Reference:

- A. Your fax dated 12 September 1994
- B. Our outgoing fax 329 dated 19 June 1994
- C. Our outgoing fax 388 dated 27 June 1994
- D. Our outgoing fax 1266 dated 15 August 1994

1. **Introduction** - Under Security Council resolution 928(1994) of 20 June 1994, UNOMUR will be closed down on completion of its extended mandate period on 21 September 1994 with the gradual reduction of observers in phases by adjusting operational requirement.

2. **Aim** - The aim of this draft instruction is to outline the operational and administrative procedures that has been followed/being followed to effect the disbandment.

3. **Operational** - In the light of reference B and D, the reduction plan and transfer of observers to UNAMIR vis-à-vis the operational activities have already been implemented and will be completed by 19th September 1994.

- a. **Revised Plan**: Due to the decision/requirement of transfer of some UNMOs to UNAMIR and travel arrangements made on the basis of availability of flights, an uptodate repatriation/transfer plan of UNMOs is given at Annex A to this Instruction.
- b. **Implementation**: On a perusal of Annex A, Phase I to III have already been implemented. We are now in Phase IV with 34 UNMOs (including 3 members medical team). In view of the closing ceremony which is scheduled to be held on 20th September 1994 and to ensure closing of the CPs/OPs in a systematic manner with limited number of

administration staff and only one truck available with us, the following will be closed as under:

4. **Administrative** - Draft closing scheduled prepared by administration staff was faxed vide reference C. With the closure of the Mission, the assets and all permanent civilian staff of UNOMUR will be transferred/integrated to UNAMIR.

a. UNMOs

- (1) Vehicles, radios, equipments issued to UNMOs have already been taken over by civilian staff and stored in the Logistics ware house/Support HQ from those who have already been repatriated to home country/transferred to UNAMIR.
- (2) "Check out procedure" as per Annex B is strictly followed before finally leaving the Mission Area.
- (3) Settlement of all financial claims (current/outstanding) for those already left have been done. For remainders, it will be followed accordingly.

b. Buildings/CPs/OPs: Hired and UN constructed structured are disposed off as under:

1. HQ Area West
2. HQ Area East
3. Kafunzo OP/CP
4. Lubirizi OP/CP

Returned to owners as per agreement with UNOMUR

5. Cyanika OP/CP
6. Mirama Hills OP/CP
7. Katuna OP/CP
8. Mission HQ
9. Logistics Ware House
/Support HQ
10. Helicopter Site

c. Transfer of Vehicles/Equipments

- (1) Already Transferred - Vehicles(total 6), equipments, furnitures which are not required for use in UNOMUR have already been transferred to UNAMIR.
- (2) Being Transferred - All other assets i.e. vehicles, radios, generators, office equipments, furnitures etc. are being transferred to UNAMIR as soon as they are no longer required for operational and administrative use by UNOMUR.

d. Liaison/Assistance Unit

- (1) To coordinate the movement of logistical support for UNAMIR through Uganda a small (2/3 members) "Liaison/Assistance Unit " may remain stationed at Kabale out of presently held UNOMUR civilian and technical staff.
- (2) To maintain the supply route by land for UNAMIR, Katuna crossing point is recommended for use due to all weather good road for heavy vehicles.
- (3) Besides a 2/3 members UNMOs from UNAMIR will also be stationed at Kabale to carry out liaison duties from 21 September 1994.

- (4) The "Liaison/Assistance Unit" may be housed in the present Logistics Ware House/Support HQ which is located in the heart of Kabale town.
- (5) The "Liaison/Assistance Unit" can perform required duties at Katuna border from Kabale which is at a distance of only 20 Km.
- (6) The "Liaison/Assistance Unit" will retain telephone/fax/computer, other office equipments, vehicles, generators as required to keep the unit functional for all purposes.

e. Transfer of Civilian Staff

- (1) All civilian and technical staff (total 17 including 7 locally recruited staff) will remain in Kabale until such time assets are transferred to UNAMIR and commitments with local authorities/owners are finalized. International staff will be transferred to UNAMIR once their services are no longer required in Kabale.
- (2) Contract and services of all (total 7) locally recruited staff will be terminated until their need ceased.

f. Transfer of Files/Documents Following military documents/correspondences which need to be preserved for future reference will be sent to HQ UNAMIR after the closure of the Mission for retention/further disposal to UN NYK. Routine and internal correspondences will be destroyed by burning before the closure.

- (1) All Code Cables
- (2) All important operational & administrative correspondence
- (3) All maps.

