
Dear Dr. Dorsett,

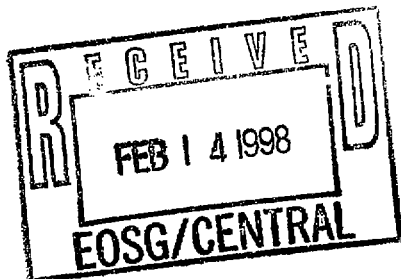

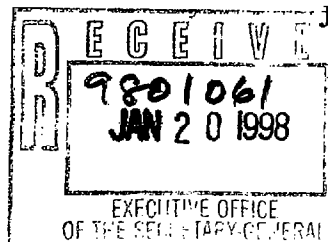

On February 1, 1998, the King will be celebrated at Aaron Davis Hall on City College Campus and greeted by a host of guest performers. The celebration commences at 3 p.m. and a private reception will follow the performance. The funds raised at this endeavor will support the health and educational projects in the village of Apatrapa, Ghana.

Fortunately for me, I have a school named in my honor in the Ashanti Region of Ghana. The school is called the Dorsett Memorial School.
