

SUBJ: CANADIAN PRESS AGENCY NEWS FOR THE CF

ST. JOHNS, NEWFOUNDLAND -- THE THREE POLITICAL PARTIES IN THE NEWFOUNDLAND LEGISLATURE ARE STANDING BEHIND OTTAWA. NOT SURPRISINGLY, MEMBERS UNANIMOUSLY PASSED A RESOLUTION TODAY SUPPORTING CANADAS TOUGH ACTION IN THE TURBOT DISPUTE. PREMIER CLYDE WELLS PRESENTED THE RESOLUTION SUPPORTING DIRECT ACTION AGAINST DESTRUCTIVE FISHING PRACTICES. THE TORY OPPOSITION WILL HAVE ITS CHANCE ON WEDNESDAY. LEADER LEN SIMMS WILL PRESENT A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR OTTAWA TO EXTEND JURISDICTION TO THE NOSE AND TAIL OF THE GRAND BANKS, PLUS THE FLEMISH CAP. THEYRE THE AREAS OF THE GRAND BANKS THAT STRETCH JUST BEYOND CANADAS 200-MILE LIMIT. CANADA USED FORCE TO ARREST A SPANISH TRAWLER FISHING TURBOT IN THOSE INTERNATIONAL WATERS TEN DAYS AGO. HALIFAX -- THE OPPOSITION PARTIES IN NOVA SCOTIA SAY THE CABINET

SHUFFLE WONT HELP THE GOVERNMENTS POLICIES OR ITS SAGGING POPULARITY. FIVE MINISTERS CHANGED DEPARTMENTS, WHILE ONE NEW MINISTER -- VETERAN HALIFAX M-L-A GERALD OMALLEY -- WAS ADDED. N-D-P LEADER JOHN HOLM SAYS THE SHUFFLE ONLY AFFECTS MINOR DEPARTMENTS. HE SAYS THE CHANGES WILL DO NOTHING TO QUELL THE CONTROVERSY OVER CUTS TO HEALTH CARE, EDUCATION, AND OTHER AREAS. HOLM POINTS OUT THERE ARE NO CHANGES IN HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND FINANCE. TORY M-L-A RON RUSSELL SAYS PREMIER JOHN SAVAGE STILL HAS MANY NON-PERFORMERS IN CABINET. HE SAYS THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD HAVE THROWN SOME MINISTERS OUT OF CABINET ALTOGETHER, INSTEAD OF SHUFFLING THEM AROUND.

FREDERICTON -- IT NEEDS A NAME AND A LEADER, BUT A NEW POLITICAL PARTY IS JUST ABOUT READY TO BE BORN IN NEW BRUNSWICK. BRENT TAYLOR, A ONETIME CONFEDERATION OF REGIONS MEMBER WHO NOW SITS AS AN INDEPENDENT IN THE LEGISLATURE, SAYS ABOUT 100 PEOPLE ATTENDED AN INCEPTION MEETING DURING THE WEEKEND IN SUSSEX. HE SAYS MOST WERE MEMBERS OR SUPPORTERS OF THE FEDERAL REFORM PARTY, WHICH HAS DECIDED TO STAY OUT OF PROVINCIAL POLITICS. TAYLOR SAYS ANOTHER MEETING WILL BE HELD IN ABOUT THREE WEEKS TO CHOOSE AN INTERIM LEADER, DRAW UP A PARTY CONSTITUTION AND PICK A NAME. HE SAYS THE INITIAL OBJECTIVE OF THE NEW PARTY IS TO OFFER A POLITICAL HOME FOR WHAT HE SAYS ARE TENS

OF THOUSANDS OF NEW BRUNSWICKERS DISILLUSIONED WITH THE OTHER PARTIES. TAYLOR HELPED FORM THE CONFEDERATION OF REGIONS PARTY IN 1989 BUT LEFT LAST YEAR AFTER A BITTER LEADERSHIP BATTLE WITH DANNY CAMERON.

THE DOLLAR CLOSED AT 71.05 CENTS U-S. THATS UP 23-100THS FROM FRIDAYS CLOSE.

