This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of 25 February
with attached copy of a letter from Mr. Chester M. Williamson
of Mission, Texas.

As you are probably aware, Mr. Williamson's nephew, Corporal
Valio Aapa Lunkkainen, as a member of the Finnish Army, would
not be under UNRRA care, even if he was in the Western part of
Europe. It may be assumed that the soldier, if still alive,
would be under Russian authority. The only possible way in
which the young man could be traced would be via the National
Tracing Bureau of the USSR at the following address:

Dear Mr. West:

I am in receipt of your letter of 2 October enclosing a letter from Mr. M. H. Clark of Laredo, Texas, requesting information regarding the feeding of the German people.

The Director General of UNRRA has no authority, under the terms laid down by the member governments at their several council meetings, to provide any relief to German civilians although UNRRA does have a substantial staff in Germany assisting the military in taking care of the displaced persons found in Germany and Austria.

The question of relief for the German civilian population is at present a matter for the Allied Control Commissions in each of the zones of occupation.

We are returning herewith the letter from Mr. M. H. Clark to you.

We are also enclosing UNRRA In Outline and Up-to-Date, which is a summary of current operations, and Out of the Chaos, a popular description of our work in general, which we believe you will find of interest.
