SUBJECT: SITREP COVERING PERIOD 281800 TO 291800 JUN 95.

1. GENERAL SITUATION. THE SITUATION IS CALM ALTHOUGH FEAR AND APPREHENSION OF INSECURITY PREVAILS AMONG THE LOCALS IN THE PREFECTURE AS BEFORE.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES

A. ONE MILOB TEAM PATROLLED MUBUGA GR (2463) IN GISHYTA COMMUNE . THE TEAM MET BOUGOMEISTER WHO TOLD THEM THAT 699 REFUGEES HAVE SO FAR RETURNED TO THE COMMUNE FROM THE MONTH OF MARCH TO DATE . HE FURTHER SAID THAT SOME OF THE RETURNEES HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED EMPTY HOUSES AND OTHERS ARE COHABITING WITH THEIR RELATIVES . THE RETURNEES ARE FACED WITH THE PROBLEM OF FOOD , SEEDS , CLOTHING AND FARMING TOOLS . THE MILOB REPORTED THAT THE BURGOMASTER WAS VERY EVASIVE TO QUESTIONS AND UNCOOPERATIVE . THE MILOB TEAM PROCEEDED TO MARA GR (2068) AND ON THEIR WAY STOPPED AT KARORA GR (2166) TO TALK TO LOCALS . THE LOCALS TOLD THE TEAM THAT PEOPLE HAVE STOPPED COMING FROM ZAIRE BECAUSE RPA TAKE THEM AWAY WHEN THEY COME BACK . AT THIS JUNCTURE BURGOMASTER CAME AND CONFRONTED THE MILOB TEAM AND TOLD THAT THE NEW MANDATE DOESN'T ALLOW MILOBS TO PATROL IN HIS AREA WITHOUT HIS PERMISSION . AFTER A LENGTH DISCUSSION WITH HIM , THE MILOB TEAM CAME BACK WITHOUT REACHING ITS FINAL DESTINATION . THE SUB SECTOR COMD IN COMPANY OF THE SOUS PREFECT DROVE TO MUBUGA TO VERIFY THE BURGOMASTER'S STATEMENT ABOUT THE NEW MANDATE . THEY DECIDED TO RESOLVE THE ISSUE WHEN THE PREFECT WHO WAS OUT IS BACK IN THE OFFICE .

B. THE SECOND MILOB TEAM WHICH WAS PROCEEDING TO ROBOREZA GR (1158) IN RWAMATAMU COMMUNE WAS STOPPED BY RPA AT A CHECK POINT AT NGOMA GR (2159) AND WAS DENIED ACCESS TO PASS .AFTER A LENGTH DISCUSSION WITH RPA COMD , EFFORTS TO SECURE PASSAGE PROVED FUTILE .THIS IS THE SECOND TIME A MILOB TEAM HAS BEEN DENIED PASSAGE AT THIS RPA CHECK POINT .

C. THIRD MILOB TEAM CONDUCTED A HELI PATROL TO CYANAZA GR (5464) TO CONFIRM ANY BANDITRY ACTIVITIES IN THE AREA . THE MILOB TEAM SPOKE TO THE LOCALS WHO TOLD THEM THAT RPA USUALLY COME IN THE NIGHT AND GRAB COWS AND PROPERTY . THEY FURTHER TOLD THE TEAM THAT ONE PERSON NAMED FRANCIS WAS ARRESTED FOR STEALING COWS AND IS CURRENTLY IN BWAKIRA PRISON . THE TEAM THEN FLEW TO MUREHE GR (5668) WHERE LOCALS TOLD THEM THAT THERE ARE PEOPLE WHO ARE STEALING CATTLE AND ARE OPERATING ALONG NYABARONGO . THE LOCALS ALSO TOLD THE TEAM THAT THERE IS AN OUT BREAK OF EYE DISEASE AND DISENTRY IN THE AREA .

