A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS REMAINS TENSE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT TWO RPA OFFICERS WERE SENT BY THEIR BDE COMD TO TUNBATT HQ REQUESTING THEM TO VACATE THE SITES OF BUSOGO AND GISENYI NOT LATER THAN 26 MAY 95. THEIR REQUEST WAS PRESENTED AS AN ULTIMATUM.

(2) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ABOUT 50 RPA RECRUITS WERE BEING TRAINED AT KIGEMBE (7093).

B. MILITIA/FRGF. NSTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) FC HAD CONTINUED DISCUSSIONS WITH SENIOR STAFF AND SRSG REGARDING MANDATE OPTION AND CONTINUED VIOLATIONS OF SOMA. THE FC HAS CONTINUED HIS PERSISTENCE IN NON-COMPLIANCE WITH NEW RPA DEMANDS WHICH VIOLATE THE SOMA. CODE CABLE HAVE BEEN DESPATCHED TO UNHQ NEW YORK WITH DETAILS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

(2) MET BRIEFLY WITH PROTOCOL OFFICER OF RPA GOVT AND DISCUSSED CURRENT RELATIONS AND DIFFERING FACTORS BETWEEN RPA MIL AND BROAD BASED GOVT. THE TWO ENTITIES DO NOT ALWAYS NECESSARILY AGREE. IT WAS DISCUSSED THAT UNAMIR SHOULD DO MORE TO DISPEL WHAT IT FEELS AS PROPAGANDA, IN PARTICULAR ABOUT THE TWO INDIVIDUALS WHICH UNAMIR HAD TRANSPORTED FOR INTERVIEWS WITH THE KIBEHO COMMISSION. NOT ALL GOVT OFFICIALS AGREE WITH THE CURRENT SITUATION BETWEEN UNAMIR AND THE RPA GOVT.

(3) FC MET WITH SRSG AND DISCUSSED BRIEFLY THE ROLE OF UNAMIR DURING SRSG'S ABSENCE TO NEW YORK FOR MANDATE DEBATE AND VOTE. FC WILL BE PREPARING LETTER OF PROTEST TO RPA FOR THE LATEST VIOLATION OF SOMA REGARDING THE FORCED AND CONTINUED SEARCH OF ALL UNAMIR VEHS.

(4) FC ATTENDED FUNCTION FOR OUTGOING CHIEF ADMIN OFFICER, MR GOLO.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PTLs TO CYUMBA REPORTED THAT REHABILITATION ACTIVITIES IN THE COMMUNE IS SLOW AND MOST CLINICS WERE NOT FUNCTIONING.

(2) 230 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI AND KIBUNGO. 339 IDPs TRANSPORTED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO AND NGENDA. A TOTAL OF 450 IDPs STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 44 UNAMIR CIVILIAN STAFF IN AOR.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION REMAINED GENERALLY CALM. BANDITRY WAS REPORTED IN SECTOR 4B.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) PTLS TO BIRENGA COMMUNE (5959) VISITED THE ELDERLY PEOPLE'S HOME IN KIBUNGO. THERE WERE 30 PERSONS AND THE FACILITY WHICH WAS RAN BY CARITAS. THE HOME IS NEED OF FOOD AID. HAC INFORMED.

(C) PTLs TO RUSUMO COMMUNE (7448) CONFIRMED THAT 36 VEHICLES FROM DAR ES SALAAM, TRANSPORTING ITEMS FOR THE UNAMIR FORCE SIG COY, WERE HELD UP AT THE BUKOBA BORDER POST (8637). THE I/C OF THE CONVOY SAID THE PROBLEM WAS WITH PAYMENT OF CUSTOMS DUTIES. WHEN MOVCON KIGALI WAS INFORMED, IT WAS INTIMATED THAT IT WAS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONTRACTING AGENCY TO DELIVER THE VEHICLES.

(D) MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE SUB-SECTOR HQ HAS MOVED FROM RILIMA TO NYAMATA (1060). HOWEVER THERE ARE 9 MILOBS PERSONNEL STILL IN RILIMA DUE TO INADEQUATE ACCOMMODATION IN NYAMATA.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PTLs TO TABA COMMUNE ATTENDED A REBURIAL CEREMONY ORGANISED BY THE CATHOLIC CHURCH. IT WAS ATTENDED BY THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND FAMILY PLANNING. ALSO PRESENT WERE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EUROPEAN CHURCH COMMUNITY.

(C) PTLs TO MUKINGI, NTONGWE AND KIVUMU COMMUNES (5573). REPORTED THAT LOCALS WERE GRATEFUL TO UNAMIR FOR PROVIDING SECURITY IN THE MENTIONED AREAS.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4A REPORTED SHORTAGE OF FOOD IN NYAMAGABE (5427) AND KIBINGO (5429) COMMUNES. HAC INFORMED.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) AN INCREASE OF RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI WAS OBSERVED OVER THE PAST FOUR DAYS.

(B) PTLs TO KIGEMBE (7093) REPORTED THAT AT MID-NIGHT ON 24 MAY, BANDITS ATTACKED AND SERIOUSLY WOUNDED A MAN WHO IS NOW ON ADMISSION IN BUTARE HOSPITAL. AT 0500 HRS ON 25 MAY, ABOUT 28 BANDITS ALLEGEDLY FROM BURUNDI, ATTACKED A FAMILY OF 12 AT KIVUMU (6694) AND SERIOUSLY WOUNDED A WOMAN AND A CHILD.

(C) PTLs TO KIBILIZI REPORTED THAT 756 IDPS AT KIBILIZI TRANSIT CAMP WERE AWAITING TRANSPORT TO

THEIR HOME COMMUNES. UNICEF IS PROVIDING POTABLE WATER TO THE IDPs. HOWEVER THERE IS A SHORTAGE OF FOOD IN THE CAMP. IN MUGANZA COMMUNE 33% OF THE POPULATION ARE HOMELESS AND REQUIRE ASSISTANCE IN BUILDING MATERIALS. MSF PLANS TO OPEN A CLINIC IN THIS AREA.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR. NSTR.

(B) THE DCMO PAID A WORKING VISIT TO THE SECTOR. HE WAS CONDUCTED AROUND ISHARA AND MURWA PENINSULAS.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) PTLS TO MUSANZE SECTEUR GR 5535 WERE INFORMED THAT 5 PERSONS HAVE BEEN KILLED BY UNKNOWN PERSONS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(C) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5, REPORTED THAT 246 RETURNEES OF THE 1959/60 CASE LOAD WERE EVAC BY UNHCR FROM THE COLLEGE RECEPTION CENTRE TO NGENDA AND KIBUNGO. THERE ARE STILL OVER 12,000 RETURNEES AT THE CENTRE.

(2) TREATED A TOTAL OF 32 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 21 DENTAL PATIENTS DURING THE PERIOD. CHK IS CURRENTLY HOLDING 13 IN-PATIENTS.

(3) RIFLE COY ELM PROVIDED SECURITY AT THE MIL BKS AND CHK.

N. AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE KIA DURING THE PERIOD. A TOTAL OF 08 FLIGHTS DEPARTED AND ARRIVED KIA.

O. UN MP COY.

- (1) UNAMIR MP COY CONTD TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO THE NIBATT SLDR SUSPECTED OF MURDER.
- (2) PROVIDED SECURITY AT MILOB GROUP HQ.
- (3) INVESTIGATED TRAFFIC ACCIDENT INVOLVING UNAMIR 709 AND UNAMIR 708. THERE WERE SLIGHT DAMAGES TO BOTH VEHS.

