SITREP FOR 11 OCT 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 946 INCLUDING 562 FROM ZAIRE AND 384 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW: NIL

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 5958. OUTFLOW 22.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE FIRST MEETING OF THE SUB COMMITTEE IN CHARGE OF REPATRIATION MATTERS OF RWANDESE REFUGEES IN ZAIRE WAS HELD ON 11 OCT 95 IN GISENYI. ATTENDING WERE OFFICIALS FROM RWANDA, ZAIRE AND UNHCR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/ GENDARMERIE. RPA HELD A MEETING ATTENDED BY 300-400 LOCALS TO INFORM THEM ABOUT SECURITY ISSUES IN SECTOR 4. THE NEED FOR VIGILANCE AND CAUTION TO PREVENT SABOTAGE INCIDENTS WAS STRESSED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) REPORTEDLY ABOUT 21 BOATS WERE STOLEN FROM MURAWA PENINSULA (GR 9741) ON NIGHT 10/11 OCT. IT IS SUSPECTED THAT BOATS WERE TAKEN TO IJWI ISLAND. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT THE COUNSELLOR OF RUGAMBA SECTOR WAS ATTACKED BY A GROUP OF ARMED MEN WHO THREW A GRENADE ON THE ROOF OF HIS HOUSE BUT THE GRENADE DID NOT EXPLODE.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 151 INCLUDING 91 FROM ZAIRE, 40 FROM BURUNDI AND 20 FROM TANZANIA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND H.E MRS MARY ROBINSON VISITED UNAMIR HQs. IN THE COURSE OF HER VISIT, A BRIEFING WAS GIVEN BY THE FORCE COMMANDER, MAJ GENERAL TOUSSIGNANT ON THE ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF UNAMIR. THE DEPUTY PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA ALSO BRIEFED THE PRESIDENT.

B. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA, H.E MRS ROBINSON STATED THAT THE PURPOSE OF HER CURRENT VISIT TO RWANDA WAS TO GATHER FIRST HAND INFORMATION ON THE SITUATION IN RESPECT TO HUMAN RIGHTS, THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES AND NATIONAL RECONCILIATION, SO AS TO BRIEF OTHER LEADERS IN ATTENDANCE AT THE FORTHCOMING MEETING IN NEW YORK TO CELEBRATE THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE UNITED NATIONS.

A. RPA/ GENDARMERIE. IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ON 08 OCTOBER 1995, AT APPROXIMATELY 2030HRS, A CONSULTANT NURSE AT MUGANZA HEALTH CENTRE WAS ARRESTED BY RPA AT HIS RESIDENCE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ON 10 OCTOBER 1995 AT APPROXIMATELY 0032HRS, AN ELECTRIC PYLON WAS BLOWN UP AT CYIMBOGO COMMUNE, WINTKO SECTOR, KARAMBO CELL GR

773203.

THE PYLON CONNECTED TWO POWER LINES LEADING TO THE CIMERWA CEMENT FACTORY GR 9011 AND THE JUICE FACTORY GR 773197. THESE TWO POWER LINES ARE NOW OUT OF ORDER. NO INJURIES AND NO SUSPECTS HAVE BEEN APPREHENDED SO FAR. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) IN NYAMUTERA COMMUNE, 18 FRGFs WERE RECRUITED AND TAKEN TO RUHENGARI RPA CAMP ON

09 OCTOBER 1995 BEFORE THEY ARE TRANSFERRED TO BUTARE REORGANISATION CENTRE AND LATER BE ABSORBED INTO THE RPA.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 367. 354 RETURNEES CAME FROM ZAIRE , AND 13 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW: 33.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR URASA, DELEGATE OF THE UNHCR, ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE TRIPARTITE COMMISSION COMPRISING RWANDA, ZAIRE AND UNHCR AND DISCUSSED MEANS TO FACILITATE THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF REFUGEES, THE SITUATION IN THE CAMPS AND THE REHABILITATION OF RETURNEES TO RWANDA.

B. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE SRSG MET WITH THE PRISONS ADVISER MR RANDOLF KENT AND HIS COLLEAGUES TO DISCUSS THE PRISON SITUATION, PLANS FOR FURTHER IMPROVEMENTS AND FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THEIR IMPLEMENTATION.

C. LATER, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE REPRESENTATIVE OF IRELAND, MS BARBARA JONES, TO DISCUSS THE FORTHCOMING VISIT TO RWANDA BY THE PRESIDENT OF IRELAND.

G. A TOTAL OF 182 MED AND 03 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY UNAMIR MED STAFF.

THE EXPLOSION IN SECTOR 4, WAS DUE TO THE BLOWING UP OF AN ELECTRIC PYLON IN GIKUNGWE CELLULE IN CYETE SECTOR OF CYIMBOGO COMMUNE GR 771206 ON 24 SEP 95 AT 0230 HRS BY UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS. THE PYLON IS STILL FUNCTIONAL. REPS OF ELECTROGAZ CONFIRMED THAT THE PYLON WOULD BE REPLACED AT THE EARLIEST.

(3) IN SECTOR 4, A REP OF CONCERN(NGO), REPORTED THAT A GROUP OF ARMED MEN IN UNIFORM ROBBED TENTAGE AND PLASTIC SHEETING FROM NYARUSHISHI REFUGEE CAMP GR 845238 ON 15 SEP 95 AND 23 SEP 95. IN THE SAME SECTOR, ICRC REPORTED THAT 60 BLANKETS WERE STOLEN FROM THEIR WAREHOUSE ON NIGHT 17/18 SEP 95.

JOSE LUIZ JESUS HAD MET WITH THE RWANDESE FOREIGN MINISTER AND DISCUSSED PLANS REGARDING THE CO-ORDINATING OF A REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT IN THE REGION. HE ALSO INDICATED THAT A NATIONAL INQUIRY COMMISSION HAD BEEN SET UP TO REPORT WITHIN THREE MONTHS OVER THE KANAMA INCIDENT.

B. THE SRSG OBSERVED THAT THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATIONS IN RWANDA ARE IN THE PROCESS OF LAUNCHING AN AMBITIOUS PLAN FOR IMPROVING CONDITIONS IN THE PRISONS AND ADVISED THE MEDIA TO VISIT PRISON PREMISES TO HAVE A FIRST HAND ACCOUNT OF THE SITUATION. THE COMPLETION OF THE NSINDA PRISON BY END OF THIS MONTH WILL ACCOMMODATE 5,000 PRISONERS THEREBY MITIGATING THE PROBLEM OF OVERCROWDING.

C. THE SRSG ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT RECRUITMENT OF JUDICIARY IS IN THE OFFING AND A BATCH OF FIFTY FOREIGN EXPERTS ARE LIKELY TO ARRIVE IN A MONTH'S TIME TO REVIEW THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM IN AN ADVISORY CAPACITY.

E. 193 REFUGEES ARRIVED FROM ZAIRE IN SECTOR 5B GISENYI ON 07 SEP 95. THEY WERE ALL TRANSPORTED TO THE TRANSIT CAMP. 84 WERE DESPATCHED TO THEIR COMMUNES.

THE GVT OF RWANDA CAN BE EXPECTED TO ASSIST, BUT THE RESOURCES NECESSARY FOR A CROSS-BORDER INFORMATION CAMPAIGN OF THE MAGNITUDE REQUIRED WILL LIKELY BE BEYOND THEIR CAPABILITY FOR THE FORESEEABLE FUTURE.

(1) ON 05 SEP AT 1130 HRS SECTOR MILOBS WAS INFORMED BY THE RPA LO THAT RPA SOLDIERS AT NYAMUTETRA WERE ATTACKED BY SUSPECTED FRGF ELEMENTS ON NIGHT 04 SEP 95. THEY THREW GRENADES TOWARDS RPA AND TWO OF THEM WERE INJURED BY SPLINTERS. FURTHER DETAILS WILL FOLLOW.

B. SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) AT MUHURA COMMUNE THE ONLY NGO NAMED AS INTER SOS, WORKING IN THE HEALTH CENTRE (GR 298088) HAS WITHDRAWN. THERE IS AN OUT BREAK OF DISEASE NAMED AS STIFF NECK WHICH HAS CLAIMED 12 LIVES SO FAR SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THIS MONTH. MEDICAL SPECIALIST SUSPECTED IT TO BE MENINGITIS BUT IT COULD NOT BE ASCERTAINED. IN KIBALI COMMUNE ICRC HAVE REPORTED TO THE SECTOR HQ AND INDICATED THAT THEY ARE GOING TO BUILD A RECEPTION CENTER IN BYUMBA GR 085237. ALSO GOAL IRELAND, ANOTHER NGO HAS ACCEPTED TO CONSTRUCT THE RECEPTION CENTRE AND REQUESTED UNAMIR TO ASSIST THEM WITH AN EARTH MOVING PLANT TO LEVEL THE AREA BEFORE THEY COULD START THE CONSTRUCTION. HOWEVER AN INFORMAL REPORT WAS MADE THROUGH HAC TO THIS EFFECT.

C. SECTOR 3B (BUTARE) - BOURGMESTRE OF THE SHYANDA COMMUNE INFORMED THE MILOB TEAM THAT THE COMMUNE IS FACING PROBLEMS OF WATER AND FOOD. THERE ARE REPORTS OF MEDICINE SHORTAGE AT NYARUHENGARI AND KANZI SECTOR.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. IN SECTOR 3B REPORTED THAT ON 29 AUG 95 AT ABOUT 2000 HRS, THE JUDGE OF BUTARE WAS MURDERED IN SHYANDA (GR 7718). THE JUDGE HAD GONE TO DRINK BEER AT THE BAR OPPOSITE HIS HOUSE. HE HAD LEFT THE BAR FOR HOME FOR HIS HOME BUT BEFORE HE COULD REACH THE DOOR STEP, HE WAS SHOT TWICE AT THE BACH AND NECK AND DIED INSTANTLY. THE BODY WAS TAKEN TO BUTARE MORTUARY AND WAS BURIED TO-DAY AT 311400 B AUG 95. MILOB/CIVPOL TEAM COULD NOT REACH THE SCENE OF INCIDENCE AS IT WAS UNDER RPA GUARD WHO ARE ALSO INVESTIGATING THE CASE.

G. IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) 89 REFUGEES ARRIVED FROM ZAIRE ON 31 AUG 95. 35 RETURNEES WERE TRANSPORTED TO THE TRANSIT CAMP AND 34 RETURNEES SENT TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES DUE TO NON AVAIL OF TRANSPORT. HEAD COUNT CONDUCTED REVEALED THAT 1322 REFUGEES ARE STILL REMAINING IN THE TRANSIT CAMP.

(1) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) THERE WERE SOME SMALL ARMS FIRING ON 30 AUG 95 AT 1755 HR'S FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE MAIN BORDER CROSSING POINT IN GISENYI. SUBSEQUENT INVESTIGATION DID NOT REVEAL ANY UNUSUAL ACTIVITY.

(2) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGERI) RPA FROM KINIGI COMMUNE GR 5440 VISITED THE MSF CLINIC WITH ARMS AFTER MIDNIGHT AND ASKED FOR MEDICINE FORCEFULLY, IT WAS FURTHER CONFIRMED BY THE DOCTOR OF THE CLINIC. DETAILED REPORT WILL FOLLOW.

B. **FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.**

(1) CIVPOL TEAM PATROL TO NYAMUTERA COMMUNE WAS INFORMED THAT ON 26 AUG 95 ONE LOCAL WAS SHOT AND WOUNDED AT HIS HOUSE BY TWO ARMED MEN, ONE DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORM AND THE OTHER IN CIVILIAN CLOTHES. THE WOUNDED LOCAL WAS EVAC TO RUHENGERI HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT. REASON FOR THE SHOOTING UNKNOWN. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) ON 29 AUG 95 AN UNIDENTIFIED NUMBER OF BANDITS ATTEMPTED TO STEAL FIVE COWS IN GISHOMA COMMUNE GISAGARA AREA GR 7812, IN SECTOR 4 BUT WERE FOILED BY RPA AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE ENSUED BUT NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED. THE BANDITS ESCAPED WITHOUT THE COWS.

(3) THE SAME DAY AT APPROX 2300 HRS A SIMILAR INCIDENT OCCURRED IN THE CYIMBOGO COMMUNE WHEN BANDITS ATTEMPTED TO STEAL FIVE HEAD OF CATTLE BUT WERE FOILED BY RPA.

4. **HUMANITARIAN**

A. SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) - A TOTAL OF 1007 RETURNEES WERE AT THE DIHIRO TRANSIT CAMP ON 30 AUG 95. THESE RETURNEES CAME UNDER ARRANGEMENT OF UNHCR FROM BURUNDI. OUT OF THEM RETURNEES 852 WERE FROM KIBUNGO PREFECT, 144 WERE FROM NGENDA, 07 FROM GASHORA, 03 FROM BICUMBI AND 01 FROM KANZENZE.

B. SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) - 200 RETURNEES WERE EXPECTED TODAY FROM TANZANIA AT NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CAMP GR 7549 BUT ONLY 114 HAVE PHYSICALLY ARRIVED. THE UNHCR HAS BROUGHT ABOUT 60,000L OF DRINKING WATER TO THE CAMP TODAY TO OVERCOME THE SHORTAGE OF WATER. IT WAS FURTHER REPORTED BY UNHCR THAT A TOTAL OF 997 RETURNEES ARRIVED TO THE BIRENGA TRANSIT CAMP GR 5959 FROM BURUNDI.

C. SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO) - THE ONLY CLINIC AT CYANICA GR 5630 RUN BY THE CATHOLIC CHURCH FACES PROBLEM OF NON AVAILABILITY OF ELECTRICITY, TELEPHONE AND AMBULANCE.

D. SECTOR 3B (BUTARE) - MILOB REPORTED THAT THE ESPANYA SECONDARY SCHOOL AT NYABISINDU NEEDS ASSISTANCE OF 200 BEDS AND MATTRESSES, FURNITURE ITEMS AND STATIONERIES.

E. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - THREE RETURNEES ARRIVED AT THE BORDER ON 30 AUG 95. THEY WERE TRANSPORTED TO THE TRANSIT CAMP. UNHCR TRANSPORTED A TOTAL OF 550 RETURNEES TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES. A TOTAL OF 2,683 RETURNEES REMAIN AT THE NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP.

F. SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - 140 RETURNEES WERE RECORDED ON 30 AUG 95 AT THE BORDER. THEY WERE ALL TRANSPORTED TO THE TRANSIT CAMP. 23 WERE TRANSPORTED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES BY UNHCR WHICH ALSO TRANSPORTED 112 RETURNEES FROM GOMA CAMP, ZAIRE TO NKAMIRA TRANSIT CAMP, GISENYI.

G. SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) - UNHCR TRANSPORTED 323 RETURNEES FROM THE NYAMISHABA (GR 2571) TRANSIT CAMP TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOME COMMUNES.

H. SECTOR 1A (GITARAMA) - THERE IS ACUTE SHORTAGE OF WATER PREVAILING IN THE GITARAMA PRISON. REPRESENTATIVE FROM

95 CMSG VISITED GITARAMA SECTOR HQ AND REPORTED THAT THEY ARE GOING TO DRAIN THE 100, 000L OF WATER BLADDER AT THE PETIT SEMINAIRE AND TAKE IT BACK. IT WOULD BE APPRECIATED IF THIS WATER WOULD BE PUMP TO A TRUCK AND BRING BACK TO THE GITARAMA PRISON WHICH IS IN DESPERATE NEED.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 5 RUHENGEI AN INDIVIDUAL FROM "WORLD VISION" REPORTED TO MILOB SECTOR HQ AT AROUND 1000 HR's AND REQUESTED MILOB TO SAVE HIM BECAUSE ONE UNKNOWN PERSON WANTED TO ARREST HIM. WITHIN 5 MINUTES OF HIS ARRIVAL RPA BDE COMMANDER ALSO CAME TO MILOB SECTOR HQ WITH GENDARMERIE TO ARREST HIM. HIS FAULT WAS THAT HE SUDDENLY CAME TO THE MAIN ROAD AND WAS ABOUT TO STRIKE THE BRIGADE COMMANDER VEH. HOWEVER THE MATTER WAS RESOLVED IN PRESENCE OF THE SECTOR COMMANDER AND THE PERSON WAS NOT ARRESTED, BUT BRIGADE COMMANDER REQUESTED HIM TO FOLLOW THE LOCAL TRAFFIC RULE IN FUTURE.

DAILY SITREP FOR 29 AUG 95

1. **HIGHLIGHTS.**

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. FORCED REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU SEEMS TO HAVE STOPPED FOR THE TIME BEING.

B. **BORDER CROSSING:**

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 186 OUT OF WHICH 136 COMING FROM BURUNDI.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 18,174. OUTFLOW - 21.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES**

A. THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, IN A COMMUNIQUE DATED 28 AUG 95, DECLARED THAT THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA HAD RELIEVED THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER OF HIS OFFICIAL DUTIES AT 1500 HRS ON MONDAY 28 AUG 95. IN ANOTHER DEVELOPMENT, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT SUBMITTED A LETTER OF RESIGNATION TO THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA DATED 28 AUG 95.

B. IN A COMMUNIQUE ISSUED BY THE OFFICE OF THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT ON 29 AUG 95, IT WAS ANNOUNCED THAT THE FOLLOWING FOUR MINISTERS HAD LEFT THE GOVERNMENT TO ASSUME OTHER DUTIES: THE MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT, THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION (AND GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN), AND THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS. THE MINISTERS HOLD DIFFERENT POLITICAL AFFILIATIONS, BUT THREE OF THE FOUR ARE OF THE SAME HUTU ETHNIC ORIGIN AS THE FORMER RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER.

3. **MILITARY ACTIVITIES.**

A. **RPA/GENDARMERIE.**

(1) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) THERE WAS A BRIEF FIRE FIGHT BETWEEN RPA AND AN UNIDENTIFIED GROUP WHO THREW A HAND GRENADE AT AN RPA PATROL WOUNDING TWO SOLDIERS. THE INCIDENT TOOK PLACE AT THE GISENYI MARKET AT ABOUT 2030 HRS. MILOBS ARE YET TO OBTAIN FURTHER DETAILS.

(2) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) THREE RPA SOLDIERS WENT TO

THE NYABIKENKE (GR 7292) CACHOT AT ABOUT MIDNIGHT AND FORCIBLY TOOK THE KEYS FROM THE GUARD AND SUBSEQUENTLY BEAT MANY OF THE PRISONERS SEVERELY. ONE PRISONER DIED ON THE SPOT WHILST A SECOND DIED AT 1215 HRS TODAY. THE INSTIGATOR IS SAID TO HAVE BEEN PUT IN A MILITARY JAIL.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) MRS ROSELYNE MATTEUER, HEAD OF THE FEDERATION OF THE RED CROSS IN ZAIRE INFORMED MILOBS AT RUSIZI I ON 29 AUG 95 THAT A DISINFORMATION CAMPAIGN HAS BEEN LAUNCHED BY FRGF INFORMING REFUGEES THAT THEY HAD BEEN IN CYANGUGU AND HAD OBSERVED RETURNEES BEING KILLED BY RPA SOLDIERS. IT WAS THEREFORE ARRANGED THAT AN INDEPENDENT TEAM FROM ZAIRE BE MADE TO VISIT THE BORDER AREA AT RUSIZI I IN THE NEXT FEW DAYS ON A FACT FINDING MISSION.

(2) MILOBS PATROL TEAM TO KAYOVE (GR 2892) WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT ON 24 AUG 95 THREE LOCALS WERE ABDUCTED INTO THE FOREST BY SIX ARMED MEN. THE HOSTAGES WHO MANAGED TO ESCAPE INFORMED RPA WHO CONDUCTED A SEARCH FOR THE ARMED MEN WITHOUT RESULT. ALSO AT NGAMA (GR 2498) THE TEAM WAS INFORMED THAT ON 24 AUG 95 THERE WAS A FIRE FIGHT BETWEEN RPA AND ONE SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE. THE INSURGENT WAS KILLED AND BURIED IN LOCATION. PATROL TEAM VISITED THE SITE AND FOUND TWO HAND GRENADES.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) A TOTAL OF 99 RETURNEES WERE AT THE NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CAMP (GR 7549) ON 29 AUG 95. THE CAMP IS FACING SHORTAGE OF DRINKING WATER.

B SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) - MILOBS INFORMED BY RWINKAVU HOSPITAL STAFF OF WATER SHORTAGE AT THE HOSPITAL AND REQUESTED FOR ASSISTANCE TO FILL A 45,00 LITRE RESERVOIR AT LEAST ONCE A WEEK. UNHCR FILLS UP THE RESERVOIR ONCE IN TWO WEEKS.

C SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) UNHCR TRANSPORTED A TOTAL OF 662 RETURNEES TO 7 COMMUNES ON 29 AUG 95. A TOTAL OF 2,683 RETURNEES REMAIN AT THE NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP.

D SECTOR 5A (RUHENGERI) UNHCR TRANSPORTED 42 RETURNEES TO VARIOUS COMMUNES IN THE PREFECTURE.

E SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) UNCHR TRANSPORTED 382 RETURNEES FROM THE NYAMISHABA (GR 2571) TRANSIT CAMP TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOME COMMUNES.

F. PATROL TO NTYAZO GIKONGORO LEARNT THAT A TOTAL OF 80 REFUGEES, 60 FROM ZAIRE AND 20 FROM BURUNDI ARRIVED IN THE

COMMUNE ON 28 AUG 95.

5. **CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.**

A. SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) THE VICE BOURGMESTRE OF KIVUYE COMMUNE, MR EMMANUEL BIZIMANA, WITH TWO OTHER LOCALS WERE YESTERDAY ARRESTED AND DETAINED BY LOCAL RPA SOLDIERS FOR DRUNKENNESS AND DISORDERLY BEHAVIOUR. THE TWO LOCALS WERE LATER RELEASED AFTER PAYING A FINE OF FRW10,000.00 EACH.

B. SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO) A MEETING, ATTENDED BY THE PREFECT AND THE BOURGMESTRE, WAS HELD IN MUBUGA COMMUNE OFFICE TO WORK OUT MODALITIES FOR REHABILITATING RETURNEES.

- 6 **SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL** AT ABOUT 0730 HRS TODAY IN MUKINGI COMMUNE (GR 7160) GITARAMA SECTOR, A PICK-UP VEHICLE OF MEDECIN DU MONDE BASED IN CYANGUGU HIT AND KILLED A 17 YEAR OLD FEMALE LOCAL PEDESTRIAN. MILOBS ASSISTED THE NGO IN TRANSPORTING THE CORPSE FROM THE KABGAYI HOSPITAL TO MUKINGI COMMUNE FOR BURIAL. THE GITARAMA IPJ HOWEVER ADVISED THE NGO PERSONNEL NOT TO ATTEND THE BURIAL FOR FEAR OF REPRISALS BY LOCALS.

A. **RPA/GENDARMERIE.** SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - IN DISCUSSION WITH MSF TODAY, ONE SICK PRISONER WHO WAS TAKEN TO THE KABGAYI HOSPITAL YESTERDAY FROM NTONGWE COMMUNE GR 9057 FOR A HERNIA SURGERY WAS BEATEN BY THE RPA SOLDIERS AT THE HOSPITAL. MSF HIRED PERSONNEL INTERVENED AND STOPPED THE BEATING WHEN THE PATIENT HAD BEEN LAID ON THE GROUND AND BEATEN WITH A STICK. FURTHER INVESTIGATION WILL BE CONDUCTED AND A DETAILED REPORT WILL FOLLOW.

B. **FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.** NSTR.

C. **OWN ACTIVITIES.** NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(1) **OTHER SECTORS**

(A) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 4 FURTHER REPORTED REGARDING THE INJURY OF THE COUNSELLOR OF GISHUMA COMMUNE GR 8211 UNDER MUKINBANGIRO SECTOR GR 8612, MR SEZIBERA ATHANASE, A HUTU, APPEARS TO BE POLITICALLY MOTIVATED AND SUBSCRIBES TO THE DECLARED CAMPAIGN OF TERROR LAUNCHED AGAINST THE POLITICAL LEADERS BY FRGF/INTERAHAMWE IN THE VARIOUS COMMUNES OF THE BUGARAMA SUB SECTOR, BEGINNING EARLY JULY 95.

(B) SECTOR 4 MILOB ALSO REPORTED THAT ON 25 AUG 95 AT AROUND 1230 HRS, A SINGLE ENGINE AC WAS SIGHTED OVER KIRAMBO COMMUNE GR 0444 FLYING IN A

SOUTH WEST TO NORTH EAST DIRECTION AT AN ALTITUDE OF 3,000 FEET. THE COLOR WAS METALLIC WHITE GREY WITH NO VISIBLE MARKINGS.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) MILOBS REPORTED THAT MSF HAS ESTABLISHED A TEMPORARY MEDICAL CENTRE AT RWANTERU AND ARE CARRYING OUT IMMUNIZATION AGAINST POLIO, TB AND TETANUS.

B. MILOBS FROM SECTOR 2A (KIBUNGO) ALSO REPORTED THAT THERE IS WATER SHORTAGE AT RWINKWAVU CENTRE DE SANTE GR 6782 AND NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CAMP. THE WATER PUMP AT THE CAMP WHICH WAS SUPPLIED BY IRC IS OUT OF ORDER. THE CAMP STILL HAS 115 RETURNEES.

C. SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - UNHCR MOVED ALL 36 VOLUNTARY RETURNEES WHO CROSSED FROM ZAIRE TODAY TO THE NKAMIRA TRANSIT CAMP.

D. SECTOR 5C MILOBS REPORTED THAT KABONA DISPENSARY AT RUTISIRO COMMUNE GR 430851 IS RUNNING OUT OF MEDICINE. ANOTHER TEAM VISITED GISHARU GR 4263 MEDICAL CENTRE AND REPORTED THAT THE ONLY TUBE WELL IS OUT OF ORDER.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. SECTOR 1A MILOBS REPORTED THAT UNHCR TODAY TRANSPORTED 36 RETURNEES TO NYABIKENKE COMMUNE GR 7292 AND 31 TO RUOBWE COMMUNE GR 7781. THE PREFECT ALSO INFORMED THAT 95 HAD ARRIVED IN TAMBWE COMMUNE GR 7653, 11 IN KITGOMA COMMUNE GR 7649 AND 3 IN MUKINGI COMMUNE GR 7160. THESE RETURNEES HAVE COME FROM BOTH GOMA AND GISENYI. TOMORROW THEY WILL TRANSFER SOME RETURNEES TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOME COMMUNES. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THERE WILL BE ACUTE SHORTAGE OF FOOD, HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND AGRICULTURE ITEMS. IT IS THEREFORE REQUESTED THAT HAC APPROACH THE NECESSARY NGOS TO CATER FOR THESE SHORTAGES.

B. MILOBS SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT ON 25 AUG THERE WERE NO REFUGEES TRANSPORTED FROM NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP TO COMMUNES IN THE CYANGUGU PREFECTURE. ALL AVAILABLE TRANSPORTATION WAS FERRYING THE REFUGEES TO BUTARE PREFECTURE. SECTOR HAS BEEN INFORMED THAT DISPERSION OF REFUGEES TO VARIOUS COMMUNES OF THE CYANGUGU PREFECTURE WILL RESUME ON SAT 26 AUG 95. A TOTAL OF 20 FORCED REPATRIATION WAS RECORDED ON 25 AUG 95, 64 TRANSPORTED TO TRANSIT CAMPS AND 1218 SENT TO THEIR COMMUNES.

C. SECTOR 5, 234 FORCED RETURNEES WERE REGISTERED ON 25 AUG 95. ALL WERE TRANSPORTED TO TRANSIT CAMPS. 1037 WERE DESPATCHED TO THEIR COMMUNES

IN KAYINZA COMMUNE GR 5784 THREE FRGF INFILTRATED INTO THE COMMUNE WITH ARMS ON 15 AUG 95 FROM ZAIRE AND ESCAPED BACK TO TANZANIA.

C. **OWN ACTIVITIES.** NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. **HUMANITARIAN** IN SECTOR 1B INDBATT TRANSPORTED FIVE TONS OF FOODSTUFFS FOR WFP FROM GITARAMA TO KAYENZI COMMUNE GR 8389 AND SAME TONS FROM GITARAMA TO NYABIKENKE COMMUNE GR 7292. REPS OF AFRICAN HOUSING REQUESTED FOR 60 PIECES OF PLASTIC SHEETS TO COVER 15,000 TILES THEY CONTRACTED IN THE PREFECTURE TO BUILD 10,000 HOUSES IN SURROUNDING COMMUNES. A. IN SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU, ON 21 AUG 95 BY 1700 HRS AT RUSIZI 1 GR 7624, RPA RECEIVED 261 REFUGEES WHICH WERE FORCED OUT OF ZAIRE BY ZAIRIAN FORCES. AS OF 1830 HRS SOME 460 REFUGEES ASSEMBLED AT RUSIZI 1 AND WERE EXPECTED TO SPEND THE NIGHT THERE UNDER RPA WATCH. THE CROSSING AT RUSIZI I WAS CLOSED AS OF 1830 HRS. THE SECTOR COMMANDER AND OTHER MILOBS PRESENT

WERE TOLD BY RPA TO RETURN MORNING OF 22 AUG FOR FURTHER INFORMATION AND TO MONITOR THE SITUATION. THE COMPLETE STRENGTH OF ADDITIONAL 500 EXPECTED BEFORE LAST LIGHT TODAY HAS NOT ENTIRELY MATERIALIZED. OUT OF THESE NUMBERS, SOME REFUGEES WERE SEEN WITH LUGGAGE, PRESUMABLY COMING FROM THE CAMPS, WHILE OTHERS HAD NO BELONGINGS WITH THEM, PRESUMABLY ASSEMBLED QUICKLY, OUTSIDE THE MAIN REFUGEE CAMPS.