D. THE RPA BN COMD WAS CONTACTED TO VERIFY WHY THE MILOB TEAM PROCEEDING TO RWAMATAMU HAD BEEN DENIED PASSAGE BY RPA SOLDIERS AT NGOMA CHECK POINT . HE WAS VERY EVASIVE TO THIS DEMAND AND ISSUED A LETTER AUTHORIZING PASSAGE TO MILOB TEAMS , HE WAS REPORTED BUSY ATTENDING A MEETING . THE SUB SECTOR COMD HAS SORT A MEETING WITH RPA BN COMD AND THE PREFECT TO IRON OUT THESE LATEST DEVELOPMENTS AFFECTING OUR SMOOTH OPERATIONS IN THE PREFECTURE .

E . FOURTH MILOB TEAM WHICH WENT TO BWIZA IN COMPANY OF BURGOMASTER OF RUTSIRO COMMUNE TO VISIT WHERE THE REPORTED REFUGEES STRANDED AT RUTSIRO COMMUNE CENTRE WILL BE RESETTLED , IS STILL OUT .

SUBJECT: SITREP COVERING PERIOD 271800 TO 281800 JUN 95.

1. GENERAL SITUATION. THE SITUATION IS CALM ALTHOUGH FEAR AND APPREHENSION OF INSECURITY PREVAILS AMONG THE LOCALS IN THE PREFECTURE AS BEFORE.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES

A. ONE MILOB TEAM IN COMPANY WITH MALAWI ESCORTS PATROLLED NYARUTUDURA TO VERIFY RUMORS THAT FRGF ELEMENTS HAD INFILTRATED THE NEIGHBORING SECTOR. THE MILOB TEAM MET THE SECTOR CHIEF WHO TOLD THEM THAT HE HAS NOT HEARD OF THIS INFORMATION. HIS STATEMENT WAS SUPPORTED BY SEVERAL LOCALS. THE TEAM FURTHER VISITED MURUNDA HOSPITAL. THE HOSPITAL IS FUNCTIONING WELL. THE HOSPITAL STAFF TOLD THE TEAM THAT THIS RUMOR COULD HAVE ORIGINATED FROM RPA SOLDIERS WHO ARE OPERATING IN THE GISENYI PREFECTURE BECAUSE AT ONE TIME WHEN THEY WERE COMING FROM GISENYI THEY HEARD SIMILAR STATEMENTS AT A CHECK POINT. HOWEVER THE SITUATION IS REPORTED CALM.

B. SECOND MILOB TEAM PATROLLED RUGARAGARA GR (1749) IN RWAMATAMU COMMUNE, THE MILOB TEAM SPOKE TO LOCALS WHO TOLD THEM THE SITUATION IS CALM. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED KABULIRO PRIMARY SCHOOL GR (1650). TEACHERS AT THIS SCHOOL COMPLAINED TO TEAM THAT WFP DO NOT GIVE THEM FOOD BECAUSE THE COMMUNE IS CONSIDERED TO BE UNDER CHANGUSU PREFECTURE. LOCALS TOLD THE TEAM THAT THERE IS A RUMOR

CIRCULATING THAT THE FORMER FRGF WILL ATTACK THIS AREA . THE TEAM *was upon*
~~FOUND OUT THAT THERE IS NO TAP WATER IN THE AREA .~~ LOCALS IN
 NYATUBITU AND RUGARAGARA TOLD THE TEAM THAT SOME RPA SOLDIERS ARE
 GRABBING COWS FROM HUTUS *For no Reason.*

C. THIRD TEAM PATROLLED RUGABANO GR (4367) AND MUGUDA GR (4468)
 IN BWAKIRA COMMUNE SITUATION IS CALM . IN RUGABANO THE TEAM FAILED
 TO MEET THE LOCAL LEADERS . THE MILOB TEAM MET TWO RETURNEES OF
 1959/60 IN MUGUNDA , THE RETURNEES TOLD THE TEAM THAT THEY HAVE NO
 FOOD , TOOLS AND SEEDS .