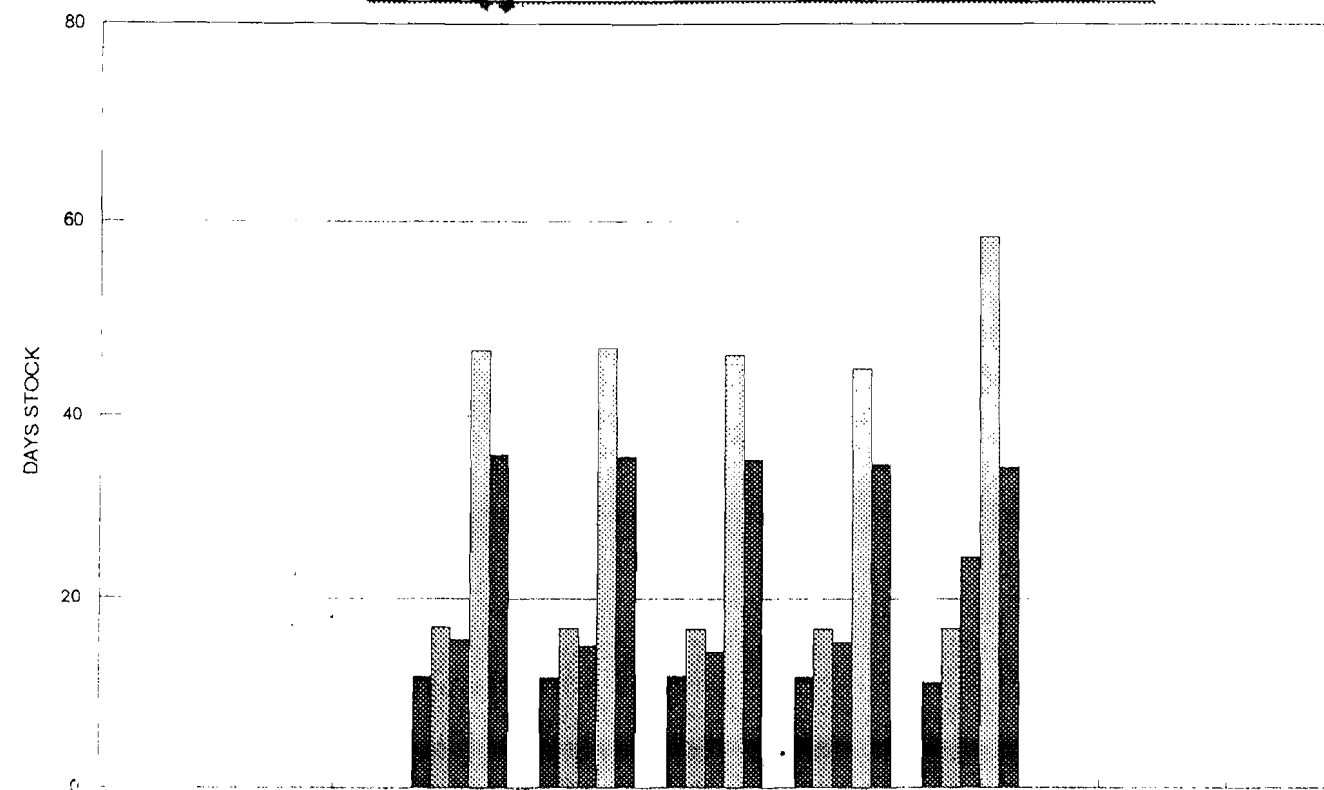

(1) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT THE RPA

COMMANDER AT RWAMIKO ON 24 MAY 95, REQUESTED THAT ALL MATTERS OF SECURITY IN NATURE OCCURRING IN RWAMIKO AREA BE HANDLED BY RPA AND UNAMIR TOGETHER. THIS COMES AFTER RELATIONS BETWEEN RPA AND ZAMBATT TROOPS HAD DETERIORATED DUE TO ALLEGATIONS BY THE RPA THAT ZAMBATT MISINFORMED THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY OVER RPA ACTIVITIES IN THE AREA.

(2) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT AT KINIGI GR 5440 RPA TRIED TO ARREST A LOCAL BECAUSE HE CONTACTED A TUNBATT PTL AND REPORTED THAT HIS GOODS HAD BEEN STOLEN BY UNKNOWN PERSONS. THE LOCAL MANAGED TO ESCAPE BUT RPA SOLDIERS PREVENTED THE PTL FROM FURTHER MOVEMENT DEMANDING A WRITTEN REPORT TO INCLUDE THE NAME OF THE LOCAL. THE PTL COMD HOWEVER CONVINCED THEM THAT HE HAD NO INFORMATION ON THE LOCAL AND WAS LATER ALLOWED TO PROCEED.

IN THE SAME SECTOR, THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN BANDITS IN 2 BOATS AND AN RPA PATROL BOAT IN THE AREA OF GAFUNZO PENINSULA AT 240100B MAY 95. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED IN EITHER INCIDENT.

IN ALL COMMUNES VISITED, VARIOUS NGOS WERE OBSERVED ASSISTING RETURNEES WITH FOOD AID.

(D) MILOBS IN RUHENGARI REPORTED ANOTHER EXPLOSION IN MIKONGO COMMUNE IN WHICH AN ELECTRIC PYLON WAS DAMAGED. AN EMPLOYEE OF ELECTROGAZ STEPPED ON A MINE WHILE TRYING TO REPAIR THE TRANSFORMER WHICH WAS DAMAGED IN THE EARLIER EXPLOSION AND WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED.

(E) MILOBS CONDUCTED JOINT HELI PATROL WITH UNHCR, HUMAN RIGHTS, MEDICAL TEAM AND RPA LO TO THE NGOROGERO AND KIBILIRA COMMUNES. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

D. IN BUTARE PREFECTURE CIVPOL REPORTED THAT THE DIRECTOR OF NYANZA PRISONS HAS ISSUED A DIRECTIVE THAT ON NO ACCOUNT SHOULD UN PERSONNEL WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS AND RED CROSS BE ALLOWED ACCESS TO THE PRISON. THE TEAM WAS ALSO INFORMED THAT 1,200 REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI WHO HAD INTENDED TO SETTLE IN NTYAZO HAVE BEEN ASKED BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITY TO LEAVE DUE TO LACK OF ACCOMMODATION IN THE AREA. HUMAN RIGHTS TO BE INFORMED.

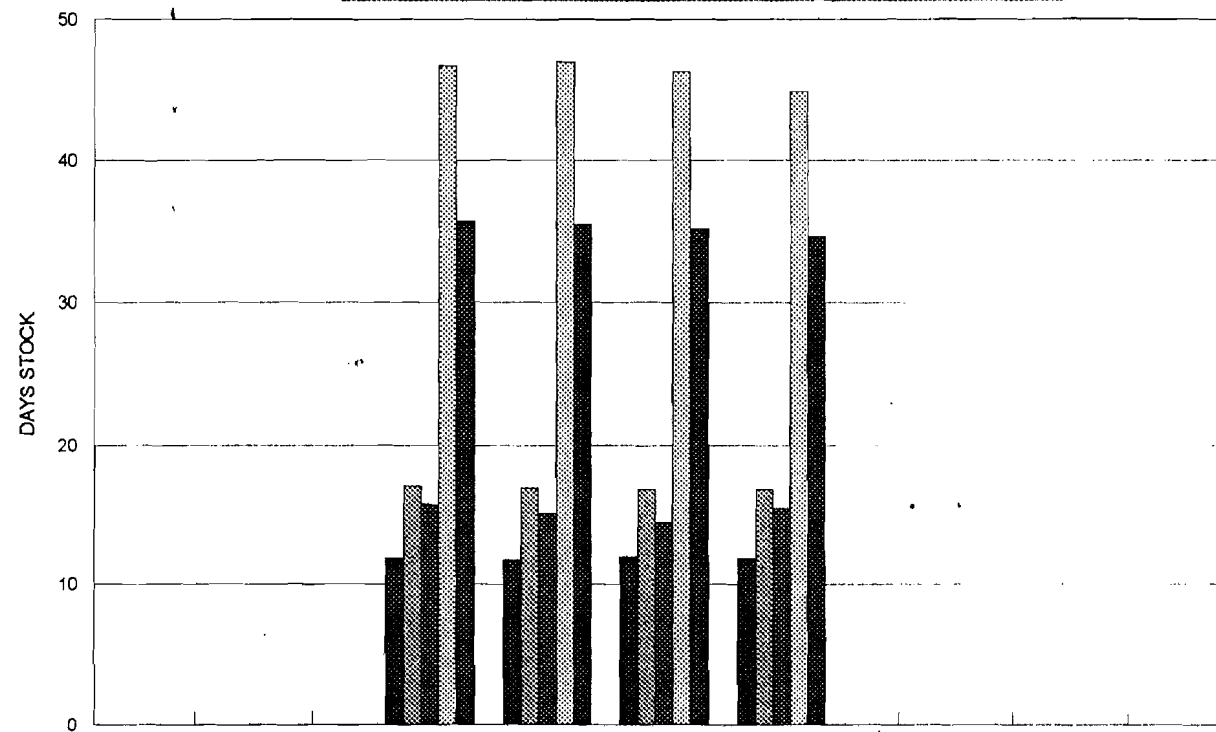

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS REMAINS TENSE.

B. AT 211000B MAY 95, EIGHT YOUNG MEN CLAIMING TO BE ZAIRIANS ARRIVED AT GHANBATT FWD POSN MULINDI GR 7667. THEY CLAIMED TO HAVE ESCAPED FROM A MIL TRG BASE IN THE AKAGERA NATIONAL PARK AFTER THREE MONTHS TRAINING. PERS WERE CONSCRIPTED FROM ZAIRE IN DEC 94 UNDER PRETEXT OF BEING FOUND EMPLOYMENT IN NAIROBI, KENYA. THE 8 MEN CLAIMED THEY WERE BROUGHT TO RWANDA IN DEC 94 AND AFTER STAYING FOR ABOUT THREE MONTHS IN KIGALI AND RWAMAGANA WITH RPA SENIOR OFFRS, THEY WERE TRANSPORTED TO THE CAMP FOR TRAINING WITH THE VIEW OF GOING BACK TO ZAIRE TO TOPPLE THE ZAIRIAN GOVT. THE GROUP MENTIONED KEKESI ANDRE GANDO AS LEADER OF THE MOVEMENT.

THE BANK IS READY TO MAKE AVAILABLE UP TO US\$ 100 MILLION IN FAVOUR OF RWANDA. HOWEVER, THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE WILL BE RELEASED ON THE CONDITION THAT RWANDA FIRST PAYS ITS ARREARS TO THE BANK, WHICH AMOUNT TO US\$ 6 MILLION.

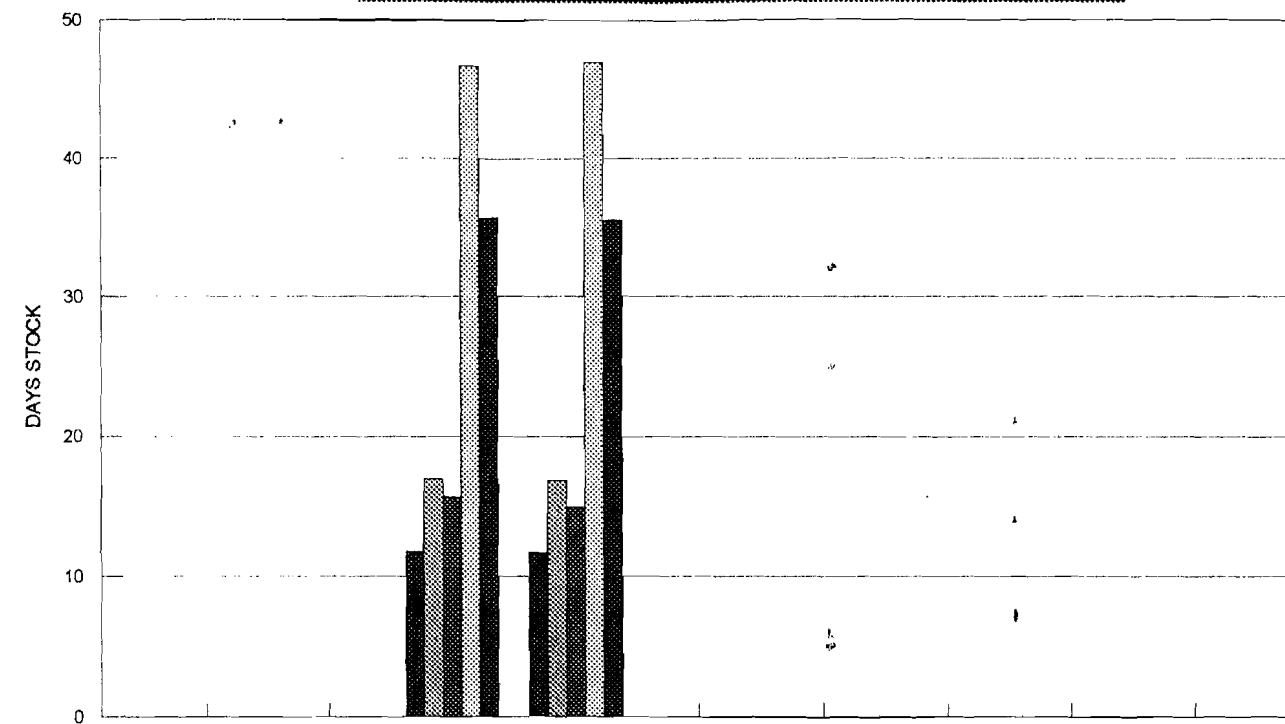

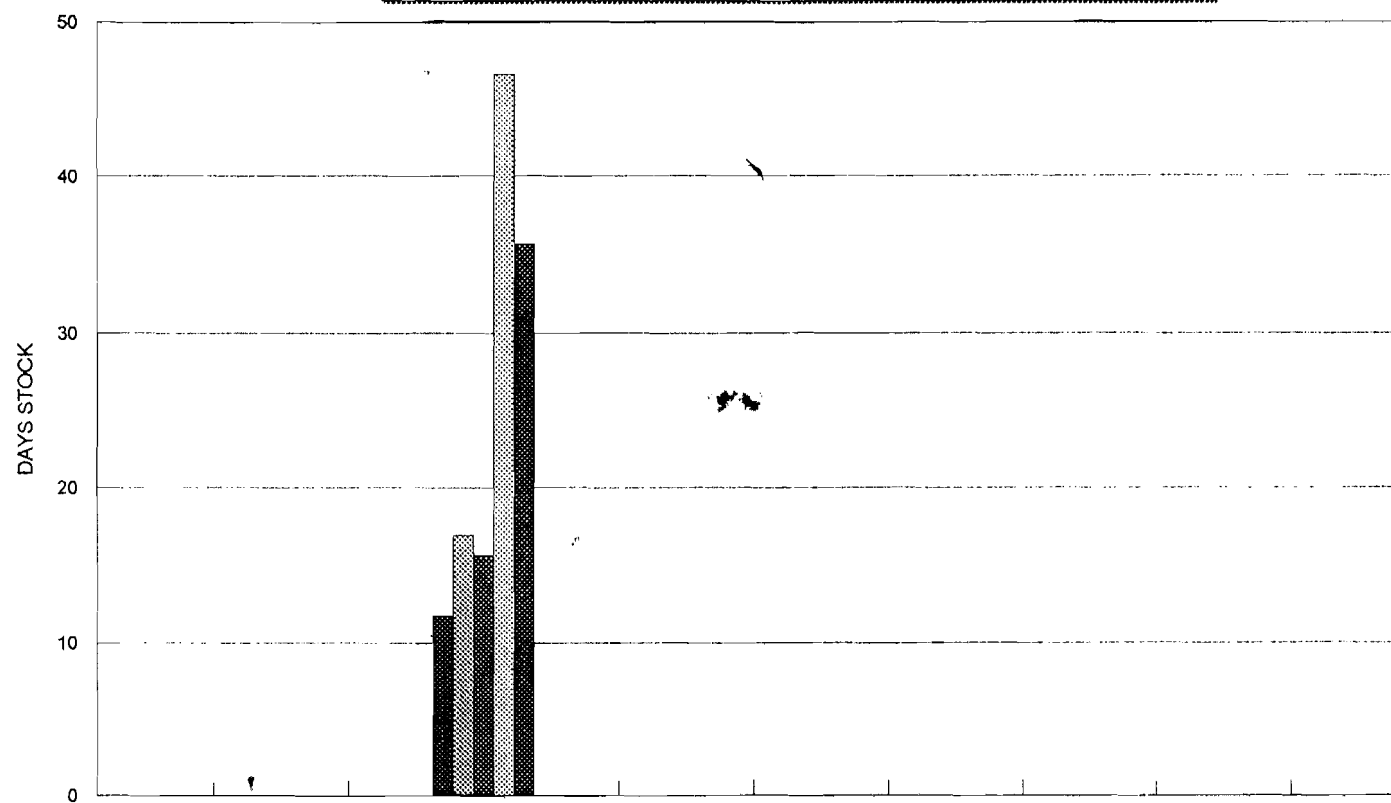

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, ATTENDED THE MILOBS SECTOR COMMANDERS' CONFERENCE, DURING WHICH THE SECTOR COMMANDERS BRIEFED HIM ON THE OVERALL SITUATION IN ALL SECTORS.

B. HE LATER RECEIVED A DELEGATION LED BY MR. JAN PRONK, THE DUTCH MINISTER OF DEVELOPMENT AND COOPERATION TO DISCUSS QUESTIONS RELATING TO ASSISTANCE TO THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT.

C. THE FOLLOWING WAS REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, HELD TALKS WITH THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UN SECRETARY-GENERAL, AMBASSADOR SHAHARYAR KHAN, WHO WAS ACCOMPANIED BY THE UNAMIR FORCE COMMANDER, MAJOR-GENERAL GUY TOUSIGNANT. THEIR TALKS FOCUSED ON THE CONCLUSIONS OF THE COMMISSION THAT WAS APPOINTED TO EXAMINE THE POSSIBILITY OF EXTENDING UNAMIR'S MANDATE. VICE-PRESIDENT PAUL KAGAME INDICATED THAT THE NEW MANDATE OF UNAMIR SHOULD TAKE INTO ACCOUNT THE EVOLUTION OF THE SECURITY SITUATION IN RWANDA. THE UNAMIR TROOPS THAT WOULD LEAVE THE COUNTRY AT THE END OF THEIR MISSION CONTRACT WOULD NOT BE REPLACED. HE SAID THAT RWANDESE LEADERS SHOULD ASSUME THEIR RESPONSIBILITY AND ENJOY THEIR FULL SOVEREIGNTY TO RUN THE COUNTRY'S AFFAIRS. HE POINTED OUT THAT THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS OPERATING IN RWANDA WERE NOT PROPORTIONAL TO THEIR MAGNITUDE AND THAT HE WOULD DISCUSS THIS ISSUE WITH HIS FELLOW POLITICAL LEADERS.

(2) VICE-PRESIDENT KAGAME ASKED THAT UNAMIR TROOPS NEITHER INVOLVE THEMSELVES IN MATTERS OF ENSURING SECURITY NOR BE VIEWED AS SPIES IN THE COUNTRY. HE ASKED INSTEAD THAT THEY CONTRIBUTE SIGNIFICANTLY TO THE RECONSTRUCTION OF THE COUNTRY.

(3) AMBASSADOR KHAN ASKED THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT TO WRITE A LETTER TO THE UN SECURITY COUNCIL TO STATE ITS PROPOSALS FOR THE NEW MANDATE OF UNAMIR. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE PROPOSED THAT UNAMIR BE INVOLVED IN THE WORK OF BOOSTING CONFIDENCE-BUILDING IN THE COUNTRY, AND ALSO PROPOSED THAT UNAMIR BE ALLOWED TO WORK IN AN ATMOSPHERE CONDUCIVE TO FRUITFUL COOPERATION.

(4) ON FRIDAY, SEVERAL DONOR COUNTRIES PLEDGED ASSISTANCE TO THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA IN A MEETING HELD IN THE HOTEL MERIDIEN IN KIGALI. THE MEETING, WHICH WAS PRESIDED OVER BY THE CHIEF PROSECUTOR OF THE TRIBUNAL, JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, AND ATTENDED BY THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY, WAS

CONVENED TO DISCUSS THE INITIAL PREPARATIONS FOR THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE TRIBUNAL'S WORK. THE DONOR COUNTRIES, NAMELY, BELGIUM, GERMANY, GREAT BRITAIN, SPAIN AND THE USA, PLEDGED USD 6 MILLION, ADDING TO THE USD 1.8 MILLION PLEDGED PREVIOUSLY BY THE USA. HOLLAND PLEDGED HALF OF THE USD 6 MILLION. THE ABOVE-LISTED COUNTRIES ALSO PLEDGED TO PROVIDE 30 INVESTIGATORS, ADDING TO THE THREE OTHERS ALREADY WORKING WITH THE TRIBUNAL.

