DAILY SUMMARY COVERING THE PERIOD 270600Z TO 280600Z SEP 94

1. GEN. SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. OP HOMEWARD STALLED AS ONLY 27 DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) WERE MOVED FROM SECTOR 4 TO SECTOR 3. DPs EXPRESSED FEELING OF LACK OF SECURITY. RADIO STATION EMITTING TRANSMISSIONS PROBABLY FROM BURUNDI CONTINUED TO SEND MESSAGES ACCUSING RPA OF KILLING REFUGEES AND LOOTING THEIR BELONGINGS. THIS SEEMS TO IMPACT NEGATIVELY ON EFFORTS TO MOVE DISPLACED PEOPLE TO THEIR HOMES. SCHOOLS CONTINUED TO OPEN IN MANY PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. TWO MASS GRAVES IN THE SOUTH WEST OF THE COUNTRY WHICH ARE MONTHS OLD WERE DISCOVERED AT NYARUBUYE GR 837588 ALLEGED TO CONTAIN OVER 400 BODIES. ANOTHER 100 BODIES WERE DISCOVERED IN A CLASSROOM NEAR A CHURCH IN THE SAME AREA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. UNAMIR CONTINUED CONTACTS WITH THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND THE DIRECTOR OF RWANDA INFORMATION OFFICE IN ORDER TO OBTAIN BROADCASTING LICENSE AND FREQUENCY ALLOCATION FOR THE UN RADIO IN RWANDA.

3. FACEDIAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS IN KIGALI AND THE REST OF THE COUNTRY. A PLATOON PASSED THROUGH KARAMA GR 5531 AND RUKOMO GR 5538 TOWARDS MWOGO GR 6240. FINAL DESTINATION TO BE CONFIRMED. A SEC ON PATROL WAS SIGHTED AT KIBEHO GR 5007 MOVING TOWARDS RURAMA GR 4716. MR LAURIEN KUBWIRAMA, ACTING MANAGER, GATARE AGRICULTURE PROJECT IS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED ON 271400Z SEP 94. HE IS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN TAKEN TO MISUMO IN GISOVU COMMUNE. A WOMAN WAS REPORTED SHOT AT NUGAZA GR 4305 BY RPA SOLDIER. THE VICTIM IS BEING GIVEN MEDICAL ATTENTION BY A BRITISH MEDICAL TEAM AT RUNYONBYI GR 4893.

C. MILITIA. NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. CONDUCTED NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES. STAFF BRIEF WAS HELD AT 1800 HRS.

B. SHAMBATT. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS. PROVIDED GUARDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE, AICF WAREHOUSE AND AT RELIEF DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AT CYANIKA GR 5630. ONE MECHANIZED SECTION EACH CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES. CONTINUED TO MAN PERMANENT ROAD BLOCKS AT GIKONGORO GR 5127, RURAMA GR 3717, RWAMIKO GR 4913 AND KITABI GR 3520. TROOPS IN SOUTH EAST RWANDA PATROLLED FROM RILINA GR 2561 TO NYANATA GR 1061 AND RUHAHA GR 0644. CONFISCATED ONE GRENADE FROM A LOCAL AT RUKONDO.

71 DPs MOVED FROM GIKONGORO TO HUYE GR 6814. MAJORITY OF DPs RELUCTANT TO LEAVE FOR FEAR OF THEIR SAFETY. CARITAS CONTINUED MED ASSISTANCE TO DPs WHILST SAVE THE CHILDREN FUND DISTRIBUTED FOOD TO NURSING MOTHERS AT RURAMA GR 4716. MINISTER OF EDUCATION VISITED GIKONGORO AND HELD A FORUM AT MBUGA GR 4124. MR UEALIBARA BENCKIEL, EX-LOCAL POLICEMAN FOR SAKA COMMUNE NOW AT CYANIKA CAMP, HANDED OVER 2 X PAIRS OF TROUSERS, 3 SHIRTS, 1 X COAT, 1 JERSEY PULLOVER, 1 X BERT, 1 X PAIR OF BOOTS AND 1 X BELT. 197 DPs GIVEN MED TREATMENT BY OWN MED STAFF AT MURAMBI GR 5128.

C. NILOS GR. MOST PRIMARY SCHOOLS HAVE OPENED AT BYUMBA PREFECTURE. 492 ORPHANS OF RUTARE ORPHANAGE GR 1908 MOVED TO KIGALI ON 27 SEP 94. MR JEAN DE DIEY HABAKURANA OF KIGALI WAS ASSISTED BY NILOS TO FIND OUT HIS FAMILY FROM A VILLAGE NAMED MULIZA GR 055225. 19 PERS ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH BURUNDI BORDER WHILE 51 PEOPLE ENTERED THROUGH TANZANIA BORDER CROSSING POINTS. 55 DPs WERE TRANSPORTED FROM KAGAYI TO HASANGO GR 6153 WITH THE HELP OF MALAWI COY. 37 PERS WERE MOVED FROM KISI TO BUTARE WHILE ANOTHER 283 WERE TRANSPORTED FROM THE SAME PLACE TO OTHER PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. AT GIKONGORO, OP HOMEWARD CONTINUED WITH VERY LOW SUCCESS. THE REASONS BEING THAT THE PEOPLE IN GENERAL WERE SCARED TO GO BACK TO THEIR COMMUNE BECAUSE AN UNKNOWN RADIO STN HAS ADVISED PEOPLE NOT TO RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES AS THEY WOULD BE KILLED BY RPA. THE RADIO ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT FORMER GOVT FORCES WOULD ATTACK THE COUNTRY SOON. IT WAS REPORTED THAT APPROX 3,000 DPs FROM RURAMBA, 300 FROM RWAMIKO AND 1,000 FROM KIBERO LEFT THEIR CAMPS AND PREFER TO USE TRACKS THROUGH THE FORESTS TO AVOID RPA CHECK PTS TO REACH BURUNDI BORDER. SOME OF THE PEOPLE WHO LEFT THESE CAMPS EARLIER FOR THEIR HOMES HAVE RETURNED. THEIR REASONS BEING INSECURITY IN THEIR HOMES. APPROX 6,000 DISPLACED PERS WERE REPORTED AT RUGABA. ICRC DISTRIBUTED FOOD FOR 25,000 PERS AT BUTARO GR 8243 AREA ON 27 SEP 94. 112 PERS ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH CUYANIKA POST WHILE 321 PERS ENTERED THROUGH BORDER POST NO. 1, 2 AND 3.

D. BRITISH. FIELD SURGICAL TEAM AT KIGEME PERFORMED 5 SURGICAL PROCEDURES. A TOTAL OF 2,584 PERS WERE TREATED DURING THE PERIOD WITH 23 IN PATIENTS. OUT OF THE 400M WATER PIPING REQUIRED AT THE MUKOSO CLINIC, 160M HAVE NOW BEEN LAID. ENGR DUTIES IN SUPPORT OF 23 PFA CONTINUED INVOLVING BACK FILLING, LINING AND FENCING OFF MASS GRAVES IN CAMP 4A/03. EOD TASKED TO CLEAR 120MM MORTAR ROUND ON ROUTE TO PEGASUS THROUGH KIGALI. THE UNICEF MINE AWARENESS PACKAGE WILL BE IN THEATRE FROM 4 OCT 94. ONLY 27 DISPLACED PEOPLE MOVED FROM GIKONGORO TO BUTARE ON OP HOMEWARD.

E. CAN SIGS. SUPPORT TO UNAMIR HQ AND TAC HQ CONTINUED. PREPARED RECCE OF REFEATER SITE IN SECTOR 2. ASSISTED FIELD SERVICES IN ERECTING MICRO-WAVE ANTENNA AT UNAMIR HQ AS PART OF UNAMIR'S RURAL TEL NETWORK.

F. AUSMED. AUSMED MEDICAL SUPPORT FORCE PROVIDED HUMANITARIAN MEDICAL SUPPORT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

AUSMED FORCES AT CHK TREATED 69 PATIENTS AND 6 DENTAL PATIENTS AND CURRENTLY HOLDING 13 PATIENTS. TROOPS OF TSG BUTARE CONDUCTED CLINICS AT BARANZIGI, BUSORO TOWNSHIP AND KIRIKO CAMP TREATING 1,047 PATIENTS AND 20 DENTAL PATIENTS. RIFLE COMPANY ELEMENT CONDUCTED SECURITY OPERATIONS AT THE MILITARY ACADEMY BARRACKS, BELGIAN VILLAGE, KING FAISAL HOSPITAL AND UN STORES COMPOUND AT KIA.

PATROLLED FROM NYARUSHASHI TO GAFUNZO, FROM GISAKURA TO KIRAMBO AND GAFUNZO TO BUGARAMA. 301 REFUGEES WERE REPATRIATED FROM SAIRE THROUGH RUSIZI 1 AND BUGARAMA.

H. MALAWIAN COY. PROVIDED TRUCKS AND MOVED 55 DPs FROM KARGAYI TO MASANGO GR 6253. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND MAN ROAD BLOCKS IN AREA OF OPERATION.

I. FRAFBATT. CONTINUED TO MAN CHECK POINTS AND ROAD BLOCKS. NUMBER OF DPs INCREASING AT RUGABANO GR 4266 AND NDABA GR 4272 DP CAMPS. THERE IS AN OUTBREAK OF DYSENTERY IN SOME AREAS. 97 LOCALS RECEIVED MED TREATMENT AT FRAFBATT.

J. NICOY. RMO PROVIDED DRUGS AND MED ADVICE AT WORLD VISION MED CENTRE IN BYUMBA. MORE TROOPS AND EQUIPMENT ARE EXPECTED AT 281500B SEP 94.