B. 384 REFUGEES HAVE BEEN REPORTED AT NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP FROM 18 TO 21 AUG 95.

C. IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI ON 21 AUG 95, AT 900 HRS FOR CIVILIAN BUSES AND CARS ARRIVED AT THE BORDER CARRYING 250 REFUGEES FROM MUGANGA CAMP ACROSS THE BORDER. THE SITUATION AS AT 21 AUG 95 1700 HRS WAS:-

- 828 PERSONS HAS BEEN SENT IN UNHR AND NICOTY TRANSPORT TO KABALI TRANSIT CAMP (GR 3018).
- APPROX 600 PERSONS WILL AT THE BORDER POST AND SOME REFUGEES WERE STILL ARRIVING TRANSPORTED BY THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES.

D. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF RETURNEES ON 20 AUG WAS 181. OF THESE 127 WERE TRANSPORTED TO THE KABALI TRANSIT CAMP, 54 SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF AND PRISONERS FROM GOMA WERE TAKEN TO THE DETENTION CENTRE IN GISENYI. 13 CHILDREN HAD BEEN SEPERATED FROM THEIR PARENTS.

3. **MILITARY ACTIVITIES.**

A. **RPA/GENDARMERIE.** IN RUHENGERI ON 17 AUG 95 4 - 5 SOLDIERS FROM USA ALONG WITH RPA SOLDIERS WERE SEEN AT THE HOTEL COMPOUND WITHIN THE MILOB SECTOR HQ. THE SECTOR HUMANITARIAN OFFICER WENT TO DISCUSS WITH THEM BUT NO RESPONSE WAS GOT. HOWEVER THE SAME SOLDIERS WERE SEEN ON 20 AUG 95 WITH THE RPA SOLDIERS AT THE HOTEL COMPOUND.

B. **FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.** MILOBS SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT ON 19 AUG AT ABOUT 0100 HRS THREE BANDITS CAME ON BOAT. ON THIER WAY TO THE MAIN ROAD THERE WERE CHALLENGED BY THE RPA, NEAR ISHARA-NYAMASHEKE ROAD JUNCTION GR 08417. BANDITS TRIED TO RUN AWAY. RPA OPENED FIRE AND KILLED ONE OF THEM.

C. **OWN ACTIVITIES.**

(1) MILOB TEAMS CONDUCTED PATROL IN ALL SUB SECTORS INCLUDING THE BORDER POSTS AND REPORTED THE SITUATION AS CALM.

4. **HUMANITARIAN**

A. MILOBS FROM SECTOR 2B KIBUNGO REPORTED THAT GHANBATT DONATED SOME FOOD ITEMS TO KIBUNGO ORPHANAGE.

B SECTOR 2A MILOB REPORTED THAT AT MUHURA COMMUNE AN NGO NAMED AS INTER SOS, CARRIED OUT A VACCINATION PROGRAMME TO 200 CHILDREN OF BETWEEN 4 AND 9 MONTHS. THE TARGETED FIGURE IS ABOUT 1000 AND THE PROGRAMME WOULD CONTINUE AT THE BEGINNING OF NEXT WEEK.

C. AT KINYAMI COMMUNE IN SECTOR 2A MILOB REPORTED THAT THERE IS ONLY ONE HEALTH CENTRE. IT HAS RUN SHORT OF WATER AND THE STAFF BUY WATER AT THE COST OF 30 RFR TO SUSTAIN THE CENTRE. "PAM" THE ONLY NGO WORKING IN THE CENTRE

DISTRIBUTED FOOD AMONG THE PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHERS.

D. A TOTAL OF 137 LOCAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED IN AOR.

5. **CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.**

(A) SECTOR 5B MILOB REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION HELD A MEETING WITH THE PREFECT, RPA BDE AND BN COMMANDERS, BDE COMMANDER GENDAMARIE, UNHCR STAFF AT GISENYI AND THE CHIEF OF UNHCR FROM KIGALI. THE AGENDA OF MEETING WAS TO WORK OUT THE METHODOLOGY TO ACCOMMODATE THE LARGE NUMBER OF RETURNEES ARRIVING AT THE BORDER.

(B) MILOBS SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU REPORTED THAT ON 19 AUG 95 IN THE AFTERNOON A GROUP OF 42 RWANDAN REFUGEES ALLEGED TO BE THIEVES BY THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES WERE FORCIBLY PUSHED INTO RWANDA AT RUSIZI 1 GR 7624. THE REFUGEES WERE BROUGHT ALL TIED UP AND CHAINED BY THE ZAIRIAN SOLDIERS ACCOMPANYING THEM. THEY WERE GENERALLY YOUNG MEN OF 20 - 30 YEARS OLD AND WERE MAINLY HUTUS. THEY WERE DISMOUNTED AT GUN POINT AND WERE FORCED TO ENTER INTO RWANDA. RPA ON THE SPOT OBJECTED BUT FAILED TO DO ANYTHING AND THE REFUGEES WERE TAKEN INTO THE RWANDAN SIDE BY THE RPA AND AN ATTEMPT BY THE UNHCR TO CONTACT THEM OR TO KNOW WHERE THEY WERE BEING TAKEN WAS WARDED OFF BY ANGRY RPA SOLDIERS. SUBSEQUENTLY THE RETURNEES WERE TAKEN AWAY BY THE RPA AT ABOUT 1830 HRS TO AN UNKNOWN DESTINATION. ATTEMPTS TO KNOW THE WHEREABOUT OF THE RETURNEES ON 20 AUG 95 BY OWN PATROLS AND OTHER AGENCIES HAVE ALSO PROVED FUTILE.

(C) AT ABOUT 1800 HRS ON 19 AUG MILOB GISENYI CAME TO KNOW THAT A LARGE NUMBER OF RETURNEES TURNED UP AT THE BORDER POST NO - 1. TWO TEAMS WERE SENT IMMEDIATELY AND WAS CONFIRMED THAT ABOUT 150 - 200 RETURNEES WERE AT THE BORDER POST. RETURNEES INFORMED MILOB THAT THEY WERE FORCIBLY EVICTED FROM THE MUGUMBA CAMP AT ZAIRE BY THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES. THE RETURNEES WERE ALLOWED TO ENTER AT THE BORDER POST BUT KEPT FOR THE NIGHT FOR SECURITY REASONS. THIS INFORMATION WAS PASSED ON TO ALL CONCERNED INCLUDING THE RPA BN COMMANDER WHO LATER SAID THAT THIS WAS A NORMAL OCCURRENCE. HOWEVER THE SECTOR MILOBS, HR TEAMS, UNHCR AND THE NGO'S WERE ACTIVATED AT 0600 HRS TO MONITOR THE SITUATION AT BOTH BORDER POST. IT WAS LEARNT THAT APPROX 180 RETURNEES WERE PRESENT AT BORDER POST NO 1 (GR 159126) WAITING TO BE CLEARED. HOWEVER ONLY 14 RETURNEES WERE FORMALLY REGISTERED TODAY AS AT 1500 HRS. A TOTAL OF 127 RETURNEES WERE TRANSFERRED TO KABALE TRANSIT CAMP (GR 3018). THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITY RELEASED A TOTAL OF 37 PRISONERS FROM THE GOMA PRISON OUT OF WHICH 15 WERE UNDER 15 YEARS OLD AND 17 WERE BELIEVED TO BE THE MEMBERS OF FRGF. THEIR LOCATION COULD NOT BE CONFIRMED BUT REPORT WOULD FOLLOW ASP.

6. **SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL** MEMISA STAFF AT MURUNDA SQ

3088 REPORTED THAT THE MINE EXPLOSION ON 18 AUG 95 WAS MEANT TO GET THE STAFF OF MEMISA. THIS WAS TOLD TO THEM BY A TRUSTED LOCAL STAFF. HOWEVER A FORMAL HELI REQUEST WAS FORWARDED TO THE MOV CON AND THE STAFF WERE EVACUATED AT 1440 HRS TODAY.