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES

A. THE HUMANITARIAN TEAM ATTENDED A MEETING HELD TODAY AT KIBUYE
 PREFECTURE BETWEEN THE PREFECT , NGOS AND UN AGENCIES . THE MAIN
 SUBJECT DISCUSSED WAS THAT OF REFUGEES THAT ARE STRANDED AT THE
 COMMUNE CENTRE IN RUTSIRO . UNHCR AND WFP TOLD THE MEETING THAT
 EACH REFUGEE WAS PROVIDED WITH ONE MONTH FOOD PACKAGE AT NYAMASHABA
 TRANSIT CAMP AND IN ADDITION WHILE IN GISENYI THEY WERE GIVEN
 PLASTIC SHEETS , COOKING UTENSILS AND BLANKETS . THE PREFECT TOLD
 THE GATHERING THAT ALL THE REFUGEES WHO ARE AT RUTSIRO WILL BE
 RESETTLED IN BWIZA *Sector 3694.*

The Sub-Sector
 B. ON THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE PREFECTURE , HE TOLD THE
 NGOS THAT IN ORDER TO AVOID THE STEALING OF VEHICLES , HE SUGGESTED
 ALL VEHICLES TO BE PARKED AT 2200 HRS. HE FURTHER STATED THAT
 THIEVES WHO STOLE THE VEHICLE BELONGING TO SWISS DISASTER RELIEF
 PROGRAMME HAVE BEEN ARRESTED .

INTRODUCTION

FIRSTLY, ALLOW ME TO INTRODUCE MYSELF AS THE NEW SUB SECTOR COMD OF SECTOR 3A . I RECENTLY TOOK OVER DUTIES FROM LT COL BASHER WHO HAS SINCE LEFT THIS MISSION .

DURING THIS BRIEF I INTEND TO COVER THE FOLLOWING:

- A. PREVAILING OP SITUATION IN THE SECTOR
- B. SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENTS IN THE SECTOR SINCE LAST CONFERENCE
- C. GENERAL CONDITIONS AND PROBLEMS IN COMMUNES
- D. RETURNEES (FROM OUTSIDE AND IDPS)
- E. PROGRESS ON RECONCILIATION IN THE SECTOR .
- F. PROPOSAL FOR EFFECTIVE EMPLOYMENT OF MILOBS IN MY SECTOR.
- G. PROBLEMS BEING FACED IN THE SECTOR.

PREVAILING OP SITUATION

THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR WAS CALM BUT TENSE .THERE WAS APPREHENSION AMONG THE POPULATION DUE TO HARASSMENTS AND ARRESTS BY RPA . THE MAJORITY OF OUR REPORTS AND THE THRUST OF OUR EFFORTS HAS BEEN IN THE AREA OF KILLINGS , ARRESTS AND HARASSMENT OF THE POPULATION BY RPA AND FEW INCIDENTS OF WATERBORNE INCURSIONS IN THE SOUTH FROM THE ISLAND OF IJWE . HOWEVER WE HAVE ALSO UNDER TAKEN FEW TASKS OF HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES . WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE NEW MANDATE WE INTEND TO SHIFT OUR EFFORTS TO HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES . DURING THE PERIOD ONE CASE OF THEFT OF A MOTOR VEHICLE WAS RECORDED BELONGING TO AN NGO (SWISS DISASTER RELIEF PROGRAMME) AND THIS HAS CREATED UNCERTAINTY OF SECURITY AMONG THE NGOS . FEW CASES OF REFUGEES LANDING BOATS FROM ZAIRE HAVE ALSO BEEN RECORDED IN RWAMATAMU AND GISHYTA COMMUNES .

SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENTS

DURING THE PERIOD UNDER REVIEW , NO SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENTS HAVE OCCURRED IN THE SECTOR .