K. AIR OPS. A TOTAL OF 17 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

5. UNICEF. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT TRAINING OF THE GENDARMERIE.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. CHAO CONDUCTED RECCES TO BUTARE, KIZI AND GIKONGORO ON THE PROGRESS OF OP HOMEWARD. THE OP STALLED AS 27 DPs OUT OF 134 DPs FROM GIKONGORO AND 264 DPs FROM KARAMBI WERE MOVED. HAC HAS LIAISED WITH NILOB HQ IN GITARAMA. A DETAILED REPORT ON ORPHANAGE SITUATION HAS BEEN FURNISHED AND FUTURE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THESE ORPHANAGES WILL BE REVIEWED WITH UNREGO, UNICEF AND CONCERN. CONCERN ARE REPORTED NOT TO BE CAPABLE OF PROVIDING SUFFICIENT FOOD TO ORPHANAGES IN KARGAYI.

DAILY SITREP COVERING THE PERIOD 260600Z TO 270600Z SEP 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) AND REFUGEES CONTINUED TO REPATRIATE DAILY. LIFE IN KIGALI IMPROVING STEADILY. ELECTRICITY AND WATER BEING EXTENDED TO DIFFERENT PARTS OF THE CITY. A SHOOTING INCIDENT INVOLVING A UNAMIR OFFR TOOK PLACE IN THE AREA OF TAC HQ IN BUTARE WHEN A LOWBED TRUCK REFUSED TO STOP AFTER HITTING A UNAMIR VEH AND PASSING THROUGH AN RPA CHECK PT. THE OFFR STEPPED IN FRONT OF THE LOWBED TO FORCE IT TO STOP. WHEN IT BECAME EVIDENT THAT THE DRIVER DID NOT INTEND TO STOP AND FEARING THAT THE RPA WOULD SHOOT AND MAYBE KILL SOME INNOCENT BYSTANDERS, THE OFFR SHOT THE FRONT TIRE OF THE TRUCK TO FORCE THE VEH TO STOP. AFTER QUESTIONING, THE DRIVER SAID HIS BRAKES HAD FAILED HIM. OP HOMEWARD IS SUCCESSFULLY UNDERWAY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE PRESIDENT GAVE A PRESS CONFERENCE DURING WHICH HE STRONGLY DENOUNCED ALLEGATIONS OF RECENT MASS KILLINGS ALLEGEDLY COMMITTED BY THE RPA.

B. A JOINT PRESS RELEASE WAS ISSUED BY THE MINISTER OF DEFENSE AND THE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION WHICH PROTESTED THE RELEASE OF THE REPORT, WHICH INCLUDES ALLEGATIONS THAT HAVE NOT YET BEEN SUBSTANTIATED.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. RPA HAS MOVED OUT OF KIVOMBE GR 755404 BUT STILL DEPL AT KARAMA, CYONDO AND NYAGAHANGA. RPA REASSEMBLING TROOPS DEPLOYED IN SECTOR 5 FOR MAJOR TRG EXERCISE. INCREASED TRG ACTIVITIES OBSERVED AT GR 3620. THE EXTRA RPA SUPPORT PROMISED FOR THE KIZI CHECK POINT FOR OP HOMEWARD DID NOT MATERIALISE. RPA IN SECT 4C, CONDUCTED CORDON AND SEARCH OPS IN CYANGUGU AND KAMEMBE AREAS AND ARRESTED 14 MEN AND 1 LADY SUSPECTED OF HIDING WPNS. THEY CONFISCATED 1 X PPSH WPN, 1 X TAPE RECORDER, 40 X FRENCH ARMY UNIFORMS, 2 X TVs AND OTHER UNSPECIFIED ITEMS FROM A CIVILIAN'S HOME. HEAVY CONCENTRATION OF RPA TROOPS AT RUKONO JUNCTION GR 127201.

B. RGF. RUMOURS INDICATE THAT RGF PLANNING TO ATTACK BUGARAMA CITY SOMETIME IN OCTOBER IN AN ATTEMPT TO RECAPTURE RWANDA. PROPAGANDA IS PROBABLY MEANT TO DISCOURAGE REFUGEES FROM RETURNING HOME.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. FC HELD STAFF BRIEF AT 0800 HRS. FC AND SRSG ACCOMPANIED BY AMBASSADOR DILLON VISITED SECTOR 5 HQ WHERE

THEY WERE BRIEFED BY THE SECTOR COMD. DPC IS STILL IN ZAIRE.

B. CHANDATT. NORMAL PTLS AND SECURITY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED IN AOR. FOLLOWING ARMS AND UNIFORMS WERE CONFISCATED FROM LOCALS AND COMMUNAL POLICE IN AOR:

- (1) 20 X AK47 RIFLE.
- (2) 30 X MK4 LMG.
- (3) 5 X MAS RIFLE.

BN 2IC HELD A MEETING WITH PREFECT OF GIKONGORO GR 5127 AT BN TAC HQ. PROBLEM OF FREQUENT ARRESTS AND INDISCIPLINE ON THE PART OF SOME RPA PERS WERE DISCUSSED. AS PART OF OP HOMEWARD 385 DPs WERE MOVED FROM GIKONGORO TO BUTARE.

C. MILOS GR. RECEIVED INFO THAT BURUNDI RADIO WAS BROADCASTING THAT FORMER GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS WERE INCITING REFUGEES NOT TO RETURN HOME. THE DCMO AND SECTOR 2 COMD VISITED KIBUNGO AREA AND INSPECTED ACCN FACILITIES FOR OCCUPATION BY MILOS. THEY ALSO VISITED CANSIG PL LOC AT KIBUNGO GR 6262. THREE MILOS TEAMS PERMANENTLY DEPLOYED AT KIBUNGO GR 6262. OP HOMEWARD STARTED ON THE 26 SEP 94. 16 X TRUCKS WERE ESCORTED IN THE INITIAL EVAC OF 387 DPs TO BUTARE. A MASS GRAVE CONTAINING APPROX 140 BODIES DISCOVERED AT CYANGUGU. 22 OTHER GRAVES CONTAINING APPROX 5 X BODIES EACH WERE ALSO DISCOVERED IN SAME AREA. 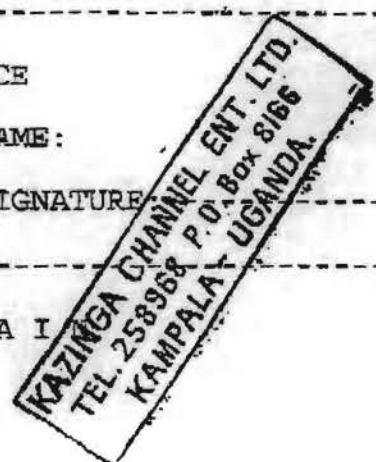

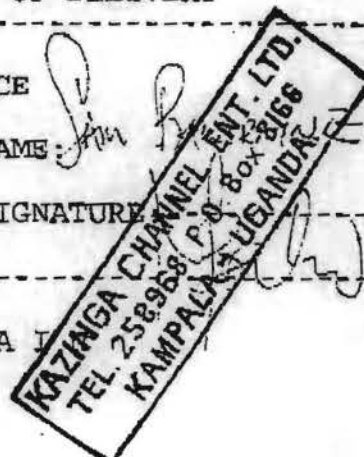

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) AND REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES. UNAMIR IS CURRENTLY ORGANISING OF HOMEWARD TO REPATRIATE A LARGE SCALE OF DPs TO THEIR HOMES FROM VARIOUS AREAS OF SECTOR 4. RPA URGING LOCAL POPULATION IN SECTOR 4 TO HAVE CONFIDENCE IN NEW GOVERNMENT FOR THEIR SECURITY AND RETURN HOME.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE PRESIDENT SUMMONED THE FORCE COMMANDER AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION, ALONG WITH TWO REPRESENTATIVES OF UNHCR, TO PROTEST THE ALLEGATION MADE BY UNHCR REGARDING MASSACRES ALLEGEDLY COMMITTED BY RPA SOLDIERS. HE CONSIDERED THESE ALLEGATIONS MISCHIEVOUS AND UNFOUNDED AND ASKED FOR MORE SUBSTANTIVE PROOF AS WELL AS FOR THE METHODOLOGY USED IN COMPILING THE REPORT.

B. THE PRESIDENT ACCUSED UNAMIR OF KNOWING ABOUT THE REPORT WITHOUT INFORMING THE GOVERNMENT. HE ADDED THAT THIS PUTS THE FUTURE OF UNAMIR'S CONTINUING OPERATION IN RWANDA IN QUESTION. THE FORCE COMMANDER DENIED HAVING ANY PRIOR KNOWLEDGE OF THE REPORT.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. RPA HUMANITARIAN LIAISON OFFICER IN SECTOR 4B ACCOMPANIED A CONVOY OF 7 TRUCKS CARRYING 395 DPs FROM GITARAMA TO KIBUYE. 6 PERSONS WHO HAD LEFT MEMBERSHIO GR 5435 SOME WEEKS AGO TO RETURN TO THEIR COMMUNE OF MUYIRA HAD BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS IN THE COMMUNE FOR UNSPECIFIED REASONS. THEY WERE TIED AND BEATEN BUT THE RPA COMPANY COMMANDER APPARENTLY SAVED THEM. THE FREQUENCY OF CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATIONS BY THE RPA HAS INCREASED OVER LAST FEW DAYS IN SECTOR 3 AND 4. THIS ACTION HAS RESULTED IN SOME REPORTS OF LOCALS LEAVING THEIR HOMES AT NIGHT AND MOVING TO UNAMIR UNIT LOCATIONS.

B. GHAMBATT. POPULATION COMPLAIN OF INSECURITY FOLLOWING CORDON AND SEARCH OPS AND ARRESTS OF SOME LOCALS BY THE RPA. DR RWAYITARE ETIENNE OF KIGEME HOSP ARRESTED AT CHECK PT BETWEEN GIKONGORO AND KIGEME BY RPA. WHEREABOUTS OF THE MENTIONED DOCTOR AND REASONS FOR ARREST IS NOT KNOWN. CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT PTLs IN AOR. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE GDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE, AICF WAREHOUSE AND DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AT CYANIKA. CONTINUED TO DEPLOY 1 X MECHANISED SECTION EACH AT NATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES. PERMANENT ROAD BLOCKS MANNED AT GIKONGORO GR 5127, KURAMBA GR 3717, RWAMIKO GR 4913 AND KITABI GR 3520. 5 X M113 TRANSPORTED TO PLATOON LOCATION IN RILIMA GR 2561. PROVIDED SECURITY AND SUPERVISED ICRC RELIEF DISTRIBUTION AT MUNINI. 19 MEMBERS OF BRITISH MED TEAM ARRIVED AT RUYOMBYI GR 4893. THEY INTEND TO STAY AT THE MENTIONED AREA FOR 4 DAYS.

