITARY OBSERVERS OR CIVILIAN STAFF SHOULD ANY ONE OF US BE INVOLVED IN A SERIOUS ACCIDENT OR SUDDENLY FALLS SICK. HE HAS URGED ME TO BRING TO YOUR IMMEDIATE ATTENTION THE NECESSITY OF URGENTLY PROCURING AN AMBULANCE AND MEDICAL SUPPLIES FOR UNOMUR.

SUBJECT: Medical Report on Incident of 24 October 1993

On October 24, 1993, at 0400 h, I was called to assist a tourist lady in a camp near the UNOMUR HQ. When I arrived there, I found her with a heart failure. I did not have any conditions to assist her, so it was necessary to transport the victim to Kabale Hospital, where she died. This hospital, like us, do not have the necessary means for attendance of critical cases.

This incident show us how urgent we need the means for assistance of similar cases with UNOMUR staff.

Because of this incident, I request your assistance in order to accelerate the acquisition process of medicines, medical materials, and ambulance already previously requested from the Chief Administrative Officer.





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

UN patrols Rwanda border

THE United Nations Observer Mission Uganda-Rwanda (UNOMOR) team based in Kabale has begun patrols along the common border in a bid to ensure that there are no military personnel, vehicles or weapons in transit across the common border.

Deployment of the 98 military and civilian personnel followed a UN June 24, Security Council Resolution 846 after persistent allegations by the Kigali government that the rebel Rwanda Patriotic Front (RPF) attacked Rwanda from Uganda.

The Chief Military Observer of UNOMOR Brig. Gen. Romeo A. Dallaire yesterday told the press that his contingent comprises 81 soldiers, 11 civilians and several local supporting staff. The UN group works with Maj. Zakyee of the National Resistance Army as a liaison officer.

Canadian-born Brig. Gen. Dallaire, 47, arrived here on October 10, to take up his post in Kabale. He is assisted by Col. Ben Matwaza from Zimbabwe as his deputy while the civilian team is co-ordinated by Dr Abdul Hamid Kabia from Sierra Leone as political advisor.

At a press conference attended by the two officials, Brig. Gen. Dallaire flanked by the UNDP Resident Representative Mr Telda Teshome, was optimistic that his mission would succeed.

Avoiding all questions regarding UN peace keeping operations outside Uganda Brig. Gen. Dallaire said ground reports from his team who arrived in Kabale mid last month, indicate that "the situation is very positive and there is good will between the parties involved." He commended Uganda and Tanzania for what he called positive steps towards restoring peace in Rwanda.

His unarmed team which he said is purely for peace keeping has discussed with the NRA authorities to ensure safe patrol. The UNOMOR contingent, he added, works with the NRA Second division.

The UNOMOR chief said his team was to follow the procedure similar to that of Western Sahara. He did not elaborate. Checkpoints, he explained, will be established along the common border. In addition to foot and vehicle patrols, the force will soon

deploy helicopters to monitor movement from above. The group, according to Brig. Gen. Dallaire, will refurbish the government buildings along the common border which were destroyed by cross-fire during the Rwanda war.

The initial operation scheduled for six months, is estimated to cost between 5m-6m US dollars. Brig. Gen. Dallaire said he had already received 35 percent of the equipment required. He said the team had received vehicles formerly used in Angola and that more were expected from Cambodia. The officers said the mandate of UNOMOR may be extended from the initial six months to a period covering completion of the demobilisation process in Rwanda.

UNOMOR comprises troops from Zimbabwe, Senegal, the Netherlands, Hungary, Bangladesh, Brazil, Botswana, Canada and Sierra Leone.



Somalia: Officials criticise UN's search for Aideed

MOGADISHU, Thursday
Heavy-handed military tactics and political ineptitude have compromised the United Nations operation in Somalia to a point where civilian staff fear that it is already too late to rescue it.

And UN military officials privately say that UN special representative Jonathan Howe's blind insistence on arresting warlord Mohamed Farah Aideed rather than seeking a political solution through negotiation makes their job almost impossible.

"I wonder whether we've passed the point of no return," said a senior UN civilian official long familiar with Somalia.

He said the world body had "lost the moral high ground" with retaliatory attacks supposed to undermine warlord Mohamed Farah Aideed that have killed hundreds of Somalis including hospital patients, young children and women.

"This is what happens when the world's most spineless organisation takes a stand," the official said. "Instead of rebuilding Somalia we've entered the war as the 16th clan faction."

Private relief officials say the UN's clumsy political initiatives aimed at forming district councils have often sparked clan fighting.

In Qoroley, about 150 kilometres southwest of Mogadishu, relief workers said 23 people were killed and up to 40 wounded in the aftermath of a September 3 visit by Leonard Kapunga, the UN political director for Somalia, and three other officials.

People started stoning them as soon as they alighted from their

helicopter, which took off, leaving them to be rescued by local officials who drove them to the office of the Save the Children (USA) Aid Agency.

Two men were killed when a mob attacked the compound. The violence was sparked by arguments over how many seats on the council should go to each clan, local relief workers said.

Kapunga and his aides were eventually driven away through a back gate. Their helicopter landed and flew them to safety.

Three days later the clans decided to settle the score for the two dead men. Another 23 people were killed and as many as 40 wounded in a savage five-hour battle.

And Qoroley residents say it is not over yet.

"We've all got blood on our hands from Qoroley," said a UN civilian official who requested anonymity.

"If we can't get back to our original goal of helping this country recover from famine and civil war, we should just pack our bags," he said.

Meanwhile the mood among many of the 18,000 UN soldiers in Mogadishu is one of despondency and anger. Fifty-three peacekeepers have been killed since May.

"Arresting Aideed is a police job," complained a US soldier. "The problem isn't that we can't catch him. It's that the civilian side isn't doing its job. The only way out of this mess is to look for a political solution. Even if we get him it might not solve things." (AFP)

UNMOUR boss here next week

THE Chief Military Observer of the United Nations Observer Mission Uganda-Rwanda (UNMOUR) Brig Gen Romeo Dallaire will arrive here next week to join a contingent of 72 stationed at the common border.

Dallaire had last week led a reconnaissance team to Kigali after the RPF-Rwanda peace accord.

Deployment of the observer team was approved by the UN

Security Council on June 24.

It was agreed that a monitoring team be stationed at the Uganda-Rwanda border to study movements and there after allegations by the Kigali government that the rebels constantly attacked Rwanda territory from Uganda.

The group which has been in Kabale for three weeks now is currently under the command of the Deputy Chief Military Observer, Col Ben Matiwaza from Zimbabwe. His team includes soldiers from Brazil, Bangladesh, Botswana, Canada, Hungary, the Netherlands and Zimbabwe.

Bangladesh has the biggest number of 18 men who arrived last week. During the June meeting, the UN agreed that 81 soldiers be sent to the Uganda-Rwanda border. According to the Chief Political Advisor Abdul Kadia (Sierra Leone), others from Slovak and Senegal will arrive soon.

The six months operation subject to renewal, will cost the UN about US dollars 8.5 million. Mr Kadia contacted yesterday at White Horse Inn, Kabale, said that the military team works with 24 civilians. These include 17 foreigners and seven Ugandans. Abdul is part of the civilian component.

Kadia said the military team had deployed people at five observation posts in Kabale and Mbarara. "The team has to monitor the border and verify reports about transport especially transit of ammunition," he said. Kadia refused to give details of any other findings so far. "Our duty once done, we have to report to the Secretary General," he explained.
