**COMMENTS ON "THE UNITED NATIONS CIVILIAN POLICE COURSE"
CURRICULUM**

1. The present United Nations Civilian Police Course is comprehensive and rich in content. It will fulfil the requirement of standardised information for the training of future United Nations Police Officers participating in Peace Keeping Operations. It represents a substantial effort which should be appreciated.

2. Nevertheless, it raises the following observations:

a. On the Structures:

- i. In the arrangement of pages if preface is included in the contents then it is natural that the contents should be placed before and if not then preface should not be a part of the contents.
- ii. The letter of transmittal is not a part of the draft curriculum and should be deleted from the contents.
- iii. The contents of the title "Background" is not really a background, but it is proposed to be called "Definition and Profile".

b. On the Contents:

- i. There is need in practice to distinguish UN Civilian Police as a structure and UN Civilian Police Observers as officers assigned to serve in the structure. It is therefore proposed that the first paragraph under Background should be amended as follows:

- (1) United Nations Civilian Police (UNCIVPOL) is a Unit which consists of Police officers assigned to serve with the United Nations by Member States at the request of the Secretary General.
 - (2) According to this observation it is proposed that the word "UNCIVPOL" be considered a singular term when it relates to structure. When UNCIVPOL relates to the officers, it should be mentioned "UNCIVPOL Observers or UNCIVPOL Officers". This is to avoid confusion.
- ii. On page 13, there is a need to incorporate paragraphs on the components of a Peace Keeping Operations such as (a) Political Component, (b) Civil Administration Component and (c) Military Component. This information will better prepare the New UNCIVPOL Observers for the discharge of their functions and understand the composition and the roles of these components.
 - iii. In page 2, it is necessary for the following sentences to be added in driving requirements "To be in possession of a Valid National or International Driving Licence".
 - iv. In page 16 under tasks, to include "Visit and Monitor to the prisons".
 - v. In page 2 on the minimum level of experience it is necessary to include 7 years of experience "as officers"
- c. Recommendations:

3. In order for Police Officers earmarked for Peace Keeping Operations to be familiar with the roles expected of them in mission areas, it is suggested that the standard draft developed training course curriculum be translated into the eight UN official languages and disseminated to contributing countries for basic introductory course to be organized in their home country for intended officers prior to assignment to mission area. In addition, copies

can also be made available to the local organizations or institutions to be monitored by CIVPOL in order to place them in a position to appraise and understand the functions and roles of UN CIVPOL in their locality.

4. To evaluate the officers acquired knowledge of their roles on arrival in a mission area, pre-assignment training which presently is classified as orientation should be introduced to up date any missing link and keep them informed on the developing needs in the mission area which hitherto was not in the training programme of the contributing countries. The evaluation should also include screening in order to timely eliminate all unqualified officers and quickly repatriate such officers.

5. It is also suggested that as the need arises details of new standard functions to be performed by UN CIVPOL in any Mission area different from the training course contents should at all times be made available to contributing countries in advance for proper orientation of intended officers. This will correct the imbalance of differing standard of discipline, background and legal system. The prompt information will equally place officers in a position to understand the expected standard of discipline in the discharge of their functions and relation with other components, and most importantly be aware of the primary functions to be carried out jointly or separately with the local law enforcement bodies or other agencies.

Objet:

1. General Situation:

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Sectors.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in Sect. 5B had discussions with the Administrator of Medicines Sans Frontiers (MSF) Health Centre who reported to them of RPA soldiers incessant harassment to the workers/patients by entering into the health centre and armed with military weapons against the centre's standing orders. Human Rights Field Office has been informed accordingly.

C. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 6 met with Chief of Staff of the National Gendarmerie HQ Col. DEOGRATIAS NDIBWAMI who expressed great appreciation to UNAMIR CIVPOL for the support rendered in areas of technical assistance for the National Gendarmerie in RWANDA. He however requested for more assistance in the specialized units such as investigations, forensic analysis, finger printing and allied services.

D. The Chief of Communal Police of RWANDA met with UNAMIR Chief Police Training Officer and 3 other CIVPOL Observers from KIGALI Sector 6 at CIVPOL HQ on 8/2/95. Their discussion bothered on the modalities of training the first batch of the Communal Police in RWANDA..

