PROJECT 20-11: EDUCATION
(UNESCO)

Since 1960, UNESCO has assisted the Congolese Government in the fields of higher education and scientific research, has helped to develop secondary education and improve the quality of primary education. The programme has not changed through the years, and forms an integrated whole geared to attain the objectives which the Ministers of Education of African countries had defined during the conference of Addis Ababa (1960), Paris (1961) and Abidjan (1964).

In the years to come, an adviser should continue to assist the Secretary-General of the Ministry of National Education, in the field of school administration and budget. The Secondary School Inspection Section of the Ministry has been reorganized in 1965, so as to better control schools and teaching personnel, the numbers of which have continued to increase. It is thus necessary that assistance be continued in this area, as also in the fields of technical and commercial education.

At the Bureau of School Constructions an expert architect, and an assistant, will be required to continue the vast programme of constructions: secondary schools, buildings of the Universities of Elisabethville and Stanleyville and other institutes of higher learning. Technical support to this sector should be reinforced.

The mobile teams, which during the past years have labored to improve the standard and quality of the teaching staff and directors of primary schools, will have to be maintained: a co-ordinator of the mobile teams, and experts in pedagogical publications and related fields, at the Centre for the Production of Pedagogical Material at Limité, and teams of animators in the provinces. The mobile teams have been hampered in their activities by the absence of adequate transport. The Government's request under UNDP/TA therefore includes the provision of transport for four teams, \$12,600 being considered adequate for the purchase of four Landrover-type vehicles.

Interprovincial pedagogical advisers will be necessary to assist provincial authorities to apply the directives of the Ministry of National Education, as well as solve numerous pedagogical and administrative problems.

As for scientific research, UNESCO is asked to continue to provide the Government with a highly qualified expert who will remain the scientific adviser of the Minister, as well as Director of the Central African Scientific Research Institute (IRSAC), which plays an important role in the economic development and scientific life of the country.

As for higher education, UNESCO is the executing agency of 3 Special Fund projects namely, the IPN (Institut Pédagogique National), INM (Institut National des Mines), and the INBTP (Institut National des Bâtiments et des Travaux Publics).

A. Objectives and structure of the project

This remained as described in the 1964 Annual Report. Reorganisation of the educational system is a long term project.

Assistance was given under the following headings:

1. Advisory Services

UNESCO made available under the EPTA budget the services of Dr. Rahm, Director of the Institute for Scientific research in Central Africa (IRSAC) who also served as scientific adviser to the Government.

The expert who assisted in programming the educational broadcasts of the Congolese National Radio, Mr. Paccard, left the Congo on 26 June 1965, upon completion of his assignment and no replacement has been provided.

In 1965 UNESCO experts assisted the Congolese Government on a larger scale. As in the preceding years this assistance applied to all educational levels, but particularly to secondary education. Apart from the staff of the three Special Fund Projects executed by UNESCO and the two experts having UNESCOPAS contracts (OPEX type), all the experts served in an advisory capacity.

ii) First Directorate

Two experts were to be assigned to administer the programme for foreign teachers recruited under UNESCO technical assistance. However, only one expert (Mr. Blanch) actually worked in this capacity, the other post remaining vacant during the entire year. At the end of the year an additional expert (Mr. Thevoz) arrived in order to assist in re-organizing the salary system for teaching personnel. This post had also been vacant the whole year.

iii) Second Directorate

Two experts (Messrs. Bayens and Lemoine) continued their efforts to improve commercial and technical education. A Senior Adviser for school inspection (Mr. Benet) arrived to fill the post established in the school inspection department.

iv) Fourth Directorate (Pedagogical services)

A Senior Adviser (Mr. Perrot) was active in organizing the work and studies required by the committee set up to reform school programmes and teaching methods. He coordinated the work of an expert statistician and his assistants (Mr. Mirville and Mr. Joory), two experts in orientation (Mr. Maroun and Mr. Pasartzis) and an expert on school manuals (Miss de Julliot). This service also gives directives to the Purchasing and Distribution Centre for Educational Material (CADMP), on the selection and purchase of school books and their distribution to educational institutions. Two experts are assigned to CADMP, one as Co-Director (Mr. D'Hont, succeeded by Mrs. Gosset in October 1965), the other as Chief Accountant (Mrs. Gosset, succeeded by Mr. Rettig at the end of October 1965).

b) In the Provinces

i) UNESCO/UNICEF Mobile teams

The production centre for the team continued its activity in Leopoldville with a staff of four experts including a coordinator (Mr. Condette of UNICEF, until July) and three specialists, in school books, in printing, and in audio-visual equipment (Mr. Wagner, Mr. Adé and Mr. Deneyer). The provincial teams, still five in number, and operating from Leopoldville, Luluabourg, Elisabethville, Bukavu and Coquilhatville, gave refresher courses to primary school teachers and inspectors. The number of experts active in this field was reduced to nine (Leopoldville: Mr. Rubon, Miss Nicolet and Mr. Freitas; Luluabourg: Mr. Manolas; Elisabethville: Mr. Barjon and Mr. Bouyez; Bukavu: Mr. Zafrilla and Mr. Francisque; Coquilhatville: Mr. Boulanger). It has not been possible to re-establish the Stanleyville team dissolved in 1964.