C. NILOB GR. CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PTLs IN ALL SECTORS. SECTOR 2 COMMANDER ALONG WITH CHC WENT TO KIBUNGO FOR RECCE. THEY MET THE BOURGMESTER OF KIBUNGO WHO ASSURED THEM OF TWO HOUSES FOR NILOB ACCOMMODATION IN THE SECTOR. MEANWHILE NILOBs WILL BE ACCOMMODATED IN TENTS UNTIL A SUITABLE ACCOMMODATION IS OBTAINED. ONE GHANIAN PLATOON ALSO DEPLOYED AT KIBUNGO. NILOB ESCORTED 395 DPs FROM KABUAYI CAMP GR 7269 TO KIBUYE PREFECTURE WITH THE HELP OF MALAWI TPS. WFP PERSONNEL REPORTED THAT TWO OF THEIR STAFF, JEROME HAIZIMANA AND EUGENE NDATIMANA WERE ARRESTED BY THE RPA WHEN A WPM WAS FOUND IN THE CEILING OF THE HOUSE THEY WERE OCCUPYING DURING A SEARCH OPERATION BY RPA ON 19 SEP 94. THEY ARE STILL IN CUSTODY AT GIKONGORO. APPROX 200 DPs WERE TRANSPORTED FROM BUGARAMA TO CYANGUGU. 22 DPs ENTERED RWANDA VIA CYANIKA WHILE 1,326 ENTERED THROUGH BORDER POST 1, 2 AND 3.

D. BRITCON. A MED SECTION DEPARTED KITABI FOR A 4 DAY TOUR OF REFUGEE CAMPS IN THE SOUTH AND WILL BE JOINED BY ANOTHER MED SECTION TOMORROW. RH TEAM HELD A MEETING WITH NGOs AND FORMULATED A PLAN FOR WATER/SANITATION FACILITIES AT CAMP 4A/11 GR 5107. IN PATIENTS WERE VISITED AT CAMPS 4A/11 AND 4A/35. THE REMAINDER OF 23 PFA CONDUCTED MAINTENANCE TASKS ON EQUIPMENT AT KITABI. WORK ONGOING AT THE SISTERS OF MERCY ORPHANAGE TO INCLUDE PREPARATION OF PERMANENT SITE OF THE ODA GENERATOR AND BUILDING MAINT. THE MUKONO CLINIC, GHEMI HOSP AND MANUYAGIRO WATER SUPPLIES ARE ALL SCHEDULED FOR REINSTATEMENT NEXT WEEK. RPA OFFICERS IN SECTOR 4 ARE URGING PEOPLE TO HAVE CONFIDENCE IN NEW GOVERNMENT FOR THEIR SECURITY AND RETURN HOME. UNAMIR IS CURRENTLY ORGANISING OF HOMEWARD TO REPATRIATE A LARGE NUMBER OF DPs TO THEIR HOMES FROM VARIOUS AREAS OF SECTOR 4.

DAILY SITREP COVERING THE PERIOD 230600Z TO 240600Z SEP 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) AND REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN. SCHOOLS ARE REOPENING IN MOST SECTORS WITH MORE GIRLS REPORTING FOR CLASSES THAN BOYS. ZAIRE BORDER AT GOMA/GISENYI IS REPORTED CLOSED BY ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES TO UN PERSONNEL. NO REASON HAS BEEN GIVEN. 1 WFP TRUCK ON RELIEF DUTIES IN SECTOR 4C WAS INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT THAT RESULTED IN THE DEATH OF ITS DRIVER NAMED CORTIA MURANGI ALLI. ARRANGEMENTS UNDERWAY TO EVACUATE DEAD BODY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. A JAPANESE DELEGATION HEADED BY THE MINISTER OF DEFENSE, MR. T. TAMASANA VISITED KIGALI TO ASSESS JAPAN'S POTENTIAL CONTRIBUTION TO HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS IN RWANDA. DISTRIBUTED COMPO RATION TO THE DPs AT GATARE GR 3535 AND EGANZO GR 3335. PROVIDED SV AND SUPERVISED RELIEF DISTRIBUTION BY ICRC AT MUNINI GR 4800 AND RURAMBA GR 3717.

C. MILOR GR. DCMO PAID A STAFF VISIT TO SEC 4A AND 4C. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS. IN BYUMBA DISPENSARY WHICH WAS LOCATED AT KIVUYE HAS MOVED TO BUNGUCA GR 975344, THIS HOSP IS RUN BY RPA. 5 VEHs WERE BROUGHT FROM KABALE TO KIGALI BY UNHOS. 1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM. RETURN OF DISPLACED PERSONS (DPs) CONTINUES ALBEIT AT REDUCED LEVELS. LIFE IN THE CAPITAL AND AS WELL IN RWANDA APPEARS TO BECOMING BACK TO NORMAL. SCHOOLS ARE OPENING IN MOST OF THE SECTORS. RPA ARE CONDUCTING DAILY PATROLS AND MANNING ROAD BLOCKS IN AND AROUND KIGALI. REPORTS OF DISCOVERY OF MASS GRAVES WERE RECEIVED FROM RUEAVU AND KAYONE. UNCONFIRMED REPORT RECEIVED ABOUT 10 BODIES ALLEGEDLY KILLED BY RPA IN THE BEGINNING OF AUGUST. A JOINT TEAM OF BBGNU MINISTERS, UNAMIR, UNHCR, AND HUMAN RIGHTS REPS VISITED SECTOR 2 AT RUSUMO AND RUTONDE IN AN ATTEMPT TO INVESTIGATE THE ALLEGATIONS CONTAINED IN THE RECENTLY ANNOUNCED REPORT COMMISSIONED BY UNHCR. FINDINGS WERE INCONCLUSIVE; A SEPARATE REPORT WILL BE MADE BY THE SRSG IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

C. MILOB GR. COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBs ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT. ALSO CARRIED OUT PTLs AND ESCORT DUTIES IN ALL SECTORS. PTL FROM SECTOR 4B LOCATED NEW RPA CHECK PTS AT GR 276700 AND 464631. MILOB TPT ONE MOTOR CYCLE ACCIDENT CAS FROM RUHENGARI TO KING FAISAL HOSP. J. NIGERIA COY. CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PATROLS IN AREA OF OPERATION.

K. AIR OPS. A TOTAL OF 38 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA. UN539, C-130 OF CANADIAN ARMED FORCES WAS ARRANGED TO CARRY THREE HUMAN REMAINS DELIVERED BY THE BELGIAN EMBASSY. WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 12 SEP TO 18 SEP 94.

1. HIGH LIGHTS. THE GENERAL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM. LIFE IN KIGALI CITY AS WELL AS IN OTHER AREAS IN RWANDA CONTINUED TO IMPROVE STEADILY. WATER AND ELECTRICITY HAS BEEN RESTORED IN SOME PARTS OF THE CITY. RPA DEPLOYMENT IN SECTOR 4 COMPLETED. UNAMIR TROOPS CONTINUED TO MAINTAIN SECURITY IN SECTOR 4 THROUGH PATROLLING AND SNAP ROAD BLOCKS. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE THE CIV AND MILITARY TRANSITION IN THE SAME SECTOR. HOWEVER RPA IMPOSED SOME RESTRICTIONS ON UNAMIR TROOP DEPLOYMENT AND MOVEMENT IN SECTORS 1, 2, 3 AND 5, CONTRARY TO UNAMIR MANDATE. DISPLACED PERS CONTINUED TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES FROM VARIOUS AREAS OF THE COUNTRY AND BORDERING COUNTRIES. SRSG VISITED ZAIRE AND TANZANIA WITH DFC AND CMO RESPECTIVELY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. HIGHLIGHTS. THIS WEEK, UNAMIR WORKED TO FACILITATE AND FINALIZE THE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY TRANSITION IN SECTOR 4 FROM UNAMIR TO RWANDESE GOVERNMENT CONTROL AND CONTRIBUTED TO THE STABILITY OF THE GOVERNMENT AND OF THE COUNTRY THROUGH BOTH POLITICAL AND HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS. IN ADDITION, THE FOLLOWING VISITS AND EVENTS WERE OF SIGNIFICANCE:

(1) ON 11 SEPTEMBER, THE SRSG MET WITH AMBASSADOR DILLON TO DISCUSS THE TERMS OF REFERENCE OF HIS MISSION.

(2) ON 14 SEPTEMBER, THE SRSG MET WITH PRESIDENT MOBUTU AT GBADOLITE TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF SECURITY IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS IN ZAIRE.

(3) ON 15 SEPTEMBER, THE SRSG TRAVELLED TO NAIROBI TO HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE USG FOR DPKO REGARDING THE ISSUE OF SECURITY IN RWANDA, ESPECIALLY IN THE TANZANIAN AND ZAIREAN REFUGEE CAMPS. HE THEN TRAVELLED TO TANZANIA TO MEET WITH PRESIDENT MWINYI TO ADDRESS THE SECURITY PROBLEM.

(4) ON 15 SEPTEMBER, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MET WITH MR. EDWARD CLAY, BRITISH HIGH COMMISSIONER, TO DISCUSS BRITAIN'S ASSISTANCE WITH PRIORITY PROJECTS OF RENP. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND THE DEPUTY FORCE COMMANDER THEN RECEIVED THE VISIT OF THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL OF WHO, DR. HIROSHI NAKAJIMA. BOTH THE ED AND THE DFC GAVE DR. NAKAJIMA AND HIS DELEGATION A FULL BRIEFING.

(5) ON 17 SEPTEMBER, THE SRSG RECEIVED THE VISIT OF MR. FRANCISCO AGUIRRAS-SASCA, WORLD BANK DIRECTOR FOR THE

AFRICA REGION, TO DISCUSS WORLD BANK ASSISTANCE FOR RWANDA AND TO TRY TO FOCUS ASSISTANCE EFFORTS OF THE BANK AND OF THE UN AGENCIES ON THE COMMON-SENSE PRIORITIES OUTLINED IN THE RENP, NAMELY:

(A) BUDGETARY ASSISTANCE TO THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT.

(B) THE REPAIR OF THE ELECTRICAL POWER GRID.

(C) DE-MINING AND D) THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INDEPENDENT UNAMIR RADIO.

B. THE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY TRANSITION IN SECTOR 4 FROM UNAMIR TO GOVERNMENT CONTROL HAS BEEN COMPLETED.

C. IN VIEW OF THE OVERALL STABILITY IN RWANDA, THE FOLLOWING FOUR FACTORS AND INITIATIVES WERE VITAL:

(1) RELIEF AND DEVELOPMENT/REMP: THE SERGE RWANDA EMERGENCY NORMALIZATION PLAN. THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT HAS STILL NOT SECURED FUNDS TO PAY SALARIES TO ITS MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF AND TO REPAIR INFRASTRUCTURE SUCH AS ELECTRICITY. THE ABILITY OF THE GOVERNMENT TO PAY ITS MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF AND TO PROVIDE BASIC UTILITIES SUCH AS ELECTRICITY TO ITS CITIZENS IS VITAL TO ITS CREDIBILITY AND STABILITY AND TO THE STABILITY OF THE COUNTRY AS A WHOLE. ALTHOUGH SEVERAL BILATERAL DONOR COUNTRIES HAVE BEGUN EFFORTS TO REPAIR THE ELECTRICAL POWER GRID IN RWANDA, IT REMAINS TO BE SEEN IF A PERMANENT AND COMPLETE RESTORATION WILL BE ACHIEVED. UNAMIR CONTINUES TO WORK WITH U.N. AGENCIES TO FOCUS EFFORTS AND PRIORITY PROJECTS INVOLVING BUDGETARY ASSISTANCE TO THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND A UNAMIR RADIO. NO PROGRESS HAS YET BEEN MADE ON DE-MINING. THOUGH THESE OFFERS ARE ENCOURAGING, THEY REPRESENT, IN SOME INSTANCES, A PIECE-MEAL APPROACH AND IT REMAINS TO BE SEEN HOW QUICKLY AND COMPLETELY THE FUNDING WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE. IN ADDITION, THE STATUS OF THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS SHOULD BE NOTED:

(A) RWANDA'S REPRESENTATION IN THE UN SECURITY COUNCIL: RWANDA HAS RESUMED ITS SEAT IN THE UN AND IN THE UN SECURITY COUNCIL.

(B) HOSPITALS: COMPLETED HOSPITALS ARE FUNCTIONING ADEQUATELY IN RWANDA. EMERGENCY MEDICAL NEEDS ARE BEING MET; LONG-TERM, ON-GOING HEALTH PROJECTS WILL BE PURSUED.

(C) AIRPORT: THE GOVERNMENT HAS NAMED AN AIRPORT DIRECTOR WHO WORKS IN CLOSE

COORDINATION WITH UNAMIR. UNDP WILL FINANCE 10 UN VOLUNTEERS WHO WILL SERVE AS AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS. THESE UNV'S WILL BEGIN ARRIVING WITHIN A WEEK. THERE IS STILL A NEED TO IMPROVE THE FIRE-FIGHTING CAPABILITY AT THE AIRPORT, AND UNDP, AS THE LEAD UN AGENCY FOR THE REHABILITATION OF THE AIRPORT, IS WORKING TO MEET THESE NEEDS. UNDP IS ALSO PROVIDING US\$ 245,000 TO FINANCE THE UNVS AND ALSO TO PAY RWANDESE LOCAL SALARIES.

(2) POLITICAL:

(A) THE GOVERNMENT'S INSTALLATION OF CIVILIAN AND MILITARY AUTHORITIES IN SECTOR 4. ON 6 SEPTEMBER, THE GOVERNMENT DISPATCHED A PREFECT, ACCOMPANIED BY TWO TEAMS OF MILOBS AND AN RPA PLATOON OF ABOUT 30, TO KIBUYE, GIKONGORO AND CYANGUGU TO TAKE UP DUTIES. THIS ENDEAVOUR WAS CONSTRUCTIVE AND SUCCESSFUL. PARALLEL TO THIS, THE GOVERNMENT HAS GRADUALLY DEPLOYED TROOPS IN SECTOR 4 WHICH HAS ALSO PROCEEDED SMOOTHLY.

(B) PLAN TO DISARM AND FACILITATE INTEGRATION OF FCF-INSTALLED GENDARMERIE. ONE CATEGORY OF GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 4, WHICH WAS PUT IN PLACE, ARMED AND LEFT BEHIND BY THE FRENCH WAS STILL ACTIVE IN SECTOR 4-C. THE GOVERNMENT, WHICH CONSIDERED THEM ILLEGITIMATE, REQUESTED THAT THEY BE DISARMED. THAT PROCESS HAS BEGUN IN THE FORM OF A VOLUNTARY SURRENDER OF ARMS IN KIBUYE, GIKONGORO AND CYANGUGU. THUS FAR, OVER 500 WEAPONS HAVE BEEN SURRENDERED AND REGISTERED, MOSTLY AT THE CYANGUGU CENTRE, WITH ICRC REPRESENTATIVES PRESENT, AND A NUMBER OF THESE GENDARMES HAVE ACCEPTED TO BE INTEGRATED INTO THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE. THE GENDARMES, WHEN REQUESTED BY UNAMIR, HAVE SURRENDERED THEIR ARMS PEACEFULLY.

(C) MILITARY LONG-TERM (PLAN TO SCREEN AND INTEGRATE COMMUNAL POLICE IN SECTOR 4). THE SECOND CATEGORY, THE COMMUNAL POLICE, WERE ELECTED BY THE PEOPLE IN THEIR COMMUNES AND ARMED BY THE FRENCH. THEY ARE DEPLOYED IN 4A, 4B AND 4C. THE POPULATION SEEMS TO BE COMFORTABLE WITH THIS SECOND CATEGORY SINCE THEY THEMSELVES CHOSE THEM. UNAMIR HAS ASKED THE GOVERNMENT TO DISPATCH A POLICE ADMINISTRATOR TO KIBUYE, GIKONGORO AND CYANGUGU TO SCREEN, AND HOPEFULLY, INTEGRATE

THEM AND LEAVE THEM IN PLACE AS PART OF THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE. THE GOVERNMENT WOULD SANCTION THEM AS SUCH AND PROVIDE THEM WITH AN OFFICIAL UNIFORM AND FORM OF IDENTITY. UNCIVPOL HAS BEEN ASKED TO SEND AT LEAST ONE CIVPOL TO ACCOMPANY THE GOVERNMENT POLICE ADMINISTRATOR AND TO SUPERVISE THE SCREENING OF THE COMMUNAL POLICE AND THE ISSUANCE OF CREDENTIALS. THESE CIVPOL REPRESENTATIVES WOULD THEN REPORT BACK TO HEADQUARTERS. THE CIVPOL REPRESENTATIVES WOULD ALSO CONDUCT AN INTENSIVE TRAINING PROGRAMME TO INDUCT THE COMMUNAL POLICE, AND SERVE AS ADVISORS AS NECESSARY. THE DISPATCH OF THESE SCREENING TEAMS HAS BEEN DELAYED DUE TO A LACK OF VEHICLES. THE CHIEF OF STAFF OF THE RWANDESE GENDARMERIE HAS MADE A REQUEST FOR THE TRAINING OF 6,000 GENDARMES. THE UNAMIR CIVPOL COMMISSIONNER, IN RESPONSE, ASKED THAT THE GOVERNMENT SUBMIT A FORMAL REQUEST. THE THEORETICAL PHASE OF THE CURRENT GENDARMERIE TRAINING OF 103 STUDENTS HAS BEEN COMPLETED. THE PRACTICAL PHASE, WHICH WILL LAST ONE WEEK, WILL BEGIN NEXT WEEK. IN TWO WEEKS, THE CANDIDATES WILL HAVE COMPLETED THEIR TRAINING AND WILL BE READY FOR SERVICE.

(D) THE ROLE OF ZAIRE. THE GOVERNMENT OF ZAIRE, ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS, HAS SAID THE FOLLOWING:

I. ZAIREAN TERRITORY WILL NOT BE USED TO DE-STABILIZE RWANDA.

II. ZAIRE WILL FACILITATE THE RETURN OF REFUGEES.

DESPITE THESE ASSURANCES, UNAMIR CONTINUES TO RECEIVE REPORTS OF BANDITRY, EXTORTION AND INTIMIDATION IN REFUGEE CAMPS IN GOMA BY ZAIREAN SOLDIERS, EX-RGF ELEMENTS AND OTHER EXTREMIST ELEMENTS. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU HAS ASKED UNHCR TO DO ALL IT CAN TO CURB THE INTIMIDATION AND BANDITRY IN THE CAMPS, HOWEVER, UNHCR IS NOT MANDATED TO PROVIDE SECURITY IN THIS MANNER. THE SRSG'S MISSION TO ZAIRE AND TANZANIA PRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESULTS, IN ZAIRE, IT WAS AGREED THAT TEAMS COMPRISING REPRESENTATIVES OF UNAMIR, THE ZAIREAN GOVERNMENT AND UNHCR, WILL VISIT ZAIRE, HOPEFULLY IN THE COMING WEEK, TO

IDENTIFY POTENTIAL SITES FOR THE RELOCATION OF RGF SOLDIERS. THESE TEAMS WOULD ALSO MAKE AN ASSESSMENT OF LOGISTICAL AND FINANCIAL REQUIREMENTS. THE ZAIREAN PRESIDENT ALSO WAS RECEPTIVE TO THE SUGGESTION OF UNAMIR SECURITY IN THE CAMPS. IN TANZANIA, THE SRSG HELD PARALLEL DISCUSSIONS WITH PRESIDENT MWINYI REGARDING THE CAMPS IN HIS COUNTRY. THE PRESIDENT ANSWERED THAT HE WOULD STUDY THE QUESTION AND CONSULT MEMBERS OF HIS CABINET BEFORE GIVING HIS RESPONSE.