AT 4:15 P.M. EASTERN TIME, THE T-S-E 300 COMPOSITE INDEX WAS UP 21.78 POINTS TO 4249.78. VOLUME WAS 50.28-MILLION SHARES, VALUED AT 548.7-MILLION DOLLARS.

IN NEW YORK, THE DOW JONES INDUSTRIAL AVERAGE CLOSED UP 10.03 POINTS TO 4083.6 ON 304-MILLION SHARES.

THE PRICE OF GOLD CLOSED IN LONDON AT 382 DOLLARS AND 25 CENTS AN OUNCE (538 DOLLARS AND 28 CENTS CANADIAN). THATS DOWN 50 CENTS FROM FRIDAYS CLOSE.

(RAIL STRIKE) THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IS TRYING TO PUSH A BACK-TO-WORK BILL THROUGH PARLIAMENT TO BRING AN END TO THE NATIONAL RAIL STRIKE. OTTAWA DECIDED TO PROCEED WITH LEGISLATION AFTER TALKS BROKE DOWN BETWEEN C-P RAIL AND C-N RAIL AND THEIR UNIONS. LABOR MINISTER LUCIENNE ROBILLARD HAS WARNED THE TWO SIDES THEY MAY NOT LIKE WHAT THEY SEE IN THE BACK-TO-WORK BILL. THE LAW IS EXPECTED TO

BE PASSED BY TOMCROW.

TORONTO -- LIBERAL LEADER LYN MCLEOD IS CHALLENGING PREMIER RAE TO EITHER TABLE A BUDGET OR CALL AN ELECTION. TRADITIONALLY, THIS IS THE DATE THAT THE LEGISLATURE IS RECALLED FOR THE SPRING SESSION. BUT THE NEXT SESSION HAS NOT BEEN CALLED AND FINANCE MINISTER FLOYD LAUGHREN HAS GIVEN ONLY VAGUE INDICATIONS THAT HE WOULD LIKE TO TABLE A BUDGET SOMETIME NEXT MONTH. MCLEOD SAYS THE RAE GOVERNMENT STOPPED GOVERNING A LONG TIME AGO AND HAS STARTED CAMPAIGNING FOR RE-ELECTION. SHE SAYS THE N-D-P GOVERNMENT HAS SPENT MORE THAN 700-MILLION DOLLARS SINCE CHRISTMAS TRYING TO BRIBE VOTERS. MCLEOD ADDS THAT EITHER THE MONEY IS NEW AND UNBUDGETED, OR ITS RECYCLED FUNDING AND A SHAM IN WHICH IT ONLY APPEARS THE GOVERNMENT IS OFFERING NEW PROGRAM MONEY. SHE ACCUSES RAE OF SPENDING LIKE A DRUNKEN SAILOR.

OTTAWA -- ONTARIO TAXPAYERS HAVE SHELLLED OUT ABOUT 25-MILLION DOLLARS OVER THE LAST DECADE ON SPECIAL ALLOWANCES FOR RETIRED PROVINCIAL DEPUTY MINISTERS. TREASURY BOARD PRESIDENT ART EGGLETON SAYS THE ANNUAL PERK IS SIMILAR TO A SPECIAL ALLOWANCE FOR RETIRED FEDERAL DEPUTY MINISTERS. EGGLETON PLEDGED TO REVIEW THE ALLOWANCE AFTER IT WAS REVEALED LAST WEEK. RENEE REDDICK OF ONTARIO'S FINANCE MINISTRY SAYS ABOUT 30 DEPUTY MINISTERS OR THEIR EQUIVALENTS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR

THE ALLOWANCE. REDDICK SAYS THE DEAL HAS COST TAXPAYERS ABOUT TWO-AND-A-HALF-MILLION DOLLARS A YEAR SINCE IT WAS INTRODUCED IN 1985. QUEENS PARK SAYS THE BONUS IS NEEDED TO ATTRACT TOP-QUALITY APPLICANTS FROM THE PRIVATE SECTOR.

