
Dear Kenzo,

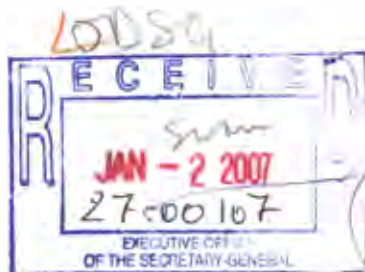