UNTIL THE 20 MAY 95, DISCUSSIONS BETWEEN AIRPORT TRAFFIC CONTROL AND UNAMIR, THE ADOPTION OF MINOR CHANGES TO UNAMIR HELICOPTERS FLIGHT PLANS PLUS OTHER EVENTS OCCURRING IN KIGALI, SUCH AS THE PRESENCE OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION ON THE KIBEHO INCIDENT, HAVE COMBINED TO LIMIT RPA INSISTENCE ON ADOPTING THE NEW PASSENGER PROCEDURES. 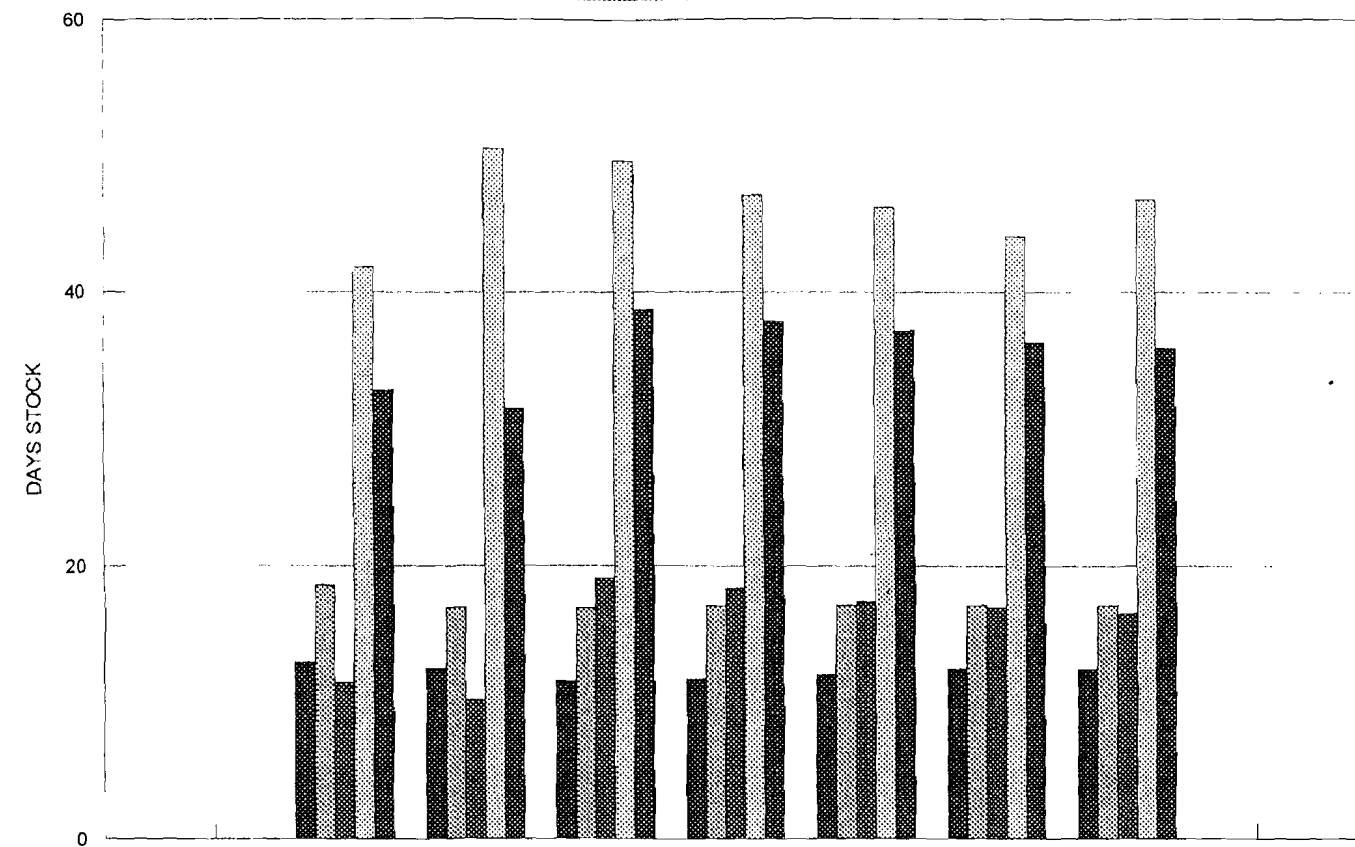

