

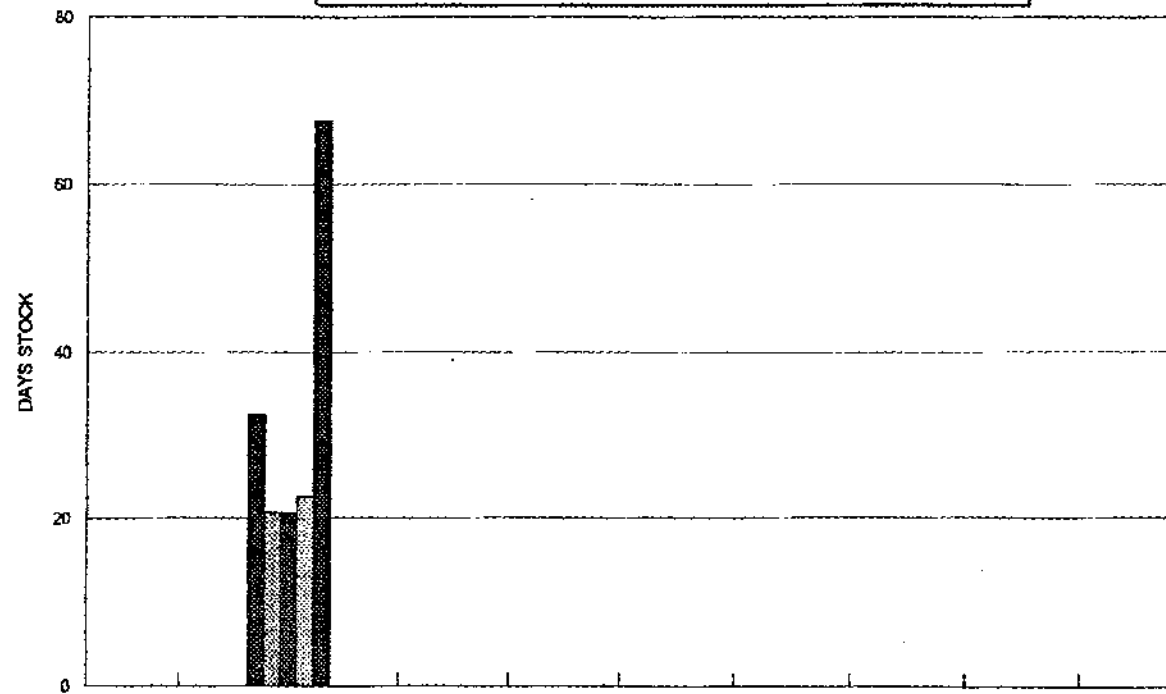

DAILY SITREP FOR 12 FEB 96

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING;

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 677. 330 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 341 CAME FROM BURUNDI AND 06 FROM UGANDA. OUT FLOW-NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 11636. OUT FLOW-NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE CHIEF PROSECUTORS OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 12 FEB 96, AND HELD GENERAL DISCUSSIONS WITH THE SRSG WHO WENT TO SEEN HIM AT THE KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT. LATER IN THE AFTERNOON THE SRSG HELD MEETINGS WITH MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC COMMUNITY AND BRIEFED THEM ABOUT DEVELOPMENTS THAT HAVE TAKEN PLACE VERY RECENTLY.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 11 FEB 96 THAT THE FOREIGN MINISTERS FROM UGANDA, TANZANIA, BURUNDI AND RWANDA HELD A MEETING IN KIGALI WITH THE AIM TO FIND WAY TO REVITALIZE THE PROJECTS OF THE KAGERA BASIN ORGANIZATION (OBK). RWANDA OWES THE ORGANIZATION US \$227,000.00 AND IS THE FIRST COUNTRY WHICH HAS BEGUN SO FAR TO PAY ITS DEBTS.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), FIRING IN THE DIRECTION OF THE LAKE KIVU WAS REPORTED ON 11 FEB 96 IN NYAMASHEKE. IT WAS GATHERED FROM GATARE COMMUNE (GR 1345) THAT RPA WAS ENGAGED IN FIRE EXCHANGE WITH FRGF ELEMENTS NEAR THE FOREST. THREE FRGF MEN WERE REPORTED KILLED AND ONE ARRESTED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA. ON 07 FEB 96 AT RURAMA SECTOR (GR 5006) GASEKE COMMUNE A MAN WAS SHOT DEAD BY SOME UNKNOWN PERSONS. SIX PERSONS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN THIS CONNECTION. HR INFORMED.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. DCOS(OPS) VISITED GISENYI TO WITNESS THE HANDING OVER OF ARMS/EQPT BY ZAIRE TO RWANDA, ALONGWITH RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER. BUT CEREMONY WAS POSTPONED TO 13 FEB 96.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 426 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT RUYENZI OWS FROM NKAMIRA. 93 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO GISENYI AND KIGALI VILLAGE. 472 PERS ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. INDEATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING RATIONS FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE.

C. FORCE ENGINEER COY DEPLOYED ONE DOZER FOR TRANSIT CAMP IN CYANGUGU, DEPLOYED ONE EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER AND TWO DUMPERS FOR RPA IN KIGALI, DESPATCHED ONE DOZER AND DUMPERS TO GISENYI FOR UNHCR AND MILOBS AND ALSO PROVIDED ONE VEHICLE TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD/BRICKS.

D. FORCE SIGNALS COY CONTINUED ACTIVATING RWANDATEL LOCAL LINES IN KIGALI AND PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM RUNDA TO KIBAYA.

E. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 139 MEDICAL AND 13 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 1 (KIBUNGO), HUMAN RIGHTS (KIBUNGO) REPORTED THAT A DEAD BODY HAS BEEN FOUND IN THE MUHAZI LAKE (GR 4696) ON 05 FEB 96. THIS IS SAID TO BE THE SECOND TIME IN THREE WEEKS THAT A BODY HAS BEEN FOUND IN THAT LAKE. GENDARMERIE HAS BEEN INFORMED AND INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

7. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL NSTR.

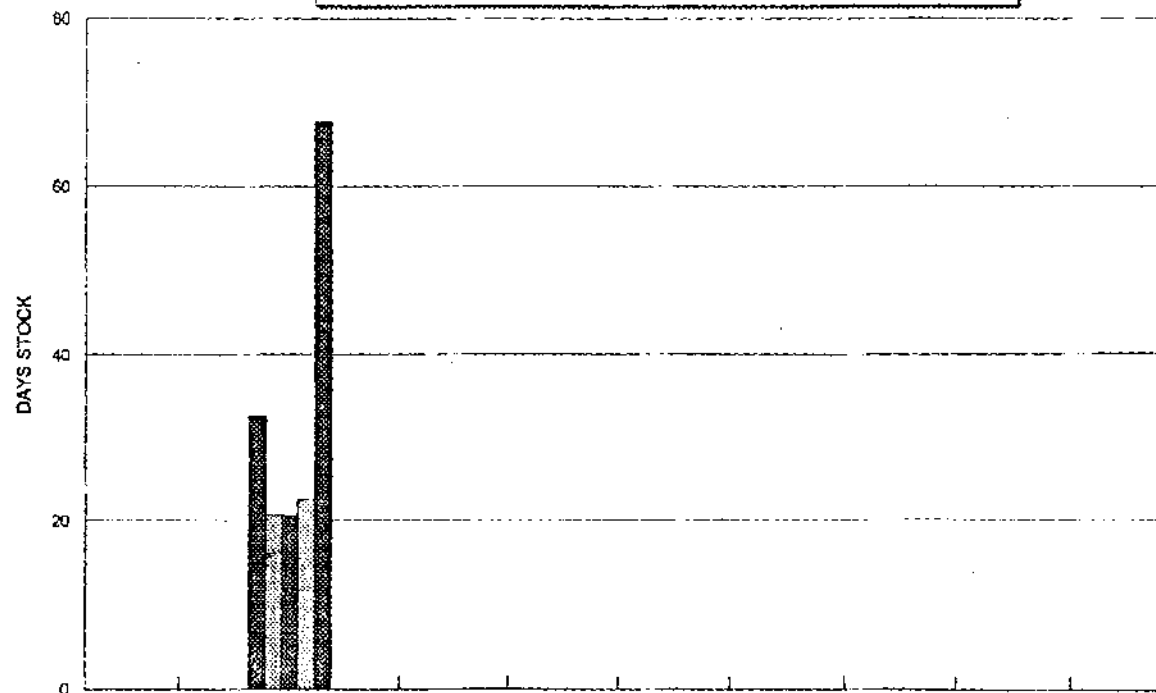

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 06 FEB 96 TO 12 FEB 96.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. THE ZAIRIAN /RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

2. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING: TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 5482. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

3. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON 05 FEB 96 RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT HAS REITERATED ITS COMMITMENT TO HAVE ALL ITS NATIONALS BACK HOME. THE RADIO QUOTED UNHCR SOURCES IN BUJUMBURA CONFIRMING THE RETURN OF 4654 RWANDAN REFUGEES FROM NTAMBA REFUGEE CAMP IN BURUNDI. ANOTHER 6000 REFUGEES HAVE MOVED TOWARDS THE TANZANIAN BORDER AND WERE SETTLED IN A TRANSIT PLACE WAITING TO BE TRANSFERRED TO A NEW CAMP UNDER CONSTRUCTION. WITH REGARDS TO THE HOLDING OF INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE GREAT LAKE REGION, THE DEPUTY SPEAKER OF THE RWANDAN NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, ACCORDING TO THE NEWS REPORT, REMARKED THAT THE PROPOSED CONFERENCE COULD NOT BE ANY DIFFERENT FROM BUJUMBURA AND NAIROBI CONFERENCES.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE CHIEF REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UN HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION IN RWANDA, MR IAN MARTIN, IN HIS MEETING WITH RWANDAN PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU ON 06 FEB 96, EXPRESSED SATISFACTION WITH REGARD TO THE IMPROVEMENTS IN THE HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION IN RWANDA. HE STATED THAT HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATION THAT OCCURRED SO, IS BECAUSE OF WEAKNESS IN INSTITUTIONS THAT CANNOT ENSURE ADEQUATE PROTECTION OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN RWANDA. HOWEVER SUCH VIOLATIONS ARE BROUGHT TO THE NOTICE OF RWANDAN GOVERNMENT AND IT HAS SHOWN WILLINGNESS TO TAKE APPROPRIATE MEASURES TO INVESTIGATE AND IDENTIFY WHAT COULD BE DONE TO IMPROVE HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY.

C. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA ON 07 FEB 96, PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU APPEALED TO INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY TO MONITOR THE DELIVERY OF ARMS IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS WHICH COULD BE USED FOR ATTACK AGAINST RWANDA. HE ALSO CALLED FOR PUTTING PRESSURE UPON ZAIRE, SO THAT RWANDA COULD RECEIVE ITS REMAINING PROPERTY, BESIDES THE HANDING OVER OF TWO HELICOPTERS OUT OF NINE HELD BY ZAIRE. THE HANDING OVER

CEREMONY WILL TAKE PLACE ON 12 FEB 96. WITH REGARDS TO THE RETURN OF REFUGEES, PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU SAID, THE RWANDAN OFFICIALS' VISITS, LIKE THE RECENT VISIT OF THE RWANDAN PRIME MINISTER TO TANZANIA, WERE MEANT TO GIVE REFUGEES ASSURANCE, SO THAT THEY CAN COME HOME, AND IF THEY DON'T, THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT WILL HAVE AN EVIDENCE, THAT IT HAD DONE ITS UTMOST TO ENCOURAGE THEM TO COME BACK. HE INDICATED THAT THE TANZANIAN GOVERNMENT WAS IN THE PROCESS OF SEPARATING INTIMIDATORS FROM THE REST OF RWANDAN REFUGEES SO THAT THEY CAN FREELY RETURN HOME.

D. THE CHIEF PROSECUTORS OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 12 FEB 96, AND HELD GENERAL DISCUSSIONS WITH THE SRSG WHO WENT TO SEEN HIM AT THE KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT. LATER IN THE AFTERNOON THE SRSG HELD MEETINGS WITH MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC COMMUNITY AND BRIEFED THEM ABOUT DEVELOPMENTS THAT HAVE TAKEN PLACE VERY RECENTLY.

E. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 11 FEB 96 THAT THE FOREIGN MINISTERS FROM UGANDA, TANZANIA, BURUNDI AND RWANDA HELD A MEETING IN KIGALI WITH THE AIM TO FIND WAY TO REVITALIZE THE PROJECTS OF THE KAGERA BASIN ORGANIZATION (OBK). RWANDA OWES THE ORGANIZATION US \$227,000.00 AND IS THE FIRST COUNTRY WHICH HAS BEGUN SO FAR TO PAY ITS DEBTS.

4. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 27 JAN 96 AT BWEYEYE (GR 1410) RPA PATROL HAD AN ENCOUNTER WITH EX FAR ELEMENTS IN WHICH ONE CIVILIAN WAS KILLED AND TWO CIVILIANS WERE INJURED. THEY WERE PART OF RPA PATROL. DETAILS OF EX FAR CASULTIES NOT KNOWN.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), THE LOCALS OF GIHORWE SECTOR IN MUTURA COMMUNE (GR 3123) COMPLAINED OF HARASSMENT BY THE RPA WITH REGARDS TO CURFEW AND THEIR SPEAKING TO MILOBS AND UN AGENCIES. A BUSINESSMAN WAS ALSO ARRESTED ON 01 FEB 96 IN KABATWA SECTOR (GR 3327) OF THE SAME COMMUNE.

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ONE PERSON WAS KILLED BY RPA IN NYAKINAMA (GR 5827), WHEN HE REFUSED TO STOP AFTER BEING CHALLENGED DURING CURFEW HRS.

(4) THE RPA DEMINING TEAM HAS COMMENCED WORK IN KINGI (GR 5440) ALONG THE TRACKS AND FOOTPATHS AND WOULD SOON MOVE TO CYERU (GR 8935) AND BUTARO (GR 8144).

(5) THE LOCAL RPA CDR REPORTED THAT THERE WAS SECOND

ANTI PERS MINE INCIDENT ON 06 FEB 96, NEAR KINHIRA RESETTLEMENT CAMP (GR 2896). THE INCIDENT OCCURRED WHEN PEOPLE RUSHED TO HELP THE INJURED PERSON IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE FIRST INCIDENT AT 0800 HRS. IN THIS A WOMAN LOST HER LEG AND A MAN WAS INJURED . THEY HAVE BEEN ADMITTED AT GISENYI HOSPITAL.

(6) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ON THE NIGHT OF 09 FEB 96, THE RPA OPENED FIRE ON DETAINEES WHO TRIED TO ESCAPE FROM CUSTODY AT THE RPA CAMP IN RUBAVU COMMUNE (GR 1812) KILLING TWO PERSONS. IT WAS ADDED THAT FOUR OF THE DETAINEES MANAGED TO ESCAPE.

(7) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), FIRING IN THE DIRECTION OF THE LAKE KIVU WAS REPORTED ON 11 FEB 96 IN NYAMASHEKE. IT WAS GATHERED FROM GATARE COMMUNE (GR 1345) THAT RPA WAS ENGAGED IN FIRE EXCHANGE WITH FRGF ELEMENTS NEAR THE FOREST. THREE FRGF MEN WERE REPORTED KILLED AND ONE ARRESTED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 31 JAN 96, MEN SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF ATTACKED A HOUSE IN THE OUTSKIRTS OF BWEYEYE (GR 1410) STOLE SOME CATTLE AND KIDNAPPED A MAN TO BURUNDI.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT FOUR PERSONS KNOWN TO BE INFORMERS OF THE RPA WERE KILLED ON 04 FEB 96 BY APPROXIMATELY 20 BANDITS PRESUMABLY FRGF, SOME OF THEM ARMED WITH AK-47 RIFLES. IT WAS LEARNT THAT ONE OF THE VICTIMS INFORMED RPA OF THE ARMS CACHE AT NKUMBA (GR 6639) ON 09 JAN 96. ONE PERSON HAS BEEN ARRESTED SO FAR.

(3) IN SECTOR 1 (KIBUNGO) A THEFT OF RECEIVER ANTENNA AND SOME CABLE FROM RADIO UNAMIR WAS REPORTED ON 06 FEB 96.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IT WAS REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 06 & 07 FEB 96 SOME ARMED PERSONS RAIDED TWO HOUSES IN GIHORWE SECTOR (GR 2635) IN MUTURA COMMUNE (GR 3123) AND MADE AWAY WITH MONEY AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS.

(5) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) IN SATINSYI COMMUNE (GR 5800) THE ASST BURGOMASTER REPORTED THE DEATH OF AN UNKNOWN PERSON IN MATYAZO SECTOR [GR 5908]. HIS BODY WAS FOUND BY THE LOCALS ON THE ROAD SIDE OF THE SECTOR. HR INFORMED.

(6) IN CYBINGO COMMUNE, SECTOR NYUNDO (GR 6123) THREE FRGF MEN WERE KILLED BY LOCALS WITH MACHETES ON 08 FEB 96, THEY WERE REPORTED TO HAVE INDULGED IN STEALING FROM

THE LOCALS IN THE AREA. TWO PERSONS SUSTAINED MACHETE WOUNDS IN CYIBINGO COMMUNE ON 06 FEB 96. THERE IS UNCONFIRMED KILLING OF ONE RPA SOLDIER ON 07/08 FEB 96 BY INFILTRATORS IN CYIBINGO. DETAILS BEING VERIFIED.

(7) IN SECTOR 1 (KIBUNGO) ABOUT A WEEK BACK, A LAND MINE BLEW OFF THE TYRES OF A TRUCK NEAR CYANKWANZI (GR 3556). NO HUMAN CASUALTIES REPORTED.

(8) ON 07 FEB 96 AT RURAMA SECTOR (GR 5006) GASEKE COMMUNE A MAN WAS SHOT DEAD BY SOME UNKNOWN PERSONS. SIX PERSONS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN THIS CONNECTION. HR INFORMED.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) ON 06 FEB 96, THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER VISITED THE FORCE ENGINEER COY WHERE HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE VARIOUS RECONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE TASKS BEING CARRIED OUT BY THE COY THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. A BRIEFING AND DEMONSTRATION ON THE VARIOUS TYPES OF ENGINEER PLANT EQUIPMENT WAS ALSO CONDUCTED.

(3) ON 07 FEB 96, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ACTING FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH THE AMBASSADOR OF FRANCE, MR JACQUES COURBIN, AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SECURITY SITUATION, REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES AND THE DISPOSAL OF ARMS AND AMMO HELD IN UN CUSTODY.

(4) THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH THE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE UNITED NATIONS DEPARTMENT OF HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS HEADED BY, MR M A DA'SILVA, AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SECURITY SITUATION.

(5) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ACTING FORCE COMMANDER, HELD A MEETING WITH THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE AND THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS AND DISCUSSED THE ASSISTANCE TO BE PROVIDED BY UNAMIR FOR TRANSPORTATION OF MILITARY EQUIPMENTS BEING HANDED OVER TO RWANDA BY THE GOVERNMENT OF ZAIRE ON 12 FEB 96 AT GOMA - GISENYI BORDER.

(6) ON 12 FEB 96, DCOS(OPS) VISITED GISENYI TO WITNESS THE HANDING OVER OF ARMS/EQPT BY ZAIRE TO RWANDA, ALONGWITH RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER. BUT CEREMONY WAS POSTPONED TO 13 FEB 96.

D. OTHER SECTORS NTR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 30 VEHS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR TRANSPORTING VARIOUS ITEMS AS PART OF HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. A TOTAL OF 472 REFUGEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

C. A TOTAL OF 685 MEDICAL AND 62 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY MED CENTRES IN VARIOUS SECTORS.

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED ONE EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER AND TWO DUMPERS TO "BMS" FOR TRANSPORTATION OF LATERITE.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), IN NYAKABANDA COMMUNE (6597), A COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY TO INVESTIGATE ON GENOCIDE SUSPECTS WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN FORMED WITH THE IPJ AS CHAIRMAN AND BOURGEMESTRE AND RPA PLATOON CDR AS MEMBERS. THE COMMISSION IS YET TO START WITH ITS INVESTIGATIONS.

B. IN SECTOR 1 (KIBUNGO), HUMAN RIGHTS (KIBUNGO) REPORTED THAT A DEAD BODY HAS BEEN FOUND IN THE MUHAZI LAKE (GR 4696) ON 05 FEB 96. THIS IS SAID TO BE THE SECOND TIME IN THREE WEEKS THAT A BODY HAS BEEN FOUND IN THAT LAKE. GENDARMERIE HAS BEEN INFORMED AND INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

7. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL IN SECTOR 3 (BUTARE), THE HOUSE OF A HUMAN RIGHTS OFFICER WAS BURGLED ON 07 FEB 96. A MUSIC SYSTEM AND OTHER HOUSE HOLD STUFF WERE TAKEN AWAY. MATTER REPORTED TO GENDARMERIE.

10. COMMENTS

A. INSURGENT ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS 4 AND 5 ARE ON THE INCREASE. THE EX-FAR IS MAKING ALL ATTEMPTS TO RE-ASSERT ITS

INFLUENCE IN THESE PREDOMINANTLY HUTU POPULATED AREAS. THIS WILL RESULT IN INCREASED RPA DEPLOYMENT, PATROLLING AND OTHER CONTROL MEASURES. THE SITUATION IS BEING MONITORED CLOSELY.

