D. MALAWI COY SENT PATROLS TO BORDER POSTS AT KAYNEA (CR 6231) AND NCOZI (CR 6081) AND REPORTED THAT MANY LOCALS ARE NOW REPORTING BACK TO THEIR VILLAGES. ANOTHER PATROL WAS SENT TO NYAKIZU (CR 5796) AND REPORTED THAT THE GENERAL SITUATION IS CALM THOUGH THE LOCALS COMPLAINED OF LACK OF MEDICAL ATTENTION AND GOOD SCHOOL AND STATIONERY FOR THEIR PUPILS.

MANPOWER REQUIREMENT  
AT TACTICAL HEADQUARTERS BUTARE

1. When the Tactical Headquarters was established in Aug 94, its main objective has been collection, collation and rapid dissemination of information to UNAMIR HQ for effective planning.

2. In order to achieve the set objectives, the office was equipped with good and reliable communication sets and correspondingly good radio operators, although some of the equipments had been dismantled. Subsequently officers were drafted to the headquarters for effective operation.

3. The equipment in use are:

- a. 2 x VHF radio sets, one on the FC's net, while the other is on Sector Comd's net.
- b. 1 x radio on channels linked with Military Observers, UNCHR and Non Governmental Organisations.
- c. 1 x INMARSAT.

4. The effective operation of above mentioned equipment were facilitated by about 21 Canadian operators. The strength is now reduced to 4 operators. For effective coverage, the equipment were manned for 24 hours daily. The same equipment are now manned by 4 operators. Obviously the result may not be the same.

5. Most of the officer pioneers of the Headquarters have been reassigned. The expectation is that the corresponding number of officers reassigned would replace them. Pertinent to say that 2 of the officers sent to Tac HQ now cannot communicate effectively in English language whereas the business of the office is conducted in English language. This makes their deployment to Tac HQ irrelevant since they cannot perform the functions they were here for.

6. Furthermore, it is now a fact that the Canadian signallers would be leaving the operational area early next year. In order not to create a vacuum, it is suggested that qualified signallers from other units should be seconded to this HQ to understudy the

procedure so that the transitional period would be smooth, not only at Tac HQ but also in other sectors.

7. It is also suggested that officers who cannot be effectively employed here as a result of language difficulties should be recalled to Kigali for re-assignment.

THIS WAS LATER CONFIRMED BY THE RUNINYA BOURGMESHE WHO SAID THAT THE PEOPLE WHO CAME TO PICK UP THE LOCALS FROM THEIR HOMES WERE EIGHT IN NUMBER AND ONE OF THEM WAS IN MILITARY UNIFORM AND HAD A RIFLE WITH HIM.

C. THE FOCRCE MEDICAL OFFICER VISITED THE PLATOON LOC IN KIGEMBE AND THE COY HQS LOC IN BUTARE.

D. ANOTHER PATROL WAS SENT TO NYAMIGABA (GR 5713) AND REPORTED THAT THOUGH THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS CALM IN THE AREA, THERE ARE INCREASED ACTS OF THEFT WHICH THREATEN THE LOCALS OF THEIR PROPERTY AND SAFETY.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

SUBJ: INFOSUM 25 NOV 94

1. DURING THE 24 NOV, CANADIANS PARTICIPATING IN OP HOMEWARD WITNESSED ACTS OF BANDITRY BY RPA SOLDIERS. UPON LEAVING KADUHA CAMP (477432), TRUCKS WERE STOPPED AND 12 X BIKES, 1 X MATTRESS, 3 X RADIOS AND 2 X WHEEL BARROWS WERE TAKEN FROM DP'S IN THE UNHCR AND IOM VEHICLES. 1 X BICYCLE WAS TAKEN FROM THE CDN CONVOY. THE REASON GIVEN WAS THAT THE OWNERS HAD NO PROOF OF PURCHASE, ALTHOUGH THE DP IN THE CDN CONVOY DID PRODUCE A RECEIPT. AN RPA SOLDIER CHECKING A CDN TRUCK PRODUCED A GRENADE IN FRONT OF THE DP'S AND TWICE DROPPED IT IN THE BACK OF THE TRUCK. 1123 DPS WERE MOVED THIS DAY. THIS ACTION CAUSED FEAR AND PANIC.