GENERAL CONDITIONS AND PROBLEMS IN COMMUNES

EVEN THOUGH THE LOCAL POPULATION IS GOING ABOUT THEIR NORMAL ACTIVITIES THEY STILL APPEAR APPREHENSIVE OF RPA . THERE ARE NOTABLE INSTANCES IN RUTSIRO , RWAMATAMU AND GISOVU COMMUNES ,WHERE LOCALS REFUSED TO TALK TO MILOB PATROLS AND THIS BEHAVIOR IS FELT IS PROBABLY REPRISALS FROM RPA . NORMAL ACTIVITIES IS SLOWLY RETURNING TO ITS EXPECTANCY IN COMMUNES ESPECIALLY IN THE SPHERE OF AGRICULTURE DUE TO THE SUPPORT OF NGOS .WFP , CARITAS ,RED CROSS

AND SWISS DISASTER RELIEF PROGRAMME HAVE CONTINUED TO PROVIDE FOOD
, AGRICULTURE TOOLS , SEEDS AND TENTS TO RETURNEES .

PROBLEMS IN COMMUNES

WATER SOME AREAS IN SOME COMMUNES DO NOT RECEIVE RUNNING
WATER FROM TAPS BECAUSE PIPES WERE DESTROYED DURING THE WAR .
REPRESENTATIVES IN THE MINISTRY OF SOCIAL AND REHABILITATION HAVE
OFTEN INDICATED THAT LACK OF ADEQUATE FUNDING IS HAMPERING REPAIRS

MEDICAL SOME SECTORS IN COMMUNES HAVE NO MEDICAL CENTRES
AND LOCALS ARE FORCED TO TAKE THE SICK TO DISTANT PLACES POSSIBLY
COMMUNE HOSPITALS WHICH ARE FAR AND DUE TO LACK OF TRANSPORT MAKES
THE PROBLEM

ACCOMMODATION THIS IS A MAJOR PROBLEM AND COMMON TO ALL
COMMUNES . WITH THE RETURN OF 1959/60 THE PROBLEM IS BECOMING MORE
ACUTE . SOME RETURNEES ARE GIVEN HOUSES OF PEOPLE WHO FLED DURING
THE RECENT WAR BUT THIS IS TEMPORAL BECAUSE THY ARE ALSO RETURNING

EDUCATION LACK OF TEACHERS IS ANOTHER COMMON PROBLEM TO
ALL SCHOOLS IN COMMUNES ALTHOUGH SEVERAL SCHOOLS HAVE SINCE OPENED
IN MOST COMMUNES IN THE PREFECTURE .

PROPERTY GRABBING SOME TUTSIS OWN THEIR OWN OR IN
COLLABORATION WITH RPA ARE ALLEGED GRABBING COWS FROM HUTUS ON
GROUNDS THAT THEIRS WAS GRABBED DURING THE 1959/60 WAR .THIS
PROBLEM IS PREVALENT IN GISHYTA AND RUTSIRO COMMUNES

RETURNEES (FROM OUTSIDE AND IDPS

(A) DURING THE LAST THREE MONTHS, KIBUYE PREFECTURE
RECEIVED NEAR 2000 REFUGEES FROM GISENYI AND NEAR 30 REFUGEES FORM
KIBEHO CAMP.

(B) THERE HAS NOT BEEN MUCH PROBLEMS WITH THE RETURNEES
THAT BELONGS TO THE 1994 WAVE. HOWEVER, THE OLD CASELOAD RETURNEES
FROM 1959/60, SOME OF THEM SECOND GENERATION BORN OUTSIDE RWANDA,
ARE LANDLESS AND UNABLE TO SUPPORT THEMSELVES DUE TO LACK OF
EXPERIENCE IN THE AGRICULTURAL ACTIVITIES AND HARVEST CYCLES IN
RWANDA.

(C) AS ABOVE MENTIONED, THE RETURNEES FROM THE OLD
CASELOAD WHO FLED THE COUNTRY BETWEEN 1959/60 AND REFUGEES/IDPS
RETURNING TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES BUT WHO MISSED THE PLANTING SEASON
ARE THE MAIN PROBLEM NOW.

OUR PREFECTURE SUFFERED SERIOUS DAMAGE TO BASIC
INFRASTRUCTURE DURING CIVIL WAR, PARTICULARLY IN HEALTH AND
ESSENTIAL SERVICES, AND IS UNABLE TO SUPPORT A LARGE NUMBER OF
RETURNEES TILL THIS PROBLEMS WILL BE SOLVED.

ALSO DUE TO POOR ROAD CONDITIONS AT KIBUYE PREFECTURE,

THE HUMANITARIAN AID HAVE ENCOUNTERED LOGISTICAL PROBLEMS WHICH HAVE AFFECTED ALL THE ACTIVITIES SCHEDULED IN SUPPORT OF THE VULNERABLE GROUPS, INCLUDING THE TRANSPORTATION OF THE RETURNEES FROM THE COMMUNE CENTERS TO THEIR HOME SECTORS AND THE TRANSPORTATION OF LOGISTIC SUPPLY FOR THEM UNTIL THEY CAN BE INSERTED INTO THE AGRICULTURAL CYCLE AND REACH AT LEAST ONE HARVEST SEASON.

ANOTHER PROBLEM THAT WE FACED IS THAT KIBUYE PREFECTURE REMAIN POLITICALLY SENSITIVE DUE TWO REASONS:

(1) THE PROXIMITY OF ZAIRE AND THE REFUGEES THAT SOMETIMES TRY TO LAND EVERYWHERE CAUSING THE RPA TO BE ULTRASENSITIVE ABOUT SECURITY MATTERS.

(2) THE OLD CASELOAD RETURNEES BELONGING TO THE TUTSI ETHNIC THAT THREATEN THE HUTU INHABITANTS IN ORDER TO OBTAIN LAND AND CATTLE, SUPPORTED BY THE RPA.

A SECONDLY BUT NOT LESS IMPORTANT PROBLEM IS THAT THE RETURNEES LODGED AT NYAMISHABA TRANSIT CAMP USUALLY SELL THE FOURTEEN DAYS PACKAGE OF FOOD PROVIDED BY WFP AT KIBUYE IN ORDER TO OBTAIN SOME CURRENCY CAUSING PROBLEMS TO THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES WHEN THEY ARRIVED TO THE COMMUNE CENTERS WITHOUT FOOD.

(D) ASSISTANCE BEING PROVIDED BY NGOS AND OTHER AGENCIES THE NYAMISHABA TRANSIT CAMP, LOCATED AT THE OLD AGRICULTURAL TRAINING CENTER (GR 2571) AND OPERATED BY UNHCR, SERVES AS A CENTRAL COLLECTING POINT FOR THE RETURNEES TRAVELLING FROM GISENYI TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES. DURING THE LAST MONTH 1824 RETURNEES PASSED THROUGH THAT CENTER AND RECEIVED THE FOURTEEN DAYS PACKAGE OF FOOD FROM WFP.

THE PRIORITIES REMAIN IN PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO THE RETURNEES DURING THEIR REINTEGRATION INTO THE AGRICULTURAL CYCLE (WFP, SDR, CARITAS) AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF INCOMING GENERATING ACTIVITIES (WFP, WCA, SDR), BUT ALL THAT EFFORT IS JEOPARDIZED BECAUSE OF THE TRANSPORTATION PROBLEM.

SEED PROTECTION PROGRAMS AND GENERAL DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD, TOGETHER WITH HEALTH PROGRAMS ARE ASSISTING IN THE REASSIMILATION OF RETURNEES IN THEIR HOME COMMUNES, STARTING WITH THE SUPPLY OF A COMPLETE PACKAGE OF FOOD, SEEDS AND TOOLS WHEN THEY LEFT THE TRANSIT CAMP.

IN ORDER TO ASSIST THAT EFFORT, OUR MILOBS GROUP ARE WORKING IN THE FOLLOWING DIRECTIONS:

- (1) IDENTIFYING VULNERABLE GROUPS IN REAL NEED OF ASSISTANCE.
- (2) MONITORING THE SECURITY SITUATION.
- (3) TRYING TO DETERMINE THE IMPACT OF FOOD DISTRIBUTION AND AID PROGRAMS AMONG THE POPULATION
- (4) TRACKING THE RETURNEES ON THE WAY TO THEIR HOME SECTORS AND PASSING THE INFORMATION COLLECTED TO THE APPROPRIATE ORGANIZATIONS.

PROGRESS ON RECONCILIATION IN THE SECTOR

THE PRESENT SITUATION IN THIS PREFECTURE IS SLIGHTLY BETTER THAN IT WAS TWO MONTHS AGO . THE RECONCILIATION THAT IS PREACHED BY THE GOVERNMENT DO NOT SEEM TO BE MATERIALIZING .THE HUTU POPULATION HONESTLY FEEL THAT RECONCILIATION IS NOT REQUIRED BECAUSE THE FRGF WILL RETURN AND SAVE THEM FROM WHAT THEY SEE AS OBVIOUSPERSECUTION AND HARASSMENT AT THE HANDS OF TUTSI RPA . THE RPA ALSO FEEL A GENUINE HATE TOWARDS ANY ONE WHO MAY HAVE POSSIBLY AIDED IN THE GENOCIDE AND THE ONLY SOLUTION FOR THEM IS DEATH . WITH THESE TWO PREMISES THE ONLY POSSIBLE RESULT IS FURTHER UNREST WHICH AT SOME TIME WILLBOIL OVER . IN THE REAL SENSE IT IS SOME HOW DIFFICULT TO TELL WHAT IS UNDER THE HEARTS OF THE POPULATION AS FAR AS THIS PROCESS IS CONCERNED . ASTHE SAYING GOES IT IS EASY TO FORGIVE BUT NOT TO FORGET .

PROPOSAL FOR EFFECTIVE EMPLOYMENT OF MILOBS IN MY SECTOR

MILOBS OPERATIONS IN THIS SUB SECTOR ARE BASED ON ONE HQ GROUP CONTROLLING THE ACTIVITIES OF PATROLS . FOUR PATROLS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR OPERATING IN TWO COMMUNES , WITH THE EXCEPTION OF ONE PATROL WHICH IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THREE COMMUNES . THE HAC IS ALSO CONSIDERED A PATROL . IN VIEW OF THE NEW MANDATE ,WE DO NOT PLAN TO CHANGE THE MAIN GROUPINGS AND THE TASKS OF THIS PRESENT ORGANISATION . HOWEVER DUE TO THE INCREASED EMPHASIS TO HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE , MONITORING OF THE RECONCILIATION PROGRESS AND SECURITY SITUATION , WE WILL REQUIRE TO INCREASE THE PRESENT STRENGTH OF MILOBS . AT THE SAME TIME DUE TO THE REDEPLOYMENT OF MALAWI COY FROM THIS SUB SECTOR , THIS DEPARTURE WILL LEAVE US WITHOUT PHYSICAL SECURITY . IN THIS REGARD WE RECOMMEND TO MOVE OUR MILOB HQ AND THE INDIAN SIGNALS DETACHMENT NECESSARY TO ITS OPERATION TO GULF EDEN ROCK HOTEL WHERE MILOBS ARE PRESENTLY ACCOMMODATED . THIS RELOCATION WOULD AFFORD US THE BEST ALL AROUND OPERATIONAL FLEXIBILITY , AS WELL AS SECURITY , WHICH WE WOULD GET IN KIBUYE PREFECTURE . WE PROPOSE THE THE FOLLOWING DISPOSITION OF ORGANIZATION TOTALLING 28 X MILOBS AND 4 X CIVPOL NOT COUNTING THE PERSONNEL , RESOURCES AND EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS AS LISTED BELOW ;

- (2) MAINTENANCE AND FUEL DET
- (3) MEDICAL DET
- (4) HEAVY TRANSPORT DET
- (5) 10 X VEHS (2 / PTL)

PROBLEMS BEING FACED IN THE SECTOR

1. SOME ROADS TO SOME AREAS IN THE SECTOR ARE IMPASSABLE DUE TO CONSTANT RAINS WHICH HAS WASHED AWAY SOME BRIDGES MAKING IT

IMPOSSIBLE FOR MILOB PATROLS TO REACH THESE AREAS .

2. THE SECTOR IS STILL WITHOUT OFFICE ACCOMMODATION OF ITS OWN . HOWEVER THERE ARE PROSPECTS OF THE CONTRACT BEING SIGNED WITH THE PREFECT SOON .

