She also informed HAC that another French NGO EQUILIBRE was also given the same warning. Both NGOs work in camps in the Gikongoro area. The reason given by the Gendarmerie was that the agencies should employ local Rwandese as drivers versus ex-patriates. She requests that UNAMIR provide a secure area for their vehicles as of Wed 7 Dec until they decide their course of action.
- (2) UNREO held a coordination conference on the return of IDPs from the Sector 4A area. In attendance was Colonel Frank Mugambage of the RPA who is the Deputy Representative of the RPA in the Rwandese Parliament. During discussion he stressed the security threat of the IDP camps and indicated that they must close as soon as possible.

1. During the past 24 hours the following incidents are significant:
 - a. Displaced Persons:
 - (1) IOM/UNHCR transported IDPs from Kigali to Ngenda, Gashora and Byumba. 34 IDPs were transported to Byumba however only 2 were allowed to remain by the Prefect. He stated that 32 of the returnees were refugees from 1959 and consequently there was nowhere for them to stay. The IDPs were returned to Kigali way station. UNHCR is addressing the problem.
 - (2) UNREO representatives reported to HAC that they have received reports of security and human rights problems against IDPs returning to the areas of Nyamata, Kanzenze and Gashora. They have asked that an increased UNAMIR presence be put into these commune possibly from Rilima. UNHCR is also concerned as this is the area selected as their test case for the return of IDPs.
 - b. Humanitarian Assistance: NTR
 - c. Miscellaneous: IDP task force continued with planning at the temporary IOC at the Amahoro Stadium. NGOs were briefed on the IDP plan developed for the return of IDPs from camps in Sector 4A .