7. REGIONAL. BURUNDI: WE ARE RECEIVING MORE INDICATORS TO SUGGEST THE FRGF MAY BE INCREASING ITS ATTENTION TO NORTHWESTERN BURUNDI. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THAT REGION HAS BEEN DETERIORATING WITH ESCALATION IN THE FIGHTING BETWEEN BURUNDIAN ARMED FORCES AND BURUNDIAN HUTU GUERRILLAS (LEONARD NYANGOMA'S FDD: FRONT FOR THE DEFENCE OF DEMOCRACY). IT IS ASSESSED THAT RWANDAN HUTU MILITIA AND PROBABLY FRGF HAVE BEEN ASSISTING BURUNDIAN HUTU IN PAST AND PRESENT DESTABILIZATION OPERATIONS. IF THE HUTU GUERRILLAS GAIN CONTROL OVER THIS REGION, THEY WOULD LIKELY ASSIST FRGF TO INCREASE ITS THREAT OF SECTOR 4'S SOUTHERN FLANK.

HE FURTHER COMPLAINED THAT LOCALS WITHIN THE AREA GO AND COLLECT THESE EXPIRED FOOD ITEMS

THE TEAM FURTHER CONFIRMED THAT 185 FAMILIES OF APPROXIMATELY 300

PERSONS WHO REFUSED TO BE EVACUATED ON THE ALLEGATION THAT THEIR HOME COMMUNES ARE NOT SAFE IS NOT TRUE. RATHER THE IDPS ARE FOUND TO BE COMFORTABLE IN SUPPLY, AND GOOD HEALTH CARE IN THE CAMP. THE TEAM LEARNT THAT THOSE EVACUATED WERE PROVIDED WITH FARMING IMPLEMENTS BY TROCAIRE.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 63 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 2,331 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING TODAY WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM U.N. AGENCIES AND THE ICRC TO DISCUSS MEASURES AIMED AT IMPROVING CONDITIONS IN RWANDESE PRISONS. HE ALSO MET WITH THE DEPUTY PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA TO RECEIVE AN UPDATE ON THE TRIBUNAL'S OPERATIONS. LATER, HE HELD A MEETING WITH UNAMIR STAFF TO DISCUSS RADIO UNAMIR AND ITS TRANSMITTING CAPABILITIES INTO REFUGEE CAMPS NEIGHBOURING RWANDA.

B. THE PRESIDENTS OF RWANDA AND UGANDA SIGNED A JOINT COMMUNIQUE YESTERDAY IN KIGALI OUTLINING AREAS OF BILATERAL COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES. THEY ALSO CALLED FOR THE SPEEDY OPERATIONALISATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, THE CONVENING OF A REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, THE NEED FOR REGIONAL INTEGRATION AND MODERNIZATION, AS WELL AS AN END TO DIVISIVE AND SECTARIAN POLITICS BASED ON RELIGIOUS AND ETHNIC FACTORS.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN GISENYI THE RPA LO REPORTED THAT A SEARCH WAS CONDUCTED AROUND SOME PORTION OF GISHWATI FOREST. SOME HAND GRENADES, ANTI-TANK AND SOME ANTI-PERS MINES WERE RECOVERED.

(2) RPA CONDUCTED CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN GISENYI TODAY. SHOPS AND MARKETS WERE CLOSED AND MOV RESTRICTED UNTIL ABOUT MID-DAY.

(3) UNHCR HAS REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS WHO ARE GUARDING RETURNEES AT CYANGUGU REFUGEE TRANSIT CAMP ARE CREATING A FRIGHTFUL ATMOSPHERE ON THE RETURNEES,

INTIMIDATING THE LOCAL STAFF AND CALLING UNHCR FOREIGN STAFF CRIMINALS WHO ARE AIDING IN THE PERPETRATION OF CRIMES.

(4) IN GIHIGANO (9301) NEAR BUGARAMA CITY ALSO IN SECTOR 4, RPA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BURNT DOWN A HOUSE BELONGING TO A LOCAL. IT WAS ALLEGED THAT THE MAN REFUSED TO MEET RPA'S DEMAND WHICH WAS NOT MADE KNOWN. ANOTHER LOCAL WHO TRIED TO ASSIST TO PUT OFF THE FIRE WAS BEATEN UP.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. ON 17 AUG 95 AT 900HRS A TWIN ENGINED TURBOPROP AIRCRAFT OVERFLEW KAMEMBE SECTOR GR 7825 IN A NORTH TO SOUTH DIRECTION. IT WAS PROBABLY A BN 2 ISLANDER.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

D. IN THE SECTORS. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED. NSTR.

C. GHANBATT DONATED FOOD ITEMS TO KIBUNGO WATER WORKS PERS. PROVIDED ALSO 4 TCVS TO WFP FOR FOOD TRANSPORTATION.

D. NO IDP ARRIVED TO NDERA CAMP. 122 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR. 31 ARE WAITING FOR EVAC.

E. INDBATT PROVIDED THREE TRUCKS TO ARDEC AND WFP TO TRANSPORT FOOD ITEMS AND WOOD.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

1. **HIGHLIGHTS.**

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. **BORDER CROSSING:**

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 49 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 2,245 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES**

A. YESTERDAY, THE SRSG, MR. SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, RETURNED TO KIGALI FROM LEAVE AND RESUMED DUTIES OFFICIALLY.

B. THE PRESIDENT OF UGANDA, MR YOWERI MUSEVENI, IN A SPEECH BEFORE THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY YESTERDAY, APPEALED TO THE RWANDESE POPULATION TO AVOID SECTARIAN AND DIVISIVE TENDENCIES AND TO FORGE UNITY AMONG THEMSELVES. HE ALSO RECOMMENDED THAT IN ORDER TO STRENGTHEN THE RWANDESE ECONOMY, THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SHOULD PROMOTE THE PRIVATISATION OF STATE ENTERPRISES.

C. MILOB RUHENGARI REPORTED THAT THE PRESIDENTS OF RWANDA AND UGANDA WHILE GOING TO GISENYI STOPPED ON THE ROAD IN FRONT OF RUHENGARI PREFECT OFFICE FOR ABOUT 5 MINUTES TO GREET THE PEOPLE. AROUND 2,000 PEOPLE WERE PRESENT TO WELCOME BOTH THE PRESIDENTS ALONG THE ROAD.

D. SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) MILOB REPORTED THAT THE PRESIDENTS OF RWANDA AND UGANDA VISITED GISENYI TODAY. THEY ADDRESSED THE PEOPLE AT GISENYI STADIUM. THE UGANDAN PRESIDENT EXPRESSED HIS SUPPORT FOR THE POLICIES PURSUED BY THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT. HE ALSO CALLED FOR THE INTERNATIONAL SUPPORT IN THE PROSECUTION OF THOSE WHO COMMITTED THE GENOCIDE, ADDING THAT RWANDA SHOULD REFRAIN FROM A BLIND KIND OF REVENGE. HE HOWEVER STATED THAT THE INTERAHAMWE MUST STAY IN ZAIRE.

3. **MILITARY ACTIVITIES.**

A. **RPA/GENDARMERIE.**

(1) MILOB FROM SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT AT NYAMASHEKE SUB SECTOR, JOINT PATROLLING IS BEING UNDERTAKEN AT NIGHT BY THE LOCALS ALONG WITH THE RPA. THIS COMMENCED APPROX ONE WEEK BACK. SIMILAR PATROL WAS REPORTED AT CYANGUGU SUB

SECTOR.