EDMONTON -- ALBERTA LIBERALS ARE ACCUSING THE TORIES OF SHOWING THEIR TRUE COLORS DURING THE RECENT CANADA WINTER GAMES. THE MEDIA IS CALLING IT JACKET-GATE. ACCORDING TO THE LIBERALS, THE KLEIN GOVERNMENT SPENT ABOUT 50-THOUSAND DOLLARS TO OUTFIT ALBERTA ATHLETES AT THE GAMES WITH SPECIAL SKI JACKETS. BUT INSTEAD OF THE PROVINCES OFFICIAL COLORS, THE JACKETS CONTAIN BLUE AND ORANGE -- THE COLORS OF THE ALBERTA PROGRESSIVE CONSERVATIVE PARTY. LIBERAL GENE ZWOZDESKY SAYS SOME TORY M-L-AS AND GOVERNMENT STAFF EVEN PICKED UP JACKETS FOR THEMSELVES AT TAXPAYERS EXPENSE. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT MINISTER GARY MAR SAYS HE DOESNT KNOW WHO APPROVED THE JACKETS, WHICH HE ADDS HAVE TURNED OUT TO BE VERY POPULAR.

VICTORIA -- PREMIER MIKE HARCOURT ISNT WORRIED ABOUT A DELAY IN THE COMPLETION OF A CONFLICT INVESTIGATION INVOLVING HIMSELF. CONFLICT COMMISSIONER TED HUGHES WONT BE FINISHED HIS PROBE UNTIL LATE THIS WEEK, INSTEAD OF TOMORROW AS ORIGINALLY THOUGHT. HARCOURT SAYS THERE WOULD ONLY BE A CLOUD OVER HIS HEAD IF PEOPLE WERE PRE-JUDGING THE

OUTCOME OF THE PROBE. BUT HE ADMITS HE WOULD RATHER HAVE HAD THE INVESTIGATION OVER EARLY THIS WEEK INSTEAD OF AFTER THE HOUSE RECONVENES ON WEDNESDAY. HUGHES IS LOOKING INTO HARCOURTS DEALINGS WITH HIS FORMER CAMPAIGN MANAGER, RON JOHNSON, WHO HEADS UP THE NOW COMMUNICATIONS P-R FIRM. NOW HAS BILLED THE B-C GOVERNMENT MORE THAN FIVE MILLION DOLLARS SINCE IT WAS FORMED AFTER THE N-D-P ELECTION WIN IN OCTOBER 1991.

(MBA-BUDGET-DEBATE) WITH DEBATE ON THE MANITOBA BUDGET WRAPPING UP TODAY IN THE LEGISLATURE, THE TALK IS TURNING TO A PROVINCIAL ELECTION. IF PREMIER GARY FILMON CALLS THE VOTE TOMORROW, AN ELECTION COULD BE HELD AS EARLY AS APRIL 25TH. LIBERAL DEPUTY LEADER AVIS GRAY SAYS BOTH HER PARTY AND MANITOBA VOTERS ARE READY FOR AN ELECTION. THE TORYS BUDGET, THE FIRST IN 23 YEARS TO FORECAST BALANCED BOOKS, ALSO PROMISES A BALANCED BUDGET LAW.

(SASK-RAIL-STRIKE-LARSEN) THE HEAD OF THE SASKATCHEWAN WHEAT POOL SAYS NEWS THAT IT COULD BE SEVERAL MORE DAYS BEFORE THE NATIONAL RAIL LABOR DISPUTE IS OVER COMES AS A SHOCK. LEROY LARSEN SAYS HES CONCERNED CANADAS REPUTATION AS A GRAIN EXPORTER COULD BE DAMAGED BY THE ONGOING RAIL DISPUTE. THE OPPOSITION IN THE COMMONS WONT GRANT THE FEDERAL LIBERALS PERMISSION TO INTRODUCE AND PASS BACK-TO-WORK ET

LEGISLATION TODAY. THAT MEANS THE STRIKE-LOCKOUT, WHICH HAS PARALYSED THE RAILWAY SYSTEM, MAY CONTINUE A LITTLE LONGER.