- g. UN Flag - UN Flag which will be lowered down from the Mission Headquarters through an "official ceremony" on 20th September 1994, marking the closure of UNOMUR will be despatched to UN NYK for preservation in the archive.

5. Conclusion - All UNMOs will be leaving the Mission Area by 25 September 1994. The closure of the civilian wing and their subsequent transfer to UNAMIR will take place immediately on completion all commitments as outlined above. This draft is forwarded to you as directed vide reference 'A' for kind perusal please.

GENERAL SITUATION

1. The situation appears generally calm with the citizens still having fears about what will happen when the FF will be withdrawn from RWANDA. There was a meeting arranged between the RPF and some prominent personalities of GIKONGORO. There was a meeting of the medical personnel of the NGOs at GIKONGORO. In Kibuye the population is getting ready to pull out unless UNAMIR troops arrived in town before the FF leave. Some are even trying to beat the 15 August deadline and are on their way to yungu.

FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

2. There was a meeting between the RPF and representatives of the initiative committee of the GIKONGORO area at the bridge over the river KIBOHO at the border of the HPI. Present at the meeting were the Commanding Officers of the FF bn, GHANEATT and UNMOs from the sector HQ.

MILITARY ACTIVITIES

3. The officers of the RPA are now appearing in military uniforms with badges of rank. A staff officer from the RPA HQ at BUTARE of the rank of a major and a captain, the prefect of Butare, who appears to have more command over politics addressed the meeting today as per para above.

4. Elements of the RPF are still being observed around CYANGUGU and its environs, most of them are unarmed without weapons although some are armed.

5. Firing is heard in the night in CYANGUGU township.

6. Because some communal police were allowed to carry weapons it seems that more people are being seen with weapons which will force the troops to check the written authorisations that were delivered when in front of armed persons.

FRENCH FORCES

7. The FF command organised the meeting as para and escorted the representatives for the meeting and back. FF escorted the Tass 3 and 4 for liaison visit at the sector HQ and back.

STRUCTURE AND DEPLOYMENT OF FF IN CYANGUGU AREA.

25. A meeting was held at the limit of HPZ between RPA representatives and representatives of the localities of the Gikongoro area. The command in command of Butare sector as well as the prefect did address the group and answer to questions. A debriefing with the members of the initiative committee is scheduled for tomorrow to get their impression about the issues that were discussed.

26. Following letter received from minister of justice through DFC visit concerning the return of former members of the ministry the following information is to be transmit to the minister :

- a. Ngilimana Martin is now in Kigali
- b. Rubaduka Jean, councillor to the state council is interested in going back if he is required
- c. Mutwareseibo Gabriel, president of 1st instance tribunal in Gikongoro would volunteer to work in Gikongoro
- d. other persons are still being look for

27. What will be the procedure for the population to obtain new ID card/passport, what are the rules for a Rwandese who want to leave the country ?

LOGISTICS

28. Gyangungu detachment will require tentage and camp beds for ten persons when FF pull out

29. Leave/CTO. This sector need to have a policy regarding the movement of officers going on leave/CTO. the following information is required:

- a. how many days before an officer should reach Kigali/Nairobi prior to his leave/CTO in order to have time to administer himself (pay , civilian flight reservation, etc??)
- b. Is it possible to book his name to go to Nairobi from Kigali by UN flight from this sector ?
- c. A copy of approved leave/CTO application should be sent to this HQ min a week before his leave/CTO commences in order to make proper arrangements to get the officer out of the sector.

30. Capt Appiah and Capt Ndlovu must be absent without authorisation if you are not able to send them here.

31. Two vehicles of sector 4 can not communicate on channel two as the radio's of these vehicles are not programmed. These vehicles moved out before the sector was deployed. Required that communication specialist be sent to programme the radio. Otherwise these vehicles need to be sent to Kigali for programming the radio which will effect the duty of the teams.

32. The vehicle antenna supplied with Base Station can not communicate to long distance. We need three long Base Station antennas.

SITUATION

1. Due to the possible security situation involving the safety of specific nationalities of UNMOs, it has been decided to withdraw them back to Nairobi until further notice. To compensate for their withdrawal a contingent of UNMOs is being deployed to replace the outgoing UNMOs.

MISSION

2. To redeploy the outgoing UNMOs to Nairobi and coordinate the move with the replacement deploying UNMOs from Nairobi.

EXECUTION

3. General Outline. The operation will be a six phase plan as follows:
- a. Phase 1: Move the 42 redeploying to the border using UNAMIR military transport.
 - b. Phase 2: Transfer from the military transport at the border to civilian transport and move to Entebbe.
 - c. Phase 3: At Entebbe airport transfer to the Canadian C130 and fly to Nairobi.
 - d. Phase 4: Fly the replacement deploying UNMOs from Nairobi to Entebbe.
 - e. Phase 5: Move the UNMOs to civilian transport from Entebbe to the border.
 - f. Phase 6: At the border transfer the UNMOs into UNAMIR military transport and move them to Kigali.
4. Coordinating Instructions.
- a. Tasks.
 - (1) Logistic Branch. Provide two buses and four trucks for Phase 1 and 6.
 - (2) Transport Section.
 - (a) Provide 1 x 45 seat coach and 2 x 5 ton trucks for Phases 2 and 5.
 - (b) Provide 1 x 45 seat bus and 2 x 5ton trucks to move the UNMOs from the airport to their accommodation.
 - (3) Air Operations. Provide C130 airlift for Phases 3 and 4.

(4) MOVCON.

- (a) Provide Customs and Immigration service in Phases 3 and 4.
- (b) Coordinate the exchange of the personnel between modes of transport.
- (c) Manifest the personnel for each stage of the movement.

(5) UNAMIR Nairobi.

- (a) Book accommodation for 42 X UNMOs arriving in Phase 3.
- (b) Arrange financial payment of MSA and DSA.



INTRODUCTION

1. The Military Observer group (MILOBs) of the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda (UNAMIR) came into being with the UN Security Council Resolution 872 of 05 Oct 93. That resolution allowed for the integration of the OAU sponsored Neutral Military Observer Group (NMOG). As NMOG was already on the ground, MILOBs became the first component of UNAMIR to deploy in Rwanda.
2. When UNAMIR became fully operational, the formed troops deployed in Kigali City and in the DMZ. The MILOBs Group on its part deployed throughout the country. The force level authorized at that time was 2548 including 331 Military Observers (UNMOs).
3. The build up of the MILOBs Group was slow, reaching a maximum strength of 253 by 6 Apr 94. The UNMOs came out of the following sixteen countries; Austria, Bangladesh, Canada Congo, Egypt, Fiji, Ghana, Malawi, Mali, Nigeria, Poland, Russia, Senegal, Togo, Uruguay and Zimbabwe.
4. By the time war broke out again on 6 Apr 94, the MILOB Group strength stood at 246 UNMOs. The Group was at that time organized and deployed in 5 sectors throughout the country.

5. Soon, the war forced the Security Council to reduce the force level of UNAMIR to about 500. Most formed troops were repatriated to their home countries. However, MILOBS Group was affected only to the extent that it had to withdraw 172 UNMOs to a standby position in Nairobi, Kenya. A residual strength of 74 remained in Rwanda.

6. On 17 May 1994, the Security Council adopted Resolution 918 increasing the force level to 5,500 troops with an expanded mandate. The MILOBs quota of this establishment is 320 UNMOs.

7. Meanwhile, the strength of the Group has been diminishing since the war began, due to various reasons including normal run-out, war casualties, voluntary repatriations and politically forced repatriations. It is expected to be only 194 strong by 01 Jul 94. It could even soon go down to about 146 if, as feared, some 48 UNMOs from Congo, Togo and Egypt are also repatriated for security reasons.

DEFUNCT MISSION OF MILOBS

8. Under the old mandate the MILOBs Group mission was to assist in and monitor the implementation of the ceasefire agreement; and to assist in the implementation of the Arusha Peace Accord of 04 August 1993. To execute this mission, MILOBs Group was organized into Group HQ based in Kigali and 5 Sectors with HQs in Kigali; Ruhengeri, Mulindi, Byumba and Butare. Plans were far advance to create a sixth Sector when war broke out. The five

sectors were, RPF Sector, DMZ Sector, RGF Sector, Kigali Sector and Sector South. Sector South was the one to be divided into Sector South-West and Sector South East.

9. Specific tasks assigned to the MILOBS Group during that mandate included:

- a. To locate, monitor, access evaluate and report on deployment, re-deployment and reinforcement of faction forces and their weapon systems.
- b. To monitor, investigate and report about ceasefire violations and violations of Arusha Peace Accord.
- c. To monitor, locate and report about presence of foreign forces within Area of Operation.
- d. To monitor and report about settlement of refugees and displaced persons within Area of Operation.
- e. To coordinate, assist and execute demobilization, cantonment and integration of faction forces.
- f. To escort humanitarian aid convoys and UNAMIR and other VIPs within Area of Operation on orders.

PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT

10. During the six months (Oct 93 - Apr 94) period of the operation of the first mandate, relations between UNAMIR as a whole and the two main factions in the Rwanda conflict were not the best. This stemmed out of mistrust of the force by both factions. The time was too short under the Rwandan circumstances to build the

required trust. But the main cause of this mistrust was a deep mistrust between the two factions themselves.

11. Even though, they had all signed the Arusha Peace Agreements, at least one side, if not both, was not fully committed to honouring it. Thus its implementation stalled at the end of December 1993 after the execution of the very first requirement. That was the movement of a 600 man battalion of the RPA from the Front's enclave in the North, to Kigali. MILOBs Group played an active part in the successful execution of that movement. That concluded Phase 1 of UNAMIR's planned four-phase mandate.

12. The Phase 2 was to begin immediately after the BBTG is formed, this never eventuated in December 1993 or even up to April 1994. This was when the mistrust between the two factions began to manifest to us. Time after time, not less than six occasions, all was set at the Parliament house, with nominated delegates and prospective ministers seated for the inauguration of the Transitional Government. Then at the very last moment, one party or the other always found a very small excuse to have the ceremony called off. Intense political and diplomatic negotiations by the political wing of UNAMIR and the top military hierarchy of the force could not get the two side to form the BBTG before the war broke out on 06 Apr 94.

13. In retrospect, despite the restrictions imposed by the various factions on UNMO operations, the force was gradually winning and could have won the total confidence of all parties over time, and could have successfully seen the BBTG installed if the Presidential jet had not been shot down on that fateful 06 Apr 94. As for that incident, it is still shrouded in mystery, and has consumed an estimated half a million lives in its wake. Several millions more have become displaced and some still, refugees. The scale of human suffering is horrific.

Meanwhile, the two-in-one war has not ceased despite difficult diplomatic efforts to get a ceasefire in place. There is no knowing when it will end. Even the former force level and mandate could not have achieved any results in this situation. This is what has forced the UN Security Council to adopt another resolution to expand UNAMIR in force level and in mandate.

REVISED MISSION

14. In the context of the expanded force mandate, (UN Security Council Resolution 918 of 17 May 1994) the new mission of the MILOBs Group, as for the force, is to facilitate the reaching of a ceasefire, and assist in providing security and support for the humanitarian efforts in Rwanda, in cooperation with local authorities. The force is mandated to use force to defend itself and to stop illegal groups that may stand in its way or try to put civilian safety at risk. The expanded force is to be appropriately armed and equipped to operate accordingly.

15. The specified tasks given to the MILOBs Group from the revised mission are:

- a. To observe and monitor the security situation on a 24 hrs basis.
- b. To assist in the movement of civilians at risk in Kigali to safe areas of their choice behind the front lines.
- c. To assist in the coordination of humanitarian aid assistance in conjunction with Humanitarian Relief Agencies.
- d. To provide escort for humanitarian aid convoys.
- e. To persuade the warring factions to reach a ceasefire, using subtle and informal negotiations and diplomacy.
- f. To be prepared to monitor the observance of the ceasefire when achieved.
- g. To investigate any cases of ceasefire violations.
- h. To assist the formed units in the protection of displaced persons camps.
- i. To investigate any cases of harassment of displaced persons and refugees.
- j. To facilitate and monitor the process of the return and resettlement of Rwandese refugees and displaced persons.

DEPLOYMENT PLAN

16. To execute the mentioned tasks, the 320 UNMOs authorized the MILOBs Group are to be deployed in 6 Sectors covering the entire country. They are: Byumba Sector, Kigali Sector, Butare Sector,

Cyangugu Sector, Gitarama Sector, and Ruhengeri Sector. Armed troops will also be deployed in all these sectors except Byumba Sector.

17. This deployment however, is not to be at one go. It will be phased, and will depend on whether or not a ceasefire is secured. If a ceasefire is not secured in the near future, we shall deploy 276 UNMOs in only Byumba, Kigali, Butare and Gitarama Sectors.

18. With our strength now below the 200 mark, we will need more UNMOs from various contributing countries. The UNHQ is expected to offer vacancies to contributing countries soon.

