

(2) THE FC HELD A CONFERENCE WITH THE  
UNITS AND CONTINGENT COMMANDERS TO DISCUSS PROBLEM  
AREAS FOR THE BENEFIT OF GENERAL BARIL WHO WAS PRESENT  
AT THE MEETING. THE PURPOSE OF THE MEETING WAS TO

(2) PROVIDED SECURITY FOR THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY GENERAL AND HIS DELEGATION ON THEIR VISIT TO KIBEHO DP CAMP. ALSO PROVIDED SECURITY FOR ICRC AT MUNINI DP CAMP DURING FOOD DISTRIBUTION AND ESCORTED THE GOVERNMENT PROSECUTOR DURING HIS VISIT IN THE AREA.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 223 LOCALS IN AOR.

F. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) TRANSPORTED 8 REFUGEES FROM RUSUZI-1 TO TRANSIT CAMP NYAGATARE WITH OWN VEHs.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 26 LOCALS AT GIHUNDWE HOSP.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) A LOCAL FROM TAMIRA SECTOR GR 3126 REPORTED TO TUNBATT TPS IN KABALI THAT RPA KILLED HER BROTHER ON 12 FEB 95 IN BUTAKA GR 3129 FOR NO APPARENT REASON. MILOBS AND HRFO WERE INFORMED.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 161 LOCAL IN AOR.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) RECEIVED THE VISIT OF MAJ GEN BARIL, MILITARY ADVISOR TO UNHQ AT THE INDBATT HQ.

(3) 198 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP. 173 IDPs WERE EVAC BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, BUTARE, KENZENZE, GASHORA, NYAMIRAMBO AND KIGALI CITY.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 541 LOCALS AT BN HQ KIGALI.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY STABLE DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) POLITICAL. NTR.

(2) BORDERS. FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO TRAFFIC.

(A) GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

(B) RUSUMO BORDER POST (RWANDA/TANZANIA).

- (C) RUSIZI BORDER POST IN SECT 4C.
- (D) GISENYI BORDER POST (EXCEPT UNAMIR PERS).
- (3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA.

(A) MILOB PATROLS TO THE GATUNA BORDER POST (GR 0142), REPORTED THAT A CONVOY OF UN VEHICLES WAS DELAYED AT THE BORDER FOR THREE DAYS BECAUSE THE CONTRACTOR ACCOMPANYING THE DRIVERS COULD NOT PAY THE US\$20 VISA FEE FOR 19 CARS TO ENTER RWANDA. THE CONVOY LEADER HAS THEREFORE RETURNED TO UGANDA TO GET THE MONEY.

(B) MILOB PATROLS TO NYABISHAMBI (GR 0928) WERE INFORMED BY AN RPA OFFICER THAT A COW DETONATED A MINE IN THE AREA. NICOY INFORMED.

(C) ADRA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE INITIATED A SEED DISTRIBUTION PROGRAMME AT NGARAMA. THERE WAS ALSO REGULAR FOOD DISTRIBUTION IN SHONGA. WFP HAS HALTED ITS 'FOOD FOR WORK PROGRAMME AND WAS REPORTED TO BE DISTRIBUTING FOOD TO GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.

(E) THE LOCAL HEALTH CENTRE IN MUKONDO (GR 9328) WAS REPORTED TO HAVE INTRODUCED HOSPITAL FEES OF 1,300 RFR PER IN-PATIENT. HOSPITAL AUTHORITIES REPORTED THAT MOST LOCALS WERE TOO POOR TO PAY THE FEES. GAOL IRELAND, WHICH WAS ASSISTING THE LOCALS WAS COMPELLED TO TERMINATE THEIR SERVICES DUE TO FINANCIAL CONSTRAINTS.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOB PATROLS REPORTED THAT A NEW DP CAMP HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED IN NYAKARAMBI (GR 7449) IN THE RUSUMO COMMUNE. THE DP CAMP CAN HOLD UP TO A MAXIMUM OF 500 PERSONS.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO MASANGO (GR 6254) INVESTIGATED REPORTS OF MEASLES EPIDEMIC IN THE COMMUNE. THE MEDICAL OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE INFORMED MILOBS THAT THERE WAS NO SUCH EPIDEMIC. HE HOWEVER ADMITTED THAT 200 CASES HAD BEEN TREATED IN THE LAST 2 MONTHS.



THE NGO MEMISA HAD EMBARKED ON A VACCINATION EXERCISE.

(C) MILOB PATROL TO KIGOMA COMMUNE (GR 7750) WAS INFORMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT A LARGE NUMBER HOUSES IN THE COMMUNE WERE UNOCCUPIED. HE SAID THERE WAS NO NEED FOR EXTRA CONSTRUCTION TO ACCOMMODATE RETURNEES. HE ALSO EXPRESSED HIS SATISFACTION WITH THE RECENT CURRENCY EXCHANGE EXERCISE. PATROLS TO NTYAZO COMMUNE ALSO RECEIVED A SIMILAR REPORT ON THE CURRENCY EXCHANGE. THE POPULATION IN BOTH COMMUNES WAS STILL BELOW THE PRE-WAR FIGURES.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PROVIDED ESCORTS FOR A UN DELEGATION ON VISIT TO NYAMIGINA GR 4624, RURAMBA GR 4816, KIBEHO GR 5007 AND NDAGO GR 5102 DP CAMPS. THE DELEGATION WAS BRIEFED ON THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE SECTOR BY A ZAMBATT OFFICER.

(C) ROUTE RECCE WAS CONDUCTED BY MILOBS FROM RUNYOMBI TO GIKONGORO. THE ROAD LINKING THE TWO TOWNS WAS REPORTED SLIPPERY THOUGH MOTORABLE.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE BOURGEMESTRE OF MABANZA COMMUNE INFORMED MILOBS THAT THERE WERE 600-800 PERSONS IN GISENYI AWAITING EVAC TO THE COMMUNE. THE DPs WERE REPORTEDLY LOC AT THE RUGERIRO VILLAGE IN GISENYI.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) SITUATION IN ALL AREAS PATROLLED WAS NORMAL EXCEPT FOR RECENT ARRESTS OF LOCALS BY RPA. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE ARRESTS ARE OF PERSONS THOUGHT TO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE IN THE RECENT CIVIL WAR. THERE WERE ALSO REPORTS ABOUT RPA MAKING ENQUIRIES ABOUT CERTAIN INHABITANTS IN CYANGUGU.

(B) MILOB PATROL TO KAGANO COMMUNE REPORTED THAT THE LOCAL POPULATION IN THE AREA WAS LIVING IN FEAR DUE TO RECENT RPA ARRESTS OF LOCALS IN NYAMASHEKE (GR 9841).

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) SRSG AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR VISITED THE

SECTOR DURING THE PERIOD. THEY WERE RECEIVED BY MILOBS, UNHCR OFFICIALS AND THE POLITICAL INFORMATION OFFICER. THE DELEGATION WAS ESCORTED TO GOMA.

(B) MILOBS PROVIDED ESCORTS FOR 2 CONVOYS OF 308 REFUGEES TO NGORONGERO (GR 5995).

(C) MILOBS MONITORED THE HANDING OVER OF A LOCAL WHO SOUGHT UN PROTECTION TO THE OFFICE OF THE PROSECUTOR AT RUHengeri. UNAMIR MPS, HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS AND ICRC OFFICIALS WERE PRESENT AT THE HANDING OVER. THE CASE HAS ALSO BEEN INVESTIGATED BY A JOINT MILOBS/HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM.

(D) MILOBS INVESTIGATED RUMOUR OF A KILLER DISEASE, CALLED 'GAPFURA' ALLEGED TO BE CLAIMING ABOUT 8 LIVES PER WEEK IN THE NYAMUTERA COMMUNE (GR 5819). THE RUMOUR PROVED TO BE FALSE.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOB PATROLLED TO GIKOMERO AND RUBUNGO COMMUNES REPORTED THAT THERE WAS A CATTLE VACCINATION EXERCISE IN THE RUBUNGO COMMUNE. TEACHERS IN THE SECTOR WERE BEING PROVIDED FOOD BY UNICEF. UNICEF WAS ALSO REPORTED TO BE PAYING THE TEACHERS 10,000 RFR PER MONTH. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE TWO AREAS WAS NORMAL.