The teaching equipment supplied by the mobile teams is described in more detail in Chapter 25.

ii) Interprovincial experts

There were supposed to be twelve of these experts, two for each of the former provinces, one working in pedagogy, the other in administration, to assist in communicating and implementing the decisions and directives of the Central Government Ministry of Education, at the provincial level. Because of recruiting difficulties this number was reduced by half. In Leopoldville Mr. Regnier had to discontinue his activity and another post became vacant in February when Mr. Bille was appointed Chief of Mission, replacing Mr. Najman who had been recalled to the Headquarters of UNESCO. In Coquilhatville Mr. Bourant was alone as administrative interprovincial expert. In Luluabourg and Bukavu, Mr. Louis and Mr. Crespin have no administrative expert to help them, nor does Mr. Medina, in Stanleyville, who arrived in July. It is only in Elisabethville that the team is complete, with Mr. Rial as a pedagogical and Mr. Jannone as an administrative interprovincial expert.

c) Ministry of Education and Ministry of Public Works

The activities of the Bureau of school construction are, admittedly, far from being strictly of an advisory nature. It prepares plans for the construction of secondary schools and colleges and supervises the actual construction work. It functioned under the direction of Mr. Palumbo, architect, and his assistant, Mr. Hebert.

d) Special Fund Institutes

UNESCO is the executing agency for three Special Fund projects in the Congo, viz. the National Pedagogical Institute (operated by the Special Fund since 1 February 1964), the National Institute for Building and Public Works (since 1 October 1963) and the National Mining Institute (since 1 February 1964).

e) The full scope of the project can be seen in Table V which gives a breakdown of its cost, and in Table VI which gives the functions of all the experts who took part.

B. Delivery of the Project

1. Advisory Services

As in preceding years, the principal sector in which UNESCO assistance was rendered was at the Fourth Directorate of the Central Government Ministry of Education. The Fourth Directorate acts as a technical bureau for the Reform Committee for programmes and school books. Also, in the absence of an integrated national development plan, it draws up directives at school level.

In 1965, the efforts to reform school programmes were concentrated on those of the 5th and 6th years of the secondary cycle, and they will reach completion in 1966. In particular, the following programmes have been brought up to date: French, history, geography, physics and chemistry, natural history and mathematics. Research, selection and adaptation of school books proceeded concurrently. The expert on these matters even supervised the editing of an English text book and a manual on biology.

As a result of a new departure in school inspection (see below) the Fourth Directorate was already able to utilize the first inspection reports which it had received.

For the educational information services the Fourth Directorate now has at its disposal, in Leopoldville and in the provinces, a network of 22 pedagogical information and documentation centres.

In educational statistics the elaboration of the necessary tools (questionnaires, forms, etc.) continued. This service has published a list of all the secondary schools in the country, as well as an analysis of educational statistics for the school year 1964/1965. Other study projects have been carried out to meet the needs of the Fourth Directorate, dealing with such topics as end-of-year examinations, qualifications of teachers, class distribution of pupils according to age, scholastic performances at the various levels, etc.

In Leopoldville, a two-month course was organized for the training of some forty statisticians from the provinces.

Finally it should be mentioned that the Fourth Directorate as a whole is giving technical support to the regional planning councils which are in the process of being established.

2. Training

Mobile teams

Designed to give training courses to active teachers and primary school inspectors, the five mobile teams continued their activity, assisted by the Production Centre for educational material.

a) Establishment of pilot centres:

With the help of specialists of bilateral assistance programmes:

- 30 pilot centres were opened or revived;
- 200 teachers participated in training courses at these centres;
- 620 teachers from satellite schools received training.

An unmistakable improvement in the work was noticed. The efforts of the mobile teams have resulted in the creation of a number of pedagogical nuclei on which future action may be based. One of the essential points of the programme has thus been realized.

b) Two types of training courses were organized:

- Second degree courses for school principals, assistant principals, and some top-quality teachers, with a view to future selection for the opening of new pilot centres or satellite schools;
- first degree courses conducted by a Congolese team.

The realization of this programme was, in certain places uneven, but where difficulties were encountered, days of study took the place of the training courses originally planned.

The number of teachers participating in training courses lasting from four to six weeks reached the figure of 285 during the year.

c) Training of Congolese personnel

In the absence of official authorisation, it proved especially difficult for the teams to secure the services of all the Congolese personnel who were supposed to work with the experts. However, eleven Congolese did participate in the activities of the teams.