CONCLUSION


19. In conclusion, it can be said that despite restrictions imposed on its operations, UNAMIR's MILOBs Group was gradually winning the confidence of the two main factions in Rwanda when war broke out. With a limited force level and mandate, there was very little the force could do to stop the war. It is hoped that with the expanded mandate and new force level, MILOBs Group would this time round, in cooperation with the formed troops, humanitarian agencies and the people of Rwanda, achieve success in reversing the tragedy situation of Rwanda. It is also hoped that member states of the UN would respond positively if and when required to contribute to the MILOBs Group.





SUBJECT : DEPLOYMENT OF MILOBS

1. MILOBS requirement of 320 observers for deployment in the next phase of the operation has become more pressing with the withdrawal of 28 Senegalese MILOBS as a result of the French intervention in Rwanda. More Contingents are likely to follow suit.

2. The present holding of MILOBS is 194 and is described at Annex A. The breakdown of deployment is as follows:

a.	Milobs in Mission area	-	112
b.	Milobs in support/liaison duties	-	18
c.	Milobs in Nairobi (future participation uncertain)		
	i. Congo	-	25
	ii. Togo	-	13
	iii. Egypt	-	10
	iv. Uruguay	-	16
d.	TOTAL	-	194

3. Out of 320, this leaves a total requirement of 126 needed to make up the 320 strength. This is dependant on the assurance that the Contingents in Nairobi will not also withdraw in the near future.

4. The difference of 126 MILOBS could be made up from the following:

- Converting 28 Staff Officers to MILOBS and employing them as MILOBS. Their vacancies must urgently be filled with new staff officers.
- Integrating 48 UNOMUR MILOBS who are either due in or on continuation of their tour, into this mission.
(Annex B)

5. This leaves a difference of 50 MILOBS to be filled by contributing countries. However, should all contingents in para

(RC) CMO, CMO, OIC

2c decide to leave, then a further requirement of 64 will be needed.

6. Experience has shown that for smooth UNMO operations with UNAMIR, French speaking officers with working knowledge of the English language are essential and therefore preferred. Existing contributing countries which fall into this category are Canada and Mali. There are also some countries with very limited contribution to UNMO strength, eg Fiji and Malawi. They could be offered some more vacancies. Other UNMO existing contributing countries and those about to contribute to the expanded force could well be offered vacancies.

7. As per Table 2 in Annex 'B', the UNMOS of Slovakia (5) with UNOMUR could be integrated into UNAMIR as they will not complete their normal tour of duty before that mission closes down on 21 Sep 94. It is hoped that countries specified in Annex B as currently contributing to UNOMUR, but are due to rotate at or near the end of the UNOMUR mandate, will automatically be prepared to send the new UNMOS to UNAMIR. Please note that Bangladesh and Senegalese (now providing UNMOS for UNOMUR) are not on the list for providing any more UNMOS to UNAMIR. In the case of the Dutch contingent, only officers will be acceptable as the trial in UNOMUR with Chief Warrant Officers as UNMOS will end with that mission and we should await the trial results before doing this again.

8. In summary, the following total Milobs are required to make up any deficiency.

a. 50 Milobs if no more Contingents of Milobs withdraw in the near future and if those countries providing UNMOS to UNOMUR (except Senegal and Bangladesh) are willing to move those who have time left on their tour and those due for rotation to UNAMIR.

b. 114 Milobs if all mentioned Contingents in Nairobi (para 2c) decide to withdraw.

c. 162 Milobs if all the contingents providing UNMOS to UNOMUR do not transfer their contributions to UNAMIR.

d. In all the above cases, the current staff officers are to be converted to MILOBS ASAP and replaced by staff officers on an immediate basis. FC has prepared a separate Fax on this matter, including the emergency restructuring of the Force HQ in order to cater for the loss of the Senegalese, Congolese and Togolese in the UNMO ranks both in the field and in the Force HQ.

2. The deployment plan for these MILOBS are as follows:
 - a. No Cease-fire Option = 276
 - b. Cease-fire Option = 320 (the total number of MILOBS)
3. The total strength of MILOBS currently based in Rwanda and Nairobi wef 30 Jun 94 will be 221.
4. To implement the No Cease-fire Option, the following are proposed:
 - a. Deploy all the 221 MILOBS
 - b. The balance of 55 is to be made out of converting 28 current FHQ staff to MILOBS status, living a balance of 27 additional MILOBS.
5. For implementation of the Cease-fire Option the force requires 320 MILOBS. To make up this figure an additional 44 x MILOBS.
6. In summary, a total number of 71 MILOBS is required to meet our deployment plan. This number should be requested from the contributing countries.
7. Presently the Force is mobilising the necessary and available logistic requirements for the deployment. The additional requirement will be forwarded soonest.


