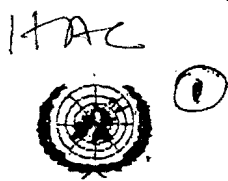



6. The commune has 8 sectors. The head of the commune is MT. GASANA CELESTIN. Name of the sectors and their heads are as follows:

7. The Commune head MR CELETSI sets in his office at BYOGA which has no facilities whatsoever. The office needs adequate manpower and other office facilities like furniture, stationeries and the like.

8. RPA. At KISARO it is reported to have an RPA camp with a PL str.

9. MILITIA. Nil

10. CIV POPULATION. Before the war there were 47,835 people in this area. Now they have only 33,829.

11. SCHOOLS. There is one Secy school at MUTETE and 15 prim at places as listed below.

12. The schools has a total of 4846 pupils and 132 teachers. The commune is authorised with 164 teachers. The teachers are paid regularly as reported. But they seriously lacks in teaching materials such as books, Ref books, Chalk, dusters, furniture and so on. All these schools needs ~~and~~ to be restaffed.

13. MED FACILITIES. The Commune has 3 health centre located at MURAMBIA, BUSORO & MUTETE (7710). But they do not have any doctor or trained med asst & nurses. Only a handful of untrained people treats the patient. They reports to have the facility to treat MALARIA and other common diseases. In case severe patients are usually taken to BYUMBA, which is again depend subject to availability of Opt.

14. CULTIVATION. They cultivate crops common to the area but they need farming tools & seeds and also irrigation facilities.

15. COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES, There are only 4 markets. But they do not have transport for trading in other places.

16. DP CAMPS. Nil.

17. ORPHANAGE. The orphans are living with their relatives. Commune has no orphanage schools.

18. NGO. Only AMREF & CARITAS are distributing medicine to the locals.

19. Essential Service.

a. Electricity. Before the war it was reported to have electricity supply.

b. Water. The commune seriously lacks water supply. They usually collect water from the distant springs. Before the war a project was taken up to set up a water pump at BYOGA but it did not materialise.

c. TPT. Nil.

20. ROADS. It has total 25 km roads under its disposal which ~~requires to~~ needs to be repaired and has no bridges.

21. MASS GRAVES . NIL

22. MINES . One ~~at~~ ZOKO. The sector head will be able to locate the place if asked.

23. MISC . The major problems in the commune as reported are water, electricity, cultivation tools & seeds and med facilities in regards to doctors & med asst. The commune has no vet doctors. As such we recommen to take nee measures to supply the commune with these needs.

24. We've also suggested the Commu. head to work out the needs of the area along with the sectors heads or feed us the data once we go on for patrolling next time. And we also asked him to make an aranger so that we can visit the sectors next time.