L. FORCE ENGR COY

(1) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

(2) CONTINUED WORK ON CONSTRUCTION OF PIER AT BUSORO BRIDGE.

M. AUSMED.

(1) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE MEDICAL SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MEDICAL SUPPORT TO CITIZENS OF RWANDA.

(2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 38 PATIENTS AND 7 DENTAL PATIENTS. CHK IS CURRENTLY HOLDING 8 IN-PATIENTS.

(3) MED SCREENING IN SPT OF OP RETOUR AT KIBEHO AND NDAGO CAMPS TREATED 2 UN PERS AND 53 CIVILIANS.

(4) ICRC HAS STATED THAT IT WILL STOP FEEDING IN THE SOUTHERN CAMPS IF THE RWANDAN GOVT AGREED TO DO SO IN IT'S PLACE. IT APPEARS TO BE AN INSINCERE GESTURE AS IT IS UNLIKELY THE RWANDAN GOVT WILL AGREE TO SUCH A

PROPOSAL.

N. AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. 22 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

O. UN MP COY.

(1) UN MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDAN CIVILIAN AT UN MP COY IN KIGALI.

(2) UN MP COY INVESTIGATING THE FOLLOWING ACCIDENTS:

(A) ACCIDENT INVOLVING UNAMIR 423 AND UNAMIR 1282 AT UNAMIR HQ, AMAHORO HOTEL, KIGALI.

(B) ACCIDENT INVOLVING BROWN AND ROOT VEH WHICH RAN OVER A PEDESTRIAN IN UGANDA ON THE 12 FEB 95.

P. 95 FLSG.

(1) TWO RECOVERY MISSIONS WERE UNDERTAKEN TO SECTOR 4A AND 4C.

(2) INSPECTIONS WERE CARRIED OUT ON INCOMING VEHS IN THE MISSION AREA.

6. CIVPOL.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN GITARAMA VISITED THE BOURGMESTER OF RUNDA COMMUNE WHO ASSURED THEM OF HIS PREPAREDNESS TO COOPERATE WITH THE TEAM. HE HINTED THAT THE COMMUNE HAS A NUMBER OF MASS GRAVES LOCATED AT CYABALIZA, KINYAMBI, RUGALIKA AND RAYENKI AND THAT ABOUT 8,000 PEOPLE WERE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED IN THE AREA DURING THE PERIOD OF THE WAR. THE BOURGMESTER FURTHER DISCLOSED THAT RPA IN THE COMMUNE KEEP SUSPECTS IN A TEMPORARILY PRISON IN RUNDA BEFORE BEING TRANSFERRED TO GITARAMA PRISONS. HUMAN RIGHTS HAS BEEN INFORMED.

C. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGERI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IS IN PROGRESS.

7. HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE CELL.

A. OP RETOUR. A TOTAL OF 347 IDPs WERE EVACUATED FROM KIBEHO AND NDAGO ON 13 FEB 95 AS PER FOLLOWING DETAILS.

(1) KIBEHO - 328.

(2) NDAGO - 19.

TOTAL NUMBER OF DPs MOVED SINCE THE BEGINNING OF OP RETOUR

IS 35,753.

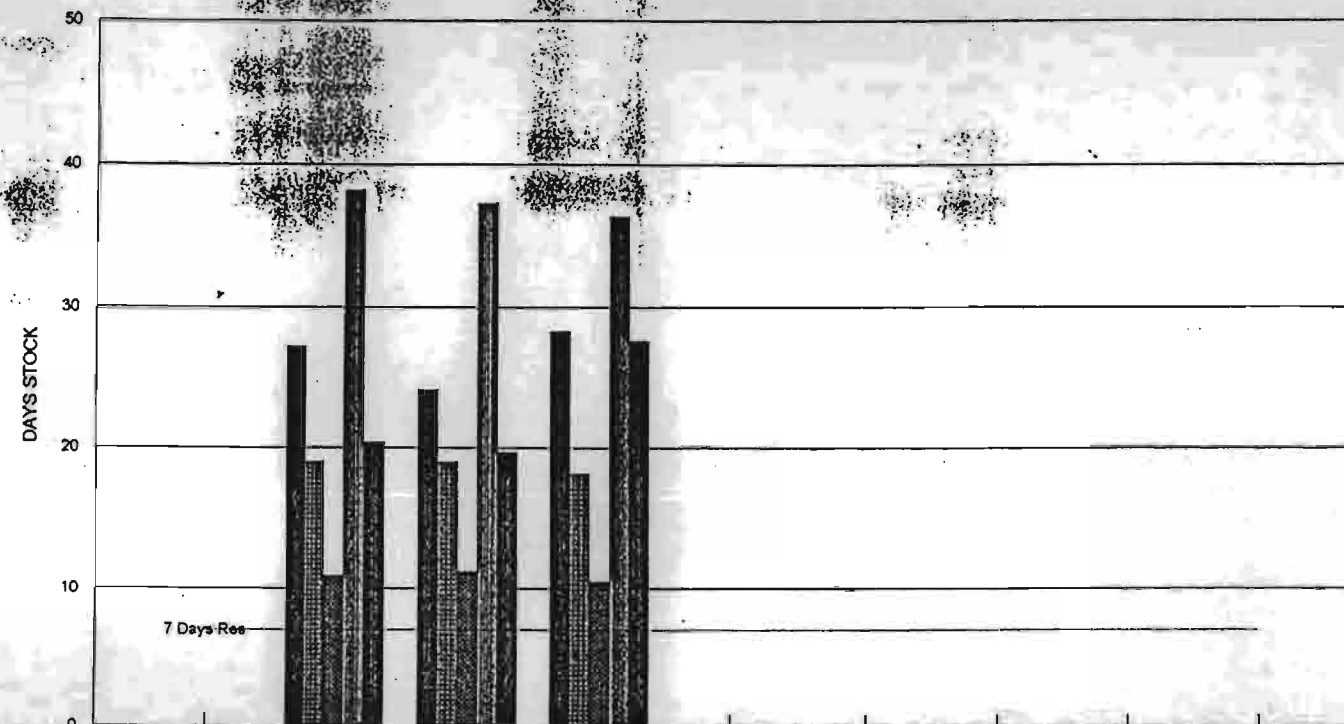



MEETING WITH MR. ARUSSA TO DISCUSS RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN UNHCR AND UNAMIR. HE ALSO GRANTED AUDIENCE TO MR. C LATULIPPE THE CANADIAN REPRESENTATIVE TO RWANDA.

(C) ON 09 FEB 95, THE FC HELD A MEETING WITH RANDOLPH KENT OF UNREO AND WITH MR. HASEGANA OF UNDP ORGANISATION. IN BOTH MEETINGS IDEAS WERE EXCHANGED ON THE UPCOMING MEETING IN BUJUMBURA. HE LATER ATTENDED A PRIVATE LUNCHEON WITH THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA AND DISCUSSED THE FUTURE OF UNAMIR.

THE KIGALI DEPUTY PROSECUTOR HOWEVER EXPLAINED THAT SOME OF THE INMATES HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO OTHER PRISONS DUE TO OVER CROWDING.

A. OP RETOUR. A 3241 IDPs WERE EVAC DURING THE WEEK FROM SECTOR 4A, BRINGING THE NUMBER OF DPs MOVED SINCE THE BEGINNING OF OP RETOUR TO 35,406.

B. MEDICAL. FORCE MEDICAL STAFF TREATED APPROX 4,096 LOCALS THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY PROVIDING PRIMARY HEALTH CARE.

- (4) FOODSTUFFS FOR WFP FROM BUTARE TO VARIOUS COMMUNES IN SECTOR 3.

6. CIVIL AFFAIRS. THE PREFECT OF CYANGUGU HELD A SY CONFERENCE IN NYAKABUYE IN SECTOR 4C.

9. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. A TOTAL NUMBER OF 07 ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHICLES WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD.

