It appears that Mr. Ernest W. Riggs, President of Anatolia College, an American Philanthropic Educational institution long established in Thessalonika, purchased for the relief of the members of his staff, clothing material and leather to be made into shoes, which should have accompanied him to Greece but which by an unfortunate series of mishaps, were delayed. They are now in the customs house at Alexandria and the authorities there say that they will release them for shipment to Greece if UNRRA issues a certificate that they are for relief purposes here.

You will greatly favor this mission if you will promptly give such a certificate in some such form as the following, addressing it to the Customs House Alexandria, and furnishing signed copies to Treasurer Connof the American University in Cairo, who is handling this matter for Anatolia College:
