WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 01 TO 07 AUG 94.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED CALM THROUGHOUT THE WEEK. REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO RWANDA FROM GOMA. THE SITUATION IN GOMA HAS IMPROVED GRADUALLY THROUGHOUT THE WEEK. 110 TROOPS FROM THE NETHERLANDS ARRIVED IN GOMA TO SET UP A FIELD HOSPITAL. ALTHOUGH ABOUT 650,000 PERSONS REMAINED DISPLACED IN THE HPZ, MOST OF THE NGOs AND AID AGENCIES FOCUSED AND CONCENTRATED THEIR EFFORTS ON GOMA. THE LOCAL POPULATION IN THE HPZ CONTINUED TO SHOW SIGNS OF APPREHENSION ABOUT THE WITHDRAWAL OF FRENCH LED COALITION FORCES (PCF) LEADING TO THE EXODUS OF SOME OF THEM. THEY REQUEST THE GOVERNMENT TO ASSURE THEM OF THEIR SECURITY BEFORE THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE PCF. ACTS OF BANDITRY WERE REPORTED IN THE CYANGUGU AREA. SAIRIAN AUTHORITIES WERE REPORTED TO HAVE CONFISCATED RPF VEHICLES IN GOMA. DELEGATIONS WERE RECEIVED FROM BELGIUM, CANADA, FRANCE, GREAT BRITAIN, ITALY AND THE USA. OF SPECIAL SIGNIFICANCE WERE THE VISITS OF GENERAL SHALIKASHVILI, CHAIRMAN JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF AND THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR TO UGANDA, MR DESCOUYRE. THE SRSG MET WITH PRESIDENT MUSEVENI OF UGANDA. A DELEGATION FROM MALAWI AND AN ETHIOPIAN RECCE TEAM VISITED KIGALI AND OTHER SECTORS OF RWANDA. THEY WERE BRIEFED ABOUT THE CURRENT SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY AND UNAMIR'S FUTURE DEPLOYMENT AND OPERATIONS. A FRENCH HIRED BOAT WAS FIRED UPON BY UNKNOWN GUNMEN ON LAKE KIVU WHILE IT WAS ON A RESUPPLY MISSION TO KIBUYE. ONE 5.56 CALIBRE ASSAULT RIFLE WAS FOUND WITHIN THE PREMISES OF THE MILITARY ACADEMY IN KIGALI. THE FLOW OF MEN AND MATERIEL THROUGH KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (KIA) HAS INCREASED TREMENDOUSLY WITH AN AVERAGE OF 25 TO 30 AIRCRAFT LANDING DAILY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. AMERICAN AMBASSADOR HANSON AND ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE FOR AFRICAN AFFAIRS GEORGE MOOSE MET THE FM MR TWAGIRAMUNGU. MR MOOSE EXPLAINED THAT THE AMERICAN DEPLOYMENT AND INVOLVEMENT IN RWANDA WILL BE CONDUCTED IN PHASES. MR MOOSE STATED THAT THE UNITED STATES WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE DEPLOYMENT OF 48 HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS. THE SRSG AGREED THAT THE DEPLOYMENT WAS IMPORTANT, BUT EMPHASIZED THE IMPORTANCE OF NAMING AND DEPLOYING THE COMMISSION OF EXPERTS FIRST. IT IS IMPORTANT TO SHOW SENSITIVITY TO THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT AND PEOPLE WHOSE FIRST PRIORITY IS TO BRING TO JUSTICE THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE RECENT MASSACRES. GENERAL SHALIKASHVILI RECEIVED A FULL BRIEFING FROM THE SRSG AND THE FORCE COMMANDER ON THE POLITICAL, HUMANITARIAN AND MILITARY SITUATIONS IN RWANDA. SPECIAL EMPHASIS WAS GIVEN TO THE TRANSITION IN SECTOR 4 AND THE URGENCY OF BRINGING HUMANITARIAN AID TO THAT AREA. GENERAL SHALIKASHVILI OFFERED TO ASSIST UNAMIR WITH THE AIRLIFT OF TROOPS, EQUIPMENT AND HUMANITARIAN AID. AMBASSADOR DESCOUYRE STATED THAT FRANCE HAS NO OBJECTION TO RPF OFFICIALS ENTERING THE HPZ TO REASSURE THE POPULATION OR TO RE-ESTABLISH THE CIVIL ADMINISTRATION. HE DENIED REPORTS THAT FRANCE HAD OBJECTED TO THIS. HE EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT WHAT HE CALLED "MIXED MESSAGES" BY THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT, REASSURANCES OF PEACE ON ONE HAND, AND STATEMENTS REGARDING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF TRIBUNALS TO TRY 30,000 DETAINEES

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ON THE OTHER, (PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU, IN A LATER CONVERSATION WITH UNAMIR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, CATEGORICALLY DENIED MAKING THIS STATEMENT WHICH HAS BEEN ATTRIBUTED TO HIM IN SEVERAL NEWSPAPERS). PRESIDENT MUSEVENI STRESSED THE IMPORTANCE OF SEPARATING REFUGEES IN THE CAMPS IN LAKE AND TANZANIA INTO:

1. RGF SOLDIERS 2. THOSE SUSPECTED OF COMMITTING MASSACRES AND 3. ORDINARY CITIZENS. HE SAID THAT THOSE SUSPECTED OF CRIMES SHOULD BE DETAINED. HOWEVER, IF THAT IS IMPOSSIBLE, THEY SHOULD AT LEAST BE SEPARATED FROM THE REST OF THE POPULATION. HE AGREED THAT THE SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEMS IN RWANDA LIES IN THE RETURN OF ALL REFUGEES. HE WAS CRITICAL OF ZAIRIAN PRESIDENT MOBUTU, STATING THAT HE DOES NOT EXPECT PRESIDENT MOBUTU TO MATCH HIS WORDS WITH ACTIONS. HE OFFERED HIS FULL ASSISTANCE TO THE SRSG AND UNAMIR. HE ASKED HIS STAFF TO CUT THE CARGO HANDLING FEES AT ENTebbe AIRPORT TO HALP IN SUPPORT OF UNAMIR'S HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS. UNAMIR IS INVESTIGATING BBC NEWS REPORTS OF KILLINGS AND SUMMARY EXECUTIONS. AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL HAS SENT A DELEGATION TO KIGALI TO INVESTIGATE HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES. THE DELEGATION PLANS TO SPEND A WEEK IN RWANDA AND SUBMIT A REPORT OF THEIR FINDINGS.

3. MILITARY.

A. FACIIONAL ACTIVITIES.

(1) REF. RPF CONTINUED TO PATROL KIGALI WITH A VIEW TO MAINTAINING LAW AND ORDER. THE NUMBER OF ROAD BLOCKS HAVE REDUCED IN THE CITY AND THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WITH UNAMIR, AID AGENCIES AND OTHER INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS. ASSURED FREE PASSAGE FOR THE HUMANITARIAN AID CONVOYS TO KIBUYE THROUGH ALL THE RPF CHECK POINTS.

(2) REF. RPF CONTINUE TO REMAIN IN CAMPS IN GOMA AND IN THE RPE. REPORTED TO BE INVOLVED IN INCREASED ACTS OF LOOTING AND BANDITHY IN THE RPE.

(3) MILITIA. REPORTED TO BE DISCOURAGING THE REFUGEES NOT TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME AREAS IN RWANDA FROM THE CAMPS OUTSIDE RWANDA.

B. ONE

(1) UNAMIR. CONDUCTED BRIEFING TO VARIOUS VISITING DELEGATIONS WHICH INCLUDED THE CHAIRMAN OF THE JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF US ARMY, A DELEGATION FROM MALAWI AND A RECCE TEAM FROM ETHIOPIA. THE PC VISITED KARALE (UGANDA) AND GOMA. HE ALSO HELD DISCUSSION WITH THE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION OF RWANDA. DPC VISITED GIKONGORO AREA AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE COMMANDER OF PCF. GHANBATT CONTINUED TO DEPLOY IN THE RPE. CONTINUED LIAISON WITH THE FRENCH LED COALITION FORCES. TROOPS FROM BRITAIN AND AUSTRALIA STARTED ARRIVING IN KIGALI.

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(2) UNIMUTE. THE AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONTINUED TO MAN CPs AND OPs AND TO ALSO MONITOR AREA ALONG THE BORDER. PROVIDED HELI SUPPORT TO UNAMIR. ALSO VISITED CPs ALONG THE BORDER. HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES AND NGOs CONTINUED TO ENTER RWANDA WITH RELIEF ITEMS FOR DISTRIBUTION. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING ARE:

(A) TO RWANDA

(B) TO UGANDA

(3) MILOS GP HQ. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE LIAISON WITH THE FRENCH IN GOMA AND IN THE HPZ. CONDUCTED RECCB IN BUTARE AND GITARAMA PRIOR TO DEPLOYMENT OF UNMOs IN THAT AREA. MILOS TEAMS WERE DEPLOYED IN GIKONGORO, GISENYI, KIBUYE, CYANGUGU AND BYUMBA. ASSISTED IN THE TRANSPORTATION OF SICK PERSONS FROM GISENYI AND RUHengeri TO MEDICAL POSTS. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ESCORTS FOR VISITING DELEGATES AND MONITORING TEAMS FOR HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ACTIVITIES.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO ASSIST AND COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. SUPPLIED FOOD STUFFS IN GISENYI TO REFUGEES RETURNING HOME. CONVOYS RETURNED WITH DISPLACED PERSONS FROM VARIOUS PLACES TO KIGALI. MANY INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AND AID AGENCIES ARRIVED IN KIGALI. VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDED FOOD AND OTHER AID ITEMS TO ORPHANAGES IN KIGALI. CHOLERA PATIENTS WHO ARRIVED IN KIGALI FROM GISENYI WERE HOSPITALIZED AT KIGALI CENTRAL HOSPITAL AND TAKEN CARE OF BY SAMARITAN'S PURSE. UNICEF BROUGHT IN EQUIPMENT FOR RESTORATION OF WATER IN KIGALI. TWO MEDIUM SIZE WATER TRUCKS DONATED BY FINLAND TO UNICEF ARRIVED AT KIGALI AND WERE SENT TO GISENYI. SIX AMERICAN WATER TRUCKS ARRIVED IN KIGALI AND HAVE SINCE BEEN DEPLOYED TO THE BORDER AREAS.

7. CONCLUSION. AS THE GENERAL SITUATION IN RWANDA RETURNS TO NORMAL, MANY INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AND AID AGENCIES ARRIVED TO HELP IN SOLVING THE HUMANITARIAN PROBLEMS IN THE COUNTRY. THE US ARMY ARRIVED IN KIGALI AND ASSISTED IN PROVIDING FACILITIES

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AT KIA TO HANDLE THE INCREASING NUMBER OF FLIGHTS. DELEGATIONS FROM BELGIUM, CANADA, FRANCE, GREAT BRITAIN, ITALY AND THE UNITED STATES WERE RECEIVED BY UNAMIR. THE SRSG AND THE PC MET PRESIDENT MUSEVENI OF UGANDA.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 091500 AUG TO 100500 AUG 94.

1. GEN SITUATION: THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUES TO REMAIN CALM IN RWANDA. DISPLACED PERSONS AND REFUGEES RETURNED TO KIGALI IN SMALL GROUPS DURING THE PERIOD. MANY RETURNERS ALSO CROSSED THE BOARDERS WITH HEAD LOADS INTO THE COUNTRY DURING THE PERIOD. LIFE IN KIGALI IS GRADUALLY PICKING UP. ROAD REPAIR WORKS HAVE STARTED IN THE CAPITAL. THE SITUATION IN GOMA IS REPORTEDLY IMPROVING. THE LOCALS STILL CONTINUE TO BE APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE WITHEDRAWAL OF FRENCH FORCES FROM THE HPZ. LT GEN GORDON REAY COMMANDER LAND FORCES COMMAND, AND LT COL RALPH COLEMAN, CHIEF PLANS, LAND FORCES COMMAND CANADA, WILL ARRIVE KIGALI LATER TODAY ON A THREE DAY OFFICIAL VISIT TO UNAMIR HQ.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: UNAMIR RECEIVED MR HARRY HMLAFONTE THE CURRENT GOOD WILL AMBASSADOR FOR UNICOF.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

A. RPA. THE RPA HAS INTENSIFIED DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS IN THE CAPITAL AND OTHER TOWNS IN AN ATTEMPT TO PROVIDE SECURITY AND RESTORE LAW AND ORDER. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WITH UNAMIR AND NGOs. RPA SOLDIERS IN THE NORTHERN PART OF SECTOR 4A ALONG HPZ WERE SHEN DIGGING TRENCHES. RPA HAS INVITED EVERY BOURGHESTRES TO ENCOURAGE THEIR POPULATION TO GO BACK TO WORK IN THE FIELDS. THEY ALSO MADE REQUEST TO PROTECT ALL PUBLIC BUILDINGS. RPA ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT THE COMMUNAL POLICE THAT THEY CARRYING WEAPONS EVEN THOUGH THIS WAS NOT BEEN AUTHORIZED BY THE FF.

B. RPF. NO MAJOR ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED.

C. MILITIA. NO MAJOR ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED.

4. GEN MILITARY ACTIVITIES:

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS CONTINUED. FC HELD BRANCH HEADS STAFF BRIEF AT 0800 HRS. PLANNING AND COORDINATION HAVE BEEN COMPLETED REGARDING THE VISIT OF LT GEN GORDON REAY COMMANDER LAND FORCES CANADA. FC WILL VISIT THE KIGALI CENTRAL HOSPITAL AND A COY OF GHANBATT LOCATED AT KIGALI.

B. UNOMIR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. ALL HELICOPTERS ARE OPERATIONAL.

C. GHANBATT. NIGHT PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED WITH THE FRENCH FROM ALL PATROL BASES. PROVIDED SECURITY AT

- MERIDIEN HOTEL, FORCE HQ AND THE MILITARY ACADEMY ALL IN KIGALI.
- D. MILOB GP. PLANNING, COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES WERE CARRIED OUT DURING THE PERIOD. CARRIED OUT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS. THE SITUATION IN SECTORS 1, 4, AND 5 AND BYUMBA AREA WERE REPORTED TO BE CALM DURING THE PERIOD.
- E. BRITCON. DEPLOYMENT OF BRITCON CONTINUES. CARRIED OUT RECCE ON A BRIDGE AT BOSORO ON BURUNDI BORDER. BRIDGE IS TOTALLY UNSUITABLE FOR HEAVY VEH TRAFFIC AND IS BEYOND THE CAPABILITY OF THE BRITCON HEAVY SQN. REDSIGN OF A NEW BRIDGE AT GATUMA ON GOING. A BOOBY TRAP WAS FOUND WITHIN TEN METERS OF THE BRIDGE AND THIS WILL BE DEMOLISHED PRIOR TO THE NEW BRIDGE BEING BUILT. MEDICAL ELEMENTS ESTABLISHED AT RUHENGURI HOSPITAL AND ABLE TO TREAT 100 OUT PATIENTS AND 12 IN PATIENTS DAILY. VEHICLE MAINTENANCE WORKSHOP HAS STARTED OPERATING IN KIGALI AND NOW FIXING VEH FOR UNAMIR.
- F. CAN SIGS COY. CANADIAN SIGNAL SQUADRON HAVE DEPLOYED HF VOICE AND INMARSAT COMMUNICATIONS AND ESTABLISHED COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN UNAMIR HQ, SECTOR 4A, 4B AND 4C. INMARSAT COMMUNICATIONS HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED WITH SECTOR 5. A RADIO DRT WILL BE DEPLOYED IN GISENYI TO REINFORCE THE PERSONNEL DEPLOYED IN THAT LOCATION. ANOTHER ONE WILL BE DEPLOYED AT MILOB HQ IN KIGALI. ELEMENTS OF TAC HQ TP WILL BE DEPLOYED IN BUTARE TO SET UP THE UNAMIR TAC HQ SOON.
5. FRENCH COALITION FORCES: THE FRENCH FORCES CONTINUED TO ASSIST REFUGEES IN GOMA AND IN THE RPE. CONTINUE TO ASSIST HUMANITARIAN AID TO PROVIDE FOOD AND WATER TO REFUGEES.
6. US FORCES: CONTINUED TO COORDINATE FLIGHTS AT KIA WITH UNAMIR.
7. UNICEF: CONTINUED TO COORDINATE PREPARATIONS FOR THE TRAINING OF THE NEW GENDARMES.
8. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES: COORDINATION OF HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES CONTINUED DURING THE PERIOD. UNICEF ARE GETTING READY TO TAKE OVER THE KIGALI HOSPITAL IN SECTOR 4 BY PROVIDING MEDICAL STAFF. UNICEF WILL TAKE OVER CONTROL OF THE WATER PUMPING STATION IN SECTOR 3 AND 4 AS SOON THE FP LEAVE. CHEMICALS WILL BE PROVIDED BY KRC AND THE FUEL BY THE UNAMIR.

1. GEN SITUATION: THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUES TO REMAIN CALM IN RWANDA. DISPLACED PERSONS AND REFUGEES RETURNED TO KIGALI IN SMALL GROUPS DURING THE PERIOD. MANY RETURNEES ALSO CROSSED THE BORDERS WITH HEAD LOADS INTO THE COUNTRY DURING THE PERIOD. LIFE IS GRADUALLY PICKING UP. ROAD REPAIR WORKS HAVE STARTED IN THE CAPITAL. 

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 071801 AUG TO 081800 AUG 94.

1. GEN SITUATION: THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM IN RWANDA. REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES IN SOME AREAS DURING THE PERIOD. THE GOVERNMENT HAS EMBARKED UPON PSYCHOLOGICAL OPS THROUGH RADIO BROADCASTS TO WIN THE HEARTS AND MINDS OF THE REFUGEES OUTSIDE THE COUNTRY IN AN ATTEMPT TO ENTICE THEM TO RETURN HOME. THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES HAVE MENTIONED THAT THEY WOULD RETURN ALL WEAPONS SEIZED FROM THE FORMER RGF TO THE NEW GOVT IN KIGALI. WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF UNAMIR, SOME EMPLOYEES OF THE FORMER MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND PEOPLE IN CHARGE OF PROJECTS CAME TO KIGALI TO ATTEND A MEETING. THE SITUATION IN GOMA IS REPORTEDLY IMPROVING. THE LOCALS STILL CONTINUE TO BE APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE WITHDRAWAL OF FRENCH FORCES FROM THE HPZ. THE ETHIOPIAN MILITARY RECCE TEAM LEFT FOR NAIROBI THIS AFTERNOON LEAVING TWO MEMBERS BEHIND FOR THE COORDINATION OF THE MOVEMENT OF THEIR TROOPS. THE FIRST BATCH OF AUSTRALIAN TROOPS ARRIVED IN KIGALI LAST NIGHT. MS. CATHERINE BERTINI, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME ARRIVED IN KIGALI. SHE VISITED UNAMIR HQ AND WAS BRIEFED BY THE SRSG AND THE FC.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: MS. CATHERINE BERTINI, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME ARRIVED IN KIGALI. THE SRSG ACCOMPANIED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MET HER AT THE AIRPORT. SHE VISITED UNAMIR HQ AND RECEIVED A DETAIL BRIEFING BY THE SRSG ON THE RELIEF PLANS TO ENCOURAGE AND FACILITATE THE SMOOTH AND QUICK RETURN OF REFUGEES, THE RECONSTRUCTION PLAN TO RETURN RWANDA TO A STATE OF NORMALCY, THE CURRENT POLITICAL SITUATION AND THE PREPARATIONS TO HAND OVER THE HPZ TO UNAMIR. MS. BERTINI ALSO MET PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU TO DISCUSS THE WFP'S ROLE IN THE CURRENT OVERALL HUMANITARIAN OPERATION. THE SRSG MET PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU AND BRIEFED HIM ON HIS RWANDA EMERGENCY NORMALIZATION PLAN (RENP). PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU EXPRESSED HIS GRATITUDE FOR THE ASSISTANCE THAT UNAMIR, UN AGENCIES AND NGO'S ARE PROVIDING RWANDA AT THIS TIME.

3. FACIONAL ACTIVITIES:

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO PATROL AND MAN SNAP ROAD BLOCKS IN KIGALI CITY WITH A VIEW TO MAINTAINING LAW AND ORDER. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WITH UNAMIR AND NGO'S. PF ORGANIZED MEETING WITH RPA REPS AND SOME CIVILIAN REPS AT KIBUYE AND GIKONGORO ALONG THE HPZ BDY. SOME RPA TROOPS ENTERED SOME VILLAGES TO TALK TO PEOPLE TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES. TWO FORMER RGF OFFICERS LT COL UMUSENYO, MAJ CHIZA AND THREE NCO'S WITH THEIR FAMILIES SURRENDERED THEMSELVES TO THE RPA AT THEIR LAST CHECK POINT ON GIKONGORO-BUTARE ROAD. THEY WERE ESCORTED TO THE RPA UNIT HQ AT BUTARE.

B. RGF. NO MAJOR ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED. TROOPS HOWEVER SEEN MOVING FREELY IN HPE. IT IS REPORTED THAT SOME RGF TROOPS ARE PRESENT IN THE CYANGUGU AREA AND ARE TRYING TO REGROUP AND RECRUIT PEOPLE TO GO BACK WITH THEM TO ZAIRE.

C. MILITIA. SOME ELEMENTS OF THE INTERHAMWE WERE REPORTED SEEN ALONG THE KIBUYE CYANGUGU ROAD. THEY WERE HOWEVER NOT CARRYING ARMS.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES:

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED. FC HELD STAFF BRIEF AT 0800 HRS. THE ETHIOPIAN RECCE TEAM DEBRIEFED THE FC AND THE STAFF BEFORE DEPARTING FOR NAIROBI. THE DFC LED THE RECCE TEAM TO MEET WITH THE VICE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA (MAJ GEN KAGAME) EARLIER ON IN THE DAY.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS. THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR TO UGANDA VISITED UNOMUR HQ ON HIS WAY TO KIGALI ON 06 AUG 94. ALL HELICOPTERS ARE OPERATIONAL.

C. GHAMBATI. DAY PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED FROM ALL PATROL BASES. THREE GRENADES WERE SEIZED FROM LOCALS AT CP AT RNAMIKORWAMIKO AND KIBENO. ESCORTED ICRC RELIEF TEAM TO MUNINI FOR DISTRIBUTION OF RELIEF ITEMS AND ALSO ASSISTED A/CF TO CONSTRUCT MALNUTRITION CENTRE AT KAMANA. BURGMESTRES IN HPZ HELD MEETING WITH FRENCH TROOPS COMMANDER AT GIKONGORO. PROVIDED SECURITY AT MERIDIEN HOTEL, FORCE HQ AND THE MIL ACADEMY ALL IN KIGALI.

3. MILOB GR. COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES CONTINUED DURING THE PERIOD. THE SITUATION IN SECTORS 1,4,5 AND BYUMBA AREA WERE REPORTED TO BE CALM DURING THE PERIOD. ABOUT 10 000 PERSONS HAVE SO FAR RETURNED TO THE KISORO AREA. ALSO ASSISTED ICRC TO DISTRIBUTE FOOD TO 6 000 PERSONS AT KISORO. ICRC INFORMED MILOBS OF THEIR PLAN TO ESTABLISH AN ORPHANAGE AT NYANZA. PROVIDED ESCORTS FOR ETHIOPIAN RECCE TEAM. CMO RETURNED TO KIGALI AFTER A THREE DAY WORKING VISIT TO ALL MILOB SECTORS. THE BODIES OF A MAN AND 4 WOMEN WERE FOUND IN A HOUSE AT GITARAMA DURING THE PERIOD. RPA TROOPS REMOVED THE BODIES FOR BURIAL AFTER IDENTIFICATION. RPA CLAIMED THAT THE KILLING WAS DONE BY THE INTERHAMWE. ABOUT 100 PEOPLE LEFT GIXONGORO TOWARDS CYANGUGU CLAIMING THEY HAVE NO CONFIDENCE IN UNAMIR.

2. BRITCON. DEPLOYMENT OF BRITCON CONTINUES. MEDICAL ELEMENTS CONTINUE TO ESTABLISH AT RUHENGERI HOSPITAL. VEHICLE MAINTENANCE WORKSHOP HAS STARTED OPERATING IN KIGALI. 75 TROOPS ARRIVED DURING THE PERIOD.

F. CAN COMM COY. CONDUCTED RECCE OF TACTICAL HQ IN BUTARE.

5. FRENCH COALITION FORCES: THE FRENCH FORCES CONTINUED TO ASSIST REFUGEES IN GOMA AND IN THE HP2. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND ALSO PROVIDED HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PERSONS IN THE HP2. ACTS OF BURGLARIES AND ROBBERIES CONTINUE TO BE ON THE INCREASE IN GOMA AND CYANGUGU. COMMUNITY POLICE AND GENDARMES ARE ASSISTING THE FRENCH FORCES TO CONTROL THE SITUATION IN THE GIKONGORO AND CYANGUGU AREAS.

6. US FORCES: CONTINUED TO COORDINATE FLIGHTS AT KIA WITH UNAMIR. THE COMMANDER OF US FORCES IN THE REGION VISITED KIGALI.

7. UNCIVPOL: CONTINUED TO COORDINATE PREPARATIONS FOR THE TRAINING OF THE NEW GENDARMES.

8. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES: WFP DELIVERED 9.2 MT OF MAIZE, .6 TONS OF OIL AND .2 TONS OF SALT TO THE RUHENGERI AREA. CON SIGS SQN HAVE DISPATCHED TWO TRUCKS WITH DRIVERS TO THE GISENYI AREA TO ASSIST IN THE TRANSPORTATION OF SICK PERSONS BETWEEN GISENYI AND RUHENGERI. A RWANDESE NUN FROM THE NOTRE DAME DE CITEAUX CHURCH TOGETHER WITH HER GERMAN ESCORT WERE EVACUATED TO NAIROBI BY C-130. BOTH WILL FLY ONTO BRUSSELS WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE BELGIAN EMBASSY IN NAIROBI. HAC TEAM VISITED SAMARITAN'S PURSE AND EMERGENCY NGO'S AT THE CHR. AMERICAN FORCE WILL STUDY WFP REQUEST TO FLY BISCUITS FROM ENGLAND TO KIGALI VS ENGLAND TO ENTebbe. HAC VISITED ICRC TO DISCUSS FOOD DISTRIBUTION PLAN FOR SECTOR 4.



1. GEN SITUATION: THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM. DISPLACED PERSONS CONTINUED TO RETURN TO RWANDA DURING THE PERIOD. THE SITUATION IN GOMA IS REPORTEDLY IMPROVING. IN THE HPE, THE LOCALS CONTINUE TO BE APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE WITHDRAWAL OF FRENCH FORCES. THE DFC VISITED GIKONGORO AND MET THE LOCAL FRENCH COMMANDER. HE RETURNED THIS EVENING. GENERAL SHALIKASHVILI, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE JOINT CHIEF OF STAFF, UNITED STATES ARMY VISITED UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS THIS AFTERNOON. THE ETHIOPIAN RECCE TEAM RETURNED FROM THEIR RECCE IN THE CYANGUGU AREA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: GENERAL SHALIKASHVILI, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF OF THE UNITED STATES ARMY, VISITED UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS TODAY. HE WAS RECEIVED AND BRIEFED BY THE SRSG AND THE FORCE COMMANDER ON THE POLITICAL SITUATION AS WELL AS ON SHORT AND LONG-TERM NORMALISATION AND HUMANITARIAN PLANS. HE ALSO MET WITH NGEN KAGAME, THE VICE PRESIDENT AND DEF MINISTER. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MET WITH PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU WHO CATEGORICALLY DENIED MAKING STATEMENTS ATTRIBUTED TO HIM REGARDING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A NATIONAL TRIBUNAL AND THE GOVERNMENT'S PLAN TO DETAIN 30,000 RWANDANS SUSPECTED OF COMMITTING ATROCITIES. 1. GEN SITUATION: THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM. THE SITUATION IN GOMA IS REPORTEDLY IMPROVING ALTHOUGH CASES OF DYSENTERY ARE STILL PREVALENT. IN THE HPE LOCALS ARE STILL SHOWING SIGNS OF APPREHENSION ABOUT WHAT WILL HAPPEN WHEN THE FRENCH FORCES WITHDRAW. THE FORCE MEDICAL OFFICER RETURNED AFTER VISITING TROOPS ON ADMISSION IN NAIROBI TO CHECK ON THEIR CONDITIONS. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH HEADS OF MAJOR UN AGENCIES AND NGOs. THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR TO UGANDA HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE SRSG DURING A WORKING VISIT TO KIGALI.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: THE SRSG RECEIVED A CANADIAN DELEGATION TODAY MADE UP OF MR BERNARD DUBAULT, SPECIAL ENVOY FROM OTTAWA, MR JIM WALL, FIRST CONSULAR, HIGH COMMISSION, NAIROBI AND MR DENIS PROVOST, HEAD OF OFFICE OF EMBASSY, KIGALI. THE DISCUSSIONS CENTRED ON:

- A. THE TRANSITION IN SECTOR 4
- B. EFFORTS BEING MADE TO ENCOURAGE REFUGEES TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES
- C. ATTEMPTS TO RETURN THE COUNTRY TO NORMALITY (RECONSTRUCTION)
- D. HUMAN RIGHTS

HE THEN MET WITH MR FRANCOIS DESCOUETTE, THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR TO UGANDA. HE BRIEFED HIM ON THE CURRENT POLITICAL, HUMANITARIAN AND MILITARY SITUATIONS. MR DESCOUETTE EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT THE FOLLOWING:

- A. RADIO BROADCASTS HAVE NOT REACHED THE HPE OR GOMA SINCE 19 JUL
- B. REPORTS ABOUT PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU THREATENING TO USE FORCE TO ENTER THE HPE
- C. REPORTS THAT THE FRENCH HAVE REFUSED TO ALLOW RWANDAN GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TO ENTER THE HPE (FRANCE CATEGORICALLY DENIES HAVING MADE THIS STATEMENT)
- D. REPORTS QUOTING PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU AS STATING THAT 30,000 RPF/MILITIA TROOPS WILL BE DETAINED AS SUSPECTS IN THE MASSACRES

MR DESCOUETTE THEN MET WITH PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU AND SEVERAL OTHER GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ALSO HELD A MEETING WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS. THE DELEGATION ASKED ABOUT THE LIST OF POWs THAT UNAMIR HAD COMPILED. UNAMIR INFORMED AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL THAT THIS LIST HAD BEEN GIVEN TO THE ICRC.

AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL STATED THAT THERE WERE POWs CURRENTLY BEING DETAINED AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. UNAMIR WILL ATTEMPT TO CONFIRM THIS REPORT. THE BRSG ATTENDED A MEETING WITH THE HEADS OF THE FOLLOWING UN AGENCIES AND NGOs TO ESTABLISH A BETTER COORDINATION OF THE OPERATIONS OF THE FOLLOWING HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES: ICRC, IOM, WFP, UNICEF, UNHCR, WHO AND UNDP.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO PATROL KIGALI CITY. CONTINUED TO MAN SHAP ROAD BLOCKS AND MOSTLY CHECKED VEHICLE DOCUMENTATION. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES WITH UNAMIR AND NGOs.

B. RPF. A FEW ELEMENTS OF UNARMED RPF WERE OBSERVED IN THE GENERAL AREA OF CYANGUGU. MOST OF THEM ARE STILL IN KAYS.

C. MILITIA. NO MAJOR ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES:

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED. FC HELD STAFF BRIEF AT 0800 HRS. HE ALSO HELD A PRESS BRIEFING AT 0930 HRS. TROOPS ON ADMISSION IN MATORI ARE REPORTED TO BE RECEIVING GOOD CARE.

SUPPLIED WATER TO ORPHANAGE AT KIBEHU. FORUM ORGANIZED AT MUNINI TO EXPLAIN UNAMIR'S MISSION TO THE PEOPLE. CONDUCTED PATROLS IN BYUMBA GENERAL AREA WHERE IT IS REPORTED THAT ABOUT 50,000 HAVE SO FAR RETURNED TO THE AREA.

SUBJECT: Van Breda Insurance - Staff assigned from Headquarters
OBJET:

I refer to the provisions in paragraph 23 of information circular ST/IC/1994/25 regarding health insurance for staff members assigned to missions.

With regard to requests for a change from the Blue Cross Wraparound or the Aetna plans to the Van Breda plan, it would be appreciated if FOD staff would ensure that the evidence of the duration of their mission assignment be provided with any such request. The request should be submitted at the start of their mission assignment.

Due to the large number of staff members going on mission and returning to Headquarters, and in order to avoid movement in and out of plans for short periods of time, it was decided, as is outlined in the information circular, that staff members already in the Blue Cross Wraparound or Aetna plans (which have world-wide coverage) must remain in either of these plans unless their mission assignment is initially for one year or longer.

To reiterate, staff members presently covered under the Blue Cross Wraparound or Aetna plans must be assigned to a mission for one year or longer and have no eligible dependents residing in the United States during the mission assignment in order for them to be eligible for Van Breda insurance. This rule will continue to be applied.

Staff members assigned on mission

23. In view of the large number of staff members who go on mission assignment, a special medical/dental plan enrolment opportunity is extended to such staff members. The provisions in this respect, which will apply to all staff members going on mission for six months or more, are as follows:

(a) Staff members who at present are NOT enrolled in any United Nations health insurance plan will be allowed to enrol themselves and eligible family members. The insurance will become effective on the first day of the month in which the mission assignment commences. Enrolment in a health insurance plan in these circumstances must be completed PRIOR to the departure of the staff member on mission assignment;

(b) Staff members assigned to a mission who are enrolled in either HIP or Kaiser, two plans which do not offer full services at locations away from Headquarters, may switch to either Aetna or Blue Cross/WrapAround Plus. These two plans provide benefits on a worldwide basis, although in the case of Blue Cross/WrapAround Plus, there are no participating providers outside the Headquarters area. Enrolment in the Aetna or Blue Cross/WrapAround Plus plans under this provision must be completed PRIOR to the departure of the staff member on mission assignment;

(c) Staff members who, at the time of commencement of the mission assignment, do not have GHI Dental coverage but who are already enrolled, together with eligible family members, in Aetna or Blue Cross/WrapAround Plus, may enrol themselves and family members covered under their medical insurance plan in the dental plan. Such enrolment must be completed PRIOR to the departure of the staff member on mission assignment;

(d) Staff members who elect to enrol in a health insurance plan in the circumstances provided under (a) to (c) above forego the right to make any further change during the annual enrolment campaign taking place in the same calendar year as the commencement of the mission assignment. The next opportunity for these staff members to make any change in their insurance coverage will be at the time of the annual enrolment campaign of the following year;

(e) Staff members who are already enrolled in Aetna or Blue Cross/WrapAround Plus at the time of the mission assignment must retain their existing coverage until the next annual enrolment campaign;

(f) Staff members who will be on mission assignment for a year or more AND WHO WILL NOT HAVE ELIGIBLE COVERED FAMILY MEMBERS RESIDING IN THE UNITED STATES for the duration of the mission assignment may opt for coverage under the Van Breda Medical, Hospital and Dental Insurance plan for staff overseas. Details of this plan are available in the offices of the Insurance Section, room 8-2765;

(g) Staff members returning to Headquarters from mission assignment, other than those who qualified and opted for the Van Breda plan, may not change their insurance coverage until the next annual enrolment campaign. Staff members who switched to the Van Breda plan, as provided under subparagraph (f) above, must revert, upon return to Headquarters, to the insurance plan which they had prior to the mission assignment at least until the next annual enrolment campaign. It is essential that such staff members advise the Insurance Section within 31 days of their return to Headquarters.

IN ALL CASES, STAFF MEMBERS GOING ON MISSION ASSIGNMENT WHO WISH TO ENROL IN A HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN OR CHANGE THEIR PRESENT COVERAGE, AS PROVIDED ABOVE, MUST PRESENT EVIDENCE TO THE INSURANCE SECTION OF THE MISSION ASSIGNMENT AND ITS DURATION.

1. GEN SITUATION: MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM. REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO KIGALI, HOWEVER THEIR NUMBERS STILL REMAINED LOW. TWO CIVILIANS WHO WERE INJURED BY LANDMINES DURING THE DAY ARE CURRENTLY UNDER MEDICAL CARE AT KIGALI CENTRAL HOSPITAL. PC AND SRSG LEFT FOR UGANDA THIS MORNING. DFC RETURNED FROM GIKONGORO WHERE HE MET THE FRENCH COALITION FORCE COMMANDER. IT IS REPORTED THAT RADIO RWANDA TRANSMISSIONS DO NOT REACH REMOTE AREAS OF THE COUNTRY SO GOVERNMENT APPEALS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS ARE NOT REACHING THE POPULATION IN THESE AREAS. ACTS OF BANDITRY CONTINUE TO BE CONDUCTED IN CYANGUGU. THE ETHIOPIAN BATTALION RECCE PARTY IS EXPECTED TO ARRIVE TOMORROW.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES: THE SRSG AND FORCE COMMANDER MET WITH PRESIDENT MUSEVENI IN KAMPALA AND DISCUSSED THE HUMANITARIAN AND RECONCILIATION EFFORTS IN RWANDA. THE HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR THE UNITED KINGDOM IN UGANDA VISITED UNAMIR AND RECEIVED A SITUATION REPORT ON RELIEF OPERATIONS. A SIX MAN DELEGATION FROM JAPAN HEADED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE AFRICAN DEPARTMENT IN THE FOREIGN MINISTRY ARRIVED IN KIGALI AFTER VISITING GOMA. THE DELEGATION WILL HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT AND UNAMIR OFFICIALS TO ACCESS THE COUNTRY'S IMMEDIATE NEEDS.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN KIGALI. ONE CIVILIAN WAS SHOT DEAD WITH ONE RPF SOLDIER WOUNDED IN A SHOOTING INCIDENT LAST NIGHT, NEAR KING PAISAL HOSPITAL. REPORTS FROM GIKONGORO INDICATE THAT RPF ALONG THE HPE BOUNDARY CONTINUED TO BE FRIENDLY TO UNAMIR TROOPS. CONTINUING TO CONDUCT INFILTRATIONS INTO THE HPE AT NIGHT.

B. HPE. CONTINUED TO REMAIN IN CAMPS IN GOMA. REPORTS INDICATE THAT THEY ARE RETURNING TO THE HPE IN CIVILIAN DRESS AND INCITING THE POPULATION TO LEAVE THE AREA AS THEIR SECURITY CANNOT BE GUARANTEED AFTER THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE FRENCH TROOPS.

C. GHANBATT. CONTINUED TO DEPLOY IN GIKONGORO. ONE COMPANY MOVED INTO THE HPE DURING THE PERIOD. CONDUCTED PATROLS WITH FRENCH TROOPS IN GENERAL AREA OF KIBENO (GR 5399). A NUMBER OF DISPLACED PERSONS IN THE HPE HAVE REQUESTED FOR ASSISTANCE TO BE MOVED TO THEIR HOMES IN KIGALI, BUTARE AND GITARAMA. UNPROFOR (Former Yugoslavia)

CROATIA

The level of tension increased significantly throughout the UN Protected Areas (UNPAs) as a result of the continuing blockade of access roads by Croatian civilians. The Croatian police have taken control of seven checkpoints into the UNPAs, from a total of 19. In Sector West, the Croatian Special Police Forces remain in 50 different positions along the ceasefire line. On 28 July, the Government of Croatia, after meeting with members of the Croatian Displaced Persons Association, announced the reopening of selected crossings. The reopening of these crossings was made conditional on the implementation of control measures. The loss of freedom of movement directly related to the blocking of crossing points in the UNPAs has raised concerns about the ability of UNPROFOR to monitor effectively the Cease-fire Agreement. Recent developments have generally heightened the level of tension and resulted in the redeployment of some heavy weapons and the preparation of defensive works by both sides in a number of areas near the zone of separation.

BOSNIA and HERZEGOVINA

The Bosnian Serbs have explained that they have not rejected the Contact Group proposal, but have rejected its map and demand clarification of constitutional principles. The Serb leaders insist that they have given enough ground for negotiations to continue. At the same time, the Bosnian Serbs have hardened their attitude towards the Bosnian government. They have closed the crossing of SARAJEVO airport from BUTMIR to DOBRINJA. On 27 July, a British convoy approaching BUTMIR from Mt. IGMAN came under fire from the Serbs for almost an hour. One British soldier was killed in the attack and two other people were injured. Five vehicles were destroyed. In SARAJEVO, the number of firing incidents, including sniping activity, increased steadily as the week progressed, reaching its highest ever level on 30 July (597) and resulting in a number of civilian casualties on both sides. In Sector Southwest, the focus was on the Maglaj "thumb" where shelling was registered daily throughout the week. Other active areas in the sector included the BiH/BSA confrontation line in VISOKO, and the town of TRAVNIK. In Sector Northwest, shelling activity was reported daily along the POSAVINA corridor and the southern confrontation line. Fighting continued in the Dijas pocket, especially in the area of SKOKOVI on the central part of the internal confrontation line. External confrontation line activity was mostly limited to shelling in the areas of the Grabez plateau, MIOSTRAH, and OTOKA.

The humanitarian situation in the Bihac pocket continued to be of great concern to UNHCR. On 30 July, one convoy carrying 98 tons of wheat flour reached VELIKA Kladusa for the first time since mid May. The SARAJEVO airlift was suspended for some days after aircraft were struck by firing from both sides. Commercial traffic into the city stopped due to the blockade of the airport crossing. The UNPROFOR Head of Civil Affairs met with leaders on both sides to open routes into SARAJEVO and, in cooperation with the ICRC, to broker an exchange of prisoners between the two sides.

UNOSOM II (Somalia)

General Morgan and Mr. Ali Mahdi had several meetings during the week to discuss issues pertaining to the National Reconciliation process and agreed that the Somali Salvation Alliance (G-12) meet on 10 August at MOGADISHU. They expressed concern about the repercussions that a UNOSOM withdrawal or reduction in force would have on Somalia. Colonel IRRO, the SNA Chairman in the Bay Region, expressed the readiness of the SNA to cooperate with UNOSOM but pointed out that the SNA had set up its own administrative structures and did not agree with the UNOSOM policy of setting up districts and regional councils. Early in the week the situation in JILIB was reported as unstable and tense. The town was under Ogadeni control and technicals patrolled the streets. The SNA had fled the town toward the north-east. On 25 July, an outbreak of fighting was reported at KAMSUMA where two Ogadenis were killed and seven wounded. On 25 July, the Absame conference was held at DOOBLEY. Mr. Syed Hussein, Colonel Omar Jess and Mr. Ahmad Hashi

stated their forces were not involved in recent banditry in the JILIB area. On 26 July, Colonel Omar Afghadable met the Indian Liaison Officer in KISMAYO and informed him that the SPM (General Morgan's) militia had occupied the area of YONTOY, 30 kilometres north of KISMAYO and that SNA forces controlled the KAMSUMA Bridge and were planning to recapture JILIB. On 27 July, SNA militia entered JILIB and fired into the air for five minutes then left. No opposition by the Ogadenis was encountered. On the morning of 28 July, SNA reinforcements (eleven technicals and 200 approximately militia) arrived in the JILIB area from BARAWE. They crossed over the JUBA River and headed towards GADUDE, MEEREEREY and AFMADOW. Later that day UNOSOM were informed that approximately 500 armed men had left DOOBLEY and were moving towards AFMADOW and JILIB. On 30 July, a ten-member delegation, including Sultan Ali Basse and Moalin Omar Fen, were transported to BANDAR SALAM to assist in the negotiations between the SNA and the Ogadenis. The AOR Commander and OIC UNOSOM (KIMAYO) met with the delegation who expressed their desire for peace. The AOR Commander later met with SNA Leaders, Yasin Salah, Colonel Ibrahim and Qasim at BANDAR SALAM. They too expressed a desire for peace.

On 24 July inter-clan fighting began between the Haber Gedir and Hawalde clans 50 kilometres north of BELET-WEYNE. Later that day it was reported that Haber Gedir militia had over-run the town of BELET-WEYNE during the afternoon using technicals. Twelve looted trucks were seen leaving the town. On 25 July the SNA had control of BELET-WEYNE and civilians had fled the town and sought refuge in the Zimbabwe Contingent's Camp. No UNOSOM personnel were injured but the situation was described as tense. In the early morning of 26 July, the SNA militia at BELET-WEYNE looted three UN vehicles and other equipment from inside the compound but after a meeting between the Zimbabwean Commander and the SNA Commander and elders, a promise was given by the SNA to return the vehicles and equipment. Two vehicles were returned at 1100 hours local time. The situation in BELET WEYNE was calm on 27 July but the SNA reportedly killed four of its members who ignored the order to stop looting the UN compound. A platoon of Zimbabwean forces reinforced BELET-WEYNE during the day. On 29 July the SNA at BELET-WEYNE demanded that all UN equipment was to remain there and that no aircraft was to land except to evacuate the Zimbabwean troops. Early on 30 July the SNA forced their way into the UN Camp, disarmed the troops and looted communications and other equipment. One Zimbabwean soldier was killed and ten were missing after the conflict. The first evacuation of the Zimbabwean Company from BELET WEYNE was conducted late in the week. On 26 July a Nigerian soldier accidentally discharged a rocket-propelled grenade (RPG) from Hunter Base in MOGADISHU. The back blast injured three Nigerian soldiers who were in a stable condition in the Pakistani Hospital. Later that day an Indian escort was fired on by armed militia north of SP-7. The escort returned fire and killed two militia without casualties or damage to themselves. Also on 26 July, a Malaysian soldier was attacked with a knife by a Somali Drown and Root worker. He was reported to be in a stable condition.

At mid-day on 27 July, inter-clan fighting erupted between the Murasade and Haber Gedir clans in the general area of the MEDINA Colony, west of the Embassy Compound in MOGADISHU. Both sides made extensive use of recoilless rifles, RPGs and machine-guns. Fighting continued for several hours and several small arms rounds struck Pakistani posts on the western wall of the Embassy Compound but no UNOSOM casualties were reported. On 29 July, inter-clan fighting erupted in the vicinity of the main gate of the MOGADISHU Airfield. An Egyptian soldier was struck by a stray bullet behind the right ear and was evacuated to a field hospital where he was described to be in a stable condition.

On 24 July the situation in BARTIER 4 was tense with technicals visible in the town and unconnected ambushes

identify the cause of the epidemic. Seven hundred internally displaced persons (IDPs) were resettled in the Middle Shabelle Region early in the week. Another 436 IDPs began a 500 kilometre journey, with the aid of Pakistani forces, from MOGADISHU to BARDERA. Funds for five small-scale projects for KISMAYO were approved by the Project Funding Committee of UNOSOM's Division for Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs. The projects included a bakery, river flood protection, school rehabilitation and women's business training. On 24 July, 155 displaced persons arrived at BAIDOA from MOGADISHU and were given assistance by Indian troops. Later that day 438 displaced persons reported the Old Seaport in MOGADISHU in connection with the Indian resettlement project. Representatives of the orphanage in HODDUR asked UNOSOM and other international organisations for food assistance as it ran short of food for its 550 children. Additional food was supplied by UNOSOM from limited reserve supplies.

The Civilian Police Division conducted one refresher course in MOGADISHU during the week and one in BAIDOA. A total of 95 policemen attended the courses. The Division handed over four 4x4 utility vans and an assortment of stationery to the Galgaduud Region police stations.

UNAMIR (RWANDA)

During the week, President Bizimungu of Rwanda met President Mobutu of Zaïre in Mauritius and discussed the refugee situation in GOMA. President Bizimungu also visited Tanzania and Burundi. The Secretary of State for African Affairs in TUNIS delivered a message to the Rwandan President from the President of Tunisia who is also the Chairman of the OAU.

The current refugee situation in Rwanda and Zaïre was still not under control and the USA Secretary of Defence held discussions with the Rwandan President where he outlined the USA's humanitarian efforts. The UN High Commissioner for Refugees, Mrs. Sadako Ogata, visited KIGALI and GOMA during the week.

The RPF continued to patrol in KIGALI City although the number of road blocks has been reduced. Reports from GIKONGORO indicated that the RPF continued to move into the northern sector of the Humanitarian Protected Zone (HPZ). The RGT continued to remain in camps in GOMA and in the HPZ in recognizable military formations. No militia and Interhamwe activities were reported during the week.

Both UNAMIR and UNAMUR provided briefings and escorts to the various delegations visiting Rwanda and Zaïre. UNAMIR continued to assist and coordinate humanitarian activities as well as provided foodstuffs in GISENYI to refugees returning home. Convoys returned with displaced people from RUHengeri to KIGALI. The cholera epidemic in GOMA was still not totally under control by the end of the week and was spreading to other parts of the country. Fifteen cholera patients were admitted to the ICRC hospital in KIGALI. Measures were being taken to curb the spread of the disease to other parts of Rwanda. UEA Army troops arrived in KIGALI to assist in reopening KIGALI International Airport to help with the humanitarian airlift. International humanitarian organisations continued to arrive in Rwanda throughout the week.

UNAVEM II (Angola)

The LUSAKA Talks were suspended until 29 July because the UNITA delegation had travelled to HUAMBO to attend a meeting of the Political Committee of UNITA. Discussions continued on 30 July on the issue of the modalities of National Reconciliation. Three more articles of the modalities had been adopted but three more issues were proposed by UNITA. South Africa actively worked on a compromise and on Dr. Savimbi's visit.

During the week, military activities intensified in the Cabinda, Lunda Norte and Cuanza Sul provinces but

placed temporary restrictions on movements and reduced the strength of the UNMOs and military personnel stationed in troubled areas. NGOs have faced increased harassment by the NPFL. In a meeting on 29 July, the NGOs conveyed their concern to the NPFL leader over seizure of their vehicles by NPFL combatants. Despite the return of their vehicles, the NGOs have curtailed their operation in areas under NPFL influence. The demobilisation process remains at a standstill.

UNDOF (Syria)

UNDOF has raised with the Syrian authorities the issue of field fortifications in the area of separation. It conducted an inspection of the area of limitations on 25 and 27 July.

UNIFIL (Lebanon)

During the week there were four operations by armed elements against Israeli Defence Force/Defacto Force (IDF/DTF) targets. On 25 July, a series of coordinated attacks was launched against IDF/DTF positions in the Finnish battalion area, the North-Eastern Israeli Controlled Area and against a troop convoy. One Israeli soldier was killed and thirteen wounded in this operation; one of the attackers was killed. Two other attacks originated from the Nepalese battalion's area of operation near YATAR. A patrol of the Nepalese battalion came under threat in an encounter with armed elements, no shots were fired. The fourth operation was an explosion inside the DTF compound near BAYT YAJILUN in the Irish battalion's sector. The situation throughout UNIFIL's area of operation was generally tense with fears amongst the local population of Israeli reprisals for the BUENOS AIRES and LONDON bombings.

UNMOGIP (India/Pakistan)

The Pakistan army lodged 15 complaints of cease-fire violations. UNMOGIP carried out 19 investigations. There was an increased number of firing incidents in the Domel area.

UNOMIG (Georgia)

The current strength of UNOMIG is 48 observers. Tension in the KADORI valley and among the refugees on the Georgian side of the Inguri river remains high.

ONUSAL (El Salvador)

The Salvadorian Government has not provided a date and an outline for an expected information campaign on the collection or registration of military weapons in the hands of civilians, claiming that the funds for the campaign are not available. The opening of offices for the collection and registration of such weapons had been scheduled for 08 August. ONUSAL has verified that members of the former Customs Police, who are reportedly civilians reintegrated into the Finance Ministry and are deployed in border and other areas, carry military and other light weapons. ONUSAL has drawn this matter to the attention of the Government. As at 29 July, 14,851 demobilised soldiers and 488 former FAES administrative employees had been paid compensation.

This instruction is being issued to facilitate the consolidation of UNOMUR trial balance and status of allotments into UNAMIR's accounts. UNAMIR will incorporate UNOMUR transactions based on UNOMUR's submission of the attached form (see page 8,9 and 10).

For your information we are currently posting UNOMUR January, February and March 1994 based on UNOMUR vouchers. Once completed we will create an export file to incorporate the transaction into UNAMIR database. UNAMIR must create SUN ledger accounts (see item 5) and UNOMUR should start coding their vouchers using these account codes.

1. Financial Statement Reporting

UNAMIR is responsible in preparing a consolidated trial balance and status of allotment report for current and prior mandates. UNOMUR is responsible in providing UNAMIR a report indicating their cash receipts and disbursements. This report should be submitted to UNAMIR along with all supporting documents twice a month, since we require that all monthly financial statements be submitted to headquarters no later than mid month following the close of the month reported on (see finance manual 8.025). UNOMUR must also submit to UNOMUR an ageing schedule of their accounts receivables and payables.

2. Remittances

- a) UNAMIR is to communicate with headquarters the remittance requirements of both offices.
- b) UNOMUR to raise the following accounting entries to acknowledge receipt of remittances in both offices.

Therefore, there is only one remittance account for both offices.

3. Inter-office vouchers (IOVs)

- a) UNAMIR is responsible in recording all HQ incoming IOVs.



1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM IN RWANDA. MANY DISPLACED PEOPLE CONTINUED TO RETURN TO RWANDA FROM GOMA, SAIRI. REPORTS FROM GIKONGORO INDICATE CONTINUED INTIMIDATION AND BRUTAL KILLING OF SUSPECTS BY RPF. THESE ACTS ARE PREVENTING PEOPLE FROM LEAVING THE RPE TO GO AND SETTLE IN THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS. THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA VISITED BURUNDI TODAY AND RETURNED IN THE EVENING. AMERICAN DELEGATION VISITED FORCE HQ AND WERE BRIEFED BY FC. UN HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES ARRIVED IN KIGALI. SHE WAS BRIEFED ON MILITARY ACTIVITIES, HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES AND FUTURE PLANS BY SRSG AND FC. RAPPORTEUR ON HUMAN RIGHTS VISITED GITARAMA THIS AFTERNOON. EUROPEAN PARLIAMENTARY DELEGATION VISITED GIKONGORO TODAY AND LEFT FOR KINSHASA LATER IN THE AFTERNOON. 150 MEMBERS OF THE CANADIAN CORN SQUADRON ARRIVED IN KIGALI THIS MORNING.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. PRESIDENT BISEMUNGU TRAVELLED TO BUJUMBURA TO MEET THE PRESIDENT OF BURUNDI. SRSG RECEIVED MADAME OGATA, THE HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES, AND HER TEAM. MADAME OGATA RECEIVED BRIEFINGS FROM THE SRSG, THE FORCE COMMANDER AND THE UN HUMANITARIAN COORDINATOR. MADAME OGATA'S TEAM, ALONG WITH THE SRSG AND HIS POLITICAL AFFAIRS OFFICER, MET FIRST GENERAL PAUL KAGAME AND THEN THE PRIME MINISTER FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU AND MINISTER OF HEALTH, DR JOSEPH KALEGERA. THE DISCUSSIONS FOCUSED ON THREE BASIC ISSUES: (1) UNHCR'S OPERATIONS IN RWANDA, (2) APPREHENDING THE PERPETRATORS OF THE MASSACRES AND BRINGING THEM TO JUSTICE AND (3) SECURITY IN RWANDA. THE TEAM THEN TOOK A TOUR OF KIGALI TO ASSESS THE PREVAILING CONDITIONS IN THE CITY.

3. FACTIOAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF IN THE SOUTH-WEST OF THE COUNTRY CLOSE TO THE RPE ARE REPORTEDLY INTIMIDATING AND CONDUCTING BRUTAL KILLINGS OF SUSPECTS. RPF IS STILL ENTERING RPE WITH AND WITHOUT WEAPONS, DAYS AND NIGHT. THEY CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROL IN KIGALI AND CONTROLLING FPM ROAD BLOCKS. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE WITH AID AGENCIES AND NGOS IN HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM. THE SITUATION IN GOMA CONTINUED TO REMAIN CRITICAL. MORE DISPLACED PEOPLE ARE REPORTED TO LEAVE GOMA AND RETURN TO RWANDA. THE SITUATION IN THE RPE CONTINUED TO REMAIN VOLATILE AND UNPREDICTABLE. DISPLACED PEOPLE ARE REPORTED TO BE DYING OF HANGER IN THE RPE. UN HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES MRS SADAKO OGATA LEFT THIS MORNING FOR GOMA. CHAKHATT TROOPS COMMENCED DEPLOYMENT IN SECTOR 4.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE US SECRETARY OF DEFENCE ARRIVED IN KIGALI AND DISCUSSED US HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS WITH PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU, SRSG AND FC. THE UN HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES CONCLUDED HER VISIT TO KIGALI AND LEFT FOR GOMA VIA GISENYI. PRIOR TO HER DEPARTURE, SHE CALLED ON PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU AND HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE. 

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STILL CALM. REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO RWANDA FROM GOMA IN EASTERN ZAMBIA. ONE IN FOOD CONVOY LEFT FOR GISENYI THIS MORNING AND IS EXPECTED TO RETURN WITH DISPLACED PEOPLE FROM KUNENGERI TOMORROW. REPORTS FROM THE HUMANITARIAN PROTECTED ZONE (HPZ) INDICATE THAT LOCALS ARE DISCOURAGING THE PEOPLE TO LEAVE THE AREA AND FRIGHTENING THEM OF THE RPF ACTIVITIES. THE SITUATION IN GOMA IS REPORTED TO BE VERY CRITICAL DUE TO THE NUMBER OF DEATHS AND THOSE AFFECTED BY MALARIA AND OTHER DISEASES.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR AFRICAN AFFAIRS FROM THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS IN TUNISIA DELIVERED A MESSAGE TO THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA FROM THE PRESIDENT OF TUNISIA, WHO IS ALSO THE CURRENT CHAIRMAN OF THE ORGANISATION OF AFRICAN UNITY (OAU). THE SRSG HELD A DISCUSSIONS WITH THE VISITING DELEGATION FROM THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT. THE SPECIAL RAPPORTEUR FOR HUMAN RIGHTS ARRIVED IN KIGALI AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE SRSG. 

1. WITH REGARD TO MY FAX DATED 15 JULY, CONCERNING THE ABOVE, PLEASE BE INFORMED THAT WE HAVE RECEIVED RESPONSES FROM ALMOST ALL MISSIONS.

2. FIRST, WE WOULD LIKE TO THANK ALL MISSIONS FOR YOUR PROMPT RESPONSES, WITH A PARTICULAR NOTE OF APPRECIATION TO THOSE MISSIONS, IN FACT THE LARGER PART, WHO WERE ABLE TO TAKE APPROPRIATE STEPS IN ORDER TO REDUCE THEIR CURRENT CASH NEEDS.

3. WE ARE CERTAINLY AWARE THAT SOME MISSIONS ARE NOT IN A POSITION, AT THIS TIME, TO MAKE ANY FURTHER REDUCTIONS TO THEIR CURRENT NEEDS. WE URGE YOU, HOWEVER, TO KEEP OUR REQUEST IN MIND, SHOULD ANY FUTURE OPPORTUNITY ARISE IN WHICH YOU CAN, IN FACT, REDUCE YOUR CASH REQUIREMENTS. TO THIS END, WE REFER YOU, AGAIN, TO THE CASH CONSERVATION TECHNIQUES LISTED IN MY 15 JULY 94 FAX. I CANNOT EMPHASIZE ENOUGH, THE IMPORTANCE OF THESE MEASURES.

4. FOR THE VERY FEW MISSIONS WHO DID NOT RESPOND, AS WELL AS FOR ALL THOSE WHO DID, WE WOULD LIKE TO REITERATE AND HIGHLIGHT COMMENTS MADE BY THE SECRETARY GENERAL TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL REGARDING THIS MATTER.

"I HAVE DECIDED TO TAKE URGENT STEPS TO REDUCE OR DELAY EXPENDITURE IN THE PEACE-KEEPING OPERATIONS AS FOLLOWS:

- A) ALL PEACE-KEEPING MISSIONS ARE BEING INSTRUCTED TO REDUCE OR DELAY EXPENDITURES TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT POSSIBLE;
 - B) ALL BUT THE MOST URGENT PROCUREMENT IS BEING POSTPONED; AND
 - C) RECRUITMENT IS BEING POSTPONED IN ALL BUT THE MOST ESSENTIAL CASES.
5. FINALLY, I WOULD LIKE TO THANK YOU, AGAIN, FOR YOUR COOPERATION AND CONSTANT VIGILANCE IN THIS VERY URGENT MATTER.