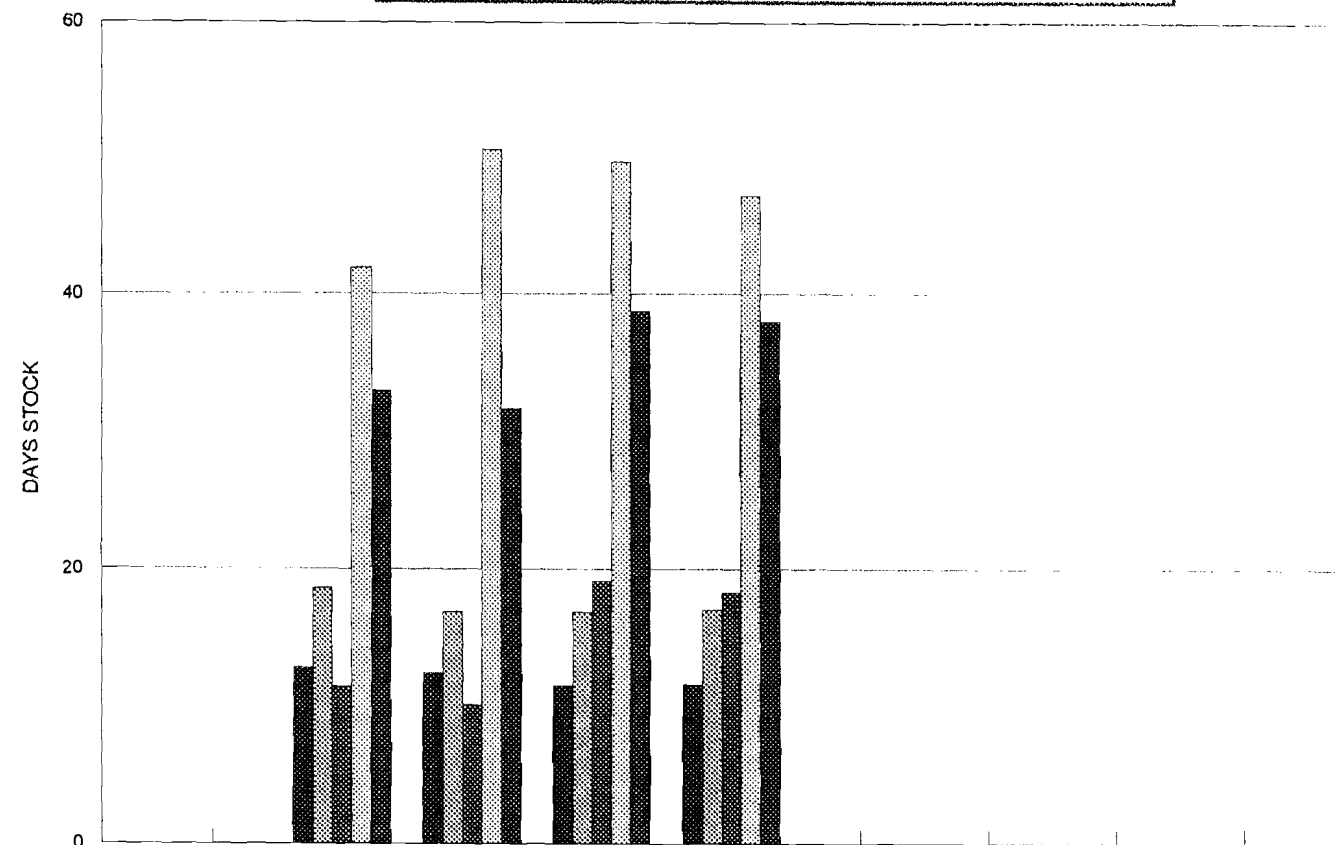

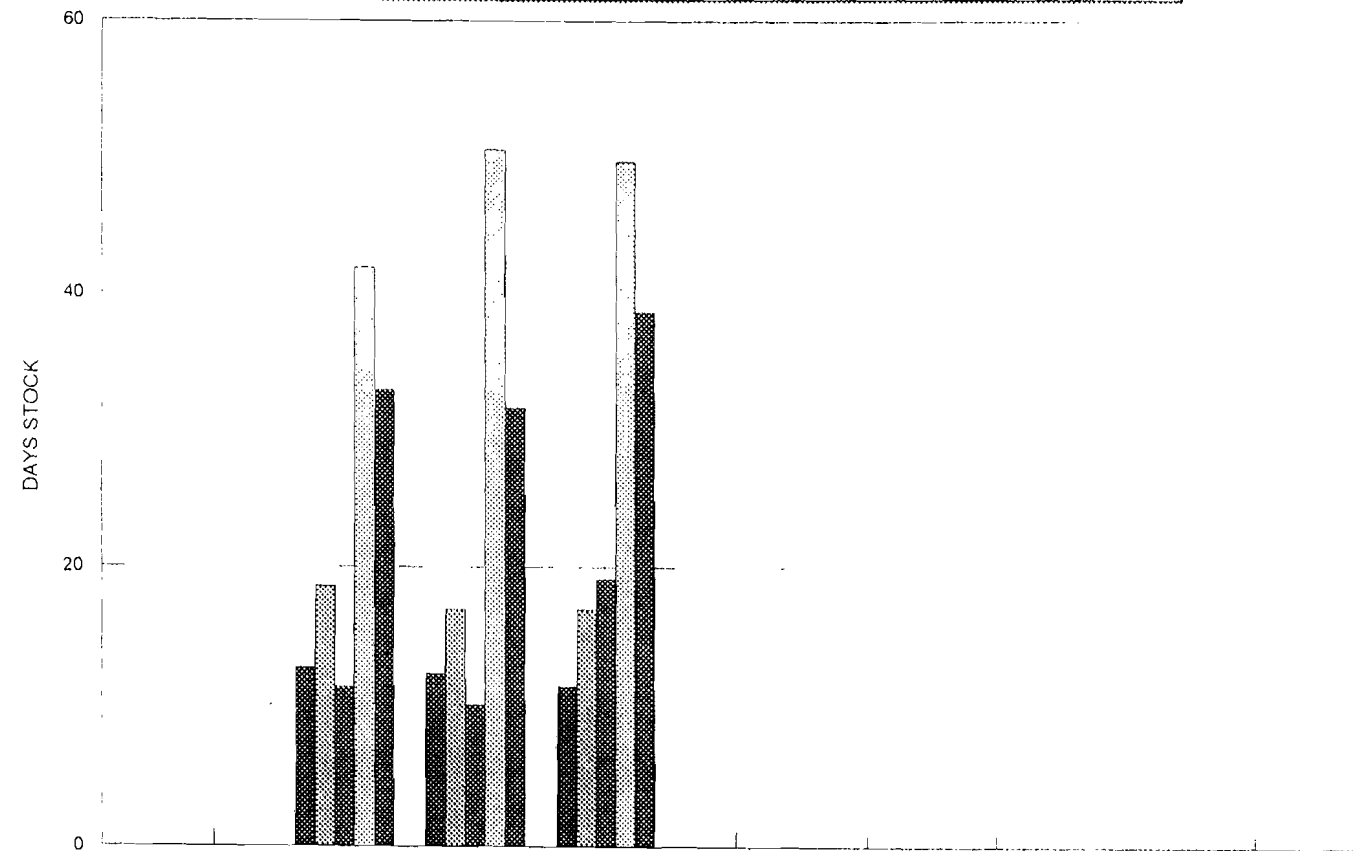

(C) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT AN RPA SOLDIER AT MBASA, IN RURAMBA AREA, ON 12 MAY 95 KILLED TWO LOCALS AND STOLE HERDS OF CATTLE FROM THE DECEASED.

(E) IN SECTOR 4B MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA PRESENCE REMAINED VERY VISIBLE WITH MUCH PATROLLING BEING CARRIED OUT IN THE CITY OF BUTARE AND IN THE COMMUNES.

III. 11 PRISONERS WERE RELEASED FROM NTONGWE COMMUNE CACHOT AFTER INITIAL INVESTIGATIONS BY AN IPJ TEAM LED BY HR MONITORS. ONE OF THE RELEASED PRISONERS WAS ACCUSED OF COLLUSION WITH UNAMIR.

IV. AT RUNDA COMMUNE A MILOB PTL TEAM WAS DENIED ACCESS TO THE COMMUNE CELL IN SPITE OF WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM THE RPA BN COMD AND CONSENT OF THE BOURGEMESTRE.

V. THE CHIEF OF IPJ (INSPECTEUR POLICE JUDICIAL) WAS ARRESTED FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. IT IS INTERESTING TO NOTE THAT HE WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR INVESTIGATING ACCUSATIONS OF CRIMINAL ACTS FOR THE PROSECUTOR. HR INFORMED.

VI. REBURIAL CEREMONIES TOOK PLACE IN NGOMA GR 2159, MABUGA GR 2463 AND RWAMATAMU GR 1557.

(G) IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO.

I. CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

II. PTLs TO TARE REPORTED THAT 158 IDPs HAVE SO FAR RETURNED TO THE SECTOR. THE WERE EITHER STAYING IN THEIR OWN HOMES OR WITH RELATIVES.

III. 5 DEAD BODIES WERE FOUND AT MATA ON 5 MAY 95. ZAMBATT PATROLS ALSO NOTICED COLLAPSED BANKS OF THE RIVER AKAVUGUTU AT 8 PLACES WHERE PORTIONS OF DEAD BODIES WERE EXPOSED. THE LOCATIONS WERE SUSPECTED TO BE MASS GRAVES.

IV. AT MTYAZO THE TEAM WAS INFORMED ABOUT FREQUENT HARASSMENT OF LOCALS BY THE RPA. ABOUT 150 RETURNEES WERE REPORTED TO HAVE LEFT THE COMMUNE FOR BURUNDI THROUGH THE NYUNGWE FOREST.

V. ON 09 MAY 95, THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY WENT TO KIBEHO CAMP AND WERE BRIEFED BY THE ZAMBATT OC, DCOS OPS, FORCE PROVOST MARSHALL AND THE RPA COMD. THE COMMISSION ALSO EXAMINED MASS GRAVES AND CORPSES AT MATA.

VI. THERE WERE REPORTS OF SEVERAL ARRESTS OF THE IDPs WHO HAD RETURNED FROM KIBEHO APPARENTLY FOR THEIR INVOLVEMENT IN THE GENOCIDE.

VII. ONE MILOB TEAM IN KIBEHO CAMP, FOUND A SUSPECTED MASS GRAVE AT GR 532081.

(H) IN SECTOR 4B - BUTARE.

I. CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES.

II. ONE PATROL REPORTED THAT IN NTYAZO GR 8631 2,306 RETURNEES HAVE BEEN REGISTERED SO FAR, AND 18 ARE BEING HELD IN PROTECTIVE CUSTODY FOR THEIR OWN SECURITY.

III. PATROLS TO HUYE COMMUNE 6714 WERE DENIED ACCESS TO THE PRISON BY THE BOURGMESTRE WHO CLAIMED THAT MILOBS REQUIRE WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM THE GOVERNMENT. HE ADDED THAT ONLY RED-CROSS AND HUMAN RIGHTS WERE PERMITTED WITHOUT PAPERS. SITUATION WAS CALM.

II. THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR REMAINED RELATIVELY CALM. SOME INFILTRATION/ROBBERY WAS ATTEMPTED ALONG THE EASTERN SHORE OF LAKE KIVU AROUND NYAMASHEKE IN THE NIGHT OF 11/12 MAY 95. MILOBS RECEIVED OTHER REPORTS OF BANDITRY AT KAGANO (9841), KAVUNE (9740) AND KININE (9535) ALL IN THE SAME NIGHT.

III. THERE WAS A CEREMONY IN KIRAMBO TO REBURY EXHUMED CORPSES. MILOBS REPORTED THAT ABOUT 500 CORPSES WERE EXHUMED AND REBURIED. THE CEREMONY WAS ATTENDED BY LOCALS AND GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.

(J) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI.

I. CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES.

II. MILOBS PTL TO CYMBILI GR 2298 AND GISIZA GR 2889 WAS INFORMED ABOUT ARBITRARY ARRESTS BY THE RPA OF LOCALS SUPPOSEDLY IMPLICATED IN THE GENOCIDE. THEY ALSO MENTIONED THAT SOME LOCALS HAVE ESCAPED TO ZAIRE ACROSS THE LAKE.

(K) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI. THE ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY VISITED THE REBURIAL SITE AT HOTEL REBERO ON 13 MAY 95.

(12) FORCE ENGR COY.

(A) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

(B) CONTINUED WORK ON THE CONSTRUCTION OF BRIDGE IN NYAMATA.

(C) EOD TEAM RECOVERED TWO 60MM BOMBS FROM FRENCH AMBASSADOR'S RESIDENCE IN KIGALI.

(D) COMPLETED DIGGING WORK FOR DISPOSAL OF REFUSE AT GISENYI.

(E) COMPLETED FENCING WORK AT MALAWICOY LOC.

(13) AUSMED

(A) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE MEDICAL SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MEDICAL SUPPORT TO CITIZENS OF RWANDA.

(B) TREATED A TOTAL OF 441 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 43 DENTAL PATIENTS DURING THE PERIOD. CHK IS CURRENTLY HOLDING 24 IN - PATIENTS.

(14) AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. A TOTAL OF 130 FLIGHTS ARR AND DEP KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT DURING THE PERIOD.

(15) UN MP COY. UNAMIR MP INVESTIGATED THE FOLLOWING INCIDENTS:

(A) A ROBBERY AT THE RESIDENCE OF A MSF (NGO) STAFF WHO WAS HELD AT GUN POINT AT KIMIHURURA, KIGALI.

(B) THEFT OF A GENERATOR AT THE RESIDENCE OF A UNHCR EMPLOYEE BY ARMED PERSONNEL AT GUN POINT.

(C) AN ATTEMPTED FORCED ENTRY INTO THE RESIDENCE OF A UNAMIR CIV EMPLOYEE WITH THE POSSIBLE INTENT TO STEAL A UN VEH. THE ATTEMPT WAS UNSUCCESSFUL.

(D) A ROBBERY AT THE RESIDENCE OF IMC STAFF AT BUTARE BY 2 ARMED MEN DRESSED IN RPA UNIFORM. THE CASE WAS REFERRED TO GENDARMERIE BRIGADE FOR INVESTIGATION.

(E) THEFT OF A UN VEH BY 2 RPA SOLDIERS FROM THE RESIDENCE OF A MILOB IN GITARAMA. THE RPA SOLDIERS REPORTEDLY FIRED SHOTS INTO THE HOUSE TO SUBDUE THE OCCUPANTS BEFORE STEALING THE VEHICLE. GENDARMERIE INFORMED.

(A) CARRIED OUT NORMAL RESUPPLY RUNS TO ALL SECTORS.

(B) ETHIOBATT REFUSED THEIR ISSUE OF HARD RATIONS BECAUSE THEY ARE GERMAN.

4. UNCIVPOL

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. CIVPOL MONITORS IN RUHENGARI PREFECTURE REPORTED THAT THE PREFECT OF RUHENGARI ON 05 MAY 95 ADDRESSED ABOUT 3,000 LOCALS AT NDUSU COMMUNE. 900 IDPs WHO HAD JUST RETURNED TO THE COMMUNE FROM GITARAMA WERE ALSO IN ATTENDANCE. THE PREFECT DURING THE ADDRESS EXPRESSED FEAR OF INSECURITY DUE TO THE PRESENCE OF THE IDPs WHOM HE SAID WERE EX-CRIMINALS AND WARNED THEM TO LEAVE THE COMMUNE WITHIN ONE WEEK OR BE FORCED TO DO SO.

C. CIVPOL MONITORS IN KIGALI VISITED KIGALI CENTRAL PRISON AND REPORTED THAT THE NUMBER OF INMATES WAS NOW 8,617 AND WERE LIVING UNDER VERY DEPLORABLE CONDITIONS.

D. IN MATIAZO SECTOR, CIVPOL MONITORS REPORTED THAT IDPs WERE FLEEING TO BURUNDI THROUGH NYUNGWE FOREST DUE TO HARASSMENT BY RPA SOLDIERS.

E. CIVPOL MONITORS IN CYANGUGU REPORTED THAT BANDITRY ACTIVITIES FROM IJWI ISLAND HAVE RESUMED AT KAGANO AND KIRAMBO COMMUNES IN NYAMASHEKE AREA DESPITE INTENSIFIED DAY/NIGHT PATROLS BY THE RPA.

F. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IN PROGRESS.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO IDPs FORCIBLY REMOVED FROM DPCs IN SECTOR 4A.

6. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. A TOTAL OF 5 ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHICLES WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD.

10. CONCLUSION.

A. ALTHOUGH THE SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED UNDER CONTROL, THERE WAS A MARKED INCREASE IN ACTS OF BANDITRY ESPECIALLY IN SECTORS 4C, 5 AND 6.

B. INCREASED ARRESTS BY THE RPA IS FURTHER AGGRAVATING THE ALREADY APPALLING CONDITIONS IN RWANDESE PRISONS COUNTRY WIDE.