3. ONE OF THE MAIN TRANSPORT PROBLEMS IS MAINTENANCE OF VEHICLES . EVEN WITH A MINOR DEFECT THE VEHICLE HAS TO BE DRIVEN TO KIGALI , WE THEREFORE SUGGEST THAT A MOBILE MAINTENANCE TEAM COULD BE VISITING ALL SECTORS ONCE OR TWICE A MONTH FOR CAREFUL CHECKING OF VEHICLES .

4. WHEN MALAWI COY LEAVES FOR THEIR NEW LOCATION WE NEED A SMALL FUEL STATION FOR OUR VEHICLES AND IF THERE WILL BE A HEAVY TRUCK DET HERE FOR HUMANITARIAN PURPOSES IT NEEDS FUEL STATION TOO .

5. ONE COMPUTER AND A PRINTER IS AVAILABLE IN SECTOR HQ . HOWEVER THIS IS NOT ENOUGH FOR OPS AND LOG/PERS MATTERS . SECTOR NEEDS TWO OR MORE COMPUTERS SETS . IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NEW MANDATE WE SHOULD KEEP MORE DATA INFORMATION .

6. ONE INMARSET LINK IS ESTABLISHED AND WE HAVE ONE FAX MACHINE AND ONE TELEPHONE LINE . ACCORDING WITH THE NEW ORGANIZATION OUR SECTOR WILL CONSIST OF FOUR STAFF OFFICERS , SIX PATROLLING AND ONE DUTY TEAMS WE NEED EIGHT MORE HAND SETS AND FOUR CHARGERS .

7. NEXT PROBLEM IS WHAT COMM EQUIPMENT WILL BE AVAILABLE IN KIBUYE AFTER MALAWI COY LEAVE THIS PLACE. WE PREFER TO HAVE THE SAME EQUIPMENT AT MILOBS DISPOSAL AS BEFORE, ESPECIALLY WE ARE INTERESTED IN FAX MACHINE.

8. THERE ARE THREE INTERPRETERS WORKING IN SECTOR. WE HAD 4 OF THEM DURING APRIL-MAY AND WE BELIEVE THAT THIS NUMBER IS MOST SUITABLE TO CARRY OUT NEW TASKS AND IS ENOUGH FOR 6 PATROLLING TEAMS.

9. MILOBS ARE LIKELY TO FACE THE PROBLEM OF DRINKING WATER WHEN MALAWI COY LEAVES . WE THEREFORE REQUEST FOR ONE WATER BLADDER TO BE INSTALLED AT THE HOTEL .

10. RECENTLY WE RECEIVED OBJECTIONS FROM LOCAL AUTHORITIES ON HELI PATROLS IN KIVUMU AND BWAKIRA COMMUNES . THIS IS A SIGN OF MISTRUST BY THE AUTHORITIES OF UNAMIR PRESENCE . FROM OUR PERCEPTION , THEY SEEM NOT TO UNDERSTAND THE NEW MANDATE .



THE ASSISTANT BOURGHMESTRE SPOKE THAT THERE WERE NO PROBLEMS OR EVENTS GOING ON IN HIS COMMUNE (STANGELY ENOUGH). HE STATED THAT THE BOURGHMESTRE WAS STILL AT THE HOSPITAL, AND THAT HIS COMMUNE IS LACKING IN EVERYTHING WHICH HE WAS UNAMIR TO PROVIDE FOR HIM. ^{NTS}

THE VICTIMS ARE REPORTED HAS HAVING BEEN SHOT BEFORE THEY LANDED ON THE BEACH. THIS MATTER WILL BE FURTHER INVESTIGATED BY MILOBS ON SATURDAY.

- A. The HAC from KIGALI continued their visit to KIBUYE today. We met with the Prefect, and the heads of ICRC and UNHCR to discuss the 1959/60 caseloads of returnees to Kibuye. These returnees, approx 6000 people thus far, are experiencing problems of housing, food and medical shortages. Many returnees have come back on their own and are not yet registered to receive aid. On 30 June 95 the Prefect will have a meeting to register all returnees from Zaire.
- B. The WFP continues to experience insufficient truck lift to get all the food they require distributed. The poor quality of roads in this prefecture make this situation difficult to resolve. The Prefect requested any assistance possible from UNAMIR to resolve this situation. In addition, the Prefect has stated that in a previous visit the UNAMIR FC has promised him a computer, printer FAX and photocopy machine. HAC please action with FC. This lack of action is seen as typical of UNAMIR's lack of ability to follow through on promised resources.







THERE WAS NO MUCH ACTIVITY IN TERMS OF EFFECTIVE PATROLS OTHER THAN ESCORT TASKS .

A. ONE MILOB TEAM WENT TO KIVUMU COMMUNE AND ESCORTED THE DCMO TO KIBUYE .

B. SECOND MILOB TEAM WENT TO RWAMATAMU COMMUNE IN COMPANY OF THE DCMO . THE PATROL WAS ALMOST A FAMILIARIZATION TOUR AND TO MEET LOCAL AUTHORITIES. NO INFORMATION WAS GAINED FROM THEM. THE LOCAL CIVILIAN POPULATION REQUESTED THE MEDEVAC OF A MALARIA VICTIM TO NGOMA HOSPITAL, WHICH WAS DONE. UPON ARRIVAL, THE CASUALTY WAS DELIVERED TO THE ADRA PERSONNEL THERE. THESE REQUESTED THE MEDEVAC TO KIBUYE HOSPITAL OF A WOMAN WITH A BLEEDING UTERUS (THIS WOMAN WAS SUBSEQUENTLY BROUGHT OUT BY THE PATROL). WHILE THE PATIENT WAS GETTING PREPARED THE PATROL GATHERED THE FOL INFO:

UN RESTRICTED

(1) A FORTY-FIVE YEAR OLD RESIDENT OF RWAMATAMU WAS TAKEN LAST NIGHT (31 MAY 95) FROM HIS HOME BY SOLDIERS (BELIEVED TO BE RPA/KABUGA). THEY TOOK HIM TO THE GENDARMERIE WHERE THEY PROCEEDED TO QUESTION HIM AS TO THE STATUS OF HIS SON BELIEVED TO BE A FORMER HUTU MILITIAMEN WHO HAD ESCAPED TO ZAIRE AND WAS BELIEVED BACK IN THE REGION. THIS MAN, NAMED KAHIRANGA (WRITTEN PHONETICALLY) WAS SHOWING SIGNS OF BEING BEATEN SEVERELY ABOUT THE CHEST AND SHOULDERS, AND A LITTLE IN THE FACE AND EARS. THE QUESTIONING DID NOT RESULT IN THE RPA FINDING OUT ABOUT THE SON; THEREFORE, THE MAN WAS RELEASED. HE WALKED ALL THE WAY TO NGOMA HOSPITAL WHERE HE IS PRESENTLY ATTENDING MED ATTENTION.

(2) MRS ROBERTSON, THE SENIOR ADRA REPRESENTATIVE AT NGOMA HOSPITAL REPORTS HAVING BEEN TOLD BY HER MEDICAL STAFF (NOT AVAILABLE FOR VERIFICATION OF THIS INFORMATION) THAT A WOMAN WAS BROUGHT TO THE HOSPITAL SUFFERING WHAT SHE REPORTED AS A GUNSHOT WOUND TO THE LEG, BUT APPEARED TO BE A BAYONET STAB. THIS WOMAN WAS IMMEDIATELY SENT ON TO THE KIBUYE HOSPITAL. NO FURTHER CLARIFICATION OR PRECESSIONS ON THIS MATTER WERE AVAILABLE. LASTLY, MRS ROBERTSON ALSO REPORTS THAT A MAN WAS BROUGHT IN WITH A GUNSHOT WOUND PRODUCED BY A BULLET THROUGH THE CHEST AND EXITING OUT THE BACK. THE STORY RELATED WAS THAT THIS MAN WAS MISTAKENLY SHOT BY THE RPA, BELIEVING HIM TO BE SOMEONE ELSE.