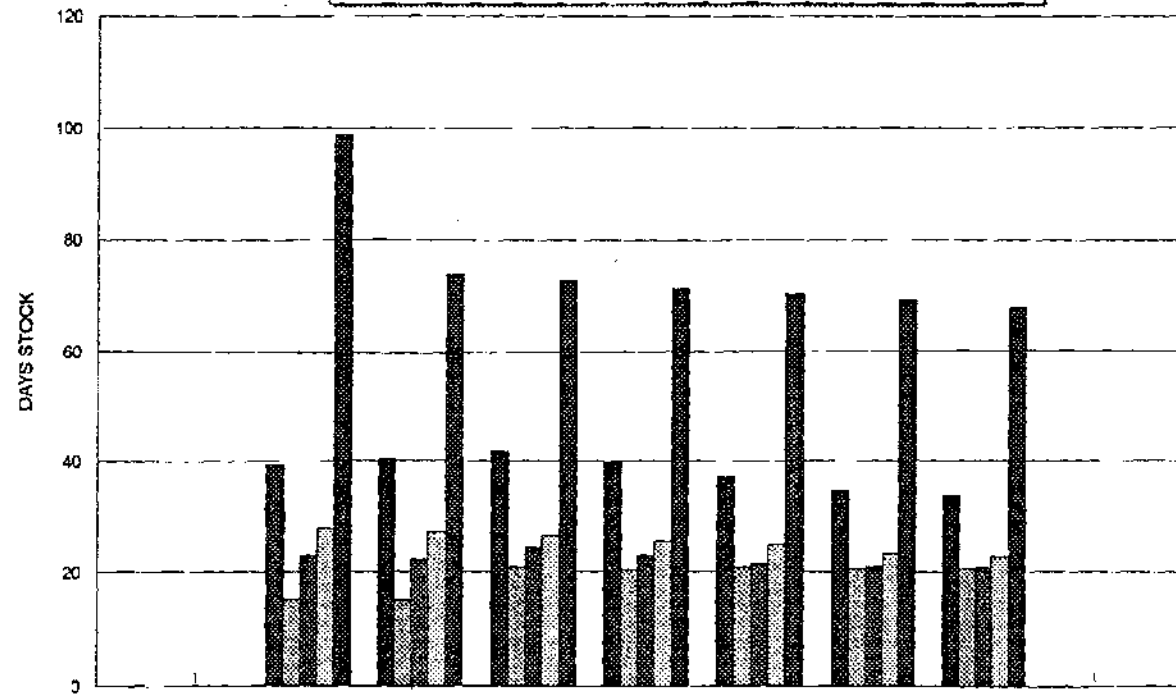

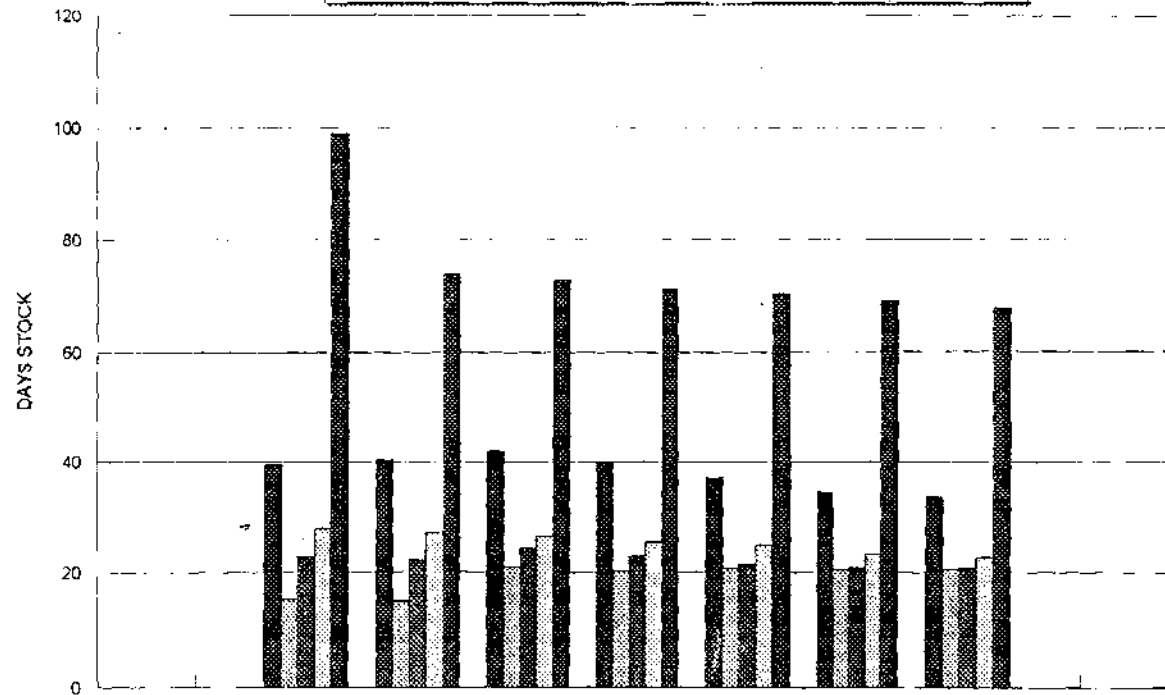

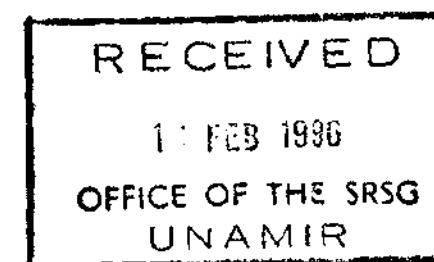

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 945. ALL CAME FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 8978 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT ZAIREAN SOLDIERS AND INTERAHAMWE MILITIAS ARE CARRYING OUT VIOLENT ACTS AGAINST THE ZAIREAN PEOPLE OF RWANDAN ORIGIN OF 1885 AND 1920. AMONG THE 3000 RETURNEES, 2700 WERE OLD IMMIGRANTS OF 1885 TO 1958. THIS SHOWS THAT RETURNING REFUGEES ARE MIXED WITH ZAIREANS OF RWANDAN ORIGIN.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA) ONE PERSON WAS ARRESTED BY RPA ON 02 FEB 96 IN MUSUMBA SECTOR FOR ALLEGED PARTICIPATION IN GENOCIDE.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) - A SECURITY MEETING WAS HELD BY THE RPA AND COMMUNE AUTHORITIES NEAR THE COMMUNE OFFICE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 06 FEB 96 SOME INFILTRATORS ENTERED A HOUSE IN RUSIZA SECTOR (GR 3028) AND GOT AWAY WITH MOST OF THE OWNERS BELONGINGS.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER VISITED SHAGASHA AND KIBUYE ON 09 FEB 96. AT SHAGASHA, HE VISITED THE LOG BASE WHERE HE DISCUSSED THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES. AT KIBUYE, HE VISITED THE PLATOON EX-GHANCOY AND ALSO MET THE EXPERTS OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL WORKING THERE, EXHUMING THE REMAINS OF GENOCIDE VICTIMS.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. NO RETURNEES ARRIVED AT RUYENZI CAMP. 161 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO BYUMBA, BUTARE, GISENYI, KIGALI TOWN, KIGALI RURAL, GITARAMA, KIBUYE AND KIBUNGO. A TOTAL OF 120 RETURNEES ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. INDBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO "CONCERN WORLD WIDE" FOR DISTRIBUTION OF BLANKETS AND FOOD STUFF TO VARIOUS COMMUNES IN BUTARE. THEY ALSO TRANSPORTED 08 TONNES OF FOOD TO VARIOUS SECTORS IN KIGALI PREFECTURE AND TRANSPORTED BUILDING MATERIALS FOR AN NGO "FOURTH WAVE" FROM GIKONGORO TO KIGALI.

C. NICOY ASSISTED "FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY" WITH 2 TRUCKS TO TRANSPORT BURNT BRICKS WITHIN GISENYI PREFECTURE.

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED ONE VEHICLE TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF BRICKS/WOOD, DEPLOYED ONE DOZER FOR TRANSIT CAMP IN CYANGUGU, ONE EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER AND TWO DUMPERS TO RPA KIGALI AND ALSO DESPATCHED A TEAM FOR SECURITY FENCING AND LIGHTING IN BUTARE PRISON.

E. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM RUNDA TO KIBAYA ON THE REQUEST OF ARDEC.

F. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 142 MEDICAL AND 13 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 1 (KIBUNGO) - THREE UNAMIR REPRESENTATIVES AND THREE OTHERS FROM THE MINISTRY OF JUSTICE VISITED THE KIBUNGO PRISON TO CHECK ON THE CONDITION OF PRISONERS. SECURITY WAS PROVIDED BY THE RPA.

7. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), ON 09 FEB 96 THE RADIO ANTENNA OF RURAL SHOOT WAS STOLEN.

DAILY SITREP FOR 08 FEB 96

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS **1351**. 944 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 407 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS **NIL**.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS **8033** AND OUTFLOW IS **NIL**.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA ON 07 FEBRUARY, PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU APPEALED TO INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY TO MONITOR THE DELIVERY OF ARMS IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS WHICH COULD BE USED FOR ATTACK AGAINST RWANDA. HE ALSO CALLED FOR PUTTING PRESSURE UPON ZAIRE, SO THAT RWANDA COULD RECEIVE ITS REMAINING PROPERTY, BESIDES THE HANDING OVER OF TWO HELICOPTERS OUT OF NINE HELI BY ZAIRE. THE HANDING OVER CEREMONY WILL TAKE PLACE ON 12 FEB 96.

B. WITH REGARDS TO THE RETURN OF REFUGEES, PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU SAID, THE RWANDAN OFFICIALS' VISITS, LIKE THE RECENT VISIT OF THE RWANDAN PRIME MINISTER TO TANZANIA, WERE MEANT TO GIVE REFUGEES ASSURANCE, SO THAT THEY CAN COME HOME, AND IF THEY DON'T, THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT WILL HAVE AN EVIDENCE, THAT IT HAD DONE ITS UTMOST TO ENCOURAGE THEM TO COME BACK. HE INDICATED THAT THE TANZANIAN GOVERNMENT WAS IN THE PROCESS OF SEPARATING INTIMIDATORS FROM THE REST OF RWANDAN REFUGEES SO THAT THEY CAN FREELY RETURN HOME.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 5 [GISENYI] ONE PERSON WAS KILLED BY RPA IN NYAKINAMA (GR 5827), WHEN HE REFUSED TO STOP AFTER BEING CHALLENGED DURING CURFEW HRS.

(2) THE RPA DEMINING TEAM HAS COMMENCED WORK IN KINGI (GR 5440) ALONG THE TRACKS AND FOOTPATHS AND WOULD SOON

MOVE TO CYERU (GR 8935) AND BUTARO (GR 8144).

(3) THE LOCAL RPA CDR REPORTED THAT THERE WAS SECOND ANTI PERS MINE INCIDENT ON 06 FEB 96, NEAR KINHIRA RESETTLEMENT CAMP (GR 2896). THE INCIDENT OCCURRED WHEN PEOPLE RUSHED TO HELP THE INJURED PERSON IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE FIRST INCIDENT AT 0800 HRS. IN THIS A WOMAN LOST HER LEG AND A MAN WAS INJURED. THEY HAVE BEEN ADMITTED AT GISENYI HOSPITAL.

B. FRGE/MILITIA.

(1) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) IN SATINSYI COMMUNE (GR 5800) THE ASST BURGOMASTER REPORTED THE DEATH OF AN UNKNOWN PERSON IN MATYAZO SECTOR [GR 5908]. HIS BODY WAS FOUND BY THE LOCALS ON THE ROAD SIDE OF THE SECTOR.

(2) IN CYBINGO COMMUNE, SECTOR NYUNDO (GR 6123) THREE FRGE MEN WERE KILLED BY LOCALS WITH MACHETES ON 08 FEB 96, THEY WERE REPORTED TO HAVE INDULGED IN STEALING FROM THE LOCALS IN THE AREA. TWO PERSONS SUSTAINED MACHETE WOUNDS IN CYBINGO COMMUNE ON 06 FEB 96. THERE IS UNCONFIRMED KILLING OF ONE RPA SOLDIER ON 07/08 FEB 96 BY INFILTRATORS IN CYBINGO. DETAILS BEING VERIFIED.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

(1) THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH THE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE UNITED NATIONS DEPARTMENT OF HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS HEADED BY, MR M A DA'SILVA, AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SECURITY SITUATION.

(2) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ACTING FORCE COMMANDER, HELD A MEETING WITH THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE AND THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS AND DISCUSSED THE ASSISTANCE TO BE PROVIDED BY UNAMIR FOR TRANSPORTATION OF MILITARY EQUIPMENTS BEING HANDED OVER TO RWANDA BY THE GOVERNMENT OF ZAIRE ON 12 FEB 96 AT GOMA - GISENYI BORDER.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 126 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT RUYENZI CAMP FROM BUTARE AND KIBUNGO. 17 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO. A TOTAL NUMBER OF 281 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVACUATION FROM RUYENZI.

B. INDBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO "CONCERN WORLD WIDE" FOR DISTRIBUTION OF BLANKETS AND FOOD STUFF FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE. THEY ALSO TRANSPORTED 12 TONES OF FOOD TO VARIOUS SECTORS IN KIGALI PREFECTURE AND CARRIED ELECTRIFICATION TASKS AND REPAIRS TO REFRIGERATION EQUIPMENTS AT MISSIONARIES OF

CHARITY ORPHANAGE (MOTHER TERESA'S GP), AT KIBUNGO.

C. NICOY ASSISTED "FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY" WITH 2 TRUCKS TO TRANSPORT BURNT BRICKS WITHIN GISENYI PREFECTURE.

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED ONE VEHICLE TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF BRICKS / WOOD, AND ALSO PROVIDED ONE EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER AND TWO DUMPERS TO BMS FOR TRANSPORTATION OF LATERITE.

E. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM RUNDA TO KIBYA ON THE REQUEST OF ARDEC.

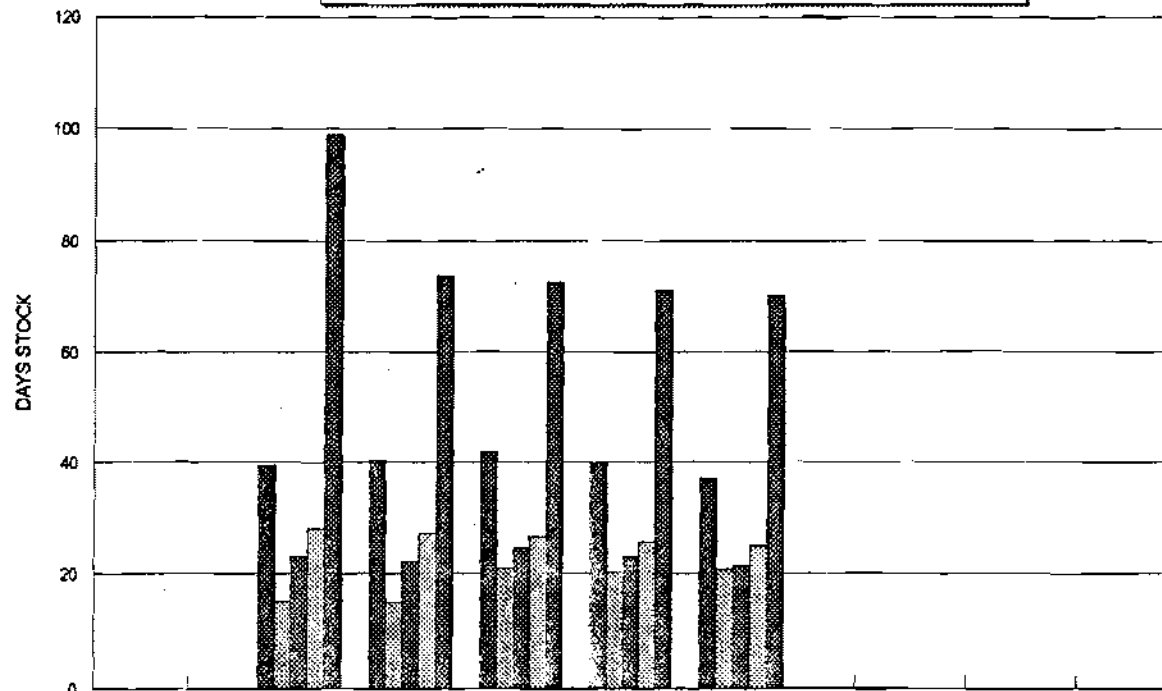

DAILY SITREP FOR 08 FEB 96

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 1351. 944 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 407 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 8033 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA ON 07 FEBRUARY, PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU APPEALED TO INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY TO MONITOR THE DELIVERY OF ARMS IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS WHICH COULD BE USED FOR ATTACK AGAINST RWANDA. HE ALSO CALLED FOR PUTTING PRESSURE UPON ZAIRE, SO THAT RWANDA COULD RECEIVE ITS REMAINING PROPERTY, BESIDES THE HANDING OVER OF TWO HELICOPTERS OUT OF NINE HELI BY ZAIRE. THE HANDING OVER CEREMONY WILL TAKE PLACE ON 12 FEB 96.

B. WITH REGARDS TO THE RETURN OF REFUGEES, PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU SAID, THE RWANDAN OFFICIALS' VISITS, LIKE THE RECENT VISIT OF THE RWANDAN PRIME MINISTER TO TANZANIA, WERE MEANT TO GIVE REFUGEES ASSURANCE, SO THAT THEY CAN COME HOME, AND IF THEY DON'T, THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT WILL HAVE AN EVIDENCE, THAT IT HAD DONE ITS UTMOST TO ENCOURAGE THEM TO COME BACK. HE INDICATED THAT THE TANZANIAN GOVERNMENT WAS IN THE PROCESS OF SEPARATING INTIMIDATORS FROM THE REST OF RWANDAN REFUGEES SO THAT THEY CAN FREELY RETURN HOME.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 5 [GISENYI] ONE PERSON WAS KILLED BY RPA IN NYAKINAMA (GR 5827), WHEN HE REFUSED TO STOP AFTER BEING CHALLENGED DURING CURFEW HRS.

(2) THE RPA DEMINING TEAM HAS COMMENCED WORK IN KINGI (GR 5440) ALONG THE TRACKS AND FOOTPATHS AND WOULD SOON

MOVE TO CYERU (GR 8935) AND BUTARO (GR 8144).

(3) THE LOCAL RPA CDR REPORTED THAT THERE WAS SECOND ANTI PERS MINE INCIDENT ON 06 FEB 96, NEAR KINHIRA RESETTLEMENT CAMP (GR 2896). THE INCIDENT OCCURRED WHEN PEOPLE RUSHED TO HELP THE INJURED PERSON IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE FIRST INCIDENT AT 0800 HRS. IN THIS A WOMAN LOST HER LEG AND A MAN WAS INJURED. THEY HAVE BEEN ADMITTED AT GISENYI HOSPITAL.

B. FRGF/MILITIA.

(1) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) IN SATINSYI COMMUNE (GR 5800) THE ASST BURGOMASTER REPORTED THE DEATH OF AN UNKNOWN PERSON IN MATYAZO SECTOR [GR 5908]. HIS BODY WAS FOUND BY THE LOCALS ON THE ROAD SIDE OF THE SECTOR.

(2) IN CYBINGO COMMUNE, SECTOR NYUNDO (GR 6123) THREE FRGF MEN WERE KILLED BY LOCALS WITH MACHETES ON 08 FEB 96, THEY WERE REPORTED TO HAVE INDULGED IN STEALING FROM THE LOCALS IN THE AREA. TWO PERSONS SUSTAINED MACHETE WOUNDS IN CYBINGO COMMUNE ON 06 FEB 96. THERE IS UNCONFIRMED KILLING OF ONE RPA SOLDIER ON 07/08 FEB 96 BY INFILTRATORS IN CYBINGO. DETAILS BEING VERIFIED.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

(1) THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH THE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE UNITED NATIONS DEPARTMENT OF HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS HEADED BY, MR M A DA'SILVA, AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SECURITY SITUATION.

(2) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ACTING FORCE COMMANDER, HELD A MEETING WITH THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE AND THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS AND DISCUSSED THE ASSISTANCE TO BE PROVIDED BY UNAMIR FOR TRANSPORTATION OF MILITARY EQUIPMENTS BEING HANDED OVER TO RWANDA BY THE GOVERNMENT OF ZAIRE ON 12 FEB 96 AT GOMA - GISENYI BORDER.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 126 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT RUYENZI CAMP FROM BUTARE AND KIBUNGO. 17 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO. A TOTAL NUMBER OF 281 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVACUATION FROM RUYENZI.

B. INDBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO "CONCERN WORLD WIDE" FOR DISTRIBUTION OF BLANKETS AND FOOD STUFF FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE. THEY ALSO TRANSPORTED 12 TONES OF FOOD TO VARIOUS SECTORS IN KIGALI PREFECTURE AND CARRIED ELECTRIFICATION TASKS AND REPAIRS TO REFRIGERATION EQUIPMENTS AT MISSIONARIES OF

CHARITY ORPHANAGE (MOTHER TERESA'S GP), AT KIBUNGO.

C. NICOY ASSISTED "FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY" WITH 2 TRUCKS TO TRANSPORT BURNT BRICKS WITHIN GISENYI PREFECTURE.

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED ONE VEHICLE TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF BRICKS / WOOD, AND ALSO PROVIDED ONE EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER AND TWO DUMPERS TO BMS FOR TRANSPORTATION OF LATERITE.

E. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM RUNDA TO KIBYA ON THE REQUEST OF ARDEC.

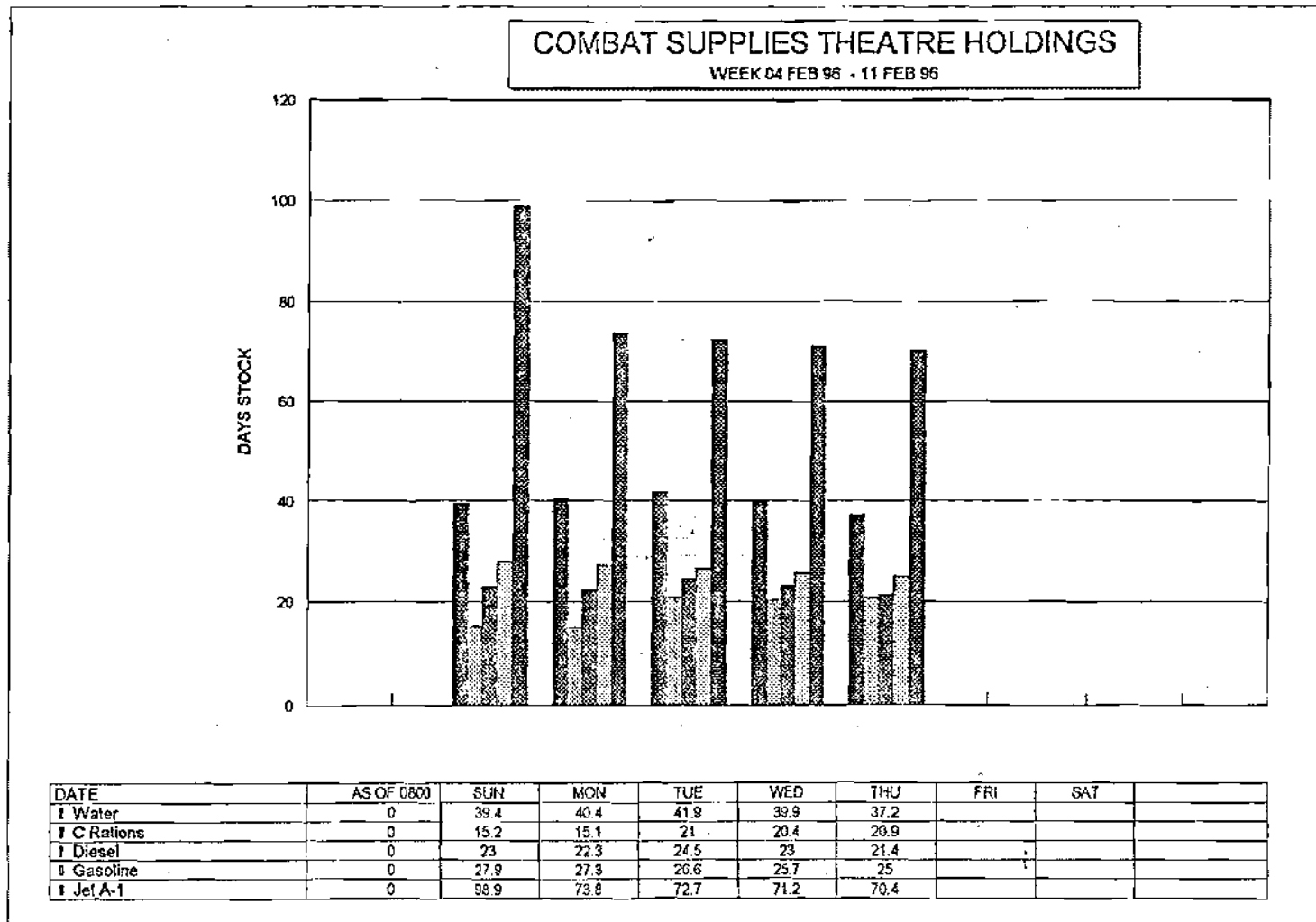

DAILY SITREP FOR 07 FEB 96

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 302. 205 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 01 FROM BURUNDI, 84 FROM TANZANIA AND 12 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 6682 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING WAS HELD AT THE UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM AND AS PER THE AGENDA, THE RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE OF UNDP, MR SUKEHIRO HASEGAWA, DISCUSSED THE OUTCOME OF THE UNDP CONFERENCE OF AFRICAN MINISTRIES IN OUAGADOUGOU BETWEEN 29-31 JAN 96. THEREAFTER PREPARATIONS REGARDING THE ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE DUE TO BE HELD SHORTLY WERE REVIEWED. THE THIRD ITEM ON THE AGENDA WAS THE ISSUE OF NGO'S. IN THIS REGARD METHODOLOGY HAS BEEN DEVISED WHEREBY THE PERFORMANCE OF VARIOUS NGOS IS TO BE EVALUATED. FINALLY UNHCR REPRESENTATIVE BRIEFED THE MEMBERS ON THE REPATRIATION PROCESS AND ARRANGEMENTS CONTEMPLATED FOR RECEIVING THE RETURNEES.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE CHIEF REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UN HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION IN RWANDA, MR IAN MARTIN, IN HIS MEETING WITH RWANDAN PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU ON 06 FEB 96, EXPRESSED SATISFACTION WITH REGARD TO THE IMPROVEMENTS IN THE HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION IN RWANDA. HE STATED THAT HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATION THAT OCCURRED SO, IS BECAUSE OF WEAKNESS IN INSTITUTIONS THAT CANNOT ENSURE ADEQUATE PROTECTION OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN RWANDA. HOWEVER SUCH VIOLATIONS ARE BROUGHT TO THE NOTICE OF RWANDAN GOVERNMENT AND IT HAS SHOWN WILLINGNESS TO TAKE APPROPRIATE MEASURES TO INVESTIGATE AND IDENTIFY WHAT COULD BE DONE TO IMPROVE HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), THE LOCALS OF GIHORWE SECTOR IN MUTURA COMMUNE (GR 3123) COMPLAINED OF HARASSMENT BY THE RPA WITH REGARDS TO CURFEW AND THEIR SPEAKING TO MILOBS AND UN AGENCIES. A BUSINESSMAN WAS ALSO ARRESTED ON 01 FEB 96 IN KABATWA SECTOR (GR 3327) OF THE SAME COMMUNE. FURTHER INFO BEING GATHERED.

B. FRGE/MILITIA. IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IT WAS REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 06 & 07 FEB 96 SOME ARMED PERSONS RAIDED TWO HOUSES IN GIHORWE SECTOR (GR 2635) IN MUTURA COMMUNE (GR 3123) AND MADE AWAY WITH MONEY AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ACTING FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH THE AMBASSADOR OF FRANCE, MR JAQUES COURBIN, AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SECURITY SITUATION, REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES AND THE DISPOSAL OF ARMS AND AMMO HELD IN UN CUSTODY.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 45 RETURNEES ARRIVED RUYENZI OWS FROM NKAMIRA . 328 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO GITARAMA, KIGALI, BUTARE BYUMBA AND KIBUNGO. A TOTAL NO OF 172 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. INDBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO KIGALI PREFECTURE FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD STUFF TO VARIOUS SECTEURS IN KIGALI, TWO TRUCKS TO "CONCERN WORLD WIDE" KIGALI FOR TRANSPORTING REUNIFICATION KITS FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE AND ASSISTED IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF BLANKETS AND FOOD STUFF TO VARIOUS COMMUNES WITHIN BUTARE. ELECTRIFICATION AND FITTING OF TUBE LIGHTS IN MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY (MOTHER TERESA'S GROUP) KIGALI WAS ALSO CARRIED OUT.

C. NICOY ASSISTED "FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY" WITH A TRUCK TO TRANSPORT 4500 BURNT BRICKS FROM GISENYI PREFECTURE TO MUKINGO AND RUNHENGARI. ALSO ASSISTED "MERLIN" TO RECOVER AN ACCIDENT VEH FROM GISENYI TO ITS LOC.

D. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED ONE DOZER IN TRANSIT CAMP CYANGUGU, PROVIDED A TRUCK FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD/ BRICKS AND PROVIDED THREE VEHICLES TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD STUFF FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE.

E. FORCE SIGNAL COMPANY CONTINUES ACTIVATING RWANDAN TEL IN KIGALI. ALSO PROVIDED ONE TRUCK FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM RUNDA TO KIBAYA ON THE REQUEST OF LOCAL ORGANISATION ARDEC.

F. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 137 MEDICAL AND 11 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), IN NYAKABANDA COMMUNE (6597), A COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY TO INVESTIGATE ON GENOCIDE SUSPECTS WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN FORMED WITH THE IPJ AS CHAIRMAN AND BOURGEMESTRE AND RPA PLATOON CDR AS MEMBERS. THE COMMISSION IS YET TO START WITH ITS INVESTIGATIONS.

7. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL IN SECTOR 3 (BUTARE), THE HOUSE OF A HUMAN RIGHTS OFFICER WAS BURGLERD ON 07 FEB 96. A MUSIC SYSTEM AND OTHER HOUSE HOLD STUFF WERE TAKEN AWAY. MATTER REPORTED TO GENDARMERIE.

DAILY SITREP FOR 07 FEB 96

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 302. 205 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 01 FROM BURUNDI, 84 FROM TANZANIA AND 12 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 6682 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING WAS HELD AT THE UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM AND AS PER THE AGENDA, THE RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE OF UNDP, MR SUKEHIRO HASEGAWA, DISCUSSED THE OUTCOME OF THE UNDP CONFERENCE OF AFRICAN MINISTRIES IN OUAGADOUGOU BETWEEN 29-31 JAN 96. THEREAFTER PREPARATIONS REGARDING THE ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE DUE TO BE HELD SHORTLY WERE REVIEWED. THE THIRD ITEM ON THE AGENDA WAS THE ISSUE OF NGO'S. IN THIS REGARD METHODOLOGY HAS BEEN DEVISED WHEREBY THE PERFORMANCE OF VARIOUS NGOS IS TO BE EVALUATED. FINALLY UNHCR REPRESENTATIVE BRIEFED THE MEMBERS ON THE REPATRIATION PROCESS AND ARRANGEMENTS CONTEMPLATED FOR RECEIVING THE RETURNEES.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE CHIEF REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UN HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION IN RWANDA, MR IAN MARTIN, IN HIS MEETING WITH RWANDAN PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU ON 06 FEB 96, EXPRESSED SATISFACTION WITH REGARD TO THE IMPROVEMENTS IN THE HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION IN RWANDA. HE STATED THAT HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATION THAT OCCURRED SO, IS BECAUSE OF WEAKNESS IN INSTITUTIONS THAT CANNOT ENSURE ADEQUATE PROTECTION OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN RWANDA. HOWEVER SUCH VIOLATIONS ARE BROUGHT TO THE NOTICE OF RWANDAN GOVERNMENT AND IT HAS SHOWN WILLINGNESS TO TAKE APPROPRIATE MEASURES TO INVESTIGATE AND IDENTIFY WHAT COULD BE DONE TO IMPROVE HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), THE LOCALS OF GIHORWE SECTOR IN MUTURA COMMUNE (GR 3123) COMPLAINED OF HARASSMENT BY THE RPA WITH REGARDS TO CURFEW AND THEIR SPEAKING TO MILOBS AND UN AGENCIES. A BUSINESSMAN WAS ALSO ARRESTED ON 01 FEB 96 IN KABATWA SECTOR (GR 3327) OF THE SAME COMMUNE. FURTHER INFO BEING GATHERED.