(E) POLITICAL RECONCILIATION. POLITICAL RECONCILIATION IS THE MOST IMPORTANT ELEMENT IN A DURABLE SOLUTION FOR PEACE IN RWANDA. HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS, RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT, AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A POLICE FORCE TO MAINTAIN SECURITY CAN ONLY PROVIDE LIMITED STABILITY TO RWANDA. SOME LEADERS OF THE FORMER REGIME ARE STILL ACTIVE IN THE BORDER AREAS OF ZAIRE, AND RUMORS CONTINUE THAT SOME ELEMENTS ARE REPORTEDLY PLANNING BORDER INCURSIONS AND GUERRILLA ACTIVITY. THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT MUST MAKE EFFORTS AT RECONCILIATION AND TO STIMULATE THE RETURN OF ALL REFUGEES. SUCH EFFORTS MIGHT BE LONG, ARDUOUS AND WOULD REQUIRE CONCERTED EFFORTS BY THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY AND THE UNITED NATIONS, HOWEVER, THIS PROCESS IS VITAL TO ANY DURABLE SOLUTION IN RWANDA.

3. MILITARY

A. FACCTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA. RPA HAS BEEN VERY ACTIVE MANNING CHECK PTS AND CONDUCTING DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS. 17 RPA VEHs CONVEYING TPS ENTERED SECTOR 4 WITHOUT MILOB ESCORT AND REFUSED TO STOP AT UN CHECK PTS. RPA SOLDIERS FIRED 20 RDS IN THE AIR AROUND RUSIZI AND ZAIRIAN SOLDIERS FIRED FEW RDS IN RESPONSE. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED FROM BOTH SIDES. MILOB TEAM FROM KIBUYE REPORTED A LARGE NUMBER OF RPA SOLDIERS TRAVELLING ON FOOT FROM SECTOR 3 TOWARDS SECTOR 4B. SOME DID NOT WEAR UNIFORMS AND OTHERS DID NOT CARRY WPNS. RPA DEPLOYED APPROX ONE BN IN SECTOR 4B. AT BUGARAMA AND KANEMBE RPA TPS CARRIED OUT PATROLLING TO WIN THE CONFIDENCE OF THE LOCALS. RPA ALSO ESTB CHECK PTS AT GR 383736, 393736, 397740, 2670, 2662, 1656 AND 1858. THEY ALSO PROVIDED SECURITY FOR THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE. RPA PL OF 58 MEN UNDER A CAPTAIN ARE NOW DEPLOYED AT FRAFBATT LOC IN MWENDO. OTHER TROOPS ARE DEPLOYED AROUND GATARE, NYMASHIEKE AND ROAD JUNCTION BUTARE/GIKONGORO.

THEY CONDUCTED RECCE AT GIFUNZO AND LAKE KIVU AREAS. CHIEF OF STAFF COLONEL SAM KAKA VISITED FRANCOPHONE AFRICAN CONTINGENT COMMANDER IN KIBUYE. THE VISIT WAS UNANNOUNCED BUT CORDIAL. ONE FORMER MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT MR RUCHAGU BONIFACE WAS ARRESTED ON 15 SEP 94 AND HIS WHEREABOUT IS NOT YET KNOWN. THEY HAVE DEPLOYED A COY EACH AT KITABI AND NSHILI. RPA HELD A MEETING IN NYARUSHISHI REFUGEE CAMP IN SECTOR 4C TO ADVISE REFUGEES TO REFRAIN FROM DISCRIMINATING AGAINST EACH OTHER ON ETHNIC LINES.

(2) REF. UNCONFIRMED REPORTS INDICATE THAT RGF SOLDIERS ARE TRYING TO BUY UNAMIR INSIGNIA, HEAD GEAR AND UNIFORMS FROM UN PERS FOR POSSIBLE FUTURE INSURGENT ACTIVITIES. RGF SURRENDERED 4 WPNS 1 X SMALL ARMS, 30 RDS AMMO AND ONE DUMMY PISTOL. FIRED SIX SHOTS FROM THEIR POSITION IN ZAIRE.

(3) MILITIA. A SECTION OF LOCALS IN GIKONGORO BELIEVE THAT ELMS OF INTERAHAMWE WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE MURDER OF 5 PERS DRESSED IN UNIFORMS TO IMPLICATE RPA.

B. ONE ACTIVITIES

(1) UNAMIR. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED. SRSG AND DFC MET PRESIDENT MOBUTO AT GRADALOTE AND HELD CONSTRUCTIVE DISCUSSIONS ON THE ISSUE OF SECURITY FOR RWANDESE NATIONALS IN REFUGEE CAMPS IN ZAIRE. FC HELD WEEKLY COORDINATION MEETING WITH HIS SECTOR COMMANDERS TO REVIEW THE OVERALL SIT IN RWANDA. FC VISITED ORPHANAGE AND DISPLACED PERS IN KABGAYI-GITARAMA AREAS, UNMO HQ IN KIBUYE AND 2 PD AMB LOC IN MUTARA. FC MET MR PRU BUSHNELL UNDER SECRETARY OF UNITED STATES AND BRIG GEN OF US ARMY. DFC VISITED GHANBATT TROOPS IN GIKONGORO. HE ALSO VISITED RAMERA BORDER AND REFUGEE CAMP AT BUSENSI.

(2) UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. ALL THREE HEL WERE OPERATIONAL AND CONTINUED TO SUPPORT UNAMIR OPERATIONS FROM KIA. DETAILS OF RWANDA-UGANDA BORDER CROSSING WERE AS FOLLOWS:

(A) UGANDA TO RWANDA

MILOB TEAMS PATROLLED ALONG BURUNDI AND TANZANIA BORDER TO MONITOR THE FLOW OF REFUGEES. A GRAVE CONTAINING 2 BODIES WAS DISCOVERED BY ICRC NEAR SAVE CHURCH GR 7411 AND A MILOB TEAM SENT TO THE AREA WAS REFUSED PASSAGE BY LOCAL RPA PERSONNEL. A PTL IN SECTOR 1 DISCOVERED THE FOLLOWING, UNEXPLODED ORDNANCE DEVICES AT KINJOJO GR 172123, 3 CLAYMORE MINES, 1 ANTI-PERSONNEL MINE, 6 MORTAR BOMBS, 5 HAND GRENADES AND 2 RIFLES. GENERAL SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY WAS REPORTEDLY CALM.

(4) GHAMBATT. SIT IN THE AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT DAY AND NIGHT PTLs AND INTERACTION WITH LOCAL POPULATION. PROVIDED GUARD AT CENTRE DE SANTE, AICF WAREHOUSE AND SECURITY AT RELIEF DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AT CYANIKA. CONTINUED TO CONTROL PERMANENT CHECK PTS AT GIKONGORO, RURAMA, RWANIKO AND KITABI. DEPLOYED ONE SECTION MBCH EACH AT MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES. PROVIDED SY AND SUPERVISED RELIEF DISTRIBUTION AT KIBERO AND NDAGO. THE INF PL CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT SY AND GD DUTIES IN BOTH KIGALI AND KITABI, ALONG WITH PRIMARY MED ASSISTANCE IN THE DP CAMPS AND CONVOY ESCORT. PROVIDED A CONVOY TO RESUPPLY FRAFATT. 454 REFUGEES WERE MOVED BY IOM TRUCKS FROM GISENYI TO 2 CDN PD AMB AT RUHengeri. THE SIGS DET ASSISTED WITH THE FIXING OF THE AUSTRALIA RATEL INTERNAL PHONE SYSTEM. THEY HAVE ALSO ASSISTED IN THE REPAIR AND MAINT OF 2AMBATT 5 RADIOS. THE SRSG AND DFC TRAVELLED TO ZAIRE TO DISCUSS WITH THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES ON MATTERS RELATED TO REFUGEE SITUATION IN THAT COUNTRY. CONTINUED TO COORDINATE SECURITY AND ADMINISTRATION WITH THE GOVT AS TROOPS AND LOCAL ADMINISTRATORS DEPLOY IN SECTOR 4.

The Office of the Resident Coordinator of the United Nations Systems for Development Activities in Uganda presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Uganda and wishes to refer to the latter's note verbale XC 1234 dated July 22, 1994 with regards to clearing charges for the UNOMUR helicopters in Entebbe.

Our UN office of Legal Affairs in New York that we have contacted regarding this issue, has brought to our attention that the clearing charges made on our behalf by Cargolux Uganda Limited, are by definition not charges for the use of public purposes but are a tax for the processing of documents allowing the UN aircrafts to enter Uganda.

Accordingly, the UN is exempt from clearing charges and the exemptions continues to be valid regardless of whether the clearing charges are imposed directly on the UN or indirectly upon an operator performing services for the United Nations. In view of the above, it is highly recommended that the Government of Uganda resolve this issue on the basis of the convention on the privileges and immunities of the United Nations.

In addition, following the agreement signed between the United Nations and the Government of Uganda, the host country makes such additional concessions to the UN as part of its obligations to contribute towards the UN Peacekeeping Operation. Enclosed, are attached copies of two letters on this issue emanating from the office of the United Nations Secretary-General and your Permanent Representative to the United Nations.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE GENERAL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS CALM. LIFE IN THE CAPITAL HAS ALMOST ASSUMED NORMALCY. WATER AND ELECTRICITY HAS BEEN RESTORED IN SOME PARTS OF THE CITY. RPA DEPLOYMENT IN SECTOR 4 CONTINUED. UNAMIR MAINTAINING SECURITY IN SECTOR 4 AND COORDINATING THE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY TRANSITION. HOWEVER RPA NOW PUTTING RESTRICTIONS ON UNAMIR TROOP DEPLOYMENT AND MOVEMENTS IN SECTORS 1, 2, 3 AND 5 CONTRARY TO UNAMIR MANDATE. REFUGEES AND DISPLACED PERS RETURNING DAILY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NTR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RPA. RPA'S CHIEF OF STAFF COLONEL SAM KAKA VISITED FRANCOPHONE AFRICAN CONTINGENT COMMANDER IN KIBUYE. THE VISIT WAS UNANNOUNCED BUT CORDIAL. RPA ARRESTED ONE FORMER MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT MR RUCHAGU BONIFACE ON 15 SEP 94. HIS WHEREABOUT IS NOT YET KNOWN. RPA CONSOLIDATING POSITIONS AND SHOWING PRESENCE IN THE CYANGUGU AND KIBUYE AREAS BY INTENSIVE FOOT AND MOBILE PTLs. B. RGE. INFORMATION REVEALED THAT RGF SOLDIERS ARE TRYING TO BUY UNAMIR INSIGNIA, HEAD GEAR AND UNIFORMS FROM UN PERSONNEL FOR POSSIBLE FUTURE INSURGENT ACTIVITIES.

C. MILITIA. NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED. FC HELD STAFF BRIEF AT 0800 HRS. FC MET MR. PRU BUSHNELL UNDER SECRETARY OF UNITED STATE AND BRIG GEN GERALD OF US ARMY.

B. UNOMUR. GEN SIT IS CALM IN SECTOR. ALL THREE HEL WERE POSITIONED AT KIGALI. BORDER CROSSING WERE AS FOLLOWS:

(1) FROM UGANDA TO RWANDA. 140 VEHs CROSSED THE

BORDER THROUGH CYANIKA, KATUNA AND MERAMA HILLS WITH 1018 PASSENGERS.

RPA SAID ROADS HAVE TO BE CLEARED OF MINES BEFORE UNAMIR PERS ALLOWED UNRESTRICTED MOVEMENT IN THE AREA. 250 RETURNEES WERE TPT FROM GISENYI TO KIGALI. MILOBs IN KIGALI ESCORTED SWISS MISSIONARIES TO GISOVU AREA.

E. BRITCON. MED SECTION VISITED CAMPS 106 AND 107, ONE PST PROCEDURE WAS PERFORMED AT AO2 AND THREE POST OP PATIENTS WERE RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES IN KIBEHO CAMP FROM KIGEME HOSP. CONTINUING WORK AT THE KIBEHO AND KIGEME ORPHANAGES, ENGR SP CONTINUES ON THE MUKONO CLINIC AND THE BRICK CONSTRUCTION ON THE MORGUE AT THE AUS FD HOSP IS NOW COMPLETED. A BRIDGE HAS BEEN REPAIRED ON THE ROAD TO CAMP 4A21. A WATER POINT AT KIBEHO IS STILL BEING SET UP AND RAN BY ELEMENTS OF BRITCON ENGR AND ALL PARTS TO THE BAILEY BRIDGE IN KIGALI HAVE BEEN LOCATED. EOD HAVE DISPOSED OF THE VARIOUS TYPES OF UNUSABLE AMMO AT KIGALI AIRPORT. A TS 50 MINE LOCATED TO THE SOUTH OF KIGALI AIRPORT HAS BEEN DISPOSED OFF. WKSP PERSONNEL CONTINUED TO GIVE 'ES' TO NUNS AT THE MISSION OF CHARITY CONVENT. CONVOY TASKS IN THE LAST 24 HRS WERE AS FOLLOWS:

SDS RUM HAS BEEN ESTB TO ENSURE THE EXTENSION OF RTT SERVICES TO ALL UN AGENCIES IN KIGALI. INMARSAT AT 4C IS DOWN, N/S UNITS BEING BROUGHT BACK TO KIGALI WITH DP RUM. BUTARE'S INMARSAT-B WILL BE MOVED TO CYANGUGU DURING NEXT REPORTING PERIOD. ALL SYSTEMS ARE OPERATIONAL AT ALL SECT HQ LESS INMARSAT 4C. SP TO UNAMIR HQ AND TAC HQ CONTINUED. 

DUE TO URGENT REQUIREMENT OF OBSERVERS IN RWANDA, WE REQUIRED THESE OFFICERS TO BE REDEPLOYED TO UNAMIR BY 23 AUGUST 1994, AS MENTIONED IN OUR ABOVE REFERRED FAX. DUE TO SOME DELAY IN IN THEIR TRANSFER, THEY COULD NOT BE REDEPLOYED AS PER THE ABOVE MENTIONED SCHEDULE. NOW WE HAVE ALREADY REACHED THE AUTHORIZED STRENGTH RATHER EXCEEDED THE LIMIT. THE FORCE COMMANDER UNAMIR HAS ALSO ASKED US TO STOP FURTHER INDUCTION.

2. IN VIEW OF THE ABOVE IT WAS DECIDED NOT TO TRANSFER THE BOTSWANIAN MILITARY OBSERVERS FROM UNOMUR TO UNAMIR. SINCE UNOMUR IS COMPLETING ITS MANDATE ON 31 SEPTEMBER 1994 AND OBSERVERS HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED THEIR ONE YEAR TOUR OF DUTY, THEY WILL BE REPATRIATED TO HOME COUNTRY ON CLOSURE OF UNOMUR AROUND 22/23 SEPTEMBER 1994.

3. WE APPRECIATE BOTSWANIAN RESPONSE FOR TRANSFER OF THE ABOVE MENTIONED OBSERVERS WHICH COULD NOT BE EXECUTED DUE TO REASONS BEYOND OUR CONTROL.

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 05 SEP TO 11 SEP 94.

1. HIGH LIGHTS. THE GENERAL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUED TO REMAIN CALM. LIFE IN KIGALI IS STEADILY IMPROVING. MOST OF THE SHOPS, HOTELS AND BUSINESS CENTRES HAVE STARTED FUNCTIONING. DISPLACED PERS AND REFUGEES CONTINUED TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES. SEVERAL ACTS OF BANDITRY AND ALLEGED MURDERS WERE REPORTED IN SECTOR 4. THE THREAT OF MINES CONTINUE TO EXIST IN KIGALI AND EOD CONTINUE TO DESTROY ALL UNEXPLODED ORDNANCE THAT ARE DISCOVERED. TUNISIAN ADV PARTY ARRIVED IN KIGALI. MR. CLARENCE WHO IS CHIEF OF HUMAN RIGHTS ARRIVED IN KIGALI AND MET WITH SRSG. RPA COMMENCED TO DEPLOY IN KIBUYE, CYANGUGU AND GIKONGORO.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. HIGHLIGHTS. THIS WEEK, UNAMIR FOCUSED ON MAINTAINING SECURITY IN SECTOR 4 AND COORDINATING THE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY TRANSITION FROM UNAMIR TO RWANDESE GOVERNMENT CONTROL; AND PROVIDING SUPPORT FOR HUMANITARIAN RELIEF OPERATIONS IN THE COUNTRY. IN ADDITION, THE FOLLOWING VISITS AND EVENTS WERE OF SIGNIFICANCE:

(1) ON 4 SEPTEMBER, THE SRSG AND SEVERAL OF HIS STAFF TRAVELLED TO KABALE TO MEET WITH UNOMUR OFFICIALS TO PLAN THE CLOSING CEREMONY OF UNOMUR TO BE HELD ON 20 SEPTEMBER.

(2) WITH THE AWARD OF A WORLD BANK \$20 MILLION GRANT TO UN AGENCIES FOR PROJECTS IN RWANDA, THE SRSG WORKED TO FOCUS THE EFFORTS OF THE BANK AND OF THE UN AGENCIES ON THE COMMON-SENSE PRIORITIES OUTLINED IN THE RENP, NAMELY: A) BUDGETARY ASSISTANCE TO THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT; B) THE REPAIR OF THE ELECTRICAL POWER GRID; C) DE-MINING AND D) THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INDEPENDENT UNAMIR RADIO.

(3) ON 8 SEPTEMBER, THE SRSG AND THE FORCE COMMANDER RECEIVED THE VISIT OF A JAPANESE GOVERNMENT DELEGATION. THE SRSG ASKED FOR JAPANESE ASSISTANCE WITH THE RENP PRIORITY PROJECTS.

(4) ON 9 SEPTEMBER, UNAMIR RECEIVED THE VISIT OF MR. JAMES GRANT, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF UNICEF. THE SRSG MET WITH MR. GRANT AND OTHER UNICEF OFFICIALS DURING HIS VISIT TO DISCUSS THE POSSIBILITY OF FUNDING URGENT RATHER THAN LONG-TERM PROJECTS.

(5) ON 11 SEPTEMBER, AMBASSADOR DILLON'S DELEGATION ARRIVED TO DISCUSS WITH UNAMIR OFFICIALS A REGIONAL APPROACH TO THE RWANDESE SITUATION.

B. IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN SECURITY AND COORDINATE THE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY TRANSITION IN SECTOR 4 AND CONTRIBUTE TO THE OVERALL STABILITY OF RWANDA, THE FOLLOWING FACTORS AND INITIATIVES WERE VITAL:

(1) RELIEF AND DEVELOPMENT / RESP: THE SERGE RWANDA EMERGENCY NORMALIZATION PLAN. THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT HAS STILL NOT SECURED FUNDS TO PAY SALARIES TO ITS MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF, AND TO REPAIR INFRASTRUCTURE SUCH AS ELECTRICITY. THE ABILITY OF THE GOVERNMENT TO PAY ITS MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF AND TO PROVIDE BASIC UTILITIES SUCH AS ELECTRICITY TO ITS CITIZENS IS VITAL TO ITS CREDIBILITY AND STABILITY AND TO THE STABILITY OF THE COUNTRY AS A WHOLE. SEVERAL U.N. AGENCIES, HAVING RECEIVED GRANTS FROM THE WORLD BANK, HAVE SUGGESTED A WILLINGNESS TO CONTRIBUTE TO PROJECTS INVOLVING: A) BUDGETARY ASSISTANCE TO THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT; AND B) A UNAMIR RADIO. NO PROGRESS OR DECISIONS HAVE BEEN MADE ON DE-MINING. ACCORDING TO THE WORLD BANK, THE EUROPEAN UNION HAS REPORTEDLY OFFERED TO FINANCE THE \$2 MILLION USD ELECTRICITY PROJECT. THOUGH THESE OFFERS ARE ENCOURAGING, THEY REPRESENT, IN SOME INSTANCES, A PIECE-MEAL APPROACH AND IT REMAINS TO BE SEEN HOW QUICKLY AND COMPLETELY THE FUNDING WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE. IN ADDITION, THE STATUS OF THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS SHOULD BE NOTED:

(A) HOSPITALS: COMPLETED HOSPITALS ARE FUNCTIONING ADEQUATELY IN RWANDA. EMERGENCY MEDICAL NEEDS ARE BEING MET; LONG-TERM, ON-GOING HEALTH PROJECTS WILL BE PURSUED.