LONDON -- A DIVORCED BRITISH MAN WHO TOOK THE DIVISION OF PROPERTY A STEP TOO FAR -- WITH A CHAIN-SAW AND AXE -- HAS BEEN JAILED FOR 12 MONTHS. GARY BRACE CAUSED MORE THAN 20-THOUSAND-DOLLARS DAMAGE WHEN HE CARVED UP THE FAMILY POSSESSIONS IN HIS EX-WIFES HOME. BRACE CUT THE DINING ROOM TABLE IN HALF, THE BANNISTERS, THE PORCH AND VARIOUS PIECES OF FURNITURE.

(SIMPSON-TRIAL) THE KNUCKLE ON THE MIDDLE FINGER OF O-J SIMPSONS LEFT HAND BECAME THE FOCUS OF HIS DOUBLE MURDER TRIAL TODAY. SIMPSON DISPLAYED HIS FINGER TO THE JURY IN AN ATTEMPT TO SHOW THAT THE KNUCKLE WAS PERMANENTLY SWOLLEN. AT ISSUE IS WHEN SIMPSONS FINGER WAS DAMAGED. THE PROSECUTION CLAIMS IT WAS CUT DURING THE ATTACKS ON HIS EX-WIFE AND FRIEND LAST JUNE. HOWEVER, THE DEFENCE CLAIMS SIMPSON CUT

HIS HAND ON A GLASS AFTER LEARNING HIS EX-WIFE, NICOLE BROWN SIMPSON, HAD BEEN MURDERED.

(JAPAN-SUBWAY) JAPANESE POLICE HAVE LAUNCHED A MASSIVE INVESTIGATION TO FIND THOSE BEHIND TODAY'S NERVE GAS ATTACK ON TOKYO'S SUBWAY SYSTEM. THE GAS KILLED SIX PEOPLE AND INJURED MORE THAN 32-HUNDRED, BUT SO FAR, NO CLEAR SUSPECTS OR MOTIVES HAVE EMERGED. POLICE SAY THE SEEMINGLY POINTLESS CRIME WAS A DELIBERATE, INDISCRIMINATE ACT OF MURDER. MANY OF THE INJURED WERE RELEASED AFTER TREATMENT FOR MINOR DOSES OF THE POISON, BUT 603 REMAIN IN HOSPITAL.

(SOUTH AFRICA-QUEEN) SOUTH AFRICA'S PARLIAMENT HEARD FROM QUEEN ELIZABETH TODAY, THE FIRST SPEECH THERE BY A BRITISH MONARCH SINCE 1947. IN HER REMARKS, SHE PAID TRIBUTE TO THE POST-APARTHEID NATION AS A FORCE FOR REGIONAL STABILITY AND GROWTH. AT A STATE BANQUET LATER, PRESIDENT NELSON MANDELA WELCOMED THE QUEEN AS AN AVOWED FRIEND OF OUR COUNTRY. THE QUEEN IS ON A SIX-DAY VISIT TO SOUTH AFRICA.

(CLINTON-RUSSIA) U-S PRESIDENT CLINTON WILL VISIT MOSCOW MAY 9TH TO MARK THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE END OF THE SECOND WORLD WAR. BUT THE WHITE HOUSE SAYS CLINTON WON'T BE ABLE TO ATTEND SIMILAR CEREMONIES IN BRITAIN, FRANCE AND GERMANY. IN MOSCOW, CLINTON WILL ATTEND A RED SQUARE PARADE FEATURING RUSSIAN WAR VETERANS AND HOLD TALKS WITH

PRESIDENT BORIS YELTSIN.

GRENOBLE, FRANCE -- SCIENTISTS SAY THEYVE FOUND HIGH LEVELS OF ARSENIC IN A LOCK OF NAPOLEONS HAIR. THE DEPOSED FRENCH EMPEROR DIED IN EXILE IN 1821 AT AGE 51, AND MOST HISTORIANS SAY THE CAUSE WAS STOMACH CANCER. OTHERS, HOWEVER, CLAIM HE WAS POISONED. UP TO 10 TIMES THE NORMAL LEVEL OF ARSENIC WAS DETECTED IN NAPOLEONS HAIR BY X-RAY ANALYSIS. THE LATEST ANALYSIS WAS REQUESTED BY NAPOLEON BIOGRAPHER RENE MAURY, WHO BELIEVES NAPOLEON WAS POISONED BY ONE OF HIS MISTRESSES HUSBANDS. OTHER HISTORIANS CONTEND THE BRITISH POISONED HIM OR FRENCH ROYALISTS MURDERED HIM TO PREVENT HIM FROM RETURNING TO POWER.

OTTAWA -- SPANISH VESSELS COULD BE FISHING FOR TURBOT OFF CANADAS EAST COAST AGAIN. AND THE GOVERNMENT IS WARNING THAT COULD PUT NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE EUROPEAN UNION IN JEOPARDY. NEW BRUNSWICK LIBERAL M-P FERNAND ROBICHAUD SAYS EUROPEAN BOATS HAVE APPEARED AGAIN ON THE NOSE OF THE GRAND BANKS, JUST OUTSIDE CANADAS 200-MILE ECONOMIC ZONE. BAD WEATHER HAS KEPT OBSERVATIONS TO A MINIMUM. BUT ROBICHAUD IS CONCERNED THEY MAY BE SPANISH SHIPS BACK FISHING FOR TURBOT. THE GOVERNMENT HAS INFORMED THE E-U THE SITUATION COULD COMPROMISE ON-GOING NEGOTIATIONS. CANADA IMPOSED A 60-DAY MORATORIUM

ON TURBOT FISHING AFTER THE E-U REFUSED TO ABIDE BY INTERNATIONALLY-SET QUOTAS FOR THOSE STOCKS. ONE SPANISH VESSEL HAS ALREADY BEEN SEIZED BY CANADIAN AUTHORITIES -- AND FISHERIES MINISTER BRIAN TOBIN HAS PROMISED FURTHER ACTION IF NECESSARY. ROBICHAUD HOPES THE SITUATION WILL BE CLARIFIED IN THE MORNING.

GOATS SACRIFICED IN BID TO HALT STOCK CRASH KARACHI PAKISTANI STOCKBROKERS, IN DESPAIR OVER A BEAR RUN THAT HAS SENT THE KARACHI STOCK EXCHANGE TUMBLING, HAVE SACRIFICED 10 GOATS TO TRY TO HALT THE CRASH. THE BLACK GOATS WERE PARADED THROUGH THE TRADING HALL OF THE EXCHANGE SUNDAY, A TRADING DAY IN MUSLIM PAKISTAN, BEFORE HAVING THEIR THROATS CUT IN THE PARKING LOT OUTSIDE. OFFICIALS SAID MONDAY. TURNOVER ROSE TO A RECORD 23.3 MILLION SHARES AFTER THE SACRIFICE, BUT THE 100-SHARE INDEX FELL AGAIN, 12.57 POINTS TO A 16-MONTH TROUGH OF 1,683 POINTS. THE GOAT MEAT WAS GIVEN TO THE POOR.

OTTAWA -- REFORM M-PS SUGGEST THE BLOC QUEBECOIS WOULD BE MUCH MORE SUPPORTIVE OF THE RAILWAY BACK-TO-WORK LEGISLATION IF QUEBECERS WERE DIRECTLY AFFECTED. THE BLOC HAS REFUSED PERMISSION TO ALLOW EARLY INTRODUCTION OF THE BILL, AND IF THEY CONTINUE STICKING TO THE RULES, IT MIGHT NOT BECOME LAW UNTIL FRIDAY AT THE EARLIEST. RIGHT NOW, THOSE HARDEST-HIT BY THE SHUTDOWN ARE PRAIRIE GRAIN FARMERS AND THE

AUTO INDUSTRY IN SOUTHERN ONTARIO. REFORM M-P ELWIN HERMANSON SAYS THE SEPARATISTS MIGHT BE SINGING A DIFFERENT TUNE IF EITHER OF THOSE INDUSTRIES WERE BASED IN QUEBEC. BUT BLOC QUEBECOIS LEADER LUCIEN BOUCHARD SAYS HES SIMPLY SUPPORTING PEOPLES RIGHT TO STRIKE. HE ARGUES THE WALKOUTS ARE ONLY A FEW HOURS OLD -- AND THAT THE DAMAGE TO THE ECONOMY CANT BE THAT SERIOUS YET.

OTTAWA -- LABOUR MINISTER LUCIENNE ROBILLARD HAS APPOINTED A SPECIAL MEDIATOR TO LOOK INTO THE MONTREAL LONGSHOREMAN DISPUTE. THE MEDIATOR IS VETERAN LABOR TROUBLESHOOTER PIERRE DUFRESNE OF SAINTE-ADELE, QUEBEC. ABOUT 900 LONGSHOREMEN HAVE BEEN LOCKED OUT SINCE MARCH 7TH AFTER THEY STAGED A ONE-DAY STRIKE. LONGSHOREMEN ELIGIBLE FOR EARLY RETIREMENT ARE DEMANDING A SWEETER BUY-OUT PACKAGE. ROBILLARD MET WITH BOTH SIDES TODAY AND URGED THEM TO RESUME TALKS QUICKLY AND TO RESTORE OPERATIONS AT THE PORT. ROBILLARD HAS ASKED DUFRESNE TO REPORT TO HER ON PROGRESS WITHIN 10 DAYS.

(RAIL-STRIKE) THE STRIKE-LOCKOUT THAT HAS PARALYSED CANADAS RAILWAYS WILL LAST A LITTLE LONGER. THE POLITICAL OPPOSITION IN OTTAWA IS STALLING THE GOVERNMENTS EFFORTS TO END THE DISPUTE. THE BLOC QUEBECOIS AND NEW DEMOCRATIC PARTY HAVE BOTH REFUSED THE GOVERNMENT PERMISSION TO QUICKLY INTRODUCE AND PASS BACK-TO-WORK LEGISLATION.

(RAIL-STRIKE-CUPW) THE NATIONAL POSTAL UNION CALLS THE FEDERAL MOVE TO LEGISLATE RAIL EMPLOYEES BACK TO WORK AN OUTRAGE. THE CANADIAN UNION OF POSTAL WORKERS SAYS THE MOVE WILL END THE STRIKE IN THE LEAST EQUITABLE AND INTELLIGENT FASHION POSSIBLE. PRESIDENT DARRELL TINGLEY ADDS THAT LEGISLATED SETTLEMENTS ARE ALWAYS BAD AND ALWAYS FAVOR THE EMPLOYER.




WHITEHORSE -- YUKONS GOVERNMENT LEADER SAYS PLANS FOR A GAMBLING CASINO IN WHITEHORSE HAVE FOLDED. JOHN OSTASHEK MADE THE COMMENT AFTER A RADIO STATION REPORTED THAT MAYOR KATHY WATSON SENT A LETTER TO OSTASHEK STATING THE CITY IS NOT PREPARED TO PROCEED WITH A CASINO. GEORGETTI HAS COUNTERED, SAYING THE CLAIM IS LAUGHABLE. AND EVEN PREMIER HARCOURT GOT A GOOD BELLY LAUGH OUT OF THE CLAIM WHEN A REPORTER PUT IT TO HIM. HE SAYS THE CLOSER THE NEXT SITTING OF THE LEGISLATURE GETS. THE CRAZIER WISGERBERS STATEMENTS GET. HARCOURT SAYS HE ONLY FOUND OUT TODAY ABOUT GEORGETTIS COMPLAINT AGAINST RADIO STATION C-K-N-W TO THE CANADIAN BROADCASTING STANDARDS COUNCIL OVER N-W FILING A CONFLICT ALLEGATION AGAINST HARCOURT. THE B-C FEDS ACTION PROMPTED OPPOSITION ACCUSATIONS YESTERDAY THAT THE LABOR GROUP WAS FIGHTING THE PREMIERS BATTLES FOR HIM.