1.2 SOCIAL

There are noticeable increase in social activities in the country as observed by UNAMIR CIVPOL in the Sectors.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

People are seen going about their business peacefully. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Rwanda observe increase in volume of commercial activities.

1.4 ECONOMIC

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers throughout the country have noticed high prices of goods and services. Economic activities are going on unimpeded with visible increase in small scale businesses.

1.5 HUMANITARIAN

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 4C monitored the distribution of food items by WFP to 6,000 persons. They also visited BUGARAMAN and found the area calm. They again monitored the crossing into RWANDA of 10 refugees from BUKAVU-ZAIRE. A total of 300 refugees are awaiting evacuation at NYAGATARE Transit Camp.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 4B reported that there is a prison at BIRAMBO with inmates who are being fed by their relatives and appealed to UNAMIR for assistance.

The team further visited KIRUNDA hospital and disclosed that 2 persons have been severely wounded by unknown person(s) and are on admission. No arrest so far made. The hospital authorities further disclosed to the CIVPOL Observers that the prevalent disease in the area is measles with an average of 20 patients daily and 5 deaths a week.

2. CRIME WAVE

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in the Sectors reported low crime wave with the exception of Sectors 4A and 4B where there have been cases of banditry.

3. Investigation:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 5 is monitoring the process of investigation of two cases of Human Rights violations reported to the team by the officials of Electrogaz and Caritas International all based in GISENYI.

4. Training:

The training of gendarmes at RUHENGARI National Gendarmerie Training School is in progress.

Objet:

I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be stable but somewhat tense.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

1. POLITICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE:

1.1 UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers from DJIBOUTI, GUINEA-BISSAU, JORDAN, MALI and ZAMBIA have been awarded with UNAMIR Medals. UNAMIR Force Commander, General TOUSIGNANT officiated at the Medals ceremony. In attendance were the DFC, COS, Deputy CIVPOL Commissioner, Staff Officers from UNAMIR HQ and other CIVPOL Observers.

1.2 BUTARE Prefecture reported that International Day for women was celebrated at the BUTARE stadium. In attendance were important personalities within the locality.

2. SOCIAL:

Majority of the people in the country continue to participate in social activities especially soccer and night clubs, even though there are fears of moving around in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible increase in commercial activities throughout the prefectures. Shops are being expanded to cater for the number of people entering the country through various border posts to resettle.

4. ECONOMIC:

There is an inflationary spiral of goods and services due to the recent demonetization exercise which led to the expansion of the supply of bank money and credit in RWANDA.

5. HUMANITARIAN:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in BUTARE prefecture reported that a total of 145 refugees have left the following DP. camps in response to OP retour on 08 Mar. 95 as follows:

- a. NDAGO - 06
- b. KIBEHO - 126
- c. GIKONGO-VILE- 08
- d. NYAMIGINA - 05

III. OWN ACTIVITIES:

1. CIVPOL HEADQUARTERS:

UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

1.1 CIVPOL Commissioner attended the Sector Commanders Conference held at NYAMASHEKE - Sector 4C on 08 Mar. 95.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

2.1 PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

A. Mrs. HARERINANA LAWRENCE, the wife of Theobalt KAMPAYANA, a local interpreter at UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ reported that her husband and his two brothers namely HUNDERERE MODESTE and HAGUMA BENARDIN have been picked from their residence at KAMUHOSA/KIGALI by 10 RPA soldiers at 06.00 hrs on 08 March 95 to unknown destination. Human Rights were informed and together with CIVPOL Monitoring Team in KIGALI visited Gendarmerie Brigade stations in KIGALI on enquires but authorities at the stations did not disclose any information about the 3 arrested persons. Later at 14.00 hrs the 2 brothers returned to their residence and disclosed that THEOBALD had been detained in one of the RPA camps in KIGALI. They further hinted that they were subjected to intensive questioning by the RPA before they were released. Investigation in progress.

B. At about 20.00 hrs. DSP/LASISI AKANNI of UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ reported that he had been robbed at gun point by 3 men - one in RPA uniform at his residence in KIYOVU/KIGALI and the following items taken away from him:

- a. UNAMIR Veh. No. 1144 (4 Runner).

