SUBJECT: UNAMIR MF COT	

1. AS PART OF THE 5,500 UN FORCE IN RWANDA, THERE WAS PROVISION FOR A UNAMIR MP COMPANY. THIS REQUIREMENT HAD BEEN STAFFED TOGETHER WITH OUR OTHER TROOP DEMANDS, BUT NO ACTION HAS YET BEEN TAKEN TO FILL THIS REQUEST.

2. WITH 3,700 SOLDIERS ALREADY ON THE GROUND AND DEPLOYED EVERYWHERE IN RWANDA, AND THE VERY RAPID INCREASE OF OUR FORCE TO A PLANNED 5,500, EXCLUDING THE CIVILIANS. NUMEROUS MAJOR INCIDENTS WHICH REQUIRE IMMEDIATE POLICE ATTENTION/INVESTIGATION HAVE ALREADY OCCURRED, INCLUDING A FATAL MOTOR ACCIDENT.

3. FOR THE TIME BEING, WE HAVE NO DEDICATED UN MILITARY POLICE FORCE IN THEATER. FURTHERMORE, BECAUSE THE FORMER GENDARMERIE HAS BEEN DISSOLVED BY THE NEW RWANDESE GOVERNMENT, AT THE PRESENT TIME THERE IS NO RWANDESE CIVILIAN NOR MILITARY POLICE FORCES IN THE ENTIRE COUNTRY. WHAT THERE IS OF "LAW AND ORDER/SECURITY ENFORCEMENT" IS BEING HANDLED BY LOCAL RPA SOLDIERS. NEEDLESS TO SAY, THIS SITUATION CREATES SERIOUS COMPLICATIONS, TO SAY THE LEAST, FOR UNAMIR.

4. OUR TROOPS ARE ALREADY GOING ON R&R IN PLACES LIKE NAIROBI AND MOMBASSA, KENYA. BASED ON EXPERIENCE FROM OTHER UN MISSIONS, INCIDENTS WHICH WILL CALL FOR UN MP PRESENCE WILL SOONER OR LATER HAPPEN, AND A LACK OF PROPER UN POLICE RESPONSE WOULD ONLY EMBARRASS THE UNITED-NATIONS AS A WHOLE. CONSEQUENTLY, IT HAS BECOME IMPERATIVE THAT OUR REQUEST FOR A UNAMIR MP COMPANY BE ACTIONED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

MOVE OF DISPLAYED PERSONS FROM CAMP 4A21

Reference:

A. Map Series Z723 sheet 30, 31 and 22 1: 50,000.

ALL TIMINGS : BRAVO

1. SITUATION. Att at Annex A is the list of displaced persons (DP) who registered their intention to move home from Camp 4A21. UNHCR sp and assistance has been gained for this move and registration procedures have been discussed with the RPA.

2. MISSION. BRITCON is to move approx 2000 DPs from Camp 4A21 to their home communes/prefectures.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Ops. BRITCON assets are to lift the DPs over the period 19 - 21 Sep 94. The tpt plan for this is at Annex B.

b. Pkts of 8 - 12 vehs, capable of splitting into 2 sects are to leave KIGALI at 2 hrs intervals on Mon 19 Sep 94. The convoys are to follow a pre reccied/tac signed route to camp 4A21 where they will be loaded with DPs, preregistered by UNHCR. Using the 2 RPA registration points at Gd 550505 and 540248, tpt groups of DPs to their home communes via UNHCR way stns in BUTARE and KIGALI as appropriate.

c. The aim is to have a steady stream of vehs traffic through camp 4A21 and onward to the registration points.

d. CONSTRAINTS. The Op is constrained by the following factors:

- (1). No Jt RPA/UNAMIR OPS.
- (2). No BRITCON PAX are to stay out overnight except in predesignated sites.
- (3). Time taken to load refugees.
- (4). Time taken to transit registration points.
- (5). Weather implications.
- (6). The unexpected/breakdown.