MONTREAL -- RADIO-CANADA TELEVISION, THE FRENCH-LANGUAGE SERVICE OF THE C-B-C, COULD CUT 750 JOBS OVER THE NEXT TWO YEARS BECAUSE OF THE FEDERAL BUDGET. VICE-PRESIDENT OF TELEVISION MICHELE FORTIN SAYS IF FRENCH T-V IS HIT WITH A 60-MILLION-DOLLAR BUDGET REDUCTION, IT WILL BE A PERILOUS EXERCISE INVOLVING LAYOFFS. OTTAWA -- THE FEDERAL BUDGET HAS WON THE FORMAL APPROVAL OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS, IF NOT QUITE THE HEARTS OF ALL LIBERALS. BY A 142-81 VOTE, THE GOVERNMENT WON TODAYS TRADITIONAL CONFIDENCE MOTION. THE VOTE GIVES GENERAL APPROVAL TO A BUDGET THAT RAISES TAXES ON GASOLINE AND CORPORATIONS AND SLASHES SPENDING ON SOCIAL PROGRAMS. AS USUAL, VOTING FOLLOWED PARTY LINES WITH ALL THE LIBERALS PRESENT, PLUS INDEPENDENT JAG BHADURIA. BACKING FINANCE MINISTER PAUL MARTIN. THE PLOC QUEBECOIS, REFORM AND NEW DEMOCRATS WERE OPPOSED. 



 - d. don't exaggerate the situation over here; be realistic; and
 - e. avoid any policy and or negative comments about the Rwandan government or UN. This is not a vehicle to vent frustrations.



1. GENERAL SITUATION - A RPA CAR HIT AN ANTI-TANK MINE IN KIGALI AT 0715 HRS ON 6 SEP 94. THE EXPLOSION BLEW THE VEHICLE APPROXIMATELY TWENTY FEET THROUGH THE AIR. THE DRIVER WAS SERIOUSLY WOUNDED. IT APPEARS AS THOUGH THE MINE WAS PLANTED IN THE PAST WEEK AND A HALF.
2. DOMESTIC FORCES ACTIVITIES - ON THE NIGHT OF 5 SEP A LOCAL MAN WAS ADMITTED TO THE AUSTRALIAN HOSPITAL IN KIGALI WITH A GUNSHOT WOUND TO THE HEAD. THE VICTIM, WHO WAS STILL ABLE TO SPEAK TOLD THE AUSTRALIANS THAT HE KNEW WHO SHOT HIM AND THAT THEY ~~THEY~~ WERE MEMBERS OF THE FORMER GOVERNMENT MILITIA.
3. BANDITS ARMED WITH ~~WITH~~ GRENADES AND MACHETES ROBBED 15 TONS OF FOOD STUFFS FROM A REFUGEE CAMP IN SECTOR FOUR ALPHA ON 5 SEP. A BOMB BLEW UP IN KIBUYE ON 5 SEP, KILLING TWO AND WOUNDING SEVEN. IT IS NOT KNOWN WHO WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE BOMBING.
4. UNAMIR OPS - SRSG WILL BE TRAVELLING TO ZAIRE ON 7 SEP TO HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE ZAIRE GOVERNMENT. HIS GOAL WILL BE TO HAVE FORMER GOVERNMENT FORCES PERSONNEL SEPARATED FROM REGULAR PEOPLE IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS.
5. 1 CDHSR OPS - MEMBERS OF 1 CDHSR COMPLETED THE MOVEMENT OF THE ORPHANS FROM THEIR OLD FACILITY INTO THEIR NEW LOCATION. THE REGIMENT CONTINUED TO ASSIST RWANDA TEL IN ITS EFFORTS TO ESTABLISH ITS OPERATIONS IN THE SOUTH-WEST.
6. AIR OPS - REPAIRS THAT WERE MADE TO OPERATING SURFACES BROKE DOWN. THE HOLES ARE NOW BEING REPAIRED WITH COLD PATCH WHICH SHOULD HOLD. TRAFFIC ACCEPTANCE RATE FOR THE RAMP IS REDUCED TO TWO AIRCRAFT AN HOUR. THIS IS THE HIGHEST RATE THE LOCAL CONTRACTOR AND AIR RWANDA CAN HANDLE. THE US FIREFIGHTERS ARE NOW TRAINING LOCAL FIREFIGHTERS APPROX 6 HRS A DAY. THE LOCALS HAVE TWO SERVICABLE TRUCKS HOWEVER THEIR PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT IS ALMOST NON-EXISTANT.