10. CONCLUSION THE GENERAL SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED UNDER CONTROL AND THE HUMANITARIAN SITUATION CONTINUED TO IMPROVE. MOST IDPs IN SECTOR 4A WERE RELUCTANT TO GO BACK HOME, PROBABLY DUE TO INCREASED ARRESTS OF ALLEGED PERPETRATORS OF THE GENOCIDE IN THE HOME COMMUNES BY RPA, AND CONTINUED FOOD DISTRIBUTION BY ICRC IN KIBEHO AND NDAGO CAMPS WHICH ARE CURRENTLY ESTIMATED TO BE HOLDING OVER 120,000 DPs.

B. TAC HQ BUTARE REPORTED THAT A 20 MEMBER TEAM FROM RWANDA NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF DEPUTIES PAID A VISIT TO KIBEHO CAMP. THEIR AIM WAS TO CONVINCE DPs THAT THERE WAS ENOUGH SECURITY GRANTED IN COMMUNES FOR THEM TO RETURN HOME. DPs HOWEVER EXPRESSED THEIR CONTINUED FEAR OF UNLAWFUL PERSECUTION AND WERE DETERMINED TO STAY IN THE CAMPS FOR AS LONG AS THE SECURITY SITUATION REMAINED UNCERTAIN.

C. A MASS GRAVE WAS DISCOVERED AT RIGANSIA GR 4313 CONTAINING 60 BODIES. IT IS BELIEVED THE DEAD WERE ALL HUTUS AND WERE KILLED BY RPA IN AUGUST 1994.

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED A BREAKFAST MEETING WITH H.E. AMBASSADOR KOUYATE, THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY GENERAL FOR POLITICAL AFFAIRS, AND HIS POLITICAL AFFAIRS OFFICER.

B. HE THEN HELD CONSULTATIONS WITH GENERAL BARIL DURING WHICH THEY EXCHANGED VIEWS AND DISCUSSED THE ROLE AND REQUIREMENTS OF THE VARIOUS CONTINGENTS.

C. HE HELD A MEETING WITH MR. CLARENCE, THE CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION, DURING WHICH THE PROGRESS OF THE OPERATION, AMONG OTHER MATTERS, WAS DISCUSSED.

D. THE SRSG CONCLUDED WITH THE VISIT OF MR. GAMBA OF THE WORLD BANK TO DISCUSS THE MODALITIES FOR CHANNELING INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA.

THE BANDITS HAD INFILTRATED THROUGH THE NATIONAL PARK TO STEAL COWS BUT LOCALS ALERTED RPA SOLDIERS WHO INTERCEPTED THEM 03 BANDITS WERE KILLED AND ONE CAPTURED, ONE LOCAL WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED. DETAILS FOLLOW.

(3) IN SECTOR 4C ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAVE ARRESTED 25 LOCALS IN THE AREA OF NYAMASHEKE (9841). REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS NOT KNOWN. INVESTIGATION BY ETHIOBATT IN PROGRESS.

B. FRGF. NTR.

C. MILITIA. MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT BANDITS BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM KIREMBA REFUGEES CAMP IN BURUNDI MATCHETED TO DEATH AN OLD MAN ON NIGHT OF 13 FEB 95 IN KIGEMBE GR 9704. ONE LOCAL WOMAN AND THREE GIRLS WERE ALSO MATCHETED BUT SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES. NAMES OF SUSPECTS ARE KNOWN. THE MOTIVE FOR THE ATTACK IS NOT KNOWN. MALAWICOY PTLs AND MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

IN THE EVENING HE ATTENDED A RECEPTION FOR THE CANADIAN SECRETARY OF STATE AFRICAN AFFAIRS, THE HONOURABLE CHRISTINE STEWART.

(C) MILOBS MONITORED THE HANDING OVER OF AN FRGF SOLDIER TO THE PROSECUTOR OF BARRE. THE SOLDIER HAD ESCAPED FROM RPA CUSTODY AND SOUGHT PROTECTION WITH GHANBATT TROOPS. IT WAS LATER REPORTED THAT THE FRGF SOLDIER WAS SENT TO KIBUNGO PRISON AFTER HE WAS HANDED OVER.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) SECTOR COMD HELD A MEETING WITH RPA BDE COMD (GITARAMA) TO DISCUSS MARKING AND SAFETY OF ROAD BLOCKS AT NIGHT, COOPERATION BETWEEN RPA AND UNAMIR, ILLEGAL ARRESTS OF LOCALS BY RPA AND JOINT PATROLS. RPA BDE COMD APPEARED COOPERATIVE AND ENTHUSIASTIC ABOUT ALL POINTS DISCUSSED.

(C) MILOBS PATROLS TO MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE GR 8374 WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT THE COMMUNE REQUIRED ASSISTANCE TO REPAIR 2,615 HOUSES DESTROYED DURING THE WAR. HE ALSO COMPLAINED THAT VERY FEW DPs HAD RETURNED TO HIS COMMUNE. SEEDS AND HOES WERE ALSO REPORTED TO BE IN SHORT SUPPLY.

(D) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN RUTOBWE GR 7681 AND KAYENZI GR 8338 COMMUNES TO INTERACT WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND TO INVESTIGATE RUMOURS OF HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES. THE PATROL ALSO LOCATED ONE OF THE SEVERAL CHILDREN REPORTED MISSING IN KAYENZI AND RETURNED HIM TO A RELATIVE IN GITARAMA.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLLED MBUGA GR 4224. NYAMIGINA GR 4523, MURAMBI GR 5128 AND KARAMBI GR 5622 AS PART OF OP RETOUR. ZAMBATT AND AUSMED TROOPS PROVIDED SECURITY AND MEDICAL COVER RESPECTIVELY DURING THE EVACUATION OF IDPs BY UNHCR FROM MBUGA.

(C) AT NDAGO GR 5102, DPs INFORMED MILOBS THAT SOME OF THEIR COLLEAGUES WHO RETURNED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES WERE ARRESTED AND MISTREATED BY THE RPA.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED HELI RECCE FROM KIVUMU GR 5573 TO BWAKIRA GR 4981. THE RECCE ALSO COVERED THE BWIZA GR 3694 - MURUNDA ROAD AND THE FOREST IN THE AREA OF GISHWAT GR 3894. THE KIVUMU-BWAKIRA ROAD AND THE BWIZA-MURUNDA ROAD HAD BOTH BEEN RENDERED IMPASSABLE BY LANDSLIDES, HEAVY RAINS AND NEGLECT. TWO CAMPS WERE LOCATED IN THE GISHWAT FOREST AT GR 3298. THE CAMPS WERE ABOUT 100M APART AND APPEARED TO HAVE OCCUPANTS.

(C) MILOB PATROL TO GISOVU WAS INFORMED OF AN

INCIDENT ON THE NIGHT OF 7/8 FEB 95 IN WHICH 9 BOATS WHICH ATTEMPTED TO LAND IN NGOMA GR 2159. SEVEN OF THE BOATS WERE CAPTURED BY THE RPA AND THE ATTACKERS ESCAPED IN TWO OF THE REMAINING BOATS. RPA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED TWO LOCALS SUSPECTED OF HAVING COLLABORATED WITH THE BANDITS. THE TWO SUSPECTS ARE PRESENTLY IN THE KIBUYE PRISON.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) THE LOCAL POPULATION WAS REPORTED TO BE STILL UNEASY ABOUT THE RECENT SPATE OF RPA ARRESTS.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO KAGANO AND FAMBIRA GR 0144 CONFIRMED THAT THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND OTHER PERSONS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO KIGALI (SITREP OF 13 FEB REFERS). THE EXACT NUMBER OF PERSONS ARRESTED COULD NOT BE CONFIRMED DUE TO THE UNCOOPERATIVE ATTITUDE OF LOCALS DUE TO FEAR OF RPA REPRISALS.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) MILOBS CONDUCTED INVESTIGATIONS INTO TWO SEPARATE REPORTS OF MURDER IN BATUKA GR 3129 AND KABATWE. PRELIMINARY FINDINGS INDICATED THAT THE RPA WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR ONE OF THE KILLINGS IN BATUKA. HOWEVER LOCAL EYE WITNESS ATTRIBUTED THE MURDER OF A COUPLE IN KABATWE TO ARMED CIVILIANS FROM ZAIRE WHO WERE SUSPECTED TO BE INTERAHAMWE.