(B) AIRPORT: THE GOVERNMENT HAS NAMED AN AIRPORT DIRECTOR WHO WORKS IN CLOSE COORDINATION WITH UNAMIR. UNDP WILL FINANCE 20-27 UN VOLUNTEERS WHO WILL SERVE AS AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND CUSTOMS OFFICIALS. THESE UNV'S WILL BEGIN ARRIVING WITHIN A WEEK. THERE IS STILL A NEED TO IMPROVE THE FIRE-FIGHTING CAPABILITY AT THE AIRPORT, AND ACTIVE EFFORTS IN THIS REGARD ARE IN PROGRESS.

(2) POLITICAL/INTEGRATION:

(A) THE GOVERNMENT'S INSTALLATION OF CIVILIAN AND MILITARY AUTHORITIES IN SECTOR 4. DURING THE PERIOD UNDER REVIEW, THE GOVERNMENT DISPATCHED PREFECTS TO KIBUYE, GIKONGORO AND CYANGUGU TO TAKE UP DUTIES. PARALLEL TO THIS, THE GOVERNMENT HAS GRADUALLY DEPLOYED 210 RPA TROOPS IN SECTOR 4A, APPROXIMATELY 100 TROOPS IN SECTOR 4B AND 191 TROOPS IN SECTOR 4C.

(B) PLAN TO DISARM AND FACILITATE INTEGRATION OF FCT-INSTALLED GENDARMERIE: THE FIRST CATEGORY OF

GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 4, WHICH WAS PUT IN PLACE, ARMED AND LEFT BEHIND BY THE FRENCH IS CURRENTLY ONLY IN SECTOR 4C. THE GOVERNMENT CONSIDERS THEM ILLEGITIMATE AND HAS REQUESTED THAT THEY BE DISARMED. THAT PROCESS HAS BEGUN IN THE FORM OF A VOLUNTARY SURRENDER OF ARMS IN KIBUYE, GIKONGORO AND CYANGUGU. THUS FAR, OVER 500 WEAPONS HAVE BEEN SURRENDERED AND REGISTERED, MOSTLY AT THE CYANGUGU CENTRE, WITH ICRC REPRESENTATIVES PRESENT, AND A NUMBER OF THESE GENDARMES HAVE ACCEPTED TO BE INTEGRATED INTO THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE.

(C) PLAN TO SCREEN AND INTEGRATE COMMUNAL POLICE IN SECTOR 4. THE SECOND CATEGORY, THE COMMUNAL POLICE, WERE ELECTED BY THE PEOPLE IN THEIR COMMUNES AND ARMED BY THE FRENCH. THEY ARE DEPLOYED IN 4A, 4B AND 4C. THE POPULATION SEEMS TO BE COMFORTABLE WITH THIS SECOND CATEGORY SINCE THEY THEMSELVES CHOSE THEM. UNAMIR HAS ASKED THE GOVERNMENT TO DISPATCH A POLICE ADMINISTRATOR TO KIBUYE, GIKONGORO AND CYANGUGU TO SCREEN, AND HOPEFULLY, INTEGRATE THEM AND LEAVE THEM IN PLACE AS PART OF THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE. THE GOVERNMENT WOULD SANCTION THEM AS SUCH AND PROVIDE THEM WITH AN OFFICIAL UNIFORM AND FORM OF IDENTITY. UNCIVPOL HAS BEEN ASKED TO SEND AT LEAST ONE CIVPOL TO ACCOMPANY THE GOVERNMENT POLICE ADMINISTRATOR AND TO SUPERVISE THE SCREENING OF THE COMMUNAL POLICE AND THE ISSUANCE OF CREDENTIALS. THESE CIVPOL REPRESENTATIVES WOULD THEN REPORT BACK TO HEADQUARTERS. THE CIVPOL REPRESENTATIVES WOULD ALSO CONDUCT AN INTENSIVE TRAINING PROGRAMME TO INDUCT THE COMMUNAL POLICE, AND SERVE AS ADVISORS AS NECESSARY. THE DISPATCH OF THESE SCREENING TEAMS WILL BEGIN THIS WEEK.

(D) THE ROLE OF ZAIRE. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THERE ARE AS MANY AS 10,000 EX-RGF MEMBERS IN ZAIRE ACROSS THE BORDER FROM CYANGUGU. THEY ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE CROSSED INTO ZAIRE WITH APPROXIMATELY 50% OF THEIR WEAPONS. THERE ARE ALSO REPORTS OF MILITARY-AGED MALES CROSSING THE BORDER WITH LARGE SUPPLIES OF RATIONS, WATER AND ARMS. THE GOVERNMENT OF ZAIRE, ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS, HAS SAID THE FOLLOWING:

I. ZAIRIAN TERRITORY WILL NOT BE USED TO DESTABILIZE RWANDA.

II. ZAIRE WILL FACILITATE THE RETURN OF REFUGEES.

DESPITE THESE ASSURANCES, UNAMIR CONTINUES TO RECEIVE REPORTS OF BANDITRY, EXTORTION AND

INTIMIDATION IN REFUGEE CAMPS IN GOMA BY ZAIRIAN SOLDIERS, EX-ARPF ELEMENTS AND OTHER EXTREMIST ELEMENTS. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU HAS ASKED UNHCR TO DO ALL IT CAN TO CURB THE INTIMIDATION AND BANDITRY IN THE CAMPS, HOWEVER, UNHCR IS NOT MANDATED TO PROVIDE SECURITY IN THIS MANNER. THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES HAVE ALSO BEEN ASKED BY SEVERAL U.N. OFFICIALS TO MAKE EFFORTS IN THIS REGARD, HOWEVER, THE SITUATION HAS NOT IMPROVED. THE SRSG HAS THEREFORE BEEN REQUESTED BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL TO UNDERTAKE A MISSION TO ZAIRE, IN CONJUNCTION WITH UNHCR AND DHA TO ASSESS THE CURRENT SITUATION IN ZAIRE AND TO ADDRESS THESE CONCERNS DIRECTLY WITH THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES. THIS MISSION IS CURRENTLY IN PROGRESS.

(E) POLITICAL RECONCILIATION: THERE ARE UNCONFIRMED REPORTS THAT BORDER INCURSIONS BY OPPOSITION AND/OR EXTREMIST ELEMENTS ARE INCREASING AND SEEM TO BE DEVELOPING INTO A TREND. THIS MIGHT RAISE EXPECTATIONS FROM THE POPULATION THAT UNAMIR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR COMBATTING OPPOSITION ELEMENTS AND FOR MAINTAINING THE GENERAL SECURITY OF RWANDA. UNAMIR, MILITARILY, CANNOT AND SHOULD NOT DEFEND RWANDA FROM GUERRILLA WARFARE. POLITICAL RECONCILIATION IS PROBABLY THE BEST AND MOST EFFECTIVE WAY TO PREVENT AND/OR CURB GUERRILLA WARFARE. IF TALKS CAN BE CONVENED TO INCLUDE THOSE ELEMENTS IN THE OPPOSITION NOT INVOLVED IN THE GENOCIDE, EVEN THE MOST EXTREME, PERHAPS THE CURRENT GUERRILLA WARFARE ACTIVITY AND THE PERPETUAL CYCLE OF VIOLENCE IN RWANDA COULD BE CURBED. ALSO, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THESE TALKS, THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD CONTINUE ITS EFFORTS TO BE AS BROAD-BASED AND INCLUSIVE AS POSSIBLE IN TERMS OF POTENTIALLY OFFERING GOVERNMENT POSTS TO SOME MEMBERS OF THE MRND, THE FORMER GOVERNMENT POLITICAL PARTY.

3. MILITARY

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS IN KIGALI. RPA ARE NOW DEPLOYED IN GIKONGORO, CYANGUGU AND IN KIBUYE. RPA SEEMS TO HAVE WITHDRAWN THEIR TROOPS FROM NYOVE, KINIHIRA AND TUMA AREAS IN SECTOR, CHECK PTS ALONG THE RD HAVE ALSO BEEN DISMANTLED. RPA REP REMINDED ALL NGOs THAT THEY ARE NOT TO TPT NON NGO OR STAFF IN UN OR NGO VEHs. IF THIS PRACTICE CONTINUED ALL VEHs WILL BE ROUTINELY SEARCHED AT CHECK PTS. RPA WAS ASKED TO ENSURE THAT ALL RPA SOLDIERS WERE INFORMED THAT THEY ARE NOT TO SEEK RIDES IN NGO/UN VEHs. CHILDREN INTERVIEWED AT THE SCENE OF A DOUBLE

MURDER GR 172832 SAID THEY SAW RPA SOLDIERS BEATING THESE PEOPLE WITH BATS. MILOB, HAC AND HUMAN RIGHTS REPS INVESTIGATING. RPA CHARLIE MOBILE FORCE WAS RELIEVED BY BRAVO MOBILE FORCE IN GISENYI. CHARLIE MOBILE FORCE IS LIKELY TO MOVE TO THE SOUTH. ONE UNIT OF CHARLIE MOBILE FORCE WAS DEPLOYED TO RUTSIRO GR 3283. ONE UNIT OF 7TH BN IS DEPLOYED IN KINIGI GR 5540 WHOSE HQ IS IN RUHENGURI.