2. ON THE 25 NOVE OP HOMEWARD RETURNED TO KADUHA CAMP. WORD OF THE RPA'S BANDITRY HAD SPREAD AND ONLY 16 DP'S WERE WILLING TO GET ON THE TRUCKS. THE BUTARE RPA LO VISITED KADUHA CAMP AND TALKED TO THE LOCAL RPA SOLDIER IN CHARGE SGT SHERIFF NINJA. ACCIDENT INVOLVING UNAMIR VEH # BR 62  
AT GIKONGORO ON THUR 17 NOV 94

1. At 0530 hrs on Thur 17 Nov 94, Sgt Nani CK UNID M1338 and Cpl Oppong - Boakye UNID M1341 left the Ghana Supply Platoon location at the University Campus in Butare for Gikongoro on routine water delivery duties. The two were going to take water from the water point in Gikongoro. Gikongoro is the only point in the sector where the tanker can safely take water as the recent rains have rendered the route to the Butare water point unmotorable.
2. After taking the water, Sgt Nani and Cpl Oppong - Boakye set out for the Christ Roi School at Nyanza (GR 1140) when, while going downhill at a point four kilometers from Gikongoro, the driver detected that the brakes of the vehicle were not functioning. All efforts to bring the truck to a halt failed. In a desperate effort by the driver to avoid plunging into the valley, the water truck crushed into the hillside and fell on its side.
3. As a result of the accident, the water truck got badly damaged and was recovered and towed by Britcon engineers to Ghanbatt location in Gikongoro (sector 4A).
4. The driver and his escort sustained head injuries and are receiving treatment at Ghanbatt location in Gikongoro.
5. Ghanbatt Military Police have started preliminary investigations and will submit its report soonest.

Monsieur l'Abbé,

Nous avons appris avec consternation le décès tragique de notre confrère le père Claude Simard. Nous savons, par le Ministère des affaires étrangères du Canada, qu'il a été tué dans la nuit du 17 octobre et qu'il a été inhumé deux jours plus tard, probablement dans le cimetière de sa paroisse de Ruyenzi.

Hier j'ai envoyé l'information aux religieux de notre province ainsi qu'aux membres de la famille du père Simard. Ce matin, nous avons décidé que les funérailles auraient lieu jeudi le 27 à l'Oratoire Saint-Joseph. En plus des confrères en Sainte-Croix et des membres de la famille, il y aura sûrement plusieurs religieux et religieuses canadiens qui ont oeuvré au Rwanda. Que le Seigneur garde Claude dans sa paix!

En ouvrant le dossier du père Simard, j'ai trouvé son testament dûment signé le 22 novembre 1989 en présence de deux témoins. Je vous remets une copie de ce testament. Les dispositions pour ce qui regarde ses biens matériels sont très simples : 1) Il laisse à notre province religieuse tout ce qu'il pourrait posséder au Canada. Ça se résume à pratiquement rien. 2) Il lègue tous ses biens qui pourraient se trouver au Rwanda à vous-même. Vous pouvez donc en montrant ce testament et cette lettre que je vous envoie procéder ouvertement et officiellement pour la disposition des biens. J'imagine qu'il y a une jeep, des meubles, des livres, des classeurs, etc. Vous êtes probablement au courant de ses affaires. Vous saurez donc discerner ce qui est argent d'honoraires de messes, ou argent reçu de donateurs pour des fins missionnaires spécifiques. Vous avez entière liberté pour décider de tout selon les intentions mêmes du père Simard.

Je me permets de vous demander : 1) un certificat de décès; 2) des détails sur son décès et sur ses funérailles. On nous a dit que des soldats canadiens du MINUAR avaient aidé à l'identification de la dépouille et que des prêtres de la région s'étaient chargés des funérailles. Ces détails seraient appréciés autant pour les confrères que pour les membres de la famille. Vous avez probablement été partie prenante de toutes les démarches consécutives au décès.

Veuillez transmettre mes plus sincères condoléances à l'évêque de Butare qui perd un missionnaire tellement dévoué. Veuillez lui dire combien nous aussi nous avons de la peine du départ de ce confrère qui s'est montré si généreux. Au plus fort de la guerre, j'avais invité Claude à considérer un retour au Canada. Il avait préféré rester avec les siens. Que son sacrifice ne soit pas vain mais soit une semence pour la reconstruction spirituelle et économique de votre pays!

D'après le testament du père Simard, c'est l'économe de notre province religieuse qui est l'exécuteur testamentaire. Le père Guy Lavoie signe cette lettre avec moi pour dire son accord à tout ce qui précède.

Veuillez agréer, Monsieur l'Abbé, l'expression de mes meilleurs sentiments.

AT 051400HRS NOV A TAC HQ SOLDIER WITNESSED A CARITAS TRUCK BEING OFFLOADED WITH FOODSTUFFS INTO A SHOP IN BUTARE. THE SOLDIER CONTINUED ROUND THE BLOCK AND RETURNED TO THE SHOP BUT THE TRUCK HAD LEFT. HE WENT INTO THE SHOP AND SAW BAGS OF FLOUR ETC WHICH HAD COME OFF THE TRUCK. THE SHOP OWNER APPEARED TO RESENT THE PRESENCE OF UNAMIR TROOPS AND CLOSED HIS SHOP. COMMENT: IT HAS BEEN NOTED THAT MOST OF THE SHOPS IN BUTARE USUALLY HAVE AN RPA PRESENCE AND MAY ACTUALLY BE OWNED BY THEM. NO CONNECTION BETWEEN THE TWO INCIDENTS HAS BEEN CONFIRMED.