- b. Hand Motorola.
- c. UN ID card.
- d. Personnel belongings yet to be enumerated.

UNAMIR MP and Gendarmerie have been informed. Investigation in progress.

2.2 PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

Revealed that RPA and Gendarmerie have intensified motor-cycle and veh. patrols in the area. There were reports of rumors among the local populace that there was going to be another war in the country. Meanwhile, the team is assisting Human Rights monitors to investigate the assassination of the Prefect of BUTARE, Mr. RWANGABO. The team further disclosed that the rate of banditry activities in the communes within the prefecture is on the increase and are suspected to have come from KIBEHO DP camp.

In another incident, the team patrolled RUHASHA GR 6926 and MUGUSA communes and revealed that about 50 locals are in prisons awaiting trial. Human Rights informed.

3. TRAINING:

The training of gendarmes at RUHENGARI National Gendarmerie Training School is in progress.

IV. CRIME WAVE

UNAMIR CIVPOL Monitoring Teams in the prefectures have reported that criminal activities such as armed robbery and arbitrary arrest of locals are on the increase during the week.

V. Investigation:

CIVPOL Monitoring Teams in the prefectures are assisting Human Rights Monitors in the investigation of Human Rights violation cases. The teams are also assisting UNAMIR Military Police in motor accident cases throughout the prefectures.

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Reported that the Special Investigation Unit at the Gendarmerie HQ had been assigned to investigate the circumstances leading to the death of the Prefect of BUTARE who was assassinated on 4 March 95 in MBAZI Commune on his way from KIGALI to BUTARE. The team further reported that 4 males (locals) suspected to be members of the former RGF who entered into the country from refugees camp in Zaire have been arrested by RPA. Human Rights informed.

Majority of the people in the country continue to participate in social activities especially soccer and night clubs.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible increase in commercial activities throughout the prefectures. Shops are being expanded to cater for the number of people entering the country through the various boarder-posts to resettle.

PMT Kigali Prefecture reported that a cabinet meeting was held in Kigali on 05 March 95 under the chairmanship of the President of Rwanda, His Excellency Pasteur Bizimungu to discuss about the modalities of devaluing the national currency.

I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

1. POLITICAL:

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Visited the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and was informed by the Minister that a meeting was held on 03 Feb. 95 between the Ministry and representatives of UNHCR in KIGALI. The Minister further disclosed that the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, Mr. Lasso AYALA is expected in RWANDA by the end of February 95 to evaluate the process of rehabilitation of damaged buildings and resettlement of refugees in the country. In another incident the Rwandese Human Rights association organized a demonstration in KIGALI in memory of victims of last year's genocide and human rights violations in the country.

2. SOCIAL:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Monitoring Teams in the Prefectures observed springing up of social-cultural activities by majority of the people of RWANDA.

3. COMMERCIAL:

1.1 At the request of the JORDANIAN Government UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Major Yousef Sh. Shabsough was repatriated to his home country on 02 Feb. 95.

1.2 UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL PREFECTURES:

2.1 PMT - RUHENGARI Prefecture:

Reported that on 28 Feb. 95 a hand grenade exploded at KIGOMBE Commune and injured 4 children who were fetching firewood in a farm. They are on admission at RUHENGARI MSF Centre. The RPA Brigade Commander for NKAMIRA when contacted commented that the area was being occupied by FRGF before last year's war. In another incident in the same prefecture the Hospital Administrator for Ruhengeri MSF centre disclosed that on 22 Feb. 95 3 local workers at the hospital were arrested by Gendarmerie officers for taken part in last year's genocide. Human Rights informed.

2.2 PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

2.1 PMT - GITARAMA Prefecture:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in GITARAMA Prefecture reported that arbitrary arrests of locals from RUTOBWE and NYABIKENKE communes by RPA is on the increase, and the where abouts of the arrested persons not known.

B. The team further reported that there have been incessant harassment of locals in NYABIKENKE commune especially at night by locals suspected to be militia from RUHengeri prefecture. The Bourgmestre and RPA Commander in the commune who confirmed this however disclosed that 2 arrests have so far been made. The suspects are in GITARAMA prison awaiting trial.

C. In another incident in the same prefecture the team disclosed that 19 locals suspected to have taken part in last year's genocide have been detained at KIYUMBU for over a month and are being fed by their relatives. Human Rights informed.