(2) SECTOR 3B MILOB REPORTED THAT AROUND 1830 Hrs on 14 AUG 95, SIX VANS LOADED WITH TROOPS AND LUGGAGES WERE SEEN REFUELING AT THEIR GARAGE IN BUTARE AND LATER OBSERVED HEADING TOWARDS GIKONGORO. PRESUMABLY HEADING FOR THE ZAIRIAN BORDER.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) A COMBINED PATROL OF MILOBS AND UNHCR CONFIRMED THE REPORTS OF INFILTRATION OF ARMED PERSONS IN RUKARA COMMUNE (SQ 5601) FROM TANZANIA MOSTLY IN THE LAST MONTH. IT IS FURTHER REPORTED THAT A NUMBER OF LOCALS WERE KILLED DURING THE INCURSIONS IN THE SAME PERIOD. EXTENT OF THREAT, FREQUENCY AND IDENTITY TO BE INVESTIGATED.

(2) SECTOR 4 MILOB CYANGUGU REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 1000 Hrs on 10 AUG 95, A GROUP OF 6 BANDITS ATTACKED A HOUSE IN MPMGA SECTOR SQ 9408 IN BUGARAMA COMMUNE. THE BANDITS ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM BURUNDI AND WERE REPORTEDLY ARMED WITH SMALL ARMS AND MACHETES. THEY KILLED A MAN BY SMALL ARMS FIRE AND FLED INTO BURUNDI WITH 3 COWS.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) MILOBS REPORTED THAT NORD SUD (NGO) CONTINUES TO ASSIST FARMERS IN RUSHASHI COMMUNE. AFRICARE IS PROVIDING MEDICINES TO THE CLINIC IN THE SAME COMMUNE.

C. SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE SHORTAGE OF MEDICINE IN ZAZA HEALTH CENTRE (SQ 4859) RUN BY IMC IS STILL OUTSTANDING. ICRC DISTRIBUTED PLATES AND MUGS IN RUKARA COMMUNE (SQ 5601).

D. MILOBS FROM SECTOR 3B BUTARE REPORTED THAT THE STAFF MEMBERS OF KABILIZI CLINIC GR 5935 COMPLAINED THAT THEY LAST GOT WAGES IN MAY 95. THE CLINIC ALSO REQUESTED FOR AID IN WATER SUPPLY. A GERMAN NGO RHENANIE PALATINE HAS DONATED 1,500 Pcs roofing tiles to RUNYINYA COMMUNE WHICH ARE STILL IN KIGALI. THE BOURGEMESTRE ASKED FOR ASSISTANCE TO TRANSPORT

THE MATERIALS FROM KIGALI.

E. 64 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE. 40 WERE
DESPATCHED BY UNHR TO KIBUNGO. 214 ARE STILL
WAITING FOR EVAC.

F. INDBATT PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF
WOOD FOR COOKING BRICKS.

B. THE DEPUTY PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA HAS ANNOUNCED THAT THE TRIBUNAL'S CHIEF PROSECUTOR AND PRESIDENT WOULD BE VISITING RWANDA AT THE END OF AUGUST TO HOLD TALKS WITH SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT ON 7 AUG 95, THE COMMISSION ON REPATRIATION COMPOSED OF REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA AND TANZANIA, AND UNHCR, BEGAN A WORKING VISIT TO BURUNDI AND TANZANIA IN AN EFFORT TO URGE RWANDESE REFUGEES TO RETURN HOME.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) RPA CONDUCTED A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION NEAR SECT 1 MILOBS HQ IN KIGALI. THIS WAS IN RESPONSE TO GUNSHOTS THAT WERE FIRED THE PREVIOUS NIGHT (10 AUG 95). NO FURTHER INFORMATION AVAILABLE.

(2) IN SECTOR 1 GITARAMA TWO FEMALE OFFICERS WERE SUBJECTED TO A DETAILED SEARCH, INCLUDING THEIR DOCUMENTS.

(3) MILOBS RUHENGURI WERE INFORMED THAT RECENTLY 300 ANTI PERSONNEL MINES WERE DEMINED BY ONLY THREE RPA SOLDIERS, ALONG THE BORDER WITH UGANDA/ZAIRE IN VOLCANO

MOUNTAIN AREA UNDER KINIGI AND NKUMBA COMMUNES. THIS WAS CONFIRMED BY THE RPA LO.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) CASES OF BANDITRY WERE REPORTED IN GIKONI SECTOR GR 5237, GIKONGORO, RESULTING IN THE LOSS OF COWS AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS BY THE VICTIMS.

(2) ON 10 AUG SIX BANDITS CARRIED OUT AN ARMED ROBBERY AT KIRANGA GR 7908, IN SECTOR 4, GISHOMA COMMUNE. THEY RAN AWAY WITH THREE COWS.

(3) ON 9 AUG 95 AT ABOUT 2130 THERE WAS AN ATTEMPTED SABOTAGE ON AN ELECTRIC PYLON CLOSED TO THE COMMUNE OFFICE OF KIBILIRA GR 5785, IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI. MINOR DAMAGES WERE RECORDED.

(4) SOME UNIDENTIFIED PERSONNEL TRIED TO ROB THE HOUSE OF WORLD CONCERN INTERNATIONAL NEAR HOTEL MERIDIEN, KIGALI. RRF WAS CALLED FOR AT 102030 HRS, BUT THE INTRUDERS FLED AWAY BEFORE RRF'S ARRIVAL ON THE SITE. NOTHING WAS STOLEN HOWEVER, OCCUPANTS OF THE HOUSE REPORTED SOUND OF SINGLE SHOT HEARD FROM THE OUTSIDE GATE.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES.

(1) FC MET WITH TWO FRENCH JOURNALISTS TO DISCUSS THE GENERAL SITUATION IN RWANDA.

2. HE ALSO GRANTED AN INTERVIEW OVER THE TELEPHONE WITH VOA, WASHINGTON, ON THE ALLEGED BUILD-UP OF TROOPS ON THE ZAIRIAN BORDER.

D. IN THE SECTORS NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED. NSTR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SIG COY PROVIDED 1 TRUCK FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM SHELI TO RUNDA AND RUNDA TO GIHARA ON THE REQUEST OF A LOCAL ORGANISATION - ARDEC.

B. TWO MILOBS, FROM SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU, MAJ MICHAEL KANTARIA AND MAJ IDRISSE TRAORE DONATED BLOOD AT THE GIHUNDI HOSPITAL FOR A WOMAN WHO WOULD BE UNDERGOING SURGERY.

C. A TOTAL OF 175 MEDICAL AND 20 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE GIVEN MEDICAL ASSISTANCE THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY THE MEDICAL CENTRES IN THE VARIOUS SECTORS.

D. 16 IDPS ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI. 82 WERE

DESPATCHED BY UNHCR.

DAILY SITREP FOR 10 AUG 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 64 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 1,791 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA FOLLOWING HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO BELGIUM, THE RWANDESE FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, STATED WITH REGARD TO THE REPORTED BELGIAN PROPOSAL FOR A NATIONAL DIALOGUE WITH RWANDESE REFUGEES, THAT NO DIALOGUE WAS NECESSARY AS THE PRINCIPLES OF THE ARUSHA ACCORD, INCLUDING DEMOCRACY, POWER-SHARING AND NATIONAL RECONCILIATION, WERE ALREADY THE BASIS FOR THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT'S ACTIONS. ON THE PROPOSAL FOR A REGIONAL CONFERENCE TO DISCUSS THE PROBLEM OF REFUGEES, MR. GASANA STATED THAT, FOLLOWING THE CONCLUSIONS OF THE NAIROBI SUMMIT AND THE BUJUMBURA MEETING, NO CONFERENCE OF THE KIND WAS NEEDED EXCEPT FOR A MEETING TO COLLECT FUNDS FOR PURPOSES OF FINANCING REFUGEE REPATRIATION.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN KIGALI CITY CENTRE IT WAS REPORTED THAT SOME OPERATORS OF ILLEGAL BUREAU D'ECHANGE WERE ARRESTED BY GENDARMES FOR ENGAGING IN THE EXCHANGE OF FOREIGN CURRENCY IN THE BLACK MARKET. IT WAS GATHERED THAT THERE IS A DIRECTIVE GIVE BY PREFECT OF KIGALI TO ARREST ANYONE FOUND CHANGING FOREIGN CURRENCY IN BLACK MARKET NO MATTER HIS/HER STATUS OR NATIONALITY.