(B) MILOBS ALSO PATROLLED GISENYI, MUKAMIRA GR 4521, KARAGO GR 4516, GICEYE GR 5111 AND GASEKE GR 4904 TO MONITOR THE WELL-BEING OF RETURNEES SINCE THEIR RETURN. IT WAS REPORTED THAT RETURNEES WERE GENERALLY WELL TAKEN CARE OF BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES. THEY WERE HOWEVER LOW ON FOOD SUPPLY. MILOBS INTEND TO LIAISE WITH UNHCR TO ASSIST.

(C) SECTOR COMD PAID FIRST COURTESY CALL ON COMD OF THE RPA BDE LOCATED IN RUHENGERI. IT WAS AGREED THAT THERE SHOULD BE CLOSE COOPERATION TO ENSURE A GOOD WORKING RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE RPA TROOPS AND UNAMIR.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(1) UN MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDAN CIVILIAN AT UN MP COY IN KIGALI.

(2) ONE LOCAL UN EMPLOYEE WAS DETAINED AT UN MP COY FOR THEFT OF AN ALTERNATOR FROM THE WORKSHOP. HE WAS LATER HANDED OVER TO THE PROSECUTOR.

HE ALSO REQUESTED THAT UNAMIR SHOULD SEEK TO RESOLVE THE SOCIAL PROBLEMS OF THE IDPs/REFUGEES.

C. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGIERI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IS IN PROGRESS.

B. IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT A GRAVE WAS DISCOVERED AT MUHUNGUE FOREST GR 3016. THE GRAVE CONTAINED 4 DEAD BODIES WITH SEVERAL UNBURIED DEAD BODIES AROUND THE GRAVE. THE GRAVE DATES BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR

C. IN SECTOR 6, INDBATT REPORTED THE DISCOVERY OF ANOTHER MASS GRAVE AT NDERA CAMP NEAR THE MENTAL HOSP COMPLEX. NUMBER OF BODIES IN THE GRAVE UNKNOWN. THE GRAVE DATES BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE FORCE COMMANDER MET THE AMERICAN AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, H.E. MR. DAVID RAWSON, AND A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE U.S. NATIONAL SECURITY COUNCIL, MR. TIMOTHY ATKIN, TO DISCUSS THE PROVISION OF PATROL BOATS BY THE U.S GOVERNMENT FOR USE BY UNAMIR TROOPS ON LAKE KIVU, AND OTHER ASPECTS OF UNAMIR'S CURRENT AND PROJECTED FUTURE OPERATIONS IN RWANDA.

B. HIGH-LEVEL RWANDESE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS HELD SEPARATE TALKS WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF CHINA AND FRANCE IN EFFORTS AIMED AT INCREASING JOINT COOPERATION BETWEEN THEIR RESPECTIVE COUNTRIES.

C. RADIO RWANDA ANNOUNCED THAT A REGIONAL MINISTERIAL MEETING ON REFUGEES WOULD BE HELD IN BUJUMBURA, BURUNDI FROM 15 TO 17 FEBRUARY, UNDER THE AUSPICES OF UNHCR AND THE ORGANISATION OF AFRICAN UNITY. NO INFORMATION WAS PROVIDED REGARDING THE PARTICIPATION OF THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AT THIS CONFERENCE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

(1) LOCALS IN MUHIRA (GR 4185) AND RUBOREZA COMMUNE (GR 1158) REPORTED TO SECTOR 4B MILOBS THAT THE RPA HAD ARRESTED A TOTAL OF 31 PEOPLE IN THE TWO COMMUNES. THE LOCALS WERE NOT SPECIFIC ABOUT THE DATE OF THE ARRESTS. LOCAL POLICE AND RPA COMMANDERS CONTACTED DECLINED TO COMMENT OR TO GIVE REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS. INVESTIGATIONS STILL IN PROGRESS. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN ARMED INCURSIONS INTO THE RUBOREZA AREA ABOUT THREE WEEKS EARLIER. THE DEPLOYMENT OF RPA TROOPS HAD HOWEVER STABILISED THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA.

(2) IN SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT TWO PERSONS WERE ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN GISHUMA COMMUNE FOR THEIR ALLEGED PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE DURING THE WAR. THE SUSPECTS ARE BEING HELD IN THE GISHUMA JAIL.

(3) A LOCAL FROM MUTURA COMMUNE GR 3223 REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT RPA TPS ARRESTED HIS BROTHER AND THREE OTHER LOCALS ON 09 FEB 95. REASONS FOR ARREST NOT KNOWN. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT, A LOCAL AT NKULI GR 4724 REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT HE HAD BEEN LIVING IN THE FOREST DUE TO THREATS TO HIS LIFE BY THE RPA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. MILOBS SECTOR 5 AND HUMAN RIGHTS WERE INFORMED.

C. MILITIA. AUSMED QUOTING AN UNREO REP INDICATED THAT THERE WAS HARD CORE INTERAHAMWE PRESENCE WITHIN NDAGO DP CAMP IN SECTOR 4A.

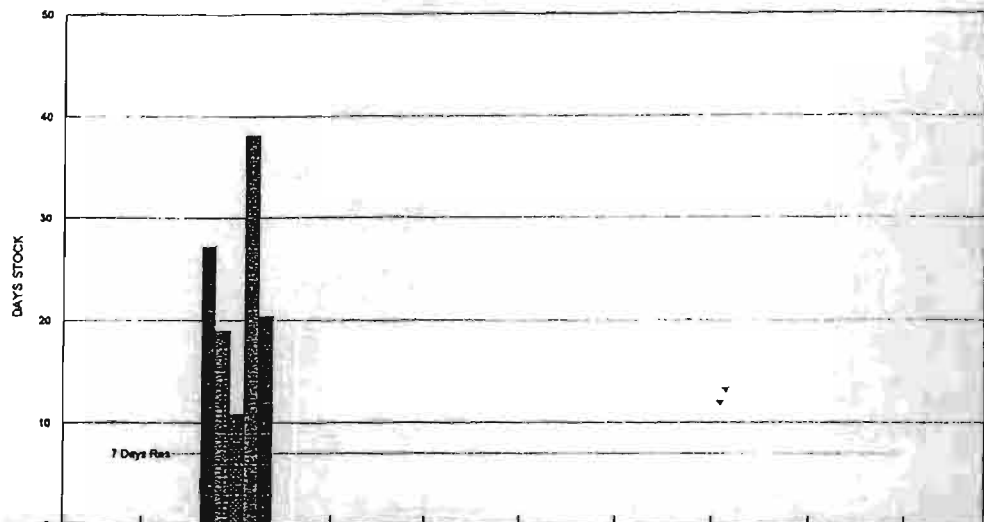

A. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR UNAMIR MET THE UNDER-SECRETARY OF STATE FOR AFRICA IN THE BRITISH FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH OFFICE, MR. ANTHONY GOODENOUGH, AND THE BRITISH AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA, H.E. MR. EDWARD CLAY, TO EXCHANGE VIEWS AND TO DISCUSS THE CURRENT SITUATION IN RWANDA. AMONG THE VARIOUS TOPICS OF DISCUSSION WERE THE ENVISAGED DURATION OF UNAMIR'S PRESENCE IN RWANDA AND THE

SUCCESS OF EFFORTS AIMED AT ACHIEVING NATIONAL RECONCILIATION IN THE COUNTRY.

B. THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, YESTERDAY CHAIRED A MEETING IN KIGALI OF THE REPRESENTATIVES OF NATIONAL GOVERNMENTS AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS WHICH PLEDGED THEIR ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA DURING THE RECENT GENEVA ROUND-TABLE CONFERENCE. THEY DISCUSSED THE MECHANISMS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION AND COORDINATION OF THE HUMANITARIAN AID PLAN FOR RWANDA WHICH HAS BEEN PRESENTED BY THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AS THE PROGRAMME FOR NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC REHABILITATION.

(3) IN SECTOR 4B FRAFATT REPORTED THAT THE NEW RPA COMD IN THE AREA HAS ARRESTED FOUR LOCALS FROM KIBUYE, MPOZAYO AND BIRAMBO AREAS. REASONS FOR ARREST YET TO BE ASCERTAINED. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(1) IN SECTOR 4B MILOBS REPORTED THAT INFO RECEIVED INDICATED THAT ON 3 FEB 95, 10 UNIFORMED FRGF TROOPS LANDED IN RWARAMBA GR 2063 AND ORDERED PEOPLE TO VACATE THE AREA. 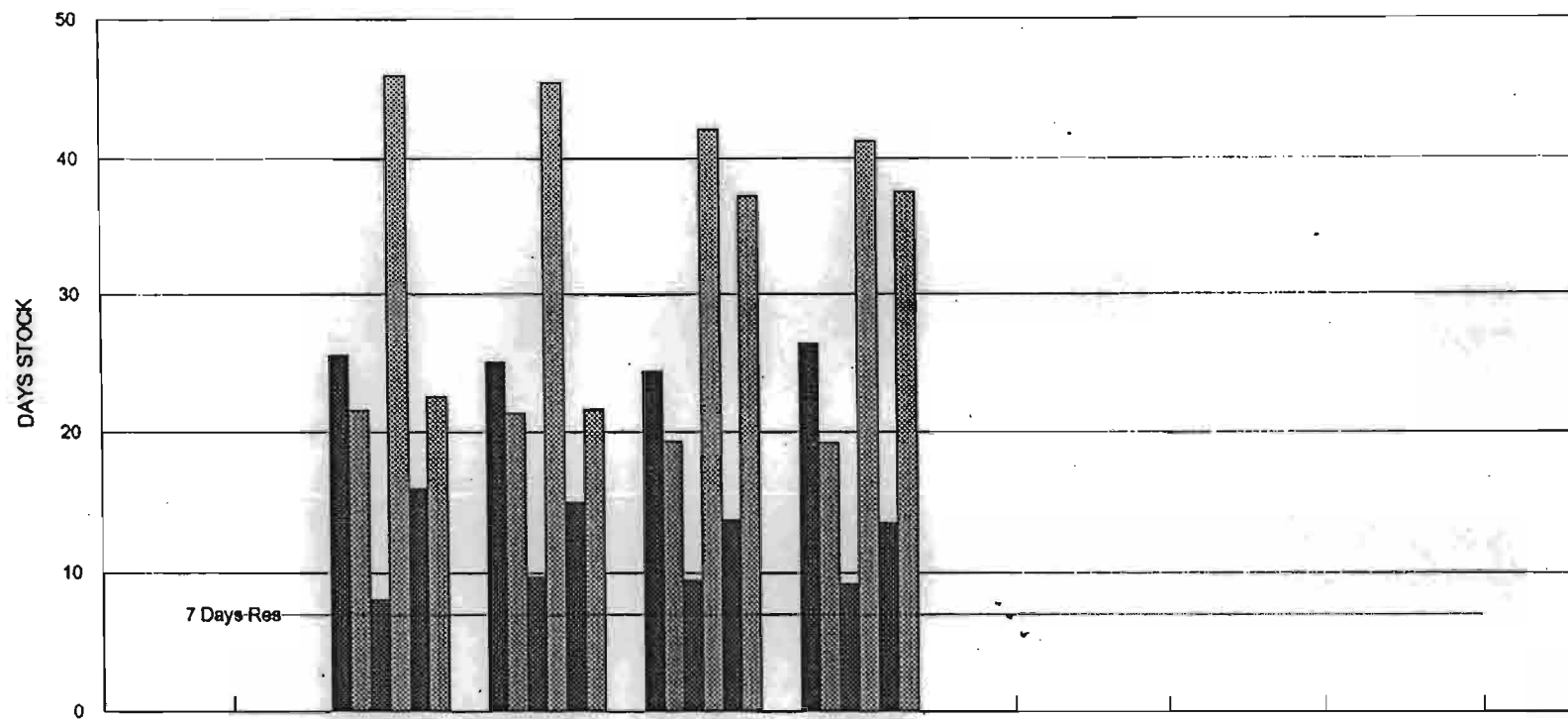



DURING THE SEARCH OF THE SUSPECTS HOUSE, RPA TROOPS FOUND AND CONFISCATED AN AMOUNT OF 110,000 RFR. RPA COMMANDER LATER RETURNED 75,000 RFR. FAMILY OF THE PRISONER REQUESTED MILOBS TO INVESTIGATE.

C. TUNBATT REPORTED THAT A MASS GRAVE WAS DISCOVERED IN THE SANTIANNE CHARITY FACILITY, LOCATED AT KIVUMU GR 2303. NUMBER OF DEAD BODIES UNKNOWN.

A. REPORTS FROM SOUTHWESTERN RWANDA (SECTOR 4) INDICATE THAT THE RPA HAS IMPOSED A BAN ON ALL PUBLIC POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS IN THE REGION CLAIM THAT SUCH ACTIVITIES WOULD BE PREMATURE, COUNTER-PRODUCTIVE, DIVISIVE WITHIN THE LOCAL POPULATION AND DESTABILISING TO THE AREA.

B. THE U.N. HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION FOR RWANDA HAS COMPLETED AN INVESTIGATION INTO THE RECENT ATTACK ON THE WELL-KNOWN RWANDESE POLITICAL JOURNALIST. THE RESULTS OF THIS INQUIRY WILL BE PRESENTED TO HIGH-LEVEL OFFICIALS OF THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT WITH AN AIM TO CLARIFYING THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE ATTACK, BRINGING TO JUSTICE THOSE INVOLVED, AND PREVENTING THE RECURRENCE OF SIMILAR INCIDENTS.

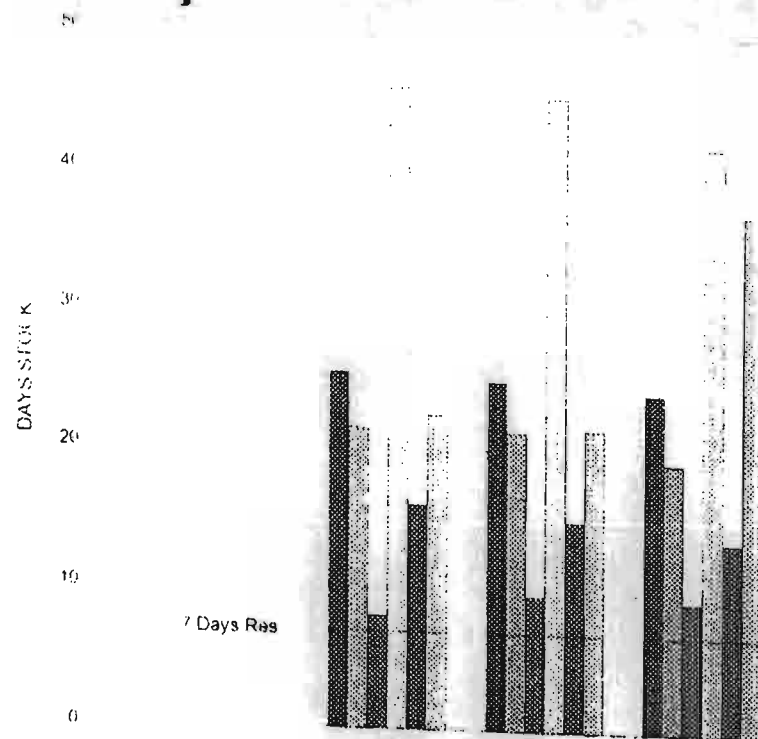



B. ACTS OF BANDITRY CONTINUED TO BE COMMITTED BY FRGF TROOPS FROM ACROSS THE ZAIRIAN BORDER INTO SECTOR 4C. RPA IS REPORTED TO HAVE REINFORCED ITS TROOPS ALONG THE SHORES OF LAKE KIVU. AN INCIDENT WAS REPORTED ON 31 JAN IN WHICH BANDITS RAIDED A HOUSE AND ATTACKED 5 FAMILIES AT MUHEWE GR 8710. THE BANDITS MANAGED TO ESCAPE WITH THEIR STOLEN ITEMS. 2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. DISCUSSIONS WERE HELD BETWEEN THE FORCE COMMANDER AND THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL OF RWANDATEL REGARDING GOVERNMENTAL APPROVAL OF THE FREQUENCIES NEEDED FOR RADIO UNAMIR'S COMMENCEMENT OF OPERATIONS. ALTHOUGH THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SIGNED AN AGREEMENT WITH UNAMIR ON 14 JANUARY 1995 GRANTING PERMISSION FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A U.N. RADIO BROADCASTING STATION IN RWANDA, UNAMIR HAS YET TO BE ISSUED THESE FREQUENCIES DESPITE ITS COMPLIANCE WITH PROCEDURAL AND TECHNICAL FORMALITIES.

B. UNAMIR ISSUED A PRESS COMMUNIQUE EXPRESSING CONCERN OVER THE ATTACK ON THE WELL-KNOWN RWANDESE POLITICAL JOURNALIST BY UNIDENTIFIED ASSAILANTS WHICH LEFT HIM HOSPITALISED IN A CRITICAL CONDITION IN KIGALI. IN A STATEMENT ISSUED BY THE OFFICE OF THE SRSG, IT CONDEMNED THE ATTACK AS AN IMPEDIMENT TO NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AND URGED THAT AN INVESTIGATION BE CONDUCTED IMMEDIATELY TO IDENTIFY THOSE RESPONSIBLE AND TO PREVENT THE RECURRENCE OF SIMILAR INCIDENTS. THE ACTION WAS ALSO DENOUNCED BY THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND THE NGO REPORTERS SANS FRONTIERES.

C. REPORTS FROM SOUTHWESTERN RWANDA (SECTOR 4) INDICATE THAT THE RPA HAS IMPOSED A BAN ON ALL PUBLIC POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS IN THE REGION CLAIM THAT SUCH ACTIVITIES WOULD BE PREMATURE, COUNTER-PRODUCTIVE, DIVISIVE WITHIN THE LOCAL POPULATION AND DESTABILISING TO THE AREA.

D. THE FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH THE CHIEF OF THE U.N. HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION IN RWANDA (UNHRFOR) TO DISCUSS THE ATTACK ON THE RWANDESE JOURNALIST, AS WELL AS OTHER HUMAN RIGHTS ISSUES. UNHRFOR HAS CONCLUDED ITS OWN INVESTIGATION INTO THE INCIDENT AND IT WILL PRESENT THE RESULTS OF THIS INQUIRY TO HIGH-LEVEL OFFICIALS OF THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT WITH AN AIM TO CLARIFYING THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE ATTACK, BRINGING TO JUSTICE THOSE INVOLVED AND PREVENTING THE RECURRENCE OF SIMILAR INCIDENTS.

3. MILITARY

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA.

(A) IN SECTOR 4A, A YOUNG BOY REPORTED TO MILOBS THAT RPA TPS KILLED HIS PARENTS WHILE THEY WERE RETURNING FROM CYANIKA TO NTYAZO COMMUNE IN BUTARE PREFECTURE. MILOBS HAVE REFERRED THE CASE TO HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM FOR INVESTIGATION.

(B) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA TPS ARRESTED 9 PERSONS LAST WEEK IN RWAMATAMU FOR ALLEGED INVOLVEMENT IN THE GENOCIDE. 58 OTHER PRISONERS ARE ALSO REPORTED TO BE WAITING EVAC TO KIGALI.

(C) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT TWO RPA SOLDIERS KILLED A LOCAL AT RWAMATAMU. IN THE SAME SECTOR, RPA ARRESTED AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF PERSONS BELIEVED TO BE INTERHAMWE WHO ATTEMPTED TO USE LOCALS TO EXCHANGE MONEY DURING THE CURRENCY CHANGING EXERCISE. ARRESTS TOOK PLACE IN MARAS GR 2068, GISHYITA GR 2062, MPEMBE GR 1766 AND MURANGARA GR 2166. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(D) IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA IN RUGUTI GR 929161 SHOT AND KILLED A MAN SUSPECTED TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE. THE DECEASED LIVED IN BURUNDI AND WAS VISITING HIS FAMILY IN RUGUTI WHEN RPA TPS AMBUSHED AND SHOT HIM AS HE RESISTED ARREST.

(E) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE LOCALS IN NYAMABUYE COMMUNE ARE ALARMED AT THE HIGH RATE OF ARRESTS OF LOCALS, PREDOMINANTLY HUTUS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(F) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THE ARREST OF THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF MABANZA COMMUNE FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. IN A SEPARATE REPORT FRAFATT REPORTED THAT TRUCKLOADS OF LOCALS ARE BROUGHT TO THE SAME COMMUNE BY THE RPA FOR INTERROGATION AND THE VICTIMS ARE OFTEN BEATEN UP IN THE PROCESS. HUMAN RIGHTS AND SECTOR MILOBS ARE INVESTIGATING.

(G) ON 31 JAN 95, IN SECTOR 4C, RPA CARRIED OUT A CORDON AND SEARCH OP IN KAGANO COMMUNE AND ARRESTED 5 SUSPECTED BANDITS. IN THE SAME SECTOR, AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE TOOK PLACE BETWEEN THE RPA AND BANDITS ON KIREHE PENINSULA AROUND 022000B. NO CASUALTIES OR ARRESTS WERE REPORTED.

(H) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT FORMER SECTOR CHIEF OF CYRBYINGO GR 6525 WAS ARRESTED BY

RPA. HE WAS ALLEGED TO BE AN ACTIVE MEMBER OF INTERHAMWE.

(2) FRGF MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C, RECEIVED REPORTS THAT FRGF MEMBERS HAVE MOVED FROM GOMA CAMPS TO IJWI ISLAND. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(3) MILITIA GHANBATT REPORTED THAT ON 27 JAN 95, 4 BANDITS ATTACKED A HOUSE AT GR 508060 IN KIGEME COMMUNE WITH GRENS. THE OWNER OF THE HOUSE WAS INJURED AND ONE ATTACKER WAS CAPTURED AND HANDED OVER TO THE LOCAL PROSECUTOR.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) UNAMIR

(A) THE FC VISITED THE INCIDENT SITE IN SECTOR 4C ON 30 JAN 95 AND DISCUSSED REPORTING PROCEDURES AND DETAILS OF THE INCIDENT. LATER IN THE DAY, HE RECEIVED THE VISIT OF MR BOWDEN OF SAVE THE CHILDREN FUND.

(B) ON 31 JAN 95, THE FC MET THE HEAD OF NGO AGENCIES AT UNREO TO DISCUSS THE CURRENT STATUS OF OP RETOUR AND ITS RELATIVE SUCCESS. LATER, HE HELD A MEETING WITH MR KABIA, CAO AND BMS TO DISCUSS INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT AT GAKO CAMP.

(C) THE FC VISITED SECTOR ONE TO GET AN UPDATE ON THE SIT IN THE SECTOR. LATER IN THE DAY HE MET THE US DEMINING TEAM TO DISCUSS THE DEMINING PROGRAMME IN RWANDA.

(D) ON 02 FEB 95, THE FC MET THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR AND DISCUSSED THE ACCOMMODATION IN THE BELGIAN VILLAGE. HE LATER MET THE RWANDATEL REPRESENTATIVE TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF THE RADIO LICENCE TO UNAMIR.

(2) SECTOR 1 (NICOY).

(A) ONE WOMAN LOST HER LEG IN A MINE EXPLOSION ON 31 JAN 95 AT GISIZA GR 096344 IN YANBISHANBI COMMUNE.

(B) A TOTAL OF 541 LOCALS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN MED CENTRE DURING THE WEEK.

(3) SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(A) RELIEF OF GHANBATT IN SECTOR 4A SOUTH BY



ZAMBATT COMPLETED ON 30 JAN 95.

(B) A TOTAL OF 1337 IDPs ARRIVED AT RELIMA AND NGENDA ORC GR 2561. THEY WERE REGISTERED AND EVAC TO THEIR VARIOUS COMMUNES.

(C) A LOCAL IN KIGARAMA COMMUNE SOUGHT PROTECTION AT THE BN HQ LOC FROM THE CHIEF OF REMERA GR 6171 ALLEGING THAT THE CHIEF WANTED TO KILL ALL HUTUS IN THE VILLAGE INCLUDING HIM. HRFO INFORMED AND GHANBATT IS INVESTIGATING.

(D) ON 01 FEB 95, A WOMAN AND HER TWO CHILDREN WERE STRANGLED TO DEATH BY UNKNOWN PERSONS AT MUKARANGE NEAR KAYONZA GR 5791. MILOBS AND HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(4) SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY).

(A) PTLs TO BUHORO GR 5710 FOUND 4 LOCALS WHO WERE ATTACKED AND ROBBED BY BANDITS BELIEVED TO BE OPERATING FROM GIKONGORO DP CAMP. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(B) PTLs TO NYABIKAMA GR 5713, KIBINGO GR 6313 AND MUGOMBWA GR 8407 REPORTED THAT LOCALS LIVING IN FEAR DUE TO FREQUENT ATTACKS BY BANDITS IN THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS.

(C) MALICOY ESCORTED 37 DPs FROM NTONGWE GR 9052 AND 85 FROM KIGOMA GR 7649 TO THEIR VARIOUS HOME COMMUNES.

(D) MALAWI COY MED STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 27 LOCALS DURING THE WEEK.

(B) TRANSPORTED A TOTAL OF 143 RETURNEES FROM RUSIZI-1 TO NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP.

(C) TREATED A TOTAL OF 91 PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(8) SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT).

(A) A LOCAL ON ADMISSION TO KAYOVE HOSP GR 2792 ON 31 JAN 95 WAS TAKEN AWAY TO AN UNKNOWN PLACE BY THE RPA. HRFO HAS BEEN INFORMED.

(B) PTL TO BUTARO GR 8482 DISCOVERED FOUR MASS GRAVES CONTAINING OVER 200 BODIES EACH. ANOTHER MASS GRAVE CONTAINING 400 BODIES WAS LOCATED 500M FROM COMMUNE OFFICE AT KAYENZI GR 8388. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

(D) MEDICAL STAFF PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 951 RWANDESE PATIENTS.

(9) SECTOR 6 (INDBATT). PROVIDED SY TO ALL UN INSTALLATIONS IN KIGALI.

(A) A GIRL LOST HER RIGHT LEG IN A MINE INCIDENT AT RUGENDE GR 2782.

(B) REGIMENTAL MEDICAL OFFICER TREATED A TOTAL OF 2252 CIVIL PATIENTS AT CLINIC DURING THE PERIOD.

(10) MILOB GP HQ.

(A) POLITICAL

I. THE PREFECT OF CYANGUGU AND THE CHIEF OF GENDARMES HELD A MEETING WITH LOCALS IN

BUGARAMA TO PROMOTE RECONCILIATION AND TO DISCUSS THE SY SIT IN THE AREA.

II. THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE MET THE BRITISH AMBASSADOR AND COMMONWEALTH REPS DURING THE PERIOD. IT WAS ANNOUNCED DURING THE MEETING THAT THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT IS TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE OF US \$ 3 MILLION TO THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT.

III. THE FOREIGN MINISTER MET THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR ON 2 FEB 95. THE RE-ESTABLISHMENT OF GOOD RELATIONS BETWEEN RWANDA AND FRANCE WAS DISCUSSED. IT WAS DECIDED TO REOPEN THE FRENCH CULTURAL CENTRE. FRENCH GOVERNMENT HAD ALREADY GIVEN FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE OF 35 MILLION FRANCS TO THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT.

(B) BORDER. BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED DURING THE PERIOD EXCEPT GISENYI BORDER POST WHICH WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERS.

(C) IN SECTOR 1 - BYUMBA.

I. MILOBS PTLs TO MATIMBA REPORTED THAT THE DAILY RETURNEES ARE RELUCTANT TO STAY IN THE REGISTRATION CENTRES AND OFTEN GO HOME UNDER OWN ARRANGEMENTS.

II. MILOB PATROL TO MUGAMBAZI GR 0903 WAS REQUESTED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE TO ASSIST IN CLEARING MINES ON THE ROAD FROM KIYANZA GR 0705 TO MUGAMBAZI AND TABA GR 0113.

III. THE AUSTRALIAN RELIEF PROGRAMME HAS REHABILITATED THE WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM AT SHONGA GR 8653 AND RUKOMO GR 3146.

(D) IN SECTOR 2 - KIBUNGO. MILOBS ARE INVESTIGATING HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATION IN KABILIZI IN MUGESERA COMMUNE. THREE MEN WHO CLAIMED THAT THEY WERE BEING SOUGHT BY THE RPA AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES ARE NOW UNDER GHANBATT PROTECTION.

(E) IN SECTOR 3 - GITARAMA.

I. THE BOURGEMESTRE MENTIONED THAT THERE ARE NUMEROUS PROPERTY DISPUTES IN THE SECTOR BECAUSE MANY VACANT HOUSES HAVE BEEN OCCUPIED BY SQUATTERS.

II. THE SECTOR COMD ON HIS VISIT TO THE

GITARAMA PRISON ON 31 JAN 95, FOUND THE CONDITIONS IN THE PRISON APPALLING. MILOBS ASSESSMENT IS THAT LOCAL AUTHORITIES REQUIRE ASSISTANCE TO INCREASE THE HOLDING CAPACITY OF THE PRISON SINCE THE NUMBER OF DETAINEES WERE LIKELY TO INCREASE TILL THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNALS ARE ESTABLISHED.

(F) IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO. NTR.

(G) IN SECTOR 4B - KIBUYE.

I. VARIOUS ACTS OF BANDITRY WERE REPORTED IN THE SECTOR INVOLVING THEFT OF FOODSTUFFS, LIVESTOCK AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS IN MUHAVU GR 1056, MUBUGA GR 1054, RWABISINDU GR 5951 AND NYABITARA GR 6822.

II. THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE ADDRESSED A GATHERING OF WORRIED LOCALS TO ALLAY THEIR FEARS ABOUT THE DETERIORATING SY SITUATION IN THE SECTOR.

(H) IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU. IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE FLOW OF RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE HAS DECREASED POSSIBLY DUE TO IMPROVED LIVING CONDITIONS IN THE CAMPS, INTERFERENCE BY FRGF AND MILITIA WITH THE RETURN OF REFUGEES, HARASSMENT BY ZAIREAN TPS AT THE BORDER AND INCREASED ARRESTS BY THE RPA OF GENOCIDE PERPETRATORS.

(I) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI. MED AUTHORITIES IN CYERU INFORMED MILOBS OF AN OUTBREAK OF MEASLES AMONG CHILDREN IN THE AREA.

(J) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI.

I. IN RUBONGO COMMUNE, THE BOURGEMESTRE REPORTED OF SEVERAL PROPERTY DISPUTES AS THE RETURNEES FOUND THEIR HOUSES OCCUPIED. THE BOURGEMESTRE HAS ISSUED A DIRECTIVE TO ALL UNAUTHORISED OCCUPANTS TO VACATE THE HOUSES WITHIN TWO WEEKS.

II. TWO UXOs WERE LOC AT GR 111830. EOD TEAM INFORMED.

III. MILOBS WERE INFORMED ABOUT AN INCREASE IN BANDITRY ACTIVITIES IN RUSHESHE SECTOR OF KANOMBE COMMUNE. LOCALS WERE AFRAID TO LEAVE THEIR HOMES AT NIGHT.

(K) FORCE ENGR COY.

I. EOD TEAM RECOVERED ONE 60 MM BOMB AND A HAND GREN FROM A HOUSE IN KIGALI ON 31 JAN 95.

II. WORK ON THE CONSTRUCTION OF HELIPAD AT KIBUYE COMPLETED ON 03 FEB 95. ONE TEAM DESPATCHED TO BUSORO GR 9247 ON 02 FEB 95 TO ASSIST IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE BRIDGE.

(12) AUSMED.

(A) THE SPT FORCE PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(B) TREATED A TOTAL OF 517 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 42 DENTAL PATIENTS DURING THE PERIOD. CHK IS HOLDING 5 IN- PATIENTS.

(13) 95 FLSC. MOV TO TRAFIPRO COMPLETED ON 30 JAN 95. INTEGRATION PROCESS CONTINUES.

(14) AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS CONTINUED TO ARRIVE AND DEPART FROM KIA. A TOTAL OF 130 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED DURING THE PERIOD.

(15) UN MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION FOR A RWANDESE CIVILIAN AT UN MP COY HQ.

4. UNCIVPOL.

A. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN SECTOR 4B REPORTED THAT AT RWAMATAMU COMMUNE, RPA TPS SHOT AND KILLED A LOCAL FOR UNDISCLOSED REASONS. THE RPA ALSO ARRESTED 9 OTHERS FOR ALLEGED INVOLVEMENT IN THE GENOCIDE. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

B. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN SECTOR 6 REPORTED THAT THE RWANDAN DEMOCRATIC MOVEMENT (MDR) HAS ACCUSED THE RPA OF ARBITRARY ARRESTS, ABDUCTION AND SUMMARY EXECUTIONS OF POLITICAL OPPONENTS. THESE ACTS THEY CLAIMED ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GENERAL CLIMATE OF INSECURITY IN THE COUNTRY.

C. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN SECTOR 6 REPORTED THAT INTERNATIONAL PROSECUTORS WHO ARE TO COMPILE RECORDS ON GENOCIDE DETAINEES HAVE REQUESTED THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE HQ TO SUBMIT INVESTIGATION REPORTS AND OTHER RELEVANT DOCUMENTS IN RESPECT OF LOCALS ALLEGEDLY ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE DURING THE WAR.

D. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN SECTOR 6, REPORTED THAT A LOCAL JOURNALIST WHO IS A KNOWN CRITIC OF THE RPF GOVT, WAS SERIOUSLY WOUNDED IN AN ATTACK BY UNKNOWN PERSONS ON 01 FEB 95. THE RWANDESE GOVT ORDERED AN INVESTIGATION INTO THE MATTER



BUT ON 05 FEB 95, CIVPOL OBSERVER TEAM REPORTED THAT THE HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM WHICH WAS INVESTIGATING THE MATTER, WAS SURROUNDED BY ARMED RPA SOLDIERS AND PREVENTED FROM HAVING CONTACT WITH THE LOCALS TO GAIN INFORMATION. THE WITNESSES, ON SEEING THAT THE SECURITY SITUATION WAS UNFAVOURABLE, TURNED HOSTILE. THE HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM WAS THEN TRAILED BY VEHICLES CARRYING UNDERCOVER AGENTS FROM NYAMIRAMBO TO THEIR HQ.

E. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL AT RUHENGIRI IS STILL IN PROGRESS.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES NTR.

9. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. A TOTAL NUMBER OF 14 ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHICLES WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD.
10. CONCLUSION THE GENERAL SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED UNDER CONTROL. OP RETOUR CONTINUED AT A VERY ENCOURAGING PACE AS THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY HAS IMPROVED CONSIDERABLY IN THE PAST FEW DAYS. RUKONDO DP CAMP COULD BE EMPTY NEXT WEEK. KIBEHO AND NEIGHBOURING CAMPS ARE HOWEVER GROWING RAPIDLY DUE TO MOVEMENT OF DPs FROM THE NORTHERN CAMPS INTO THE SOUTHERN ONES. FOOD DISTRIBUTION IN THE SOUTHERN CAMPS HAS BEEN CITED AS THE MAIN REASON FOR THE DRIFT, NOT FEAR.



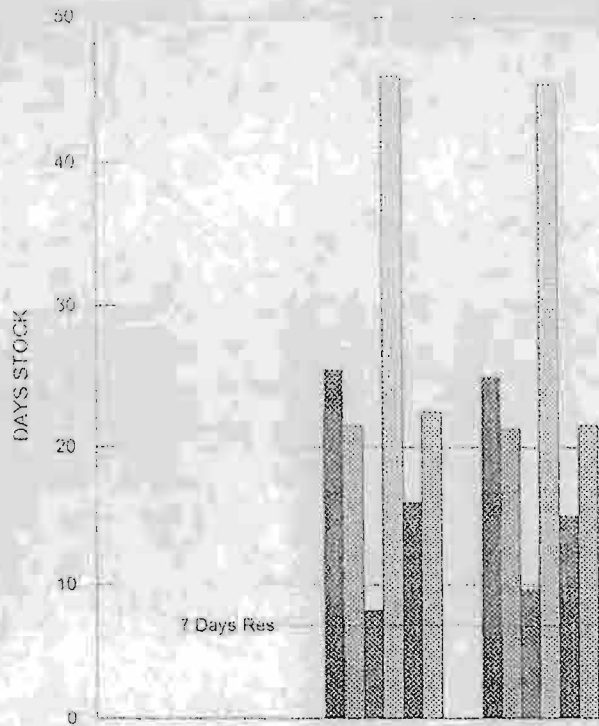

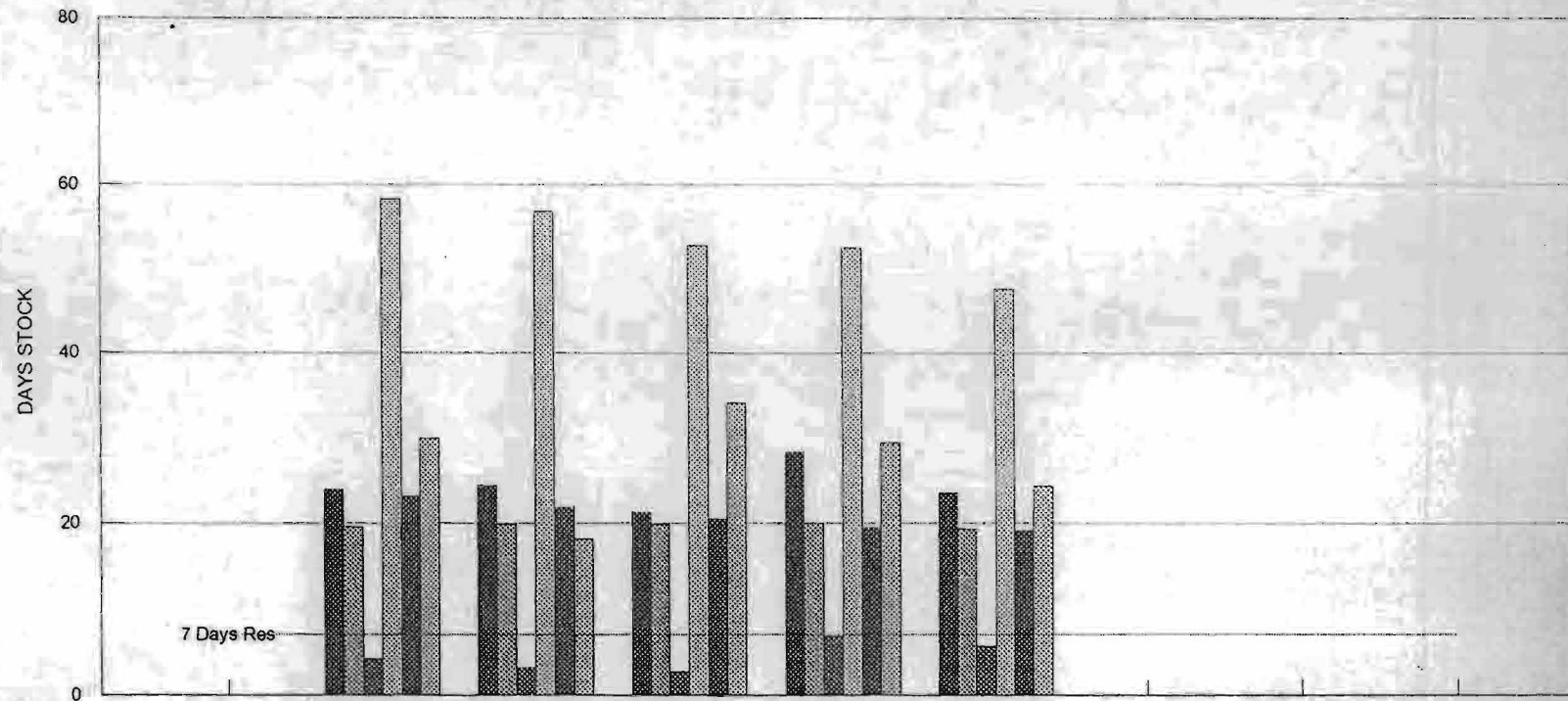