B. FRGE/MILITIA. IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IT WAS REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 06 & 07 FEB 96 SOME ARMED PERSONS RAIDED TWO HOUSES IN GIHORWE SECTOR (GR 2635) IN MUTURA COMMUNE (GR 3123) AND MADE AWAY WITH MONEY AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ACTING FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH THE AMBASSADOR OF FRANCE, MR JAQUES COURBIN, AND DISCUSSED THE OVERALL SECURITY SITUATION, REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES AND THE DISPOSAL OF ARMS AND AMMO HELD IN UN CUSTODY.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 45 RETURNEES ARRIVED RUYENZI OWS FROM NKAMIRA . 328 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO GITARAMA, KIGALI, BUTARE BYUMBA AND KIBUNGO. A TOTAL NO OF 172 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. INDBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO KIGALI PREFECTURE FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD STUFF TO VARIOUS SECTEURS IN KIGALI, TWO TRUCKS TO "CONCERN WORLD WIDE" KIGALI FOR TRANSPORTING REUNIFICATION KITS FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE AND ASSISTED IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF BLANKETS AND FOOD STUFF TO VARIOUS COMMUNES WITHIN BUTARE. ELECTRIFICATION AND FITTING OF TUBE LIGHTS IN MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY (MOTHER TERESA'S GROUP) KIGALI WAS ALSO CARRIED OUT.

C. NICOY ASSISTED "FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY" WITH A TRUCK TO TRANSPORT 4500 BURNT BRICKS FROM GISENYI PREFECTURE TO MUKINGO AND RUNHENGARI. ALSO ASSISTED "MERLIN" TO RECOVER AN ACCIDENT VEH FROM GISENYI TO ITS LOC.

D. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED ONE DOZER IN TRANSIT CAMP CYANGUGU, PROVIDED A TRUCK FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD/ BRICKS AND PROVIDED THREE VEHICLES TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD STUFF FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE.

E. FORCE SIGNAL COMPANY CONTINUES ACTIVATING RWANDAN TEL IN KIGALI. ALSO PROVIDED ONE TRUCK FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM RUNDA TO KIBAYA ON THE REQUEST OF LOCAL ORGANISATION ARDEC.

F. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 137 MEDICAL AND 11 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), IN NYAKABANDA COMMUNE (6597), A COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY TO INVESTIGATE ON GENOCIDE SUSPECTS WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN FORMED WITH THE IPJ AS CHAIRMAN AND BOURGEMESTRE AND RPA PLATOON CDR AS MEMBERS. THE COMMISSION IS YET TO START WITH ITS INVESTIGATIONS.

7. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL IN SECTOR 3 (BUTARE), THE HOUSE OF A HUMAN RIGHTS OFFICER WAS BURGLERD ON 07 FEB 96. A MUSIC SYSTEM AND OTHER HOUSE HOLD STUFF WERE TAKEN AWAY. MATTER REPORTED TO GENDARMERIE.

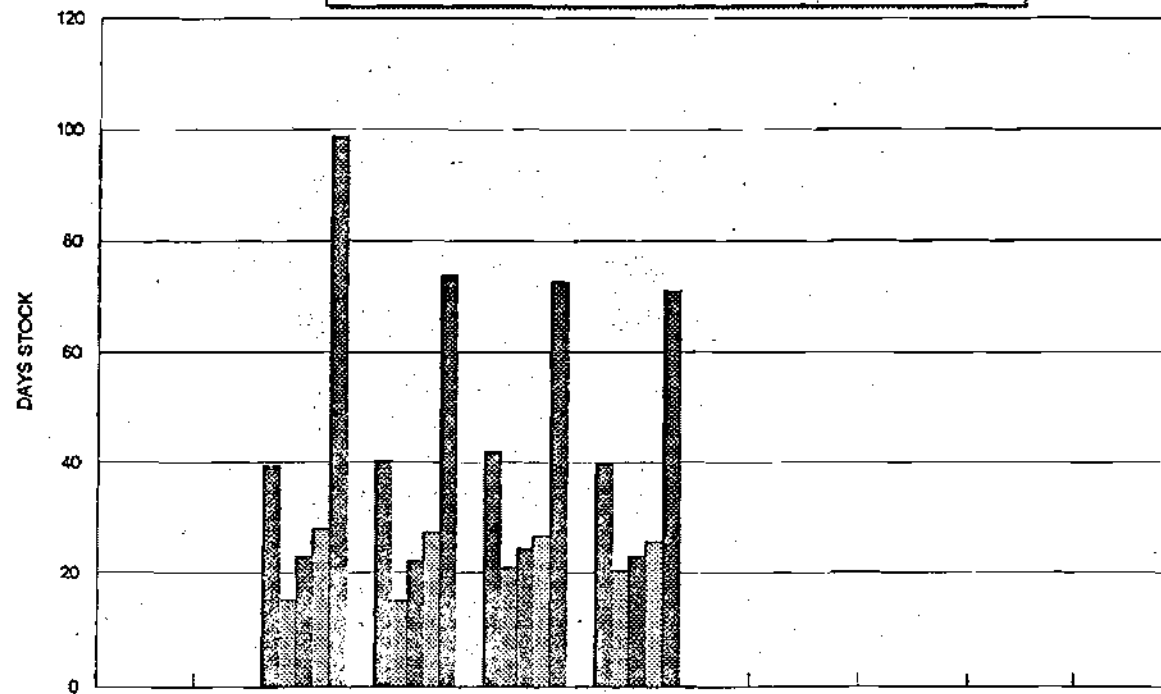



RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. TWO JOURNALISTS WERE REFUSED PERMISSION TO ENTER ZAIRE AT THE BORDER. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 226.178 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 48 CAME FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

WITH REGARDS TO THE HOLDING OF INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE GREAT LAKE REGION, THE DEPUTY SPEAKER OF THE RWANDAN NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, ACCORDING TO THE NEWS REPORT, REMARKED THAT THE PROPOSED CONFERENCE COULD NOT BE ANY DIFFERENT FROM BUJUMBURA AND NAIROBI CONFERENCES.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 27 JAN 96 AT BWEYEYE (GR 1410) RPA PATROL HAD AN ENCOUNTER WITH EX FAR ELEMENTS IN WHICH ONE CIVILIAN WAS KILLED AND TWO CIVILIANS WERE INJURED. THEY WERE PART OF RPA PATROL. DETAILS OF EX FAR CASULTIES NOT KNOWN.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT FOUR PERSONS KNOWN TO BE INFORMERS OF THE RPA WERE KILLED ON 04 FEB 96 BY APPROXIMATELY 20 BANDITS PRESUMABLY FRGF, SOME OF THEM ARMED WITH AK-47 RIFLES. IT WAS LEARNT THAT ONE OF THE VICTIMS INFORMED RPA OF THE ARMS CACHE AT NKUMBA (GR 6639) ON 09 JAN 96. ONE PERSON HAS BEEN ARRESTED SO FAR.

(3) IN SECTOR 1 (KIBUNGO) A THEFT OF RECEIVER ANTENNA AND SOME CABLE FROM RADIO UNAMIR WAS REPORTED ON 06 FEB 96.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER VISITED THE FORCE ENGINEER COY WHERE HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE VARIOUS RECONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE TASKS BEING CARRIED OUT BY THE COY THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. 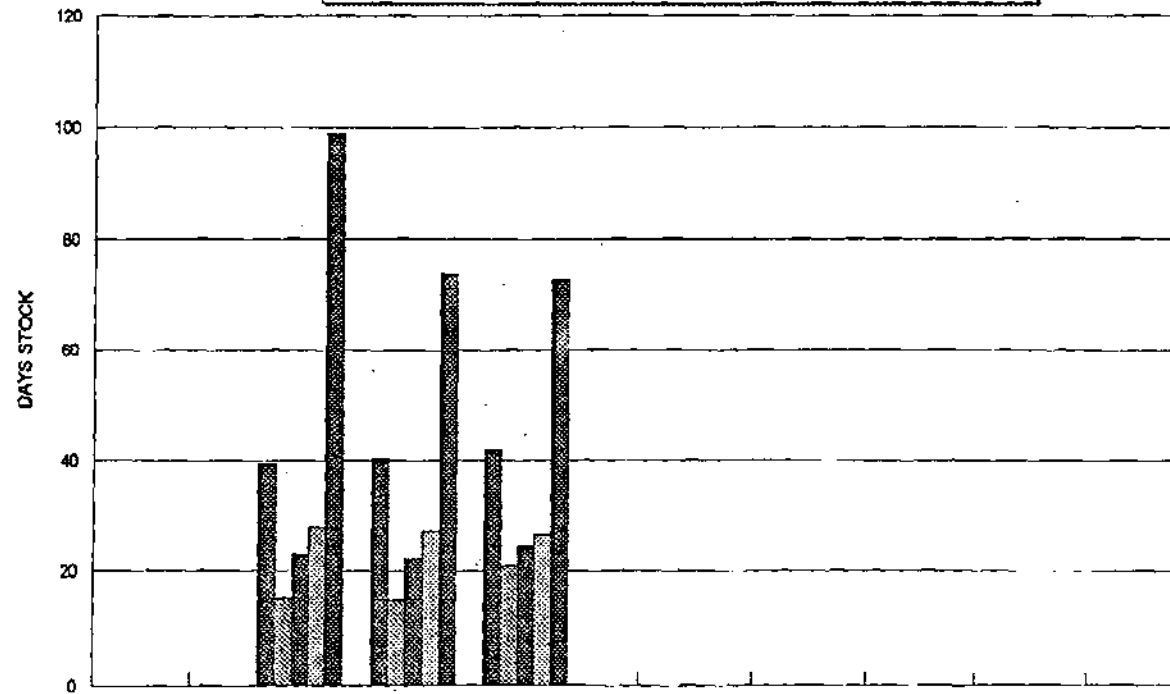