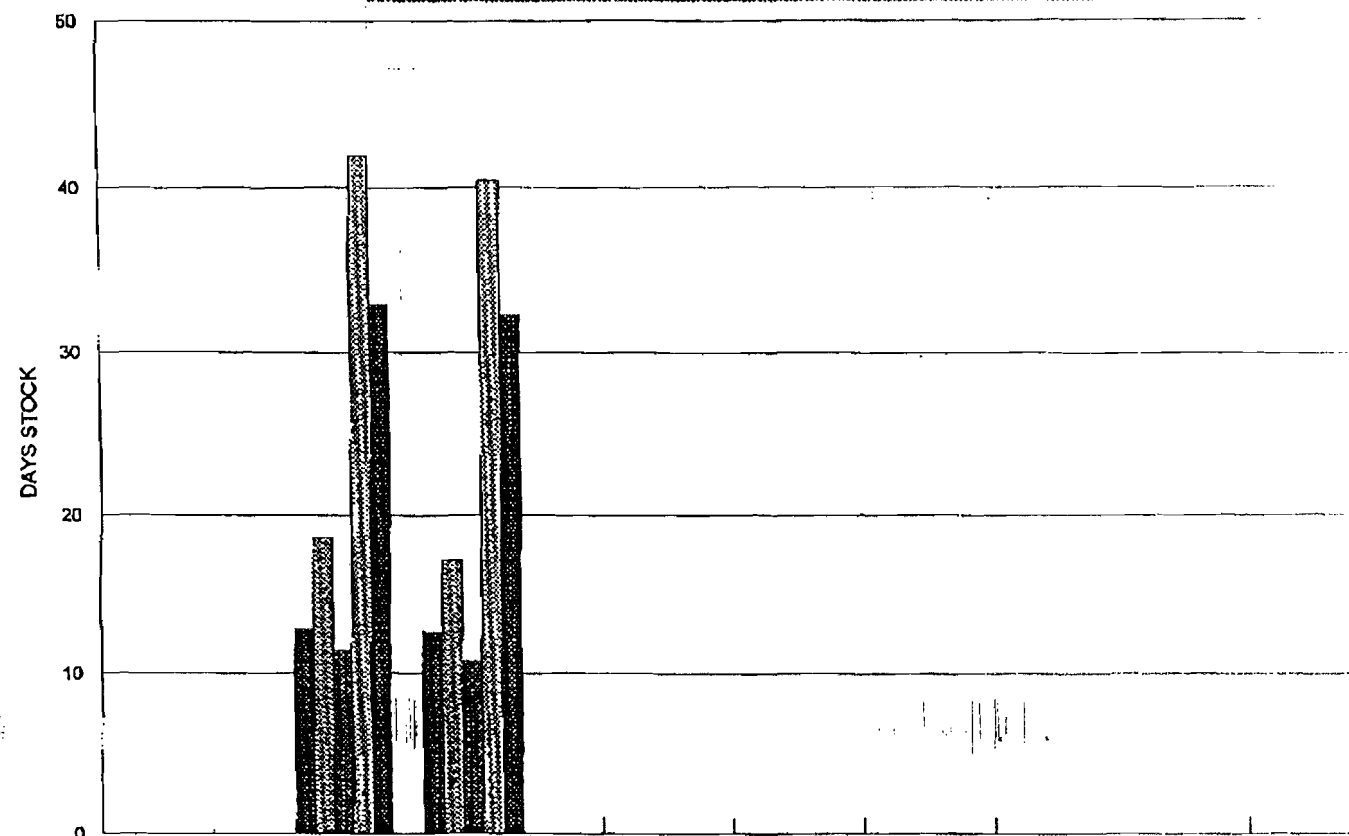

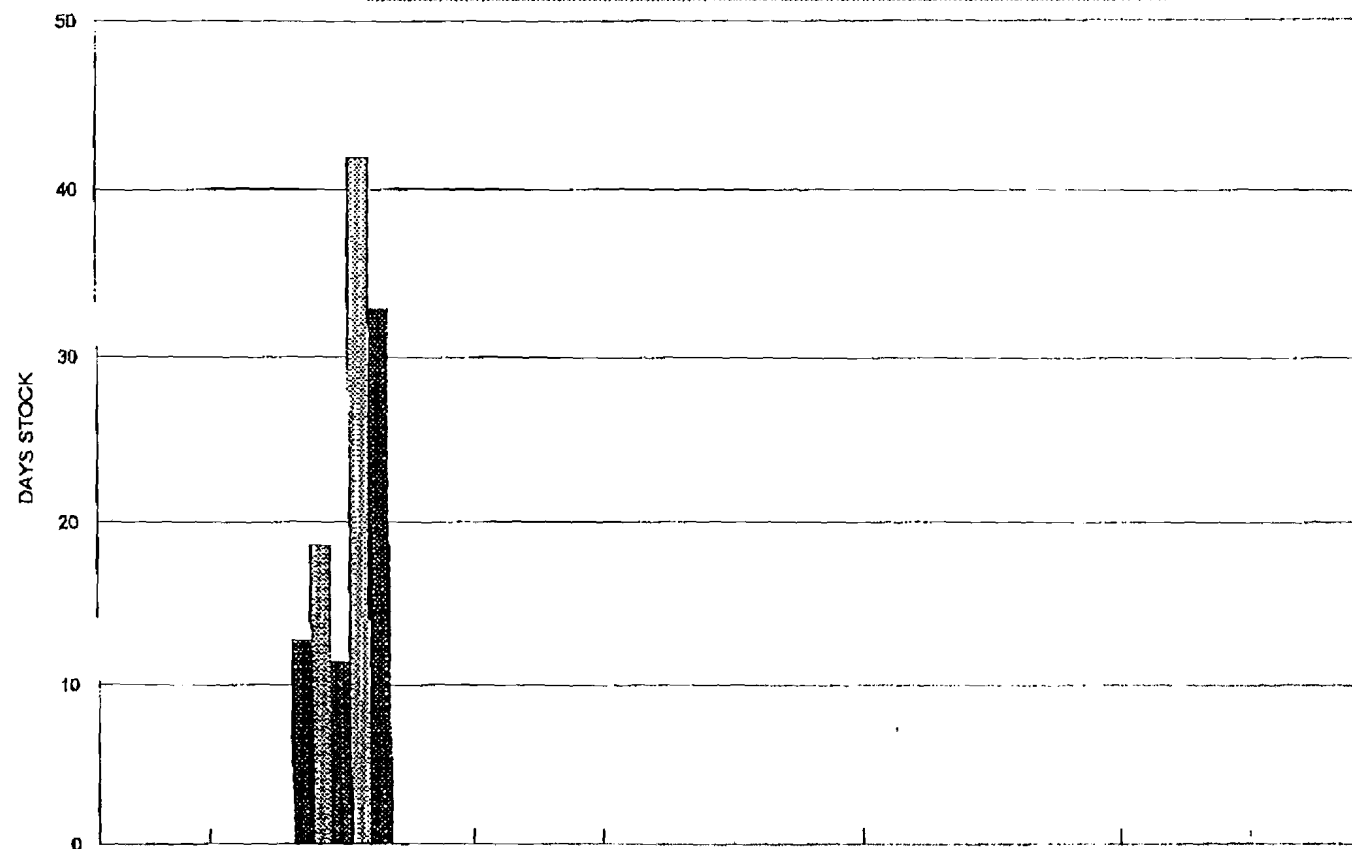

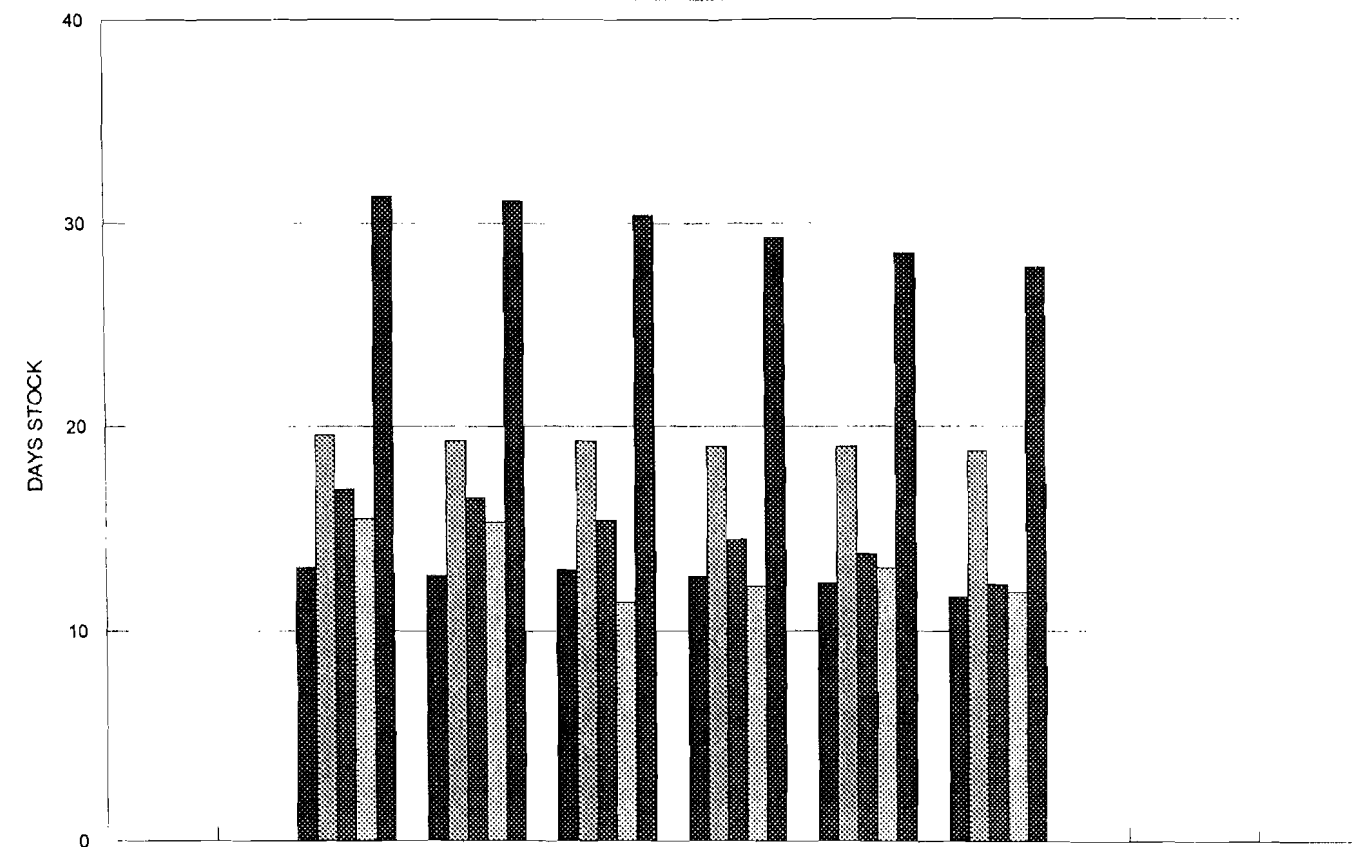