(2) RGF. RGF TPS CONTINUED TO SURRENDER THEIR WPNS TO UNAMIR IN SECTOR 4. IT HAS BEEN LEARNT FROM A RELIABLE SOURCE THAT RGF SOLDIERS HAD FIRED APPROX 80 RDS SA AMMO FROM THE ZAIRIAN SIDE OF THE BORDER TOWARDS THE POWER STN AT RUSIZI 2. THE AIM OF THIS ATTACK WAS TO DESTROY THE POWER STN. IT IS FEARED THAT WHEN THE RPA IS DEPLOYED IN THE AREA THEY MIGHT RETALIATE TO SUCH ATTACKS AND CREATE SERIOUS INCIDENTS ALONG THE BORDER. RGF ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN A SHOOTING INCIDENT IN CYANGUGU WHERE TEN PERE WERE KILLED AND SOME WERE INJURED. GENDARMERIE AROUND NYAMASHAKI, KIRAMBO AND KANEMBE SURRENDERED TO ETHIOBATT 13 RIFLES, 1,031 RDS AND 10 HAND GRENADES.

(3) MILITIA. ACTS OF BANDITRY ARE CONTINUED TO BE REPORTED IN SECTOR 4. ALLEGED INTERAHAMWE ACTIVITIES HAVE ALSO BEEN REPORTED IN THAT AREA. EIGHT SMALL ARMS, 211 RDS OF AMMUNITION, 12 MAGAZINES AND SOME GRENADES WERE SURRENDERED BY GENDARMERIE AT NYAKABUYE GR 9116 IN SECTOR 4C AREA. TWO GENDARMERIE HAVE SURRENDERED TO UNAMIR AT GISITA. A MAN REPORTED TO KIGALI HOSP WITH A BULLET WOUND IN THE HEAD. HE ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN SHOT BY INTERAHAMWE. ALSO VISITED GITARAMA AND LOCS OF MASS GRAVES IDENTIFIED IN THE AREA. HE ALSO SPOKE TO THE NEWLY ARRIVED MILOBS. DFC VISITED CHK. FC GAVE A BRIEFING TO JAPANESE DELEGATION AT UNAMIR HQ. SRSG AND FC BRIEFED THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND HIS DELEGATION FROM UNICEF. FC AND SRSG MET WITH AMBASSADOR DILLON. DFC VISITED TAC HQ DURING THE PERIOD. UNAMIR TPS DEPLOYED IN VARIOUS SECTORS HAVE CONFISCATED MANY ARMS, GRENADES AND AMMO.

(2) BRITCON. THE BRIDGE AT BYUMBA IS NOW OPEN AND IS BEING TRAFFICKED. THE MSR BETWEEN BYUMBA AND GATUNA AND WITHIN KAGAMBA REGION IS NOW COMPLETED. BRITCON

ENGR CONTINUE TO PROVIDE VARIOUS FORMS OF ESSENTIAL ENGR SP THROUGHOUT THE AOR. 8 TONS OF CSUP WERE DELIVERED TO KITABI. ENGR SECTION HAVE ERECTED A 10,000 LITRE WATER TANK AT KIBEHO, THEY ARE ALSO ESTABLISHING WATER AND SANITATION FACILITIES AND CARRYING OUT MAINT TASKS. BRITCON WKSP CONTINUED TO REPAIR VEHs THOUGH SPARES PROBLEM STILL PERSISTS.

(3) CANSIGS. CANSIGS RESTORED U-CRTTZ AT SECTOR 4 AND NOW WORKING WITH ALL OTHER SECTORS, ALL OTHER SYSTEMS ARE OPERATIONAL AT ALL SECTOR HQs. U-CRTTZ AT TAC HQ IN BUTARE HAS BEEN RE-DEPLOYED TO MILOB HQ IN KIGALI.

(4) AUSMED. AUSMED CONTINUED TO PROVIDE FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD LEVEL MED SUPPORT TO UNAMIR TPS AND CIVILIANS IN RWANDA.

(5) US FORCES. US FORCES CONTINUED TO ASSIST FLIGHT AT KIA IN COORD WITH UNAMIR.

(6) UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION IS CALM. 3 HEL WERE OPERATIONAL. 2 WERE STANDBY AT KIA.

(7) MILOB GP HQ. THE SIT REMAINED CALM IN ALL SECTOR. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND ESCORT DUTIES IN ALL SECTORS. TRG FOR NEWLY ARRIVED MILOBs CONTINUED IN GITARAMA. CMO HELD HIS WEEKLY BRIEFING WITH SECTOR COMDS AND PRINCIPAL STAFF OFFICERS OF MILOB HQ IN CYANGUGU. A ZAIRIAN MILITARY PERS WAS KILLED ON 09 SEP NIGHT. IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE BODY WAS FOUND HANGING FROM A LAMP POST. THE ZAIRIAN OFFICIAL STATED THAT THE MATTER WAS AN INTERNAL AFFAIR OF ZAIRE AND HAD NO BEARING WITH REFUGEES. IN RUKABA A MASS GRAVE YARD WAS DISCOVERED. MORE AND MORE PEOPLE ARE RETURNING HOME AND RE-BUILDING THEIR HOMES. IN MUHURA, THE RPA HAS ESTB A TRG CAMP WHERE 50 RECRUITS WERE FOUND DOING BASIC TRG. ICRC OFFICIALS REPORTED TWO MINE INCIDENT IN KISARO AND RUSHAK, THE INCIDENTS OCCURRED ON 02 AND 07 SEP. ALL FORMER RGF AND GENDARMERIE CAMP IN KIGALI ARE NOW OCCUPIED BY RPA TPS.

4. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO COORDINATE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES IN CLOSE CONSULTATION WITH THE GOVERNMENT AND AID AGENCIES. IOM, UNHCR AND UNAMIR CONTINUED TO PROVIDE TPS FOR DISPLACED PERS FROM VARIOUS SECTORS TO KIGALI AND OTHER DESTINATIONS. THREE RWANDESE WERE ATTACKED ON THE NIGHT OF 10 SEP IN THE AREA OF GR 172832 IN KIGALI. TWO WERE DEAD AND SHOWED EVIDENCE OF HAVING BEEN ATTACKED WITH BATS. ONE SURVIVED AND IS IN THE KING FAISAL HOSP. UN HUMAN RIGHTS REPRESENTATIVES WAS NOTIFIED AND WILL INVESTIGATE..

5. CIVIL AFFAIRS. NTR.

7. CONCLUSION. THE CURRENT SITUATION IN RWANDA IS FAIRLY STABLE. HOWEVER IT IS IMPORTANT THAT THE GOVERNMENT AS PART OF THE POST WAR TRANSITION GRADUALLY BUT FIRMLY TAKE CONTROL OF ITS SOVEREIGN TERRITORY ON BOTH THE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY LEVELS. IN THIS CONNECTION UNAMIR WORKED CLOSELY WITH THE GOVERNMENT TO COORDINATE THIS TRANSITION BOTH IN THE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY LEVEL. IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT THE BCGU RECEIVE SOME FUNDS FOR SALARIES SO THAT IT CAN BUILD AND MAINTAIN ITS INFRASTRUCTURE.

The Legal position vis-a-vis clearing charges for UNOMUR helicopters is made clear in the fax. Put in another way, the position is that under international law the U.N. is exempt from paying taxes. It is our additional view that the phrase "charges which are levied with respect to the use of public utilities..." has to be understood in the context of whether the activity attracting the said charges is of a private nature aimed at profit or leisure. This cannot be said of the U.N. activities in the border region of Uganda-Rwanda. Moreover, as a general practice, member states which are supportive of the peacekeeping process or other similar U.N. operations stationed on their territories have waived such charges as part of their (the states') support for the U.N. peace operations. It follows, therefore, that because the U.N. is in Uganda not in pursuit of private profit or leisure, its activities should not attract the said charges.

If U.N. planes were not granted the free use of both air space and ground facilities it would not be able to discharge its international peacekeeping responsibilities. Therefore if the charges are insisted upon they would amount to a tax on the U.N. in that Canadian Helicopters are performing a task at the request and under the colours of the U.N.

You are therefore requested to vigorously negotiate not only for an end to levying of such charges, but also for a refund of all such charges levied to-date.

In view of the impending closure of UNOMUR on 22/9/94, speed will be of the essence in concluding this matter before that date.

1. The UN Legal Counsel was asked to provide a decision whether Canadian Helicopters, hired and used by UNOMUR, was required to pay clearing charges at Entebbe.
2. Under the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations, the Organization enjoys exemption from taxes generally. The UN while deployed in the Territory of a Member State, the host country makes additional concessions to the UN as part of its obligation to contribute towards the UN Peacekeeping operation.
3. The Legal Counsel provides "In light of the foregoing, clearing charges are by definition not charges for the use of public utility but are a tax for the processing of documents allowing aircraft to enter Uganda. Accordingly the UN is exempt from clearing charges and the exemption continues to be valid regardless of whether the clearing charges are imposed directly on the UN or indirectly upon an operator performing services for the UN."
4. In view of the above, the matter is now between the UNOMUR legal staff and the Government of Uganda to resolve this issue.
5. UNOMUR and UNAMIR are provided a copy of the Legal Counsel's comments (see attached).

Clearing charges for UNOMUR helicopters at Entebbe

1. FOD by its fax OPS/ADM-929 of August 29, 1994 has requested advice from this Office on whether Canadian helicopters hired and used by UNOMUR are required to pay clearing charges at Entebbe.

2. Under the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations, the Organization enjoys exemption from taxes generally. Only as regards charges which are levied with respect to the use of public utilities may the United Nations not claim exemption. This legal position of the United Nations is generally made more favourable for the Organization under the terms of SOPAs or SOMAs, supportive of United Nations peacekeeping or similar other UN operations deployed in the territory of a Member State. In such cases the UN typically, through negotiation secures exemption not only from taxes but also from charges for the use of public utilities. The host country makes such additional concessions to the UN as part of its obligation to contribute towards the UN peacekeeping operation.

3. In light of the foregoing, clearing charges are by definition not charges for the use of public utility but are a tax for the processing of documents allowing aircraft to enter Uganda. Accordingly the UN is exempt from clearing charges and the exemption continues to be valid regardless of whether the clearing charges are imposed directly on the UN or indirectly upon an operator performing services for the UN.