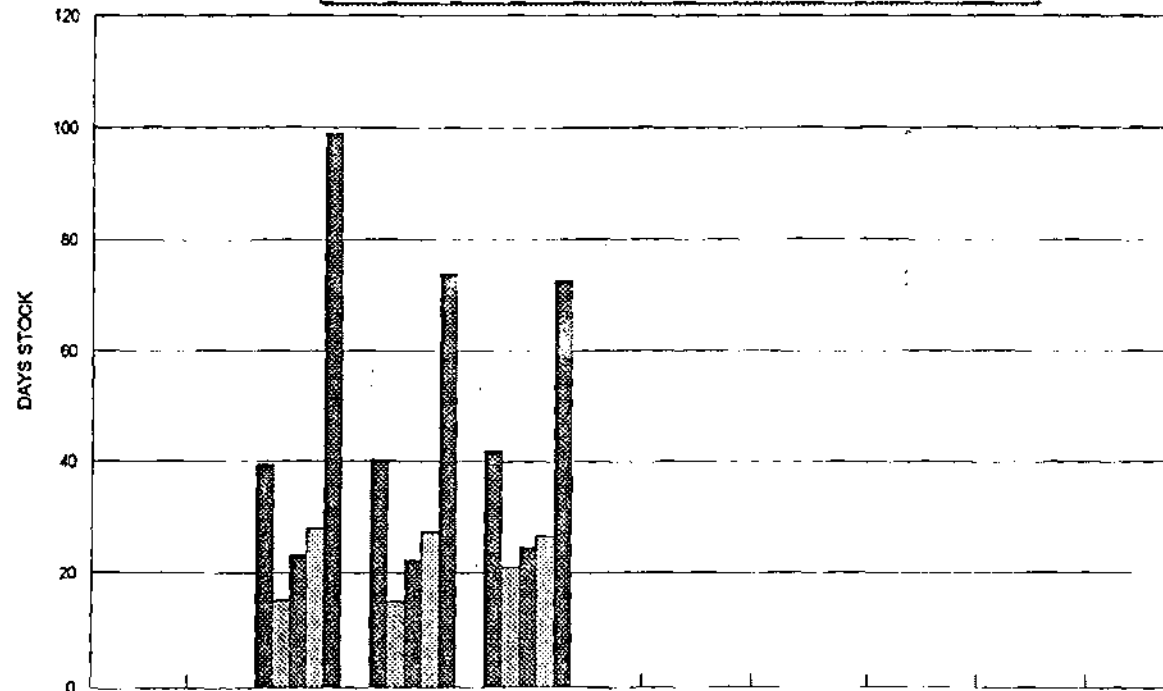

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 30 JAN 96 TO 05 FEB 96.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. THE ZAIRIAN /RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

2. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING: TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 7502. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

3. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. HEAD OF AGENCIES MEETING WAS HELD IN UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM. MATTERS CONCERNING REFUGEE REPATRIATION, SECURITY SITUATION AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE TRIPARTITE MEETINGS WERE DISCUSSED. ISSUES PERTAINING TO THE FORTHCOMING ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE WERE ALSO DELIBERATED UPON.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDAN PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, ACCOMPANIED BY THE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, THE PRIME MINISTER P CLESTIN RWIGEMA, AND SOME OTHER DIGNITARIES, VISITED CYANGUGU PREFECTURE ON 30 JANUARY 1996 AND DISCUSSED THE PROBLEMS FACING THE POPULATION OF THAT PREFECTURE. IN PARTICULAR THE ISSUE OF OLD CURRENCY NOTES BROUGHT BY PEOPLE COMING BACK FROM BUKAVU CAMPS IN ZAIRE WAS DISCUSSED.

C. THE RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE UNITED NATIONS IS TRYING TO FIND A REPLACEMENT FOR THE CHIEF PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, WHO HAS BEEN APPOINTED TO HEAD THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT IN HIS COUNTRY SOUTH AFRICA.

D. IT FURTHER REPORTED, THAT THE REPLACEMENT WOULD NOT COME FROM ANY AFRICAN COUNTRY NOR FROM FRANCE OR BELGIUM, BECAUSE RWANDA WOULD NOT AGREE. THE RADIO ALSO QUOTED RELIABLE SOURCES, AS HAVING INDICATED THAT THE REPLACEMENT FOR JUDGE GOLDSTONE WOULD COME FROM CANADA.

E. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, A DELEGATION CONSISTING OF DELEGATES FROM UNHCR, THE GOVERNMENT OF BURUNDI AND THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA VISITED RWANDAN REFUGEES CAMPS IN BURUNDI AND PERSUADED THE REFUGEES TO RETURN TO RWANDA. THEY WERE TOLD THAT THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM IN RWANDA WAS BEING RESTORED AND ONCE A REFUGEE IS REPATRIATED, HE CAN CLAIM

HIS PROPERTY BY APPROACHING THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES INSTEAD OF GOING STRAIGHT TO THE ILLEGAL OCCUPANT.

F. RWANDAN RADIO ALSO REPORTED THAT ZAIRE IS ABOUT TO CLOSE KIBUMBA AND GASHYUSHYA REFUGEE CAMPS AND REFUGEES INFLUX WILL COMMENCE.

G. ON 02 FEB 96 RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE NTAMBA REFUGEE CAMP IN BURUNDI MIGHT BE CLOSED WITHIN TWO DAYS. OUT OF 8000 REFUGEES, IN THE CAMP, ONLY 2000 WERE TRANSPORTED BY UNHCR TRUCKS TO BUTARE, GIKONGORO, KIBUNGO AND KIGALI RURAL. IT FURTHER REPORTED THAT THE TRIPARTITE COMMISSION RECOMMENDED THE SEPARATION OF INTIMIDATORS FROM GENUINE REFUGEES IN THE CAMPS AND BE TRANSFERRED TO ANOTHER LOCATION IN BURUNDI, WHICH WOULD BE COMMUNICATED TO UNHCR BY BURUNDIAN AUTHORITIES.

H. ON 03 FEB 96 RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT MR CLAUDE DUSAIDI, THE VICE-PRESIDENT'S ADVISOR, EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE ALLEGED DISBANDING OF THE COMMISSION OF INQUIRY, INVESTIGATING THE ILLEGAL ARMS TRAFFIC IN GREAT LAKES REGION. HE SAID THAT MILITIAS FROM BURUNDI AND RWANDA ARE IN ZAIRE GETTING READY TO ATTACK RWANDA. IF THE COMMISSION IS DISBANDED THEN THERE WILL BE NO ONE TO CHECK THE ARMS SUPPLY TO MILITIA AND EX-FAR. HE FURTHER ADDED THAT HE FINDS IT WISE TO ENFORCE AND EQUIP THE COMMISSION SO THAT IT CAN ACHIEVE ITS GOALS RATHER THAN DISBAND IT. HE CONCLUDED THAT, IF NECESSARY, THE UN WOULD HAVE TO TAKE SOME FORMAL SANCTIONS OR FORCEFUL MEASURES TO FORCE ZAIRE TO COMPLY WITH ITS RESOLUTIONS, SINCE THE REPORT SHOWS THAT THE TRAINING OF FORMER FAR IS STILL GOING ON.

J. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT FORMER TANZANIAN PRESIDENT JULIUS NYERERE ARRIVED IN KIGALI IN THE EVENING OF 04 FEB 96 FOR A TWO DAY VISIT AND MET WITH THE VICE-PRESIDENT MAJOR GEN PAUL KAGAME. MWALIMU NYERERE IS ONE OF THE FACILITATORS WHO ARE TO OVER-SEE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF CAIRO SUMMIT RESOLUTIONS ON RWANDA AND BURUNDI REFUGEES REPATRIATION. THE RADIO FURTHER REPORTED THAT WITH THE CLOSURE OF BYUMBA PRISON, THE PROCESS OF JUSTICE IN THE PREFECTURE FACES MANY DIFFICULTIES. CRIMINAL SUSPECTS ARE DETAINED IN COMMUNAL LOCK-UPS AND POLICE STATIONS WHICH IS AGAINST THE LAW. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA HAD EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE SHORTAGE OF FOOD AND GUARDS FOR THE DETAINEES.

4. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECT 5, GISENYI, ON 28 JAN 96 SIX PERSONS WERE ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN RAMBA COMMUNE (GR 4893) IN CONNECTION WITH THE ANTI-TANK MINE EXPLOSION ON 25 JAN

96. SUSPECTS ARE BEING HELD AT THE COMMUNE CELL FOR INVESTIGATION.

(2) IN KIGALI ON 29 JAN 96 AT 1815 HRS, THREE PERS OF THE ICTR WERE MANHANDLED BY RPA SOLDIERS WHEN THEY UNKNOWINGLY ENTERED A "NO ENTRY AREA ". MATTER TAKEN UP WITH RWANDAN GOVT AND RPA AUTHORITIES. RPA HAS REPORTEDLY ARRESTED THE SOLDIERS INVOLVED IN THE INCIDENT FOR THEIR HIGHHANDED BEHAVIOUR. ICTR PERS SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES.

(3) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) TWO FRGF SOLDIERS WERE ARRESTED AND ONE WAS SHOT AND INJURED WHILE TRYING TO ESCAPE ON THE NIGHT 29/30 JAN 96 BY RPA. ONE RIFLE, A GRENADE AND EXPLOSIVE HAVE BEEN RECOVERED FROM THEM.

(4) ON THE NIGHT OF 01/02 FEB 96, AN RPA UNIT ENCOUNTERED A GROUP OF MEN AT RUGERERO (GR 2113) IN WHICH ONE OF THE INFILTRATORS WAS KILLED AND ANOTHER INJURED. THE INTERROGATION REVEALED THAT THE INJURED PERSON WAS REPORTEDLY A "ZAIREAN SOLDIER" AND THEY WERE GIVEN REFUGE BY A LOCAL WOMAN. THE WOMAN WAS ARRESTED AND ON SEARCHING THE PREMISES, NINE RIFLES AND A GRENADE WERE RECOVERED. FURTHER DETAILS BEING INVESTIGATED.

(5) IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), IN NYAMABUYE COMMUNE (7570), IT WAS REPORTED THAT EIGHT PERSONS ARE BEING HELD BY THE RPA IN CONNECTION WITH THE MURDER OF A COUPLE IN KIVUMU SECTOR (7873) ON 26 JAN 96.

(6) IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), RPA RECOVERED THREE GRENADES FROM A PERSON ARRESTED ON 30 JAN 96 IN MAHEBWE SECTOR (GR 7292). ANOTHER PERSON WAS ARRESTED BY RPA IN NGOMA SECTOR (GR 7448) ON 03 FEB 96 FOR ILLEGAL POSSESSION OF A RIFLE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA

(1) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) AT MUTURA [GR3123] ACCORDING TO THE BOURGUEMESTRE OF THE AREA AND THE RPA LOCAL COMMANDER, ONE RPA SOLDIER AND AN FRGF WERE KILLED ON 28 JAN 96 AT NYAMIRAMA VILLAGE [GR 3223] IN A PATROL CLASH.

