Dear Dr. Glasser,



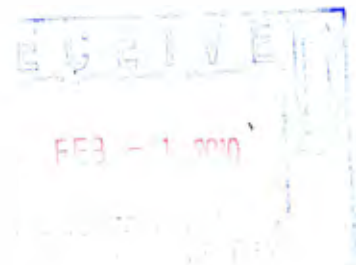

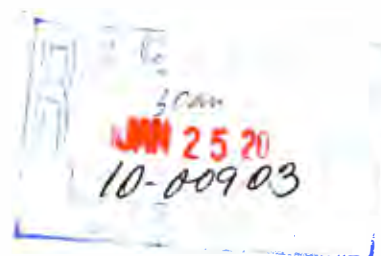

Dear Secretary General:
