

Post : Expert in geophysics

It is requested to have 3 geophysicists : one at Kinshasa, one at Karouba and the third at Simba. The 3 centres work without any scientific guide since independent. Instruments have to be calibrated or adjusted, data have to be studied and interpreted.

- Duties : - Advice and assistance to the Congolese Meteorological Service in the field of :
- a) Direction, organisation and supervision of Geophysics Centres.
  - b) Conduct of research in Geophysics.
  - c) Technical enquiries and publication of data.
  - d) Choice and advice for ordering equipment.

- - -

Post : Expert in hydrometeorology

One post at Kinshasa.

- Duties : - Give advice on questions relating to hydrology.
- Conduct research in hydrometeorology in cooperation with the Navigable Inland Waters Division.
  - Collecting and making use of information of hydraulic character.
  - Installation and inspection of hydrometeorological equipment.
  - Training Congolese staff.
  - Dealing with related matters such as artificial rain etc.

- - -

Post : Expert in agrometeorology

One post at Kinshasa.

- Duties : - Give advice on questions relating to agrometeorology and climatology.
- Establishment of a network of agrometeorology and inspection of status.
  - Conduct research in agrometeorology.
  - Assistance in the direction and operation of climatological and microclimatological studies etc.
  - Training Congolese staff.

- - -

Post : Electronic expert

The institute has a number of different electronic equipment. Modification and modernisation is necessary to keep up with time and hence the need of an electronic expert who will guide electronicians and give advice on the operation of equipment. The expert will be stationed at Leopoldville but will travel to Karavia and Bunia to supervise the work of electronics and observers.

- - -

Post : Electronician

The institute requires the service of 2 electronicians, one for Karavia, the other for Bunia. Consideration has been given to the availability of an electronician who has been qualified as such after long experience and fellowship abroad.

- Duties :
- Assistance in organisation and supervision of the operation and maintenance of radio-service stations and electronic equipment.
  - Maintenance and repair of electronic equipment such as weather radar.
  - Organising reserve stocks of electronic apparatus.
  - Training of Congolese staff.

Post : Expert in instruments

The service is in need of an expert in instruments for the development and the calibration of meteorological instruments. The service has instrument-mechanics who have some practical experience but not enough for the calibration and development of instruments.

- - -

Post : Chief forecaster

2 posts of chief forecaster are required; one for N'Djili, the other for B'ville. However, a third one is requested for the centre of analysis, but this could be postponed for the following year. The remaining forecasting centres are in no need to have chief forecasters.

- - -

Post : Forecaster

The service requires as a minimum 10 forecasters.

- 5 for N'Djili
- 1 for Luluabourg
- 1 for B'ville
- 1 for Coquilhatville
- 1 for Kanina
- 1 for Stanleyville

Consideration has been given to the presence of 10 Congolese forecasters who have obtained their diploma this year, in addition to an expert (Belgian) belonging to the Meteorological Service.

- - -

Post : Aerologist

The aerological stations to be operated at Bunia, Luluabourg and the aerological station at Karavia will each need the services of an expert in aerology for a period of 9 months to train and supervise personnel. After such a period the Congolese personnel should be able to carry on the work independently. At Binza, Congolese personnel are already working in collaboration with WHO experts and another expert is not required there.

- - -

Experts for the school.

The school requires 2 experts; one of the university professor level and the other of lecturer level. It is planned to have meteorological courses in the University of Lovanium where the chief instructor will act as associate professor.

It is also necessary to have an assistant instructor (meteorologist) and 2 inspectors to supervise the elementary stages of the observers' courses and the practical training of the forecasters. Perfection courses will be required from time to time as circumstances demand.

Suite aux entretiens qui ont eu lieu sur la question de l'inclusion de la météorologie parmi les sujets à étudier pour la Licence en Sciences Physiques de l'Université Lovanium, entre vous-même, MM. Borghracq, Bartholomé, Pollak et Charette de l'Université et MM. Davies et O'Byrne de l'ONDA, nous avons l'honneur de vous proposer les modalités suivantes pour la mise en exécution de ce projet:

1. Le cours de météorologie sera enseigné pendant les 2 ans de Licence en sciences physiques selon le programme de l'Université. Owing to the fact that the World Meteorological Organisation does not recruit observers and to the deficiency of meteorological observers in the Congo, and in view of the importance of running certain meteorological stations particularly in the Province of Katanga, it has been agreed with Air Commodore Varma to engage military personnel for this purpose.

A course has been organised at Kamina Base for the teaching of 15 persons from the Irish, Ethiopian and Indian contingents. This course has been discontinued during the last events of Katanga and it would be useless to resume it now as these contingents are going back home next March.

I shall therefore be grateful if you will kindly take the necessary steps so that the expected contingents include meteorological observers in order to facilitate the running of the stations at Kamina Base, Albertville, Elisabethville and Kolwezi. These stations are of great importance in supplying meteorological information for the safety of flight operations, and in particular of ONUC operations.

I am also informed that this has become known among our students, and is causing some unrest. In fact, six of the students in Luluabourg have left for other courses where they are paid fellowships at these rates.

I suggest, therefore, that we proceed immediately to the payment of these fellowships, as from February 1. They will not, of course, apply to some of the classes of students mentioned in my plan, e.g. to members of the Meteorological Service on courses.

In the meantime, I am investigating the possibility of our future students benefiting from Government Scholarships. If my efforts are successful this will lead to a further reduction in our costs.

In an attempt to find a means of providing the Meteorological Service with the forty odd highly trained meteorologists it lacks, Dr. Borghgraef, Vice-Rector and Dr. Bartholomé, Dean of the Faculty of Science at Lovanium University, and I have arrived, in unofficial discussions, at a tentative plan of training which would lead to a "Licences en Sciences Physiques" in Meteorology.

The plan envisages that the Chief Instructor at the Training School of the Meteorological Institute would be Professor of Meteorology at the University. Ultimately the emoluments of this Professor should be furnished by the Government. In the meantime, it seems reasonable that the OMM/ONUC Chief Instructor should fill this post. I shall be grateful if you will kindly give me your opinion on the feasibility of this, taking into account the fact that a project for transference of the training programme to the Special Fund is in the course of preparation. It is to be noted in this connection that if such a plan is implemented the candidature of the Chief Instructor would have to have the approval of the University.

Two further related proposals have been favourably received by Drs. Borghgraef and Bartholomé:

- (1) the University to invite other Universities to send post-graduate students to study at Lovanium, using for their research the material which has accumulated in the Meteorological Institutes Laboratories in the past

With reference to our recent conversation, I enclose herewith a memorandum from the Chief of WHO mission concerning the operation of the imprest account administered by him.

1. The practice followed so far was to give each month to the Director of the School against a receipt a global sum of CF.36,000.- calculated on the basis of CF. 1,000.- per student lodged in the school. In view of the fact that the Director effected purchases of food for the students mostly in market and around Leopoldville, he never was able to provide us with itemised receipts.
2. I agree with you that this procedure was not very satisfactory from the auditor point of view. It has therefore been suggested, effective 1 January 1963, to attribute to each student, individually the sum of CF. 1,000.--per month in terms of a fellowship. The recovery of this money from the students and its subsequent disbursement on food would then be a matter concerning solely the Meteorological Service. Replenishments of the imprest would be made against the receipts signed by the students.

Dear Dr. Sebastian,

You must think that I have been very remiss in not replying earlier to the point you raised in Geneva regarding the nationality of experts.

I had been hoping to give you a firm reply on the particular case you had raised. However, it turned out that this had to wait on the receipt of an official communication from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and, although this had been provided verbally some weeks ago, the letter itself has still not reached us.

In the meantime, I can inform you that we are assisting the Government in establishing a new procedure by which requests for experts will be coordinated at a single point, so that in future we shall be sure that, when a nomination is approved, the approval is that of the Government and not merely of an individual ministry.

As regards the nationality of experts, our general principle is that, so long as an expert has been recommended by the United Nations or by a specialised agency and approved by the Congolese Government, he may be recruited.



Your attention is invited to the enclosed memorandum from the Chief of WHO mission on the above subject.

According to the Administrative Guide for Holders of United Nations Fellowships, all fellows are entitled to one allowance equivalent to \$50.- in the currency of their host country for the purchase of technical publications in connection with their training or study programs. This allowance is only paid once, usually at the beginning of the award.

In view of the special circumstances under which the fellowship programs in East Africa was arranged, the book allowance was not included in the stipend cheques.

Since this request has been received from the Chief of WHO mission, I should be grateful if you would issue two cheques in the equivalent of \$50.- each to Messrs. Mumenbe and N'Dika, WHO fellows.

All payments should be liquidated against RDO 62-145 as a charge to project 10-07.