(2) AT GASASA VILLAGE (GR 2991) OF KAYOVU SECTOR, KAYOVU COMMUNE THE FOLLOWING MILITARY EQUIPMENT WERE DISCOVERED IN THE HOUSE OF MISS KAGWERA'S BROTHER, WHEN A SEARCH WAS CONDUCTED BY THE LOCAL SECTOR AND COMMUNE CIVIL AUTHORITIES.

(A) FOUR ANTI - PERSONNEL MINES.

(C) MILITARY UNIFORMS.

THE WOMAN IS BEING HELD AT THE COMMUNE CELL. IN THE COURSE OF INVESTIGATION SHE MENTIONED THAT THE ABOVE ITEMS WERE KEPT IN HER BROTHER'S HOUSE BY FIVE MEN SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF WHO VISITED HIM AROUND 17 JAN 96. THE BROTHER HAS SINCE FLED.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT A CIVILIAN AND HIS WIFE WERE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED BY SUSPECTED BANDITS AT CYATO (GR 0934) AT ABOUT 2100 HRS ON 31 JAN 96. THE BANDITS LOOTED VALUABLES AND FIRED IN THE AIR BEFORE FLEEING.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 27 JAN 96 IN BIREMBO SECTOR (GR 0934) TWO PERSONS WERE KILLED BY A GROUP OF FOUR PERSONS WHO WERE DEMANDING MONEY .

(5) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 27 JAN 96 TWO PERSONS, WERE KILLED IN THE GIHIRA SECTOR (GR 4612). TWO PERSONS WERE KILLED BY RPA WHEN THEY ATTACKED THE RPA TEAM WHICH HAD GONE TO INVESTIGATE THE INCIDENT.

(6) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT ON 23 JAN 96 SOME PERSONS DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORMS STOLE 30,000 RWF, RADIO AND OTHER ITEMS FROM THE HOUSE OF MR HABAMENSHI IN GASIZA CENTRE (GR 5408).

(7) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT THE CHIEF OF THE CHILDREN DEPT OF THE HEALTH CENTER OF KIVUMU (2303) AND HIS WIFE WERE BEATEN BY ABOUT TEN TO TWELVE UNIDENTIFIED ARMED MEN IN UNIFORM ON THE NIGHT OF 30 JAN 96 AT HIS HOUSE AT TARASI CELLULE 2304 AND MADE AWAY WITH THEIR PERSONAL BELONGINGS.

(8) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IT WAS REPORTED THAT A WOODEN LOG BRIDGE ACROSS THE PFUND RIVER (2106) WAS DEMOLISHED ON 31 JAN 96. THE BLAST OF THE EXPLOSION IS BELIEVED TO HAVE AFFECTED DOORS, WINDOWS AND ROOFING OF NEARBY HOUSES. FURTHER DETAILS LATER.

(9) THE BRIDGE WHICH WAS BLOWN AT PFUNDA (GR 2211) HAS BEEN REPAIRED BY LOCALS ON 02 FEB 96. MEANWHILE, THE RPA HAS INTENSIFIED PATROLS IN THE AREA.

(10) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON THE NIGHT OF 02\03 FEB 96 THERE WAS AN EXPLOSION HEARD NEAR THE BREWERY. A COMBINED MILOB AND HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM VISITED THE INCIDENT SITE AND REPORTED THAT THE PYLON LOCATED IN [GR 1908] ON THE ROAD TO THE BREWERY FROM GISENYI TOWN WAS BLOWN AND TNT

EXPLOSIVE HAD BEEN USED. 10 BODIES WERE FOUND IN THE AREA SOME OF THEM WERE WITH SPLINTER/BULLET WOUNDS. IN ANOTHER SMALLER EXPLOSION A SECTION OF THE WATER PIPELINE LOCATED ABOUT 150 FROM THE BREWERY WAS ALSO DAMAGED. RPA HAS ARRESTED SEVEN PERSONS FOR INVESTIGATIONS.

(11) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), ON 24 JAN 96 SOME INFILTRATORS ATTACKED A CIVILIAN IN GAKURABWENGE SECTOR (GR 2625) AND STOLE CATTLES AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS. THREE PERSONS WERE APPREHENDED BY LOCALS AND HANDED OVER TO RPA. SAME DAY ONE PERSON WAS ARRESTED IN GABIRO SECTOR (GR 2423) WHILE TRYING TO CROSS OVER TO ZAIRE.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) ACTING FORCE COMMANDER VISITED INDBATT AND RUYENZI OWS CAMP AND MET THE REPRESENTATIVES FROM MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION, UNHCR AND CONCERN. LATER, HE MET MR URASA, UNHCR REP, AND MR MUHIGA, UNHCR COORDINATOR FOR AFRICA REGION, AND DISCUSSED ISSUES RELATING TO REFUGEE REPATRIATION AND UNAMIR'S ASSISTANCE.

(3) GHANBATT REAR PARTY LEFT KIBUNGO FOR KIGALI. TEN MAN NICOY TEAM PROVIDED SECURITY AT GHANBATT LOCATION, AT KIBUNGO, OF UNAMIR PROPERTY LEFT BEHIND UP TO 01 FEB 96.

(4) THE INVESTIGATION OFFICER AND THE SECURITY COORDINATOR FOR THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, MR BORDEWIJK, CALLED ON THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER AND DISCUSSED SECURITY RELATED ISSUES.

(5) THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH CHIEF OF STAFF RPA, COL SAM KAKA, IN THE RPA HEAD-QUARTERS. DURING THE MEETING THE CHIEF OF STAFF REGRETTED THE INCIDENT OF 29 JAN 96 IN WHICH THREE PERSONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL WERE ILL-TREATED BY THE RPA SOLDIERS. HE STRESSED THAT THE DEFAULTERS HAVE SINCE BEEN ARRESTED AND WOULD BE PUNISHED. HE ALSO ASSURED THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER THAT NECESSARY STEPS HAVE BEEN TAKEN TO AVOID FUTURE OCCURRENCES.

(6) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH AMBASSADORS OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AT THE EU OFFICE KIGALI. HE ALSO MET SPANISH AMBASSADOR TO TANZANIA, MR JOSE MARIA SANZ-PASTOR, DURING THE MEETING, THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER BRIEFED THEM ON THE OVERALL SECURITY SITUATION, THE INCIDENT OF 29 JAN 96 IN WHICH THREE PERSONS FROM THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL WERE MANHANDLED BY RPA AND ISSUES REGARDING THE REPATRIATION

OF REFUGEES.

(7) DURING THE MEETING AT THE EUROPEAN UNION, THE ED ALSO BRIEFED THEM ABOUT THE DISCUSSION HELD WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA ON THE PAYMENT OF TAXES BY THE CONTRACTORS AND OTHER RELATED ISSUES.

(8) THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER BADE FAREWELL TO ALL MEMBERS OF 95 CMSG AND THE CANADIAN MILOBS, WHO DEPARTED FOR CANADA ON COMPLETION OF THEIR TOUR OF DUTY ON 02 FEB 96.

(9) THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER VISITED THE SIGNALS DETACHMENT AT MT KARONGI ON 02 FEB 96 AND INSPECTED THE REPEATER STATION THERE.

(10) THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER BADE FAREWELL TO 151 PERSONNEL OF GHANCOY WHO DEPARTED FOR GHANA ON COMPLETION OF THEIR TOUR OF DUTY ON 03 FEB 96.

D. OTHER SECTORS NTR.



1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAIN TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 IS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 212. 207 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 05 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 6154 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT FORMER TANZANIAN PRESIDENT JULIUS NYERERE ARRIVED IN KIGALI IN THE EVENING OF 05 FEB 96 FOR A TWO DAY VISIT AND MET WITH THE VICE-PRESIDENT MAJOR GEN PAUL KAGAME. MWALIMU NYERERE IS ONE OF THE FACILITATORS WHO ARE TO OVER SEE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF CAIRO SUMMIT RESOLUTIONS ON RWANDA AND BURUNDI REFUGEES REPATRIATION. THE RADIO FURTHER REPORTED THAT WITH THE CLOSURE OF BYUMBA PRISON, THE PROCESS OF JUSTICE IN THE PREFECTURE FACES MANY DIFFICULTIES. CRIMINAL SUSPECTS ARE DETAINED IN COMMUNAL LOCK-UPS AND POLICE STATIONS WHICH IS AGAINST THE LAW. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA HAD EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE SHORTAGE OF FOOD AND GUARDS FOR THE DETAINEES.

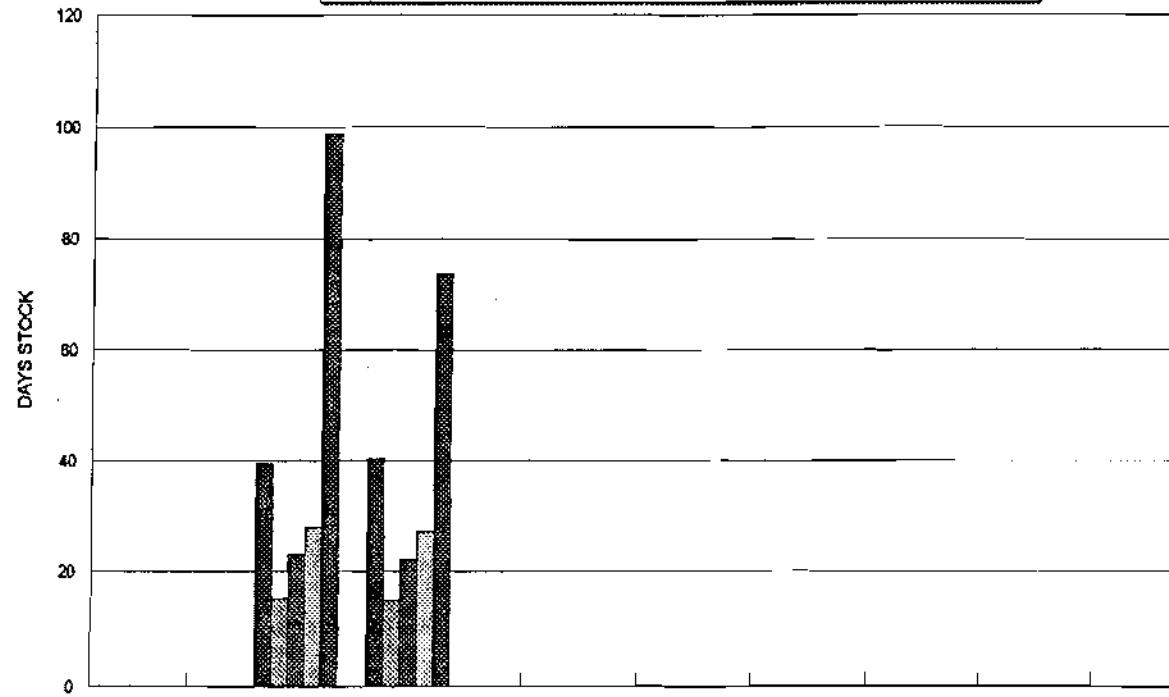