(2) RPA PREVENTED SECT 4 MILOBS PATROL TEAM TO RUSIZI I FROM CROSSING THE FOOT BRIDGE TO OBTAIN REFUGEE FIGURES FROM UNHCR OFFICE ON ZAIRIAN SIDE AS HAD BEEN THE CASE. MILOBS WERE TOLD TO OBTAIN FIGURES FROM UNHCR OFFICE IN CYANGUGU.

(3) SECTOR 1 (GITARAMA) RPA IMPLICATED IN MURDER OF ONE

LOCAL, IN MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE (GR 8274) ON 07 AUG 95 ACCORDING TO FINDINGS OF A JOINT MILOB/CIVPOL INVESTIGATING TEAM. ALSO A BELGIAN SISTER INFORMED MILOBS THAT RPA ARRESTED 2 GATE GUARDS WHO WERE AT THE HOUSE OF THE RWANDESE PRIEST KILLED IN KAMONYI SECTOR LAST WEEK.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NSTR.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES.

(1) FC MET WITH DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RIGHTS WATCH AND THEY DISCUSSED THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM OF THE RWANDESE PRISONS.

(2) HE ALSO MET WITH UNREO REPRESENTATIVES TO DISCUSS POSSIBLE ACTIONS NEEDED TO BE TAKEN TO IMPROVE THE CONDITIONS IN THE RWANDESE PRISONS.

IN THE SECTORS

(1) NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) SECTOR 2 MILOBS BYUMBA REPORTED A MEETING AT KIBUNGO BETWEEN BOURGMESTRES AND SHOPKEEPERS IN THE PREFECTURE AT THE PREFECTS OFFICE. PAYMENT OF TAXES AND RENT BY THE SHOPKEEPERS WERE DISCUSSED.

(3) SECTOR 3 MILOBS GIKONGORO REPORTED THAT THE NEW BOURGMESTRE OF MUKO COMMUNE (GR 3841) WHO WAS APPOINTED FOLLOWING DEMONSTRATIONS AGAINST THE OLD ONE ASSUMED OFFICE EFFECTIVE 07 AUG 95. THE FORMER WHO WAS ACCUSED OF ADMINISTRATIVE MALPRACTICE IS REPORTEDLY IN DETENTION AT GIKONGORO.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 3 MILOBS GIKONGORO REPORTED THAT 499 PERSONS WERE EVACUATED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNE IN MUBUGA (GR 5202) FROM MURAMBI IDP CAMP (GR 5125) BRINGING THE TOTAL NUMBER EVACUATED SINCE THE PROGRAMME BEGAN 4 DAYS AGO TO 953. UNHCR, ICRC, MALICOY AND SOLIDARITY CONTINUE TO PROVIDE FOOD, MEDICAL SUPPORT AND TRANSPORTATION TO THE RETURNEES. HOWEVER SOME IDPS INTERVIEWED, WHO WERE REGISTERED TO GO TO RWAMIKO COMMUNE (GR 4914) EXPRESSED FEAR OF INSECURITY AND THEREFORE OPTED TO BE TAKEN TO KIBEHO (GR 5107).

B. IN SECTOR 3 (BUTARE) BOURGMESTRE OF RUNYINYA COMMUNE (GR 6012) HAS REQUESTED THAT ONE HUNDRED ORPHANS OF BETWEEN TWO (02) AND TWELVE (12) YEARS IN THE AREA BE MOVED TO AN ORPHANAGE BECAUSE OTHER FAMILIES KEEPING THEM WERE UNABLE TO PROVIDE FOR THEIR BASIC NEEDS.

C. A TOTAL OF 408 MEDICAL AND 14 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. THE BOURGMESTRE OF RUNYINYA COMMUNE INFORMED SECTOR 3 MILOBS BUTARE OF BIG POPULATION INCREASE IN THE COMMUNE FROM A PREVIOUS 13,000 TO ABOUT 30,600. MANY OF THE RETURNEES WERE FROM ZAIRE AND BURUNDI.
6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL NSTR.
7. LOGISTICS RESTRICTIONS LIFTED AND ALL ISSUING FACILITIES OPEN.
8. CASUALTIES ONE NIGERIAN SOLDIER WAS WOUNDED DURING A DEMONSTRATION/TRAINING SESSION WHEN A FUSE EXPLODED.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. **RPA/GENDARMERIE.** SECTOR 1 GITARAMA, REPORTED AN INCREASE OF RPA PRESENCE IN GITARAMA CITY AND KABGAYI.

B. FRGF\MILITIA\BANDITRY.

(1) ON 8 AUG 95 10 TO 15 MEN ,SOME OF THEM IN UNIFORM, KILLED A LOCAL FROM KAMAYANZA CELLULE GR 8277, IN MUSAMBIRA SECTOR GR 8275, GITARAMA PREFECTURE. THE VICTIM'S WIFE WAS HIT ON THE HEAD.

(2) IN SECTOR 4 AT KIRANGIRA (GR 9300), UNHR REPORTED THAT FOUR BODIES OF SUSPECTED FRGF SOLDIERS WHO WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN SHOT BY RPA SLDRS WERE PHOTOGRAPHED BY UNIDENTIFIED UN PERSONNEL. JOINT INVESTIGATION BY MILOBS AND UNHCR AND DETAILS TO FOLLOW.

(3) IN SECTOR 5, GISENYI, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 08 AUG 95 AT AROUND 2330 HRS, RPA WENT TO A HOUSE WHERE A MEETING WAS BEING HELD BY PEOPLE ALLEGEDLY SUPPORTING THE PREVIOUS GOVT. A GRENADE WAS LOBBED FROM THE HOUSE WHICH PROMPTED THE RPA TO OPEN FIRE, KILLING TWO PEOPLE AND TWO OTHERS WERE APPREHENDED. ONE PERSON ESCAPED.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES.

(1) FC VISITED MALAWICOY AT SHAGASHA IN SECTOR 4 TO MEET THE TROOPS AND ACQUAINT HIMSELF WITH PROGRESS SINCE THEIR ARRIVAL ON 06 AUG 95. DURING BRIEFING, THE MILOB SECTOR COMD STATED THAT THE TENSION WHICH EXISTED BETWEEN

MALAWICOY AND THE RPA WAS GRADUALLY BEING RESOLVED.

(3) OTHER SECTORS NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. IN SECT 5, RUHENGARI WFP DELIVERED 40 TONS OF FOOD TO THE GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL.

B. IN SECTOR 4, UNHCR REPS FROM NYAGATARA TRANSIT CAMP REVEALED THAT BETWEEN 14 AND 16 AUG 95, 200 REFUGEES WOULD BE TRANSFERRED FROM IJWI ISLAND TO NYAMASHEKE SECTOR (GR 9841). THOSE WHO WISH TO RETURN TO THEIR COMMUNES WILL BE REPATRIATED.