3. Operational Services

a) The Production Centre for Educational Material

which receives its equipment from UNICEF, produced:

for the travelling teams:

- educational pamphlets for the teaching personnel of the pilot centres and satellite schools,
- pedagogical material: letters, drawings, photographs, and various material prepared by the audio-visual section which then distributed samples. Other items, such as pictures for object-lessons, teaching of the spoken language, etc..., are in course of preparation,
- all printed material required for administrative purposes,
- the "Information Bulletin" of the teams;

for the Central Ministry of Education:

- 60 pamphlets concerning new programmes and directives, and re-publication of earlier pamphlets out of print,
- the periodical "Educator"; present circulation: 12,000 (5 issues published in 1965);

for the National Pedagogical Institute:

- the periodical "Colloque"; circulation: 3,000 (2 issues)

b) School Inspection

Since his arrival in the Congo, the Principal Adviser on School Inspection was active in re-organizing the inspection of secondary schools.

In addition to the Director and the Congolese-Director, the Inspection Service comprised 4 UNESCO experts (including the Principal Adviser), 14 experts of bilateral assistance programmes and 12 Congolese inspectors.

Due to administrative difficulties it was not possible to send out the inspectors until the beginning of November. By the end of the year, some 150 teachers had, however been inspected, in Leopoldville and in the provinces.

The reports, which are submitted regularly, have been utilized promptly and systematically. The training of Congolese inspectors is progressing under favourable conditions and with good results.

Thanks to reports submitted by the inspectors on supervision of administrative and teaching staff, on the application of the programmes, and on the implementation of teaching instructions, this work is beginning to bear fruit.

The competent services of the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Civil Service are at present studying a project for the reorganization of the inspection service. In all probability, the inspection service will in the future function as an autonomous service attached directly to the under Secretariat of the Ministry of Education.

c) Office of Foreign Teaching Personnel

The Office of Foreign Teaching Personnel in the Central Government Ministry of Education is in charge of the recruitment, assignment and administration of foreign teaching personnel working in secondary, higher or technical schools, no matter what educational grouping they are attached to.

The teachers recruited and administered with UNESCO technical aid during the school year 1964/1965 totalled approximately 800 distributed over the entire territory of the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

As it proved impossible for the Congolese Government and UNESCO to reach an agreement before the expiration of the time-limit for the renewal of this programme, it was taken over in its entirety by the Congolese Government.

However, at the express request of the Prime Minister, the UNESCO Mission continued to extend its technical collaboration to the administration of foreign teaching personnel, and a UNESCO expert was given the special assignment of drawing up lists of salary transfers in foreign currency for these teachers.

In spite of this administrative change, the foreign teaching personnel extended their contracts for the school year 1965/1966. The number of resignations was the same as in preceding years.

As of 31 December 1965, 783 such teachers were working in the Congo. Their distribution according to country of origin is indicated below.

d) Construction Programme

In order to speed up the school construction programme, the Bureau of School Construction was placed directly under the joint authority of the under Secretaries of the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Public Works.

The activity of the Bureau is reflected in the figures below:

Since its creation, that is to say, over a period of 3 years, the Bureau of School Construction has placed contracts totalling the equivalent of \$ 8,234,056. During 1965, new contracts were concluded amounting to the equivalent of \$ 2,010,098.

The average value of the work carried out per year is thus the equivalent of approximately \$ 2,667,000. Since the flow of credits originating from counterpart funds has diminished sharply, it has become necessary for the Ministry of Education to make funds available from its own budget in order to make up for these losses. These allocations totalled the equivalent of \$ 573,333.

The most important construction projects for which contracts were signed in 1965 are the following:

- i) completion of the buildings for the National School of Law and Public Administration (ENDA) (equivalent of \$ 557,000) (see chapter 9);
- ii) continuation of the construction work for the National Pedagogical Institute, involving a residence with complete facilities for 57 students (equivalent of \$ 500,000);
- iii) the buildings for the National Institute of Civil Aviation, comprising two technical and one administrative buildings. Work was commenced.

The technical department of the Bureau completed a considerable number of study projects. The complete files on several important projects are ready for execution whenever the funds become available.

A draft budget for 1966 was worked out and submitted to the Government for approval. It represents a volume of construction work the total cost of which would amount to the equivalent of \$ 24,073,000. This programme involves school construction work all over the country. Obviously, it cannot be carried through without aid from technical assistance programmes and outside financial sources.

It would contribute to an economic recovery and the elimination of unemployment in the country.

C. Evaluation

Evaluation of work done in 1965 under this project, and in the three UN Special Fund assisted Institutes, the National Pedagogical Institute (IPN), the National Institute of Building and Public Works (INBTP) and the National Mining School in Bukavu, has not yet been completed.

However, it can be mentioned that the existence of three successive Governments during the year meant three different Ministers of Education, which obstructed certain activities.