DRAFT PROCEDURE FOR TRANSPORTING REFUGEES RETURNING TO RWANDA

1. HQ UNAMIR task:
 - a. A contingent to provide transport to move Refugees.
 - b. HQ UNMO to provide MILOB at Pick up Point, and all sectors crossed.
 - c. Humanitarian Assistance Cell to provide reception arrangements.
2. MILOB at Pick Up Point arranges for refugees to be searched for weapons.
3. MILOB documents Refugees to be transported.
4. MILOB and Convoy Commander supervise loading of refugees.
5. MILOB accompanies Convoy to the edge of the Sector, and is responsible for liaising with the RPA at any checkpoints.
6. The Convoy Commander is responsible for controlling the convoy.
7. On reaching the boundary of Sector 4 the convoy stops short of the checkpoint, the refugees dismount and approach the checkpoint under the control of the MILOB. The convoy vehicles proceed through the checkpoint and halt a short distance on the other side.
8. Once the refugees are through the checkpoint, the Sector 4 MILOB hands them over to the Sector 3 MILOB.
9. The Sector 3 MILOB accompanies the convoy to the Drop Off Point, and is responsible for liaising with the RPA at any checkpoints en route.
10. On arrival at the Drop Off Point, the refugees dismount, the MILOB hands them over to the Humanitarian Assistance Cell, and the Convoy vehicles return to their parent unit.

- A. Administration Order to Operation Order 18 dated 31 August 1994

SITUATION

1. a. General. As detailed in Operation Order 18.

MISSION

2. To provide logistic support to FRAFBATT at KIBUYE assisting in the UNAMIR forces providing security, assistance and coordination of humanitarian support to participating countries/organizations facilitating the rapid and effective end to the crisis in RWANDA.

EXECUTION

3. General Outline.

- a. Logistic Support. Logistic Support to FRAFBATT will be provided by the Force Support Elements (FSE) as detailed in Reference A.

- b. Deployment. As detailed in Operation Order 18.

MATERIAL AND SERVICES.

4. a. Supply.

- (1) General.

- (a) Resupply to FRAFBATT will be effected by road convoy from Kigali to Gisenyi then by civilian barge operated by Office Des Routes, to Kibuye. The first resupply convoy will occur FRAFBATT on 12 Sep 94.

- (b) Local procurement can only be done through the CAO, and his authorized delegates, or by Brown & Root when applicable. FRAFBATT will have a CAO representative in location. No UNAMIR reimbursement will be approved unless this procedure is followed.

(2) Sup Class I.

- (a) Combat Rations. Combat rations will continue to be issued until the fresh ration system is introduced. 7 days rations will be maintained as a reserve stock held at unit level. Two weeks stocks will be issued on 12 Sep 94, one week for consumption and one week reserve.
- (b) Fresh Rations. Fresh rations will be delivered, by a contractor, directly to the unit location. Fresh food will be provided as soon as refrigeration containers are available. Initially two refrigeration units will be allocated.
- (c) Drinking Water. 7 days bottled drinking water will be issued on the 12 Sep 94 as a reserve stock. Potable water jerry cans and storage containers will be issued to FRAFBATT on 12 Sep 94 to allow distribution of locally produced potable water to platoon locations. The UN allowance for drinking water is 3 lt/man/day.

(3) Sup Class II.

- (a) General and Technical Stores. Demands for Class II items are to be placed with the civilian logistics officer at UNHQ Log Coord Cell.
- (b) Clothing, Personal Issue Items. As a contingent FRAFBATT is to provide their own country uniforms and personal issue items. UN accoutrements are to be worn at all times. Shortfalls in accoutrements or replacement items are to be requested immediately to the SO SUP at the Log Coord Cell.

(4) Sup Class III.

- (a) POL. 7 days holdings of bulk fuel is to be established in the contingent location, consisting 5,000 lt of gasoline and 5,000 lt of diesoline will be held in bulk. A weeks reserve of both Gasoline and Diesoline will be held in drums.

(5) Sup Class IV.

- (a) Construction Materials. Requests for construction items are to be submitted in a consolidated demands to the civilian logistic officer at the Log Coord Cell. If items are not in store the demand will be forwarded to CBMS for appropriate action.
- (b) Defensive Stores. Chief Operation Officer (COO) is the releasing authority for stocks of defence stores. Demands must be submitted to the Civilian Logistic Officer for onforwarding to the COO for approval.

- (6) Sup Class V. Negotiations are in process to purchase ammunition on loan to FRAFBATT. Holdings of ammunition is to be in accordance with national directives. Expenditures of ammunition is to be recorded in accordance with Reference A.

- (7) Sup Class VI. Class VI (personnel demand) items are to be coordinated by FRAFBATT using regimental funds and nation arrangements. Limited items may be purchased by the Force Welfare Officer for purchase and resale by FRAFBATT. FRAFBATT is to conduct direct liaison with the Force Welfare Officer.

- (8) Sup Class VII. Major Ends Items will be held by the Brown & Root warehouse located at the Kigali airport. Second and third line major end items may be demanded through SO Maint through Log Coord Cell and will to be satisfied either through LOA with French forces in Bangui in the Central African Republic or Brown and Root.

- (9) Sup Class VIII. 60 days Class VIII stocks are held with the Australian Field Hospital. FRAFBATT should demand to increase holdings to 90 days Class VII stocks. A bulk order for 60 days has also been placed for replacement stocks.

Requisitions for urgently required Class VII supplies including Blood products and medical gasses not able to be satisfied by UNAMIR may be purchased on LOA with a contingent parent country that can satisfy the demand soonest.

- (10) Sup Class IX. Six months stocks or repair parts has been put in place with FRAFBATT. Second and third line repair parts are to be demanded through SO Maint through Log Coord Cell and will to be satisfied either through LOA with French forces in Bangui in the Central African Republic or Brown and Root.
- (11) Water. A detailed medical examination and test has been conducted on the locally produced water at FRAFBATT and has been found to be fit for consumption. Accordingly water containers will be issued on the 12 Sep 94 for the distribution of drinking water to FRAFBATT elements.
- (12) Garbage. FRAFBATT is to utilize only approved dumping sites. No payment is authorized to local authority unless coordinated with the CAO or his staff.
- (13) Laundry. A local laundry contract may be established if requested by FRAFBATT and approved by the general Services Manager at UN HQ.
- (14) Waste POL Products. When conducting first vehicle servicing FRAFBATT, is to contain waste POL products in old POL containers. Waste POL is not to be disposed of locally. Waste POL is to be returned to Brown and Root for disposal/recycling.
- (15) Employment of Civilian Staff. The employment of 10 civilian staff may be approved. Work orders for 10 civilian staff have been placed with Brown and Root. A Brown and Root representative will visit Kibuye to conduct liaison concerning the details of civilian employment. The request has detailed the employment to commence on 15 Sep 94, so that the civilians currently employed will have continued employment and FRAFBATT will enjoy a continuous service.

b. TRANSPORTATION

- (1) Unit to be self sufficient. Demands for additional support to be coordinated by SO Transport, Log Coord Cell.
- (2) Movement outside the theater for R and R may be effected by MOVREQ to the Movement Control Cell.
- (3) All traffic accidents are to be reported to the closest CIVPOL organization and FRAFBATT. FRAFBATT is to report traffic accidents to UNHQ to SO Transport and to the OPS duty officer for damage to civilian property or injury to personnel.

c. MAINTENANCE.

- (1) Repairs. Priority of repairs to be determined by SO Maint on advice from the COO and the CLOGO.
 - (a) First Line. FRAFBATT is responsible for first line maintenance of all equipment. Repairs beyond the capabilities of 1st line are to be recovered by second line assets to second line maintenance facilities.
 - (b) Second and Third Line Repairs. Second and third line repairs are to be conducted by BRITCON Maintenance Coy and by Brown and Root.
 - (c) Recovery.
 - i. Backloading Point (BLP). The BLP for FRAFBATT is to be the Sector HQ. Backloading vehicle casualties are to be determined in conjunction with the SO Maint and Brown & Root.
 - ii. Main Recovery Location. BRITCON Maintenance Company.

5. HEALTH SUPPORT.

- a. Medical Plan. As detailed in Reference A.
- b. Medical Resupply. FRAFBATT should place demands for medical supplies to ensure a 90 days medical stock holding as directed by UNNY. AS MSF is responsible for the maintenance of 60 days Force medical stocks as directed by HQ UNAMIR II Medical Branch. Level One and Two medical stock is to be initiated using message demand procedures IAW HQ UNAMIR II SOP.

6. PERSONNEL.

- a. Amenities. Queries relating to amenities are to be directed to the Force Welfare Officer located in UNHQ room 1045.
- b. Messes and Institutes. Messes and institutes (wet canteens), may be established as authorized by the Force Commander on request from Commanding Officer FRAFBATT.
- c. Out of Bound Policy. Out of bounds areas will be notified as determined by Force Commander.
- d. Finance. UN pay is to be effected in location. Advances and finance queries should be directed to the Force Finance Officer located at UNHQ room 3005.
- e. Postal. FRAFBATT should send mail back with resupply convoys for onforwarding. Distribution of mail will be by FSE (Transport) and delivered to Kibuye on routine resupply convoys or during liaison visits.