2.2 PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

A. Is assisting the Human Rights investigation team in GISENYI in a case of the arrest of the Councillor of NKUMIRA by the RPA. He has been accused of taken part in last year's genocide. The team is also assisting the Human Rights in another case of arbitrary arrest of 3 locals at GISENYI by RPA. Reasons of arrest unknown.

B. In another incident the RPA at GISENYI have released a Toyota pick-up vehicle which was mysteriously disappeared at the Gendarmerie Brigade Station to the owner. CIVPOL Daily Sitrep No. 126 of 11/2/95 refers.

2.3 A joint team of CIVPOL Observers and Human Rights special investigation unit travelled to CYANGUGU on 21 Feb. 95 to investigate the alleged killings of 13 locals by RPA at KAMEMBE commune.

The CIVPOL Commissioner on 18/2/95 visited BYUMBA prefecture in connection with the establishment of new CIVPOL monitoring team in the area. He exchanged views with the prefet on security matters. The prefet also assured the Commissioner of his preparedness to cooperate with the team.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Gisenyi Prefecture reported that a team of Rwandan Parliamentarians visited Gisenyi on 16 Feb 95 on familiarization tour. They had audience with the Prefet of Gisenyi and UNHCR officials. Detailed were not disclosed.

C. The team also reported that RPA soldiers arrested a 28 year old worker (male) in the Brasserie Mitziing in Gisenyi on 8th February 95. He is accused to have taken part in the last year's genocide. Human Rights team informed. Meanwhile, investigations in progress.

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Gisenyi Prefecture conducted joint patrols with Human Rights Teams within the prefecture and met 13 locals who have been detained at RPA training camp at BIGOGWE for over 3 weeks. The Deputy Commandant of the camp disclosed that 7 of the detainees were former RGF soldiers who have come from ZAIRE but have failed to report for screening and registration, and would soon be integrated into RPA after intensive training at the camp. He further disclosed that 6 other detainees are locals found to be involved in last year's genocide and would be transferred to RUHENGARI Prison shortly. Investigation in progress.

C. The team is also assisting the Human Rights investigation team in 2 cases of murder where on 12/2/95 a local was killed by the RPA at BAKUKA in MUTURA commune and on 7/2/95 another local and his wife were also killed by some armed civilians who were reported to have come from ZAIRE.

D. UNAMIR CIVPOL Monitoring team in Gitarama Prefecture visited Gitarama central Prison and found out that the cells are overcrowded. Further enquiries from the prison authorities revealed that the prison which was built in 1973 to contain a maximum of 1,000 inmates presently has about 5,000 inmates. Human Rights Team informed.

E. UNAMIR CIVPOL Monitoring Team in Ruhengeri prefecture hinted that a meeting was held with the representatives of CIVPOL, Human Rights monitors and RPA on 14 Feb 95. The meeting centered on security situation within the prefecture.

The team met "CONCERN", a NGO providing necessities of life to the inmates of the camp.

B. CIVPOL Monitoring Teams in Cyangugu Prefecture reported that there are 312 refugees awaiting evacuation from NYAGATARE Transit Camp to their various communes. Also 28 refugees crossed into Rwanda from Bukavu ZAIRE on 14/Feb/95.

C. CIVPOL Monitoring team in Ruhengeri prefecture patrolled Nyamugali commune where the Assistant Bourgmestre informed the team that the commune has a population of 48,150 inhabitants and 13 primary schools with 12,000 pupils on admission. Also there is only one clinic in the commune which is being operated by MSF. The prevalent

diseases in the area are Malaria and diahorrea. The MSF officials informed the team that there are enough drugs to contain the situation but would require special equipments to diagnose the diseases. Meanwhile, there is acute shortage of vaccine to vaccinate children at the clinic.

D. The team also patrolled CYANIKA boarder post and were briefed by the boarder officials that 106 refugees crossed into Rwanda from Uganda on 14/Feb/95. They further disclosed that refugees that cross through the boarder post move to their communes for resettlement after registration formalities.

E. CIVPOL Monitoring team in Gisenyi also reported that 919 and 257 refugees crossed to Gisenyi through Goma on 13 February 95 and 14 February 95 respectively.
