Note to the Secretary-General

(Through Mr. Yoon)

Second Part of Secretary-General's "global tour" on women's and children's health

Further to my previous note setting out the options for your Asia global health tour and your positive response, we have started planning a trip itinerary which would begin in India, departing New York on 8 November and ending in Bali the night of 16 November to participate in the ASEAN Summit.

As detailed in the short program, we would spend 2.5 days in India and Indonesia and 1.5 days in Bangladesh. The extra half day beyond a usual country visit is necessary to ensure political meetings in the capital cities, health visits in areas outside the capitals, and special events to cultivate strong government and private sector engagement around the Every Woman Every Child effort, as well as the additional components encompassed in this trip (peacekeeping, UN-REDD, Global Pulse, creative community).

Ray Chambers has offered his private jet to facilitate movement from India to Bangladesh and on to Indonesia.

We would need to inform the governments of India, Indonesia and Bangladesh of our proposed dates as soon as possible, and look forward to your approval on the proposed timeframe to be able to proceed.

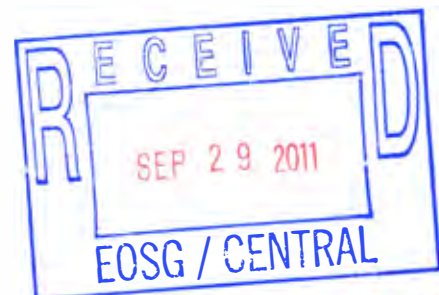

Note to the Secretary-General

Second Part of Secretary-General's "global tour" on women's and children's health

Following on the success of your trip to Nigeria, Ethiopia and the G8 Summit, we would like to begin planning for the next stage of your global health tour. A visit this fall to the three countries with the highest burden of maternal and child mortality, India, Bangladesh and Indonesia, would mean that you have covered countries making up 42 % of maternal mortality and 60% of child mortality worldwide. A stop in Nepal to showcase the success of community-based efforts, would also be beneficial, if your schedule permits.

As with your recent trip, combining the country field visits with an appearance at a major global forum is highly desirable. This will ensure that your messages from the trip have maximum impact on global decision makers, in addition to gaining significant additional media attention. In that regard, there are three options for your consideration.

The first option would be finishing your tour at the G20 meeting in Cannes, France (3-4 November). The G20 offers the opportunity to address key world leaders, yet their attention will not be immediately directed to health priorities. The second option would be ending the tour at the Fourth High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness in Busan, Korea (29 November - 1 December), the most prominent development-focused meeting this fall, where health issues will be front and center. The third option would be showcasing your trip outcomes at the ASEAN Summit in Bali (17-18 November), which would be the easiest logistically since we will be in Indonesia in any case, but would have less global resonance or coverage than either of the first two options.

Of the three options, the High Level Forum in Busan would likely be the best way to end your trip as it will be a high profile event, focusing on the right substance and with the representation of the whole UN system. This will be an opportunity to showcase both your and the UN system's successful efforts, as well as your vision and on the ground leadership, as you approach your next mandate as United Nations Secretary-General.

As in the previous trip, we would be able to integrate official visits and non-health substance at each stop. India will offer the opportunity to hold a Bollywood event in support of your creative community initiative. The visit in Indonesia could include the launch of the second Global Pulse laboratory, the first one in Asia and highlight UN collaboration on deforestation. Should a stop in Nepal be possible, a visit to Buddha's birthplace, Lumbini, could also be organized.

We would like to initiate planning as early as possible. We look forward to your guidance.

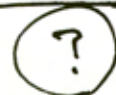
